Top Storylines

- W&M will travel to local rival Old Dominion for the Tribe's final road game of the regular season ... The Monarchs have a 48-14 lead in the series ... The Tribe has won two straight against ODU, with both of those wins in Williamsburg ... W&M defeated the Monarchs, 86-77, in W&M Hall on Jan. 26 earlier this season ... ODU has won five straight against W&M in Norfolk ... The Tribe's last win on the road against the Monarchs was Feb. 3, 1998.
- Senior forward **Adam Hess** was voted the 2003-04 CAA Preseason Player of the Year by the league's media ... Hess leads the CAA in scoring with 20.2 points per game, 3.3 ppg more than the next closest player and is ranked in the top 10 in the league in seven other categories, including rebounds and steals ... Last week it was announced that Hess was named NABC First Team All-District 4 and Academic All-District III for the second straight year.
- Freshman forward **Corey Cofield** is making a strong case for CAA Rookie of the Year honors, leading the league's freshmen in points per game (13.0), rebounds per game (6.6) and field goal percentage (.574) ... Overall in the CAA, he is 13th in scoring, fifth in rebounding and third in field goal percentage ... He has been named CAA Rookie of the Week three times this season (Jan. 12, Jan. 26 and Feb. 9), more than any other player and leads the team with six double-doubles, including four in the last five games ... In games against CAA opponents, Cofield is averaging 15.4 points per game (second among rookies by just nine total points), while still leading all conference freshmen with 7.6 rebounds per game and a .575 field goal percentage ... In the Tribe's last 10 games, he is averaging 16.9 points and 9.4 rebounds per game.
- W&M is led by first-year head coach **Tony Shaver** ... Shaver put together a record of 358-121 (.747) in an outstanding 17-year career at Division III Hampden-Sydney prior to joining the Tribe ... He led the Tigers to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference championships, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Tournament appearances (including trips to the Final Four in 1999 and 2003).

Hess Heating Up

Picked as the CAA's Preseason Player of the Year, senior forward **Adam Hess** has lived up to the billing throughout the season, leading the league with 20.2 points per game, more than three points ahead of any other player ... He also is ranked in the top 10 in the league in seven other statistical categories, including rebounds and steals, and is currently playing some of the best basketball of his career ... In the last 10 games, he has averaged 21.9 points, 7.2 rebounds and a .454 field goal percentage ... In the Tribe's last five games, Hess is averaging 24.2 points and 7.0 rebounds per game, while shooting .506 (43-85) from the floor and .387 (12-31) from the three-point line.

Fabulous Freshman

Forward **Corey Cofield** is making a strong case for CAA Rookie of the Year honors this season and has been named the CAA Rookie of the Week a league-best three times, including his most recent pick on Feb. 9 ... He leads all conference rookies in scoring (13.0), rebounding (6.6) and field goal percentage (.574) and is the only freshman ranked in the top-20 in the CAA in both scoring (13th) and rebounding (5th) ... As impressive as his overall numbers are, he is even bet-

ter against conference opponents, where he is averaging 15.4 ppg (8th overall and second among rookies by just nine total points) and fourth overall and first among freshmen with 7.6 rpg and a .575 field goal percentage.

Helping Hand

Junior guard **Nick D'Antoni** has returned to the level of play that earned him CAA All-Rookie honors two seasons ago ... The nephew of Phoenix Suns head coach Mike D'Antoni, Nick is leading the team with 135 assists against just 66 turnovers ... That includes 11 assists at Towson (1/14), 10 at Hofstra (1/24) and 11 at George Mason (1/31) ... Only 16 other times has a Tribe player had 10 or more assists in a game, and only one other has accomplished the feat three times in a single season ... He is third in the CAA with an average of 5.40 assists per game and fourth with a 2.05 assist-to-turnover ratio ... D'Antoni is currently second in W&M history in single-season assists per game ... The only time a Tribe player

Seeing Improvement

Senior **Zeb Cope**, junior **Nick D'Antoni** and sophomore **Taylor Mokris** are seeing significant improvement under head coach **Tony Shaver** ... Cope has recorded the only two double-doubles of his career with 21 points and 11 rebounds in games at VCU (12/6) and against Drexel (1/17) ... He has also been given the green light to shoot from the outside, and is connecting on a team-best 36.4% (32-88) of his shots from the three-point line, after shooting just 1-4 from long range in his first three seasons ... With a team-high 135 assists, D'Antoni is currently second in school history with a single-season average of 5.40 assists per game ... In the last three games, Mokris is averaging 9.3 points, while shooting .471 (8-17) from the field and .500 (7-14) from the three-point line in 21.7 minutes per contest.

Rebounding Rampage

After being out-rebounded by 18 (49-31) in its game at Hofstra (1/24), the Tribe has had a renewed focus on recovering missed shots ... That emphasis has paid off and the Tribe has not been out-rebounded since then, including six games with at least a nine-rebound advantage ... In the first game of the current stretch, W&M out-rebounded Old Dominion by 22 (45-23), the Tribe's largest margin since out-rebounding Elon by 23 (44-21) in a game at Stanford on Dec. 22, 1998 ... W&M is currently third in the CAA with a +2.8 rebounding margin per game.

Bringing Home the Hardware

Last week it was announced that **Adam Hess** was voted to the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) Academic All-District III team and to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 4 First Team ... This is the second straight year that Hess has earned both honors ... He is the only player in W&M history to have earned first team NABC all-district honors more than once.

Killer Cs

Senior forward **Zeb Cope** and rookie forward **Corey Cofield** are each having outstanding seasons for the Tribe this year ... Cope has started all but one of W&M's games, is third on the team with 11.8 points per game, 5.9 rebounds per game and second with a .456 field goal percentage ... Arguably the most improved player in the league this season, he is more than tripling his career scoring average (3.5 ppg), almost doubling his career rebounding average (3.1 rpg) and shooting more than 40 points higher than his career field goal percentage (.410) entering this season ... Cope has both of his career double-doubles this year, each

A Rookie of the Year candidate in the CAA, Cofield has started the last 18 games for W&M, leading the Tribe with 6.6 rebounds per game and a .574 FG% and second on the team with an average of 13.0 points per game ... He has six double-doubles (including four in the last five games) and has been named CAA Rookie of the Week three times (Jan. 12, Jan. 26 and Feb. 9).

Mr. Everything

The conference's top scorer at 20.2 points per game, **Adam Hess** is currently ranked in the top 10 in the CAA in eight of 12 statistical categories ... Sixth in the conference with 6.6 rebounds per game and tied for seventh with 1.68 steals per game, he is one of only two players in the CAA ranked in the top 10 in all three categories ... Hess is also ranked in the top-10 in free throw percentage (T8th), three-point field goal percentage (10th), three-point field goals per game (5th), offensive rebounds (T5th) and defensive rebounds (5th).

