

2004-05 Outlook

The 2004-05 edition of the William and Mary men's basketball team will have a dramatically different look in head coach **Tony Shaver**'s second season leading the Green and Gold. Gone are three-year starter Zeb Cope and two-time First Team All-Colonial Athletic Association pick Adam Hess, but rising to take their place will be six newcomers—four freshmen and two junior transfers—who will be making their W&M debut in 2004-05. The added depth is something Shaver believes will be crucial to the success of the program.

"These new players will definitely make us more athletic and allow us to play more of a full-court, up-tempo game," explains Shaver. "That's exciting for us. We will have more athleticism and more quickness on the floor this year, which will allow us to play our preferred style."

Guards

W&M will have tremendous depth at the guard position, where four players return with Division I experience and four more will see their first collegiate action this season. This depth will be necessary for the Tribe to excel under Shaver's fast-paced style of play.

Leading the way at the point for the second straight year will be senior co-captain **Nick D'Antoni**. After starting nearly every game as a rookie, D'Antoni had a breakthrough season last year. The only returning player to have started all 28 games, he ended the 2003-04 campaign with an average of 5.68 assists per game, second in the CAA and the second-best mark for a season in W&M history. With 159 assists on the year, D'Antoni was just nine short of tying the school record and became just the second player in school history with three double-digit assist games in one season.

"Nick plays as hard, and has as much passion for the game as anybody I've ever coached," praised Shaver. "Returning as one of our captains, he's really given us great off-season leadership. If he can play a little bit more of a cerebral game at times, he will be a great, great player for us."

Backing up D'Antoni will be incoming freshman **Nathan Mann**, a first team All-Johnson County and All-Eastern Kansas League selection. Mann averaged 19 points, five assists and four rebounds per game his senior year at St. Thomas Aquinas High School in Overland Park, Kansas.

"Nathan has really impressed me," said Shaver. "He's a tough player and very committed to the game of basketball. His body is cut out of stone and he is one of the strongest guys on the team. He's a tough, competitive guy and

Also in the mix at the point guard position is walk-on junior **Adam Dutton**. A transfer from Cuesta Junior College in San Luis Obispo, California, Dutton averaged 19 points and six assists per game as a senior at Handley High School in Winchester, Virginia, where he was the Region II Player of the Year in basketball and was a first team All-Virginia Group AA selection in both basketball and football (as a wide receiver).

"Adam is somebody who can really help our team at the point," said Shaver. "He understands the game and knows how to get other people involved. His challenge will be that he hasn't played competitively at this level and will need to adapt to the speed of the game."

Leading the way at the off-guard position will be a pair of returning players with significant experience in senior **Reid Markham** and junior **Taylor Mokris**. Markham has been plagued by injuries and illness over the last two seasons, taking a medical redshirt in 2002-03 after playing in only five games, and then missing 13 games in the middle of last year with a broken hand. He has proven to be a legitimate scoring threat when healthy, as he averaged 6.7 points per game on 41.6 percent shooting from the floor in 20.9 minutes per game as a sophomore.

"As a senior, we really need good leadership out of Reid," said Shaver. "If he can stay healthy, he could be a major factor for us."

Mokris played in every game last season, including nine starts, and is the second-highest

returning scorer with an average of 7.0 points per game. Shooting 44.4 percent from the field overall and .373 from the three-point line, Mokris scored in double figures seven times last season, including a career-high 19 points on 8-11 shooting against Liberty.

"Taylor certainly is a very good shooter and has a knack for putting the ball in the basket," said Shaver. "He also worked very hard at improving his conditioning over the summer and has come back noticeably stronger and faster."

Also returning is sophomore walk-on **Adam Trumbower**, who played in all 28 games, including two starts, and became the first walk-on to start for the Tribe since the 1996-97 season. With a proclivity for scoring at key moments, his biggest basket of the year came in the first league game of the season. Trumbower knocked down the game-tying three-pointer with 2.8 seconds left in regulation against two-time defending conference champion UNC Wilmington, a game that the Tribe won by one point in overtime.

"Adam had a really nice year for us as a walk-on freshman," praised Shaver. "There's nobody on this team that's going to outwork Adam Trumbower and I expect that when we get out on the floor, we're going to see him as a bigger, stronger athlete who will once again be a solid contributor."

Rounding out the guard position will be a pair of true freshmen in **Edwin Ofori Attah** and **Kyle Carrabine**. A tremendous scorer, Ofori Attah set the North Carolina high school single-game scoring record with 71 points and also has the state's third-highest total with 68 points in another outing, as he ended his senior season with 760 points for Statesville Christian School.

