Top Storylines

- William and Mary travels to face Towson on Wednesday, looking to win the Tribe's third straight game against the Tigers ... The Tribe is also hoping to end a season-long four-game losing streak, after ending one of W&M's toughest stretches of the season.
- The Tribe holds a 6-3 advantage in the series with Towson and has a 3-1 record against the Tigers in CAA play ... Most of those wins have come in Williamsburg, as the Tribe is just 1-3 on the road against Towson ... Last season W&M defeated the Tigers 74-55 in Williamsburg and 59-52 in Towson, Maryland .. The series began with a 94-31 W&M win in the 1948-49 season, the worst loss in Towson history.
- W&M is led by first-year head coach **Tony Shaver** ... Shaver put together a record of 358-121 (.747) in an outstanding 17-year career at Division III Hampden-Sydney prior to joining the Tribe ... While there, he led the Tigers to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference championships, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Tournament appearances (including trips to the Final Four in 1999 and 2003).
- Senior forward **Adam Hess** was voted the 2003-04 CAA Preseason Player of the Year by the league's media ... Through Jan. 12, Hess leads the CAA in scoring with 19.1 points per game, and is ranked in the top-15 in the league in seven other categories ... With a layup in the second half at UNCW (1/7), he scored the 1,000th point of his W&M career, and currently has 1,021 in a Tribe uniform ... He has a total of 1,267 points in his career, including 246 in his freshman season at Eastern Michigan ... With 20.1 points per game last season, he is the conference's top-returning scorer and is the only returning first team All-CAA selection.
- Shaver was well-known for his up-tempo style at H-SC and he is continuing to implement that philosophy at W&M ... The Tribe is averaging 69.6 points per game this season ... The last season in which W&M averaged at least 70 ppg was the 1995-96 campaign, when the Tribe scored 74.0 ppg ... W&M has scored at least 80 points in four games this season, after totalling just four 80-point games in the last three seasons combined.

Cofield Named CAA Rookie of the Week

Freshman forward **Corey Cofield** was picked as the CAA Rookie of the Week on Monday, following a three-game stretch in which he averaged 17.7 points and 5.7 rebounds per game, while shooting 66.7% (22-33) from the field ... At home against George Mason (1/10) he led all scorers with a career-high 22 points on 8-11 shooting from the floor and 6-8 from the free throw line ... He also had 14 points and eight rebounds at UNCW (1/7) and 17 points, seven rebounds and four assists at Virginia (1/5) ... This season he is third on the team with 10.2 points and 4.5 rebounds per game and is second in the conference with a .605 field goal percentage.

Seeing Improvement

Three players in particular this season, senior **Zeb Cope**, junior **Nick D'Antoni** and sophomore **Taylor Mokris** are seeing significant improvement under first-year head coach **Tony Shaver** ... Each of the three has more than doubled his scoring average from last season ... Cope recorded the first double-double of his career at VCU (12/6) with game-highs in points (21) and rebounds (11) ... He has also been given the green light to shoot from the outside, and is connecting on 35.9% (14-39) of his shots from the three-

point line, after shooting just 1-4 from long range in his first three seasons ... With a team-high 58 assists, D'Antoni already has more than doubled the 27 he compiled all of last season.

Four times this season, the high-scoring games of **Adam Hess** have ranked him in the top 20 in the nation in scoring on that particular day ... That includes his 27 points on Nov. 23 against Liberty, the second-most points scored by one player that day, and his 27 against Hampton on Dec. 19, tied for the fourth-best total of the day ... Through Jan. 12, his average of 19.1 ppg was first in the CAA.

W&M's Adam Hess Voted CAA Pre-season Player of the Year

Senior forward **Adam Hess** was voted the 2003-04 Colonial Athletic Association's Preseason Player of the Year by the media at the conference's annual media day, held at the Washington, DC ESPNZone on October 29 ... Hess was also projected by *Sporting News* as the league's best player ... No W&M player has ever been named CAA Player of the Year at the end of the season ... Only twice in history has a Tribe men's basketball player been selected as any league's player of the year ... **Jeff Cohen** (1961) and **Tom Jasper** (1971) were each named Southern Conference Player of the Year ... Hess has been unanimously picked to be the only player this season to repeat as a first team All-CAA honoree, including predictions by the conference's coaches and media and numerous publications, including *Athlon*, *Basketball News*, *Lindy's*, *Sporting News*, and *Street & Smith's*.

