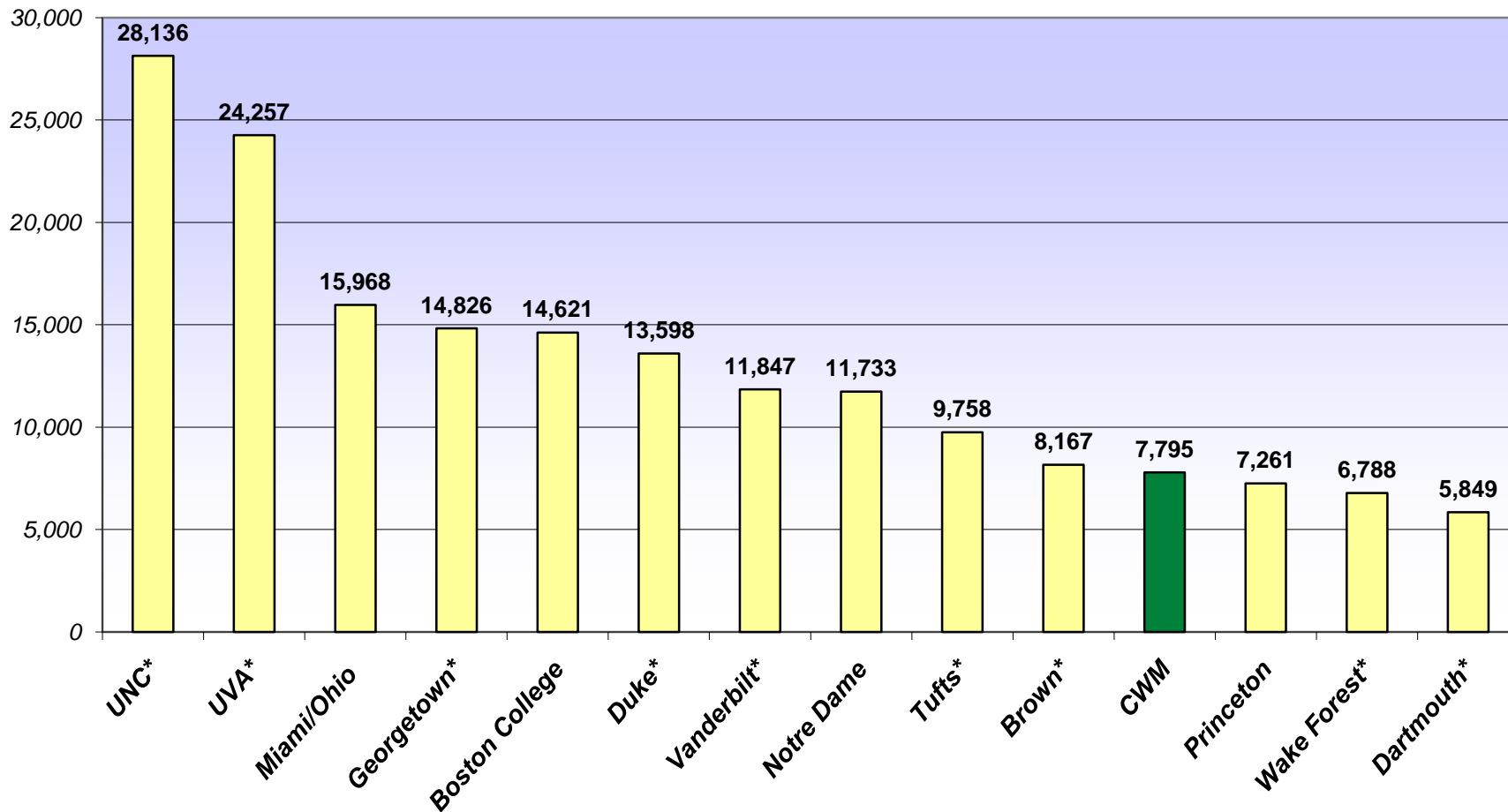

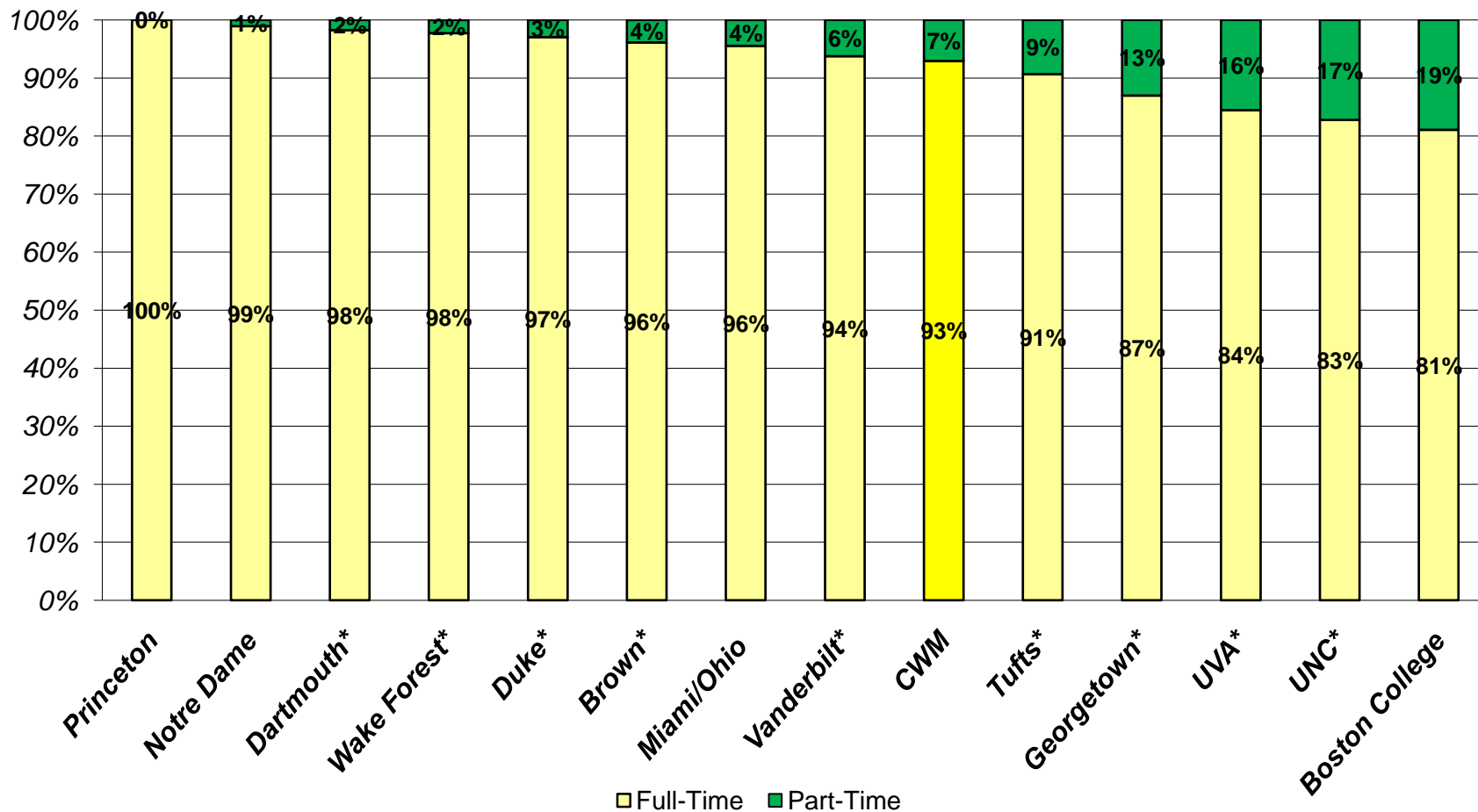
Total enrollment: Total men and women enrolled for credit in the fall of the academic year.