"Edwin will be a great talent for us," said Shaver. "He's a dynamic athlete who is betterknown for his scoring right now, but I think he can also be a lock-down defender, which we really didn't have enough of last year. I'm extremely excited about his future."

Carrabine, a product of Nequa Valley High School in Naperville, Illinois, will also be pushing for playing time at the guard position. An all-conference and academic all-conference selection in both basketball and golf, he averaged 13 points, five rebounds and three assists a game as a senior.

"Kyle runs like a deer and can really shoot the ball, he just needs to get stronger to succeed at this level," said Shaver. "He's another freshman who brings good skills and a great understanding of the game."

Also on the roster this season is Adam

Payton, who transfered from Vanderbilt over the summer and will have two years of eligibility for W&M after sitting out this season. A terrific athlete, Payton played in 52 games in two seasons with the Commodores, shooting 47.3 percent from the floor, including a .458 three-point field goal percentage.

"I wish Adam could play right now," said Shaver. "He's been very impressive so far. He's very energetic and loves the game of basketball. He'll bring a level of athleticism and explosiveness next season when he's able to play for us and will be a great addition to our practice time this season."

Forwards

Although W&M has just one returning player at forward who saw action last year, Shaver expects that quality should make up for a lack of quantity at the position. **Corey Cofield**, the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, will look to improve on a season that saw him finish second on the team with 13.2 points and 6.6 rebounds per game, while recording a teambest six double-doubles.

"Corey was thrown to the wolves last year, but responded very impressively," remarked Shaver. "He's a gifted athlete, but needs to be able to step away from the basket and score a little more this year. What will be different for Corey this season is that he will be a marked man from the very first game. He'll probably start the season as the guy teams will feel they have to stop to beat William and Mary. How he deals with that is going to be very important."

One of the Tribe's co-captains, **Hawley Smith**, will be in his first season wearing the Green and Gold, but does not lack experience, after playing two seasons at Temple before transferring to the College a year ago. A two-time Sixth Man Award winner for the Owls, he played in 62 games his first two seasons and earned a selection to the Atlantic 10 All-Academic Team as a sophomore.

"Hawley is a great leader. It's very impressive for someone who has never played a minute in a William and Mary uniform to be voted a captain by his teammates and the coaching staff," said Shaver. "He's a physical-minded player who brings great toughness to our team. Probably the strongest player on the team, he is a fine rebounder for his size and can be a lock-down defender for us."


New to the team is freshman **Laimis Kisielius**, a native of Lithuania who spent two years at The Miller School in Charlottesville. A versatile athlete who could play any of four positions for the Tribe, he was an all-state and

all-conference selection in high school, who also played for the Lithuanian Junior National Team.

"Laimis has a great future," said Shaver. "He has good instincts, can shoot the three and loves to handle the ball. He's also going to have to get stronger, or he's going to get beaten around in this league."

Centers

A pair of experienced players with starts under their belts return for the Tribe in junior Nate Loehrke and sophomore Brian Hutt. After seeing limited action as a redshirt-freshman, Loehrke came on strong at the end of last season, starting 10 of W&M's final 11 contests. In his first career start, a home game against Old Dominion, he sparked the Tribe to a win with 14 points and five rebounds in just 27 minutes.

"Nate finished our season extremely well," said Shaver. "He became a real factor and hopefully that will carry over to this year. We don't have a lot of height inside this year, so it will be important for him to play well."

Hutt played in all but one game and made seven starts at the beginning of the season. Hutt led the team and finished tied for 12th in the CAA with 0.74 blocked shots per game, averaging one block every 18 minutes.

"Brian might be the most improved player on our team right now," said Shaver. "He worked very hard at his game over the summer. Probably the biggest improvement for him is in the level of confidence he has in his own abilities. Brian's a good athlete and a tough kid, and I think he believes in his own abilities a little bit more right now."

Schedule

Shaver and his staff have positioned the team for a successful season with a quality schedule that gives the Tribe 14 home games, while also providing an opportunity to travel and face some of the most storied college basketball programs in the nation.

A key factor in the ability to have 14 home games, tied for the most since 1991-92, is the inaugural W&M Tip-Off Classic. Hartford, Radford and Yale will come to Williamsburg to take part in the first regular-season tournament ever hosted by the College.

"It's terrific to be able to even out our schedule," commented Shaver. "It's great to have that many home games for the fans and one of the big factors in that is our administration helping us with the Tip-Off Classic. It's a great addition to our schedule, and in the long-term, a great addition to our program."

The remaining three non-conference home games for W&M are against in-state opponents, including a matchup against Virginia Tech, the first Atlantic Coast Conference team to play in Williamsburg since the 1996-97 season. The College will also host local rival Hampton, and Longwood will come to town for the first ever meeting between the two schools in men's basketball.