Tony Shaver Ninth in Nation

Through Jan. 12, W&M head coach **Tony Shaver** had the ninth-best winning percentage in the nation among active Division I coaches, taking into account results from every level of college basketball ... Shaver currently has a record of 362-130 (.736).

Helping Hand

Junior point guard **Nick D'Antoni** appears to have returned to the level of play that earned him CAA All-Rookie accolades two seasons ago ... The nephew of Phoenix Suns head coach Mike D'Antoni, Nick is leading the team with 58 assists against just 31 turnovers this season ... Through Jan. 12, he was fifth in the CAA with a 1.87 assist-to-turnover ratio and third with an average of 4.25 assists per game.

1,000 Points (Again)

Adam Hess became the 25th player in W&M history to score 1,000 points in his Tribe career when he scored a layup with 17:21 left in the second half at UNCW (1/7) ... He currently is 23rd in W&M history with 1,021 points while playing for the College and is the fifth W&M player to accomplish the feat while totalling three or less seasons in a Tribe uniform ... Hess scored 246 points in his freshman season at Eastern Michigan before transferring to W&M, and has 1,267 points in his college career ... Ironically, he scored the 1,000th point of his overall college career at UNCW last season ... Hess is averaging 17.0 points per game in his W&M career, eighth-best in school history ... The last person to score 1,000 points for W&M while playing less than four years is also the only person to do it in just two seasons ... **Bob Sherwood** scored 545 points in 1967-68 and had 506 in the 1969-70 campaign, for a total of 1,051 ... **Jim Moran** was the last Tribe player to get

Career Night

Sophomore **Nate Loehrke** stepped in at UNCW (1/7) with the best performance of his career ... The 6-10 center set then-career highs in points (7), rebounds (5) and assists (2), while tying his career bests in blocked shots (2) and minutes (16) ... He continued his solid play at home against George Mason (1/10), resetting his career-high in scoring with eight points ... Loehrke has scored 15 of his 42 career points in the last two games.

Road Woes

Since the start of the 1998-99 campaign, W&M has had a tough time winning on the road ... Since then the Tribe has a record of 13-59 (.181) on its opponents home court, including a 6-38 (.136) record against CAA foes ... W&M's record since then at home is 42-27 (.609) and the Green and Gold is 3-9 (.250) in games on a neutral court ... This year, the Tribe is 0-7 on the road and has lost nine straight road contests, dating back to last season.

The Tribe spent part of its extended stay last week in Charlottesville on the other kind of hardwood—a bowling alley ... Junior point guard **Nick D'Antoni** demonstrated his versatility by posting a team-high single-game score of 223 ... Also impressive was junior guard **Reid Markham** who, with his dominant broken right hand in a cast, was still able to roll a 109 with his left.

More Praise for Hess

Many people that cover William and Mary and the Colonial Athletic Association know of the abilities of senior forward **Adam Hess**, as evidenced by his selection by the media as the league's

preseason player of the year ... Now the national media is also jumping on the bandwagon, starting with a recent piece on the website collegeinsider.com, that focuses on mid-major Division I teams ... In a recent front page article on the site, Matt Drake wrote that he believes Hess may be "the BEST mid-major player in America," adding, "the Michigan native plays with poise and has an excellent shooting stroke, with seemingly unlimited range. Sure there are a lot of players with quicker feet and more pure talent, but few are as complete a player as Hess."

High Scoring Tribe

This season the Tribe has scored 80 or more points four times, which is as many times as it accomplished the feat in the previous three seasons combined ... The College is currently averaging 69.6 points per game, the most for the team since the 1995-96 season, when the team averaged 74.0 ppg ... Head Coach Tony Shaver

On May 2, 2003, the William and Mary athletics department announced the hiring of Tony Shaver as the 30th men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Shaver came to W&M after coaching for 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

Last season, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four for the second time in his career, as his team finished the season with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. H-SC opened the 2003 season by winning its first 22 games and was ranked as high as second in the nation as it finished the regular season with a record of 23-1.

In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished with a record of 29-3, setting a school record for the most wins in a single season.

