## **The Cabell Foundation, Inc.'s History and Graveyard Policy**

In 1955, the monument to Dr. William Cabell and Elizabeth Burks in the Liberty Hall graveyard was damaged. As a result, in 1957, the Cabell Foundation was established

“to acquire and care for Cabell Family graveyards, wherever they may be found. All persons who are descendants of Dr. William Cabell (1699-1774) and Elizabeth Burks (1706-1756) of Liberty Hall near Warminster, Nelson County, Virginia shall be eligible for membership.”

The Foundation has acquired title to both the Liberty Hall and the Union Hill graveyards. In the 1960's the Board of Directors voted to close Liberty Hall to future burials and on March 23, 2002, the Board voted to close Union Hill to future burials.

### **THE CABELL FOUNDATION, INC.**

#### **GRAVEYARD POLICY**

**Meeting of the Board of Directors  
June 28, 2003**

**In order to establish a formal graveyard policy, the Board reviewed and discussed all available background documents: Suggestions from minutes of prior Board meetings; average costs for annual maintenance of current graveyards; past costs for replacement of iron fences; prior suggestions for eligibility as a “Cabell graveyard selected for Foundation maintenance.” Special consideration was given to the minutes of the Aug. 25, 1991 Board meeting: “Proposed criteria for what is a Cabell Graveyard: It must fall within the land holdings of Dr. William Cabell and contain five-or more stones of the descendants of Dr. William Cabell.....” No action was taken in 1991.**

Realizing that financial restraints must be of paramount importance, the following was unanimously adopted as Current Policy for Cabell Graveyards as of June 28, 2003:

1. **Definition of an eligible Cabell graveyard.**
  - a. **The property must fall within the land holdings of Dr. William Cabell, (4800 tract along both sides of the James River) and**
  - b. **It must contain the grave of at least one child or grandchild of Dr. William Cabell and his wife, Elizabeth Burks Cabell, and**
  - c. **It must also contain a total of no less than five graves: descendants of Dr. and Mrs. Cabell or the spouses of those descendants.**
  
2. **For graveyards currently owned by the Foundation (“Liberty Hall” and “Union Hill”):**
  - a. **The Foundation will provide regular care and maintenance for the graveyards it owns, which typically will include up to 4 grass mowings a year, general repairs to fences, removal of trees and brush, cleaning and repair of headstones and markers and filling sunken graves. All cleaning of headstones must be done using previously approved methods. All expenditures for the foregoing shall be subject to budgetary limitations established by the Board, and to limitations or conditions contained in the By-laws.**
  
  - b. **If capital expenditures are deemed necessary, the chair of the Graveyard Committee shall consult with the Treasurer and present the matter to the Board with recommendations for action.**
  
3. **For those graveyards which the Foundation does not own but currently maintains, general mowing only will be provided, up to four times annually. In recent years, this traditionally has included Inglewood, Fork Field and occasionally, Soldier’s Joy. In recognition of this tradition, the Foundation will continue to provide general mowing to these three cemeteries, should the owners so desire.**
  
4. **If requests for routine maintenance of new property are received by the Board, those properties must meet the above definition of eligible Cabell graveyards; maintenance will be limited to routine mowing. Maintenance of new properties must be approved by the Board.**
  
5. **Requests for the acquisition of additional property or offers of additional graveyards will not be considered unless the property is an eligible Cabell graveyard. In deciding whether or not to acquire such property, future financial obligations which may result will be a paramount consideration as well as rights of legal access. Any such acquisition or acceptance must be approved by the Board and also be in conformity with applicable provisions of the bylaws.**

