Top Storylines

- William and Mary's men's basketball team will open a three-game homestand on Wednesday evening, when the Tribe hosts UNC Wilmington ... The Tribe enters the game with a record of 4-10 overall and in 10th place in the Colonial Athletic Association with an 0-5 league record ... The Seahawks are 9-5 this season, tied with Delaware for second place in the CAA at 4-1.
- UNCW leads the series with W&M, 29-14 and has won six of the last seven games between the two teams ... This will be the first game between the two in more than a year ... Last season the two teams split the series, with each team winning on its home court ... The Tribe defeated UNCW, 67-66, in overtime on Dec. 4, but fell to the Seahawks in Wilmington, 67-59, on Jan. 7.
- W&M's last game was a 91-65 loss at Drexel ... Sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** came off the bench to lead the Tribe with 20 points and nine rebounds in 25 minutes ... Sophomore center **Brian Hutt** earned his first start of the season and responded by scoring a career high eight points, also adding four rebounds, two assists and two blocked shots.
- Cofield leads the Tribe in scoring (11.5 ppg), rebounding (6.4 rpg) and free throw percentage (.831) this season ... He is followed by junior forward **Hawley Smith**, who is second on the team with 10.9 points and 4.9 rebounds per game ... Senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** has a team best 2.4 assists per game and is ninth in W&M history with 299 assists in his career ... Including Smith, in his first season at W&M after transferring from Temple, four of the Tribe's top five scorers are new to the team this year ... Rookies **Ofori Attah** (9.0 ppg), **Laimis Kisielius** (7.2 ppg) and **Nathan Mann** (7.0 ppg) round out the top five.
- W&M has a .724 free throw percentage this season, ranked first in the CAA and the highest mark in a season for the program since shooting .734 from the line in 1984-85 ... This is just the fourth time since then that the Tribe has made over 70 percent of its foul shots, the most recent being the 1999-2000 campaign, when the team shot .707.

Three regular season games are scheduled to be televised this season. The Tribe's game at George Mason Jan. 29 will be shown live on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, the Metro Channel (New York) and KTVS (Albuquerque, NM). W&M's game at Kentucky on Dec. 22 was shown tape-delayed on the UKTV network. The game at North Carolina on Jan. 2 was shown live on the Raycom & Jefferson-Pilot ACC Network.

Cofield Leads Tribe in Points, Boards and Blocks

2004 CAA Rookie of the Year **Corey Cofield**, is again playing well this season, leading W&M in a variety of statistical categories ... The sophomore forward leads the team in scoring (11.5 ppg) and rebounding (6.4 rpg) and is tied with junior center **Nate Loehrke** for the team lead with 10 blocks ... Cofield is also shooting a team best .831 (59-71) from the free throw line, ranking him second in the CAA and a significant improvement from his 63.4 percent shooting from the line last season ... The CAA Player of the Week in the first week of this season, Cofield has 531 points (12.6 ppg) and 274 rebounds (6.5 rpg) in his 42 game career ... He scored his 500th career point in his 40th career game, on a free throw with 1:23 left to play against Delaware (Jan. 8) ... Cofield has played especially well lately, averaging 14.7 points and 7.0 rebounds in his last three games.

Tough Transfer

W&M junior forward **Hawley Smith** is the most recent in a long line of significant transfers to the College from other Division I programs ... Per NCAA regulations, Smith

sat out last season, following two seasons at Temple University ... The only player to have started every game this season, he leads the team with a .495 field goal percentage, and is second with 10.9 points and 6.4 rebounds per game ... W&M has had at least one Division I transfer on the active roster all but one year since the start of the 1995-96 campaign, all of whom have been significant contributors with starting experience ... The trend began with the arrival of **Bobby Fitzgibbons** (Wake Forest), **David Grabuloff** (Florida State) and **Sam Steen** (Loyola [MD]) in 1995-96 and continued with two-time first team All-CAA selection **Adam Hess** (Eastern Michigan), who graduated last season ... Currently sitting out this year is guard **Adam Payton** (Vanderbilt), who will be eligible to play for W&M next year.

D'Antoni Ranks Ninth at W&M

Senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** is ranked ninth in school history with 299 career assists, after recently passing **Matt O'Reilly** (1987-90), who is in 10th place with 297 ... Next up for D'Antoni is **Ron Satterthwaite** (1974-77), who is eighth at W&M with 331 assists ... The W&M record is held by Scott Coval (1983-86) with 409 career assists ... The nephew of current Phoenix Suns head coach Mike D'Antoni, Nick is averaging 3.25 assists per game in his career, the fifth-best mark in school history ... His career 1.44 assist-to-turnover ratio is third-best in W&M history ... Last season, he totalled 159 assists, second-most in school history and just nine away from tying the school record of 168 set by Coval in 1985.