Together with his team's successes on the court, Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999)

and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally

a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (22), a senior pitcher on W&M's baseball team, Austin (18) and Jackson (12).

William and Mary put on a shooting clinic from behind the arc, tying the arena record with 14 three-pointers in a 91-64 victory over Liberty in the Tribe's first game under new coach Tony Shaver.

With the Tribe up 25-19 and just over seven minutes remaining in the first half, that's when W&M began to turn it on from three-point range. Sophomore guard **Taylor Mokris** drained a three-pointer, followed by another trey by senior forward **Adam Hess** that put W&M ahead 31-19. After a Liberty basket, Mokris converted again from deep and two possessions later, senior **Zeb Cope** connected to make the score 37-23. Hess hit another three and then freshman guard **Adam Trumbower** converted one of his own to finalize the Tribe's run and break the game open at 43-23.

The halftime stats told the tale of the shooting percentages, as Liberty (0-2) was connecting on 39.3 percent of its shots from the field, including 1 of 8 (.125) from three-point range. W&M, meanwhile, made 56.7 percent of its first half shots, including an incredible 9 of 13 (.692) from beyond the three-point arc.

The second half was more of the same for the Tribe, as three of W&M's first five field goals were three-pointers. W&M continued to impress offensively and played sound defensive basketball, as the lead went up to as many as 30 points on a few occasions before Liberty made a free throw in the final seconds to set the final margin of 27 points in the Tribe's favor.

The Tribe had a balanced offensive attack, with four players scoring in double figures, led by Hess. The preseason CAA Player of the Year hit 10 of his 16 shots, including five of eight from three-point range, for 27 points on the afternoon. He also contributed six rebounds and three assists.

Also impressive for W&M was Cope. The senior forward played a team-high 35 minutes and made six field goals, including two three-pointers. Coming into this season, Cope had attempted four three-pointers in his career, making just one of them. He also added a team-high eight rebounds and two steals.

Mokris was a sparkplug off of the bench for W&M, making eight of his 11 attempts for a career-high 19 points. He also collected a career-best seven rebounds.

William and Mary's men's basketball team lost at Radford, 89-86, at the Dedmon Center.

Radford took a 14-5 lead less than four minutes into the game, but W&M battled back, eventually taking a 24-23 lead on a three-pointer by junior guard **Nick D'Antoni**. Tribe senior forward **Adam Hess** keyed the comeback, scoring 10 straight points for the Green and Gold. Radford again pulled ahead, going up by seven, 35-28, with 7:05 remaining. The Tribe fought back again, however, cutting the lead to one on layups by freshman **Corey Cofield**, senior **Zeb Cope** and sophomore **Taylor Mokris**. The Highlanders went up 43-38 with 1:40 remaining, before a barrage of threes, two by D'Antoni and one by Mokris, led to W&M holding a 47-45 lead. Radford's Chris Oliver hit on one of two free throws with two seconds left to cut the Tribe lead to 47-46 at the break.

W&M extended its lead to nine points, 59-50, with 16:15 left in the second on a layup by redshirt freshman center **Brian Hutt**. Radford's Whit Holcomb-Faye single-handedly cut the lead to two, scoring seven of his game-high 29 points to bring the score to 59-57 in favor of the Tribe with 14:32 to play. Thirteen times over the next 14 minutes, the Highlanders would either cut the Tribe's lead to one, or tie the score, but on each occasion W&M responded, until Radford's Andre Bynum connected on a pair of free throws to give the home team a one-point, 87-86, lead with 32 seconds in the game. The Tribe was forced to foul down the stretch and Radford converted two of its last four free throws to secure the 89-86 win.

Hess paced the Tribe for the second straight game with 25 points, also collecting seven rebounds with four assists. Cope just missed a double-double with a career-high 17 points to go with a game-high nine rebounds, while D'Antoni added 16 points to the Tribe cause. Freshman guard **Adam Trumbower** played well coming off the bench, scoring eight points and pulling down seven rebounds, including four offensive. William and Mary senior **Adam Hess** scored 22 and classmate **Zeb Cope** added 21, as the Tribe men's basketball team defeated St. Francis College (NY), 80-60, in the first round of the Red Auerbach Colonial Classic, hosted by George Washington University at the Smith Center.

