Top Storylines

- William and Mary opens the final week of the regular season with a 7:30 PM game at Virginia Commonwealth on Wednesday ... The Tribe will come into the game with a record of 6-19 overall and 2-14 in the Colonial Athletic Association ... The Rams are 15-11 overall and third in the CAA with an 11-5 league record.
- Freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** was named the CAA Rookie of the Week on Monday, after averaging 14.0 points and 4.0 rebounds in games against James Madison and Old Dominion ... Kisielius had 12 points, six rebounds and two assists against the Dukes, and scored 16 points against the Monarchs ... Kisielius is now second on the team in scoring with 9.0 ppg.
- Wednesday's game will be the 35th in the series between William and Mary and Virginia Commonwealth ... VCU leads the series, 24-10, and has won six of the last eight meetings between the two teams ... The College's most recent win against the Rams was an 88-83, double overtime game in Williamsburg on Jan. 18, 2003 ... W&M was the first CAA team to defeat the Rams in their own gym after VCU joined the league in the 1995-96 season, posting a 77-63 win on Feb. 28, 1997 in the quarterfinals of the CAA Tournament at the Richmond Coliseum (then VCU's home court) ... That was also the Tribe's last postseason victory ... The series began on Nov. 25, 1977, with a 55-54 W&M win at the University of Richmond's Spider Classic.
- Saturday the Tribe lost to league-leading Old Dominion, 82-66 ... Junior center **Nate Loehrke** came off the bench to lead all scorers with a career high 21 points, along with four rebounds and four assists ... Also scoring in double figures for W&M was Kisielius with 16 points and senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** with 10 ... Sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** had nine points and eight rebounds.
- Cofield leads the Tribe in scoring (12.8 ppg), rebounding (6.7 rpg), field goal percentage (.493) and free throw percentage (.832) ... He ranks 17th in school history in career rebounds per game (6.6), while his free throw percentage this season is 12th in W&M's record book.

Cofield Leads Tribe in Points, Boards and Shooting Percentage

2004 CAA Rookie of the Year **Corey Cofield**, is again playing well this season, leading W&M in a variety of statistical categories ... The sophomore forward leads the team in scoring (12.8 ppg) and rebounding (6.7 rpg) and is tied with sophomore center **Brian Hutt** for the team lead in blocks (0.64 per game, 16 overall) ... Cofield is also leading the team with a .493 field goal percentage and is shooting a team-best .832 (114-137) from the free throw line, 12th-best in a season at W&M and a significant improvement from his .634 FT% last season ... The CAA Player of the Week in the first week of this season, Cofield has 690 points (13.0 ppg) and 352 rebounds (6.6 rpg) in his 53-game career ... Cofield recorded his ninth career double-double with 21 points and 12 rebounds at UNC Wilmington (Feb. 9).

Improving With Age

Selected as the CAA Rookie of the Week on Monday (Feb. 21), freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** hasn't shown any signs of hitting the proverbial wall in his rookie season ... After averaging 7.1 points and a .367 field goal percentage through the first 16 games of the year, he has been heating up lately, averaging 12.3 points to go with a .405 FG% in the last eight contests ... Including his career-high 23-point showing at UNCW (Feb. 9), Kisielius has led the Tribe in scoring in three of the last six games ... He earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors after recording 12 points and six rebounds against James Madison (Feb. 16) and scoring 16 points against Old Dominion (Feb. 19) ... Overall this season, he is second on the team with 9.0 ppg and has a .385 FG%.

Tough Transfer

W&M junior forward **Hawley Smith** is the most recent in a long line of significant transfers to the College from other Division I programs ... Per NCAA regulations, Smith sat out last season, following two seasons at Temple University ... He is third on the team with 8.8 ppg and second with 5.5 rebounds per game ... W&M has had at least one Division I transfer on the active roster all but one year since the start of the 1995-96 campaign, all of whom have been significant contributors with starting experience ... The trend began with the arrival of **Bobby Fitzgibbons** (Wake Forest), **David Grabuloff** (Florida State) and **Sam Steen** (Loyola [MD]) in 1995-96 and continued with two-time first team All-CAA selection **Adam Hess** (Eastern Michigan), who graduated last season ... Currently sitting out this year is guard **Adam Payton** (Vanderbilt), who will be eligible to play for W&M next year.

D'Antoni Ranks Ninth at W&M

Senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** is eighth in school history with 332 career assists ... Next up for D'Antoni is **David Cox** (1992-95), who is seventh at W&M with 336 ... The W&M record is held by **Scott Coval** (1983-86) with 409 career assists ... The nephew of current Phoenix Suns head coach Mike D'Antoni, Nick is averaging 3.22 assists per game in his career, the fifth-best mark in school history ... His career 1.46 assist-to-turnover ratio is third-best in W&M history ... Last season, he totaled 159 assists, second-most in school history and just nine away from tying the school record of 168 set by Coval in 1985.

Second is freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** (9.0 ppg) ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith**, a transfer from Temple, is third on the team in scoring with 8.8 ppg ... He is followed by freshmen guards **Nathan Mann** (8.0 ppg) and **Edwin Ofori Attah** (6.9 ppg).

D'Antoni Appears in 100th Career Game

Senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** appeared in the 100th game of his career at UNCW (2/9) ... With 79 starts at W&M, D'Antoni has now played in 53 consecutive contests (103 overall) and missed just five games in his college career ... Next on the team in terms of total career W&M games is senior

guard **Reid Markham** with 82 ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith** has played in 87 games, although only the 25 this season have been in a W&M uniform ... The last Tribe player to appear in 100 games was 2004 graduate **Zeb Cope**, who ended his career last season with 108 games played, tied for 18th in school history.

Best Things in Life are Free (Throws)

W&M leads the CAA with a .733 free throw percentage, the 34-best percentage in Division I through Feb. 21 ... A league-high 24.6 percent (403 of 1635) of the Tribe's points are coming from the charity stripe ... The next closest percentage of points from the line is James Madison, with 22.1 (334 of 1513) ... The College has three players ranked in the top eight in the CAA in free throw percentage, led by sophomore forward **Corey Cofield**, who is third in the conference (and 12th in school history) at .832 (114-137) ... Junior forward **Hawley Smith** is seventh in the league at .793 (69-87), while freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** is eighth (.788, 67-85) ... The Tribe has shot more than 90 percent from the line three times this season, including a 20-22 (.909) effort against Hofstra (Jan. 5), in which Cofield, Kisielius and Smith each went 6-6 from the foul line ... W&M has made at least 75 percent of its free throws in 10 of 25 games ... The Tribe's current .733 percentage is the best mark for the program since a .734 mark in 1984-85 and is the seventh-best season mark in school history.

