Top Storylines

- William and Mary will host Delaware Saturday afternoon at 2:00 PM in William and Mary Hall ... It will be the Tribe's second straight home game and its third in the last four games.
- W&M's last game was a 71-59 home loss to Hofstra on Wednesday ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith** led all scorers with a career high 20 points in the game, adding four rebounds and two steals ... Rookie guard **Nathan Mann** came off the bench for 13 points, including 11 on 4-5 shooting overall and 3-4 from behind the arc in the first half ... Sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** had a team high five rebounds, while also adding eight points ... Smith, Cofield and freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** each went 6-6 from the free throw line, leading the Tribe to a 20-22 (.909) performance from the charity stripe.
- This will be the 16th meeting between W&M and Delaware ... The Blue Hens lead the series, 9-6 ... W&M's last win came on Jan. 5, 2002 in Williamsburg, as the Tribe defeated Delaware, 59-53.
- Smith leads the Tribe in scoring with an average of 12.3 points per game and is second on the team with 5.1 rebounds per game ... Cofield is second on the team with 10.6 ppg and first with 6.2 rebounds per game ... Including Smith, in his first season at W&M after transferring from Temple, four of the Tribe's top five scorers are new to the team this year ... Rookies **Edwin Ofori Attah** (8.7 ppg), **Nathan Mann** (7.6 ppg) and **Laimis Kisielius** (6.9 ppg) round out the top five.
- Head coach **Tony Shaver** is in his second season at W&M ... Shaver came to the College after a very successful 17-year career at Hampden-Sydney, where he compiled a record of 358-121 (.747), including eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference championships, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Tournament appearances, advancing to the national championship game in 1999 and the Final Four again in 2003.

Tough Transfer

W&M junior forward **Hawley Smith** is the most recent in a long line of significant transfers to the College from other Division I programs ... Per NCAA regulations, Smith sat out last season, following two seasons at Temple University ... One of two players to have started every game this season, he leads the team with 12.3 points per game and a .566 field goal percentage, and is second with 5.1 rebounds per game ... W&M has had at least one Division I transfer on the active roster all but one year since the start of the 1995-96 campaign, all of whom have been significant contributors with starting experience ... The trend began with the arrival of **Bobby Fitzgibbons** (Wake Forest), **David Grabuloff** (Florida State) and **Sam Steen** (Loyola [MD]) in 1995-96 and continued with two-time first team All-CAA selection **Adam Hess** (Eastern Michigan), who graduated last season ... Currently sitting out this year is guard **Adam Payton** (Vanderbilt), who will be eligible to play for W&M next year.

Ofori Attah Named CAA Rookie of the Week

Tribe guard **Edwin Ofori Attah** was named the Colonial Athletic Association's Rookie of the Week on Dec. 6 ... In two games, Ofori Attah came off the bench to average 17.5 points and shoot .583 from the floor ... He scored a game-high 17 points to go with six rebounds in a win over Longwood ... He followed that up three days later with a game-high 18 points, along with four rebounds, against Old Dominion in the Tribe's first conference game of the season.

Cofield Named CAA Player of the Week

Sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** received the first Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Week award for the 2004-05 season on Nov. 22 ... A preseason second team all-league selection, Cofield averaged 22.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in the first two games of the season, leading the Tribe to the W&M Tip-Off Classic championship ... It is the first player of the week honor for Cofield,

the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, who was picked as the league's rookie of the week three times last season ... Cofield was also voted as the 2004 W&M Tip-Off Classic Most Valuable Player ... He is second on the team with 10.6 ppg and leads W&M with 6.2 rebounds per game.

D'Antoni Passes Pride

Against Hampton, senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** passed 1990 W&M graduate and Major League Baseball player **Curtis Pride** for sole possession of 10th place on the College's all-time assist list ... He currently has 293 career assists, just four away from tying **Matt O'Reilly** (1987-90) for ninth place ... W&M's all-time assist leader is **Scott Coval** (1983-86) with 409 ... The nephew of current Phoenix Suns head coach Mike D'Antoni, Nick is averaging 3.29 assists per game in his career, the fifth-best mark in school history ... Ranked 14th in the CAA with 2.55 assists per game, his career 1.47 assist-to-turnover ratio is third-best in W&M history ... Last season, he totalled 159 assists, second-most in school history and just nine away from tying the school record of 168 set by Coval in 1985.