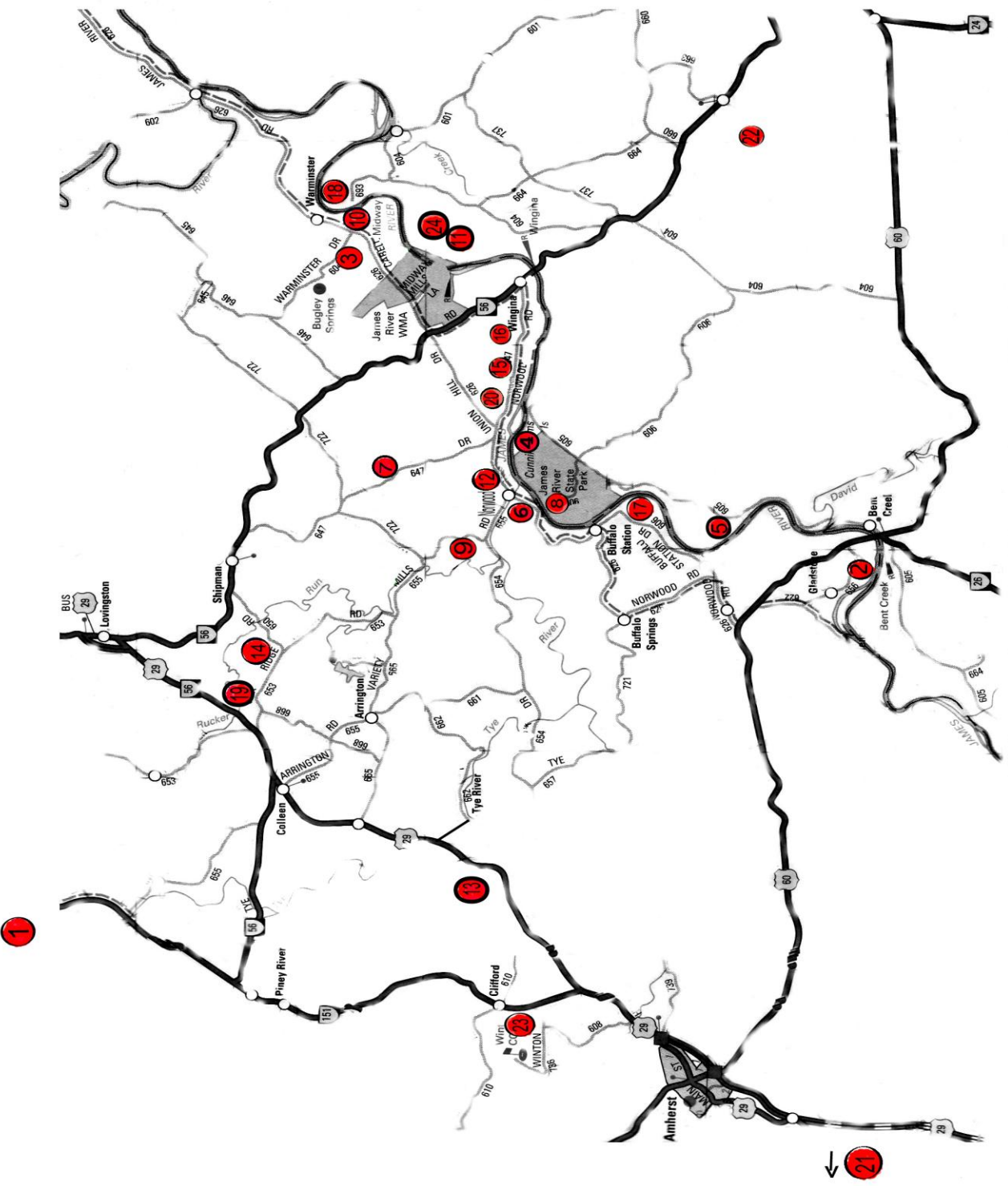

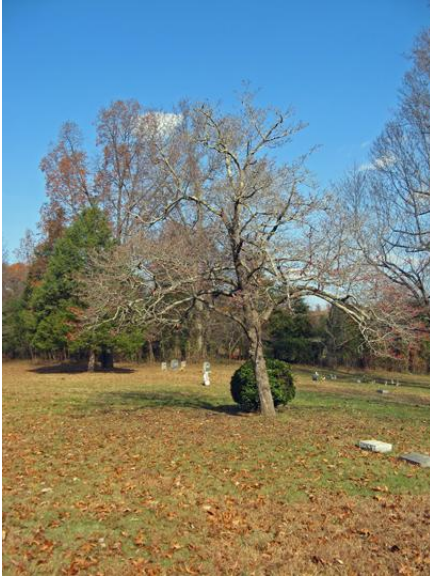




## Centre Hill

Located in Nelson County near the present site of Gladstone Station, Centre Hill was the home of Mary Cabell, daughter of Dr. William Cabell, and William Horsley. The home is no longer in existence. Mary Cabell and William Horsley were both buried at Center Hill although the exact site in the graveyard is unknown. Centre Hill or Gladstone Community Cemetery is now a public graveyard with approximately 60 gravesites.

