Top Storylines

- This will be the 116th meeting in the long-running series between William and Mary and Virginia Tech ... The only team that the Tribe has faced more often than the Hokies is Richmond, with 191 contests between those two schools ... W&M and VT have faced each other in 15 of the last 16 seasons ... The Tribe has won two of its last three games against Virginia Tech, with a 60-52 win in Williamsburg on Dec. 7, 2002 and a 48-46 decision on Nov. 20, 2000 in Blacksburg ... Before W&M's win over VT in Williamsburg two years ago, the Tribe lost its three previous meetings with the Hokies in W&M Hall by a combined total of just nine points, with a pair of two-point losses and a 71-66 defeat to then No. 22 Virginia Tech on Dec. 2, 1995 ... VT leads the all-time series with W&M, 74-41..
- Last weekend W&M won a regular season tournament for the first time since 1981, defeating Hartford and Radford to claim the Inaugural W&M Tip-Off Classic ... It is the fifth time in school history that the Tribe won an in-season tournament ... A win over Virginia Tech would give W&M its best four-game start (3-1) since opening the 1992-93 campaign with four straight victories.
- Monday, W&M sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** was named the Colonial Athletic Association's first Player of the Week for the 2004-05 season ... The 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year and a preseason second-team all-league selection, Cofield averaged 22.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in the two games of the W&M Tip-Off Classic, shooting .667 (14-21) from the field ... He was also named the tournament's most valuable player ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith**, a transfer from Temple who is playing his first season for W&M, was named to the all-tournament team, averaging 17.0 points, 5.5 rebounds and 3.0 steals in the two games, shooting .667 (8-12) from the field.
- The Tribe's newcomers have played very important roles for the College this season ... After top scorer Cofield (17.0 ppg), a sophomore, the next four leading scorers are in their first season wearing the Green and Gold ... Smith is second with 15.0 ppg, while freshmen **Edwin Ofori Attah** (14.7 ppg), **Laimis Kisielius** (9.3 ppg) and **Nathan Mann** (7.0 ppg), round out the top five.

The Tribe opened the season by winning the inaugural W&M Tip-Off Classic with victories over Hartford and Radford ... It is the Tribe's fifth regular season tournament title in school history ... The last time the College won a regular season tournament was in the 1981-82 season, as the Green and Gold defeated Auburn and Davidson to take the 1981 Iron Duke Classic ... W&M is now 39-69 (.361) all-time in regular season tournament games.

Cofield Named CAA Player of the Week

Monday, sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** received the first Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Week award for the 2004-05 season ... A preseason second team all-league selection, Cofield averaged 22.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in the first two games of the season, leading the Tribe to the W&M Tip-Off Classic championship ... It is the first player of the week honor for Cofield, the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, who was picked as the league's rookie of the week three times last season ... Cofield was also voted as the W&M Tip-Off Classic Most Valuable Player ... He leads the team this season with 17.0 points and 6.7 rebounds per game while shooting .593 (16-27) from the field and .792 (19-24) from the free throw line.

High Scoring Tribe

Under head coach Tony Shaver's fast-paced style of play, the Tribe has scored 80 or more points in nine of his 31 games at W&M, including two of the first three games this season ... This is the second straight season that the College has opened with two games in the 80s ... The last time that happened, before Shaver came to W&M last season,

was the start of the 1980-81 campaign, with an 85-64 win over Pace (Nov. 29) and an 84-56 win over Christopher Newport ... The Tribe scored 80 or more points seven times last season, the first time a W&M team had done that since the 1995-96 campaign, when the Green and Gold had 80 or more points in nine games ... With an average of 71.7 points per game last season, the Tribe averaged more than 70 points a game for the first time since scoring at a 74.0 ppg clip in 1995-96.

Best Things in Life are Free (Throws)

Part of W&M's 2-1 start this season can be attributed to its performance from the free throw line, where the Tribe has gone 74-101 (.733) ... The school record for free throw percentage in a season is .772 (470-609), set in the 1982-83 campaign ... The only other time the College made over 75 percent of its foul shots was in the 1972-73 season (483-636, .759) ... Last season W&M was 442-634 (.697) from the charity stripe ... The Tribe has taken nearly twice as many foul shots as the opposition this season (101 to 56) and is outscoring opponents by 37 points (74-37) from the line ... Three players who have attempted 10 or more free throws this season are shooting over 79 percent, led by junior **Hawley Smith**, who is 18-20 (.900) and has connected on his last 16 shots from the line.

Season Openers

After the season-opening 84-71 win over Hartford, W&M is 53-47 (.530) all-time in the first game of the year, and has won six of its last nine season-opening games ... Last season, Tony Shaver became the 12th head coach to win his first game at the College, as the Tribe defeated Liberty, 91-64, on November 23 ... This is the third straight year and the fifth time in the last six seasons that the Tribe has started the year in W&M Hall.