Tribe Led by Newcomers

After sophomore forward **Corey Cofield's** team-leading 11.5 points per game, the Tribe's next four leading scorers are in their first season wearing the Green and Gold ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith**, a transfer from Temple, is second on the team in scoring with 10.9 ppg ... He is followed by freshmen **Edwin Ofori Attah** (8.9 ppg), **Laimis Kisielius** (7.1 ppg) and **Nathan Mann** (6.6 ppg).

Best Things in Life are Free (Throws)

W&M is ranked first in the CAA and (through Jan. 17) 57th in the nation with a .724 free throw percentage ... A league high 26.7 percent (241 of 901) of the Tribe's points are coming from the charity stripe ... The only other team in the conference to have more than 20 percent of its points from free throws is George Mason, with 21.4 (214 of 1000) ... W&M leads the CAA with 241 free throws and 333 free throw attempts ... The College has three players ranked in the top six in the league in free throw percentage, led by sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** at .831 (59-71) ... Freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** is fourth in the league at .805 (33-41), while junior forward **Hawley Smith** is sixth (.774, 48-62) ... The Tribe has shot more than 90 percent from the line twice this season, including a 20-22 (.909) effort against Hofstra (Jan. 5), in which Cofield, Kisielius and Smith each went 6-6 from the foul line ... The Tribe's current .724 percentage is the best mark for the program since a .734 mark in 1984-85.

Tough Competition

W&M played two of the nation's best teams in the non-conference portion of the schedule with games at Kentucky (Dec. 22) and North Carolina (Jan. 2) ... Two of the most storied programs in college basketball history, UK (1876-577-1, .765) and UNC (1827-677, .730) entered the 2004-05 campaign ranked first and second, respectively, in Division I history for most wins and highest winning percentage ... The Tribe joined Indiana and Tennessee as the only teams in the nation to face both Carolina and Kentucky this regular season, and was the only team to play them both on the road ... This is the first time since the 1995-96 campaign that W&M faced two nationally-ranked teams in the same season ... That year, W&M lost to No. 15 Virginia (87-58) and No. 22 Virginia Tech (71-66).

Winning with Defense

Despite head coach **Tony Shaver's** preference for a fast-paced, high-offense style of play, the Tribe proved it could also win a defensive struggle, grinding out a 60-51 win over Hampton on Dec. 30 ... The Pirates' 18 field goals, .333 field goal percentage and

51 points are all season lows for a W&M opponent this season ... The 51 points allowed was the Tribe's best defensive effort since a 54-51 win over George Mason on Feb. 18, 2002.

Long Layoff ...

Between games at Old Dominion (Dec. 4) and at UNC Greensboro (Dec. 20) W&M went 15 days without playing, the longest stretch of days without a game in the CAA ... The layoff was due to the College's policy of not allowing regular season athletic events during the two-week final exam period ... The Tribe's last game before the break was Dec. 4 at Old Dominion ... The next-longest stretch of days without a game in the CAA was George Mason's 13-day layoff between games on Dec. 8 and Dec. 22.

30-Point Win Over Longwood

W&M's 90-60 victory over Longwood was the College's first win of 30 or more points since defeating Washington College by 53, 92-39, in Williamsburg on Nov. 20 to open the 1999-2000 season ... The last time W&M earned a 30-point win over a countable Division I opponent was a 32-point, 101-69 win over Elon on Dec. 22, 1998 at the Stanford Invitational ... That game was also the last time that the Green and Gold scored 100 points against any opponent.