Straight Shooter

Rookie forward **Corey Cofield** is on pace for one of the most accurate shooting seasons in school history ... He has connected on 57.4 percent (113-197) of his field goal attempts this season ... The W&M single-season record (with a minimum of 200 attempts) was set in the 1995-96 season by **Carl Parker**, who shot .599 (164-274) from the floor ... Against James Madison (2/4), Cofield was 9-9 from the floor, tied for the third-best shooting night in school history ... The last Tribe player to shoot that well was **Tom Bock** with a 10-10 game at Navy (Feb. 15, 1989) ... **Jim McDonough** also went 10-10 at Richmond on Feb. 21, 1976, while **Keith Cieplicki** was 9-9 against Virginia Commonwealth on Feb. 23, 1982.

Tony Shaver Eighth in Nation

Through Feb. 22, W&M head coach **Tony Shaver** had the eighth-best winning percentage in the nation among active Division I coaches, taking into account results from every level of college basketball ... Shaver currently has a record of 364-139 (.724).

Hess scored 246 points in his freshman year at Eastern Michigan before transferring to W&M, and has 1,504 points in his college career ... Tribe Adds Junior College Transfer

On Jan. 9, the College announced that sophomore **Adam Dutton** had transferred to W&M from Cuesta Junior College in San Luis Obispo, CA ... A 6-0, 185-pound guard from Winchester, VA, Dutton will have two seasons of eligibility after sitting out the rest of this year ... Dutton graduated from Handley High School in 2001 and was a first team all-state pick in both basketball and football (wide receiver) ... He was a high school teammate of W&M's current starting quarterback, junior **Lang Campbell**, and starting senior linebacker **Paul Carpenter** ... Dutton is the Tribe's first junior college transfer in men's basketball since forward **Chris Hall** played for the 1994, 1995 and 1997 seasons, averaging 2.1 points and 1.6 rebounds in 56 games.

W&M's Adam Hess Voted CAA Pre-season Player of the Year

Only twice in history has a Tribe men's basketball player been selected as any league's player of the year ... **Jeff Cohen** (1961) and **Tom Jasper** (1971) were each named Southern Conference Player of the Year ... Hess has been unanimously picked to be the only player this season to repeat as a first team All-CAA honoree, including predictions by the conference's coaches and media and numerous publications, including *Athlon*, *Basketball News*, *Lindy's*, *Sporting News*, and *Street & Smith's*.

Many people that cover W&M and the CAA know of the abilities of senior forward **Adam Hess**, as evidenced by his selection by the media as the league's preseason player of the year ... Now the national media is also jumping on the bandwagon, starting with a recent piece on the website collegeinsider.com, that focuses on mid-major Division I teams ... In a front page article on the site this season, Matt Drake wrote that he believes Hess may be "the BEST mid-major player in America," adding, "the Michigan native plays with poise and has an excellent shooting stroke, with seemingly unlimited range. Sure there are a lot of players with quicker feet and more

pure talent, but few are as complete a player as Hess."

Head Coach Tony Shaver

On May 2, 2003, the William and Mary athletics department announced the hiring of Tony Shaver as the 30th men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Shaver came to W&M after coaching for 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

Last season, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four for the second time in his career, as his team finished the season with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. H-SC opened the 2003 season by winning its first 22 games and was ranked as high as second in the nation as it finished the regular season with a record of 23-1.

In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished with a record of 29-3, setting a school record for the most wins in a single season.

Together with his team's successes on the court, Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999)

and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally

a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (22), a senior pitcher on W&M's baseball team, Austin (18) and Jackson (12).

William and Mary 91, Liberty 64

William and Mary put on a shooting clinic from behind the arc, tying the arena record with 14 three-pointers in a 91-64 victory over Liberty in the Tribe's first game under new coach Tony Shaver.

With the Tribe up 25-19 and just over seven minutes remaining in the first half, that's when W&M began to turn it on from three-point range. Sophomore guard **Taylor Mokris** drained a three-pointer, followed by another trey by senior forward **Adam Hess** that put W&M ahead 31-19. After a Liberty basket, Mokris converted again from deep and two possessions later, senior **Zeb Cope** connected to make the score 37-23. Hess hit another three and then freshman guard **Adam Trumbower** converted one of his own to finalize the Tribe's run and break the game open at 43-23.

The halftime stats told the tale of the shooting percentages, as Liberty (0-2) was connecting on 39.3 percent of its shots from the field, including 1 of 8 (.125) from three-point range. W&M, meanwhile, made 56.7 percent of its first half shots, including an incredible 9 of 13 (.692) from beyond the three-point arc.

The second half was more of the same for the Tribe, as three of W&M's first five field goals were three-pointers. W&M continued to impress offensively and played sound defensive basketball, as the lead went up to as many as 30 points on a few occasions before Liberty made a free throw in the final seconds to set the final margin of 27 points in the Tribe's favor.

The Tribe had a balanced offensive attack, with four players scoring in double figures, led by Hess. The preseason CAA Player of the Year hit 10 of his 16 shots, including five of eight from three-point range, for 27 points on the afternoon. He also contributed six rebounds and three assists.

Also impressive for W&M was Cope. The senior forward played a team-high 35 minutes and made six field goals, including two three-pointers. Coming into this season, Cope had attempted four three-pointers in his career, making just one of them. He also added a team-high eight rebounds and two steals.

Mokris was a sparkplug off of the bench for W&M, making eight of his 11 attempts for a career-high 19 points. He also collected a career-best seven rebounds.

Radford 89, William and Mary 86

William and Mary's men's basketball team lost at Radford, 89-86, at the Dedmon Center.

Radford took a 14-5 lead less than four minutes into the game, but W&M battled back, eventually taking a 24-23 lead on a three-pointer by junior guard **Nick D'Antoni**. Tribe senior forward **Adam Hess** keyed the comeback, scoring 10 straight points for the Green and Gold. Radford again pulled ahead, going up by seven, 35-28, with 7:05 remaining. The Tribe fought back again, however, cutting the lead to one on layups by freshman **Corey Cofield**, senior **Zeb Cope** and sophomore **Taylor Mokris**. The Highlanders went up 43-38 with 1:40 remaining, before a barrage of threes, two by D'Antoni and one by Mokris, led to W&M holding a 47-45 lead. Radford's Chris Oliver hit on one of two free throws with two seconds left to cut the Tribe lead to 47-46 at the break.

W&M extended its lead to nine points, 59-50, with 16:15 left in the second on a layup by redshirt freshman center **Brian Hutt**. Radford's Whit Holcomb-Faye single-handedly cut the lead to two, scoring seven of his game-high 29 points to bring the score to 59-57 in favor of the Tribe with 14:32 to play. Thirteen times over the next 14 minutes, the Highlanders would either cut the Tribe's lead to one, or tie the score, but on each occasion W&M responded, until Radford's Andre Bynum connected on a pair of free throws to give the home team a one-point, 87-86, lead with 32 seconds in the game. The Tribe was forced to foul down the stretch and Radford converted two of its last four free throws to secure the 89-86 win.

Hess paced the Tribe for the second straight game with 25 points, also collecting seven rebounds with four assists. William and Mary 80, St. Francis (NY) 60

Nov. 28, 2003 • Washington, DC • Charles E. Smith Center

William and Mary senior **Adam Hess** scored 22 and classmate **Zeb Cope** added 21, as the Tribe men's basketball team defeated St. Francis College (NY), 80-60, in the first round of the Red Auerbach Colonial Classic, hosted by George Washington University at the Smith Center.

