Top Storylines

- William and Mary opens its 99th season of men's basketball on Sunday ... The Tribe's all-time record is 1010-1126 (.473).
- The game is also the William and Mary (and Division I) debut for head coach **Tony Shaver** ... Shaver put together a record of 358-121 (.747) in an outstanding 17-year career at Division III Hampden-Sydney ... While there, he led the Tigers to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference championships, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Tournament appearances (including trips to the Final Four in 1999 and 2003)
- Tribe senior forward **Adam Hess** was voted the 2003-04 Colonial Athletic Association Preseason Player of the Year at the league's media day on October 29 in Washington, DC ... With 20.1 points per game last season, he is the conference's top-returning scorer and is the only returning first team All-CAA selection.
- Sunday's game will be just the second meeting between W&M and Liberty ... Last season the Flames defeated the Tribe, 62-61, in Lynchburg ... Prior to last season, Liberty was the only Division I team in Virginia that the Tribe had never faced.
- The Tribe ended last season with a record of 12-16 (.429) ... W&M finished eighth in the CAA with a league record of 7-11 (.389).
- W&M won both of its preseason exhibition games ... The Tribe defeated GT Express, 94-76, and beat Interhoop, a team from Lithuania, 69-61 ... **Adam Hess** led the team with an average of 29.0 points in the two games ... Three players, senior forward **Zeb Cope**, sophomore guard **Taylor Mokris** and redshirt-freshman center **Brian Hutt**, each averaged a team-best 8.0 rebounds in the two games ... W&M shot .468 (59-126) from the floor and .385 (15-39) from beyond the three-point line in the two games, while holding the opposition to just a .371 (46-124) FG% and a .313 (21-67) 3FG% ... The Tribe also held a 45.0 to 31.5 rebounding advantage in the two contests

W&M's Adam Hess Voted CAA Pre-season Player of the Year

Senior forward **Adam Hess** was voted the 2003-04 Colonial Athletic Association's Preseason Player of the Year by the media at the conference's annual media day, held at the Washington, DC ESPNZone on November 29 ... Hess was also projected by *Sporting News* as the league's best player ... No W&M player has ever been named CAA Player of the Year at the end of the season ... Only twice in history has a Tribe men's basketball player been selected as any league's player of the year ... **Jeff Cohen** (1961) and **Tom Jasper** (1971) were each named Southern Conference Player of the Year ... Hess has been unanimously picked to be the only player this season to repeat as a first team All-CAA honoree, including predictions by the conference's coaches and media and numerous publications, including *Athlon*, *Basketball News*, *Lindy's*, *Sporting News*, and *Street & Smith's*.

And He's Smart, Too

Not only is **Adam Hess** one of the top players in the conference and the state, but he also excels in the classroom ... Last season he was named a second team Academic All-American and was picked to the Academic All-District III team ... In addition, Hess earned his second se-

lection to the CAA All-Academic Team and was named the league's first ever Men's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year.

Late Start

W&M is the second-to-last CAA team to open the 2003-04 season ... Only Drexel, with its first game against Pennsylvania at the Palestra on Nov. 24, has a later start.

Season Openers

Despite losing its last two, W&M has won four of its last seven season openers and is 51-47 (.520) in the first game of the year ... Last season the Tribe began the year with a 79-76 home loss to Fordham on Nov. 22, 2002 ... The College's last season-opening win was an 87-62 defeat of High Point on Nov. 17, 2000.

Back-to-Back Games

W&M will open the 2003-04 season with games on consecutive days in different locations (Nov. 23 at home vs. Liberty and Nov. 24 at Radford) ... It is the first time W&M has played on consecutive days in different arenas since the 1976-77 season, when the Tribe won at UC Santa Barbara (78-65) on Dec. 22, 1976, before falling at eighth-ranked UCLA (59-55) on Dec. 23 ... The following year was the last time that W&M opened a season with games on consecutive days, as the Tribe began the year at the Spider Classic, defeating Virginia Commonwealth (55-54) on Nov. 25, 1977 and falling to St. Joseph's (69-60) on Nov. 26.

W&M Coaching Debuts

Tony Shaver is looking to become the 12th of W&M's 30 head men's basketball coaches to win his Tribe debut ... W&M's first-year coaches have done well since the start of the 1974-75 season, with four of the six winning their first game at the College, and the other two losing by just three points each ... The last time a Tribe mentor had a winning record in his first season at W&M was **Bruce Parkhill's** 16-10 (.615) mark in the 1977-78 campaign.

Hess 30-Point Games

Last season **Adam Hess** set a school record with five 30-point games in a single season ... He also had two games in which he just missed the mark, scoring 29 points ... With 31 points at Campbell on Dec. 30, 2002 and 33 points against Charleston Southern on Jan. 2, 2003, he became the first W&M player with 30 or more points in consecutive games since the 1966-67 season, when **Ron Panneton** had 31 against Hampden-Sydney on Jan. 11, 1967 and put up 38 at Richmond on Jan. 14, 1967.

No Harm ...

Last season the Tribe ranked 14th in the nation in fewest personal fouls per game, with an average of just 16.1 ... W&M's total of 451 (in 28 games) was the program's fifth-fewest ever, and the least in a single season since the 1978-79, when the Tribe committed 449 in 26 games ... The school record is 389 (in 22 games) set in 1964-65.

Guard the Line

One area that the Tribe hopes to improve on this year is its defense of the three-point line ... Last season, W&M opponents shot .360 (250-695) from beyond the arc ... The 250 three pointers made is by far the most ever allowed in a season by the Tribe ... The previous high was 178 given up in the 2000-01 campaign ... Opposing teams outscored W&M, 750-522, from the three-point line, a difference of 228 points, which was almost twice the margin by which the Tribe was outscored all of last season (119 points).

Taking Care of the Ball

W&M ranked tied with Akron for 23rd in Division I last season with just 12.5 turnovers per game ... W&M's 349 giveaways was the second-fewest in a season since the stat was consistently kept (1975-76 season), trailing only the 1984 season when the Tribe had 340 turnovers.

Keeping it in the State

W&M is scheduled to play 13 regular season games this year against in-state opponents ... The Tribe will play nine of the other 12 Division I schools in Virginia ... The only in-state Division schools that W&M won't face this season are Norfolk State, Richmond and VMI.

Head Coach Tony Shaver

On May 2, 2003, the William and Mary athletics department announced the hiring of Tony Shaver as the 30th men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Shaver came to W&M after coaching for 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

Last season, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four for the second time in his career, as his team finished the season with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. H-SC opened the 2003 season by winning its first 22 games and was ranked as high as second in the nation as it finished the regular season with a record of 23-1.

In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished with a record of 29-3, setting a school record for the most wins in a single season.

Together with his team's successes on the court, Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999)

and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally

a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (22), a senior pitcher on W&M's baseball team, Austin (18) and Jackson (12).