Straight Shooters

In the recent home game against Hofstra (Jan. 5), three different W&M players, junior **Hawley Smith**, sophomore **Corey Cofield** and freshman **Laimis Kisielius**, each went 6-6 from the free throw line, leading the Tribe to a 20-22 (.909) effort from the stripe in that game ... It was the Tribe's second straight game shooting over 90% from the line, as the Tribe was 11-12 (.917) at No. 4 North Carolina (Jan. 2) ... Not coincidentally, the three are W&M's best and most prolific free throw shooters this season ... Cofield leads the team and is third in the CAA at .820 (41-50), Smith is second on the team and fourth in the league at .813 (39-48), while Kisielius is third on the team and tied for fifth in the conference at .800 (24-30) ... W&M is shooting .728 from the line this season, second in the CAA and the eighth-best mark in school history ... The Tribe has made 182 foul shots this year, nearly as many as the 197 its opponents have attempted.

Tough Competition

W&M played two of the nation's best teams in the non-conference portion of the schedule with games at Kentucky (Dec. 22) and North

Carolina (Jan. 2) ... Two of the most storied programs in college basketball history, UK (1876-577-1, .765) and UNC (1827-677, .730) entered the 2004-05 campaign ranked first and second, respectively, in Division I history for most wins and highest winning percentage ... The Tribe joined Indiana and Tennessee as the only teams in the nation to face both Carolina and Kentucky this regular season, and was the only team to play them both on the road ... This is the first time since the 1995-96 campaign that W&M faced two nationally-ranked teams in the same season ... That year, W&M lost to No. 15 Virginia (87-58) and No. 22 Virginia Tech (71-66).

Winning with Defense

Despite head coach **Tony Shaver's** preference for a fast-paced, high-offense style of play, the Tribe proved it could also win a defensive struggle, grinding out a 60-51 win over Hampton on Thursday ... The Pirates' 18 field goals, .333 field goal percentage and 51 points are all season lows for a W&M opponent this season ... The 51 points allowed was the Tribe's best defensive effort since a 54-51 win over George

Long Layoff ...

Between games at Old Dominion (Dec. 4) and at UNC Greensboro (Dec. 20) W&M went 15 days without playing, the longest stretch of days without a game in the CAA ... The layoff was due to the College's policy of not allowing regular season athletic events during the two-week final exam period ... The Tribe's last game before the break was Dec. 4 at Old Dominion ... The next-longest stretch of days without a game in the CAA was George Mason's 13-day layoff between games on Dec. 8 and Dec. 22.

30-Point Win Over Longwood

W&M's 90-60 victory over Longwood was the College's first win of 30 or more points since defeating Washington College by 53, 92-39, in Williamsburg on Nov. 20 to open the 1999-2000 season ... The last time W&M earned a 30-point win over a countable Division I opponent was a 32-point, 101-69 win over Elon on Dec. 22, 1998 at the Stanford Invitational ... That game was also the last time that the Green and Gold scored 100 points against any opponent.

High-Scoring Tribe

Under head coach **Tony Shaver's** fast-paced style of play, the Tribe has scored 80 or more points in 10 of his 39 games at W&M, including three of the Tribe's wins this season ... This is the second straight season that the

College has opened with two games in the 80s ... The last time that happened, before Shaver came to W&M last season, was the start of the 1980-81 campaign, with an 85-64 win over Pace (Nov. 29) and an 84-56 win over Christopher Newport ... The Tribe scored 80 or more points seven times last season, the first time a W&M team had done that since the 1995-96 campaign, when the Green and Gold had 80 or more points in nine games ... Head Coach Tony Shaver