W&M's road schedule will pit the Green and Gold against two of the premier teams in the nation, as the Tribe will face Kentucky and North Carolina in a span of less than two weeks. W&M will also play road games against Campbell and UNC Greensboro.

"Having the 14 home games is great and hosting the tournament is very exciting for us," continued Shaver. "Obviously we're challenging our team with some pretty tough opponents. Playing at North Carolina and Kentucky are exciting events for all of us. We're also happy that we're able to keep an in-state flavor to our schedule."

The schedule will not get any easier when the Tribe begins conference play, as the CAA has consistently been rated the top non-football league in the nation. W&M will get an early taste of conference play with a game at Old Dominion on December 4, and the Tribe's first CAA home game will be against Hofstra on January 5. The final home game of the year will be on Saturday, February 19 against longtime rival Old Dominion, and the Green and Gold will end the regular season the following weekend at Towson. Starting March 4, the 2005 CAA Tournament will once again be held in the Richmond Coliseum, with the conference's championship game televised nationally on ESPN March 7.

Head Coach North Carolina (1976) Second Season at W&M

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his second season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program. Officially hired on May 2, 2003, Shaver is the 31st men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Although the Tribe did not have a winning record in 2004, there were a number of

W&M will soon experience under Shaver. In his first game at the College, the Tribe pounded Liberty, 91-64, while shooting 54.0 percent from the field. Shaver also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime. In his first contest against a nationallyranked opponent, W&M also performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There were individual successes as well for the Green and Gold. 2004 graduate Adam Hess became the first player in school history highlights that foreshadow the successes that to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding

student and athlete. Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a first team Academic All-America and all-conference selection. Current sophomore Corey Cofield was voted the CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Several players saw significant improvement from their prior year, most notably 2004 grad Zeb Cope, who scored more than three times his career average entering the season, and senior Nick D'Antoni, who started every game and ended the year nine assists away from breaking the school record for a season, after averaging just 12.2 minutes per game his previous year.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors



1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm committment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach sons Austin, Christopher and Jackson.



Assistant Coach Virginia (1993) Second Season at W&M

Ted Jeffries is in his second year at W&M, coming to Williamsburg from Coastal Carolina where he was an assistant coach for two years, helping to lead the Chanticleers to a 13-15 record in 2002-03, the best for the program since 1993-94. Before beginning his coaching career, he played professionally for eight years in Spain, Poland, Latvia, Germany, Turkey, Portugal and Japan. He was named his team's Most Valuable Player while playing in Bamburg, Germany and was an all-star selection while playing in Ventspils, Latvia.

A 1993 graduate of the University of Virginia with a degree in communications and rhetoric and a minor in sociology, Jeffries started four years at center for the Cavaliers. Strength and conditioning coach John Sauer is starting his 15th season with W&M athletes and the results speak for themselves. At least one Tribe student-athlete has garnered All-America Strength honors in 14 of the past 15 seasons.

In 1995, Sauer designed the Joseph W. Montgomery Strength Training Center located in the lower level of William and Mary Hall. This 5,000-square foot facility contains 14,000 pounds of free weights, 6,000 pounds of dumbbells and 4,000 pounds of rubber bumper plates. In addition it has 14 custom-built olympic platforms, 14 multi-purpose power racks, a fully equipped plyometric area and also a wide variety of selectorized machines.

Sauer came to William and Mary from Clemson where he was an assistant strength and conditioning coach. At Clemson, he assisted in the development, coordination and implementation of strength and conditioning programs for more than 450 varsity athletes. Before Clemson, Sauer held assistant coaching

Boasting a roster of 10 (soon to be 12) well-respected academic institutions, the CAA has established itself as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences. On the playing field, the league has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 11 national coaches of the year, 11 national players of the year and 12 Honda Award winners. The CAA has consistently ranked among the top 15 in the Sears Directors Cup standings and has been the nation's top-ranked Division I non-football conference in recent years.

Even more impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 16 other sports. CAA squads have won 10 field NCAA post-graduate scholars. Last year, the CAA had eight CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, including five who were selected to the first team. Over 1,200 CAA student-athletes posted at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport and received the CAA Commissioner's Academic Award in 2003-04.

With a geographic footprint that currently stretches from the shadow of the Statue of Liberty to the beaches of North Carolina, the landscape of the conference includes four of the nation's top 25 media markets - New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Washington, D.C. (8) and Baltimore (24). That reach will expand even wider in 2006 with the addition of Georgia State University in Atlanta and Northeastern University in Boston, giving the CAA a presence in five of the nation's nine largest metropolitan areas.