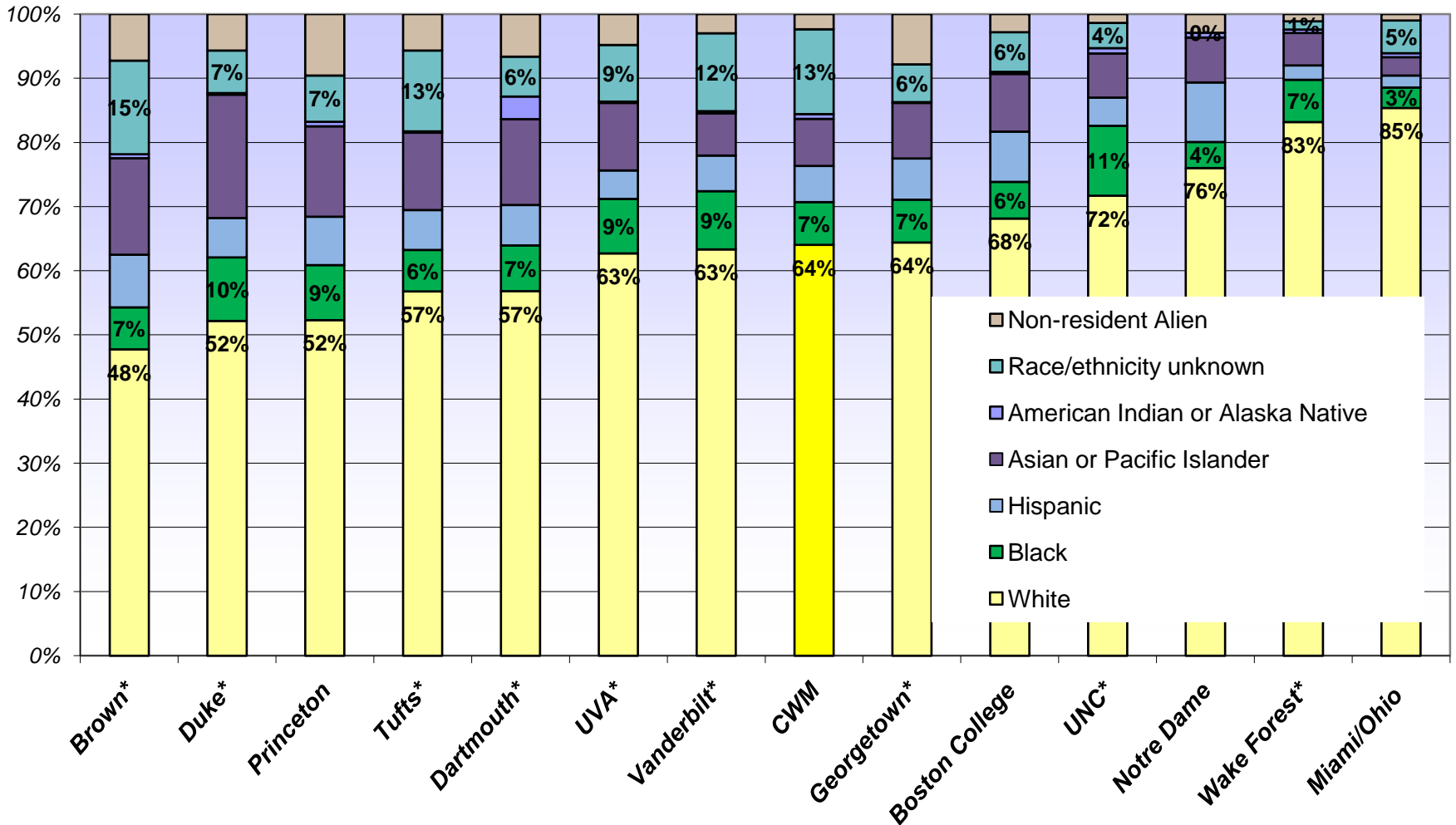

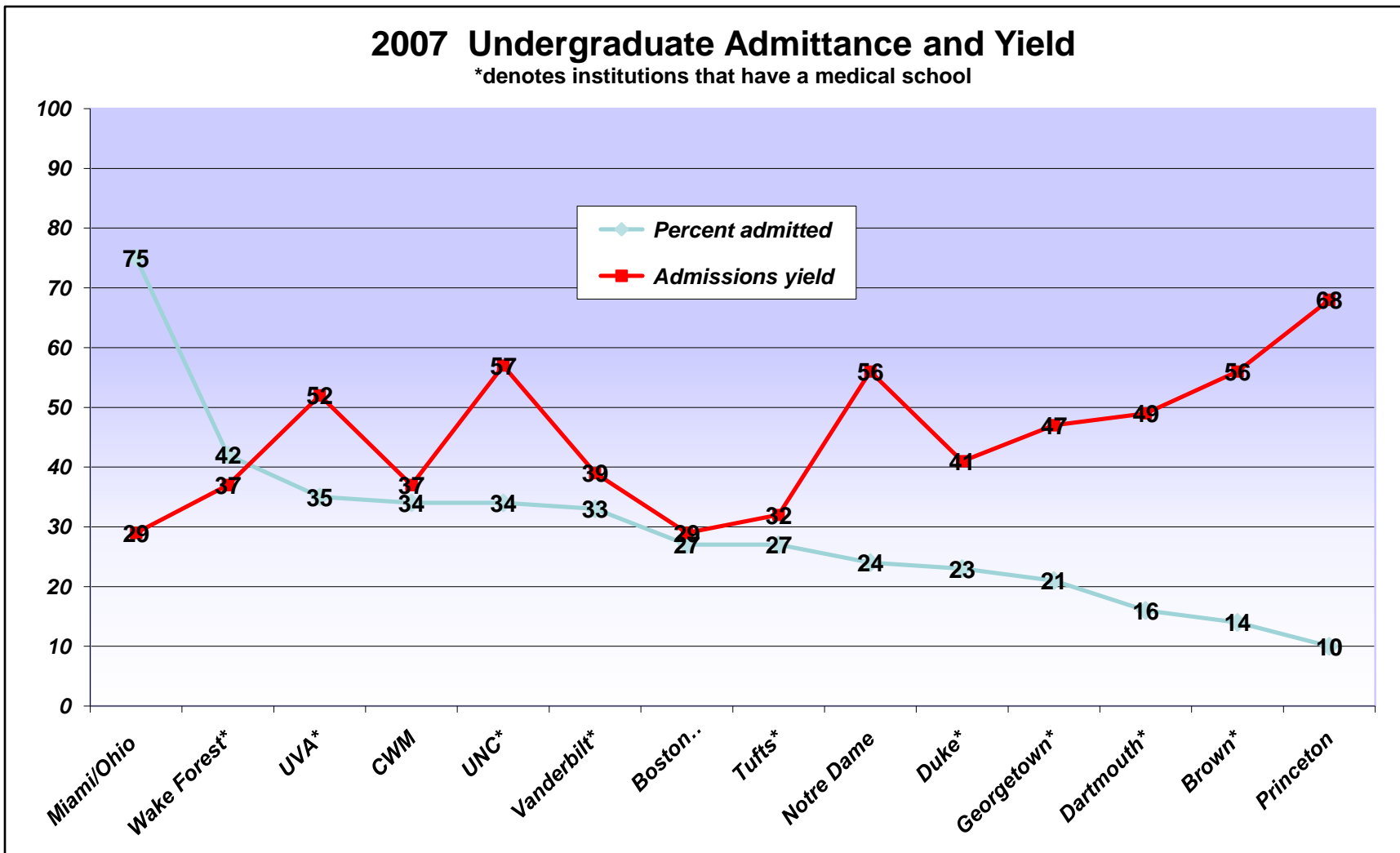

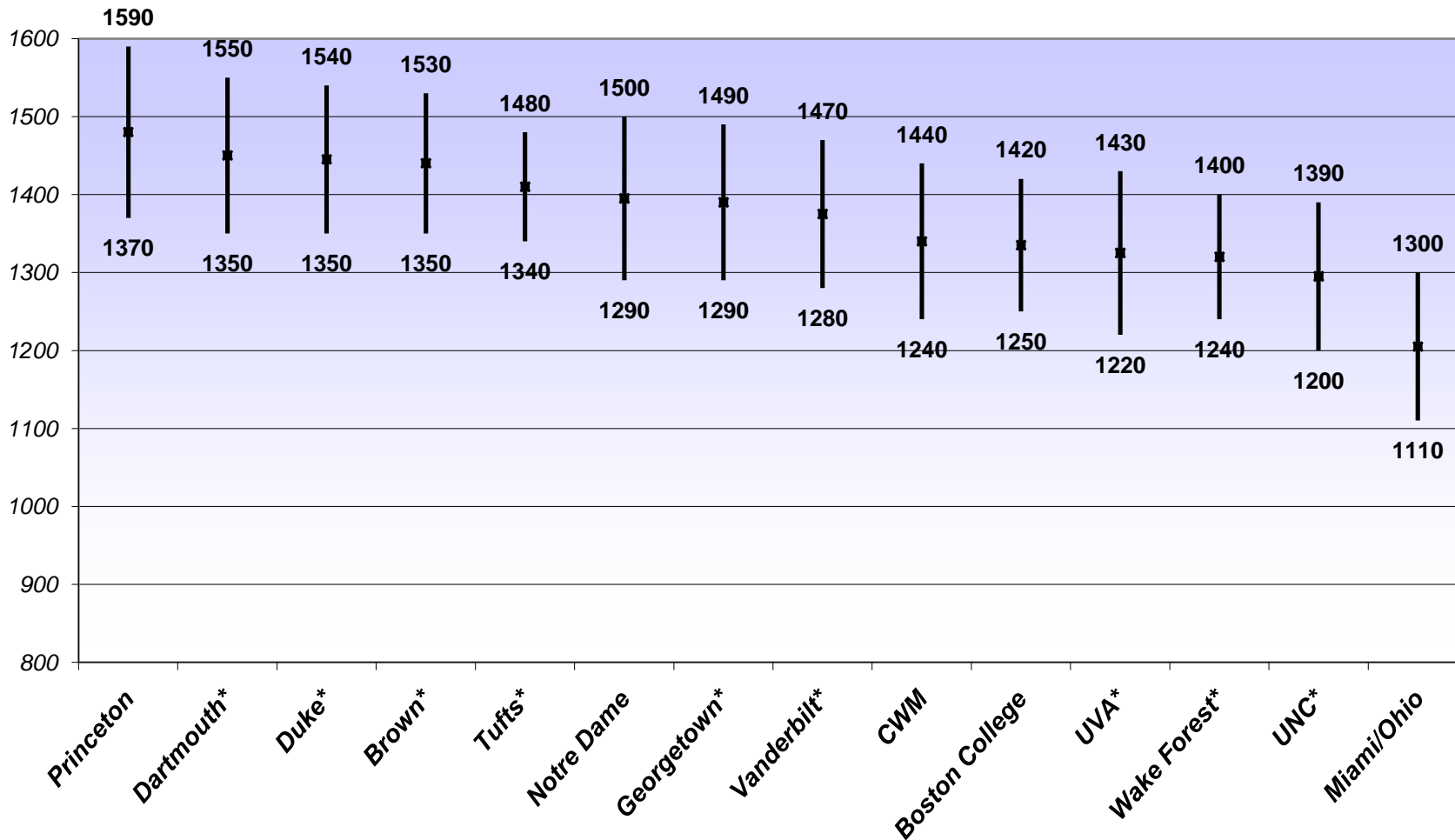
Admissions Yield: Fall 2007, number enrolled divided by the number admitted.