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his second season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program. Officially hired on May 2, 2003, Shaver is the 31st men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Although the Tribe did not have a winning record in 2004, there were a number of highlights that foreshadow the successes that W&M will soon experience under Shaver. In his first game at the College, the Tribe pounded Liberty, 91-64, while shooting 54.0 percent from the field. Shaver also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime. In his first contest against a nationally-ranked opponent, W&M also performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There were individual successes as well for the Green and Gold. 2004 graduate Adam Hess became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a first team Academic All-America and all-conference selection. Current sophomore Corey Cofield was voted the CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Several players saw significant improvement from their prior year, most notably 2004 grad Zeb Cope, who scored more than three times his career average entering the season, and senior Nick D'Antoni, who started every game and ended the year nine assists away from breaking the school record for a season, after averaging just 12.2 minutes per game his previous year.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious

Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (23), a standout pitcher on the Tribe's baseball team, who is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization, Austin (19) and Jackson (13).

Freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** scored a team-high 22 points in his first collegiate game to lead four Tribe players in double-figures, as W&M defeated Hartford, 84-71, in the second game of the W&M Tip-off Classic.

Ofori Attah shot 50% from the floor (7-for-14), including 4-of-6 from behind the three-point line, coming off the bench in his first college game.

Sophomore **Corey Cofield**, the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, picked up where he left off last season, scoring 20 points on 7-for-12 shooting from the floor and sharing team-high honors with six rebounds. Cofield added two assists and a block and was a perfect 6-for-6 from the foul line. He capped a strong first-half effort with a put-back lay-in in the closing seconds of the opening half to give W&M a 32-27 lead at the break.

The Tribe quickly turned a five-point halftime lead into an 18-point advantage in the first six minutes of the second half, using a 13-1 run to extend the lead to 52-34 with just under 15 minutes remaining. The spurt was capped by three consecutive treys, the first two by Ofori Attah, and the last by junior **Hawley Smith**.

After the Hawks cut the deficit to 14, an Ofori Attah free throw and a Cofield three-point play pushed the lead back to 18 with 10:48 remaining. The W&M lead grew to 22, its biggest of the game, just over a minute later, as Cofield, junior **Taylor Mokris** and Ofori Attah connected on six straight opportunities from the foul line, giving the Tribe a 64-42 lead.

Hartford trimmed the Tribe advantage to 11 on back-to-back three-pointers from junior guard Aaron Cook, cutting the deficit to 65-54 with 6:12 left on the clock, but a pair of free throws from Mokris and junior **Adam Dutton** lay up pushed the lead back to 15.

The Hawks got as close as 10 with 2:07 left, but another pair of Mokris free throws and two-straight Ofori Attah field goals put the game out of reach at 79-66 with 50 seconds remaining.

Joining Ofori Attah and Cofield in double-figures were Smith and freshman **Laimis Kisielius**. Smith poured in a career-high 19 points, which included a 9-for-12 performance from the charity stripe, and pulled down six boards. Kisielius was 3-of-5 from the floor and 4-for-4 from the stripe for 10 points in his first collegiate game.

Mokris did all of his damage from the foul line, going 6-for-6 on the evening. As a team, the Tribe shot 76.2% from the foul line (32-for-42), including 23-for-27 in the second half.

Corey Cofield recorded a double-double with 24 points and 10 rebounds, both game-highs, and **Nathan Mann**'s hot shooting in the second half led William and Mary to an 81-76 victory over Radford in the championship game of the W&M Tip-off Classic at William and Mary Hall.

Cofield shot an impressive 7-for-9 from the field and converted 10-of-14 free throw opportunities in the title game to earn tournament MVP honors, as the Tribe captured the title in the first regular season tournament ever hosted by the College.

Trailing by as many as 10 points in the second half, Cofield, Mann and **Hawley Smith** keyed a second-half surge that erased the Tribe deficit at the 5:42 mark. Smith knocked down a field goal at the 8:18 mark to cut the Highlanders' lead to five, and then nailed a pair of free throws to shrink Radford's lead to three. The Highlanders restored their lead to five just over a minute later, before Mann's first three-pointer at the 6:11 mark and pair of free throws from Cofield brought about a 69-69 tie.