From Route 29 south, turn left on Route 60 east and proceed 16.6 miles. Turn right on Route 656 for 0.5 mile then turn right on Route 691 for 0.1 mile then turn left to driveway.

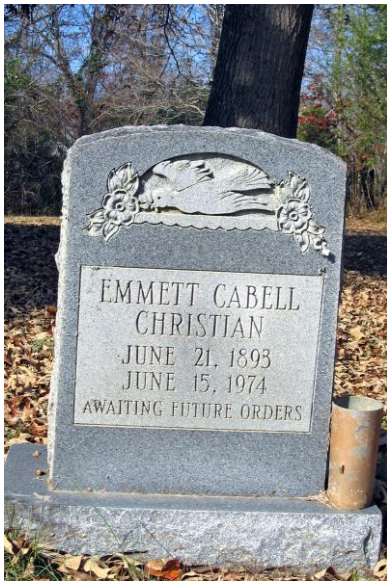

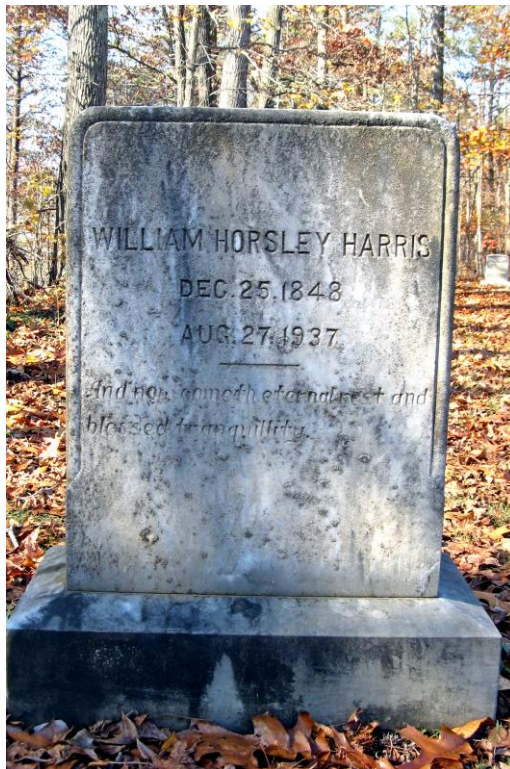

## Elm Cottage

John Cabell moved to Elm Cottage from Green Hill. Although he died at Elm Cottage in 1815, it is assumed that he was buried at Green Hill. Located in Buckingham