High-Scoring Tribe

Under head coach **Tony Shaver's** fast-paced style of play, the Tribe has scored 80 or more points in 10 of his 42 games at W&M, including three of the Tribe's wins this season

... This is the second straight season that the College has opened with two games in the 80s ... The last time that happened, before Shaver came to W&M last season, was the start of the 1980-81 campaign, with an 85-64 win over Pace (Nov. 29) and an 84-56 win over Christopher Newport ... The Tribe scored 80 or more points seven times last season, the first time a W&M team had done that since the 1995-96 campaign, when the Green and Gold had 80 or more points in nine games ... Head Coach Tony Shaver

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his second season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program. Officially hired on May 2, 2003, Shaver is the 31st men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Although the Tribe did not have a winning record in 2004, there were a number of highlights that foreshadow the successes that W&M will soon experience under Shaver. In his first game at the College, the Tribe pounded Liberty, 91-64, while shooting 54.0 percent from the field. Shaver also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime. In his first contest against a nationally-ranked opponent, W&M also performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There were individual successes as well for the Green and Gold. 2004 graduate Adam Hess became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a first team Academic All-America and all-conference selection. Current sophomore Corey Cofield was voted the CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Several players saw significant improvement from their prior year, most notably 2004 grad Zeb Cope, who scored more than three times his career average entering the season, and senior Nick D'Antoni, who started every game and ended the year nine assists away from breaking the school record for a season, after averaging just 12.2 minutes per game his previous year.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious

Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (23), a standout pitcher on the Tribe's baseball team, who is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization, Austin (19) and Jackson (13).

William and Mary freshman guard **Edwin Ofori Attah** came off the bench to score a game-high 21 points, but it was not enough, as the Tribe men's basketball team lost to James Madison, 55-47, Wednesday night at the JMU Convocation Center.

The loss dropped W&M's record to 4-9 overall and 0-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while the Dukes improved to 3-9 (1-3 CAA).

Both teams struggled to put the ball in the basket in the first half, which ended with the score tied at 18. JMU jumped out to an early 6-1 lead, before Ofori Attah tied the game with a three-pointer and jumper. The Dukes went ahead 13-6 with 9:04 left on a dunk by Chris Cathlin, but the Tribe defense held JMU scoreless for five and a half minutes, tying the game at 13 on a layup by sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** with 6:02 left in the half. A free throw by Cathlin and pair of jumpers by Cavell Johnson put the Dukes up 18-13, but the College again came back to tie the score with a layup by Cofield and another three by Ofori Attah in the final minute of the half.

The game went back and forth for the first 14 minutes of the second half, with neither team able to lead by more than three points in a stretch that included seven ties and six lead changes. With the Tribe ahead 38-36 with 7:10 remaining, JMU took control of the game, scoring 13 unanswered points in less than three and a half minutes for a 49-38 lead with 3:43 left to play. W&M cut the lead to seven points twice in the final minutes, but could get no closer, as the Dukes won the game, 55-47.

W&M was hampered by shooting just .294 from the field in the game, while JMU connected on 39.6 percent of its shots. Along with Ofori Attah's 21 points, just one off his career high, Cofield also scored in double digits for the Tribe with 11. Ray Barbosa led the Dukes with 19 points, while Cathlin scored 15 and Johnson added 11.

The Tribe dropped to 4-10 overall and 0-5 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while DU improved to 7-6, 3-2 CAA).

Drexel shot a blistering 72.2 percent (13-18) from beyond the three-point line in the first half and was 21-31 (.677) overall in the period, as the Dragons led 57-35 at the break. Despite the hot shooting, the game stayed close through the first 10 minutes, with W&M trailing 17-15 with 11:38 on the clock on a three pointer by junior forward **Hawley Smith**. Drexel used five threes and a 19-7 run over the next five minutes for a 14-point lead, ending with a shot from long-range by Phil Goss.

W&M cut the lead back down to 11, 36-25, but four more threes from the Dragons sparked a 16-3 run for a 52-28 Drexel lead with 1:53 left in the period. A layup by Smith brought the Tribe within 19 with four seconds in the half, but DU's Jeremiah King's shot at the buzzer from beyond half court banked in to give the Dragons a 57-35 lead at the intermission.

Tribe sophomore center **Brian Hutt** was fouled on W&M's first two possessions and knocked down three of his four free throws to cut the lead to 19 just over a minute into the game, but that would be as close as the Tribe would get, as Drexel scored seven straight to take a 64-38 lead with 17:24 to go. The two teams played each other evenly the rest of the way, with W&M senior guard **Reid Markham** scoring on a layup with 14 seconds left to put the final score at 91-65.

W&M shot 36.2 percent (17-47) from the floor in the game, outrebounding the Dragons 31-29 in the contest. Drexel ended the game shooting .525 (32-61) from the floor and .517 (15-29) from three-point range. Along with the 20 points and nine rebounds from Cofield, Hutt scored eight points to lead the Tribe. Goss had 21 points off the bench to lead Drexel, followed by Danny Hinds with 15 and Dominick Mejia's 11.