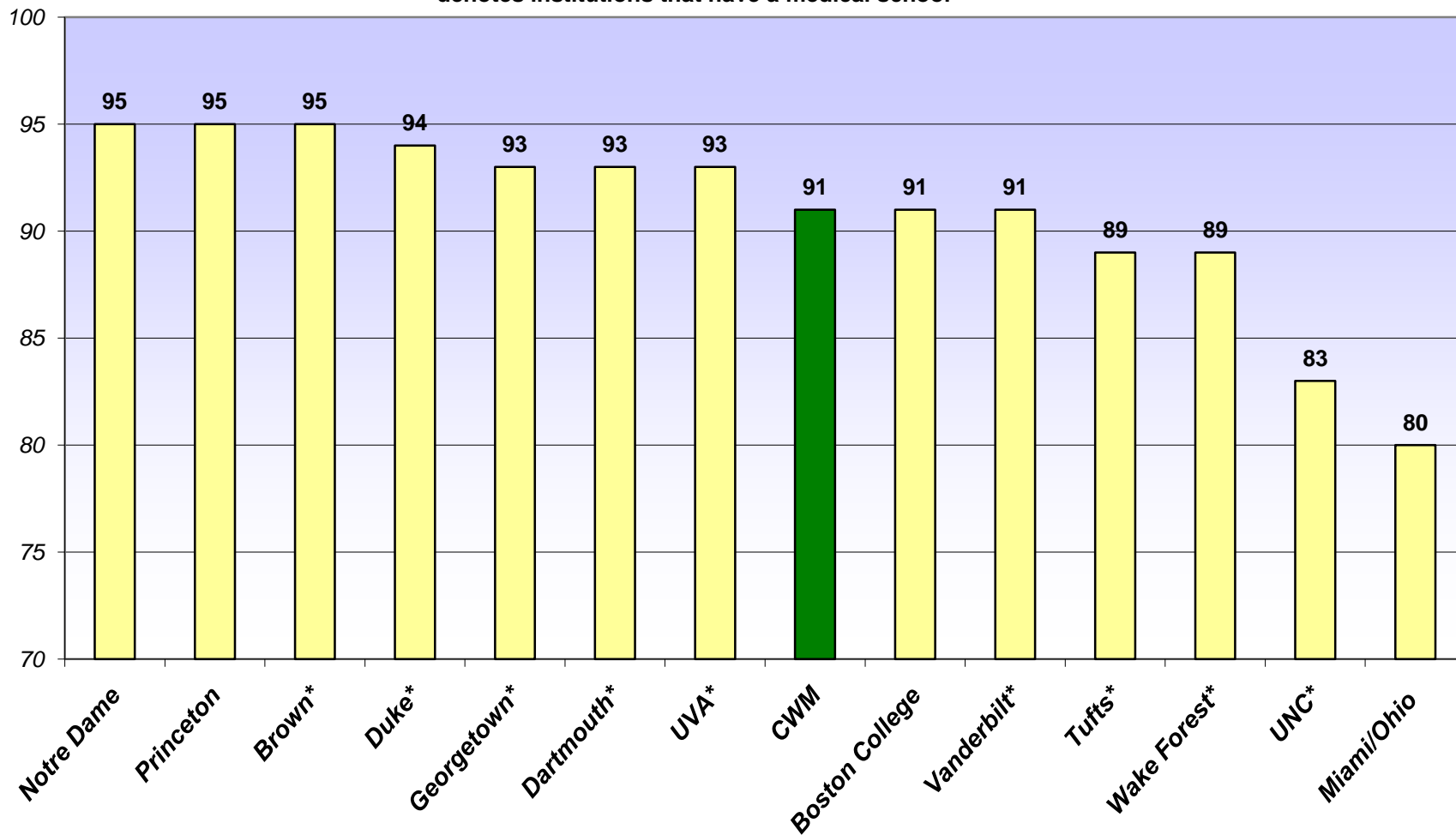

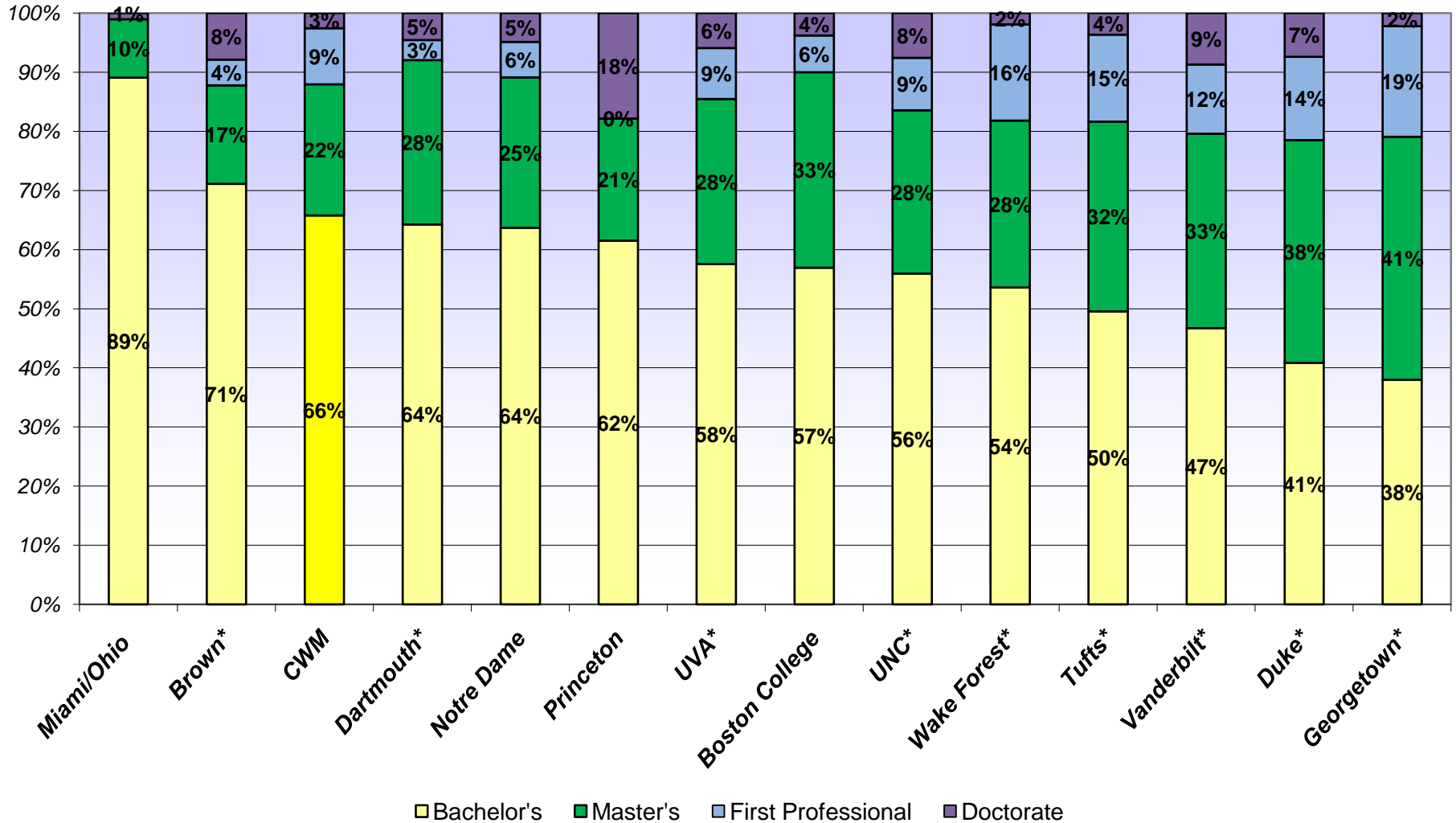

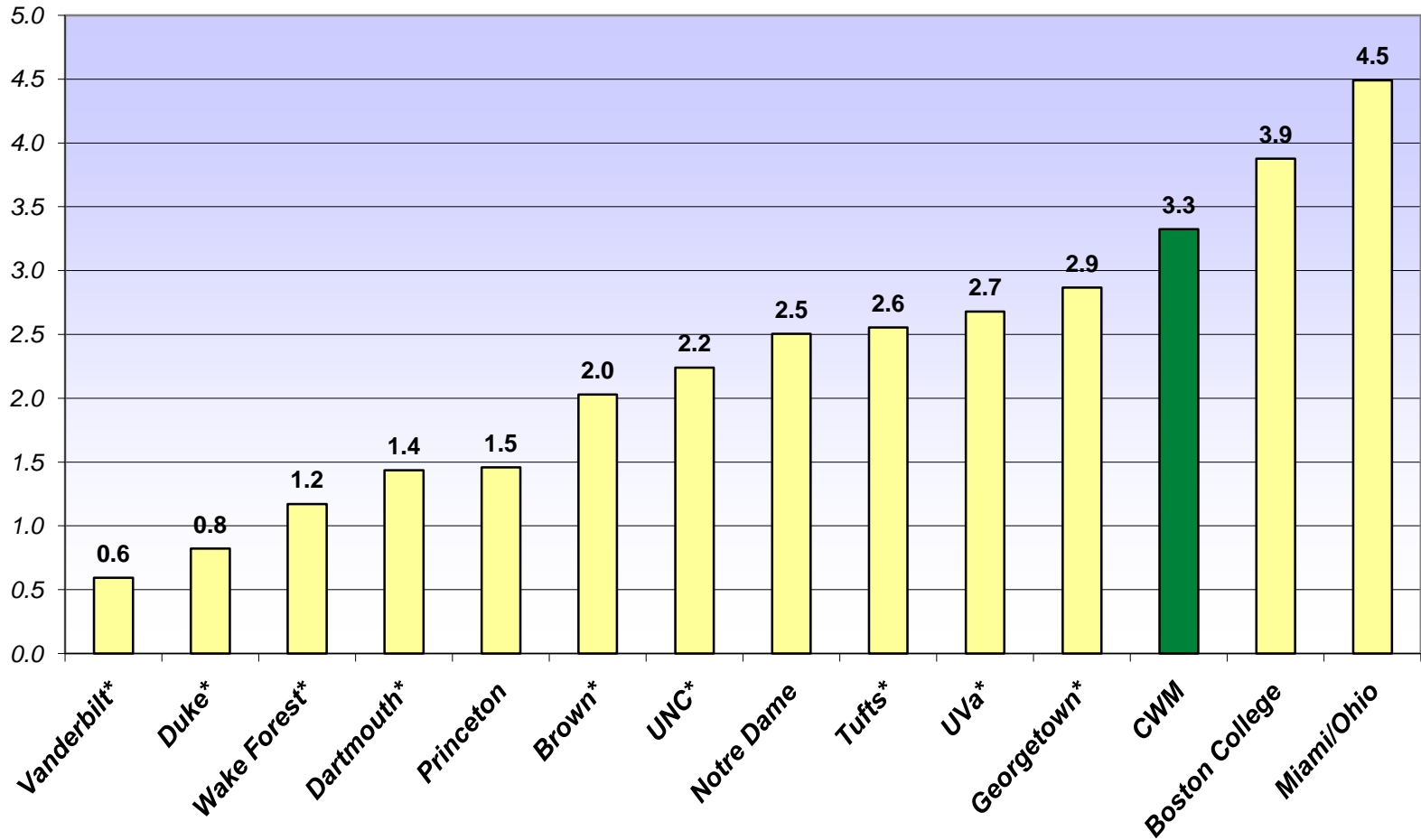

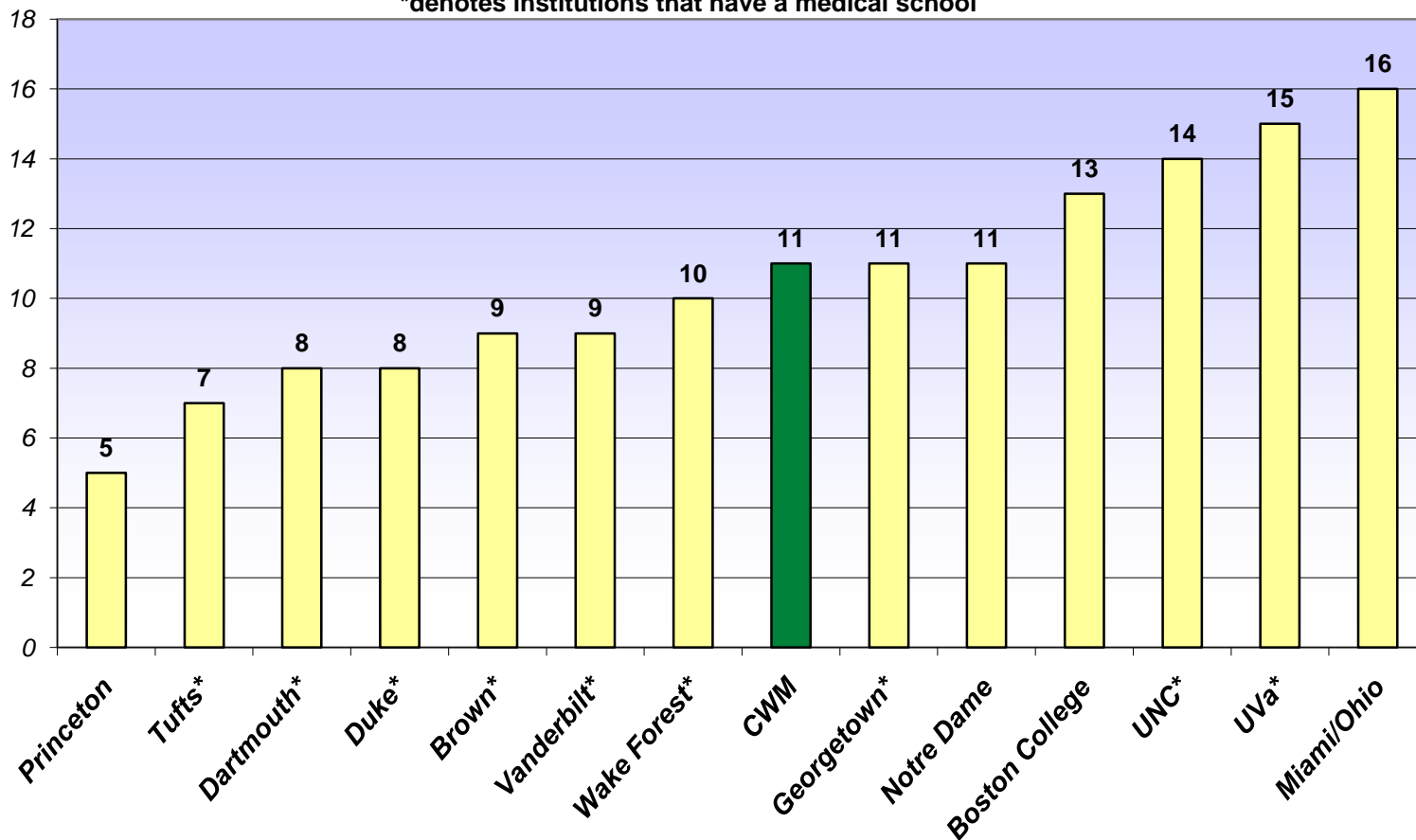


The full-time-equivalent (FTE) of staff and students is calculated by summing the total number of full-time staff or students and adding one-third of the total number of part-time staff or students.