The Tribe opened the game with a 15-7 lead at the 13:03 mark, led by six points from Cope on a pair of three-pointers. SFC gradually chipped away at the lead, taking a one-point advantage of its own at the 8:47 mark on a layup by Sean Dantzler. The two sides kept the score close for the next two minutes, but from there the Tribe started to pull away, with freshman **Corey Cofield** leading W&M to a 36-30 lead with six points in less than three minutes of action. With the Tribe leading, 37-32, the Terriers appeared to have an opportunity to take the final shot of the half, gaining control of a jump ball under their own basket with less than two seconds remaining. However, Hess stole the ball from SFC and banked in a halfcourt shot as time expired to give the Tribe a 40-32 lead at the break.

W&M opened an 11-point, 48-37, lead in the second half on a layup by redshirt-freshman **Brian Hutt** with 15:25 on the clock, before extending its advantage to 58-44 with 9:25 to play on a layup by Hess. From there the Terriers mounted a comeback, scoring nine straight points to cut the Tribe's lead to 58-53 with 5:41 left. However, it was all Green and Gold from that point on, as the College ended the game with a 22-7 run, including nine points down the stretch from Hess.

The CAA Preseason Player of the Year, Hess led all scorers with 22 points, to go with nine rebounds and four steals. For the second straight outing, Cope set a career high in scoring with 21 points. **Reid Markham** also scored in double figures with 14 points, while **Nick D'Antoni** had five assists and six points against just one turnover. Hutt also had a solid game for W&M, pulling down nine rebounds to go with his four points. Eric Thompson led SFC with a double-double, scoring 12 points and 14 rebounds. The Tribe held the Terriers to just .397 shooting from the field, including just 20.0 percent (5-25) from the three-point line. W&M shot .418 (28-67) from the floor and made 19 of 27 free throws (.704) in the contest.

The game marked the first time since 1981 that the Tribe opened an in-season tournament with a win, the last time being the Iron Duke Classic in December of 1981, when W&M defeated Auburn and Davidson to win the event.

William and Mary lost to George Washington, 73-57, in the championship game of the Red Auerbach Colonial Classic at the Smith Center. The loss drops the Tribe's record to 2-2 this season, while the Colonials improve to 4-0, winning their tournament for the 10th time in as many tries.

W&M opened the game on fire, taking a 13-2 lead over GW less than three minutes into the game. Tribe senior forward **Adam Hess** keyed the drive, scoring 11 straight points for W&M, including three three-point field goals. The host Colonials responded with a 12-1 run to tie the game at 14 with 12:26 on the clock and finally took the lead, 18-17, at 9:28, an advantage that they would maintain throughout the contest. GW would lead by as many as 12 points in the half, ending the period ahead 36-26.

The second half began much the same as the first, as the Tribe scored seven unanswered points to close to within three, 36-33, at the 18:13 mark. However, the Colonials soon built an insurmountable lead, scoring 13 straight at one point, and leading by as many as 21 in the half. W&M would get no closer than 14 points the rest of the way and was unable to connect on a field goal in the final five minutes of the contest, as GW won the championship, 73-57.

Hess led the all scorers for the fourth straight game with 16 points in the contest and was selected to the all-tournament team for his efforts. Redshirt-freshman center **Brian Hutt** had eight rebounds, five points and two blocked shots in the game, while junior guards **Reid Markham** and **Nick D'Antoni** had nine and eight points, respectively. For GW, Mike Hall had a double-double with 13 points and 13 rebounds, while J.R. Pinnock had 15 points.

The game marked the first time all season that the Tribe offense scored fewer than 80 points in a game, as the College was held to just 34.0% shooting from the field and 25.0% from the three-point line.

William and Mary 67, UNC Wilmington 66 (OT)

Dec. 4, 2003 • Williamsburg, VA • William and Mary Hall

Corey Cofield scored four of his career-high 17 points in overtime, including the winning layup with five seconds remaining, to give the Tribe men's basketball team a thrilling, 67-66, overtime win against two-time defending Colonial Athletic Association champions UNC Wilmington.

UNCW started the game on a tear, as Aaron Coombs scored eight points to lead the Seahawks to their biggest lead of the game at 13 points, 24-11, with 8:59 on the clock. The Tribe responded by closing out the half on a 17-9 run, led by **Nick D'Antoni** with six points and ending with a three by **Taylor Mokris** to close the half down just three points, 33-30.

Much like the Seahawks in the first half, the Tribe used a strong start to take a healthy lead in the second half. W&M opened the stanza on a 10-4 run, fueled by two three-pointers from CAA Preseason Player of the Year **Adam Hess**, as the Tribe took its first lead since the early seconds at 40-37. W&M would run out to its biggest lead of the game, nine points, at 49-40 with 11:27 left, and held the lead until the Seahawks used a 9-1 run to reclaim a one-point lead, 57-56, with 37 seconds left, on a jumper by Ed Spencer. After two Spencer free throws upped the UNCW lead to three with 14 seconds left, the Tribe, with no timeouts, quickly raced down the floor. Hess tried a running three-pointer that was off target, but the ball came down to the waiting arms of **Brian Hutt**. Hutt alertly kicked the ball out to **Adam Trumbower**, who drained a three-pointer, his only points of the game, to tie the score at 59 with 2.8 seconds remaining. UNCW had one last chance to win in regulation, but Halston Lane's jumper from 20 feet drew iron, sending the game into overtime.

UNCW took control early in the extra period, racing out to a 63-59 lead on two free throws by Taylor Lay and a jumper by Spencer. But the Tribe would not give up, as D'Antoni cut the lead to two with a wide-open layup off of a feed from Cofield. Lane sent the lead to five, 66-61, with a trifecta with two minutes left, the last Seahawk points of the evening. Cofield trimmed the lead to two with a wide-open layup with 1:38 left, and after a missed UNCW basket, Hess sank a layup the next time down the floor to close the UNCW lead to one at 66-65.

After a Tribe foul, Spencer missed the front end of a one-and-one and the rebound was corralled by **Zeb Cope**. W&M sprinted down the floor and Hess fired up a short-range jumper that fell off the side, but he chased after the ball and deflected the rebound off of a UNCW player as he was going out of bounds. On the ensuing inbound play, Cofield broke free underneath the basket and took a pass from D'Antoni for a layup that would give the Tribe a 67-66 lead with just five seconds remaining. The Seahawks had one final chance, as Spencer took the inbound pass, raced the length of the floor and pulled up for a 13-foot jumper, but it drew iron, allowing W&M to gain the win.

William and Mary senior forward **Zeb Cope** recorded the first double-double of his career with 21 points and 11 rebounds, but it was not enough, as the Tribe men's basketball team fell at Virginia Commonwealth, 71-60, at the ALLTEL Pavilion.

W&M falls to 3-3 overall and 1-1 in the Colonial Athletic Association with the loss, while the Rams improve to 4-1 (1-0 CAA).