> In men's basketball, the CAA has earned a reputation as a "giant killer" in the NCAA Tournament. Since 1981, CAA schools have posted 12 wins over higher-seeded teams. Last year, seven of the league's 10 teams were among the top 140 in the RPI and four were ranked in the top 100. In women's basketball, the CAA ranked ninth among the nation's 31 conferences in 2003-04. Perennial power Old Dominion has captured three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985) and reached the title game again in 1997.

> The conference has also excelled in many hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981, which is not only more than any other conference but represents nearly half of all titles won. In baseball, at least two CAA teams have earned NCAA Tournament berths for seven consecutive seasons. The CAA is annually ranked among the nation's top 10 conferences in men's and women's soccer, and has traditionally sent multiple teams to the NCAA Tournament. The conference finished the 2003-04 campaign with teams ranked among the top 25 nationally in cross country, field hockey, men's soccer, wrestling, softball, men's and women's tennis and men's and women's lacrosse.

CAA member institutions are also com mitted to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university Mason, James Madison, and William and life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs already established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs and granting visiting academic status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so that they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

In 2002, two faculty members from CAA institutions were awarded academia's most coveted distinction - the Nobel Prize. John B. Fenn, a research professor in the Department of Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University, received the Nobel Prize for chemistry, and Vernon Smith, a professor of economics and law at George Mason University, shared the Nobel Prize in economic sciences.

Under the direction of Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager, who has guided the CAA since its inception, the league currently in2006. Core members George Mason University, James Madison University, the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Old Dominion University, Virginia Commonwealth University and the College of William and Mary were joined by the University of Delaware,

Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Northeastern University will become a member of the conference in July, 2005 and Georgia State University will join the league in July, 2006.

The CAA traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members—George Mary-were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (UNC Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985. By the fall of 1986, the league gained automatic bids to NCAA Championships in men's basketball, soccer, baseball and women's basketball and formed an officials' bureau. Old Dominion became a member of the CAA in 1991-92 and Virginia Commonwealth University joined the conference prior to the 1995-96 season.

From all-star athletes to Nobel prize winning faculty, the CAA takes great pride in producing performers who stand out both on the playing field and in the classroom.

For more than 300 years, William and Mary has been a symbol of academic distinction in America. Now, in its fourth century, the College is prepared to educate the leaders of the 21st century.

The College of William and Mary was founded in 1693 by King William III and Queen Mary II of England. Four Presidents of the United States received their education at the College - George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler. The current chancellor of the College is former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, and he took over the post from former British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher.

William and Mary was the first college to institute an honor code of conduct. The premier academic society, Phi Beta Kappa, was founded by William and Mary students in 1776. The Society of the Alumni, founded in 1842, is the sixth oldest alumni group in the nation. Now the College is designated as a "Public Ivy", and ranks 15th among the best regional business schools.


Terry Driscoll Director of Athletics

With an extensive résumé that includes four years as a student-athlete, a professional playing career and numerous jobs in the athletic business world, Edward C. "Terry" Driscoll is entering his eighth year as the athletics director at the College of William and Mary.

Driscoll's tenure has seen a wealth of improvements across the board in the W&M athletics department, from new facilities to increased fundraising for the Tribe. In addition, the Tribe has reached all-time highs in the annual Director's Cup rankings that summarize excellence in all sports.

Upon the death of legendary Tribe athletics director John Randolph, W&M president Timothy J. Sullivan chose Driscoll to be the new leader of the department, saying "Terry brings outstanding management and leadership skills to the position."

Since Driscoll took over as athletics director, he has overseen the construction of more than \$6 million in facilities, including the new Plumeri



Park (baseball), Albert-Daly Field (soccer, lacrosse) and the Busch Courts (tennis). Driscoll has also increased the annual fundraising totals for non-capital projects from \$1.36 million in 1995 to around \$2.7 million currently. He also has served on numerous conference and NCAA committees, including a stint as president of the Atlantic 10 Football Conference.

The Tribe has also had outstanding success across the board since Driscoll came to Wil-

liamsburg. In 2002-03, W&M had a school-record 10 teams compete in the NCAA Tournament. Four teams won conference titles, while six were in the top 25 at the end of their respective seasons. One of the department's goals each year is to finish in the top 100 in the annual Director's Cup rankings, and that has happened in all but one of the years that Driscoll has been the AD, with a high ranking of 42 oc-

curring in 1997. In addition, W&M had captured 76 CAA Championships coming into the 2003-04 school year, by far the highest total among all conference schools.

Driscoll's leadership skills were developed in his collegiate years. As a student-athlete at Boston College, Driscoll captained the basketball team to the National Invitation Tournament championship game as a senior, and was named the tournament MVP. In addition to being named an All-American, his success in the classroom with a major in biology garnered him an Academic All-America honor.

