Top Storylines

- William and Mary continues its stretch of three games in five days with Monday's game against Old Dominion at 7:00 PM ... ODU leads the series with W&M, 48-13, although the Tribe has won two of the last three against the Monarchs in W&M Hall ... Last season the two teams split in the regular season, with ODU winning, 76-64, in Norfolk and the Tribe winning, 69-53, in Williamsburg ... W&M has faced ODU more times than any other current CAA school.
- W&M is led by first-year head coach **Tony Shaver** ... Shaver put together a record of 358-121 (.747) in an outstanding 17-year career at Division III Hampden-Sydney prior to joining the Tribe ... While there, he led the Tigers to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference championships, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Tournament appearances (including trips to the Final Four in 1999 and 2003).
- Senior forward **Adam Hess** was voted the 2003-04 CAA Preseason Player of the Year by the league's media ... Through Jan. 25, Hess leads the CAA in scoring with 19.6 points per game, and is ranked in the top-15 in the league in seven other categories ... He has a total of 1,352 points in his career, including 246 in his freshman season at Eastern Michigan and is the 27th player to score 1,000 points in a W&M uniform.
- Freshman forward **Corey Cofield** is making a strong case for CAA Rookie of the Year honors, as he is currently the only freshman ranked in the top-20 in the league in both scoring and rebounding ... He is 17th overall and the second-highest scoring freshman with 11.8 points per game, and is tied for 15th overall and second among rookies with 5.3 rebounds per game ... Cofield also has the highest shooting percentage and is fourth overall in the conference with .586 field goal percentage ... He has scored at least 17 points in four of his last five games, including three games of 21 points or more ... Cofield recorded his first career double-double with 21 points and 11 rebounds at Delaware, then led all scorers with a career-high 24 points at Hofstra.

W&M's Adam Hess Voted CAA Pre-season Player of the Year

Senior forward **Adam Hess** was voted the 2003-04 Colonial Athletic Association's Preseason Player of the Year by the media at the conference's annual media day, held at the Washington, DC ESPNZone on October 29 ... Hess was also projected by *Sporting News* as the league's best player ... No W&M player has ever been named CAA Player of the Year at the end of the season ... Only twice in history has a Tribe men's basketball player been selected as any league's player of the year ... **Jeff Cohen** (1961) and **Tom Jasper** (1971) were each named Southern Conference Player of the Year ... Hess has been unanimously picked to be the only player this season to repeat as a first team All-CAA honoree, including predictions by the conference's coaches and media and numerous publications, including *Athlon*, *Basketball News*, *Lindy's*, *Sporting News*, and *Street & Smith's*.

Fabulous Freshman

Forward **Corey Cofield** is making a strong case for CAA Rookie of the Year honors this season ... Through Jan. 25, he is 17th in the CAA overall and second

among the league's freshmen with 11.8 points per game, and is tied for 15th overall in the conference with 5.3 rebounds per game, also the second-best total for a freshman ... He leads all CAA rookies and is fourth in the league with a .586 field goal percentage ... In his last seven games, Cofield is averaging 17.1 points (including three 20-point games) and 7.0 rebounds, while shooting 60.0 percent from the floor.

Seeing Improvement

Three players in particular this season, senior **Zeb Cope**, junior **Nick D'Antoni** and sophomore **Taylor Mokris** are seeing significant improvement under first-year head coach **Tony Shaver** ... Each of the three has more than doubled his scoring average from last season ... Cope has recorded the only two double-doubles of his career with 21 points and 11 rebounds in games at VCU (12/6) and against Drexel (1/17) ... He has also been given the green light to shoot from the outside, and is connecting on a team-best 35.7% (20-56) of his shots from the three-point line, after shooting just 1-4 from long range in his first three seasons ... With a team-high 92 assists, D'Antoni already has more than tripled the 27 he compiled

Killer Cs

Senior forward **Zeb Cope** and rookie forward **Corey Cofield** are each having outstanding seasons for the Tribe this year ... Cope has started all but one of W&M's games, leading the team with 6.5 rebounds per game and second with an average of 12.0 points per contest and a .463 field goal percentage ... Arguably the most improved player in the league this season, he is more than tripling his career scoring average (3.5 ppg), more than doubling his career rebounding average (3.1 rpg) and shooting more than 50 points higher than his career field goal percentage (.410) entering this season ... Cope has both of his career double-doubles this year, each being 21-point, 11-rebound efforts (at VCU and home against Drexel) ... An all-rookie candidate in the CAA this season, Cofield has started the last 10 games for W&M, leading the Tribe with a .586 FG% and third on the team with averages of 11.8 points and 5.3 rebounds per game ... He recorded his first career double-double with 21 points and 11 rebounds at Delaware (1/21) and was named CAA Rookie of the Week on Jan. 12.