County, Elm Cottage became the home of Maria Graf & Thomas S. McClelland, Jr. (grandson of Col. William Cabell, Jr.) and their daughter Mary Greenway McClelland in 1859. 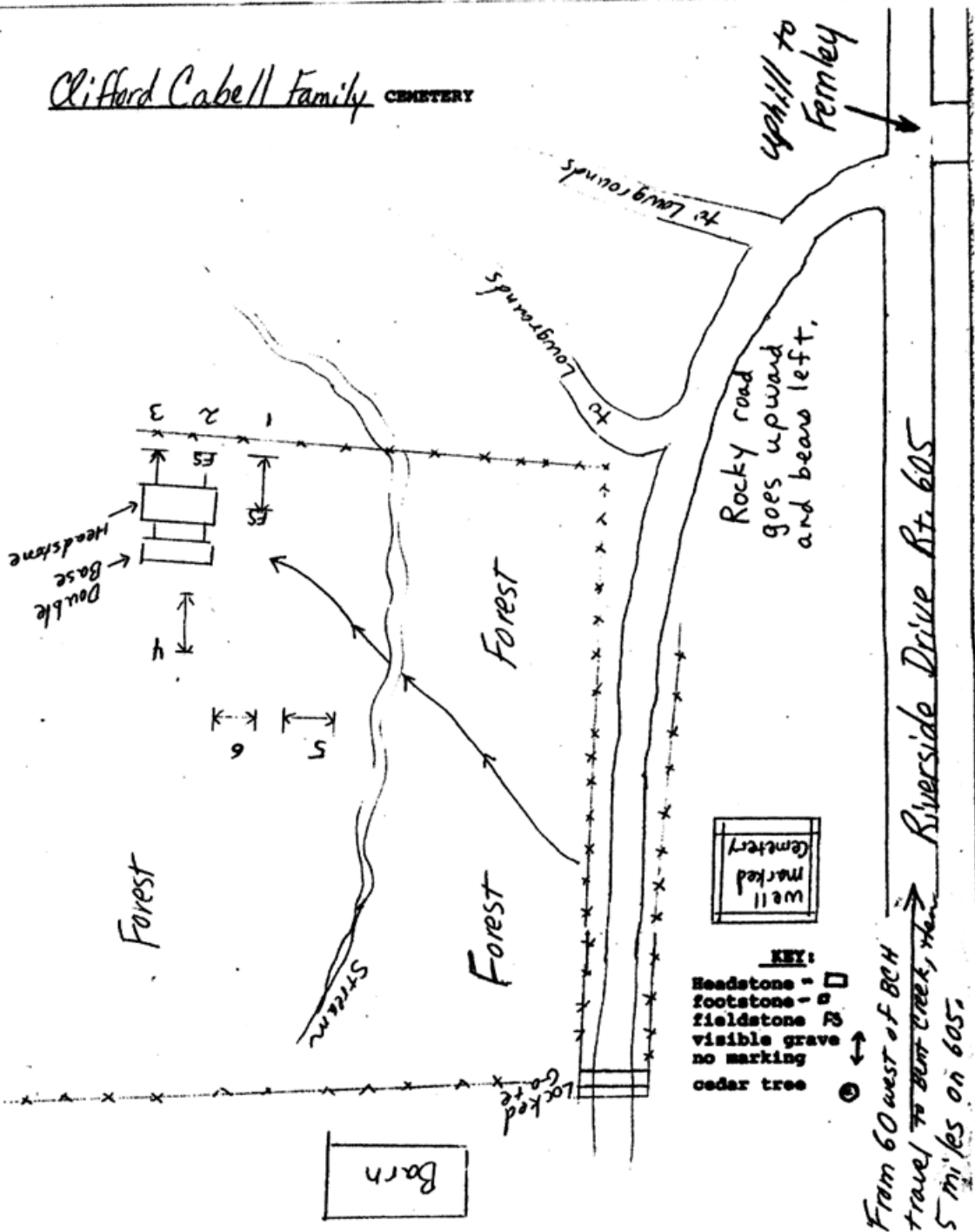

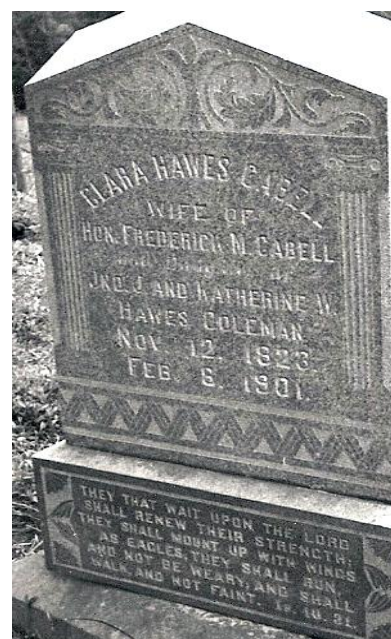

## Glenmore

Glenmore was built in 1820 by Dr. George Callaway and his wife, Mary Elizabeth Cabell. Alexander Brown, author of *The Cabell's and Their Kin*, was born at Glenmore in 1843.

