Top Storylines

- William and Mary continues its tough stretch in which it plays four of five games on the road with Saturday's 7:30 PM game at Delaware ... The Tribe enters the contest with a record of 5-15 overall and 1-10 in the Colonial Athletic Association ... Delaware is 8-14 overall and is seventh in the league with a 5-6 conference record.
- Wednesday, the Tribe lost at home to Drexel, 60-48 ... Freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** led W&M in scoring for the second straight game with 12 points ... Sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** was second on the team with 10 points and also had seven rebounds ... Junior center **Nate Loehrke** came off the bench for six points and seven rebounds in 13 second-half minutes ... The Green and Gold outrebounded the Dragons, 36-30, in the game.
- Delaware leads the series with W&M, 10-6, and has won six straight and nine of the last 10 games in the series ... Earlier this season, the Blue Hens defeated the Green and Gold, 69-59, in Williamsburg on Jan. 8 ... W&M's last win against the Blue Hens was a 59-53 victory on Jan. 5, 2002 in Williamsburg.
- Cofield leads the Tribe in scoring (11.8 ppg), rebounding (6.3 rpg), field goal percentage (.475) and free throw percentage (.816) this season ... He is followed by junior forward **Hawley Smith**, who is second on the team with 9.3 points and 5.0 rebounds per game ... Senior **Nick D'Antoni** leads the team with 2.7 assists per game ... Including Smith, in his first season at W&M after transferring from Temple, four of the Tribe's top five scorers are new to the team this year ... Freshmen Kisielius (8.1 ppg), **Nathan Mann** (8.0 ppg) and **Edwin Ofori Attah** (7.5 ppg) round out the top five.
- W&M has a .723 free throw percentage this season, first in the CAA and the highest mark in a season for the program since shooting .734 from the line in 1984-85 ... Through Jan. 31, the Tribe's .725 mark from the line was 50th in the nation ... This is just the fourth time since 1984-85 that the Tribe has made over 70 percent of its foul shots.

The Tribe's game at George Mason Jan. 29 was shown live on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, Comcast SportsNet Chicago, Fox Sports South, the Metro Channel (New York) and KTVS (Albuquerque, NM). W&M's game at Kentucky on Dec. 22 was shown tape-delayed on the UKTV network. The game at North Carolina on Jan. 2 was shown live on the Raycom & Jefferson-Pilot ACC Network.

Cofield Leads Tribe in Points, Boards and Shooting Percentage

2004 CAA Rookie of the Year **Corey Cofield**, is again playing well this season, leading W&M in a variety of statistical categories ... The sophomore forward leads the team in scoring (11.8 ppg), rebounding (6.3 rpg) and is tied with sophomore center Brian Hutt for the lead in blocks (0.75 per game, 15 overall) ... Cofield is also leading the team with a .475 field goal percentage and is shooting a team-best .816 (84-103), 15th-best in a season at W&M and a significant improvement from his.634 FT% last season ... The CAA Player of the Week in the first week of this season, Cofield has 606 points (12.6 ppg) and 311 rebounds (6.5 rpg) in his 48-game career ... He scored his 500th career point in his 40th career game, on a free throw with 1:23 left to play against Delaware (Jan. 8) ... Cofield recorded his eighth career double-double with 22 points and a season-high 12 rebounds vs. VCU (1/22).

Tough Transfer

W&M junior forward **Hawley Smith** is the most recent in a long line of significant transfers to the College from other Divi-

sion I programs ... Per NCAA regulations, Smith sat out last season, following two seasons at Temple University ... The only player to have started every game this season, he is second with 9.3 points and 5.0 rebounds per game ... W&M has had at least one Division I transfer on the active roster all but one year since the start of the 1995-96 campaign, all of whom have been significant contributors with starting experience ... The trend began with the arrival of **Bobby Fitzgibbons** (Wake Forest), **David Grabuloff** (Florida State) and **Sam Steen** (Loyola [MD]) in 1995-96 and continued with two-time first team All-CAA selection **Adam Hess** (Eastern Michigan), who graduated last season ... Currently sitting out this year is guard **Adam Payton** (Vanderbilt), who will be eligible to play for W&M next year.