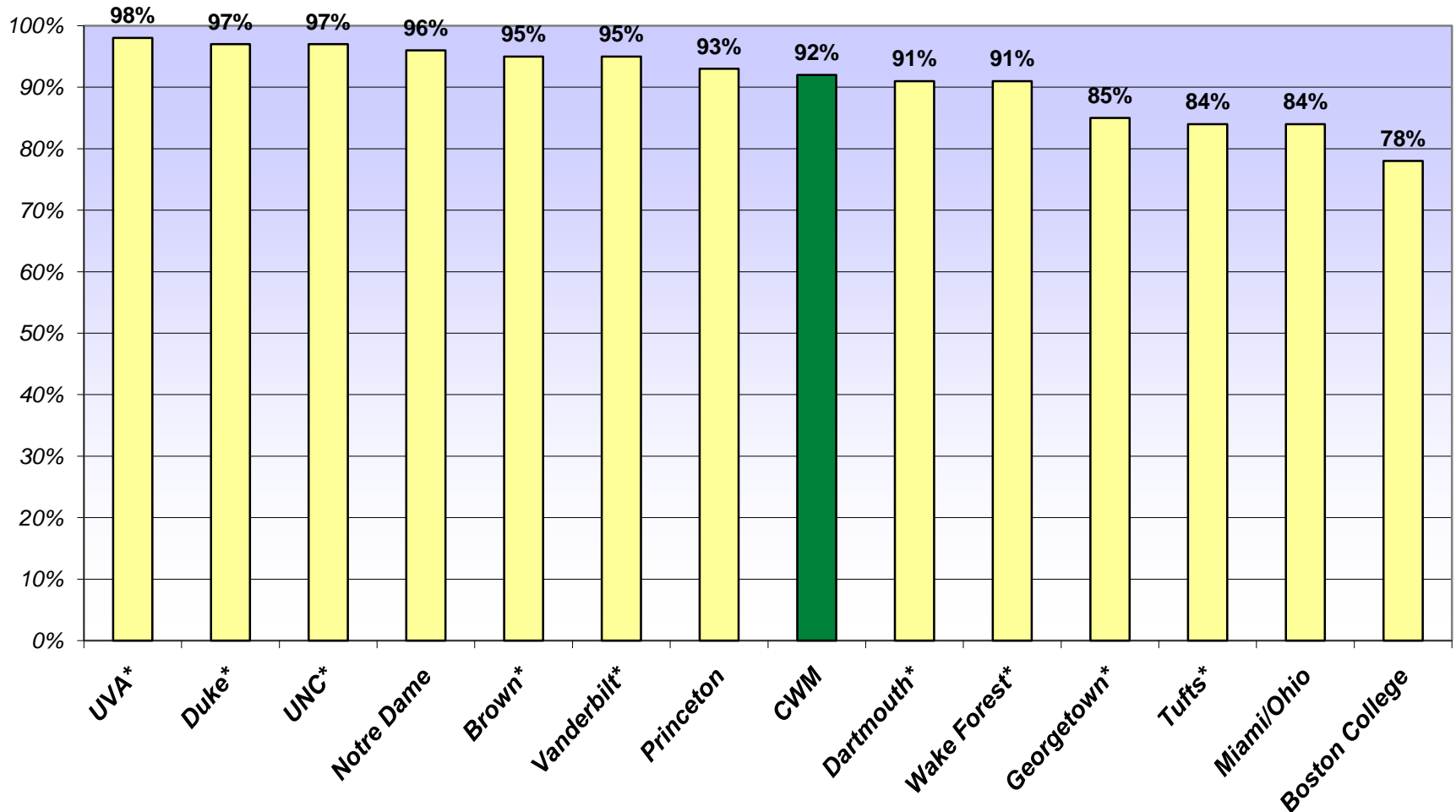

Includes instructional, research, and public service faculty. The full-time-equivalent (FTE) is calculated by summing the total number of full-time staff and adding one-third of the total number of part-time staff.