The Tribe opened the game with a 15-7 lead at the 13:03 mark, led by six points from Cope on a pair of three-pointers. SFC gradually chipped away at the lead, taking a one-point advantage of its own at the 8:47 mark on a layup by Sean Dantzler. The two sides kept the score close for the next two minutes, but from there the Tribe started to pull away, with freshman **Corey Cofield** leading W&M to a 36-30 lead with six points in less than three minutes of action. W&M opened an 11-point, 48-37, lead in the second half on a layup by redshirt-freshman **Brian Hutt** with 15:25 on the clock, before extending its advantage to 58-44 with 9:25 to play on a layup by Hess. From there the Terriers mounted a comeback, scoring nine straight points to cut the Tribe's lead to 58-53 with 5:41 left. However, it was all Green and Gold from that point on, as the College ended the game with a 22-7 run, including nine points down the stretch from Hess.

The CAA Preseason Player of the Year, Hess led all scorers with 22 points, to go with nine rebounds and four steals. For the second straight outing, Cope set a career high in scoring with 21 points. **Reid Markham** also scored in double figures with 14 points, while **Nick D'Antoni** had five assists and six points against just one turnover. Hutt also had a solid game for W&M, pulling down nine rebounds to go with his four points. Eric Thompson led SFC with a double-double, scoring 12 points and 14 rebounds. The Tribe held the Terriers to just .397 shooting from the field, including just 20.0 percent (5-25) from the three-point line. W&M shot .418 (28-67) from the floor and made 19 of 27 free throws (.704) in the contest.

The game marked the first time since 1981 that the Tribe opened an in-season tournament with a win, the last time being the Iron Duke Classic in December of 1981, when W&M defeated Auburn and Davidson to win the event.

William and Mary lost to George Washington, 73-57, in the championship game of the Red Auerbach Colonial Classic at the Smith Center. The loss drops the Tribe's record to 2-2 this season, while the Colonials improve to 4-0, winning their tournament for the 10th time in as many tries.

W&M opened the game on fire, taking a 13-2 lead over GW less than three minutes into the game. Tribe senior forward **Adam Hess** keyed the drive, scoring 11 straight points for W&M, including three three-point field goals. The host Colonials responded with a 12-1 run to tie the game at 14 with 12:26 on the clock and finally took the lead, 18-17, at 9:28, an advantage that they would maintain throughout the contest. GW would lead by as many as 12 points in the half, ending the period ahead 36-26.

The second half began much the same as the first, as the Tribe scored seven unanswered points to close to within three, 36-33, at the 18:13 mark. However, the Colonials soon built an insurmountable lead, scoring 13 straight at one point, and leading by as many as 21 in the half. W&M would get no closer than 14 points the rest of the way and was unable to connect on a field goal in the final five minutes of the contest, as GW won the championship, 73-57.

Hess led the all scorers for the fourth straight game with 16 points in the contest and was selected to the all-tournament team for his efforts. Redshirt-freshman center **Brian Hutt** had eight rebounds, five points and two blocked shots in the game, while junior guards **Reid Markham** and **Nick D'Antoni** had nine and eight points, respectively. For GW, Mike Hall had a double-double with 13 points and 13 rebounds, while J.R. Pinnock had 15 points.

The game marked the first time all season that the Tribe offense scored fewer than 80 points in a game, as the College was held to just 34.0% shooting from the field and 25.0% from the three-point line.

Corey Cofield scored four of his career-high 17 points in overtime, including the winning layup with five seconds remaining, to give the Tribe men's basketball team a thrilling, 67-66, overtime win against two-time defending Colonial Athletic Association champions UNC Wilmington.

UNCW started the game on a tear, as Aaron Coombs scored eight points to lead the Seahawks to their biggest lead of the game at 13 points, 24-11, with 8:59 on the clock. The Tribe responded by closing out the half on a 17-9 run, led by **Nick D'Antoni** with six points and ending with a three by **Taylor Mokris** to close the half down just three points, 33-30.