## Green Hill

## Liberty Hall

Dr. William Cabell built Liberty Hall after 1741 on Swan Creek. The house was inherited by Col. Nicholas Cabell who made numerous changes to the house. Upon Nicholas's death, his son, Nicholas Cabell, Jr. inherited Liberty Hall and then it was left to Nathaniel Francis Cabell. The house burned in 1895.

The graveyard monument in memory of Dr. William Cabell and his wife was erected by their grandson, Joseph Carrington Cabell. A tree fell on the monument in 1955 and in 1957 the Cabell Foundation Inc. was established to care for Cabell family graveyards.

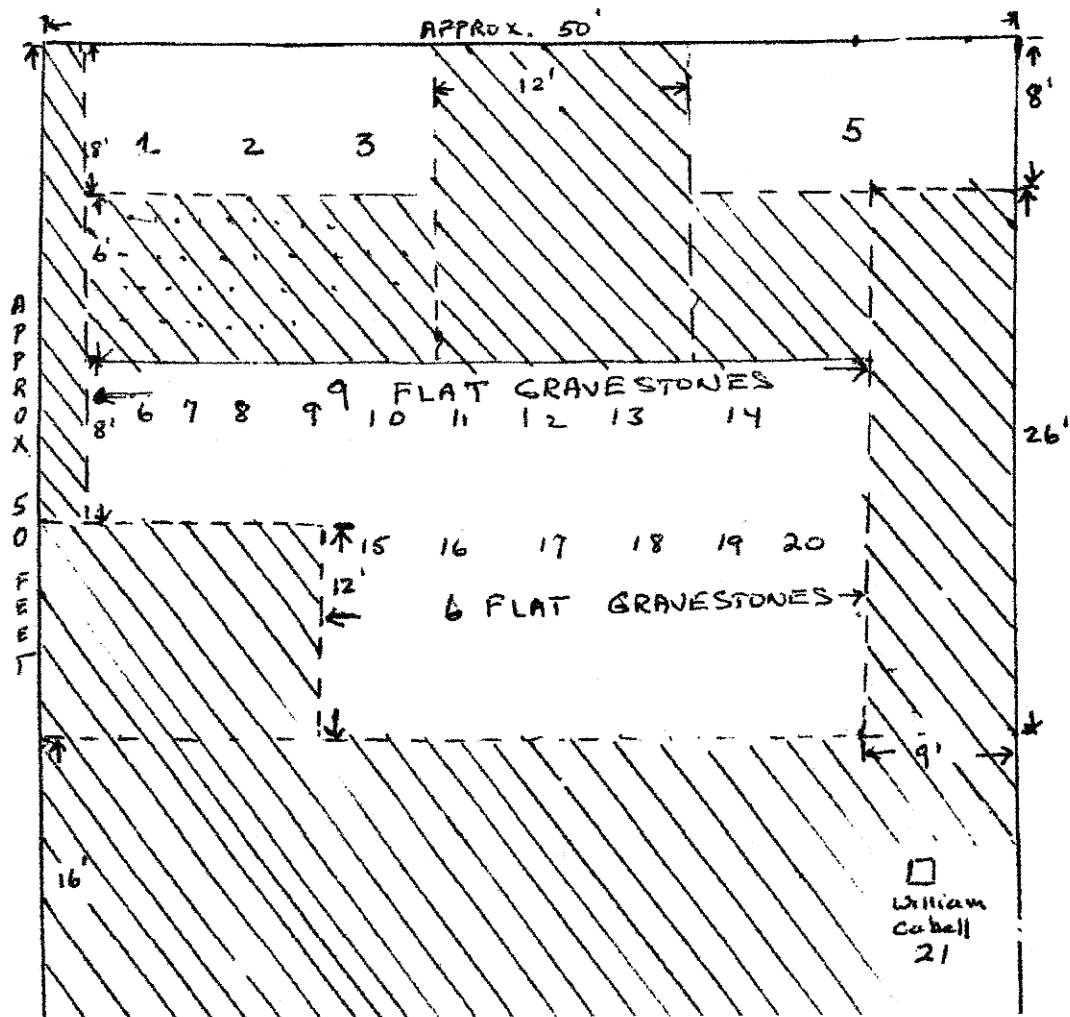

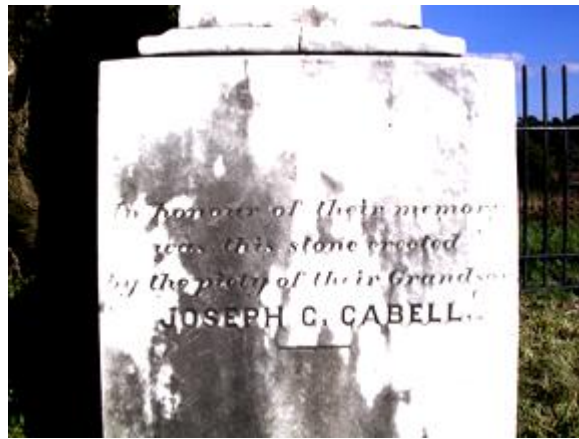
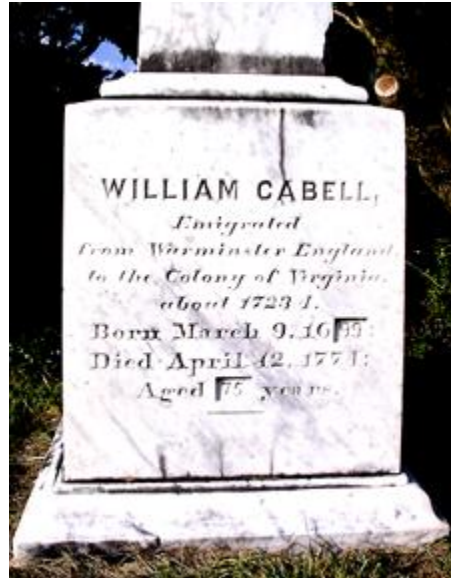

## Montevideo/Repton

Joseph Cabell, Jr. (1762-1831) built Repton in 1785 in Buckingham County. William H. Cabell changed the name to Montevideo when he bought the property in 1809. The house was destroyed by fire during the Civil War.

Joseph Cabell, Jr. may have been buried here, but there is no proof. Joseph's first wife, Pocahontas Bolling Cabell (1765-1803) died and was buried at her family's home, Chellowe in Buckingham County. In 1811, Joseph moved to Kentucky where he died.

## Montezuma

The original name of Montezuma was Spring Hill. The house was built by Col. William Cabell, Sr. (1730-1798) somewhere between 1783-1790. One source says the home was built for Col. William Cabell's son, Hector who lived there from at least 1798 until his death in 1807. Landon, another son of Col. William Cabell, lived at Montezuma in 1794 prior to moving to Nassau Plantation.