D'Antoni Ranks Ninth at W&M

Senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** is ranked ninth in school history with 319 career assists, recently passing **Matt O'Reilly** (1987-90), who is in 10th place with 297 ... Next up for D'Antoni is **Ron Satterthwaite** (1974-77), who is eighth at W&M with 331 assists ... The W&M record is held by **Scott Coval** (1983-86) with 409 career assists ... The nephew of current Phoenix Suns head coach Mike D'Antoni, Nick is averaging 3.26 assists per game in his career, the fifth-best mark in school history ... His career 1.48 assist-to-turnover ratio is third-best in W&M history ... Last season, he totalled 159 assists, second-most in school history and just nine away from tying the school record of 168 set by Coval in 1985.

Tribe Led by Newcomers

After sophomore forward **Corey Cofield's** team-leading 11.3 points per game, the Tribe's next four leading scorers are in their first season wearing the Green and Gold ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith**, a transfer from Temple, is second on the team in scoring with 9.3 ppg ... He is followed by freshmen **Laimis Kisielius** (8.1 ppg), **Nathan Mann** (8.0 ppg) and **Edwin Ofori Attah** (7.5 ppg).

Best Things in Life are Free (Throws)

W&M leads the CAA with a .723 free throw percentage ... The Tribe's .725 mark through Jan. 31 was the 50th-best percentage in Division I ... A league-high 25.1 percent (319 of 1271) of the Tribe's points are coming from the charity stripe ... The next closest percentage of points from the line is Towson, with 21.4 (288 of 1347) ... W&M also leads the CAA with 319 free throws and 441 free throw attempts ... The College has three players ranked in the top six in the league in free throw percentage, led by sophomore forward **Corey Cofield**, who is second in the CAA at .816 (84-103) ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith** is fourth in the league at .784 (58-74), while freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** is sixth (.780, 46-59) ... The Tribe has shot more than 90 percent from the line three times this season, including a 20-22 (.909) effort against Hofstra (Jan. 5), in which Cofield, Kisielius and Smith each went 6-6 from the foul line ... The Tribe's current .723 percentage is the best mark for the program since a .734 mark in 1984-85.

Tough Competition

W&M played two of the nation's best teams in the non-conference portion of the schedule with games at Kentucky (Dec. 22) and North Carolina (Jan. 2) ... Two of the most storied programs in college basketball history, UK (1876-577-1, .765) and UNC (1827-677, .730) entered the 2004-05 campaign ranked first and second, respectively, in Division I history for most wins and highest winning percentage ... The Tribe joined Indiana and Tennessee as the only teams in the nation to face both Carolina and Kentucky this regular season, and was the only team to play them both on the road ... This is the first time since the 1995-96 campaign that W&M faced two nationally-ranked teams in the same season ... That year, W&M lost to No. 15 Virginia (87-58) and No. 22 Virginia Tech (71-66).

Winning with Defense

Despite head coach **Tony Shaver's** preference for a fast-paced, high-offense style of play, the Tribe proved it could also win a defensive struggle, grinding out a 60-51 win over Hampton on Dec. 30 ... The Pirates' 18 field goals, .333 field goal

percentage and 51 points are all season lows for a W&M opponent this season ... The 51 points allowed was the Tribe's best defensive effort since a 54-51 win over George Mason on Feb. 18, 2002 ... W&M has held opponents to 60 or fewer points five times this year, a feat that occurred just once all of last season.

CAA Announces New Schedule Format

With the addition of Georgia State and Northeastern to the Colonial Athletic Association next season, the league will have an all-time high of 12 member institutions ... As a result, for the first time in conference history, the CAA will play an unbalanced schedule ... Each school has a set group of five opponents that it will play both at home and away each season ... The remaining six opponents are grouped into three pairs that rotate through the schedule every two years ... Each season a team will face one pair of opponents both home and away, while playing the other four foes either home or away ... Using this rotation, each team in the CAA will host every league member at least four times in the six-year rotation ... W&M's annual home-and-home opponents are Drexel, James Madison, UNC Wilmington, Old Dominion and Virginia Commonwealth ... In the next two seasons, the Tribe will also play two games against George Mason and Georgia State ... Next season, W&M will host single games against Delaware and Hofstra, and will play at Northeastern and Towson.