Tough Competition

W&M played two of the nation's best teams in the non-conference portion of the schedule with games at Kentucky (Dec. 22) and North Carolina (Jan. 2) ... Two of the most storied programs in college basketball history, UK (1876-577-1, .765) and UNC (1827-677, .730) entered the 2004-05 campaign ranked first and second, respectively, in Division I history for most wins and highest winning percentage ... The Tribe joined Indiana and Tennessee as the only teams in the nation to face both Carolina and Kentucky this regular season, and was the only team to play them both on the road ... This is the first time since the 1995-96 campaign that W&M faced two nationally-ranked teams in the same season ... That year, W&M lost to No. 15 Virginia (87-58) and No. 22 Virginia Tech (71-66).

Winning with Defense

Despite head coach **Tony Shaver's** preference for a fast-paced, high-offense style of play, the Tribe proved it could also win a defensive struggle, grinding out a 60-51 win over Hampton on Dec. 30 ... The Pirates' 18 field goals, .333 field goal percentage and 51 points are all season lows for a W&M opponent this season ... Head Coach Tony Shaver

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his second season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program. Officially hired on May 2, 2003, Shaver is the 31st men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

Although the Tribe did not have a winning record in 2004, there were a number of highlights that foreshadow the successes that W&M will soon experience under Shaver. In his first game at the College, the Tribe pounded Liberty, 91-64, while shooting 54.0 percent from the field. Shaver also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime. In his first contest against a nationally-ranked opponent, W&M also performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There were individual successes as well for the Green and Gold. 2004 graduate Adam Hess became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a first team Academic All-America and all-conference selection. Current sophomore Corey Cofield was voted the CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Several players saw significant improvement from their prior year, most notably 2004 grad Zeb Cope, who scored more than three times his career average entering the season, and senior Nick D'Antoni, who started every game and ended the year nine assists away from breaking the school record for a season, after averaging just 12.2 minutes per game his previous year.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious

Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (23), a standout pitcher on the Tribe's baseball team, who is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization, Austin (19) and Jackson (13).

Freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** scored a team-high 22 points in his first collegiate game to lead four Tribe players in double-figures, as W&M defeated Hartford, 84-71, in the second game of the W&M Tip-off Classic.

Ofori Attah shot 50% from the floor (7-for-14), including 4-of-6 from behind the three-point line, coming off the bench in his first college game.

Sophomore **Corey Cofield**, the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, picked up where he left off last season, scoring 20 points on 7-for-12 shooting from the floor and sharing team-high honors with six rebounds. Cofield added two assists and a block and was a perfect 6-for-6 from the foul line. He capped a strong first-half effort with a put-back lay-in in the closing seconds of the opening half to give W&M a 32-27 lead at the break.

The Tribe quickly turned a five-point halftime lead into an 18-point advantage in the first six minutes of the second half, using a 13-1 run to extend the lead to 52-34 with just under 15 minutes remaining. The spurt was capped by three consecutive treys, the first two by Ofori Attah, and the last by junior **Hawley Smith**.

After the Hawks cut the deficit to 14, an Ofori Attah free throw and a Cofield three-point play pushed the lead back to 18 with 10:48 remaining. The W&M lead grew to 22, its biggest of the game, just over a minute later, as Cofield, junior **Taylor Mokris** and Ofori Attah connected on six straight opportunities from the foul line, giving the Tribe a 64-42 lead.

Hartford trimmed the Tribe advantage to 11 on back-to-back three-pointers from junior guard Aaron Cook, cutting the deficit to 65-54 with 6:12 left on the clock, but a pair of free throws from Mokris and junior **Adam Dutton** lay up pushed the lead back to 15.

The Hawks got as close as 10 with 2:07 left, but another pair of Mokris free throws and two-straight Ofori Attah field goals put the game out of reach at 79-66 with 50 seconds remaining.

Joining Ofori Attah and Cofield in double-figures were Smith and freshman **Laimis Kisielius**. Smith poured in a career-high 19 points, which included a 9-for-12 performance from the charity stripe, and pulled down six boards. Kisielius was 3-of-5 from the floor and 4-for-4 from the stripe for 10 points in his first collegiate game.

Mokris did all of his damage from the foul line, going 6-for-6 on the evening. As a team, the Tribe shot 76.2% from the foul line (32-for-42), including 23-for-27 in the second half.

Corey Cofield recorded a double-double with 24 points and 10 rebounds, both game-highs, and **Nathan Mann**'s hot shooting in the second half led William and Mary to an 81-76 victory over Radford in the championship game of the W&M Tip-off Classic at William and Mary Hall.

Cofield shot an impressive 7-for-9 from the field and converted 10-of-14 free throw opportunities in the title game to earn tournament MVP honors, as the Tribe captured the title in the first regular season tournament ever hosted by the College.

Trailing by as many as 10 points in the second half, Cofield, Mann and **Hawley Smith** keyed a second-half surge that erased the Tribe deficit at the 5:42 mark. Smith knocked down a field goal at the 8:18 mark to cut the Highlanders' lead to five, and then nailed a pair of free throws to shrink Radford's lead to three. The Highlanders restored their lead to five just over a minute later, before Mann's first three-pointer at the 6:11 mark and pair of free throws from Cofield brought about a 69-69 tie.

With just under five minutes remaining, Mann dialed long distance once again, giving W&M its first lead of the game, 72-69, since the 17-minute mark of the second half, when the Tribe led 43-42. Cofield, Mann and **Laimis Kisielius** all hit clutch free throws down the stretch to preserve the victory. Mann finished with 14 points on 4-of-9 shooting, with all nine attempts coming from behind the arc. He added a team-high five assists and four rebounds.

Smith scored in double figures for the second straight game with 15 to join Cofield on the all-tournament team, while Kisielius chipped in with 11 to give W&M four players in double figures.

Both teams struggled from the floor early, as W&M hit on just 2-of-8 attempts from the field in the opening six minutes, while the Highlanders managed only a 3-for-7 effort. Trailing 7-4, Radford began to heat up, hitting five straight field goals, including seven points by all-tournament team selection Olumuyiwa Poopoola, to spur a 13-0 run and take a 17-7 lead with just under 12 minutes remaining in the opening half.