## Soldier's Joy

Soldier's Joy was built between 1783-1785 for Col. Samuel Jordan Cabell. In 1825, Samuel Cabell, Jr. sold the house to Daniel Higginbotham whose sister-in-law was Margaret, Samuel's daughter. John London bought the home in 1853. Around 1894, Charles T. & Alice Winston Cabell Palmer or their children, Margaret, Alice & Clifford Palmer (descendents of John) purchased Soldier's Joy. Charles Wood bought the house in 1924 and it remains in the Wood family.

The original rock wall which enclosed the graveyard no longer remains. Supposedly Col. Samuel Cabell & his wife, Sarah Syme, were buried under a tall rock pyramid in the graveyard. According to Cliff Wood, when his father bought Soldier's Joy in 1924, the pyramid had already fallen down and in the 1950's the remaining rocks were cleared and thrown in a nearby ice pit.

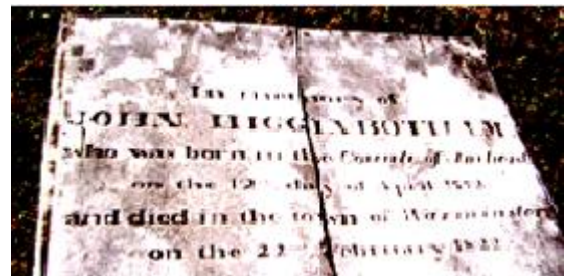

## Struman

## Traveller's Rest

Located in Buckingham County, Traveller's Rest was possibly built in the first half of the 18<sup>th</sup> century by William Horsley (1726-1760), husband of Mary Cabell (1727-1760). Major Charles Yancey lived at Traveller's Rest and his daughter, Mary Chambers Yancey married John Horsley (1785-1827), grandson of William and Mary Cabell Horsley.