David Willson Promoted to Assistant Coach

Current director of operations **David Willson** was promoted to assistant coach, effective February 1 ... Head Coach Tony Shaver

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his second season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program. Officially hired on May 2, 2003, Shaver is the 31st men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Although the Tribe did not have a winning record in 2004, there were a number of highlights that foreshadow the successes that W&M will soon experience under Shaver. In his first game at the College, the Tribe pounded Liberty, 91-64, while shooting 54.0 percent from the field. Shaver also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime. In his first contest against a nationally-ranked opponent, W&M also performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There were individual successes as well for the Green and Gold. 2004 graduate Adam Hess became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a first team Academic All-America and all-conference selection. Current sophomore Corey Cofield was voted the CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Several players saw significant improvement from their prior year, most notably 2004 grad Zeb Cope, who scored more than three times his career average entering the season, and senior Nick D'Antoni, who started every game and ended the year nine assists away from breaking the school record for a season, after averaging just 12.2 minutes per game his previous year.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious

Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (23), a standout pitcher on the Tribe's baseball team, who is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization, Austin (19) and Jackson (13).

Ed Spencer came off the bench to score a game-high 11 points and the Seahawks' clutch foul shooting down the stretch gave UNC Wilmington a 54-49 victory over William and Mary.

Nathan Mann paced the Tribe with 10 points off the bench, and Corey Cofield and Hawley Smith each chipped in with eight points.

Despite the frigid conditions outside, the teams started hot from the field, as they battled through a back-and-forth opening 20 minutes. Nick D'Antoni drained a pair of three-pointers and Cofield scored five of his eight points in the first half, as the Tribe shot 10 for 23 (43.5%) from the floor.

Spencer had the hot hand for UNCW in the early going, as he connected on all three of his field goal attempts in the first half, including two three-pointers, as the Seahawks shot 42.9% from the floor (12 for 28) in the opening frame and took a 30-25 lead into the break.

After the teams battled through two scoreless minutes to start the second half, Cofield hit on the first of two free throws to cut the deficit to 30-26 with 17:44 remaining. The Seahawks, however, got a running jumper from sophomore T.J. Carter and a three-pointer from junior Beckham Wyrick to take their biggest lead of the game, 35-26, less than two minutes later.

Mann and Reid Markham provided the spark the Tribe needed though, as Mann buried a long three-pointer to start a 12-2 W&M run, and Markham came off the bench to grab a key offensive rebound, record a steal and score a bucket that gave the College a one-point lead, 38-37, with 11:19 remaining. After Mann's trey, Nate Loehrke's layin with just over 14 minutes left cut the UNCW lead to 35-31, and Cofield brought the Tribe within two on a dunk after his own offensive rebound the next trip down the floor.

Carter extended the Seahawks' lead to 37-33 with another running jumper in the lane, before Mann answered again from long distance with his second three-pointer of the half, cutting the deficit to one. After a pair of UNCW turnovers, Markham gave the Tribe its first lead of the game since the 10:22 mark of the first half, 38-37. After a foul shot from senior Aaron Coombs and another three-pointer from Spencer, the Seahawks went back in front by three, 41-38, before a layup from Smith at the 9:42 mark cut it to one.

UNCW answered with five straight points to build a 46-40 lead with 7:08 left. Smith brought the Tribe within four on its next possession with a jumper, but after a John Goldsberry field goal and a missed three-pointer by Mann, the Seahawks controlled the ball for over two minutes with four consecutive offensive rebounds. W&M's Edwin Ofori Attah hit one of three opportunities at the line to pull W&M within 48-43 with 3:22 remaining, but the Seahawks again crashed the offensive boards, corralling three rebounds off their own misses to run the clock down to 1:46 before turning it over.

Smith added a pair of foul shots to make it 48-45 with 1:14 left, but Coombs and Carter connected on four-of-four attempts from the charity stripe in the final 1:02 to preserve the victory.

Despite cooling off considerably from the field in the second half (25%), the Seahawks pulled down 10 offensive rebounds and used a slow-down ball-control attack to hold off the Tribe. Wyrick led UNCW with a game-high 11 boards, five of which came on the offensive end.

Markham wound up with four points, four rebounds, a steal and an assist, while D'Antoni finished with six points, four boards, a pair of assists and one steal.

Virginia Commonwealth 79, William and Mary 77 (OT)

Jan. 22, 2005 • Williamsburg, VA • William and Mary Hall

VCU's Nick George tied a career-high with a game-high 24 points, including a key field goal in the final minute of overtime, as the Rams pulled out a 79-77 overtime victory over William and Mary.