After graduating from BC, he was the fourth pick of the NBA Draft, selected by the Detroit Pistons, just three picks after the Milwaukee Bucks chose UCLA's Lew Alcindor, later to be known as Kareem Abdul-Jabbar. Driscoll chose to play a year in Italy first, but then returned to the U.S. to play for the Pistons, Washington Bullets and Milwaukee Bucks before going back to Italy as a player and coach until 1980.

Driscoll then entered the corporate world in 1980, working for Kazmaier Associates, Inc., an international sporting goods sales and sports marketing firm. After Kazmaier purchased Bike Athletic in 1986, KSG Inc. was formed with the objective of becoming the first, and only, national sales agency in the sporting goods industry. By 1987, Driscoll was president of the company and

had expanded the agency to all 50 states just two years later. In early 1990, Driscoll's contribution to a marketing research project for the NCAA was the initial step moving him from product marketing and sales to sports marketing and management. The result of the project was a joint venture between Kazmaier Associates and Host Communication - with Driscoll being named managing director and chief operating officer of NCAA International.

In 1993, Driscoll diversified his experience in the athletic world by working as the executive director of the 1994 World Cup site in Boston. In September of that year, Driscoll was again enlisted to launch a new business, Eagle International Group, an event management and services company. As vice president, Driscoll worked with Hawaii Pacific Sports as well as organizing the Women's World Volleyball Grand Prix, a fiveweek competition in Honolulu.

Driscoll resides in Williamsburg with his wife, Susan. The couple has two children - Keith, 29, a 1997 graduate of Holy Cross and Leslie, 25, a 2001 graduate of William and Mary.

Barb Blosser Senior Executive Associate AD

After serving 12 years as the College's associate athletics director, Barbara Blosser was promoted to

her current position of senior executive associate athletic director in April of 2004. Blosser started her career at William and Mary as the head women's basketball coach in 1978 and guided the Tribe to a VAIAW crown in her first season with a school-re-



cord 16 wins (16-13). Her 1980 Tribe team (11-14) placed third, while the 1981 squad (16-16) was VAIAW runner-up. She was also at the helm during the 1984-85 season when William and Mary made the jump to NCAA Division I. Overall, she finished her coaching career with 115 wins, 84 of which came at William and Mary.

When the College's men's and women's athletic programs merged in May of 1986, she moved to administration, first serving as the Assistant to the Associate Athletics Director. Over the past 16 years, her administrative responsibilities at W&M have included the monitoring of financial aid matters, coordinating the scheduling of athletic facilities, supervision of coaches and staff and, currently, serving as the person primarily responsible for administering the day-to-day operations of the department.

From October 1992 to June 1993 and August 1995 to July 1996, Blosser also served as acting athletics director in an interim capacity. For her efforts, she was named the first recipient of the John Randolph Inspiration Award. Blosser has served on various committees such as the NCAA Strategic Planning Committee and the Colonial Athletic Association Competition Committee.

Blosser began her coaching career at the helm of the women's basketball program at Ashland College in Ohio. During two seasons there, she led the Eagles to successive 15-7 and 16-8 ledgers. Her 1977 squad won the AIAW Region V Championship, while her 1978 team took the OAISW Small College title.

A former three-sport standout at Ohio State, Blosser graduated Cum Laude in 1975 with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education. At OSU, she was selected to both Phi Beta Kappa and Mortar Board. She competed in basketball, field hockey and tennis and captained both the basketball and field hockey squads her senior year. She went on to earn her master's degree from the University of North Carolina Greensboro in 1978. In 1993, she was selected as a member of the first class of women inducted to the Ohio State University Athletic Hall of Fame.

Robb Dunn Associate AD. Internal Affairs

Robb Dunn is in his fourth year with the College, and his first as the Associate Athletics Director for Internal Af-

fairs.

Dunn oversees the facilities and operations for W&M athletics. In this position, Dunn is responsible for budgets, maintenance and game-day operations of all Tribe athletic facilities. He oversees a staff of seven full-time



employees. In addition to his duties with athletics, Dunn also coordinates all outside events held at William and Mary Hall, as well as summer camps and equipment operations. Also, Dunn oversees the day-to-day operations of the baseball, men's soccer and men's and women's gymnastics programs.

Prior to arriving in Williamsburg, Dunn served as the Facilities and Game Management Supervisor at the University of Michigan. In that capacity, Dunn managed six department facilities, as well as handling game management duties for baseball, basketball and football. Prior to assuming this position, Dunn spent five years at Michigan's Yost Arena, including four years overseeing the consulting portion of the Sport Facilities Research Laboratory.