With just under five minutes remaining, Mann dialed long distance once again, giving W&M its first lead of the game, 72-69, since the 17-minute mark of the second half, when the Tribe led 43-42. Cofield, Mann and **Laimis Kisielius** all hit clutch free throws down the stretch to preserve the victory. Mann finished with 14 points on 4-of-9 shooting, with all nine attempts coming from behind the arc. He added a team-high five assists and four rebounds.

Smith scored in double figures for the second straight game with 15 to join Cofield on the all-tournament team, while Kisielius chipped in with 11 to give W&M four players in double figures.

Both teams struggled from the floor early, as W&M hit on just 2-of-8 attempts from the field in the opening six minutes, while the Highlanders managed only a 3-for-7 effort. Trailing 7-4, Radford began to heat up, hitting five straight field goals, including seven points by all-tournament team selection Olumuyiwa Poopoola, to spur a 13-0 run and take a 17-7 lead with just under 12 minutes remaining in the opening half.

The Radford lead grew to as many as 11 after six straight points from Chris Oliver, another all-tournament team selection with 23 points, before the Tribe began to chip away.

Cofield and Kisielius each knocked down a pair of free throws to cut the deficit to six, and a Kisielius lay-in at the 5:17 mark trimmed the Highlanders' advantage to four, before back-to-back jumpers from Cofield had the Tribe within one at 31-30 with 2:37 remaining in the half.

Taylor Mokris drained two of his three first-half treys in the final two minutes, including one in the closing seconds to knot the score at 36-36 heading into the break.

Jamon Gordon poured in a game-high 20 points and Carlos Dixon added 18 to lead Virginia Tech's men's basketball team to an 80-63 victory over William and Mary.

As the first ACC team to visit W&M Hall since 1996, the Hokies outscored W&M 18-5 over the final five minutes of the first half to extend a four-point lead to a 42-25 advantage at the break. Junior **Hawley Smith** knocked down a pair of free throws with 5:40 remaining in the opening half to pull the Tribe within 24-20, before the Tech run began.

Dixon scored eight of his 11 first-half points in a 14-3 Hokie spurt, after a put-back layup from Smith cut the Tech lead to 28-22 with four minutes remaining.

Freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** buried a three-pointer, his only field goal of the first half, with just under three minutes remaining that made the score 32-25, but Virginia Tech held the Tribe scoreless the rest of the way, using a 10-0 run to close the period.

Gordon was a perfect three-for-three from behind the arc in the second half, as the Hokies opened up as much as a 22-point lead and held off any chance of a Tribe comeback.

After sophomore **Corey Cofield** sank a pair from the foul line with 12:38 remaining in the game to cut the Tribe's deficit to 53-39, Gordon hit on back-to-back three-pointers to push the lead back to 20.

W&M closed to within 16 at the 7:22 mark after a pair of free throws from junior **Adam Dutton**, but Dixon answered with another three for the Hokies, who shot 50% (9-for-18) from behind the arc in the game.

Senior **Nick D'Antoni** cut the deficit to 73-56 with two free throws with 3:55 remaining, but Gordon responded with his final trey, again extending the lead back to 20.

Smith recorded his first career double-double with 10 points and a game-high 11 rebounds, surpassing his previous career-high of seven boards with eight in the first half alone, while Cofield paced the Tribe with 14 points, including an eight-for-eight effort at the charity stripe.

Junior **Nate Loehrke** narrowly missed his first career double-double with 10 points and a career-high nine rebounds in 18 minutes, and freshman **Nathan Mann** tallied 11, spurred by a 3-for-4 effort from three-point range, to give W&M four in double-figures.

Freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** scored a game-high 17 points and junior **Hawley Smith** dropped in 16 points and pulled down seven rebounds to lead the William and Mary men's basketball team to a 90-60 win over in-state rival Longwood University at William and Mary Hall.

The Tribe improved to 3-2 with the victory, while the Lancers remained winless on the year, falling to 0-6.

