Top Storylines

- William and Mary will play its third game in five days on Wednesday when the Tribe hosts Drexel at 7:00 PM in William and Mary Hall ... W&M is currently in the midst of a five-game stretch in which the Green and Gold play just one game at home and only two in the state of Virginia.
- Monday, the Tribe lost at Hofstra, 72-51 ... Freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** came off the bench to lead W&M in scoring with 14 points ... The College started its ninth different lineup of the season, which included a pair of walk-ons in sophomore guard **Adam Trumbower** and freshman forward **Chris Stratton**.
- Drexel leads the series with W&M, 10-2, and is the only Colonial Athletic Association team that the Tribe has never defeated in conference play ... Earlier this season, the Dragons extended their winning streak against the Green and Gold to nine games with a 91-65 win in Philadelphia on Jan. 15.
- Cofield leads the Tribe in scoring (11.9 ppg), rebounding (6.3 rpg), field goal percentage (.480) and free throw percentage (.816) this season ... He is followed by junior forward **Hawley Smith**, who is second on the team with 9.6 points and 5.1 rebounds per game ... Senior **Nick D'Antoni** leads the team with 2.5 assists per game ... Including Smith, in his first season at W&M after transferring from Temple, four of the Tribe's top five scorers are new to the team this year ... Rookies **Nathan Mann** and Kisielius (both at 7.9 ppg) and **Edwin Ofori Attah** (7.8 ppg) round out the top five.
- W&M has a .725 free throw percentage this season, first in the CAA, 50th in the nation (through Jan. 31) and the highest mark in a season for the program since shooting .734 from the line in 1984-85 ... Just under the 10th-best mark in a season in W&M history, this is just the fourth time since 1984-85 that the Tribe has made over 70 percent of its foul shots.

W&M's game at Kentucky on Dec. 22 was shown tape-delayed on the UKTV network. The game at North Carolina on Jan. 2 was shown live on the Raycom & Jefferson-Pilot ACC Network.

Cofield Leads Tribe in Points, Boards and Shooting Percentage

2004 CAA Rookie of the Year **Corey Cofield**, is again playing well this season, leading W&M in a variety of statistical categories ... The sophomore forward leads the team in scoring (12.1.9 ppg), rebounding (6.3 rpg) and is second in blocks (0.74 per game, 14 overall) ... Cofield is also leading the team with a .480 field goal percentage and is shooting a team-best .816 (84-103), 15th-best in a season at W&M and a significant improvement from his.634 FT% last season ... The CAA Player of the Week in the first week of this season, Cofield has 596 points (12.7 ppg) and 304 rebounds (6.5 rpg) in his 47-game career ... He scored his 500th career point in his 40th career game, on a free throw with 1:23 left to play against Delaware (Jan. 8) ... Cofield recorded his eighth career double-double with 22 points and a season-high 12 rebounds vs. VCU (1/22).

Tough Transfer

W&M junior forward **Hawley Smith** is the most recent in a long line of significant transfers to the College from other Division I programs ... Per NCAA regulations,

Smith sat out last season, following two seasons at Temple University ... The only player to have started every game this season, he is second with 9.6 points and 5.1 rebounds per game ... W&M has had at least one Division I transfer on the active roster all but one year since the start of the 1995-96 campaign, all of whom have been significant contributors with starting experience ... The trend began with the arrival of **Bobby Fitzgibbons** (Wake Forest), **David Grabuloff** (Florida State) and **Sam Steen** (Loyola [MD]) in 1995-96 and continued with two-time first team All-CAA selection **Adam Hess** (Eastern Michigan), who graduated last season ... Currently sitting out this year is guard **Adam Payton** (Vanderbilt), who will be eligible to play for W&M next year.