The home remained in the family until 1971.

There are two graveyards – the original and a newer one closer to the house. Nancy Faxon has restored the original graveyard.

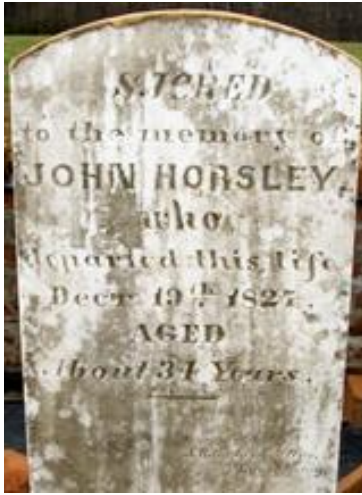

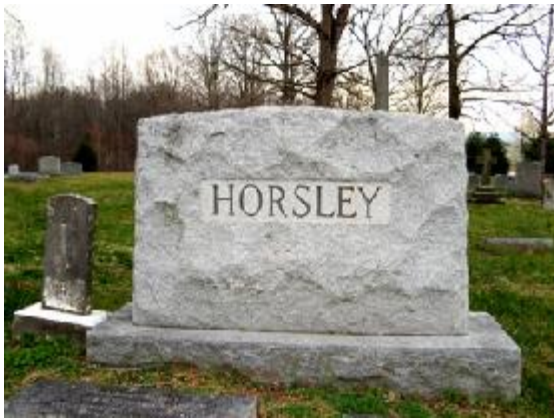

## Union Hill

Col. William Cabell, Sr. built Union Hill in 1775-1778. In addition to William & Margaret Jordan Cabell, Anne Carrington & Col. William Cabell, Jr., Elizabeth & William H. Cabell, and Lucy & Mayo Cabell lived at Union Hill. Alexander Brown purchased the home in the 1870's and it remained in the family through Edmund Marshall Cabell and his children Randolph McGuire Cabell, Elizabeth Cabell Dugdale and Ruth Holmes Cabell Brand. It was sold in 1969 but the Cabell Foundation retains ownership of the graveyard.