Helping Hand

Junior point guard **Nick D'Antoni** has returned to the level of play that earned him CAA All-Rookie accolades two seasons ago ... The nephew of Phoenix Suns head coach Mike D'Antoni, Nick is leading the team with 92 assists against just 44 turnovers this season ... That includes 11 assists at Towson (1/14) and 10 assists at Hofstra (1/24) ... Only 16 other times has a Tribe player had 10 or more assists in a game, and only two others have accomplished the feat more than once in a single season ... Through Jan. 25, D'Antoni was fourth in the CAA with a 2.09 assist-to-turnover ratio and third with an average of 5.41 assists per game

... D'Antoni is currently second in W&M history in single-season assists per game ... The only time a Tribe player ended a season averaging more than five assists a game was when **Scott Coval** averaged 6.22 in the 1984-85 season.

Cofield Named CAA Rookie of the Week

Freshman forward **Corey Cofield** was picked as the CAA Rookie of the Week on Jan. 12, following a three-game stretch in which he averaged 17.7 points and 5.7 rebounds per game, while shooting 66.7% (22-33) from the field ... At home against George Mason (1/10) he led all scorers with a career-high 22 points on 8-11 shooting from the floor and 6-8 from the free throw line ... He also had 14 points and eight rebounds at UNCW (1/7) and 17 points, seven rebounds and four assists at Virginia (1/5) ... This season he is third on the team with 11.8 points and 5.3 rebounds per game and is fourth in the conference with a .586 field goal percentage.

Tribe Adds Junior College Transfer

On Jan. 9, the College announced that sophomore **Adam Dutton** had transferred to W&M from Cuesta Junior College in San Luis Obispo, CA ... A 6-0, 185-pound guard from Winchester, VA, Dutton will have two seasons of eligibility after sitting out the rest of this year ... Dutton graduated from Handley High School in 2001 and was a first team all-

state pick in both basketball and football (wide receiver) ... He was a high school teammate of W&M's current starting quarterback, junior **Lang Campbell**, and starting senior linebacker **Paul Carpenter** ... Dutton is the Tribe's first junior college transfer in men's basketball since forward **Chris Hall** played for the 1994, 1995 and 1997 seasons, averaging 2.1 points and 1.6 rebounds in 56 games.

Magic Number

The number 67 has special meaning for the Tribe this season, at least in relation to the number of points scored by the opposition ... W&M is undefeated (3-0) when holding teams to less than 67 points, winless (0-12) when opponents score more than 67 points and has split the two times when opponents have scored exactly 67 points (defeating Campbell, 82-67, on Dec. 30 and losing at UNC Wilmington, 67-59, on Jan. 7).

Tony Shaver Ninth in Nation

Through Jan. 22, W&M head coach **Tony Shaver** had the ninth-best winning percentage in the nation among active Division I coaches, taking into account results from every level of college basketball ... Shaver currently has a record of 362-134 (.730).

Hess is averaging 17.3 points per game in his W&M career, eighth-best in school history ... The last person to score 1,000 points for W&M while playing less than four years is also the only person to do it in just two seasons ... **Bob Sherwood** scored 545 points in 1967-68 and had 506 in the 1969-70 campaign, for a total of 1,051 ... **Jim Moran** was the last Tribe player to get 1,000 points, ending his career in 2001 with 1,324 points, 12th in school history ... A complete list of all 27 of W&M's 1,000-point scorers is on page six of this release.

Quick Trigger

Sophomore forward **Steve Sorenson** quickly took advantage of his playing time at Hofstra (1/24), scoring on his first touch of the game at the 7:52 mark of the second half, just two seconds after he entered the game for the first time ... Sorenson also scored on a putback at the 7:04 mark, giving him four points in his first 50 seconds of action.

Straight Shooter

Rookie forward **Corey Cofield** is on pace for one of the most accurate shooting seasons in school history ... He has connected on 58.6 percent (75-128) of his field goal attempts this season ... The W&M single-season record (with a minimum of 200 attempts) was set in the 1995-96 season by **Carl Parker**, who shot .599 (164-274) from the floor.