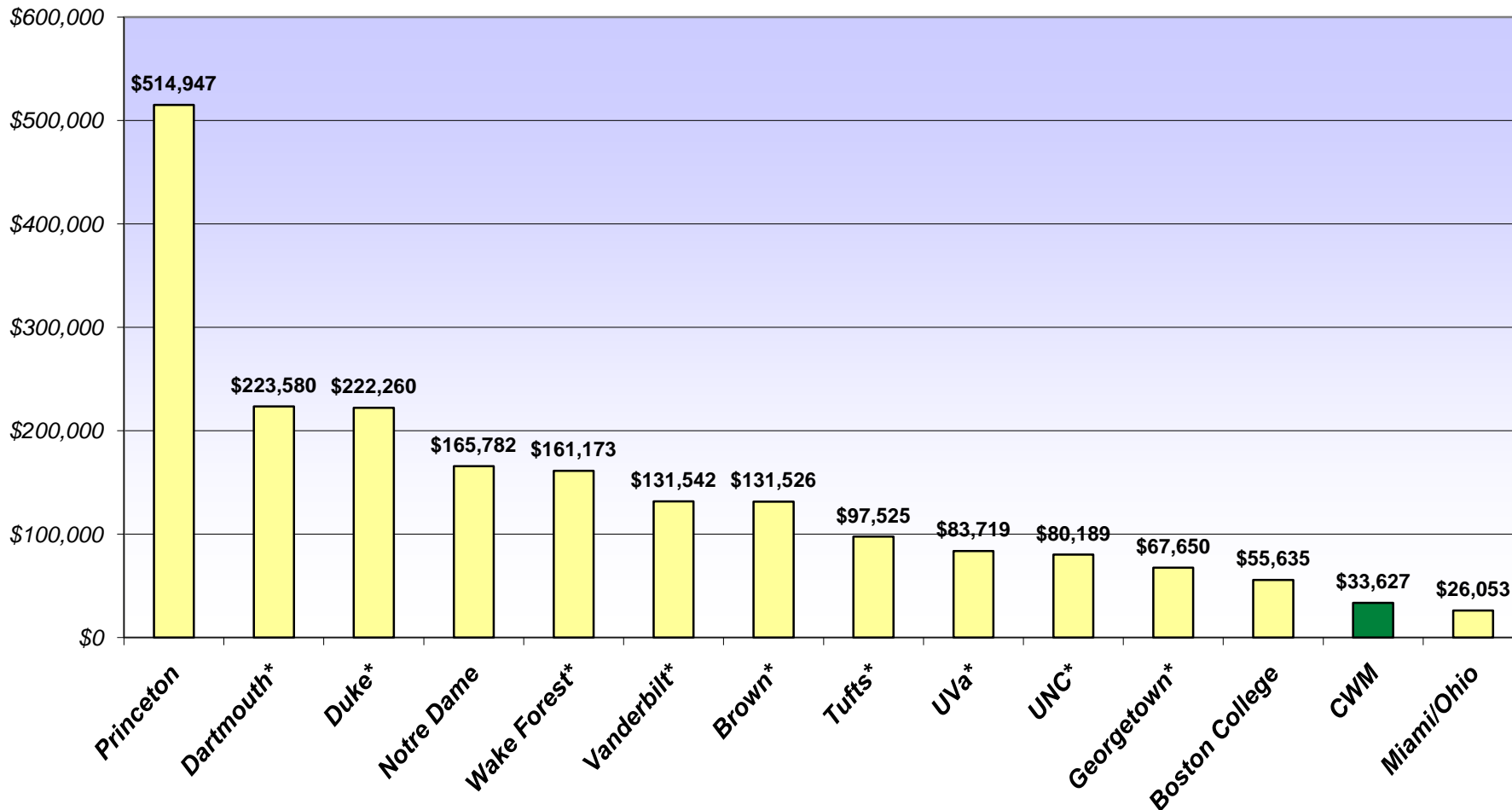

Core Revenues Per FTE Student

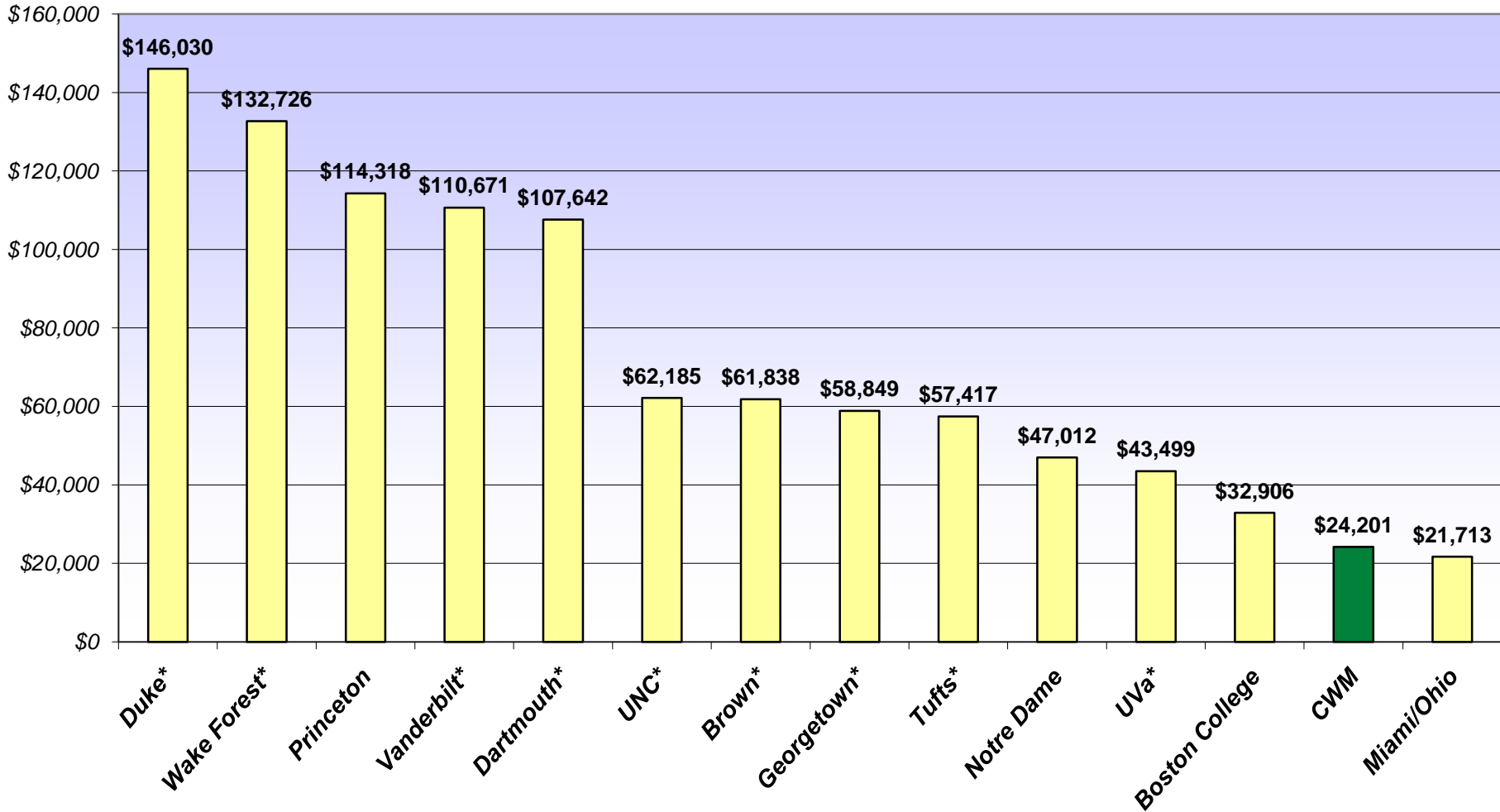

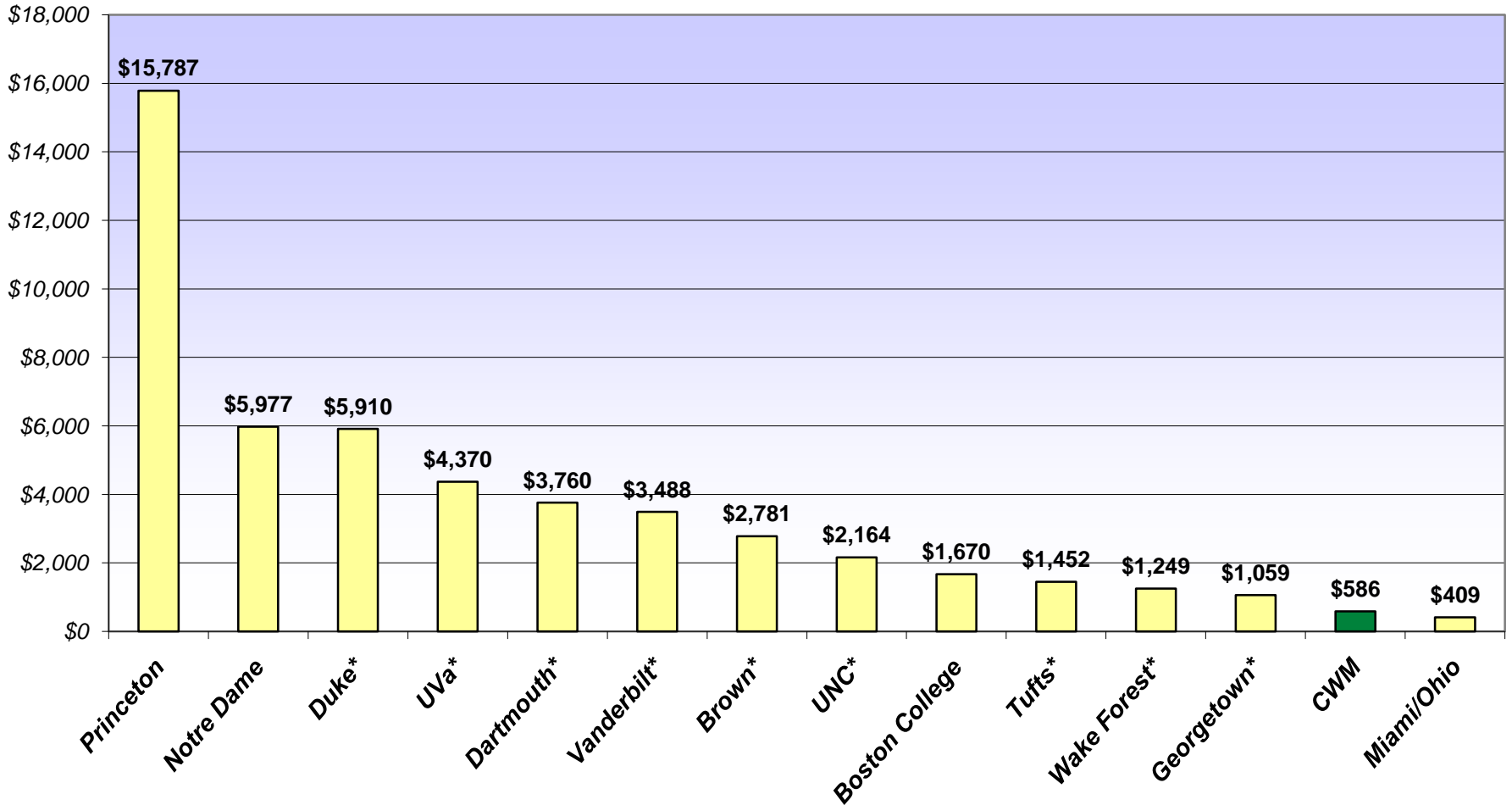


Core expenses exclude expenses for auxiliary enterprises (e.g., bookstores, dormitories), hospitals, and independent operations.