The Tribe offense was sluggish in the first half, scoring just 15 points and shooting .269 (7-26) from the field. Junior guard **Reid Markham** tied the score at eight with 13:39 remaining in the first half, but VCU scored the next nine points to go up, 17-8. W&M cut the lead to six with 7:20 left on a dunk by freshman forward **Corey Cofield**, but the Rams closed the half on a 10-2 run to head to the locker room ahead, 29-15.

Cope opened the second half for the Tribe with a layup and a three-pointer, to bring W&M within nine, 29-20. From there, VCU pulled ahead to lead by as many as 19, 54-35, with 7:43 to play, led by Michael Doles who had eight points in the stretch. W&M did not give up, closing to within eight points, 68-60, with 42 seconds remaining, but time ran out on the Tribe, falling 71-60.

Cope's 21 points led all scorers in the game and he tied VCU's Godwin with a game-high 11 rebounds. Senior forward **Adam Hess** added 13 points and six rebounds to the Tribe's cause. Scoring in double figures for VCU were Godwin with 20, Domonic Jones with 18 and Michael Doles with 13.

Hampton 79, William and Mary 72

Dec. 19, 2003 • Williamsburg, VA • William and Mary Hall

Hampton forward Devin Green led all scorers with a career-high 33 points and also had a game-high 10 rebounds as the Pirates defeated the William and Mary men's basketball team 79-72, at William and Mary Hall. The Pirates improve to 3-7 on the season, while the Tribe falls to 3-4.

The first half was a series of runs for both teams as each shot well from the field. The Tribe finished the first half shooting 53.1% (17-32), running out to a 12-6 lead at the 17:06 mark on a three-pointer by sophomore guard **Taylor Mokris**, but the Pirates would use a run of their own to cut into the Tribe's lead, getting as close as 16-15 with 14:25 left in the half, using consecutive three pointers from Rodney Hughes, Green and Jeff Granger. The College responded with 12 unanswered points in less than three minutes, ending with a three by senior forward **Zeb Cope** to give the Tribe its biggest lead of the game, a 13-point, 28-15 advantage.

Hampton, however, survived the Tribe's run and answered with one of its own, a 16-3 romp to tie the contest at 31. After a layup by senior forward **Adam Hess** and the ensuing free throw after he was fouled gave the College a three-point lead, Donald Didlake tied it back up with a three pointer, and a free throw by Jared Woodley gave the Pirates their first lead of the game at 35-34 with 4:42 left in the half. It was short-lived, however, as back-to-back layups from freshman forward **Corey Cofield** gave W&M a three-point lead at 38-35. Another Hampton three point field goal, this one from Granger, tied the game again, but Cofield again gave the Tribe the advantage, converting a layup while being fouled, and then hitting the free throw to give W&M a 41-38 advantage with 2:15 left. After a missed Pirate basket, Hess scored on a layup with 1:56 left, and two Hampton free throws by Green ended the first half with the Tribe leading, 43-41.

The second half was a seesaw affair, that featured eight ties and seven lead changes, as neither team led by more than four points for most of the period. Two free throws from Granger gave the Pirates a 69-68 lead with 4:50 left and HU would never trail again, as Green made one of two free throws and followed that up with a dunk to put the Pirates ahead, 72-68 with 3:14 remaining. A Hess free throw put the Tribe within three, 72-69, with 2:05 to play, but W&M would get no closer, falling to the Pirates, 79-72.

William and Mary's Hess led the Tribe with 27 points, while Mokris had 16 and Cofield added 13. Granger had 14 points to aid Hampton's cause. The difference in the contest came at the free throw line, with Hampton converting 22 of 30 (73.3%) of its foul shots, while the Tribe connected on just 12 of 26 (46.2%). The Pirates out-rebounded W&M, 43-41, and had 16 turnovers to the Tribe's 17.

Virginia Tech 80, William and Mary 54

William and Mary's men's basketball team fell on the road to Virginia Tech, 80-54, at Cassell Coliseum. The loss drops the Tribe's record to 3-5 on the season, while the Hokies improve to 7-3.

W&M held an early, 5-2, lead in the contest, but VT used a 28-5 run over the next 8:20, taking a 30-10 lead with 8:02 remaining in the first half. The Tribe cut the lead to 17 points on a three-pointer by senior forward **Adam Hess**, but would get no closer, as the Hokies led by 25 at halftime, 46-21. Bryant Matthews led the way for Tech in the period with 22 points on 7-9 shooting from the floor and 8-12 from the free throw line. W&M committed 16 turnovers and shot just 20.8 percent from the floor in the half, including 1-14 (7.1%) from beyond the three-point line.

With 17:47 remaining in the second half the Tribe cut the lead down to 22 points on a layup by senior forward **Zeb Cope**, but the College was held without a field goal for the next seven minutes, while the Hokies expanded their lead to 32 points. VT would eventually lead by as many as 36 with 5:36 remaining in the contest, before the Tribe, which never gave up, outscored the home team by 10 points down the stretch. Six different W&M players scored in the final 5:30, as the Green and Gold outscored Tech, 17-7, while allowing the Hokies to convert just two field goals.

Hess led the Tribe with 13 points, while junior guard **Nick D'Antoni** chipped in with 11. W&M rookie forward **Corey Cofield** played well in his first career start, scoring eight points and collecting a game-high 11 rebounds. Matthews led all scorers with 32 points and also had 11 rebounds, while Coleman Collins added 10 points for the Hokies. W&M was hurt by a season-high 26 turnovers in the game and also had its worst shooting night of the season, making just 30.6 percent of its field goals.

Game #9 William and Mary 82, Campbell 67

Dec. 30, 2003 • Williamsburg, VA • William and Mary Hall

William and Mary's **Adam Hess** led all scorers with 19 points, while **Zeb Cope** and **Corey Cofield** each added 16, as the Tribe men's basketball team defeated Campbell, 82-67, at William and Mary Hall.

The win snaps a three-game losing streak for the Green and Gold, which improves its record to 4-5. The Camels drop to 0-9 on the year, their worst start since joining Division I in the 1977-78 season, while suffering their 22nd straight road loss, a streak that dates back to January 19, 2002.

W&M jumped out to an early lead, taking a 15-6 advantage less than seven minutes in on a pair of baskets by **Nick D'Antoni**. A shot by CU's Anthony Atkinson cut the lead to seven and the two teams twice traded pairs of free throws, before the Camels' Robby Dupre and Tarick Johnson scored on consecutive possessions to cut the lead to three, 19-16, with 10:12 left in the half. The Tribe scored seven straight points to pull ahead by 10 points, but the Camels regrouped to chip away at the margin, eventually taking their first lead of the game, 34-33, on a three-pointer by Dominique Klein. W&M's **Adam Trumbower** responded with a layup to put the Tribe back up, but a three-pointer by CU's Lee Marsh gave the Camels a 37-35 halftime lead.

The Tribe stormed out of the gates in the second half, scoring the first 10 points of the period, beginning with a pair of three-pointers on the first two possessions by **Taylor Mokris**. W&M outscored the Camels, 28-8, through the first 10 minutes of the second half, opening up an 18-point, 63-45 lead. CU never came closer than 13 points the rest of the way, as the Tribe won the game, 82-67, the fourth time in nine games this season that the College has broken the 80-point barrier.

