### Top Storylines

- William and Mary will play its second-to-last home game of the year Wednesday, when the Tribe hosts James Madison at 7:00 PM ... W&M comes into the game with a record of 5-18 overall and 1-13 in the Colonial Athletic Association ... The Dukes are 4-18 overall and tied with Towson for eighth place in the conference with a 2-12 league record.
- Saturday, the Tribe lost a heart-breaking, double-overtime game to George Mason, 104-99 ... Senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** and freshman guard **Nathan Mann** each scored a game-high 25 points in the contest ... Sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** just missed his second straight double-double with 19 points and 10 rebounds, while junior forward **Hawley Smith** had eight points, 11 rebounds, four assists and three steals.
- Cofield leads the Tribe in scoring (12.5 ppg), rebounding (6.6 ppg), field goal percentage (.485) and free throw percentage (.818) ... He ranks 17th in school history in career rebounds per game (6.6), while his free throw percentage this season is 15th in W&M's record book.
- Smith, is second on the team with 9.0 points and 5.3 rebounds per game ... D'Antoni leads the team with 2.7 assists per game ... Including Smith, in his first season at W&M after transferring from Temple, four of the Tribe's top five scorers are new to the team this year ... Freshmen **Laimis Kisielius** (8.5 ppg), Mann (8.2 ppg) and **Edwin Ofori Attah** (7.2 ppg) round out the top five.
- W&M has a .728 free throw percentage this season, first in the CAA, eighth in school history and the best mark in a season for the Tribe since 1984-85 (.734) ... Through Feb. 7, the Tribe's .726 mark from the line was 54th in the nation.
- Head coach **Tony Shaver** is in his second season at W&M ... Shaver came to the College after a very successful 17-year career at Hampden-Sydney, where he compiled a record of 358-121 (.747), including eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference championships, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Tournament appearances, advancing to the national championship game in 1999 and the Final Four again in 2003.

## Cofield Leads Tribe in Points, Boards, Blocks and Shooting Percentage

2004 CAA Rookie of the Year **Corey Cofield**, is again playing well this season, leading W&M in a variety of statistical categories ... The sophomore forward leads the team in scoring (12.5 ppg), rebounding (6.6 rpg) and blocks (0.70 per game, 16 overall) ... Cofield is also leading the team with a .485 field goal percentage and is shooting a team-best .818 (99-121) from the free throw line, 15th-best in a season at W&M and a significant improvement from his.634 FT% last season ... The CAA Player of the Week in the first week of this season, Cofield has 657 points (12.9 ppg) and 336 rebounds (6.6 rpg) in his 51-game career ... He scored his 500th career point in his 40th career game, on a free throw with 1:23 left to play against Delaware (Jan. 8) ... Cofield recorded his ninth career double-double with 21 points and 12 rebounds at UNC Wilmington (Feb. 9).

## Improving With Age

Freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** hasn't shown any signs of hitting the proverbial wall in his rookie season ... After averaging 7.1 points and a .367 field goal percentage through the first 16 games of the year, he has been heating up lately, averaging 11.9 points to go with a .397 FG% in the last seven contests ... Including his career-high 23 point showing at UNCW (Feb. 9), Kisielius has led the Tribe in scoring in three of the last five games ... Overall this season, he is averaging 8.5 ppg and a .380 FG%, and is second on the team—and fifth in the CAA—with an .809 free throw percentage.

## Tough Transfer

W&M junior forward **Hawley Smith** is the most recent in a long line of significant transfers to the College from other Division I programs ... Per NCAA regulations, Smith sat out last season, following two seasons at Temple University ... He is second on the team with 9.0 points and 5.3 rebounds per game ... W&M has had at least one Division I transfer on the active roster all but one year since the start of the 1995-96 campaign, all of whom have been significant contributors with starting experience ... The trend began with the arrival of **Bobby Fitzgibbons** (Wake Forest), **David Grabuloff** (Florida State) and **Sam Steen** (Loyola [MD]) in 1995-96 and continued with two-time first team All-CAA selection **Adam Hess** (Eastern Michigan), who graduated last season ... Currently sitting out this year is guard **Adam Payton** (Vanderbilt), who will be eligible to play for W&M next year.