Corey Cofield Voted to Preseason All-CAA Second Team

In a vote of the league's media at CAA Media Day on Oct. 27, sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** was picked to the all-conference second team ... The 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year and third team all-league pick at the end of last season, Cofield is the Tribe's top-returning scorer and rebounder, averaging 13.2 points and 6.6 rebounds as a freshman ... Cofield also led the team with six double-doubles in his first year of collegiate basketball.

Back-to-Back Games

This is the second straight season, and the third time in the last four years, that the Tribe has opened the season with games on consecutive days ... It is the first time in almost 50 years that the College has opened a season with back-to-back home games on consecutive days ... W&M began the 1956-57 season with home wins over The Citadel (87-74) on Nov. 30 and Hampden-Sydney (98-81) on Dec. 1 ... Last season, the Tribe opened the year with a 91-64 win over Liberty on Nov. 23 before falling on the road to Radford, 89-86, on Nov. 24 ... The Tribe opened at the Red Raider Classic in 2001-02, with a 75-55 loss to Texas Tech on Nov. 16 and a 76-55 defeat at the hands of Northern Iowa on Nov. 17.

Tribe Hosts First Regular Season Tournament

This season's inaugural W&M Tip-Off Classic was the first regular season tournament ever to be hosted by the College and was first men's basketball tournament of any kind to be played at W&M Hall since the Tribe hosted the ECAC South Tournament in 1985 ... W&M also played home quarterfinal games in the 1975, 1976 and 1977 Southern Conference and the 1980 and 1981 ECAC South tournaments ...

W&M Hall was the location of NCAA Tournament first round games in 1972 and 1973, although W&M did not play in either of those games.

Happy Birthday

Junior center **Nate Loehrke** celebrated his 22nd birthday on Saturday, Nov. 20, when the Tribe defeated Radford, 81-76, in the championship game of the W&M Tip-Off Classic ... The only other member of the team who will celebrate a birthday on the day of a regular season game is senior guard **Nick D'Antoni**, who will turn 23 years old on Dec. 4, when the Tribe plays at Old Dominion ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith** will celebrate his 22nd birthday on March 4, the same day as the first round of the 2005 CAA Tournament.

No Place Like Home

W&M will play 14 home games this season, the most since also playing 14 at home in 2002-03 ... The Tribe also had 14 home games in 1995-96 ... The last time W&M had more than 14 home games was in the 1991-92 season, when the Green and Gold played 15 times inside W&M Hall.

Tough Competition

W&M will take on two of the nation's best teams in the non-conference portion of the schedule with games at Kentucky (Dec. 22) and North Carolina (Jan. 2) ... Two of the most storied programs in college basketball history, UK (1876-577-1, .765) and UNC (1827-677, .730) entered the 2004-05 campaign ranked first and second, respectively, in Division I history for most wins and highest winning percentage ... The Tribe will join Indiana and Tennessee as the only three teams in the nation to face both Carolina and Kentucky this regular season and will be the only team to play them both on their own home court.

Head Coach Tony Shaver

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his second season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program. Officially hired on May 2, 2003, Shaver is the 31st men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Although the Tribe did not have a winning record in 2004, there were a number of highlights that foreshadow the successes that W&M will soon experience under Shaver. In his first game at the College, the Tribe pounded Liberty, 91-64, while shooting 54.0 percent from the field. Shaver also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime. In his first contest against a nationally-ranked opponent, W&M also performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There were individual successes as well for the Green and Gold. 2004 graduate Adam Hess became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a first team Academic All-America and all-conference selection. Current sophomore Corey Cofield was voted the CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Several players saw significant improvement from their prior year, most notably 2004 grad Zeb Cope, who scored more than three times his career average entering the season, and senior Nick D'Antoni, who started every game and ended the year nine assists away from breaking the school record for a season, after averaging just 12.2 minutes per game his previous year.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious

Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (23), a standout pitcher on the Tribe's baseball team, who is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization, Austin (19) and Jackson (13).

Freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** scored a team-high 22 points in his first collegiate game to lead four Tribe players in double-figures, as W&M defeated Hartford, 84-71, in the second game of the W&M Tip-off Classic.

Ofori Attah shot 50% from the floor (7-for-14), including 4-of-6 from behind the three-point line, coming off the bench in his first college game.

Sophomore **Corey Cofield**, the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, picked up where he left off last season, scoring 20 points on 7-for-12 shooting from the floor and sharing team-high honors with six rebounds. Cofield added two assists and a block and was a perfect 6-for-6 from the foul line. He capped a strong first-half effort with a put-back lay-in in the closing seconds of the opening half to give W&M a 32-27 lead at the break.

The Tribe quickly turned a five-point halftime lead into an 18-point advantage in the first six minutes of the second half, using a 13-1 run to extend the lead to 52-34 with just under 15 minutes remaining. The spurt was capped by three consecutive treys, the first two by Ofori Attah, and the last by junior **Hawley Smith**.

After the Hawks cut the deficit to 14, an Ofori Attah free throw and a Cofield three-point play pushed the lead back to 18 with 10:48 remaining. The W&M lead grew to 22, its biggest of the game, just over a minute later, as Cofield, junior **Taylor Mokris** and Ofori Attah connected on six straight opportunities from the foul line, giving the Tribe a 64-42 lead.