D'Antoni Ranks Ninth at W&M

Senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** is ranked ninth in school history with 313 career assists, recently passing **Matt O'Reilly** (1987-90), who is in 10th place with 297 ... Next up for D'Antoni is **Ron Satterthwaite** (1974-77), who is eighth at W&M with 331 assists ... The W&M record is held by **Scott Coval** (1983-86) with 409 career assists ... The nephew of current Phoenix Suns head coach Mike D'Antoni, Nick is averaging 3.23 assists per game in his career, the fifth-best mark in school history ... His career 1.46 assist-to-turnover ratio is third-best in W&M history ... Last season, he totalled 159 assists, second-most in school history and just nine away from tying the school record of 168 set by Coval in 1985.

Tribe Led by Newcomers

After sophomore forward **Corey Cofield's** team-leading 11.9 points per game, the Tribe's next four leading scorers are in their first season wearing the Green and Gold ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith**, a transfer from Temple, is second on the team in scoring with 9.6 ppg ... He is followed by freshmen **Nathan Mann** (7.9 ppg) and **Laimis Kisielius** (7.9 ppg) and rookie **Edwin Ofori Attah** (7.8 ppg).

Best Things in Life are Free (Throws)

W&M leads the CAA with a .725 free throw percentage, which was the 50th-best percentage in Division I, through Jan. 31 ... A league high 25.7 percent (314 of 1223) of the Tribe's points are coming from the charity stripe ... The next closest percentage of points from the line is James Madison, with 22.0 (229 of 1043) ... W&M also leads the CAA with 314 free throws and 433 free throw attempts ... The College has three players ranked in the top six in the league in free throw percentage, led by sophomore forward **Corey Cofield**, who is second in the CAA at .816 (84-103) ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith** is fifth in the league at .792 (57-72), while freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** is sixth (.780, 46-59) ... The Tribe has shot more than 90 percent from the line three times this season, including a 20-22 (.909) effort against Hofstra (Jan. 5), in which Cofield, Kisielius and Smith each went 6-6 from the foul line ... The Tribe's current .725 percentage is the best mark for the program since a .734 mark in 1984-85 and just outside the top ten percentages in a season in W&M history.

Tough Competition

W&M played two of the nation's best teams in the non-conference portion of the schedule with games at Kentucky (Dec. 22) and North Carolina (Jan. 2) ... Two of the most storied programs in college basketball history, UK (1876-577-1, .765) and UNC (1827-677, .730) entered the 2004-05 campaign ranked first and second, respectively, in Division I history for most wins and highest winning percentage ... The Tribe joined Indiana and Tennessee as the only teams in the nation to face both Carolina and Kentucky this regular season, and was the only team to play them both on the road ... This is the first time since the 1995-96 campaign that W&M faced two nationally-ranked teams in the same season ... That year, W&M lost to No. 15 Virginia (87-58) and No. 22 Virginia Tech (71-66).

Winning with Defense

Despite head coach **Tony Shaver's** preference for a fast-paced, high-offense style of play, the Tribe proved it could also win a defensive struggle, grinding out a 60-51 win over Hampton on Dec. 30 ... The Pirates' 18 field goals, .333 field goal

percentage and 51 points are all season lows for a W&M opponent this season ... The 51 points allowed was the Tribe's best defensive effort since a 54-51 win over George Mason on Feb. 18, 2002 ... W&M has held opponents to 60 or fewer points four times this year, a feat that occurred just once all of last season.

CAA Announces New Schedule Format

With the addition of Georgia State and Northeastern to the Colonial Athletic Association next season, the league will have an all-time high of 12 member institutions ... As a result, for the first time in conference history, the CAA will play an unbalanced schedule ... Each school has a set group of five opponents that it will play both at home and away each season ... The remaining six opponents are grouped into three pairs that rotate through the schedule every two years ... Each season a team will face one pair of opponents both home and away, while playing the other four foes either home or away ... Using this rotation, each team in the CAA will host every league member at least four times in the six-year rotation ... W&M's annual home-and-home opponents are Drexel, James Madison, UNC Wilmington, Old Dominion and Virginia Commonwealth ... In the next two seasons, the Tribe will also play two games against George Mason and Georgia State ... Next season, W&M will host single games against Delaware and Hofstra, and will play at Northeastern and Towson.