Much like the Seahawks in the first half, the Tribe used a strong start to take a healthy lead in the second half. W&M opened the stanza on a 10-4 run, fueled by two three-pointers from CAA Preseason Player of the Year **Adam Hess**, as the Tribe took its first lead since the early seconds at 40-37. W&M would run out to its biggest lead of the game, nine points, at 49-40 with 11:27 left, and held the lead until the Seahawks used a 9-1 run to reclaim a one-point lead, 57-56, with 37 seconds left, on a jumper by Ed Spencer. After two Spencer free throws upped the UNCW lead to three with 14 seconds left, the Tribe, with no timeouts, quickly raced down the floor. Hess tried a running three-pointer that was off target, but the ball came down to the waiting arms of **Brian Hutt**. Hutt alertly kicked the ball out to **Adam Trumbower**, who drained a three-pointer, his only points of the game, to tie the score at 59 with 2.8 seconds remaining. UNCW had one last chance to win in regulation, but Halston Lane's jumper from 20 feet drew iron, sending the game into overtime.

UNCW took control early in the extra period, racing out to a 63-59 lead on two free throws by Taylor Lay and a jumper by Spencer. But the Tribe would not give up, as D'Antoni cut the lead to two with a wide-open layup off of a feed from Cofield. Lane sent the lead to five, 66-61, with a trifecta with two minutes left, the last Seahawk points of the evening. Cofield trimmed the lead to two with a wide-open layup with 1:38 left, and after a missed UNCW basket, Hess sank a layup the next time down the floor to close the UNCW lead to one at 66-65.

After a Tribe foul, Spencer missed the front end of a one-and-one and the rebound was corralled by **Zeb Cope**. W&M sprinted down the floor and Hess fired up a short-range jumper that fell off the side, but he chased after the ball and deflected the rebound off of a UNCW player as he was going out of bounds. On the ensuing inbound play, Cofield broke free underneath the basket and took a pass from D'Antoni for a layup that would give the Tribe a 67-66 lead with just five seconds remaining. The Seahawks had one final chance, as Spencer took the inbound pass, raced the length of the floor and pulled up for a 13-foot jumper, but it drew iron, allowing W&M to gain the win.

Hampton forward Devin Green led all scorers with a career-high 33 points and also had a game-high 10 rebounds as the Pirates defeated the William and Mary men's basketball team 79-72, at William and Mary Hall. The Pirates improve to 3-7 on the season, while the Tribe falls to 3-4.

The first half was a series of runs for both teams as each shot well from the field. The Tribe finished the first half shooting 53.1% (17-32), running out to a 12-6 lead at the 17:06 mark on a three-pointer by sophomore guard **Taylor Mokris**, but the Pirates would use a run of their own to cut into the Tribe's lead, getting as close as 16-15 with 14:25 left in the half, using consecutive three pointers from Rodney Hughes, Green and Jeff Granger. The College responded with 12 unanswered points in less than three minutes, ending with a three by senior forward **Zeb Cope** to give the Tribe its biggest lead of the game, a 13-point, 28-15 advantage.

Hampton, however, survived the Tribe's run and answered with one of its own, a 16-3 romp to tie the contest at 31. After a layup by senior forward **Adam Hess** and the ensuing free throw after he was fouled gave the College a three-point lead, Donald Didlake tied it back up with a three pointer, and a free throw by Jared Woodley gave the Pirates their first lead of the game at 35-34 with 4:42 left in the half. It was short-lived, however, as back-to-back layups from freshman forward **Corey Cofield** gave W&M a three-point lead at 38-35. Another Hampton three point field goal, this one from Granger, tied the game again, but Cofield again gave the Tribe the advantage, converting a layup while being fouled, and then hitting the free throw to give W&M a 41-38 advantage with 2:15 left. After a missed Pirate basket, Hess scored on a layup with 1:56 left, and two Hampton free throws by Green ended the first half with the Tribe leading, 43-41.

The second half was a seesaw affair, that featured eight ties and seven lead changes, as neither team led by more than four points for most of the period. Two free throws from Granger gave the Pirates a 69-68 lead with 4:50 left and HU would never trail again, as Green made one of two free throws and followed that up with a dunk to put the Pirates ahead, 72-68 with 3:14 remaining. A Hess free throw put the Tribe within three, 72-69, with 2:05 to play, but W&M would get no closer, falling to the Pirates, 79-72.

William and Mary's Hess led the Tribe with 27 points, while Mokris had 16 and Cofield added 13. Granger had 14 points to aid Hampton's cause. The difference in the contest came at the free throw line, with Hampton converting 22 of 30 (73.3%) of its foul shots, while the Tribe connected on just 12 of 26 (46.2%). The Pirates out-rebounded W&M, 43-41, and had 16 turnovers to the Tribe's 17.