## Verdant Vale

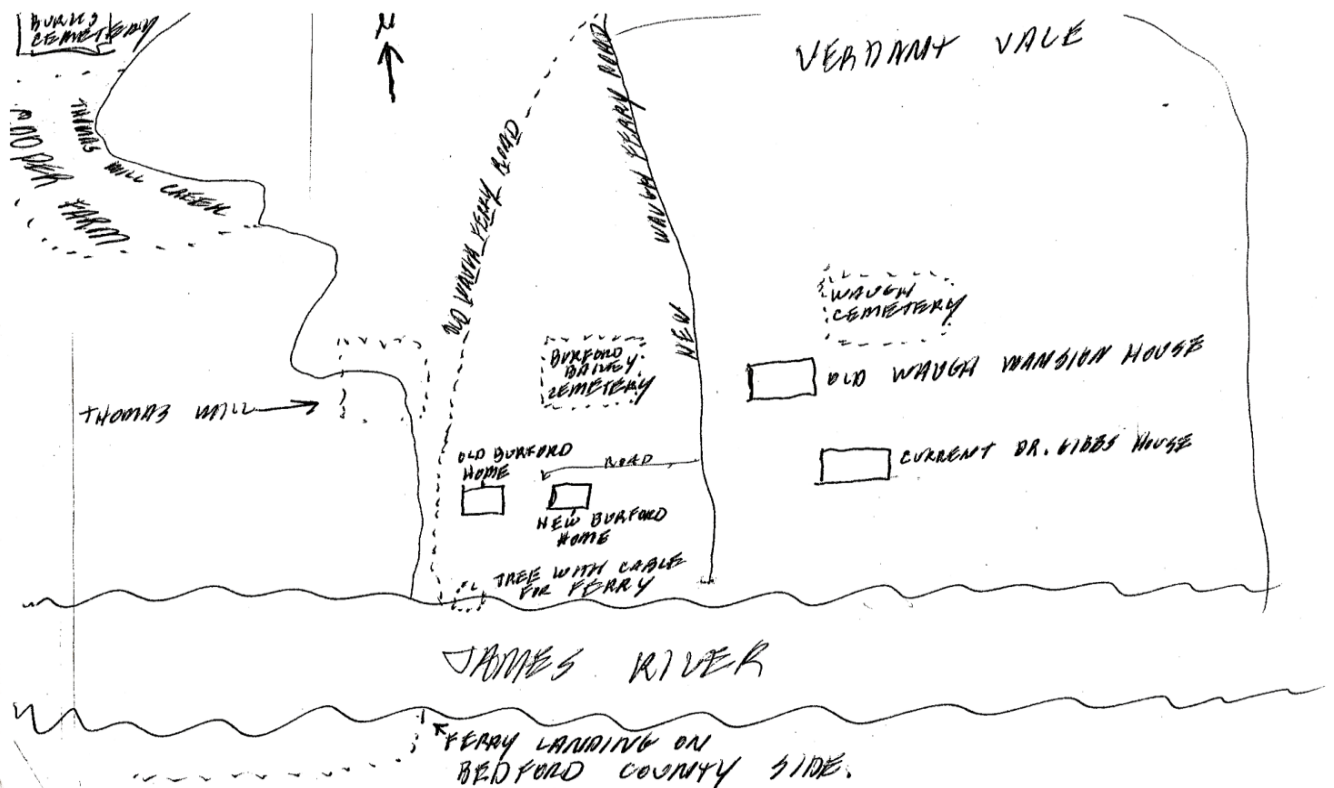
Verdant Vale, located in Amherst County near Waugh's Ferry, was the home of Elizabeth Horsley McCulloch and her husband Roderick McCulloch.

After the house burned about 1819 or 1820, the McCullochs moved in with their daughter, Isabella McCulloch Waugh (1784-1860), on an adjoining farm.

Supposedly Isabella McCulloch Waugh was buried in cemetery on the property but the location is unknown; however the Waugh graveyard remains.

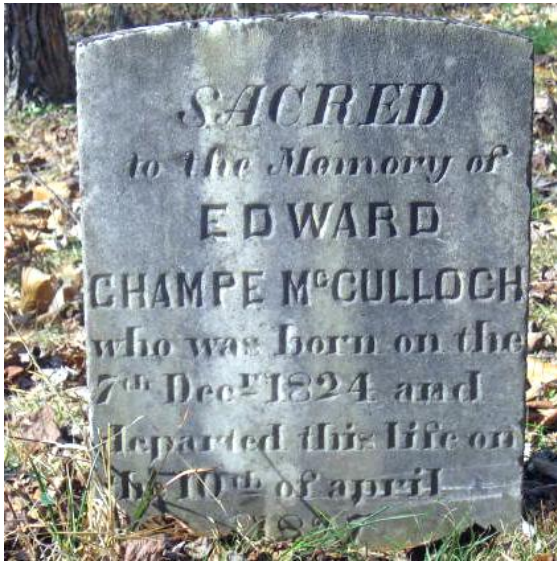

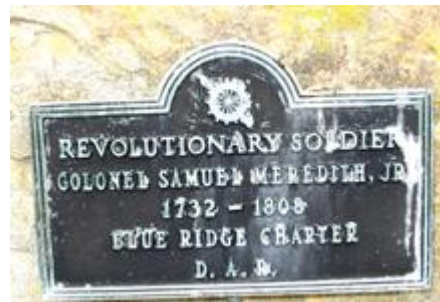

### Zion Hill/Sion Hill/Yellow Gravel

The house known as Zion Hill, Sion Hill and Yellow Gravel was located in Buckingham County. The home of Joseph Cabell (1732-1798) was built in 1785 and is no longer in existence. Joseph and his wife, Mary Hopkins (1735-1811) were buried at Zion Hill but the stones and remains were relocated in Ridgewood, NJ by Robert H. Cabell sometime prior to 1959.