Ofori Attah hit on 6-of-12 attempts from the floor to pace the Tribe, which shot a season-high 50% (30-for-60) from the field. Smith also had a solid shooting performance, going 5-for-9 from the floor and 5-of-6 at the foul line.

Freshman **Nathan Mann** chipped in 11, giving the College three players in double-figures, and added four assists, four rebounds and a career and game-high five steals.

The Tribe shot a blistering 60.6% (20-for-33) from the field in the first half, led by Ofori Attah and Mann, to open up a 56-34 lead at the break. Ofori Attah connected on 5-of-9 attempts from the floor for 13 points in the opening period, while Mann added 10, sparked by 3-of-4 shooting from behind the arc.

Longwood slowly chipped away at the Tribe's lead in the second half, cutting the deficit to as few as 11 points at the 12:25 mark on a Dana Smith jumper, which made it 63-52.

After a W&M timeout, however, the Tribe went back on the offensive, as Smith answered with a lay-in and a pair of free throws on the following possession to push the lead back to 15 with 11:25 remaining.

The Lancers' Husein Pistoljevic trimmed the College's lead to 12 with his second try of the game at the 8:57 mark, but consecutive field goals from Ofori Attah, junior **Adam Dutton** and sophomore **Corey Cofield** gave the Tribe a 19-point lead, 76-57, effectively putting the game out of reach with just under six minutes left.

Cofield wound up with eight points on 4-of-6 shooting and eight rebounds, while Dutton tallied eight points behind a 3-for-4 effort from the floor.

Lamar Barrett led the Lancers with 16 points on 8-for-10 shooting from the floor and seven rebounds. Maurice Sumter added 11 points and six rebounds.

William and Mary freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** came off the bench for a game-high 18 points, but it was not enough, as the Tribe men's basketball team lost to Old Dominion, 69-56, at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

Following the first Colonial Athletic Association game of the year for both teams, W&M's record dropped to 3-3, while the Monarchs, picked in the preseason by both the coaches and the media to win the conference, improved to 6-1.

Neither team led by more than six points in the back-and-forth first half, that featured four ties and seven lead changes. Both sides started off slowly, combining for just 24 points through the first 10 minutes, with W&M tying the score at 12 on a pair of free throws by rookie **Laimis Kisielius**. ODU scored six straight from there, ending with a layup by John Morris, for an 18-12 lead, but the Tribe used an 11-2 run, led by seven points by Ofori Attah, to take a 23-20 lead with 3:48 left in the half. The Monarchs took a 31-27 lead with 25 seconds left on a layup by CAA Preseason Player of the Year Alex Loughton, but a layup with three seconds left in the half by W&M sophomore **Corey Cofield**, the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, cut led Monarchs' lead to just two points, 31-29, at the intermission.

ODU opened the second period with a 13-6 run, including six points from Arnaud Dahi, to go up 44-37 less than five minutes into the half. The Tribe battled back to close within three, 44-41, on buckets by Ofori Attah and Cofield, but that would be as close as the College would get, as the Monarchs used the next five minutes to take a 59-45 advantage, eventually leading by as many as 16 points, before closing out the 13-point, 69-56, win.

The Tribe out-rebounded ODU, 41-37, and shot .458 (22-48) from the floor, compared to a .373 (25-67) performance from the Monarchs. However, the Tribe was ultimately done in by a season-high 23 turnovers, compared to just seven giveaways for ODU. This was also the first game all season in which the Tribe committed more fouls than its opponent, as the Green and Gold was whistled for a season-high 24 fouls, compared to just 19 for ODU.

Along with Ofori Attah's 18 points, Cofield also scored in double figures for W&M with 13 points (including 11 in the second half), while pulling down a team-high eight rebounds. Loughton and Isaiah Hunter led the Monarchs with 14 points each, followed by Dahi with 13 and Kiah Thomas, who added 12.

William and Mary freshman **Laimis Kisielius** scored a career-high 15 points and the Tribe men's basketball team made 50.0% of its three-point field goal attempts, but the Green and Gold was unable to defeat UNC Greensboro, falling to the Spartans, 84-62, at Fleming Gymnasium.