The Radford lead grew to as many as 11 after six straight points from Chris Oliver, another all-tournament team selection with 23 points, before the Tribe began to chip away.

Cofield and Kisielius each knocked down a pair of free throws to cut the deficit to six, and a Kisielius lay-in at the 5:17 mark trimmed the Highlanders' advantage to four, before back-to-back jumpers from Cofield had the Tribe within one at 31-30 with 2:37 remaining in the half.

Taylor Mokris drained two of his three first-half treys in the final two minutes, including one in the closing seconds to knot the score at 36-36 heading into the break.

William and Mary freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** scored 17 points, but it was not enough, as the Tribe men's basketball team fell at Campbell, 75-62, at Carter Gymnasium.

The loss was the first of the season for W&M, which fell to 2-1 on the year. The Fighting Camels improved to 1-1 with the win.

The Camels opened the contest with an 11-1 lead and never looked back, going ahead by as many as 17 points in the first half before taking a 12-point, 45-33 advantage into halftime. The Tribe started to come back in the second, using a 17-10 run over the first 10 minutes, ending with a layup by junior **Nate Loehrke**, to close to within five at 55-50. The two teams traded free throws, before sophomore **Adam Trumbower** knocked down a pair from the line to cut Campbell's lead to just three, 56-53, with 7:56 remaining. The Camels led 60-54, before a three-pointer from junior **Taylor Mokris** cut the lead back to three points with 6:05 to play. However, that would be as close as the Tribe would get, as Campbell went on an 11-3 run over the next six minutes to put the game away.

Joining Ofori Attah in double figures was junior **Hawley Smith**, who had 11 points on 4-5 shooting from the field and a 3-3 performance from the free throw line. Anthony Atkinson led three Campbell players in double figures with 18 points, while Comerlee Poole had a double-double with 10 points and a game-high 12 rebounds.

Jamon Gordon poured in a game-high 20 points and Carlos Dixon added 18 to lead Virginia Tech's men's basketball team to an 80-63 victory over William and Mary.

As the first ACC team to visit W&M Hall since 1996, the Hokies outscored W&M 18-5 over the final five minutes of the first half to extend a four-point lead to a 42-25 advantage at the break. Junior **Hawley Smith** knocked down a pair of free throws with 5:40 remaining in the opening half to pull the Tribe within 24-20, before the Tech run began.

Dixon scored eight of his 11 first-half points in a 14-3 Hokie spurt, after a put-back layup from Smith cut the Tech lead to 28-22 with four minutes remaining.

Freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** buried a three-pointer, his only field goal of the first half, with just under three minutes remaining that made the score 32-25, but Virginia Tech held the Tribe scoreless the rest of the way, using a 10-0 run to close the period.

Gordon was a perfect three-for-three from behind the arc in the second half, as the Hokies opened up as much as a 22-point lead and held off any chance of a Tribe comeback.

After sophomore **Corey Cofield** sank a pair from the foul line with 12:38 remaining in the game to cut the Tribe's deficit to 53-39, Gordon hit on back-to-back three-pointers to push the lead back to 20.

W&M closed to within 16 at the 7:22 mark after a pair of free throws from junior **Adam Dutton**, but Dixon answered with another three for the Hokies, who shot 50% (9-for-18) from behind the arc in the game.

Senior **Nick D'Antoni** cut the deficit to 73-56 with two free throws with 3:55 remaining, but Gordon responded with his final trey, again extending the lead back to 20.

Smith recorded his first career double-double with 10 points and a game-high 11 rebounds, surpassing his previous career-high of seven boards with eight in the first half alone, while Cofield paced the Tribe with 14 points, including an eight-for-eight effort at the charity stripe.

Junior **Nate Loehrke** narrowly missed his first career double-double with 10 points and a career-high nine rebounds in 18 minutes, and freshman **Nathan Mann** tallied 11, spurred by a 3-for-4 effort from three-point range, to give W&M four in double-figures.

Freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** scored a game-high 17 points and junior **Hawley Smith** dropped in 16 points and pulled down seven rebounds to lead the William and Mary men's basketball team to a 90-60 win over in-state rival Longwood University at William and Mary Hall.

The Tribe improved to 3-2 with the victory, while the Lancers remained winless on the year, falling to 0-6.

Ofori Attah hit on 6-of-12 attempts from the floor to pace the Tribe, which shot a season-high 50% (30-for-60) from the field. Smith also had a solid shooting performance, going 5-for-9 from the floor and 5-of-6 at the foul line.

Freshman **Nathan Mann** chipped in 11, giving the College three players in double-figures, and added four assists, four rebounds and a career and game-high five steals.

The Tribe shot a blistering 60.6% (20-for-33) from the field in the first half, led by Ofori Attah and Mann, to open up a 56-34 lead at the break. Ofori Attah connected on 5-of-9 attempts from the floor for 13 points in the opening period, while Mann added 10, sparked by 3-of-4 shooting from behind the arc.

Longwood slowly chipped away at the Tribe's lead in the second half, cutting the deficit to as few as 11 points at the 12:25 mark on a Dana Smith jumper, which made it 63-52.

After a W&M timeout, however, the Tribe went back on the offensive, as Smith answered with a lay-in and a pair of free throws on the following possession to push the lead back to 15 with 11:25 remaining.

The Lancers' Husein Pistoljevic trimmed the College's lead to 12 with his second try of the game at the 8:57 mark, but consecutive field goals from Ofori Attah, junior **Adam Dutton** and sophomore **Corey Cofield** gave the Tribe a 19-point lead, 76-57, effectively putting the game out of reach with just under six minutes left.

Cofield wound up with eight points on 4-of-6 shooting and eight rebounds, while Dutton tallied eight points behind a 3-for-4 effort from the floor.

Lamar Barrett led the Lancers with 16 points on 8-for-10 shooting from the floor and seven rebounds. Maurice Sumter added 11 points and six rebounds.

William and Mary freshman **Edwin Ofori Attah** came off the bench for a game-high 18 points, but it was not enough, as the Tribe men's basketball team lost to Old Dominion, 69-56, at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

Following the first Colonial Athletic Association game of the year for both teams, W&M's record dropped to 3-3, while the Monarchs, picked in the preseason by both the coaches and the media to win the conference, improved to 6-1.