W&M shot 50.0% (29-58) from the floor in the game, including a 17-28 (.607) performance in the second half, while holding the Camels to just 39.3% (24-61) shooting, the Tribe's best defensive effort this season. A total of 54 fouls were called in the contest, leading to 11 players ending with at least four fouls, although just one, Campbell's Colin Hunt, fouled out of the game.

D'Antoni set a career high with eight assists and did not commit a turnover in the game, adding seven points to the Tribe cause. Tarick Johnson led Campbell off the bench with 16 points, while Atkinson had 13 points and Dupre added 10.

William and Mary led 15th-ranked Pittsburgh by as many as 10 points in the first half, but the Panthers closed out the period on a 24-5 run to take a nine point lead at halftime and held on for the win, as Pitt defeated the Tribe in men's basketball action, 70-55 at the Peterson Events Center.

W&M falls to 4-6 on the year, while the Panthers improve to 14-0 this season.

The Tribe used a bucket by freshman forward **Corey Cofield** and a three and a layup by senior forward **Adam Hess** to open up a 7-2 lead early. The Panthers closed to within one, 12-11, but W&M responded with nine unanswered points, including seven by senior forward **Zeb Cope**, to take a 10-point, 21-11, lead with 8:49 left in the first half. Pitt used three three-pointers by Antonio Graves to close out the half on a 24-5 run, to end the period ahead, 35-26.

The Panthers continued their strong play to start the second period, taking a 50-32 lead, their largest advantage of the game. W&M continued to play tough, and cut the lead to 10 points, 63-53, with 3:36 remaining on threes by Cope and freshman guard **Adam Trumbower**. That would be as the Tribe would get, however, as Pitt converted four of its last five free throws in the final 1:10 of the game, to close out the contest, 70-55.

W&M shot .449 from the floor, including going 10-20 from beyond the three-point line, while Pitt converted 57.5% of its shots from the floor, while going just 3-14 (.214) from long-range. The Panthers out-rebounded the Tribe, 34-19, and attempted 28 more free throws than W&M, while making 20 more from the line. The Tribe forced the Panthers to make 18 turnovers in the game, while making just 12 of their own.

Hess had a solid game for the Tribe, scoring 16 points, with three rebounds, six assists and four steals. Cope also had 16 points coming off the bench for W&M. Pitt's Jaron Brown led all scorers with 19 points and had a game-high nine rebounds, while Chevon Trotman had 18 points and Graves added 10.

William and Mary's men's basketball team cut Virginia's double-digit halftime lead to just one point with 7:38 left to play, but could not pull ahead, as the Tribe fell to the Cavaliers, 84-71, at University Hall in the final non-conference game of the season for both teams.

W&M drops to 4-7 with the loss, while UVA improves to 10-2.

The Cavaliers led by two, 13-11, with 15:55 left in the first half, before taking off on a 14-2 run over the next five minutes, opening up a 27-13 lead with 10:42 on the clock. W&M cut the margin to 10 on two occasions, but each time UVA pulled back ahead by 15, their largest lead of the game. The Tribe closed out the period with baskets on consecutive possessions by **Nate Loehrke** and **Corey Cofield** to end the half down 11, 48-37.

W&M opened the second period with a three by **Nick D'Antoni** and a pair of free throws by Cofield to bring the score to 48-42 in favor of the Cavaliers. Virginia pulled back ahead by 10 and the two teams traded baskets over the next three minutes, with UVA leading, 57-47, with 15:09 remaining. From there the Green and Gold took off on a 9-1 run, beginning with Cofield getting fouled on a made basket and scoring the free throw for the conventional three-point play. Three-point baskets by **Adam Hess** and D'Antoni brought the Tribe to within two points, 58-56, with 13:46 left. The Cavaliers went back up by eight, but W&M continued to fight back, scoring seven straight points, including another three by Hess and 2-2 shooting from the free throw line by both D'Antoni and **Zeb Cope** to close to within just one point, 64-63, with 7:38 left to play.

Following a media timeout, UVA's Devin Smith knocked down a big three-pointer, but W&M's **Taylor Mokris** responded with a jumper to bring the Tribe back within a basket. However, that would be the College's final field goal in a span of more than four minutes, while the Cavaliers used a 15-2 run to go ahead by 15, 82-67, with 3:16 remaining. W&M would get no closer than 13 the rest of the contest, as UVA won the game, 84-71.

Hess led the Tribe with 20 points, and also collected a game-high eight rebounds to lead W&M. Cofield continued his solid play of late, scoring 17 points with seven rebounds and four assists. Cope had 12 points in the game, while D'Antoni added 10. For Virginia, Smith and Elton Brown each had 22 points, with Smith adding eight points and three assists. W&M outrebounded the Cavaliers, 39-31, but was hurt by 15 turnovers, while UVA committed only six. The Tribe shot 44.8% (26-58) from the field and the Cavaliers connected on half (32-64) of their shots from the floor.

UNC Wilmington 67, William and Mary 59

Jan. 7, 2004 • Wilmington, NC • Trask Coliseum

William and Mary's **Adam Hess** scored a game high 21 points, including the 1,000th of his three-year W&M career, but it was not enough, as the Tribe fell on the road two-time defending CAA champion UNC Wilmington, 67-59, at Trask Coliseum.

UNCW used two consecutive three-pointers by Anthony Terrell to help build an 11-4 lead early in the game, but the Tribe gradually chipped away at the lead, eventually going ahead by as many as three points. W&M held the Seahawks to just one field goal and two free throws over a period of eight minutes while taking a 16-15 lead, its first of the game, at the 8:02 mark. The Tribe went up, 23-20, with 4:30 left on a jumper by **Nate Loehrke** and, following a bucket by UNCW's Halston Lane, used a jumper by **Corey Cofield** to lead, 25-22. W&M's advantage was short-lived, as the Seahawks ran off 10 straight points to go up, 32-25. A jumper by Hess brought the halftime score to 32-27.

The Tribe got to within three points, 38-35, with 14:59 remaining on a jumper by **Zeb Cope**, but allowed the Seahawks to go on a 9-3 run over the next two and a half minutes to take a 47-37 lead. W&M narrowed UNCW's lead to four points on three occasions, but the Seahawks used a 14-4 run to take a commanding, 65-51, lead with just 1:29 remaining. Hess knocked down a three for the Tribe, then scored three more points as he was fouled attempting another shot from long-range, to close the Tribe to within eight points. However, time ran out on the Green and Gold, as Cope scored W&M's final points on a jumper with just over a second remaining to close out the 67-59 ballgame.

Hess scored the 1,000th point of his W&M career on a layup at the 17:21 mark of the second half, ending his night with a game-high 21 points and 1,012 in a Tribe uniform. A transfer to W&M after his freshman year, he scored 246 as a rookie at Eastern Michigan and has a total of 1,258 points as a college player, ironically scoring the 1,000th point of his overall career in the Tribe's game at UNCW last season on March 3. Cofield added 14 points and eight rebounds, while Cope had a game-high nine rebounds and six points for W&M. John Goldsberry led the Seahawks with 15 points, while Anthony Terrell had 14, Lane added 13 and Taylor Lay chipped in with 10.