Hartford trimmed the Tribe advantage to 11 on back-to-back three-pointers from junior guard Aaron Cook, cutting the deficit to 65-54 with 6:12 left on the clock, but a pair of free throws from Mokris and junior **Adam Dutton** lay up pushed the lead back to 15.

The Hawks got as close as 10 with 2:07 left, but another pair of Mokris free throws and two-straight Ofori Attah field goals put the game out of reach at 79-66 with 50 seconds remaining.

Joining Ofori Attah and Cofield in double-figures were Smith and freshman **Laimis Kisielius**. Smith poured in a career-high 19 points, which included a 9-for-12 performance from the charity stripe, and pulled down six boards. Kisielius was 3-of-5 from the floor and 4-for-4 from the stripe for 10 points in his first collegiate game.

Mokris did all of his damage from the foul line, going 6-for-6 on the evening. As a team, the Tribe shot 76.2% from the foul line (32-for-42), including 23-for-27 in the second half.

Corey Cofield recorded a double-double with 24 points and 10 rebounds, both game-highs, and **Nathan Mann**'s hot shooting in the second half led William and Mary to an 81-76 victory over Radford in the championship game of the W&M Tip-off Classic at William and Mary Hall.

Cofield shot an impressive 7-for-9 from the field and converted 10-of-14 free throw opportunities in the title game to earn tournament MVP honors, as the Tribe captured the title in the first regular season tournament ever hosted by the College.

Trailing by as many as 10 points in the second half, Cofield, Mann and **Hawley Smith** keyed a second-half surge that erased the Tribe deficit at the 5:42 mark. Smith knocked down a field goal at the 8:18 mark to cut the Highlanders' lead to five, and then nailed a pair of free throws to shrink Radford's lead to three. The Highlanders restored their lead to five just over a minute later, before Mann's first three-pointer at the 6:11 mark and pair of free throws from Cofield brought about a 69-69 tie.

With just under five minutes remaining, Mann dialed long distance once again, giving W&M its first lead of the game, 72-69, since the 17-minute mark of the second half, when the Tribe led 43-42. Cofield, Mann and **Laimis Kisielius** all hit clutch free throws down the stretch to preserve the victory. Mann finished with 14 points on 4-of-9 shooting, with all nine attempts coming from behind the arc. He added a team-high five assists and four rebounds.

Smith scored in double figures for the second straight game with 15 to join Cofield on the all-tournament team, while Kisielius chipped in with 11 to give W&M four players in double figures.

Both teams struggled from the floor early, as W&M hit on just 2-of-8 attempts from the field in the opening six minutes, while the Highlanders managed only a 3-for-7 effort. Trailing 7-4, Radford began to heat up, hitting five straight field goals, including seven points by all-tournament team selection Olumuyiwa Poopoola, to spur a 13-0 run and take a 17-7 lead with just under 12 minutes remaining in the opening half.

The Radford lead grew to as many as 11 after six straight points from Chris Oliver, another all-tournament team selection with 23 points, before the Tribe began to chip away.

Cofield and Kisielius each knocked down a pair of free throws to cut the deficit to six, and a Kisielius lay-in at the 5:17 mark trimmed the Highlanders' advantage to four, before back-to-back jumpers from Cofield had the Tribe within one at 31-30 with 2:37 remaining in the half.

Taylor Mokris drained two of his three first-half treys in the final two minutes, including one in the closing seconds to knot the score at 36-36 heading into the break.

William and Mary freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** scored 17 points, but it was not enough, as the Tribe men's basketball team fell at Campbell, 75-62, at Carter Gymnasium.

The loss was the first of the season for W&M, which fell to 2-1 on the year. The Fighting Camels improved to 1-1 with the win.

The Camels opened the contest with an 11-1 lead and never looked back, going ahead by as many as 17 points in the first half before taking a 12-point, 45-33 advantage into halftime. The Tribe started to come back in the second, using a 17-10 run over the first 10 minutes, ending with a layup by junior **Nate Loehrke**, to close to within five at 55-50. The two teams traded free throws, before sophomore **Adam Trumbower** knocked down a pair from the line to cut Campbell's lead to just three, 56-53, with 7:56 remaining. The Camels led 60-54, before a three-pointer from junior **Taylor Mokris** cut the lead back to three points with 6:05 to play. However, that would be as close as the Tribe would get, as Campbell went on an 11-3 run over the next six minutes to put the game away.

Joining Ofori Attah in double figures was junior **Hawley Smith**, who had 11 points on 4-5 shooting from the field and a 3-3 performance from the free throw line. Anthony Atkinson led three Campbell players in double figures with 18 points, while Comerlee Poole had a double-double with 10 points and a game-high 12 rebounds.

W&M shot .382 from the field, including a 4-27 (.148) effort from the three-point line, while the Camels shot 28-60 (.467) in the game.