Neither team led by more than six points in the back-and-forth first half, that featured four ties and seven lead changes. Both sides started off slowly, combining for just 24 points through the first 10 minutes, with W&M tying the score at 12 on a pair of free throws by rookie **Laimis Kisielius**. ODU scored six straight from there, ending with a layup by John Morris, for an 18-12 lead, but the Tribe used an 11-2 run, led by seven points by Ofori Attah, to take a 23-20 lead with 3:48 left in the half. The Monarchs took a 31-27 lead with 25 seconds left on a layup by CAA Preseason Player of the Year Alex Loughton, but a layup with three seconds left in the half by W&M sophomore **Corey Cofield**, the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, cut led Monarchs' lead to just two points, 31-29, at the intermission.

ODU opened the second period with a 13-6 run, including six points from Arnaud Dahi, to go up 44-37 less than five minutes into the half. The Tribe battled back to close within three, 44-41, on buckets by Ofori Attah and Cofield, but that would be as close as the College would get, as the Monarchs used the next five minutes to take a 59-45 advantage, eventually leading by as many as 16 points, before closing out the 13-point, 69-56, win.

The Tribe out-rebounded ODU, 41-37, and shot .458 (22-48) from the floor, compared to a .373 (25-67) performance from the Monarchs. However, the Tribe was ultimately done in by a season-high 23 turnovers, compared to just seven giveaways for ODU. This was also the first game all season in which the Tribe committed more fouls than its opponent, as the Green and Gold was whistled for a season-high 24 fouls, compared to just 19 for ODU.

Along with Ofori Attah's 18 points, Cofield also scored in double figures for W&M with 13 points (including 11 in the second half), while pulling down a team-high eight rebounds. Loughton and Isaiah Hunter led the Monarchs with 14 points each, followed by Dahi with 13 and Kiah Thomas, who added 12.

William and Mary freshman **Laimis Kisielius** scored a career-high 15 points and the Tribe men's basketball team made 50.0% of its three-point field goal attempts, but the Green and Gold was unable to defeat UNC Greensboro, falling to the Spartans, 84-62, at Fleming Gymnasium.

The loss dropped to the Tribe's record to 3-4, while UNCG improved to 7-2 on the year.

W&M opened the game with an 8-2 lead early, but the Spartans regrouped, going on a 20-1 run to lead 22-9. UNCG led by 15 points, 34-19, with 5:23 left in the first half, before the Tribe rallied for an 11-2 run in a span of less than four minutes to close within six points, 36-30, with 1:49 remaining. Sophomore **Adam Trumbower** started the rally with his second three-pointer of the game, while seniors **Nick D'Antoni** and **Reid Markham** each also added a shot from long-range, and junior center **Nate Loehrke** contributed a pair of buckets.

However, the Spartans started the second half by scoring on five of their first six possessions, scoring the first 10 points following the break to take a commanding, 51-32, lead with 17:14 remaining. The Tribe was never able to get closer than 13 points the rest of the way, eventually falling, 84-62.

Along with the 15 points from Kisielius, junior forward **Hawley Smith** also scored in double figures for W&M, with 10 points to go with five rebounds and two blocked shots. UNCG's Ronnie Burrell led all scorers with 22 points and also had a game-high 10 rebounds in the game. Kyle Hines blocked six shots, as the Spartans broke their school record with 13 blocks in the contest. Hines also had 16 points and nine rebounds in the game.

The Tribe made half of its 18 three-point field goal attempts, but was hurt by its 18 turnovers. W&M also attempted a season-low nine free throws, making just five shots from the line, well below the team's average of 20.5 points from the charity stripe entering the contest.

Junior forward **Hawley Smith** scored 13 points on 6-of-8 shooting, and senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** added 12 as William and Mary defeated in-state rival Hampton, 60-51, Thursday night in men's basketball action at William and Mary Hall.

The victory snapped a three-game losing streak for the Tribe, which improved to 4-5 overall. The Pirates fell to 3-9 with the loss.

Smith keyed a strong second-half effort for the College, scoring 10 of his team-high 13 points in the second frame, while D'Antoni buried a key three-pointer and converted all six of his opportunities from the foul line down the stretch to ice the win.

With the Tribe clinging to a five-point lead, 42-37, with just under six minutes remaining, freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** pulled down an offensive rebound and found D'Antoni wide open at the top of the arc, resulting in D'Antoni's second triple of the half and an eight-point W&M lead.

The Pirates cut the deficit to seven on a free throw from Bruce Brown with 4:35 left, but a three-pointer from freshman guard **Nathan Mann** on the Tribe's next possession pushed the advantage to 10, 48-38.

D'Antoni sank his first two attempts from the charity stripe to increase the lead to 12 with 3:38 remaining, before back-to-back buckets from Smith, including a break-away dunk, gave the Tribe a 54-41 advantage with 1:23 remaining.

Hampton guard Junior Pehoua nailed four three-pointers in the final 1:31 of the contest, but D'Antoni (4-of-4) and Mann (2-of-2) answered with six-straight free throws to hold off the Pirates' late charge. Pehoua canned his final trey with 15 seconds left on the clock to set the final margin, 60-51.

Sophomore forward **Corey Cofield**, who was held scoreless in his previous two games, chipped in seven points and a game-high 10 rebounds for the Tribe, before fouling out with 2:47 remaining. Mann wound up with nine points, including a 4-for-6 effort at the line, while Kisielius added eight points, three rebounds and three assists. The unsung hero for W&M in the game was senior guard **Reid Markham**, who scored just four points, but contributed with five assists (against just one turnover), two steals and four rebounds, including a pair of crucial offensive boards in the second half.

The Tribe converted 9-of-11 (81.8%) attempts from the foul line in the second half and shot 50% (12-for-24) from the field, to the Pirates' 7-for-19 (36.8%) effort from the charity stripe and 9-for-24 (37.5%) performance from the floor.

William and Mary's men's basketball team played fourth-ranked North Carolina to a 20-20 tie through the first 10 minutes of play, before the Tar Heels went on a 29-7 run in less than nine minutes, defeating the Tribe, 105-66, Sunday afternoon at the Dean E. Smith Center.

W&M fell to 4-6 with the loss in the College's final non-conference game of the regular season. UNC won its 12th straight game to improve to 12-1.

A three-point field goal by senior guard **Nick D'Antoni** put the Tribe ahead, 9-7, at the 14:32 mark, before the Tar Heels pulled ahead by five at 12:13 on a basket by Marvin Williams. W&M used a bucket by sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** and a three by rookie guard **Nathan Mann** to tie the game at 16. The two teams each traded a pair of field goals to bring the score to 20-20 with 10:07 left in the half, before UNC closed out the period on a 33-12 run to go ahead 53-32 at the break.