David Willson Promoted to Assistant Coach

Current director of operations **David Willson** was be promoted to assistant coach, effective February 1 ... A 2004 graduate of Hampden-Sydney, Willson scored 892 points and pulled down 586 rebounds in his college career, including his freshman season at Southern Methodist ... A native of Memphis, Willson was named the West Tennessee Player of the Year and compered in the state's East-West All-Star Game while

in high school.

Long Layoff ...

Head Coach Tony Shaver

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his second season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program. Officially hired on May 2, 2003, Shaver is the 31st men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Although the Tribe did not have a winning record in 2004, there were a number of highlights that foreshadow the successes that W&M will soon experience under Shaver. In his first game at the College, the Tribe pounded Liberty, 91-64, while shooting 54.0 percent from the field. Shaver also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime. In his first contest against a nationally-ranked opponent, W&M also performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There were individual successes as well for the Green and Gold. 2004 graduate Adam Hess became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a first team Academic All-America and all-conference selection. Current sophomore Corey Cofield was voted the CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Several players saw significant improvement from their prior year, most notably 2004 grad Zeb Cope, who scored more than three times his career average entering the season, and senior Nick D'Antoni, who started every game and ended the year nine assists away from breaking the school record for a season, after averaging just 12.2 minutes per game his previous year.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious

Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (23), a standout pitcher on the Tribe's baseball team, who is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization, Austin (19) and Jackson (13).

Hofstra 71, William and Mary 59

Hofstra's men's basketball team shot 53.6% in the first half, including 50% from three-point range, and had five score in double-figures to beat William and Mary, 71-59, Wednesday night in Colonial Athletic Association action at William and Mary Hall.

The Tribe's **Hawley Smith** scored a career-high 20 points on 6-for-9 shooting from the floor to pace the College, which dropped to 4-7 overall and 0-2 in the CAA. The Pride, off to its best start since 1960-61, improved to 10-1 overall, 2-0 in the league.

Hofstra opened up a 12-2 lead in the first five minutes of the contest and led by as many as 15 in the opening frame behind a torrid start from the field. Sophomore guard Carlos Rivera, who shared team-high honors in the game with 16 points, drained 3-of-4 attempts from behind the arc in the first half, as the Pride shot 7-for-14 from long distance and took a 42-30 lead at the break.

Tribe guard **Nathan Mann** kept the Green and Gold in it early with his own long-range shooting, burying 3-of-4 three-point shots in the first stanza en route to 11 points at intermission.

The College quickly cut the deficit to eight in the second half on back-to-back buckets from Smith, but a jumper from Pride sophomore Loren Stokes, who tied Rivera for the team-lead with 16, pushed the advantage back to 10, 44-34, with 17:34 remaining.

Smith trimmed the lead to seven with a three-pointer with 17:15 remaining, but Stokes answered with two free throws after a Tribe turnover to push the lead back to nine, 48-39. W&M sophomore **Corey Cofield** dropped in his lone field goal of the game on the next possession to get within seven again, but that was as close as the Tribe would get, as Hofstra reeled off a 12-0 run to take a 19-point lead, 60-41, with 13:10 remaining.

The Tribe pulled to within 11 on two occasions down the stretch on a layup from junior **Nate Loehrke** that made it 62-51 with 7:33 left, and a jumper from Smith at the 4:25 mark that cut the deficit to 64-53, but Rivera drilled his fourth triple of the game with 1:27 to give his team a 70-57 lead and put the game away.

Smith, who went 2-for-3 from behind the arc and 6-for-6 from the stripe, added four rebounds and a pair of steals, while Mann wound up with 13 points on 5-of-8 FG shooting. Cofield chipped in with eight points and a team-high five boards, and freshman **Laimis Kisielius** added eight points, three rebounds and two assists. Smith, Kisielius and Cofield each shot 6-for-6 from the foul line, as the Tribe made good on 20-of-22 (90.9%) opportunities at the line.

Delaware's men's basketball team scored 46 points and shot 57.7% in the second half to come back and defeat William and Mary, 69-59, Saturday afternoon at William and Mary Hall.