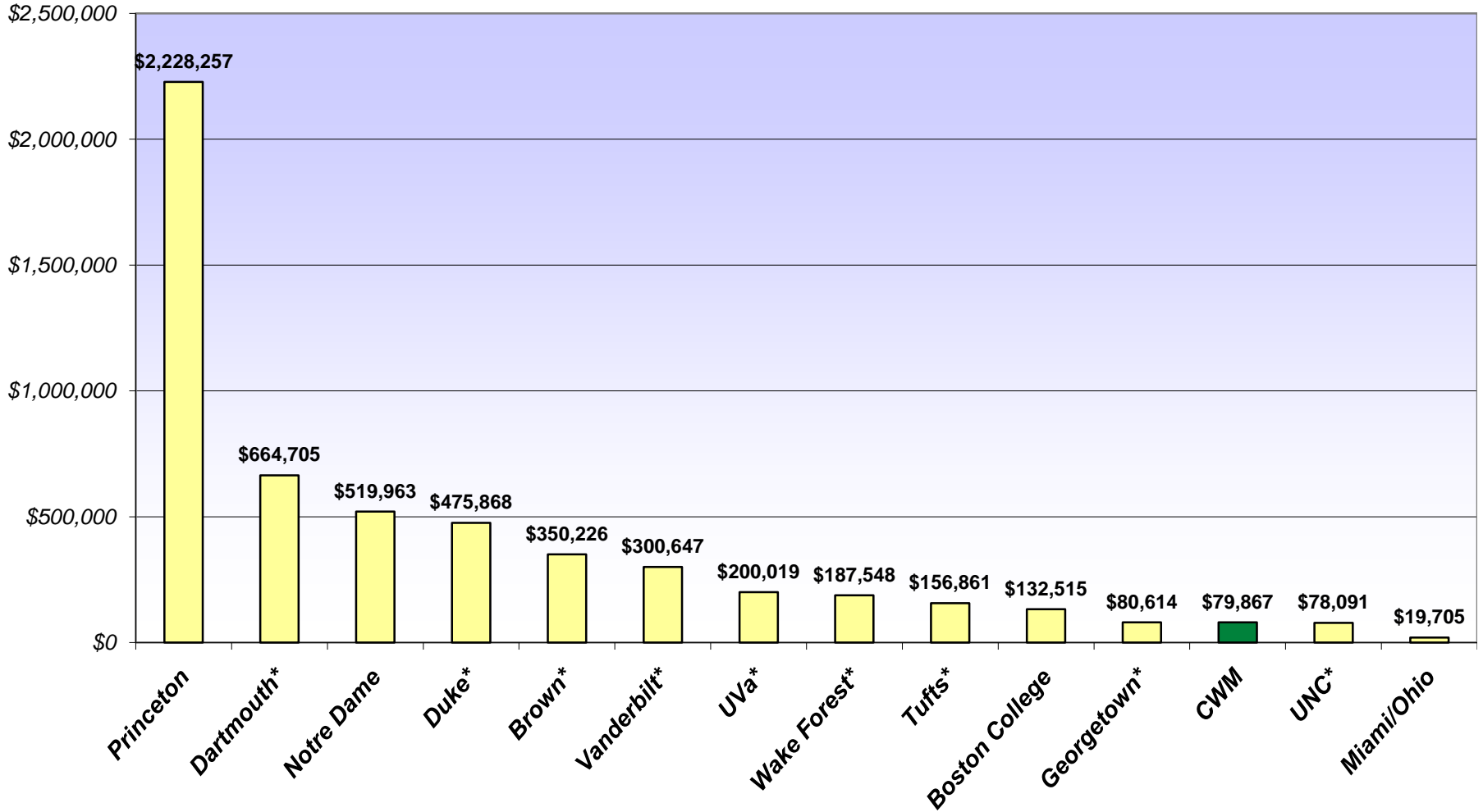

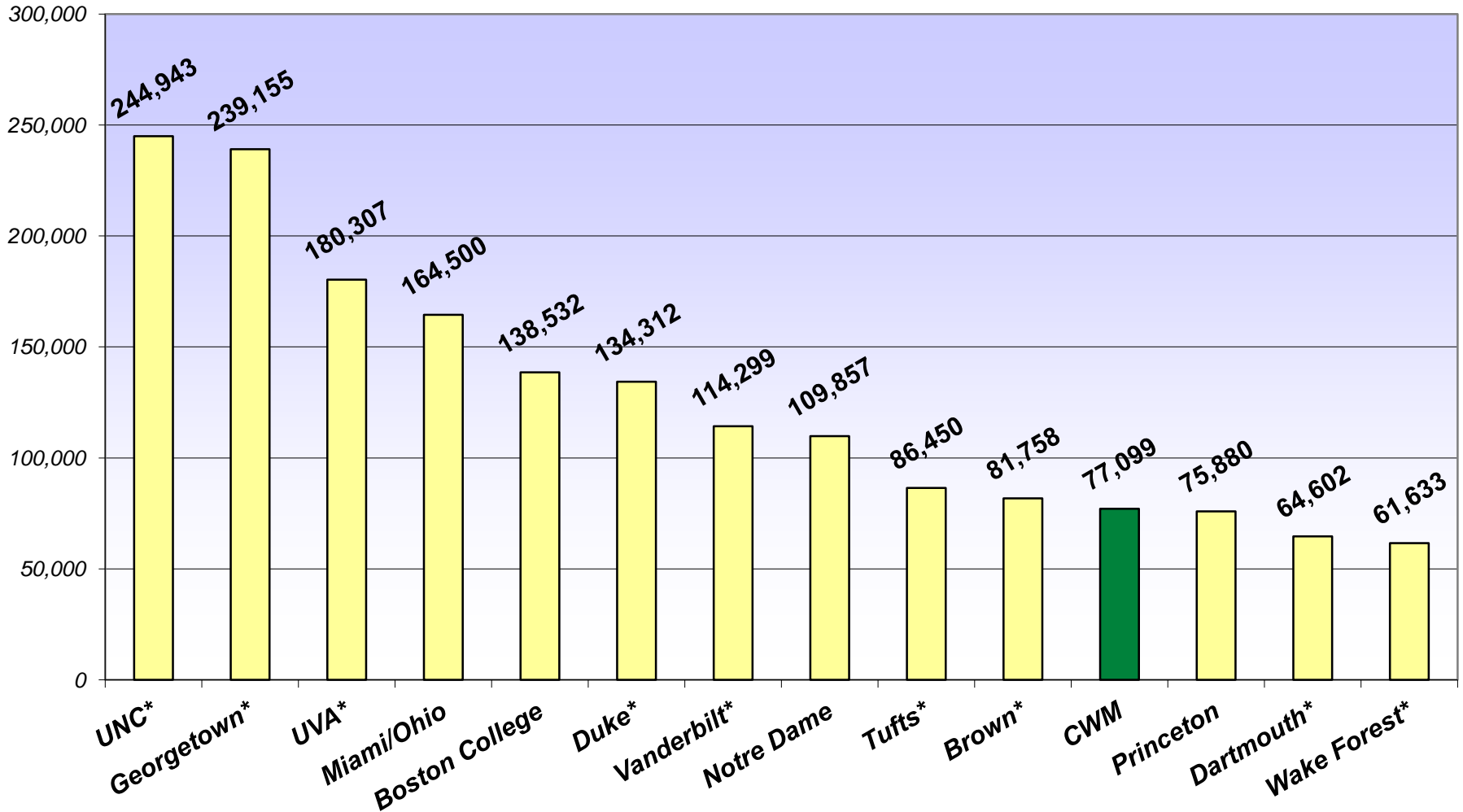

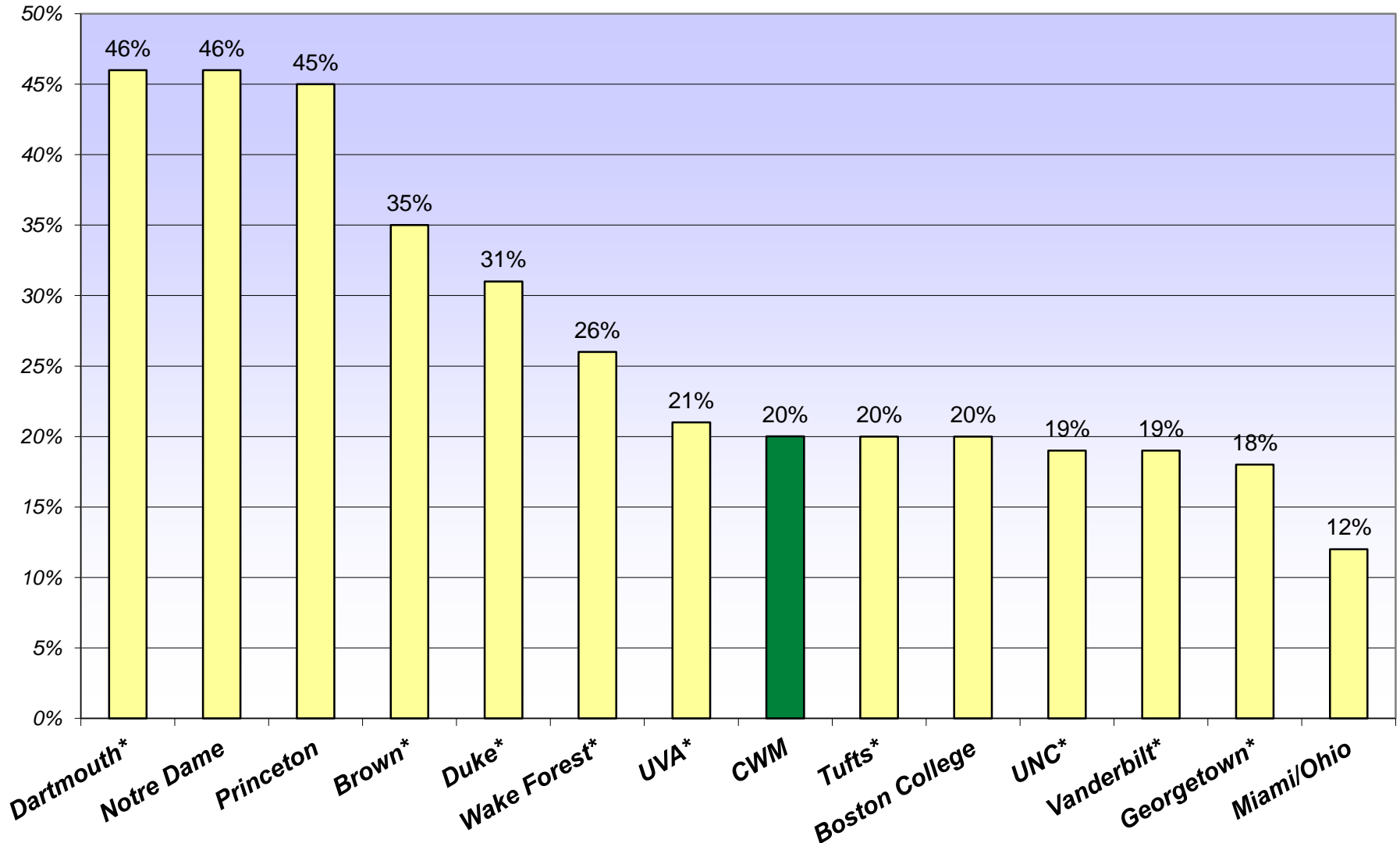

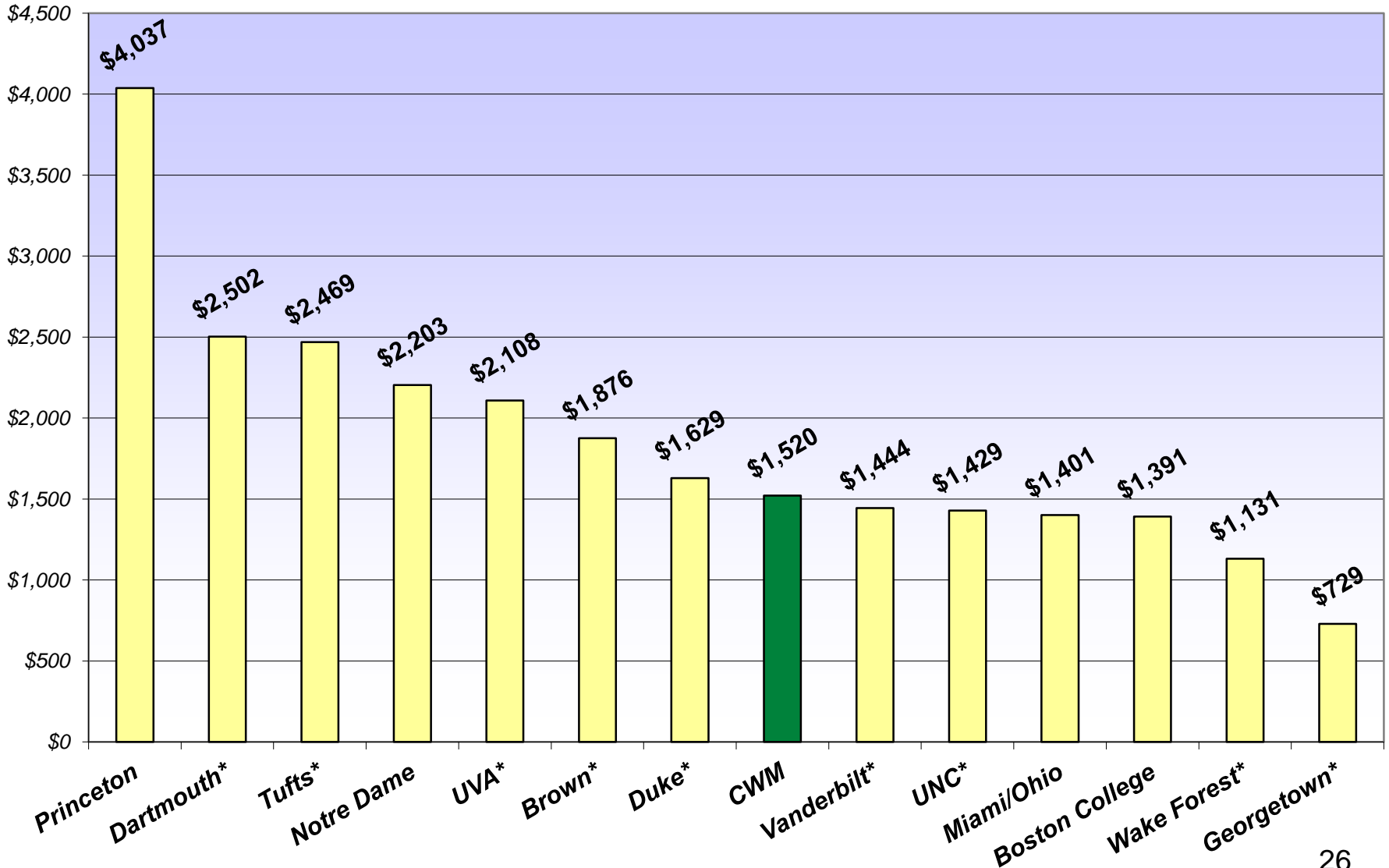