The Tar Heels opened the second half with 11 unanswered points for a 32-point lead and never let W&M get closer than 26 the rest of the way, as UNC won 105-66.

Cofield scored 16 points in the game, as did junior center **Nate Loehrke**, setting a personal career high. Junior forward **Hawley Smith** added 12 points for the Green and Gold, which shot .424 from the field in the game.

UNC's Sean May led all scorers with 24 points in the contest, followed by Jawad Williams with 19, Rashad McCants with 15 and Marvin Williams with 14. Raymond Felton had 12 assists in the game for UNC, which connected on 57.4 percent of its field goals and outrebounded the Tribe, 38-24.

Hofstra 71, William and Mary 59

Hofstra's men's basketball team shot 53.6% in the first half, including 50% from three-point range, and had five score in double-figures to beat William and Mary, 71-59, Wednesday night in Colonial Athletic Association action at William and Mary Hall.

The Tribe's **Hawley Smith** scored a career-high 20 points on 6-for-9 shooting from the floor to pace the College, which dropped to 4-7 overall and 0-2 in the CAA. The Pride, off to its best start since 1960-61, improved to 10-1 overall, 2-0 in the league.

Hofstra opened up a 12-2 lead in the first five minutes of the contest and led by as many as 15 in the opening frame behind a torrid start from the field. Sophomore guard Carlos Rivera, who shared team-high honors in the game with 16 points, drained 3-of-4 attempts from behind the arc in the first half, as the Pride shot 7-for-14 from long distance and took a 42-30 lead at the break.

Tribe guard **Nathan Mann** kept the Green and Gold in it early with his own long-range shooting, burying 3-of-4 three-point shots in the first stanza en route to 11 points at intermission.

The College quickly cut the deficit to eight in the second half on back-to-back buckets from Smith, but a jumper from Pride sophomore Loren Stokes, who tied Rivera for the team-lead with 16, pushed the advantage back to 10, 44-34, with 17:34 remaining.

Smith trimmed the lead to seven with a three-pointer with 17:15 remaining, but Stokes answered with two free throws after a Tribe turnover to push the lead back to nine, 48-39. W&M sophomore **Corey Cofield** dropped in his lone field goal of the game on the next possession to get within seven again, but that was as close as the Tribe would get, as Hofstra reeled off a 12-0 run to take a 19-point lead, 60-41, with 13:10 remaining.

The Tribe pulled to within 11 on two occasions down the stretch on a layup from junior **Nate Loehrke** that made it 62-51 with 7:33 left, and a jumper from Smith at the 4:25 mark that cut the deficit to 64-53, but Rivera drilled his fourth triple of the game with 1:27 to give his team a 70-57 lead and put the game away.

Smith, who went 2-for-3 from behind the arc and 6-for-6 from the stripe, added four rebounds and a pair of steals, while Mann wound up with 13 points on 5-of-8 FG shooting. Cofield chipped in with eight points and a team-high five boards, and freshman **Laimis Kisielius** added eight points, three rebounds and two assists. Smith, Kisielius and Cofield each shot 6-for-6 from the foul line, as the Tribe made good on 20-of-22 (90.9%) opportunities at the line.

Delaware's men's basketball team scored 46 points and shot 57.7% in the second half to come back and defeat William and Mary, 69-59, Saturday afternoon at William and Mary Hall.

The loss dropped the Tribe to 4-8 overall and 0-3 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Blue Hens improved to 5-9 (2-1 CAA).

The two teams played each other close through the majority of the first half, which had three ties and seven lead changes. Delaware's Harding Nana, who ended with game highs in points (25) and rebounds (10), knocked down a pair of free throws to cut W&M's lead to 22-21 with 3:43 left in the half. From there, the Tribe used a three and a jumper from **Nathan Mann** and another three from **Nick D'Antoni** to score eight unanswered points and go ahead 30-21. A dunk by UD's Andrew Washington brought the score to 30-23 in favor of the Tribe at the break.

A layup by W&M **Laimis Kisielius** capped another 8-0 run by the Green and Gold to open the second half, giving the Tribe a 38-25 lead with 16:02 to play. However, the Blue Hens went on an 18-5 run, ending with a three-point play by Andrew Washington, who was fouled as he scored on a layup and then hit the ensuing free throw, to tie the game at 43 with 9:18 left. The next seven minutes went back and forth, with the lead changing hands six more times and neither team able to pull ahead by more than four points. The Tribe's last two leads down the stretch were erased when Delaware's Rulon Washington knocked down a pair of three-pointers, the second coming with 2:28 left to put the Blue Hens up for good, 59-57.

A missed shot by the Tribe led to a basket by UD's Andrew Washington, before W&M's **Corey Cofield** converted a pair of free throws to pull the College back to within two points, 61-59, with 1:23 on the clock. Those would be W&M's last points of the game, however, and Delaware ended the game with eight straight points of their own to close out the win.

W&M shot .440 from the field in first half, but just .333 in the second, including going 0-7 from three-point range in the final stanza. The Blue Hens shot .460 from the field in the game, including a blistering .577 (15-26) in the second half. Along with Nana's 25 points, Andrew Washington scored 24, while Mike Slattery had six points, five rebounds and a game-high eight assists to lead Delaware. Kisielius came off the bench to lead W&M with 14 points, while Cofield had 13 and D'Antoni 12.

William and Mary sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** came off the bench to lead the Tribe with 20 points and nine rebounds, but the College was unable to overcome Drexel's hot shooting in the first half, falling to the Dragons, 91-65, Saturday afternoon at the Daskalakis Athletic Center.

The Tribe dropped to 4-10 overall and 0-5 in the Colonial Athletic Association, while DU improved to 7-6, 3-2 CAA).

Ed Spencer came off the bench to score a game-high 11 points and the Seahawks' clutch foul shooting down the stretch gave UNC Wilmington a 54-49 victory over William and Mary.

Nathan Mann paced the Tribe with 10 points off the bench, and Corey Cofield and Hawley Smith each chipped in with eight points.

Despite the frigid conditions outside, the teams started hot from the field, as they battled through a back-and-forth opening 20 minutes. Nick D'Antoni drained a pair of three-pointers and Cofield scored five of his eight points in the first half, as the Tribe shot 10 for 23 (43.5%) from the floor.