Career Nights

Sophomore **Nate Loehrke** has really stepped up his play of late, setting career highs in scoring in three of his last five games ... The 6-10 center is averaging 6.2 points and shooting .636 (14-22) from the field in just 13.6 minutes per game in that stretch ... Loehrke scored a then-career-high seven points at UNC Wilmington (1/7), then broke that mark with eight points in the next game against George Mason (1/10) ... He set a new personal standard with 10 points at Delaware (1/21) ... Loehrke has scored 31 of his 58 career points in his last five games.

High-Scoring Hess

Five times this season, the high-scoring games of **Adam Hess** have ranked him in the top 20 in the nation in scoring on that particular day ... That includes three efforts that placed him in the top-five in the country, the last time being his 29 points at Delaware (1/21), tied for the second-most points in the country that day ... His average of 19.8 ppg is currently tops in the CAA.

Now the national media is also jumping on the bandwagon, starting with a recent piece on the website collegeinsider.com, that focuses on mid-major Division I teams ... In a front page article on the site this season, Matt Drake wrote that he believes Hess may be "the BEST mid-major player in America," adding, "the Michigan native plays with poise and has an excellent shooting stroke, with seemingly unlimited range. Not only is **Adam Hess** one of the top players in the conference and the state, but he also excels in the classroom ... Last season he was named a second team Academic All-American and was picked to the Academic All-District III team ... In addition, Hess earned his second selection to the CAA All-Academic Team and was named the league's first ever Men's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year.

Tribe Wins Tourney Opener

The Tribe broke a long string of in-season tournament first round losses with the win against St. Francis in the first round of the Red Auerbach Colonial Classic ... The last time the Tribe had won the first game of such an event was Dec. 29, 1981 with a 58-48 win over Auburn at the Iron Duke Classic in Durham, NC

... Since that season, W&M had played 38 games in 19 in-season tournaments, with a record of 10-28 (.263).

Head Coach Tony Shaver

On May 2, 2003, the William and Mary athletics department announced the hiring of Tony Shaver as the 30th men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Shaver came to W&M after coaching for 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

Last season, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four for the second time in his career, as his team finished the season with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. H-SC opened the 2003 season by winning its first 22 games and was ranked as high as second in the nation as it finished the regular season with a record of 23-1.

In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished with a record of 29-3, setting a school record for the most wins in a single season.

Together with his team's successes on the court, Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999)

and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally

a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (22), a senior pitcher on W&M's baseball team, Austin (18) and Jackson (12).

William and Mary 80, St. Francis (NY) 60

Nov. 28, 2003 • Washington, DC • Charles E. Smith Center

William and Mary senior Adam Hess scored 22 and classmate Zeb Cope added 21, as the Tribe men's basketball team defeated St. Francis College (NY), 80-60, in the first round of the Red Auerbach Colonial Classic, hosted by George Washington University at the Smith Center.

The Tribe opened the game with a 15-7 lead at the 13:03 mark, led by six points from Cope on a pair of three-pointers. SFC gradually chipped away at the lead, taking a one-point advantage of its own at the 8:47 mark on a layup by Sean Dantzer. The two sides kept the score close for the next two minutes, but from there the Tribe started to pull away, with freshman Corey Cofield leading W&M to a 36-30 lead with six points in less than three minutes of action. With the Tribe leading, 37-32, the Terriers appeared to have an opportunity to take the final shot of the half, gaining control of a jump ball under their own basket with less than two seconds remaining. However, Hess stole the ball from SFC and banked in a halfcourt shot as time expired to give the Tribe a 40-32 lead at the break.

W&M opened an 11-point, 48-37, lead in the second half on a layup by redshirt-freshman Brian Hutt with 15:25 on the clock, before extending its advantage to 58-44 with 9:25 to play on a layup by Hess. From there the Terriers mounted a comeback, scoring nine straight points to cut the Tribe's lead to 58-53 with 5:41 left. However, it was all Green and Gold from that point on, as the College ended the game with a 22-7 run, including nine points down the stretch from Hess.