Virginia Tech 80, William and Mary 54

Dec. 23, 2003 • Blacksburg, VA • Cassell Coliseum

William and Mary's men's basketball team fell on the road to Virginia Tech, 80-54, at Cassell Coliseum. The loss drops the Tribe's record to 3-5 on the season, while the Hokies improve to 7-3.

W&M held an early, 5-2, lead in the contest, but VT used a 28-5 run over the next 8:20, taking a 30-10 lead with 8:02 remaining in the first half. The Tribe cut the lead to 17 points on a three-pointer by senior forward **Adam Hess**, but would get no closer, as the Hokies led by 25 at halftime, 46-21. Bryant Matthews led the way for Tech in the period with 22 points on 7-9 shooting from the floor and 8-12 from the free throw line. W&M committed 16 turnovers and shot just 20.8 percent from the floor in the half, including 1-14 (7.1%) from beyond the three-point line.

With 17:47 remaining in the second half the Tribe cut the lead down to 22 points on a layup by senior forward **Zeb Cope**, but the College was held without a field goal for the next seven minutes, while the Hokies expanded their lead to 32 points. VT would eventually lead by as many as 36 with 5:36 remaining in the contest, before the Tribe, which never gave up, outscored the home team by 10 points down the stretch. Six different W&M players scored in the final 5:30, as the Green and Gold outscored Tech, 17-7, while allowing the Hokies to convert just two field goals.

Hess led the Tribe with 13 points, while junior guard **Nick D'Antoni** chipped in with 11. W&M rookie forward **Corey Cofield** played well in his first career start, scoring eight points and collecting a game-high 11 rebounds. Matthews led all scorers with 32 points and also had 11 rebounds, while Coleman Collins added 10 points for the Hokies. W&M was hurt by a season-high 26 turnovers in the game and also had its worst shooting night of the season, making just 30.6 percent of its field goals.

Game #9 William and Mary 82, Campbell 67

Dec. 30, 2003 • Williamsburg, VA • William and Mary Hall

William and Mary's **Adam Hess** led all scorers with 19 points, while **Zeb Cope** and **Corey Cofield** each added 16, as the Tribe men's basketball team defeated Campbell, 82-67, at William and Mary Hall.

The win snaps a three-game losing streak for the Green and Gold, which improves its record to 4-5. The Camels drop to 0-9 on the year, their worst start since joining Division I in the 1977-78 season, while suffering their 22nd straight road loss, a streak that dates back to January 19, 2002.

W&M jumped out to an early lead, taking a 15-6 advantage less than seven minutes in on a pair of baskets by **Nick D'Antoni**. A shot by CU's Anthony Atkinson cut the lead to seven and the two teams twice traded pairs of free throws, before the Camels' Robby Dupre and Tarick Johnson scored on consecutive possessions to cut the lead to three, 19-16, with 10:12 left in the half. The Tribe scored seven straight points to pull ahead by 10 points, but the Camels regrouped to chip away at the margin, eventually taking their first lead of the game, 34-33, on a three-pointer by Dominique Klein. W&M's **Adam Trumbower** responded with a layup to put the Tribe back up, but a three-pointer by CU's Lee Marsh gave the Camels a 37-35 halftime lead.

The Tribe stormed out of the gates in the second half, scoring the first 10 points of the period, beginning with a pair of three-pointers on the first two possessions by **Taylor Mokris**. W&M outscored the Camels, 28-8, through the first 10 minutes of the second half, opening up an 18-point, 63-45 lead. CU never came closer than 13 points the rest of the way, as the Tribe won the game, 82-67, the fourth time in nine games this season that the College has broken the 80-point barrier.

W&M shot 50.0% (29-58) from the floor in the game, including a 17-28 (.607) performance in the second half, while holding the Camels to just 39.3% (24-61) shooting, the Tribe's best defensive effort this season. A total of 54 fouls were called in the contest, leading to 11 players ending with at least four fouls, although just one, Campbell's Colin Hunt, fouled out of the game.