## D'Antoni Ranks Ninth at W&M

Senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** is ranked ninth in school history with 326 career assists, recently passing **Matt O'Reilly** (1987-90), who is in 10th place with 297 ... Next up for D'Antoni is **Ron Satterthwaite** (1974-77), who is eighth at W&M with 331 assists ... The W&M record is held by **Scott Coval** (1983-86) with 409 career assists ... The nephew of current Phoenix Suns head coach Mike D'Antoni, Nick is averaging 3.23 assists per game in his career, the fifth-best mark in school history ... His career 1.46 assist-to-turnover ratio is third-best in W&M history ... Last season, he totaled 159 assists, second-most in school history and just nine away from tying the school record of 168 set by Coval in 1985.

The College has three players ranked in the top 10 in the CAA in free throw percentage, led by sophomore forward **Corey Cofield**, who is fourth in the conference (and 15th in school history) at .818 (99-121) ... Freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** is fifth in the league at .809 (55-68), while junior forward **Hawley Smith** is 10th (.786, 66-84) ... The Tribe has shot more than 90 percent from the line three times this season, including a 20-22 (.909) effort against Hofstra (Jan. 5), in which Cofield, Kisielius and Smith each went 6-6 from the foul line ... W&M has made at least 75 percent of its free throws in nine of 23 games ... The Tribe's current .728 percentage is the best mark for the program since a .734 mark in 1984-85 and is the eighth-best season mark in school history.

## Tough Competition

W&M played two of the nation's best teams in the non-conference portion of the schedule with games at Kentucky (Dec. 22) and North Carolina (Jan. 2) ... Two of the most storied programs in college basketball history, UK (1876-577-1, .765) and UNC (1827-677, .730) entered the 2004-05 campaign ranked first and second, respectively, in Division I history for most wins and highest winning percentage ... The Tribe joined Indiana and Tennessee as the only teams in the nation to face both Carolina and Kentucky this regular season, and was the only team to play them both on the road ... This is the first time since the 1995-96 campaign that W&M faced two nationally-ranked teams in the same season ... That year, W&M lost to No. 15 Virginia (87-58) and No. 22 Virginia Tech (71-66).

## Winning with Defense

Despite head coach **Tony Shaver's** preference for a fast-paced, high-offense style of play, the Tribe proved it could also win a defensive struggle, grinding out a 60-51 win over Hampton on Dec. 30 ... The Pirates' 18 field goals, .333 field goal percentage and 51 points are all season lows for a W&M opponent this season ... The 51 points allowed was the Tribe's best defensive effort since a 54-51 win over George Mason on Feb. 18, 2002 ... W&M has held opponents to 60 or fewer points five times this year, a feat that occurred just once all of last season.

an all-time high of 12 member institutions ... As a result, for the first time in conference history, the CAA will play an unbalanced schedule ... Each school has a set group of five opponents that it will play both at home and away each season ... The remaining six opponents are grouped into three pairs that rotate through the schedule every two years ... Each season a team will face one pair of opponents both home and away, while playing the other four foes either home or away ... Using this rotation, each team in the CAA will host every league member at least four times in the six-year rotation ... W&M's annual home-and-home opponents are Drexel, James Madison, UNC Wilmington, Old Dominion and Virginia Commonwealth ... In the next two seasons, the Tribe will also play two games against George Mason and Georgia State ... Next season, W&M will host single games against Delaware and Hofstra, and will play at Northeastern and Towson.

### David Willson Promoted to Assistant Coach

Current director of operations **David Willson** was promoted to assistant coach, effective February 1 ... A 2004 graduate of Hampden-Sydney, Willson scored 892 points and pulled down 586 rebounds in his college career, including his freshman season at Southern Methodist ... A native of Memphis, Willson was named the West Tennessee Player of the Year and competed in the state's East-West All-Star Game while in high school.