George, who shot 9-of-16 from the floor, hit a driving layup with 56.9 seconds remaining in the extra session to give VCU a 78-75 lead, after W&M's Nathan Mann had pulled the Tribe within one, 76-75, with a three-pointer with 1:22 remaining. On the Tribe's next trip down the floor, Corey Cofield, who registered his eighth career double-double with a team-high 22 points and 12 rebounds, was fouled after he grabbed a loose ball and sent to the line for two shots with 22.6 seconds left on the clock. Cofield, who was 10-for-12 from the stripe on the evening, sank both free throws to make it 78-77.

Forced to foul, the Tribe put VCU's Renardo Dixon on the line with 14 seconds remaining. Dixon converted one of the two attempts, extending the Rams' lead to 79-77. Needing a two to force a second overtime, Nick D'Antoni fed Cofield just off the right block in the waning seconds, but Cofield's fade-away as time expired caromed off the rim, giving the defending CAA champions the two-point victory.

The Rams spoiled outstanding performances from D'Antoni and Cofield, erasing a seven-point lead in the final minute and a half. D'Antoni, who poured in a season-high 16 points on 4-of-7 shooting from the field, all of which came from behind the arc, buried his fourth trey of the game with 1:29 remaining in regulation to put the Tribe ahead, 66-59. The senior guard again put W&M up by seven with a pair of free throws with 30.3 seconds remaining, pushing the advantage to 69-62.

VCU's Michael Doles, who dropped a career-high 23 points in the game, cut it to five with a layup on the Rams' next possession, and after Mann missed a pair of free throws with 19.1 seconds left, the Rams' sophomore guard B.A. Walker was fouled on a three-point attempt, resulting in three fouls shots with 12.2 seconds remaining.

Walker made the first two attempts from the line to cut the deficit to 69-66, and after a Tribe timeout, Walker missed the third try, but collected his own rebound, dribbled out and buried a three-pointer with nine seconds remaining to force the extra period tied at 69.

The Rams' late heroics overshadowed outstanding second-half efforts from Hawley Smith and Brian Hutt. Smith scored six points, including a key driving layup in the final minutes of regulation, and hauled in nine rebounds, while Hutt was a constant force on the glass off the bench, keeping several possessions alive en route to a season-high eight rebounds, one shy of his career-mark. The Tribe outrebounded VCU, 45-35, in the game.

William and Mary 83, Towson 65

Corey Cofield scored a game-high 19 points, including 10 in the final six minutes, as the Tribe pulled away from Towson for an 83-65 victory in Colonial Athletic Association men's basketball action Wednesday night at William and Mary Hall.

Cofield was an efficient 5-for-6 from the field on the night and shot 9-of-11 at the foul line for his 10th double-digit scoring game of the season. One of four in double-figures for the Tribe, Cofield's hot hand was just one of many offensive weapons, as W&M shot a season-high 52.1% (25-for-48) from the field.

The second half started with a bang, as Cofield beat the Tigers down the floor in transition for a dunk that extended a four-point halftime lead to 41-35. After Towson's Lawrence Hamm answered with a two-point field goal, W&M's **Laimis Kisielius** scored the Tribe's next six points to push the lead to nine, 47-38, with 16:07 remaining.

The Tigers' Mike Green, who scored a team-high 16 points, cut the deficit to five with back-to-back buckets, before consecutive three-pointers from **Nathan Mann** and **Edwin Ofori Attah** made it 53-42 with 13:39 left.

Towson cut it to five again, 57-52, behind free throws from Hamm at the 8:23 mark, but that was as close as the Tigers would get the rest of the way, as Cofield responded with another dunk and Ofori Attah drained his second trey to put the Tribe back up 10, 62-52 with 7:44 remaining.

Cofield pushed the lead to 12, 69-57, with a turnaround jumper at the 5:14 mark, and after Hamm answered with a layin, Cofield was again strong in the post with a jump-hook that made it 71-59 with 4:36 to go. Ofori Attah's reverse layup on the Tribe's next trip down the floor after a Towson score kept the lead at 12, before Cofield put an exclamation point on it with another dunk, bringing the lead to 14, 75-61, with 2:38 remaining.

Kisielius (2-for-2) and Cofield (4-for-4) drained six straight free throws that ballooned the lead to 81-63 less than a minute later, and **Hawley Smith's** put-back with five seconds remaining set the final margin at 83-65.