The CAA Preseason Player of the Year, Hess led all scorers with 22 points, to go with nine rebounds and four steals. For the second straight outing, Cope set a career high in scoring with 21 points. Reid Markham also scored in double figures with 14 points, while Nick D'Antoni had five assists and six points against just one turnover. Hutt also had a solid game for W&M, pulling down nine rebounds to go with his four points. Eric Thompson led SFC with a double-double, scoring 12 points and 14 rebounds. The Tribe held the Terriers to just .397 shooting from the field, including just 20.0 percent (5-25) from the three-point line. W&M shot .418 (28-67) from the floor and made 19 of 27 free throws (.704) in the contest.

The game marked the first time since 1981 that the Tribe opened an in-season tournament with a win, the last time being the Iron Duke Classic in December of 1981, when W&M defeated Auburn and Davidson to win the event.

George Washington 73, William and Mary 57

William and Mary lost to George Washington, 73-57, in the championship game of the Red Auerbach Colonial Classic at the Smith Center. The loss drops the Tribe's record to 2-2 this season, while the Colonials improve to 4-0, winning their tournament for the 10th time in as many tries.

W&M opened the game on fire, taking a 13-2 lead over GW less than three minutes into the game. Tribe senior forward Adam Hess keyed the drive, scoring 11 straight points for W&M, including three three-point field goals. The host Colonials responded with a 12-1 run to tie the game at 14 with 12:26 on the clock and finally took the lead, 18-17, at 9:28, an advantage that they would maintain throughout the contest. GW would lead by as many as 12 points in the half, ending the period ahead 36-26.

The second half began much the same as the first, as the Tribe scored seven unanswered points to close to within three, 36-33, at the 18:13 mark. However, the Colonials soon built an insurmountable lead, scoring 13 straight at one point, and leading by as many as 21 in the half. W&M would get no closer than 14 points the rest of the way and was unable to connect on a field goal in the final five minutes of the contest, as GW won the championship, 73-57.

Hess led the all scorers for the fourth straight game with 16 points in the contest and was selected to the all-tournament team for his efforts. Redshirt-freshman center Brian Hutt had eight rebounds, five points and two blocked shots in the game, while junior guards Reid Markham and Nick D'Antoni had nine and eight points, respectively. For GW, Mike Hall had a double-double with 13 points and 13 rebounds, while J.R. Pinnock had 15 points.

The game marked the first time all season that the Tribe offense scored fewer than 80 points in a game, as the College was held to just 34.0% shooting from the field and 25.0% from the three-point line.

George Mason 84, William and Mary 71

George Mason had six players reach double figures in points, led by Jai Lewis's 17, as the Patriots shot 55.9% (33-59) from the floor, as George Mason held off William and Mary, 84-71, in men's basketball action at William and Mary Hall. The Patriots improve to 9-3 overall and 2-1 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while the Tribe falls to 4-9 (1-3 CAA).

W&M was led by rookie forward Corey Cofield's 22 points on 8-11 shooting from the floor, while sophomore guard Taylor Mokris added 17, as the Tribe shot 41.7% (25-60) from the floor, but just 21.7% (5-23) from three-point range. Along with Lewis's 17, Kevin Mickens set a career-high with 14 points for the Patriots, Lamar Butler finished with 12, Mark Davis with 11 and Raoul Heinen and Terry Reynolds each added 10.

The Patriots, who never trailed after the 18:24 mark of the first half, quickly ran out to an 11-point lead at 21-10 on a Butler three-pointer with 13:02 left in the first half, and would extend their lead to as many as 14 at 31-17 with 7:03 left, before the Tribe ended the half on a 17-9 run to trim the lead to just six at 40-34. Mokris swished home two three-pointers and a free throw in the flurry, and senior guard Dave Holtzmuller added a trifecta as the Tribe trailed by just six, 40-34, at the break.

Continuing its momentum from the end of the first period, the Tribe scored the first four points of the second to close the Patriots' lead to just two at 40-38 with 18:30 to play. After the two sides traded baskets, GMU went out on a 9-4 run to widen its lead back to seven at 51-44 before a jumper by senior forward Adam Hess and a layup by Cofield trimmed the lead to three, 51-48, with 13:35 remaining. The Tribe could not get any closer, however, as the Patriots outscored W&M 24-12 over the next six and a half minutes to take a 15-point lead at 75-60 on a pair of free throws by Lewis. After two Mokris free throws got the College within 11 points at 76-65 with 5:14 remaining in the game, the Patriots went on an 8-3 mini run to take its biggest lead of the game at 16 points, 84-68 with 33 seconds left, eventually winning by 13, 84-71.