### Long Layoff ...

Between games at Old Dominion (Dec. 4) and at UNC Greensboro (Dec. 20) W&M went 15 days without playing, the longest stretch of days without a game in the CAA

... The layoff was due to the College's policy of not allowing regular season athletic events during the two-week final exam period ... The Tribe's last game before the break was Dec. 4 at Old Dominion ... The next-longest stretch of days without a game in the CAA was George Mason's 13-day layoff between games on Dec. 8 and Dec. 22.

### 30-Point Win Over Longwood

W&M's 90-60 victory over Longwood was the College's first win of 30 or more points since defeating Washington College by 53, 92-39, in Williamsburg on Nov. 20 to open the 1999-2000 season ... The last time W&M earned a 30-point win over a countable Division I opponent was a 32-point, 101-69 win over Elon on Dec. 22, 1998 at the Stanford Invitational ... That game was also the last time that the Green and Gold scored 100 points against any opponent.

### Early Signees

W&M head coach **Tony Shaver** and his staff have signed a pair of in-state student-athletes to play for the Tribe next season in **Calvin Baker (Newport News, VA)** and **Chris Darnell (Fredericksburg, VA)** ... The 2003-04 *Daily Press* Male Athlete of the Year, Baker is a 6-1, 173 pound guard who averaged 20.9 points per game at Woodside HS last season, leading his team to a 29-3 record and the Group AAA state championship ... Baker selected W&M ahead of UNC Wilmington, Winthrop, Loyola University Chicago and College of Charleston ... Darnell, a 6-8, 195 pound forward, averaged 19 points and 12 rebounds as a junior last season at North Stafford HS ... Darnell picked W&M over Holy Cross, New Hampshire, Elon, Loyola (MD), Navy, VMI and Colgate.

W&M began the 1956-57 season with home wins over The Citadel (87-74) on Nov. 30 and Hampden-Sydney (98-81) on Dec. 1 ... Last season, the Tribe opened the year with a 91-64 win over Liberty on Nov. 23 before falling on the road to Radford, 89-86, on Nov. 24 ... The Tribe opened at the Red Raider Classic in 2001-02, with a 75-55 loss to Texas Tech on Nov. 16 and a 76-55 defeat at the hands of Northern Iowa on Nov. 17.

### Tribe Hosts First Regular Season Tournament

This season's inaugural W&M Tip-Off Classic was the first regular season tournament ever to be hosted by the College and was the first men's basketball tournament of any kind to be played at W&M Hall since the Tribe hosted the ECAC South Tournament in 1985 ... W&M also played home quarterfinal games in the 1975, 1976 and 1977 Southern Conference and the 1980 and 1981 ECAC South tournaments ... W&M Hall was the location of NCAA Tournament first round games in 1972 and 1973, although W&M did not play

in either of those games.

### W&M Prolific From Line vs. Hartford

The Tribe was 32-41 (.780) from the free throw line in the season-opener against Hartford (11/19) ... That was the first time that the Green and Gold had made 30 or more free throws, or attempted at least 40 foul shots, since going 34-43 from the charity stripe against James Madison on Jan. 24, 2001 ... The most free throws the Tribe attempted in a game all last season was 34 against Delaware on Feb. 11.

### Tribe Picked Eighth in CAA Preseason Media Poll

W&M was predicted to finish eighth in the league in a poll of the CAA's media outlets last month ... Old Dominion was picked to finish first in the conference, receiving 13 of 24 first-place votes ... Last season the Tribe ended the season tied for eighth in the CAA, after being picked ninth in the preseason media poll.

The league will also have a presence in six of the top nine media markets (#1 New York, #4 Philadelphia, #6 Boston, #8 Washington, DC and #9 Atlanta) ... Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra and Towson all left the America East to become members of the CAA for the 2001-02 campaign.