Spencer had the hot hand for UNCW in the early going, as he connected on all three of his field goal attempts in the first half, including two three-pointers, as the Seahawks shot 42.9% from the floor (12 for 28) in the opening frame and took a 30-25 lead into the break.

After the teams battled through two scoreless minutes to start the second half, Cofield hit on the first of two free throws to cut the deficit to 30-26 with 17:44 remaining. The Seahawks, however, got a running jumper from sophomore T.J. Carter and a three-pointer from junior Beckham Wyrick to take their biggest lead of the game, 35-26, less than two minutes later.

Mann and Reid Markham provided the spark the Tribe needed though, as Mann buried a long three-pointer to start a 12-2 W&M run, and Markham came off the bench to grab a key offensive rebound, record a steal and score a bucket that gave the College a one-point lead, 38-37, with 11:19 remaining. After Mann's trey, Nate Loehrke's layin with just over 14 minutes left cut the UNCW lead to 35-31, and Cofield brought the Tribe within two on a dunk after his own offensive rebound the next trip down the floor.

Carter extended the Seahawks' lead to 37-33 with another running jumper in the lane, before Mann answered again from long distance with his second three-pointer of the half, cutting the deficit to one. After a pair of UNCW turnovers, Markham gave the Tribe its first lead of the game since the 10:22 mark of the first half, 38-37. After a foul shot from senior Aaron Coombs and another three-pointer from Spencer, the Seahawks went back in front by three, 41-38, before a layup from Smith at the 9:42 mark cut it to one.

UNCW answered with five straight points to build a 46-40 lead with 7:08 left. Smith brought the Tribe within four on its next possession with a jumper, but after a John Goldsberry field goal and a missed three-pointer by Mann, the Seahawks controlled the ball for over two minutes with four consecutive offensive rebounds. W&M's Edwin Ofori Attah hit one of three opportunities at the line to pull W&M within 48-43 with 3:22 remaining, but the Seahawks again crashed the offensive boards, corralling three rebounds off their own misses to run the clock down to 1:46 before turning it over.

Smith added a pair of foul shots to make it 48-45 with 1:14 left, but Coombs and Carter connected on four-of-four attempts from the charity stripe in the final 1:02 to preserve the victory.

Despite cooling off considerably from the field in the second half (25%), the Seahawks pulled down 10 offensive rebounds and used a slow-down ball-control attack to hold off the Tribe. Wyrick led UNCW with a game-high 11 boards, five of which came on the offensive end.

Markham wound up with four points, four rebounds, a steal and an assist, while D'Antoni finished with six points, four boards, a pair of assists and one steal.

Virginia Commonwealth 79, William and Mary 77 (OT) Jan. 22, 2005 • Williamsburg, VA • William and Mary Hall

VCU's Nick George tied a career-high with a game-high 24 points, including a key field goal in the final minute of overtime, as the Rams pulled out a 79-77 overtime victory over William and Mary.

George, who shot 9-of-16 from the floor, hit a driving layup with 56.9 seconds remaining in the extra session to give VCU a 78-75 lead, after W&M's **Nathan Mann** had pulled the Tribe within one, 76-75, with a three-pointer with 1:22 remaining. On the Tribe's next trip down the floor, **Corey Cofield**, who registered his eighth career double-double with a team-high 22 points and 12 rebounds, was fouled after he grabbed a loose ball and sent to the line for two shots with 22.6 seconds left on the clock. Cofield, who was 10-for-12 from the stripe on the evening, sank both free throws to make it 78-77.

Forced to foul, the Tribe put VCU's Renardo Dixon on the line with 14 seconds remaining. Dixon converted one of the two attempts, extending the Rams' lead to 79-77. Needing a two to force a second overtime, **Nick D'Antoni** fed Cofield just off the right block in the waning seconds, but Cofield's fade-away as time expired caromed off the rim, giving the defending CAA champions the two-point victory.

The Rams spoiled outstanding performances from D'Antoni and Cofield, erasing a seven-point lead in the final minute and a half. D'Antoni, who poured in a season-high 16 points on 4-of-7 shooting from the field, all of which came from behind the arc, buried his fourth trey of the game with 1:29 remaining in regulation to put the Tribe ahead, 66-59. The senior guard again put W&M up by seven with a pair of free throws with 30.3 seconds remaining, pushing the advantage to 69-62.

VCU's Michael Doles, who dropped a career-high 23 points in the game, cut it to five with a layup on the Rams' next possession, and after Mann missed a pair of free throws with 19.1 seconds left, the Rams' sophomore guard B.A. Walker was fouled on a three-point attempt, resulting in three fouls shots with 12.2 seconds remaining.

Walker made the first two attempts from the line to cut the deficit to 69-66, and after a Tribe timeout, Walker missed the third try, but collected his own rebound, dribbled out and buried a three-pointer with nine seconds remaining to force the extra period tied at 69.

The Rams' late heroics overshadowed outstanding second-half efforts from **Hawley Smith** and **Brian Hutt**. Smith scored six points, including a key driving layup in the final minutes of regulation, and hauled in nine rebounds, while Hutt was a constant force on the glass off the bench, keeping several possessions alive en route to a season-high eight rebounds, one shy of his career-mark. The Tribe outrebounded VCU, 45-35, in the game.

Corey Cofield scored a game-high 19 points, including 10 in the final six minutes, as the Tribe pulled away from Towson for an 83-65 victory in Colonial Athletic Association men's basketball action Wednesday night at William and Mary Hall.

Cofield was an efficient 5-for-6 from the field on the night and shot 9-of-11 at the foul line for his 10th double-digit scoring game of the season. One of four in double-figures for the Tribe, Cofield's hot hand was just one of many offensive weapons, as W&M shot a season-high 52.1% (25-for-48) from the field.

The second half started with a bang, as Cofield beat the Tigers down the floor in transition for a dunk that extended a four-point halftime lead to 41-35. After Towson's Lawrence Hamm answered with a two-point field goal, W&M's **Laimis Kisielius** scored the Tribe's next six points to push the lead to nine, 47-38, with 16:07 remaining.

The Tigers' Mike Green, who scored a team-high 16 points, cut the deficit to five with back-to-back buckets, before consecutive three-pointers from **Nathan Mann** and **Edwin Ofori Attah** made it 53-42 with 13:39 left.

