The County Court of King William, on Monday, entered an order submitting to the voters of this county the question of subscription to the Richmond and Southwestern Railroad Company: the vote will be taken on Tuesday, 31st August next.

The maximum amount that can be subscribed by the county is \$25,000, condition on which the subscription can be made, is, that the bonds of the county shall, not issue until the Road is completed through the county of King William.