The loss dropped to the Tribe's record to 3-4, while UNCG improved to 7-2 on the year.

W&M opened the game with an 8-2 lead early, but the Spartans regrouped, going on a 20-1 run to lead 22-9. UNCG led by 15 points, 34-19, with 5:23 left in the first half, before the Tribe rallied for an 11-2 run in a span of less than four minutes to close within six points, 36-30, with 1:49 remaining. Sophomore **Adam Trumbower** started the rally with his second three-pointer of the game, while seniors **Nick D'Antoni** and **Reid Markham** each also added a shot from long-range, and junior center **Nate Loehrke** contributed a pair of buckets.

However, the Spartans started the second half by scoring on five of their first six possessions, scoring the first 10 points following the break to take a commanding, 51-32, lead with 17:14 remaining. The Tribe was never able to get closer than 13 points the rest of the way, eventually falling, 84-62.

Along with the 15 points from Kisielius, junior forward **Hawley Smith** also scored in double figures for W&M, with 10 points to go with five rebounds and two blocked shots. UNCG's Ronnie Burrell led all scorers with 22 points and also had a game-high 10 rebounds in the game. Kyle Hines blocked six shots, as the Spartans broke their school record with 13 blocks in the contest. Hines also had 16 points and nine rebounds in the game.

The Tribe made half of its 18 three-point field goal attempts, but was hurt by its 18 turnovers. W&M also attempted a season-low nine free throws, making just five shots from the line, well below the team's average of 20.5 points from the charity stripe entering the contest.

William and Mary's men's basketball team lost to eighth-ranked Kentucky, 92-47, at Rupp Arena. The loss dropped the Tribe's record to 3-5 on the season, while the Wildcats improve to 8-1.

W&M senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** knocked down a three-pointer to give the Tribe a 3-2 lead early in the contest, but 11 straight points by Kentucky in less than three minutes set the tone early on, as the Wildcats used a 38-8 run to take a 29-point lead with 4:41 left in the first half.

Trailing 44-19 at the start of the second half, W&M used three pointers by freshman guard **Edwin Ofori Attah** and junior forward **Hawley Smith** to cut the UK lead to 21 points, 46-25, with 17:26 to play, but that would be as close as the College would get the rest of the way, as the Wildcats cruised to the 45-point victory.

Kentucky's Chuck Hayes led all scorers with 18 points, followed by Kelenna Azubuike with 17 and Joe Crawford with 12. Playing his first career college game in his home state, W&M senior guard and Louisville native **Reid Markham** tied junior guard **Taylor Mokris** for the team high with seven points. W&M shot .372 from the field, compared to .487 shooting for the Wildcats, but, again, the Tribe's biggest problem was turnovers, as the Green and Gold gave the ball away a season-high 32 times in the game.

Junior forward **Hawley Smith** scored 13 points on 6-of-8 shooting, and senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** added 12 as William and Mary defeated in-state rival Hampton, 60-51, Thursday night in men's basketball action at William and Mary Hall.

The victory snapped a three-game losing streak for the Tribe, which improved to 4-5 overall. The Pirates fell to 3-9 with the loss.

Smith keyed a strong second-half effort for the College, scoring 10 of his team-high 13 points in the second frame, while D'Antoni buried a key three-pointer and converted all six of his opportunities from the foul line down the stretch to ice the win.

With the Tribe clinging to a five-point lead, 42-37, with just under six minutes remaining, freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** pulled down an offensive rebound and found D'Antoni wide open at the top of the arc, resulting in D'Antoni's second triple of the half and an eight-point W&M lead.

The Pirates cut the deficit to seven on a free throw from Bruce Brown with 4:35 left, but a three-pointer from freshman guard **Nathan Mann** on the Tribe's next possession pushed the advantage to 10, 48-38.

D'Antoni sank his first two attempts from the charity stripe to increase the lead to 12 with 3:38 remaining, before back-to-back buckets from Smith, including a break-away dunk, gave the Tribe a 54-41 advantage with 1:23 remaining.