Despite the loss, the Tribe held a 34-32 rebounding advantage, as Hess had six rebounds, Mokris finished with five and sophomore center Nate Loehrke added four while scoring a career-high eight points. Lewis collected a game-high nine rebounds, while Reynolds dished out eight assists in the contest.

Towson 73, William and Mary 67

William and Mary's men's basketball team outscored Towson, 42-30, in the second period, but could not overcome an 18-point halftime deficit, as the Tribe fell to the Tigers, 73-67, in men's basketball action at the Towson Center.

The loss drops the Tribe's record to 4-10 overall and 1-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while Towson improves to 5-8 (2-2 CAA).

The Tigers shot 47.2% from the field in the first half, including .462 (6-13) from beyond the three-point line, opening up a 27-9 advantage through the first 10 minutes of the game. Five different Towson players had at least five points in the first half, as the Tribe trailed by as many as 21 points in the period, getting out-rebounded, 24-14.

W&M came back in the second, however, opening with a 6-2 run, including four points by Corey Cofield. The Tigers pulled back ahead by 20, leading 53-33 with 13:34 left to play, but a furious W&M rally brought the Tribe to within six, as the College went on a 23-9 run over the next six minutes, bringing the score to 62-56 with 7:15 remaining. CAA Preseason Player of the Year Adam Hess keyed the drive, scoring 12 consecutive W&M points over a stretch of less than two minutes and 30 seconds. Towson went up by nine, but a big three-pointer by Dave Holtzmuller cut the Tigers' lead back to six. Lawrence Hamm hit a shot to put Towson up by eight, but another Holtzmuller jumper brought the lead back down to six. A free throw by Nick D'Antoni and a layup by Zeb Cope brought W&M to within three points, 67-64, with 1:44 on the clock. That would be the Tribe's last score until the final second of the game, however, as the Tigers scored six unanswered points, including making four of six from the free throw line in the final 35 seconds. D'Antoni hit a three-pointer as time expired, putting the final score at 73-67 in favor of Towson.

Hess led all scorers with 21 points in the game, while Cope had 15 points and six rebounds and Taylor Mokris had 13 points. D'Antoni was credited with a career-high 11 assists in the game, just the 17th time in W&M history, and the first in more than four years, that a Tribe player collected 10 or more assists in a single game. D'Antoni also tied a career-high with seven rebounds, a feat he initially accomplished in the first game of his college career. Cofield had a game-high nine rebounds to go with five points, three assists and two steals. Mike Green led Towson with career highs in points (18), rebounds (7) and assists (9), while Jamaal Gilchrist added 11 points for the Tigers and Hamm and Andrius Petkunas each had 10.

William and Mary rookie forward **Corey Cofield** led all scorers with a career-high 24 points on 10-13 shooting from the field, but it was not enough, as Hofstra defeated the Tribe, 98-71, in men's basketball action this afternoon at the Hofstra Arena.

W&M falls to 4-13 overall and 1-7 in the Colonial Athletic Association this season, while the Pride improves to 8-10 (4-4 CAA).

Hofstra guard Carlos Rivera connected on his third three-pointer of the game, to give HU a 21-10 lead just 8:31 into the contest, before a layup by CAA Preseason Player of the Year **Adam Hess** and a free throw by freshman guard **Adam Trumbower** brought the Tribe to within eight. Two Hofstra jumpers later, W&M was back down by 12, but a three-pointer by senior forward **Zeb Cope** put the score at 25-16. A pair of free throws by the Pride's Kenny Adeleke put the margin to 11 before freshman center **Brian Hutt** brought the Tribe back to within nine. However, Hofstra responded by scoring seven straight points to go up by 16, 34-18, continuing to lead by double digits for the remainder of the game.

Early in the second, the Pride led by 16 points, before a three by Hess and a layup by Cofield cut the score to 53-42 with 17:23 to play. The two teams traded baskets, but Hofstra scored eight straight to take a 19-point advantage. W&M could only get to within 14 points the rest of the way, as the Pride cruised to the 27-point, 98-71 victory.

Three players scored in double figures for W&M, led by Cofield's career-high 24-point effort. Hess had 17 points and eight rebounds, while Cope had 12 points. Junior point guard **Nick D'Antoni** had 10 assists against just two turnovers to go with his three rebounds and two steals.