A California native, Dunn earned a bachelor of arts degree in history from the University of California at Berkeley in 1993. During his undergraduate days, he lettered as a member of the Golden Bears' football program and also worked for Cal's department of intercollegiate athletics and recreational sports. He then went on to earn a master's degree in kinesiology from Michigan in 1994.

Bobby Dwyer Associate AD, Development

Bobby Dwyer, Associate Athletics Director for Development, heads the W&M Athletic Educa-

tional Foundation, the department's alumni fund-raising arm. He came on board in October 1985 after holding assistant basketball coaching positions at the U.S. Military Academy and Duke. He was promoted to Associate Athletics Director this spring. Dwyer



heads up the fund-raising efforts for the athletics department, and supervises the marketing and promotions and special events departments.

Dwyer graduated from Wake Forest in 1974 where he was a member of the varsity basketball team for three years and captained the squad as a senior. He received his master's degree in higher education from W&M in 1994.

He is a past president of the Williamsburg chapter of the American Cancer Society and the American Heart Association. He and his wife Patti have two sons, Patrick (20) and Peter (18), and live in Williamsburg.

Frank Hardymon Associate AD, External Affairs

Frank Hardymon is in his first year as W&M's Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs.

Hardymon joined the Tribe staff in October of 1997 as Assistant Athletics Director for Business Affairs. Previously, he managed the athletics budget at Villanova as the Associate Business Manager (1995-97).



In his current role, Hardymon

assists in formulating the athletic budget, and working with all head coaches and directors to manage the budget. He also oversees the day-to-day operations of the Athletics Business Office, with the assistance of athletic business managers Andrea Evans and Jon Palumbo. Hardymon also oversees the sports information and ticket offices. In addition, he handles the day-to-day oversight of the men's and women's track and field, cross country and golf programs.

A University of Kentucky graduate, Hardymon worked in corporate finance for five years. He earned an MBA from DePaul in 1992 and a MEd from Georgia in Sport Management in 1995. He is a member of the Collegiate Athletic Business Managers Association, serving on their membership committee. Hardymon resides in Williamsburg with his wife Lisa. They have a four-year old daughter, Emma, and a two-year old daughter, Grace.

Bill Bryant Director of Compliance

Bill Bryant enters his seventh year as the College's Director of Compliance. Bryant came to W&M with a diverse and well-rounded background in collegiate administration.

Under the direction of Bryant, the compliance office works with the NCAA Clearing House to determine initial eligibility of all student athletes and continues to monitor eligibility throughout their college careers. Bryant is also responsible for educating all student-athletes, coaches and staff to the NCAA rules.

Prior to arriving in Williamsburg, Bryant had spent seven years as the Asst. AD for Student Affairs at the University of Pittsburgh. In that capacity he was responsible for the development of academic programs for student athletes, NCAA compliance and eligibility and served as the academic liaison for the football program.

A 1970 graduate of Cal-Davis, Bryant also served three-year stints in similar positions at both Arizona State (1987-90) and Oregon (1984-87), where he also earned his M.S. in Physical Education. Bryant and his wife, JoAnn, are the parents of two children, Christy (27), a graduate of Bowling Green, and Bobby (22), an avid hockey player. Bobby was a member of the SUNY-Morrisville ice-hockey team which won the Junior College National Championship three years ago.

In his two years at Fresno State, he was responsible for all interviews and practice coverage for the football team, as well as serving as the media contact for the wrestling and track and field teams.

Steve Cole Assistant AD, Health Services

Director of Sports Medicine Steve Cole enters his 21st year at the helm of the William and Mary Sports Medicine program. One who is familiar with the logistics and scope of the sports medicine field on all levels, Cole has a comprehensive knowledge of the broad discipline and all its components.

A certified athletic trainer (NATA) and strength and conditioning specialist (NSCA), Cole graduated from West Virginia in 1976 with a bachelor's degree in physical education and athletic training. He subsequently earned a master's degree in sports medicine in 1978 from the University of Virginia.

A true fitness buff, Cole is an exemplary model for all the athletes. He is an avid competitor who has participated in a variety of triathlons since 1980, spending countless hours of his spare time in training. Cole resides in Williamsburg with his wife Lonna, five-year-old daughter Sydney Janaé and two-year-old daughter Jahnessa Yaxin.

Deidre Connelly Sports Psychologist

Another valuable member of the athletic department is sports psychologist Deidre Connelly, who is entering her 13th year with the William and Mary athletic department. Connelly came to the College from Iowa, where she was a professor and the director of the sport psychology program. 

Williamsburg and Virginia

The College of William and Mary is located in one of the most historic towns in America—Williamsburg, Located in the heart of Virginia's Historic Triangle, Williamsburg traces its history back over 350 years.