Hampton guard Junior Pehoua nailed four three-pointers in the final 1:31 of the contest, but D'Antoni (4-of-4) and Mann (2-of-2) answered with six-straight free throws to hold off the Pirates' late charge. Pehoua canned his final trey with 15 seconds left on the clock to set the final margin, 60-51.

Sophomore forward **Corey Cofield**, who was held scoreless in his previous two games, chipped in seven points and a game-high 10 rebounds for the Tribe, before fouling out with 2:47 remaining. Mann wound up with nine points, including a 4-for-6 effort at the line, while Kisielius added eight points, three rebounds and three assists. The unsung hero for W&M in the game was senior guard **Reid Markham**, who scored just four points, but contributed with five assists (against just one turnover), two steals and four rebounds, including a pair of crucial offensive boards in the second half.

The Tribe converted 9-of-11 (81.8%) attempts from the foul line in the second half and shot 50% (12-for-24) from the field, to the Pirates' 7-for-19 (36.8%) effort from the charity stripe and 9-for-24 (37.5%) performance from the floor.

William and Mary's men's basketball team played fourth-ranked North Carolina to a 20-20 tie through the first 10 minutes of play, before the Tar Heels went on a 29-7 run in less than nine minutes, defeating the Tribe, 105-66, Sunday afternoon at the Dean E. Smith Center.

W&M fell to 4-6 with the loss in the College's final non-conference game of the regular season. UNC won its 12th straight game to improve to 12-1.

Hofstra's men's basketball team shot 53.6% in the first half, including 50% from three-point range, and had five score in double-figures to beat William and Mary, 71-59, Wednesday night in Colonial Athletic Association action at William and Mary Hall.

The Tribe's **Hawley Smith** scored a career-high 20 points on 6-for-9 shooting from the floor to pace the College, which dropped to 4-7 overall and 0-2 in the CAA. The Pride, off to its best start since 1960-61, improved to 10-1 overall, 2-0 in the league.

Hofstra opened up a 12-2 lead in the first five minutes of the contest and led by as many as 15 in the opening frame behind a torrid start from the field. Sophomore guard Carlos Rivera, who shared team-high honors in the game with 16 points, drained 3-of-4 attempts from behind the arc in the first half, as the Pride shot 7-for-14 from long distance and took a 42-30 lead at the break.

Tribe guard **Nathan Mann** kept the Green and Gold in it early with his own long-range shooting, burying 3-of-4 three-point shots in the first stanza en route to 11 points at intermission.

The College quickly cut the deficit to eight in the second half on back-to-back buckets from Smith, but a jumper from Pride sophomore Loren Stokes, who tied Rivera for the team-lead with 16, pushed the advantage back to 10, 44-34, with 17:34 remaining.

Smith trimmed the lead to seven with a three-pointer with 17:15 remaining, but Stokes answered with two free throws after a Tribe turnover to push the lead back to nine, 48-39. W&M sophomore **Corey Cofield** dropped in his lone field goal of the game on the next possession to get within seven again, but that was as close as the Tribe would get, as Hofstra reeled off a 12-0 run to take a 19-point lead, 60-41, with 13:10 remaining.

The Tribe pulled to within 11 on two occasions down the stretch on a layup from junior **Nate Loehrke** that made it 62-51 with 7:33 left, and a jumper from Smith at the 4:25 mark that cut the deficit to 64-53, but Rivera drilled his fourth triple of the game with 1:27 to give his team a 70-57 lead and put the game away.

Smith, who went 2-for-3 from behind the arc and 6-for-6 from the stripe, added four rebounds and a pair of steals, while Mann wound up with 13 points on 5-of-8 FG shooting. Cofield chipped in with eight points and a team-high five boards, and freshman **Laimis Kisielius** added eight points, three rebounds and two assists. Smith, Kisielius and Cofield each shot 6-for-6 from the foul line, as the Tribe made good on 20-of-22 (90.9%) opportunities at the line.