The loss dropped the Tribe to 4-8 overall and 0-3 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Blue Hens improved to 5-9 (2-1 CAA).

The two teams played each other close through the majority of the first half, which had three ties and seven lead changes. Delaware's Harding Nana, who ended with game highs in points (25) and rebounds (10), knocked down a pair of free throws to cut W&M's lead to 22-21 with 3:43 left in the half. From there, the Tribe used a three and a jumper from **Nathan Mann** and another three from **Nick D'Antoni** to score eight unanswered points and go ahead 30-21. A dunk by UD's Andrew Washington brought the score to 30-23 in favor of the Tribe at the break.

A layup by W&M **Laimis Kisielius** capped another 8-0 run by the Green and Gold to open the second half, giving the Tribe a 38-25 lead with 16:02 to play. However, the Blue Hens went on an 18-5 run, ending with a three-point play by Andrew Washington, who was fouled as he scored on a layup and then hit the ensuing free throw, to tie the game at 43 with 9:18 left. The next seven minutes went back and forth, with the lead changing hands six more times and neither team able to pull ahead by more than four points. The Tribe's last two leads down the stretch were erased when Delaware's Rulon Washington knocked down a pair of three-pointers, the second coming with 2:28 left to put the Blue Hens up for good, 59-57.

A missed shot by the Tribe led to a basket by UD's Andrew Washington, before W&M's **Corey Cofield** converted a pair of free throws to pull the College back to within two points, 61-59, with 1:23 on the clock. Those would be W&M's last points of the game, however, and Delaware ended the game with eight straight points of their own to close out the win.

W&M shot .440 from the field in first half, but just .333 in the second, including going 0-7 from three-point range in the final stanza. The Blue Hens shot .460 from the field in the game, including a blistering .577 (15-26) in the second half. Along with Nana's 25 points, Andrew Washington scored 24, while Mike Slattery had six points, five rebounds and a game-high eight assists to lead Delaware. Kisielius came off the bench to lead W&M with 14 points, while Cofield had 13 and D'Antoni 12.

William and Mary sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** came off the bench to lead the Tribe with 20 points and nine rebounds, but the College was unable to overcome Drexel's hot shooting in the first half, falling to the Dragons, 91-65, Saturday afternoon at the Daskalakis Athletic Center.

The Tribe dropped to 4-10 overall and 0-5 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while DU improved to 7-6, 3-2 CAA).

Drexel shot a blistering 72.2 percent (13-18) from beyond the three-point line in the first half and was 21-31 (.677) overall in the period, as the Dragons led 57-35 at the break. William and Mary took a 20-10 lead early, but Hofstra responded with a 23-5 run to pull ahead, as the Tribe's men's basketball team fell to the Pride, 72-51, tonight at the Hofstra Arena.

W&M's record fell to 5-14 overall and 1-9 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while the Pride improved to 13-6 (5-5 CAA).

The Tribe scored the first four points of the game on shots from junior guard **Taylor Mokris** and sophomore center **Brian Hutt**, eventually going ahead, 20-10 with 10:26 to play on a three-pointer by freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius**. However, the Pride bounced back, led by a pair of threes from Antoine Agudio, to go up by eight, 33-25, in the final minute of the half, before Kisielius scored his 10th point of the opening frame on a jumper to pull the Tribe within six, 33-27, at the break.

A jumper by Mokris to start the second cut the Pride's lead to four points, but Hofstra used a 9-0 run to pull back ahead by 13 on a Wendell Gibson layup with 15:09 remaining. W&M never came within 11 points the rest of the way, as the Pride led by as many as 27 at one point, eventually winning the contest by 21, 72-51.

After Kisielius's 14 points, freshman guard **Nathan Mann** was second on the team with seven points. Agudio led three Hofstra players in double figures with 21 points, while Loren Stokes had 20 and Gibson added 15. W&M shot 40.4 percent from the floor in the game, including a 44.4 percent effort from the three-point line. Hofstra knocked down 44.9 percent of its shots for the game, including a hot performance in the second half, when the Pride shot .571 from the field and .625 (5-8) from the three-point line.