W&M out-rebounded UNCW, 42-34, while both teams shot nearly the same from the field, 37.9% (22-58) for the Tribe and 39.7% (23-58) for the Seahawks. A big difference was the teams' shooting from long range, with W&M connecting on two of 18 from the three-point line, while UNCW was 9-22 from beyond the arc.

George Mason had six players reach double figures in points, led by Jai Lewis's 17, as the Patriots shot 55.9% (33-59) from the floor, as George Mason held off William and Mary, 84-71, in men's basketball action at William and Mary Hall. The Patriots improve to 9-3 overall and 2-1 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while the Tribe falls to 4-9 (1-3 CAA).

W&M was led by rookie forward **Corey Cofield's** 22 points on 8-11 shooting from the floor, while sophomore guard **Taylor Mokris** added 17, as the Tribe shot 41.7% (25-60) from the floor, but just 21.7% (5-23) from three-point range. After the two sides traded baskets, GMU went out on a 9-4 run to widen its lead back to seven at 51-44 before a jumper by senior forward **Adam Hess** and a layup by Cofield trimmed the lead to three, 51-48, with 13:35 remaining. The Tribe could not get any closer, however, as the Patriots outscored W&M 24-12 over the next six and a half minutes to take a 15-point lead at 75-60 on a pair of free throws by Lewis. After two Mokris free throws got the College within 11 points at 76-65 with 5:14 remaining in the game, the Patriots went on an 8-3 mini run to take its biggest lead of the game at 16 points, 84-68 with 33 seconds left, eventually winning by 13, 84-71.

William and Mary's men's basketball team outscored Towson, 42-30, in the second period, but could not overcome an 18-point halftime deficit, as the Tribe fell to the Tigers, 73-67, in men's basketball action at the Towson Center.

The loss drops the Tribe's record to 4-10 overall and 1-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while Towson improves to 5-8 (2-2 CAA).

The Tigers shot 47.2% from the field in the first half, including .462 (6-13) from beyond the three-point line, opening up a 27-9 advantage through the first 10 minutes of the game. CAA Preseason Player of the Year **Adam Hess** keyed the drive, scoring 12 consecutive W&M points over a stretch of less than two minutes and 30 seconds. Towson went up by nine, but a big three-pointer by **Dave Holtzmuller** cut the Tigers' lead back to six. Lawrence Hamm hit a shot to put Towson up by eight, but another Holtzmuller jumper brought the lead back down to six. A free throw by **Nick D'Antoni** and a layup by **Zeb Cope** brought W&M to within three points, 67-64, with 1:44 on the clock. That would be the Tribe's last score until the final second of the game, however, as the Tigers scored six unanswered points, including making four of six from the free throw line in the final 35 seconds. D'Antoni hit a three-pointer as time expired, putting the final score at 73-67 in favor of Towson.

Hess led all scorers with 21 points in the game, while Cope had 15 points and six rebounds and **Taylor Mokris** had 13 points. D'Antoni was credited with a career-high 11 assists in the game, just the 17th time in W&M history, and the first in more than four years, that a Tribe player collected 10 or more assists in a single game. D'Antoni also tied a career-high with seven rebounds, a feat he initially accomplished in the first game of his college career. Cofield had a game-high nine rebounds to go with five points, three assists and two steals. Mike Green led Towson with career highs in points (18), rebounds (7) and assists (9), while Jamaal Gilchrist added 11 points for the Tigers and Hamm and Andrius Petkunas each had 10.

Drexel's Tim Whitworth scored a season-high 30 points on 12-17 shooting from the floor, including 6-9 from three-point range, as the Dragons survived a furious William and Mary rally to defeat the Tribe, 80-76, in men's basketball action at William and Mary Hall.

W&M falls to 4-11 overall and 1-5 in the Colonial Athletic Association with the loss, while Drexel improves to 8-6 (3-2 CAA).

For the Tribe, **Zeb Cope** tied his career-high by scoring 21 points on 8-14 shooting from the field and grabbed 11 rebounds, for his second double-double of the season. **Adam Hess** also recorded a double-double, finishing with 18 points and 10 rebounds, while **Corey Cofield** scored 17. For Drexel, Phil Goss had 21 points while Sean Brooks added 16 to go with Whitworth's 30.

The game began with the Dragons taking a 13-10 lead before the Tribe went on a 22-10 run to take its biggest lead of the game, 11 points, at 34-23 with 3:36 left in the half. Three-pointers from Cope, Hess and **Nick D'Antoni** fueled the run, which was capped off by a three-point play by Cofield, who sank a free throw to up the lead to 11.

But the Dragons responded, as Goss sank a three which was followed by a layup from Bashir Mason to pull Drexel to within six at 34-28 with 3:03 left. After two free throws from **Adam Trumbower** pushed the Tribe's lead back to eight, Sean Brooks and Whitworth hit back-to-back jumpers to trim the lead to four. Hess swished home a 10-footer to up the lead back to six with 37 seconds left, but Goss ended the half with a three-pointer at the buzzer to cut the Tribe's lead to 38-35 at the break.

Drexel came out on fire in the second half, in which they outscored the Tribe, 45-38. The Dragons made 10 of their first 12 shots in the period, starting the half on a 24-6 run to take a 15-point lead at 59-44 with 13:38 left in the game. Whitworth scored 14 of those points, capping off the run with a jumper for the biggest lead of the contest.

Down 15, the Tribe stormed its way back into the game, as the College went on a 24-9 run, ending with a layup by Hess to tie the game at 68 with 3:56 remaining. Brooks sank a jumper for Drexel that was negated by two Hess free throws, and then Brooks hit one of two from the line to give the Dragons a one-point lead with 2:29 left. Two more Hess free throws gave W&M a one-point lead at 72-71 before Whitworth put the Dragons up, 74-42 with 2:01 left on his fifth three-point basket of the night. The Tribe mounted one last charge, as Cope's jumper tied the game at 74 with 51 seconds left, but Whitworth connected again from three-point land to give Drexel the lead for good at 77-74 with 29 seconds to play. Two free throws from Cofield got the Tribe within one at 77-76 with 22 seconds left, but Goss hit three out of four free throws in the last 21 seconds to seal the win.

The Tribe dominated the boards, outrebounding Drexel 41-28, but committed 15 turnovers to just six for Drexel. W&M shot .455 (14-31) from the floor, but just .294 (5-17) from the three-point line, while the Dragons were 28-60 (.467) overall and 12-28 (.429) from long range.

William and Mary's men's basketball team lost at Delaware in overtime, 93-82, at the Bob Carpenter Center. The loss drops the Tribe's record to 4-12 overall and 1-6 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while the Blue Hens improve to 10-6 (4-3 CAA).