D'Antoni set a career high with eight assists and did not commit a turnover in the game, adding seven points to the Tribe cause. Tarick Johnson led Campbell off the bench with 16 points, while Atkinson had 13 points and Dupre added 10.

William and Mary led 15th-ranked Pittsburgh by as many as 10 points in the first half, but the Panthers closed out the period on a 24-5 run to take a nine point lead at halftime and held on for the win, as Pitt defeated the Tribe in men's basketball action, 70-55 at the Peterson Events Center.

W&M falls to 4-6 on the year, while the Panthers improve to 14-0 this season.

The Tribe used a bucket by freshman forward **Corey Cofield** and a three and a layup by senior forward **Adam Hess** to open up a 7-2 lead early. The Panthers closed to within one, 12-11, but W&M responded with nine unanswered points, including seven by senior forward **Zeb Cope**, to take a 10-point, 21-11, lead with 8:49 left in the first half. Pitt used three three-pointers by Antonio Graves to close out the half on a 24-5 run, to end the period ahead, 35-26.

The Panthers continued their strong play to start the second period, taking a 50-32 lead, their largest advantage of the game. W&M continued to play tough, and cut the lead to 10 points, 63-53, with 3:36 remaining on threes by Cope and freshman guard **Adam Trumbower**. That would be as the Tribe would get, however, as Pitt converted four of its last five free throws in the final 1:10 of the game, to close out the contest, 70-55.

W&M shot .449 from the floor, including going 10-20 from beyond the three-point line, while Pitt converted 57.5% of its shots from the floor, while going just 3-14 (.214) from long-range. The Panthers out-rebounded the Tribe, 34-19, and attempted 28 more free throws than W&M, while making 20 more from the line. The Tribe forced the Panthers to make 18 turnovers in the game, while making just 12 of their own.

Hess had a solid game for the Tribe, scoring 16 points, with three rebounds, six assists and four steals. Cope also had 16 points coming off the bench for W&M. William and Mary's men's basketball team cut Virginia's double-digit halftime lead to just one point with 7:38 left to play, but could not pull ahead, as the Tribe fell to the Cavaliers, 84-71, at University Hall in the final non-conference game of the season for both teams.

W&M drops to 4-7 with the loss, while UVA improves to 10-2.

The Cavaliers led by two, 13-11, with 15:55 left in the first half, before taking off on a 14-2 run over the next five minutes, opening up a 27-13 lead with 10:42 on the clock. W&M cut the margin to 10 on two occasions, but each time UVA pulled back ahead by 15, their largest lead of the game. The Tribe closed out the period with baskets on consecutive possessions by **Nate Loehrke** and **Corey Cofield** to end the half down 11, 48-37.

W&M opened the second period with a three by **Nick D'Antoni** and a pair of free throws by Cofield to bring the score to 48-42 in favor of the Cavaliers. The Cavaliers went back up by eight, but W&M continued to fight back, scoring seven straight points, including another three by Hess and 2-2 shooting from the free throw line by both D'Antoni and **Zeb Cope** to close to within just one point, 64-63, with 7:38 left to play.

Following a media timeout, UVA's Devin Smith knocked down a big three-pointer, but W&M's **Taylor Mokris** responded with a jumper to bring the Tribe back within a basket. However, that would be the College's final field goal in a span of more than four minutes, while the Cavaliers used a 15-2 run to go ahead by 15, 82-67, with 3:16 remaining. W&M would get no closer than 13 the rest of the contest, as UVA won the game, 84-71.

Hess led the Tribe with 20 points, and also collected a game-high eight rebounds to lead W&M. Cofield continued his solid play of late, scoring 17 points with seven rebounds and four assists. Cope had 12 points in the game, while D'Antoni added 10. For Virginia, Smith and Elton Brown each had 22 points, with Smith adding eight points and three assists. W&M outrebounded the Cavaliers, 39-31, but was hurt by 15 turnovers, while UVA committed only six. The Tribe shot 44.8% (26-58) from the field and the Cavaliers connected on half (32-64) of their shots from the floor.

William and Mary's **Adam Hess** scored a game high 21 points, including the 1,000th of his three-year W&M career, but it was not enough, as the Tribe fell on the road two-time defending CAA champion UNC Wilmington, 67-59, at Trask Coliseum.