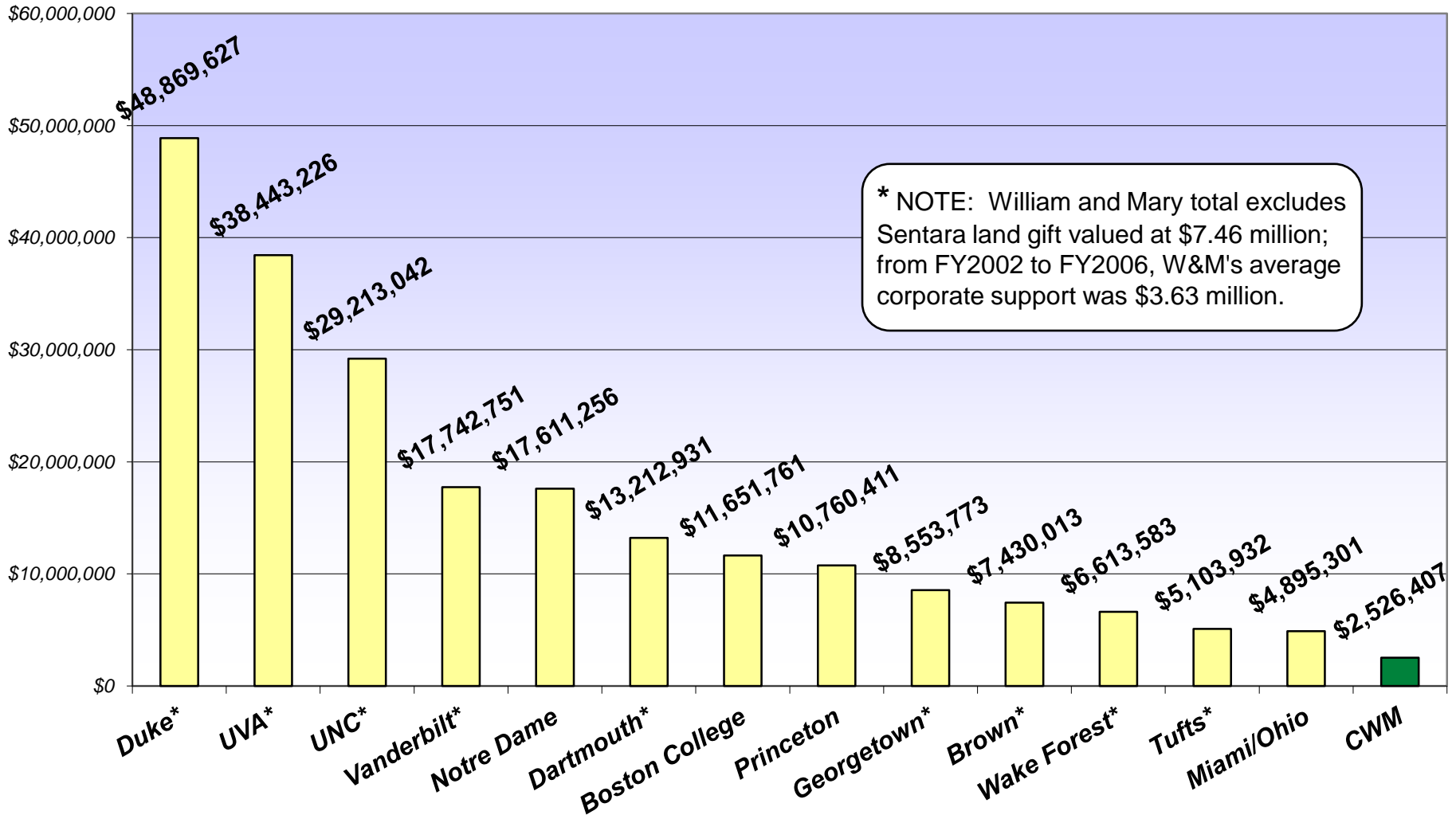

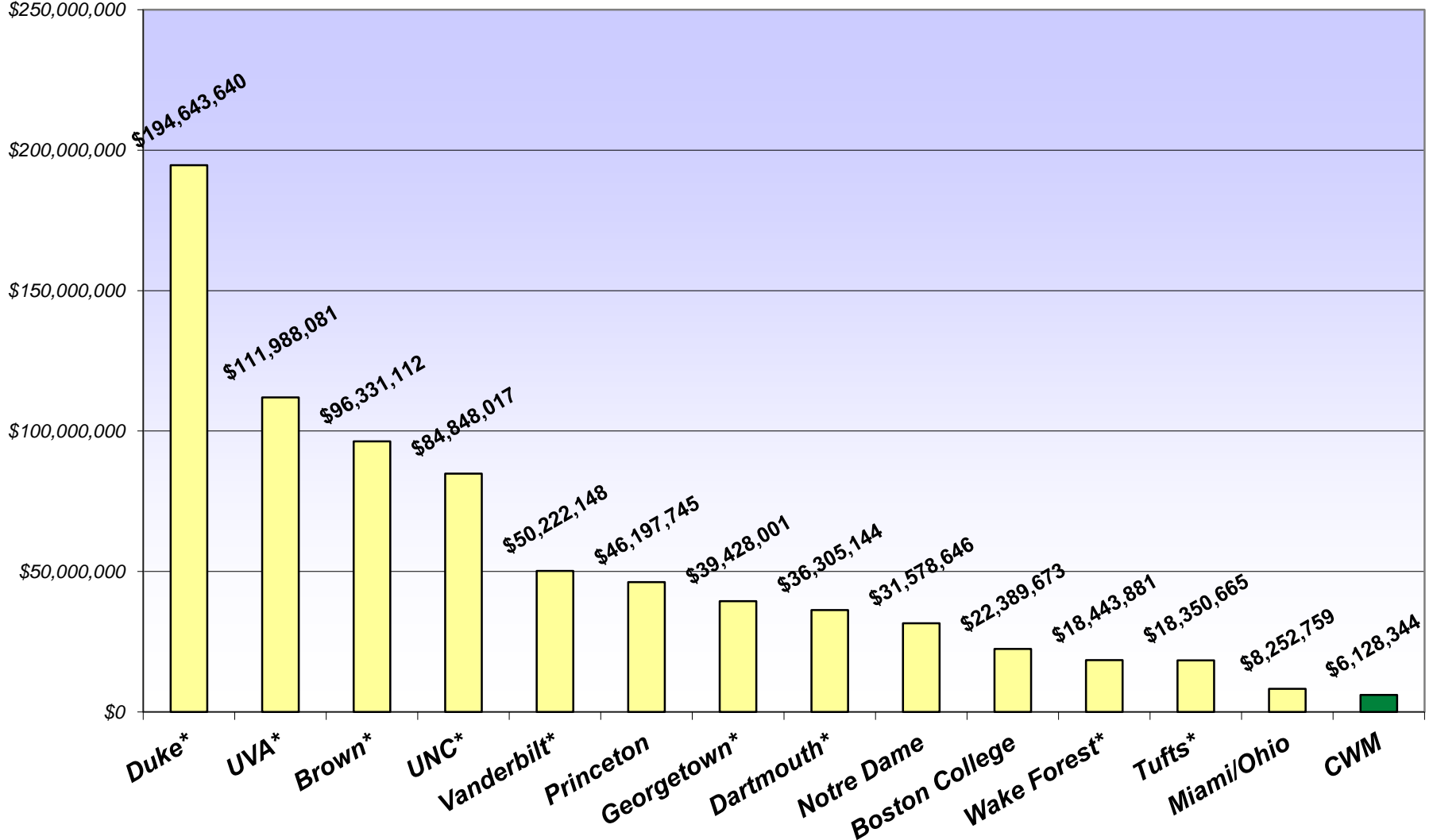

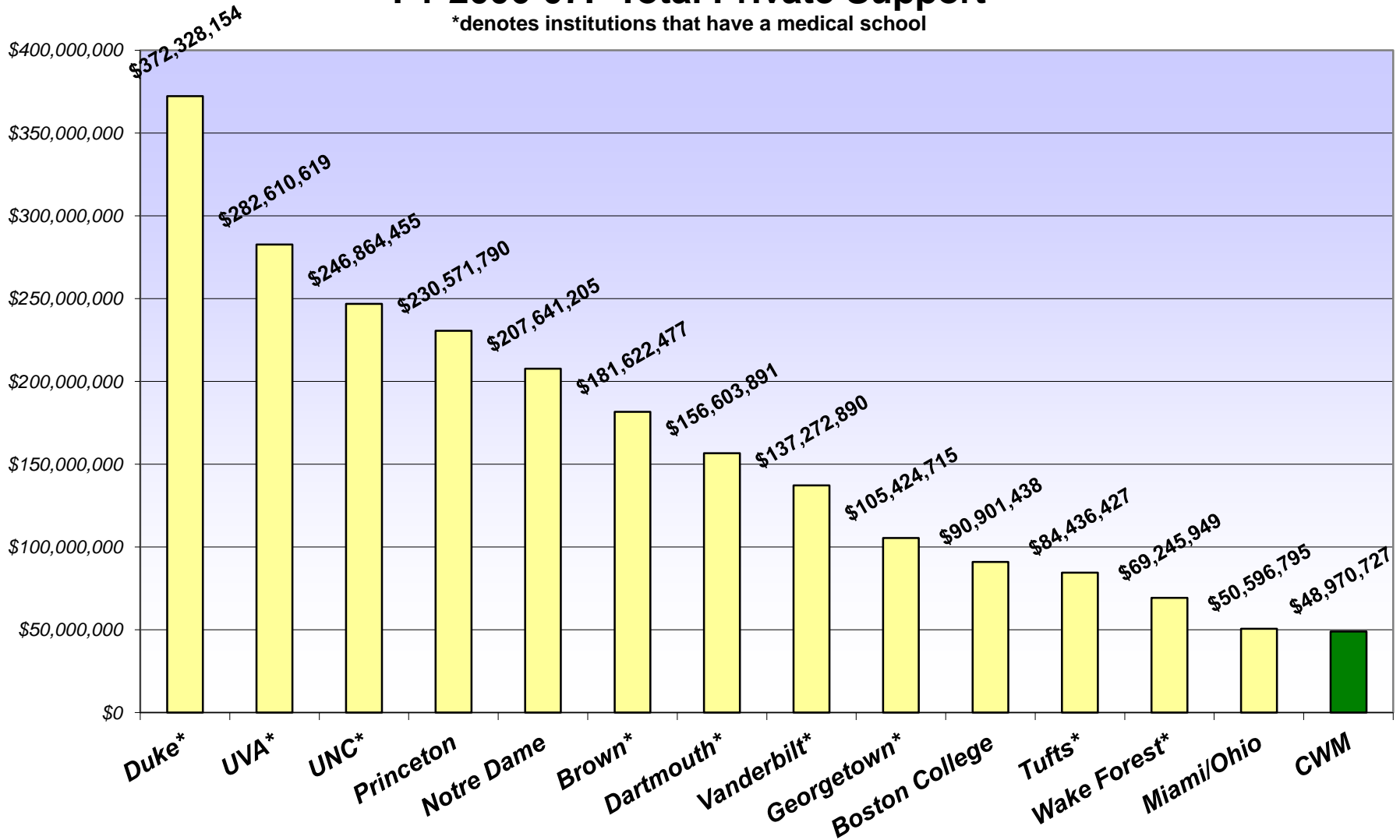

FY 2006-07: Total Private Support

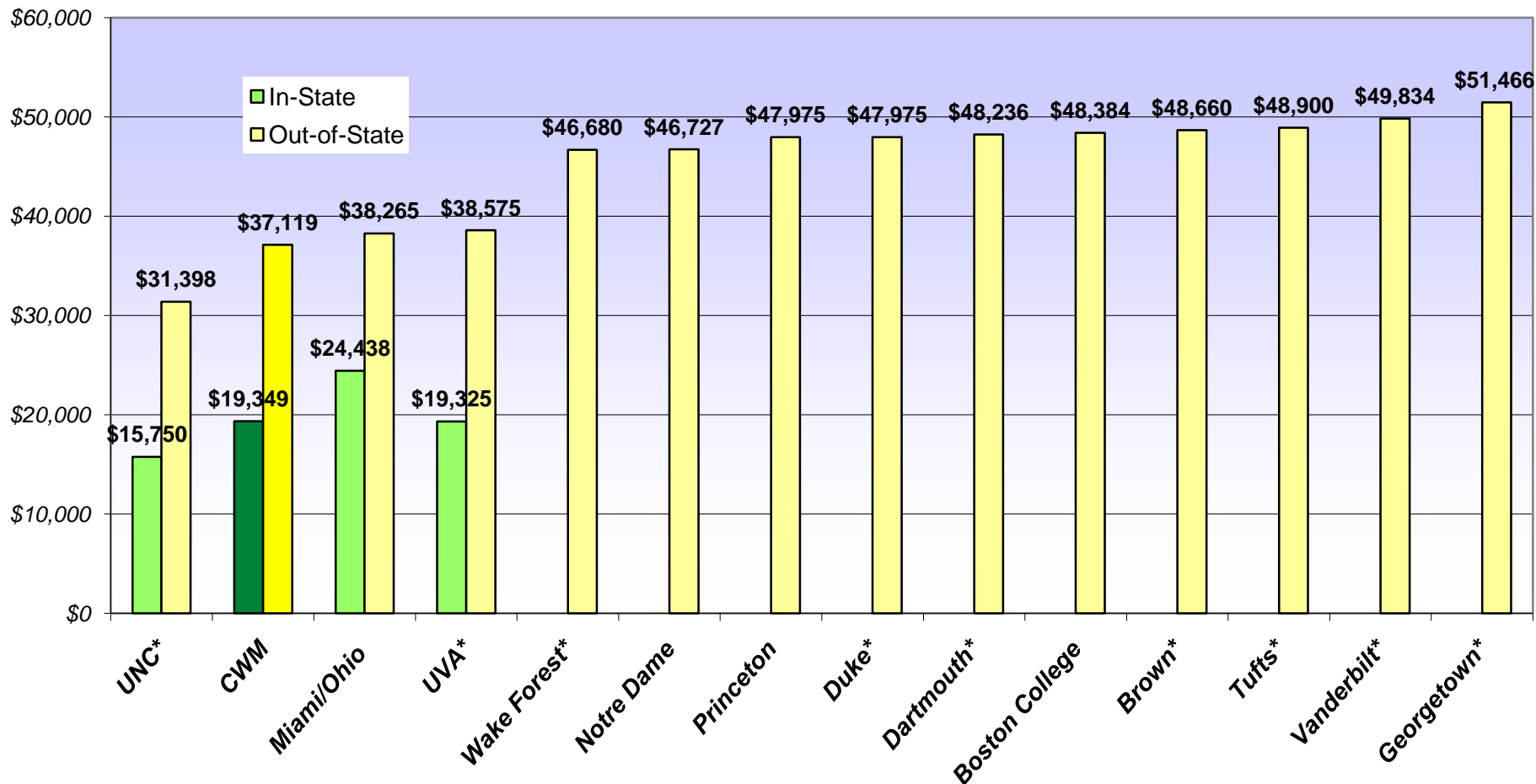