Delaware was ahead 5-4 early in the game, before a 12-1 run in just over three minutes put W&M ahead, 16-6, with 12:24 left in the first half. CAA Pre-season Player of the Year **Adam Hess** led the Tribe with 10 points in the run, knocking down four shots, including a pair of three-pointers. UD cut the lead back to four, but **Nick D'Antoni** and **Corey Cofield** combined to put the College back up by 10, 24-14, with 8:58 left in the half. The Blue Hens again responded, this time scoring 12 straight to take a 26-24 lead with 4:32 on the clock. The two sides battled back and forth through the rest of the period, with the Tribe taking a 32-31 lead at halftime on a layup by **Nate Loehrke**.

W&M's **Zeb Cope** led off the second with a three to put the Tribe up by four, 35-31, as the College would not trail for the entire half. UD came to within one, 48-47, with 12:24 left in regulation, but the Tribe went on another run, scoring nine straight to regain a 10-point lead. Cofield scored the first six points in the stretch on four made free throws and a layup, while Hess ended it with a three-point play, as he was fouled while dunking the ball and converted the free throw for a 57-47 Tribe lead.

W&M led by eight points, 71-63, with 1:15 left, when the Blue Hens began their improbable comeback that sent the game to overtime. UD made four heavily-contested three-pointers down the stretch, including three in the final 21 seconds, while fouling W&M on the Tribe's offensive possessions. W&M made eight of its 12 foul shots in the final 63 seconds of regulation, but it was not enough to keep the Blue Hens at bay, as Delaware tied the game at 79 with nine-tenths of a second remaining on an off-balance three by Rulon Washington (his only points of the game) who was falling out of bounds as his shot went through the net.

The overtime belonged to UD, as the Tribe was able to score just three points, all by Hess in the first 45 seconds of the extra period, as the Blue Hens scored the last 11 points of the game for the 93-82 victory.

Hess led all scorers with a season-high 29 points, while Cofield recorded his first career double-double with 21 points and 11 rebounds. Loehrke added a career-high 10 points off the bench for W&M, while Cope just missed his second straight double-double with nine points and nine rebounds. Delaware's Herb Courtney came off the bench for 20 points and 10 rebounds, while teammate Harding Nana had 19 points and 11 rebounds. Mike Slattery and Raphael Madera also scored in double figures for UD with 17 and 10, respectively.

Early in the second, the Pride led by 16 points, before a three by Hess and a layup by Cofield cut the score to 53-42 with 17:23 to play. The two teams traded baskets, but Hofstra scored eight straight to take a 19-point advantage. W&M could only get to within 14 points the rest of the way, as the Pride cruised to the 27-point, 98-71 victory.

Three players scored in double figures for W&M, led by Cofield's career-high 24-point effort. Hess had 17 points and eight rebounds, while Cope had 12 points. Junior point guard **Nick D'Antoni** had 10 assists against just two turnovers to go with his three rebounds and two steals. Along with his 11 assists three games ago at Towson, D'Antoni is just the fourth player in W&M history to record multiple double-digit assist games in his career. For the Pride, Adeleke and Wendell Gibson each had 20, while Rivera and Loren Stokes record 16 point apiece.

All five William and Mary starters reached double figures in points, led by **Adam Hess'** 19, as the Tribe shot 54.5% (30-55) from the floor and snapped an eight-game losing streak with a resounding 86-77 win over Old Dominion at William and Mary Hall.

The Tribe improves to 5-13, 2-7 in the CAA, while the Monarchs fall to 10-7, 5-3 CAA.

Along with Hess, reigning CAA Rookie of the Week **Corey Cofield** had a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds, while **Nick D'Antoni** scored 15 points and tied a career-high with seven rebounds. In the first start of his career, **Nate Loehrke** scored a career-high 14 points and tied a career-high with five rebounds. For ODU, Alex Loughton had 19 points, Isaiah Hunter added 16 and John Waller chipped in with 14. The Tribe dominated the game from start to finish, most notably on the backboards, out-rebounding ODU 45-23.

W&M, which never trailed in the contest, ran out to a 9-5 lead on a D'Antoni jumper, and after an ODU basket trimmed the lead to two, the Tribe went on a 9-0 run to widen its lead to 18-7 on a layup by **Brian Hutt**. The College would increase its lead to 23-14 before ODU went on a run to close the lead to four at 23-19 on two of John Waller's 14 points, but a three-pointer by **Zeb Cope** pushed the lead back to seven at 26-19 with 8:32 left. After another Monarchs run cut the lead to three, W&M went on a 7-0 run, engineered by a layup from Cofield, followed by a D'Antoni running jumper and capped off by a three-pointer from Hess, which widened the lead to 10 at 33-23 with 5:22 left. Tribe **Adam Trumbower** buried his only three points of the night with 54 seconds left to give the Tribe a 38-28 lead at the half.

W&M picked up where it left off in the second half, beginning the period on a 26-12 run to take its biggest lead of the game, 24 points, at 64-40 with 11:33 left. Three layups from Cofield, and jumpers from Cope, Hess, D'Antoni, Mokris and Loehrke all fueled the run. While W&M was blowing the game open, the Monarchs were only 5-12 from the floor during the same stretch, as it missed four three-point field goals during the run.

Down 24, ODU fought back, using an 18-3 run over the next 4:25 to cut the Tribe's lead to just nine at 67-58 with 6:45 left. Much like ODU during the Tribe's run, W&M went 4:37 between field goals, managing only a free throw from Loehrke with 7:02 left after the last Tribe basket—a jumper from Hess—came at the 11:03 mark.

The Monarchs pulled to within seven on a layup by Dahi with 4:09 to go, but a D'Antoni jumper and two free throws from Cope pushed the lead to 11 with 3:28 left. After a media timeout, the Monarchs scored the next six points to close to within five at 75-70 with 2:23 left, but that was as close as the game would get, as the Tribe sank 11 of 12 free throw attempts in the final 2:10, with Hess converting all six of his attempts to seal the 86-77 win.

William and Mary 99, James Madison 86

Jan. 28, 2004 • Harrisonburg, VA • JMU Convocation Center

William and Mary junior point guard **Nick D'Antoni** led five Tribe scorers in double figures with 22 points, as the College defeated James Madison, 99-86, in men's basketball action at the JMU Convocation Center.

The Tribe improves to 6-13 overall and 3-7 in the Colonial Athletic Association with its second straight win, while the Dukes fall to 4-13 (1-8 CAA).

Along with D'Antoni's 22 points, a season-high, forwards **Zeb Cope** and **Corey Cofield** each had 18 points and five assists, while CAA Pre-season Player of the Year **Adam Hess** had 15 points, six rebounds, seven assists and three steals. Sophomore guard **Taylor Mokris** came off the bench with 12 points for the Tribe. JMU's Dwayne Broyles led all scorers with 27 points.

The two teams played evenly through the first five minutes, with the score tied at 11 with 14:51 left in the first half. W&M went ahead 16-15 on a layup by Cofield at the 12:23 mark, a lead that the Tribe would hold on to throughout the contest. W&M continued to build its lead, going ahead by double digits, 41-30, with 4:43 left on a jumper by sophomore center **Nate Loehrke**. Outscoring the Dukes, 12-6, from there, the College was up, 53-36, at half, the most points scored by the Tribe in a half this season.