Today, with a population of 11,500, Williamsburg still plays an important role in Commonwealth of Virginia. With the College, it is a center of higher education, and with Colonial Williamsburg, it has become one of the most popular tourist attractions in the state.

However, Williamsburg is much more than just its historic district. A popular shopping area, Williamsburg is home to both Merchants Square (located next to campus) and several large outlet shopping centers located just west of town.



Just east of Williamsburg is Busch Gardensm which includes some of the top roller coasters in the nation. Water Country USA is also located just east of town.

With courses designed by such noted architects as Robert Trent Jones, Arnold Palmer, Rees Jones and Dan Maples, Williamsburg has also become noted for its impressive array of golf courses. Many of the courses in the area are ranked



among both the best in both Virgini and the nation. The Kingsmill River Resort has been the home of the PGA Michelob Championship, and currently hosts the LPGA's Michelob ULTRA Open.

Nearby Williamsburg are other noted historical and recreational areas. Jamestown, the first permanent English colony in America, is located just outside of town on the James River. The site of George Washington's decisive victory over the British, Yorktown, is just a short drive down the Colonial Parkway from Williamsburg.

An hour's drive away are both Richmond, the capital of Virginia, and Norfolk, home of the U.S. Navy's Atlan-

tic Fleet and one of the largest naval bases in the world. Just beyond Norfolk is Virginia Beach, one of the largest beach resorts on the East Coast. It offers an excellent beach on the Atlantic Ocean and a three-mile long boardwalk.

Arguably the most historic of all 50 United States, Virginia is a veritable microcosm of American heritage. Many residents here preserve and interpret everything historic, from colonial towns and trails to 20th-century diners. If you want living history, you'll find it representing nearly every era at special events and destinations all year long. In Virginia, one can visit areas from Colonial times, Civil War battlefields and still make a visit to the nation's capital in just one day.



Student-Athlete Support

Goals

We take pride in the many achievements of William and Mary athletes, both in the classroom and on the playing field. These support services and many others are in place to help each student-athlete achieve their goals. It is our hope that at the completion of their undergraduate career they can reflect upon:

- 1. An academic experience that prepared them for a successful
- 2. An athletic challenge that brought many rewards.
- 3. A feeling of loyalty and pride in identifying themselves as a varsity athlete with a degree from The College of William and Mary.

Compliance and Academic Support

Division I, the College is committed to full compliance with all NCAA and conference regulations. The department has a fulltime Director of Compliance committed to assisting students, staff and coaches through education and monitoring of compliance issues.

All entering students are assigned to a faculty academic advisor assigned by the director of Academic Advising. Students remain with this advisor until their sophomore year at which time they select a faculty advisor in their chosen major.

Within the athletic department, the Academic Support Coordinator is a valuable resource for student-athletes serving in a liaison role with the various student service offices throughout the campus community. The College has offices for Volunteer Services, Career Services, a Writing Resource Center and Oral Communication Studio, to name a few.

The department offers a variety of study, life and career building skills programs, but holds firm to the concept of self-determination—each student must take responsibility for his or her collegiate experience. Our goal is to assure that there is a support system in place to assist students to make positive and informed decisions.

Strength, Speed and Conditioning

Tribe athletics is very proud of the Joseph W. Montgomery Strength Training Center, a 5,000 square foot weight training facility. Under the guidance of the Head and Assistant Strength Coach each sport is provided with a program designed to enhance individual strength and flexibility development specific to the skills and movements required for their sport. Individuals are educated on proper lifting techniques and workouts are monitored to assure safety at all times.

Sports Psychology

The athletic department has on staff a sports psychologist, who holds a Ph.D. in sports psychology. All consultations are confidential and all student-athletes, teams or coaches are welcome regardless of the issues they wish to discuss. Consultation is available for sport

As members of the Colonial Athletic Association and NCAA psychology education, performance enhancement skills training, strategies for dealing with stress or injury, or for personal issues that may affect performance. The sports psychology consultant is considered a member of the Counseling Center and refers individuals to the Center when appropriate.



Sports Medicine

The Division of Sports Medicine provides a comprehensive health care program for the department of intercollegiate athletics. The staff consists of a team physician, seven full time certified athletic trainers, two graduate assistant athletic trainers and medical specialists from the local community. The team physician has overall responsibility for supervision of the sports medicine program. Tribe athletes have the luxury of rehabilitating and treating injuries in a state-of-the-art athletic training facility.

The priority for the athletic training staff is to enhance and assure lines of communication and cooperation among its staff, student-athletes, parents, coaches, the Student Health Center and involved medical specialists. Through a team approach to health care the sports medicine program can offer comprehensive health care services to the student-athletes in a caring and cooperative manner.