## Head Coach Tony Shaver

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his second season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program. Officially hired on May 2, 2003, Shaver is the 31st men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Although the Tribe did not have a winning record in 2004, there were a number of highlights that foreshadow the successes that W&M will soon experience under Shaver. In his first game at the College, the Tribe pounded Liberty, 91-64, while shooting 54.0 percent from the field. Shaver also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime. In his first contest against a nationally-ranked opponent, W&M also performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There were individual successes as well for the Green and Gold. 2004 graduate Adam Hess became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a first team Academic All-America and all-conference selection. Current sophomore Corey Cofield was voted the CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Several players saw significant improvement from their prior year, most notably 2004 grad Zeb Cope, who scored more than three times his career average entering the season, and senior Nick D'Antoni, who started every game and ended the year nine assists away from breaking the school record for a season, after averaging just 12.2 minutes per game his previous year.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious

Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (23), a standout pitcher on the Tribe's baseball team, who is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization, Austin (19) and Jackson (13).

## Game #23

### George Mason 104, William and Mary 99

Feb. 12, 2005 • Williamsburg, VA • William and Mary Hall

George Mason scored nine straight points to erase a four-point deficit in the second overtime period and hand William and Mary a heart-breaking, 104-99, loss in double-overtime at William and Mary Hall.

In the second overtime, W&M scored the first four points on consecutive field goals from **Corey Cofield** and **Nathan Mann**, who scored a career-high 25 points, to open a 97-93 advantage with 3:42 remaining. The Patriots, however, responded with a pair of free throws from senior guard Tony Skinn that started a 9-0 run and held the depleted and drained Tribe squad scoreless for over three minutes to take control.

After Skinn's free throws, junior Lamar Butler drilled his sixth three-pointer of the game on the Patriots' next trip down the floor to give Mason a one-point lead, 98-97, with 1:55 left on the clock, before consecutive layups from freshman John Vaughan pushed the lead to 102-97 with just over 30 seconds remaining. After Vaughan missed two foul shots, W&M's **Nick D'Antoni**, who matched Mann for game-high honors with 25 points, drove the length of the floor for a layup to cut the deficit to three, 102-99, but Skinn sealed the victory and set the final margin with a pair of free throws with 14.7 seconds left.

Cofield sent the Tribe into its first double-overtime game since the 2001-02 season, an 88-83 victory over VCU on January 18, with an offensive rebound and turn-around jumper with one second left in the first overtime that knotted the score at 93-93. Mason junior Jai Lewis nearly powered the Patriots to victory in the first extra session with six of his 19 points, including back-to-back field goals that gave Mason a 92-89 lead with 25.4 seconds remaining. D'Antoni answered with a crucial field goal with 19.7 seconds left to cut it to one, and after Patriots' sophomore Gabe Norwood missed one of two free throws, the door was open for Cofield's heroics. Trailing 93-91, **Reid Markham** drove the lane and missed a running jumper, but Cofield collected the board and buried the putback to keep the Tribe alive.

Markham and Mann each answered the call in the first extra session with six and five points, respectively. Mann, who wound up 10-for-19 from the floor, 5-of-11 from three-point range, single-handedly erased a five-point Mason lead with the Tribe's first six points of overtime on consecutive three-pointers. The Patriots went back up by one, 85-84, on a runner from Skinn, before Markham sliced his way through the paint for a jumper and three-point play to put the Tribe back on top, 87-85, with exactly two minutes to go. Skinn responded with a three-point play of his own, but Markham again got to the line and sank a pair to give W&M an 89-88 lead with 1:33 remaining, before Lewis' two field goals.

The loss spoiled the outstanding play of D'Antoni, who scored 14 of his 25 in the second half, and Mann, who played the final four minutes of regulation and both overtimes with four fouls. D'Antoni shot 10-of-21 from the field, including 5-of-10 from behind the arc, and added four assists. Mann scored 13 in the opening half and matched his previous career-high of 15 in the first minute of the second half. He too added four assists.

Cofield wound up with 19 points to give W&M three in double-figures and pulled down nine rebounds before fouling out in the second overtime. **Hawley Smith** just missed a double-double with eight points and a career-high 11 rebounds before also fouling out. Markham finished the afternoon with eight points and five rebounds.