W&M did not let up in the second, going ahead by as many as 21, 67-46, with 14:03 remaining on a three by Hess. JMU would get no closer than 10 points the rest of the game, as the Tribe won going away, 99-86.

The Green and Gold shot a season-best 60.0% (33-55) from the field and 91.3% (21-23) from the free throw line, while out-rebounding the Dukes, 37-21, in the contest. The 99 points was the most scored by the Tribe since defeating Elon, 101-69, on December 22, 1999 at Stanford. It was also the most the College had scored against a CAA opponent since defeating George Mason, 116-94, at home on February 27, 1995, and the most scored on an opponent's home court since winning at UNC Wilmington, 103-85, on February 20, 1993. D'Antoni shot 6-7 (.857) from beyond the three-point line, the second-best single-game long-range percentage in school history and tied for the seventh-most threes in a game for a Tribe player.

Two William and Mary players reached double-digits in points and rebounds, but it wasn't enough, as the Tribe fell to James Madison, 83-76, at William and Mary Hall. Despite 27 points and 10 rebounds from **Adam Hess** and 25 points and 10 rebounds from **Corey Cofield**, the Tribe could not come back from a 10-point halftime deficit.

The Tribe and the Dukes battled back and forth throughout the first half, with the Tribe stretching out to a 19-11 edge on back-to-back three-pointers by **Taylor Mokris**. But the Dukes (5-14, 2-9) battled back on a 7-0 run that was finished with a three-pointer by Cavell Johnson. W&M (6-15, 3-9) started the second half with a quick run to get the score to 42-38, but the Dukes responded with a basket each time it appeared that the Tribe had the momentum. After Daniel Freeman scored to make it 53-41, it looked like the game might get out of reach for W&M. But Hess converted a three-point play, followed by a similar sequence by Cofield, to make the score 53-47. In the end, though, it was not to be, as JMU continued to match each run by the Tribe with one of its own. The closest that the College got was three points, on two separate occasions, but W&M couldn't complete the comeback.

Five straight points by Hess narrowed the gap to 75-72, but the Dukes hit four straight free throws and six of eight down the stretch to set the final margin.

The 27 point evening for Hess included 24 points in the second half, while Cofield's 25 points were a career-high. **Zeb Cope** had 12 points and seven rebounds. **Nick D'Antoni** dished out a team-high five assists before fouling out with just under one minute to play. Dwayne Broyles led JMU with 20 points, while Barbosa had 19, Daniel Freeman had 12 and David Cooper had 11.

Free throw shooting was a key component in the game, as the Tribe made 15 of its 22 shots from the charity stripe, while JMU was 22 of 30 from the foul line. Cofield's career-high point total came on nine of nine shooting from the field, tied for the third-best performance in school history (two players have shot 10 of 10 in a game).

The teams battled back and forth for the remainder of the opening half before W&M went on a 7-0 run to extend its lead to 28-19. The run was ignited by a three from sophomore **Taylor Mokris** and finished on a jumper by junior **Nick D'Antoni**.

UD followed with a run of its own, however, using three-pointers by Mike Ames and Mike Slattery and another jumper by Slattery to close the gap to 28-27, which is where things stood as the teams hit the locker room at the break. Delaware scored early in the second half to reclaim the lead, but the teams continued to trade baskets until W&M went on another scoring spurt with about nine minutes remaining.

Up 53-52, Mokris hit two straight three-pointers and Cope hit a jumper and a free throw, as the Tribe extended its advantage to 63-54. However, the Blue Hens fought back with a quick 6-0 run to close the gap to three points, and eventually tied the game at 64 with three and a half minutes remaining on a layup by David Lunn. Robin Wentt then converted a layup to give the Blue Hens a lead that they would not relinquish. After the Tribe fell behind by four points, D'Antoni converted a pair of free throws to make it a one-possession game, but W&M couldn't complete the comeback in the end, as Delaware held on for the five-point victory.

Mokris led the Tribe with 15 points on five of six shooting from beyond the three-point line. As a team, the Tribe shot nine of 18 from three-point range. Freshman forward **Corey Cofield** continued his strong play with 13 points and eight rebounds, including 11 of 17 from the free throw line. Hess had 11 points and five rebounds before fouling out with 3:40 remaining. Cope also had 11 points and D'Antoni finished with nine points, four assists and four rebounds for W&M. Redshirt freshman **Brian Hutt** tied Cofield for the team-high with eight rebounds.

Ames led all scorers with 18 points and Wentt recorded a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds for the Blue Hens. Slattery added eight points, six rebounds and five assists.

William and Mary's **Adam Hess** led all scorers with 21 points on 8-13 shooting from the floor, and rookie forward **Corey Cofield** recorded his fourth double-double in five games by scoring 18 points and hauling in 11 rebounds, as the Tribe men's basketball team snapped its five-game losing streak with a 74-68 win over Towson at William and Mary Hall.

Along with his double-double, Cofield recorded a career-high four assists, while **Zeb Cope** also recorded a career-high in assists with five. Hess, the CAA's Preseason Player of the Year, pulled down seven rebounds to go with his 21 points. **Brian Hutt** scored a career-high seven points and blocked five shots to tie a career-high as the Tribe recorded a season-high eight rejections.

Towson was led in scoring by Mike Green who had 17 points, seven rebounds and tied a career-high with nine assists. Jamaal Gilchrist had 13 points, Lawrence Hamm had 12 and Jonathan Pease added 11 for the Tigers.

W&M, which never trailed after being down 13-12 with 12:30 left in the first half, shot 46.0% (23-50) from the floor while holding the Tigers to 43.9% (25-57) from the field.

Tied at 14 with 10:53 in the first half, the College took the lead for good as it raced out to an eight-point advantage at 24-16 with 5:23 left. Free throws from **Nick D'Antoni** and Cofield, along with layups from Hess, Hutt and **Reid Markham** all contributed to the run. Towson trimmed the lead to four at 26-22 with 3:20 left on a jumper by Holden Plack, but the Tribe scored the last five points of the half, all free throws, as it went into the break with a nine-point, 31-22, lead.

In the second half, W&M picked up where it left off, scoring six of the first seven points of the period to extend its lead to 14 at 37-23. The Tigers closed to within eight points at 48-40 with 11:53 left, but the Tribe responded with a run of its own, racing out on a 14-4 run to take its biggest lead of the game, 18 points, at 62-44 with 5:57 left. The barrage was highlighted by three-pointers from Markham, **Taylor Mokris** and Cope.

Down 18, the Tigers valiantly fought back, going on a 14-4 run to claw within six at 66-60 with 2:08 left. Consecutive threes from Winstonn Tubbs and Pease started the drive, which ended with another three from Pease.

With the lead down to six, the Tribe responded with two free throws from Hess and one from D'Antoni to go up by nine. After two Tiger free throws made it a seven-point game, Hamm put back an offensive rebound to close the lead to five at 69-64 with 42 seconds left. The game would get no closer, however, as the Tribe ended the contest by connecting on five of six free throws in the final 36 seconds to close out the win.