UNCW used two consecutive three-pointers by Anthony Terrell to help build an 11-4 lead early in the game, but the Tribe gradually chipped away at the lead, eventually going ahead by as many as three points. W&M's advantage was short-lived, as the Seahawks ran off 10 straight points to go up, 32-25. A jumper by Hess brought the halftime score to 32-27.

The Tribe got to within three points, 38-35, with 14:59 remaining on a jumper by **Zeb Cope**, but allowed the Seahawks to go on a 9-3 run over the next two and a half minutes to take a 47-37 lead. W&M narrowed UNCW's lead to four points on three occasions, but the Seahawks used a 14-4 run to take a commanding, 65-51, lead with just 1:29 remaining. Hess knocked down a three for the Tribe, then scored three more points as he was fouled attempting another shot from long-range, to close the Tribe to within eight points. However, time ran out on the Green and Gold, as Cope scored W&M's final points on a jumper with just over a second remaining to close out the 67-59 ballgame.

Hess scored the 1,000th point of his W&M career on a layup at the 17:21 mark of the second half, ending his night with a game-high 21 points and 1,012 in a Tribe uniform. A transfer to W&M after his freshman year, he scored 246 as a rookie at Eastern Michigan and has a total of 1,258 points as a college player, ironically scoring the 1,000th point of his overall career in the Tribe's game at UNCW last season on March 3. Cofield added 14 points and eight rebounds, while Cope had a game-high nine rebounds and six points for W&M. John Goldsberry led the Seahawks with 15 points, while Anthony Terrell had 14, Lane added 13 and Taylor Lay chipped in with 10.

W&M out-rebounded UNCW, 42-34, while both teams shot nearly the same from the field, 37.9% (22-58) for the Tribe and 39.7% (23-58) for the Seahawks. A big difference was the teams' shooting from long range, with W&M connecting on two of 18 from the three-point line, while UNCW was 9-22 from beyond the arc.

George Mason 84, William and Mary 71

George Mason had six players reach double figures in points, led by Jai Lewis's 17, as the Patriots shot 55.9% (33-59) from the floor, as George Mason held off William and Mary, 84-71, in men's basketball action at William and Mary Hall. The Patriots improve to 9-3 overall and 2-1 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while the Tribe falls to 4-9 (1-3 CAA).

W&M was led by rookie forward **Corey Cofield's** 22 points on 8-11 shooting from the floor, while sophomore guard **Taylor Mokris** added 17, as the Tribe shot 41.7% (25-60) from the floor, but just 21.7% (5-23) from three-point range. Along with Lewis's 17, Kevin Mickens set a career-high with 14 points for the Patriots, Lamar Butler finished with 12, Mark Davis with 11 and Raoul Heinen and Terry Reynolds each added 10.

The Patriots, who never trailed after the 18:24 mark of the first half, quickly ran out to an 11-point lead at 21-10 on a Butler three-pointer with 13:02 left in the first half, and would extend their lead to as many as 14 at 31-17 with 7:03 left, before the Tribe ended the half on a 17-9 run to trim the lead to just six at 40-34. Mokris swished home two three-pointers and a free throw in the flurry, and senior guard **Dave Holtzmuller** added a trifecta as the Tribe trailed by just six, 40-34, at the break.

Continuing its momentum from the end of the first period, the Tribe scored the first four points of the second to close the Patriots' lead to just two at 40-38 with 18:30 to play. After the two sides traded baskets, GMU went out on a 9-4 run to widen its lead back to seven at 51-44 before a jumper by senior forward **Adam Hess** and a layup by Cofield trimmed the lead to three, 51-48, with 13:35 remaining. The Tribe could not get any closer, however, as the Patriots outscored W&M 24-12 over the next six and a half minutes to take a 15-point lead at 75-60 on a pair of free throws by Lewis. After two Mokris free throws got the College within 11 points at 76-65 with 5:14 remaining in the game, the Patriots went on an 8-3 mini run to take its biggest lead of the game at 16 points, 84-68 with 33 seconds left, eventually winning by 13, 84-71.

Despite the loss, the Tribe held a 34-32 rebounding advantage, as Hess had six rebounds, Mokris finished with five and sophomore center **Nate Loehrke** added four while scoring a career-high eight points. Lewis collected a game-high nine rebounds, while Reynolds dished out eight assists in the contest.