William and Mary Hall

This year the Tribe enters its 32nd season in William and Mary Hall, home of varsity basketball and all Tribe athletics. On the concourse and lower levels of the building are coaching and staff offices housing



the William and Mary athletics department. The broad-based program offers 23 intercollegiate varsity sports to William and Mary undergraduates.

Total capacity of the arena is about 8,600 for basketball, but by using bleachers in the open end and chairs on the floor, capacity can be expanded to 11,300 for convocations, concerts or theater-in-the-round.

The building features a medical suite, seminar room, a gymnastics workout area and another room for other sports usages. The facility houses 12 locker room areas with adjoining showers. In addition, there



is a newly expanded, 5,000 square-feet weight training facility complete with Nautilus and other free-weight equipment.

The Hall, completed in 17 months by the Southeastern Construction Company of Charlotte, North Carolina, opened just in time for the inaugural game between the Tribe and the University of North Carolina Tar Heels. Financed by state revenue bonds, the total cost of the structure was \$5.3 million.

Some of the proudest moments in Tribe basketball featured John Lowenhaupt (#42), Keith Cieplicki (#14), and Chet Giermak (#32) having their jersey numbers retired. In 1990, Jeff Cohen's jersey (#52)

was retired posthumously. In 1993, Bill Chambers (#32) was also recognized as a W&M all-time great. Banners signifying those great memories hang in the Hall today.



Other sporting events held

here have included the Harlem Globetrotters and the Roller Derby. Fans in the Williamsburg area have seen auto shows, dog shows, Prince Charles, Glenn Close, a Billy Graham crusade, Bette Midler, Billy Joel, speeches by presidential candidates Jimmy Carter and Gerald Ford, the Shakespeare Players, a three-ring circus, and even a Howdy Doody show.

The first concert held was Sly and the Family Stone held in 1971. The largest crowd for a concert was 13,514 for the Police in February 1982. Other performers in the Hall included R.E.M., Sting, the Grateful Dead, Bruce Hornsby, 10,000 Maniacs, Beach Boys, Chicago, Stone Temple Pilots and many more.

Bettie Adams serves as director of William and Mary Hall and Ticket Services. Robb Dunn serves as Associate Athletics Director for Internal Affairs and is responsible for the operation of W&M Hall.



With financial support from many former W&M men's basketball players, the Tribe's locker room has undergone a variety of improvements, including new lockers, carpeting, leather coaches and a 36-inch HDTV.



Facilities

The College of William and Mary and its student-athletes take a great deal of pride in the quality of its athletic facilities. Over the last several years, the College has bolstered its lineup of venues to match the success that the Tribe has shown in the athletic arena, which has been unmatched in the Colonial Athletic Association. Credential Requests

All media credentials should be arranged by contacting Dan Wakely in the William and Mary Sports Information Office. Requests must be made on company letterhead and received at least 48 hours in advance of the game. Credentials will be mailed if time allows, or may be picked up at the Ticket Office Will Call window in the southeast corner of William and Mary Hall.

Media Parking

A limited number of media parking spaces are available in the lot immediately adjacent to the south side of William and Mary Hall. Parking passes will be available upon request. Spaces in the media parking lot are available on a first-come, first-served basis. A parking pass does not guarantee a space in the media parking lot. General parking is available in the large parking lot on the north side of William and Mary Hall.

Media Services

The media workroom (Room 221) is located off of the hallway on the north (scorers table) side of the arena. Press row is located on the south side of the arena. All seats are assigned. Game notes, media guides, rosters and programs will be available in the media workroom. A meal will also be available approximately one hour before game time. Access to the media workkroom is limited to those with proper credentials. Statistics, play-by-play and scores from college basketball games around the country will be available during and after the game.

Radio

Visiting radio lines may be rented through the Sports Information Office at a cost of \$75 per line. An ISDN line may be installed at additional request given enough advance notice. Radio stations should make arrangements with Dan Wakely in the sports infor-

mation office at least one month in advance of the game. Requests for the line will be honored on a first-come, firstserved basis. Only collect, toll-free and incoming calls will be available through this phone line. Please contact Dan Wakely at least 24 hours in advance if you wish to tape an interview with any William and Mary coaches to be broadcast before a game.

The W&M locker room is closed to the media at all times. A member of the W&M Sports Information Office will take requests for players near the end of each game. After each game, both head coaches and selected players from each team will be brought to the media workroom for the post game press conference.

All William and Mary players and head coaches will be available for interviews throughout the season. All interview requests must be coordinated through Dan Wakely in the Sports Information Office. Please give at least 24 hours notice, whenever possible. Home phone numbers will not be made available and members of the media are asked not to contact players or coaches at home.