Ofori Attah finished with 14 points, his first double-figure scoring game since dropping 21 at James Madison on January 12, while Kisielius wound up with 14 and Mann added 10 to join Cofield in double-figures. Mann dished out a team-high six assists, and Ofori Attah pulled down five rebounds. Cofield added six boards, three assists and three steals.

Nick D'Antoni drained three three-pointers in the first half, as the Tribe shot a blistering 54.5% (12-for-22) from the floor, including 6-for-12 from behind the arc in the opening 20 minutes to take a 39-35 advantage at the break. **Brian Hutt** also had a strong first half, as he came off the bench to collect four points, three rebounds and two assists.

William and Mary's **Nathan Mann** tied a career high with 15 points, but the Tribe could not hold off the George Mason men's basketball team's hot shooting, as the Patriots defeated W&M, 95-62, this afternoon at the Patriot Center.

The loss drops the Tribe's record to 5-13 overall and 1-8 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while Mason improved to 10-8 (5-4 CAA).

With W&M trailing, 10-6, following a three-pointer by GMU's Tony Skinn, the Tribe went on a 7-0 run, sparked by a three-pointer and a pair of free throws from **Laimis Kisielius**, to take a 13-10 lead with 14:18 to play in the half. Mason's Folarin Campbell kept the lead from getting any larger, scoring eight points in just over a minute, to bring the score to 18-18. Drexel's Sean Brooks came off the bench to score a game-high 18 points and pull down 11 rebounds, and the Dragons held off a late William and Mary charge to defeat the Tribe, 60-48 at William and Mary Hall.

Brooks was a dominant force in the paint for the Dragons, shooting 6-of-10 from the floor and 6-of-10 from the foul line. Dominick Mejia added 14 points behind a 5-for-5 FG shooting performance, including 4-of-4 from behind the arc, and Phil Goss chipped in with 11 to give Drexel three in double-figures.

Both teams came out of the gate slow, combining for just two field goals in the first 10 minutes of the game. A layup from Brooks at the 9:04 mark of the first half gave Drexel an 8-4 advantage, before **Corey Cofield** recorded the Tribe's second field goal of the game with 8:51 remaining in the opening period. After starting 1-of-10 from the field, Drexel went on to hit 10 of its next 15 attempts from the floor to take a 26-12 lead at the break.

After shooting just 22.7% (5-for-22) from the field in the first half, W&M picked up the pace in the second half and got back in the game behind the play of **Nate Loehrke** and **Laimis Kisielius**. Back-to-back jumpers from Loehrke cut the deficit to 10, 30-20, with 14:25 remaining, and after Brooks answered with a stick-back layin, Kisielius responded with his first field goal of the game to make it 32-22 with 13:17 to go.

Consecutive three-pointers from Mejia and Goss, however, pushed the Dragons' lead back to 16, before Loehrke tapped in his own miss and **Nathan Mann** stripped the ball at midcourt on Drexel's next possession and drove in for a layup, trimming the deficit to 38-26 with 11:26 left on the clock.

Cofield brought the Tribe within 12 again with just under seven minutes remaining with back-to-back buckets, including a fast-break dunk at the 6:48 mark that made it 45-33. A Brooks free throw and a put-back from Kenell Sanchez extended the lead back to 15, before Kisielius began to heat up for the Tribe.

After W&M started the night 0-for-10 from behind the arc, Kisielius drained three-pointers on consecutive trips down the floor for the Tribe, sandwiched around another Brooks' layup, to make it 50-41 with 3:49 remaining. Brooks pushed the lead back to 11 with a pair of free throws at the 3:25 mark, but Mann answered with the College's third straight trey to pull within eight, 52-44, at the 3:06 mark.

On the Dragons' next trip down the floor, the Tribe forced a shot-clock violation, giving W&M the ball down by eight with just under 2:30 to go, but a turnover gave it back to Drexel. After another solid defensive effort from the Tribe, Goss drilled a long two-point field goal off a high screen to make it 54-44, and after a Kisielius miss on W&M's next touch, the Dragons went on to hit four straight free throws to effectively put it out of reach, 58-44 with 50.4 seconds remaining.

Kisielius added another jumper with 30 seconds left and wound up with a team-high 12 points, all of which came in the second half, and Cofield finished the night with 10 points and seven rebounds. Loehrke corralled seven rebounds to go along with his six points, while Mann finished with nine points, five assists and two steals.