Towson cut it to five again, 57-52, behind free throws from Hamm at the 8:23 mark, but that was as close as the Tigers would get the rest of the way, as Cofield responded with another dunk and Ofori Attah drained his second trey to put the Tribe back up 10, 62-52 with 7:44 remaining.

Cofield pushed the lead to 12, 69-57, with a turnaround jumper at the 5:14 mark, and after Hamm answered with a layin, Cofield was again strong in the post with a jump-hook that made it 71-59 with 4:36 to go. Ofori Attah's reverse layup on the Tribe's next trip down the floor after a Towson score kept the lead at 12, before Cofield put an exclamation point on it with another dunk, bringing the lead to 14, 75-61, with 2:38 remaining.

Kisielius (2-for-2) and Cofield (4-for-4) drained six straight free throws that ballooned the lead to 81-63 less than a minute later, and **Hawley Smith's** put-back with five seconds remaining set the final margin at 83-65.

Ofori Attah finished with 14 points, his first double-figure scoring game since dropping 21 at James Madison on January 12, while Kisielius wound up with 14 and Mann added 10 to join Cofield in double-figures. Mann dished out a team-high six assists, and Ofori Attah pulled down five rebounds. Cofield added six boards, three assists and three steals.

Nick D'Antoni drained three three-pointers in the first half, as the Tribe shot a blistering 54.5% (12-for-22) from the floor, including 6-for-12 from behind the arc in the opening 20 minutes to take a 39-35 advantage at the break. **Brian Hutt** also had a strong first half, as he came off the bench to collect four points, three rebounds and two assists.

A jumper by Mokris to start the second cut the Pride's lead to four points, but Hofstra used a 9-0 run to pull back ahead by 13 on a Wendell Gibson layup with 15:09 remaining. W&M never came within 11 points the rest of the way, as the Pride led by as many as 27 at one point, eventually winning the contest by 21, 72-51.

After Kisielius's 14 points, freshman guard **Nathan Mann** was second on the team with seven points. Agudio led three Hofstra players in double figures with 21 points, while Loren Stokes had 20 and Gibson added 15. W&M shot 40.4 percent from the floor in the game, including a 44.4 percent effort from the three-point line. Hofstra knocked down 44.9 percent of its shots for the game, including a hot performance in the second half, when the Pride shot .571 from the field and .625 (5-8) from the three-point line.

Drexel's Sean Brooks came off the bench to score a game-high 18 points and pull down 11 rebounds, and the Dragons held off a late William and Mary charge to defeat the Tribe, 60-48 at William and Mary Hall.

Brooks was a dominant force in the paint for the Dragons, shooting 6-of-10 from the floor and 6-of-10 from the foul line. Dominick Mejia added 14 points behind a 5-for-5 FG shooting performance, including 4-of-4 from behind the arc, and Phil Goss chipped in with 11 to give Drexel three in double-figures.

Both teams came out of the gate slow, combining for just two field goals in the first 10 minutes of the game. A layup from Brooks at the 9:04 mark of the first half gave Drexel an 8-4 advantage, before **Corey Cofield** recorded the Tribe's second field goal of the game with 8:51 remaining in the opening period. After starting 1-of-10 from the field, Drexel went on to hit 10 of its next 15 attempts from the floor to take a 26-12 lead at the break.

After shooting just 22.7% (5-for-22) from the field in the first half, W&M picked up the pace in the second half and got back in the game behind the play of **Nate Loehrke** and **Laimis Kisielius**. Back-to-back jumpers from Loehrke cut the deficit to 10, 30-20, with 14:25 remaining, and after Brooks answered with a stick-back layin, Kisielius responded with his first field goal of the game to make it 32-22 with 13:17 to go.

Consecutive three-pointers from Mejia and Goss, however, pushed the Dragons' lead back to 16, before Loehrke tapped in his own miss and **Nathan Mann** stripped the ball at midcourt on Drexel's next possession and drove in for a layup, trimming the deficit to 38-26 with 11:26 left on the clock.

Cofield brought the Tribe within 12 again with just under seven minutes remaining with back-to-back buckets, including a fast-break dunk at the 6:48 mark that made it 45-33. A Brooks free throw and a put-back from Kenell Sanchez extended the lead back to 15, before Kisielius began to heat up for the Tribe.

After W&M started the night 0-for-10 from behind the arc, Kisielius drained three-pointers on consecutive trips down the floor for the Tribe, sandwiched around another Brooks' layup, to make it 50-41 with 3:49 remaining. Brooks pushed the lead back to 11 with a pair of free throws at the 3:25 mark, but Mann answered with the College's third straight trey to pull within eight, 52-44, at the 3:06 mark.

On the Dragons' next trip down the floor, the Tribe forced a shot-clock violation, giving W&M the ball down by eight with just under 2:30 to go, but a turnover gave it back to Drexel. After another solid defensive effort from the Tribe, Goss drilled a long two-point field goal off a high screen to make it 54-44, and after a Kisielius miss on W&M's next touch, the Dragons went on to hit four straight free throws to effectively put it out of reach, 58-44 with 50.4 seconds remaining.

Kisielius added another jumper with 30 seconds left and wound up with a team-high 12 points, all of which came in the second half, and Cofield finished the night with 10 points and seven rebounds. Loehrke corralled seven rebounds to go along with his six points, while Mann finished with nine points, five assists and two steals.

William and Mary freshman forward **Laimis Kisielius** led all scorers with a career-high 23 points and Tribe sophomore forward **Corey Cofield** recorded his ninth career double-double with 21 points and a game-high 12 rebounds, in the College's 80-72 men's basketball loss to UNC Wilmington at Trask Coliseum Wednesday night.

A layup by Cofield less than four minutes into the game put the Tribe ahead, 6-5, but UNCW ran off six straight points to lead, 12-6, with 11:36 remaining. However, the Seahawks responded with five straight points, eventually leading by as many as 12 points, on their way to the 80-72 victory.

Kisielius scored his game-high 23 points on 7-15 shooting, while also dishing out five assists and collecting three rebounds. Cofield was 7-12 from the field and 7-8 from the free throw line on his way to scoring 21 points, and tied a season-high with his 12 rebounds. Junior center **Nate Loehrke** came off the bench for nine points on 4-4 shooting and also had five rebounds. Mitch Laue came off the bench to lead the Seahawks with 20 points, while Wyrick had 17 points and Halston Lane added 14. John Goldsberry had eight points and 11 assists for UNCW. W&M outrebounded UNCW 37-22 in the game, but allowed the Seahawks to shoot .563 in the game, including 16-24 (.667) in the second half.