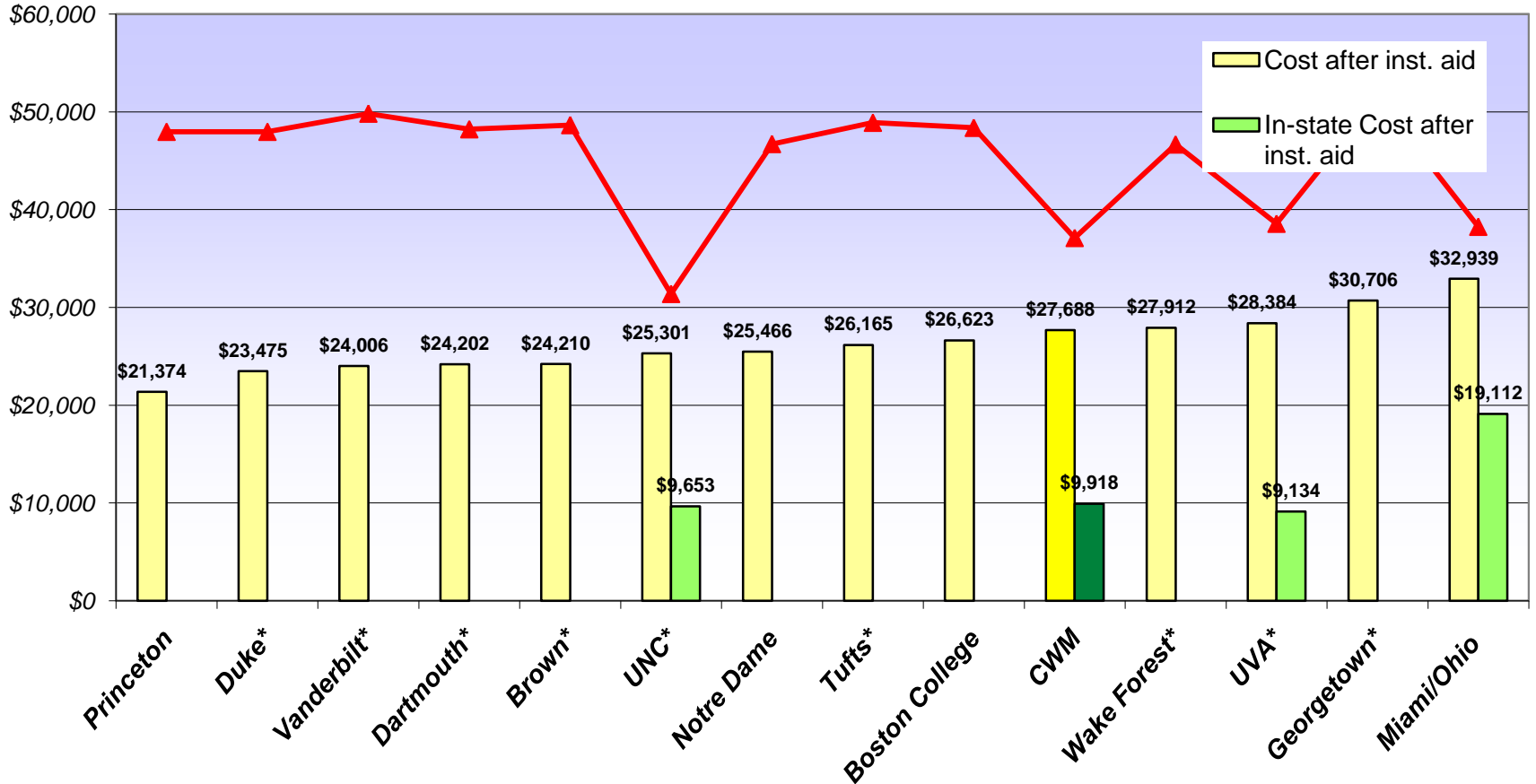

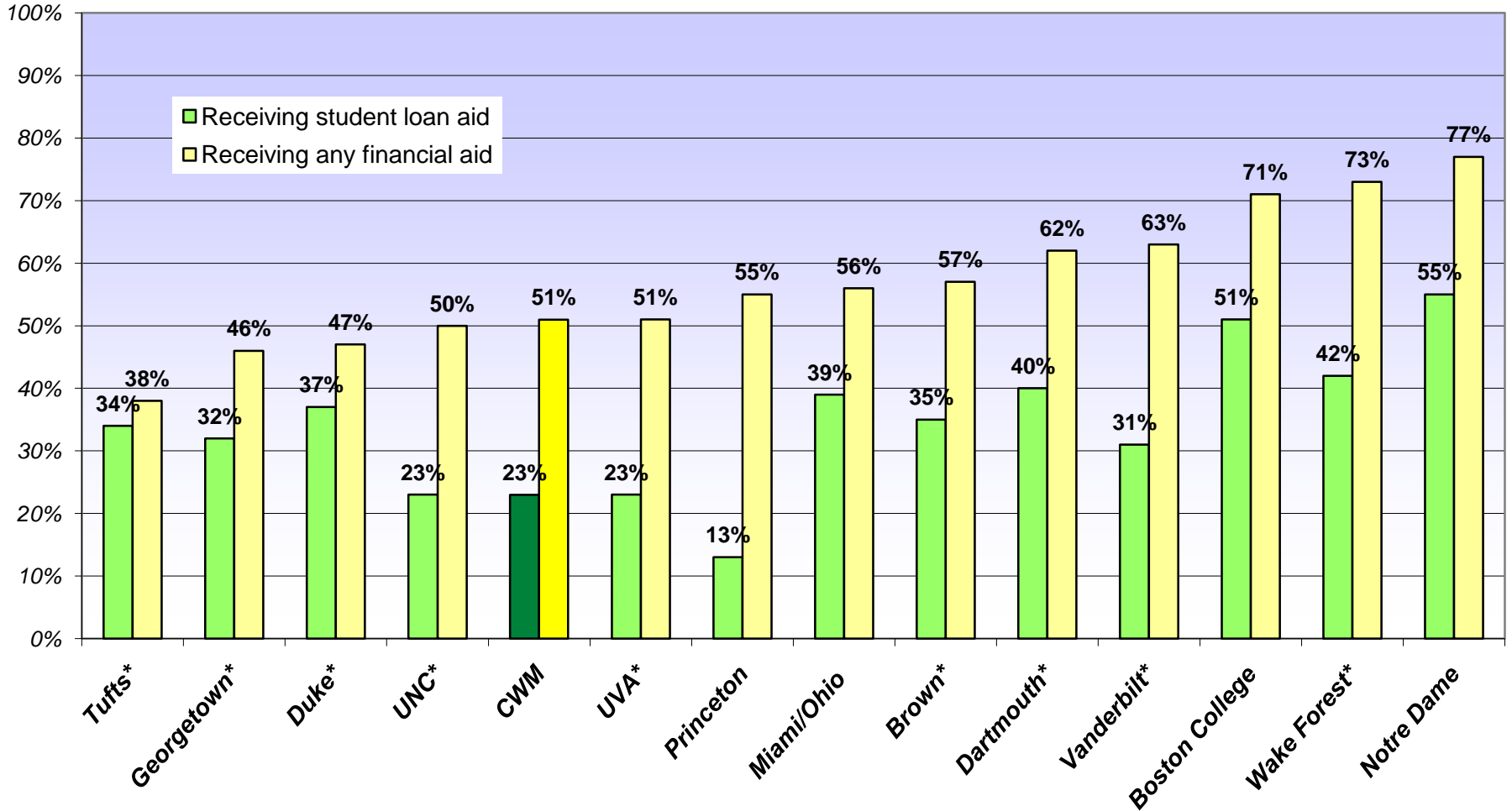

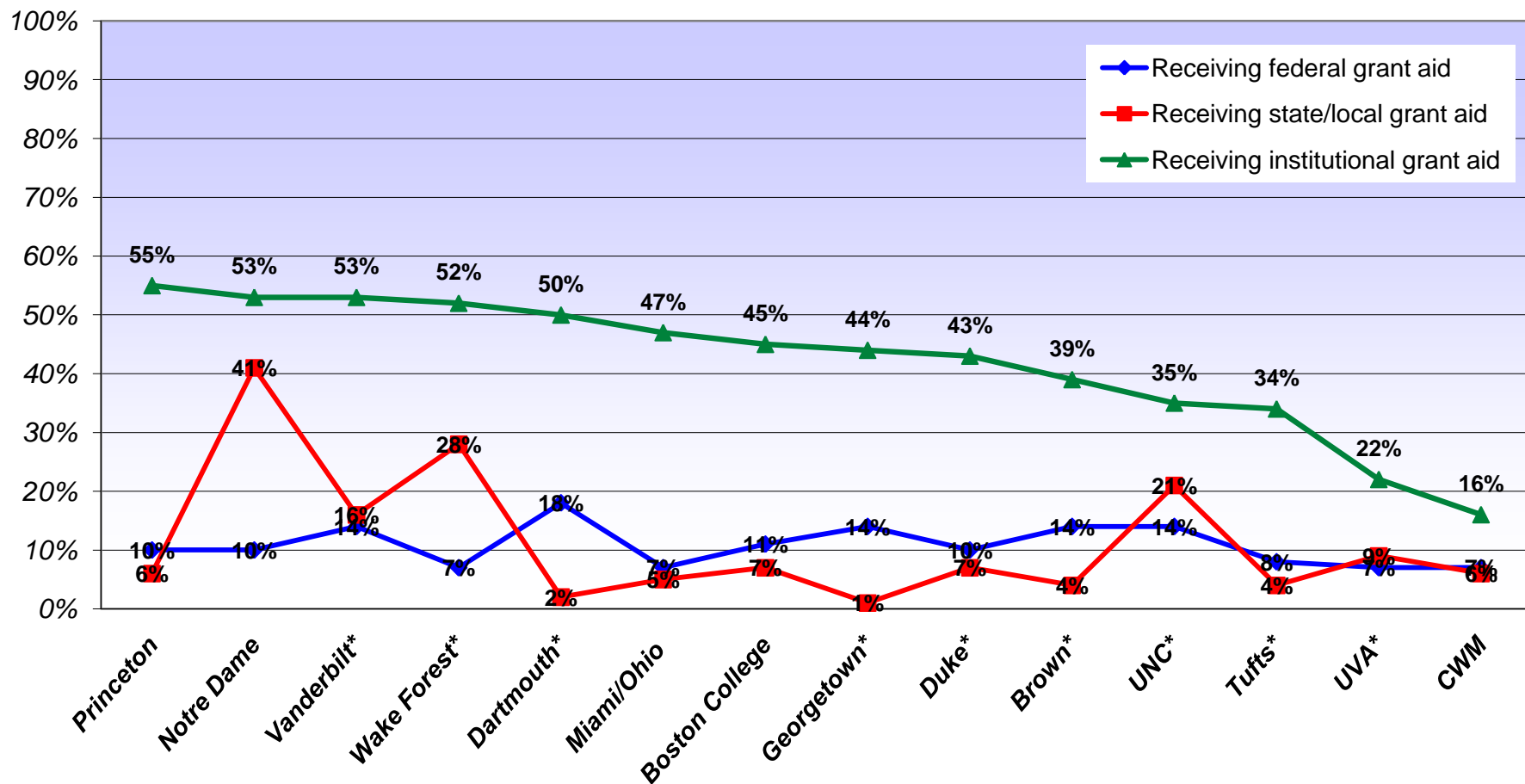

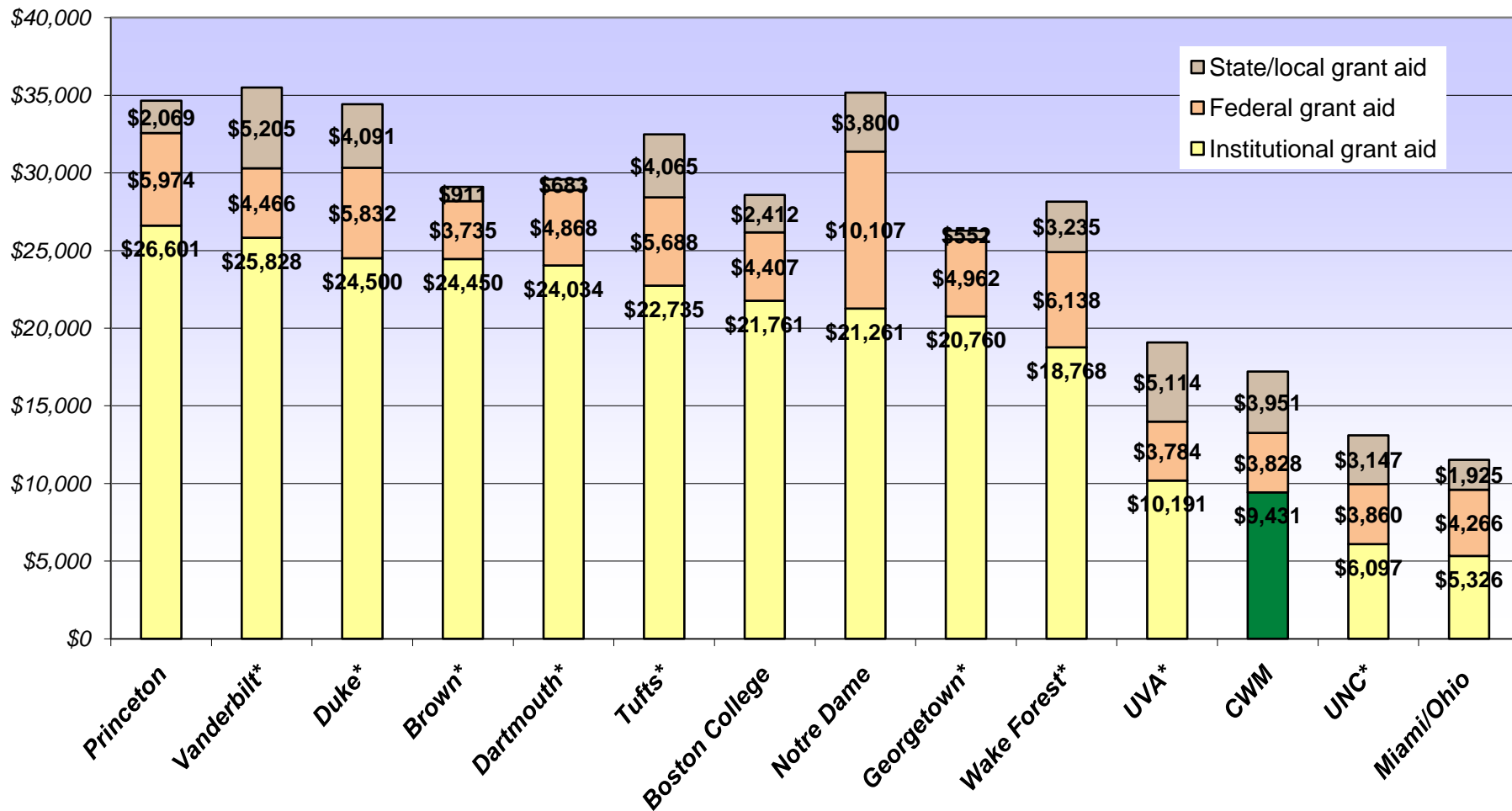