George Mason scored nine straight points to erase a four-point deficit in the second overtime period and hand William and Mary a heart-breaking, 104-99, loss in double-overtime at William and Mary Hall.

In the second overtime, W&M scored the first four points on consecutive field goals from **Corey Cofield** and **Nathan Mann**, who scored a career-high 25 points, to open a 97-93 advantage with 3:42 remaining. The Patriots, however, responded with a pair of free throws from senior guard Tony Skinn that started a 9-0 run and held the depleted and drained Tribe squad scoreless for over three minutes to take control.

After Skinn's free throws, junior Lamar Butler drilled his sixth three-pointer of the game on the Patriots' next trip down the floor to give Mason a one-point lead, 98-97, with 1:55 left on the clock, before consecutive layups from freshman John Vaughan pushed the lead to 102-97 with just over 30 seconds remaining. After Vaughan missed two foul shots, W&M's **Nick D'Antoni**, who matched Mann for game-high honors with 25 points, drove the length of the floor for a layup to cut the deficit to three, 102-99, but Skinn sealed the victory and set the final margin with a pair of free throws with 14.7 seconds left.

Cofield sent the Tribe into its first double-overtime game since the 2001-02 season, an 88-83 victory over VCU on January 18, with an offensive rebound and turn-around jumper with one second left in the first overtime that knotted the score at 93-93. Mason junior Jai Lewis nearly powered the Patriots to victory in the first extra session with six of his 19 points, including back-to-back field goals that gave Mason a 92-89 lead with 25.4 seconds remaining. D'Antoni answered with a crucial field goal with 19.7 seconds left to cut it to one, and after Patriots' sophomore Gabe Norwood missed one of two free throws, the door was open for Cofield's heroics. Trailing 93-91, **Reid Markham** drove the lane and missed a running jumper, but Cofield collected the board and buried the putback to keep the Tribe alive.

Markham and Mann each answered the call in the first extra session with six and five points, respectively. Mann, who wound up 10-of-19 from the floor, 5-of-11 from three-point range, single-handedly erased a five-point Mason lead with the Tribe's first six points of overtime on consecutive three-pointers. The Patriots went back up by one, 85-84, on a runner from Skinn, before Markham sliced his way through the paint for a jumper and three-point play to put the Tribe back on top, 87-85, with exactly two minutes to go. Skinn responded with a three-point play of his own, but Markham again got to the line and sank a pair to give W&M an 89-88 lead with 1:33 remaining, before Lewis' two field goals.

The loss spoiled the outstanding play of D'Antoni, who scored 14 of his 25 in the second half, and Mann, who played the final four minutes of regulation and both overtimes with four fouls. D'Antoni shot 10-of-21 from the field, including 5-of-10 from behind the arc, and added four assists. Mann scored 13 in the opening half and matched his previous career-high of 15 in the first minute of the second half. He too added four assists.

Cofield wound up with 19 points to give W&M three in double-figures and pulled down nine rebounds before fouling out in the second overtime. **Hawley Smith** just missed a double-double with eight points and a career-high 11 rebounds before also fouling out. Markham finished the afternoon with eight points and five rebounds.

William and Mary 80, James Madison 54 Feb. 16, 2005 • Williamsburg, VA • William and Mary Hall

Corey Cofield led all scorers with 24 points and pulled down eight rebounds to lead William and Mary to an 80-54 victory over James Madison in Colonial Athletic Association men's basketball action at William and Mary Hall.

Cofield scored 15 of his game-high 24 in the second half, as the Tribe shot 52.2% (12 for 23) from the field and an impressive 20-24 (.833) from the foul line in the final period, combined with a suffocating man-to-man defense that limited the Dukes to 34.8% (8 for 23) field goal shooting in the final 20 minutes.

W&M quickly extended a seven-point halftime lead to 15 in the first five minutes of the second half on a three-point play by Cofield that made it 49-34 with 15:04 remaining. After a pair of Cofield free throws, a jumper from **Brian Hutt** and two more foul shots from **Laimis Kisielius** at the 13:07 mark, the lead quickly swelled to 21, 55-34, behind a 9-0 Tribe run.

Kisielius, the only other Tribe player in double-figures with 12, extended the lead to 23, 63-40, with four consecutive free throws, including two on a technical foul assessed on JMU head coach Dean Keener at the 8:42 mark.

JMU cut the lead to 18 behind two free throws from sophomore center Chris Cathlin and a three-pointer from sophomore guard Ray Barbosa, who paced the Dukes with 19 points, but a layin from **Hawley Smith**, two free throws from Cofield and a layup from **Nick D'Antoni** pushed the lead to 24, 72-48, with 4:31 left on the clock, effectively putting it out of reach.

Cofield finished the night shooting 7 of 9 from the field and 10 of 11 from the charity stripe, as W&M shot 29-35 (.829) from the line in the game. Kisielius scored eight of his 12 points at the line on 8-11 shooting, and Smith (3-3), **Nathan Mann** (3-3), **Reid Markham** (2-2) and **Adam Trumbower** (2-2) were all perfect from the foul line.

Smith tied Cofield for team-high honors with eight rebounds and wound up with nine points, three steals and two assists, while Kisielius hauled in six boards for the Tribe, which held a 39-26 advantage on the glass, including a 15-8 margin on the offensive end.

Nate Loehrke played a key role in the second-half surge, coming off the bench to score six points and grab five rebounds. Ray Barbosa led JMU with 19 points, followed by David Cooper, Cavell Johnson and Jomo Belfor with seven points each.

Old Dominion 82, William and Mary 66

Old Dominion's Isaiah Hunter led five Monarchs in double-figures with 19 points, as ODU held off William and Mary, 82-66, at William and Mary Hall to clinch the Colonial Athletic Association regular season men's basketball title.

The Monarchs survived a strong second-half effort from the Tribe and an outstanding individual performance from **Nate Loehrke**, who led all scorers with a career-high 21 points, in just 25 minutes off the bench. With the victory, ODU improves to 14-2 in the conference, 24-4 overall. W&M falls to 2-14 in the league, 6-19 overall.

Loehrke came off the bench in the first half and almost single-handedly kept the game close, shooting 6 for 6 from the field, while the rest of the Tribe managed just a 7 for 29 effort from the floor, including missing all five attempts from behind the arc. Despite Loehrke's early success, ODU took a 44-27 lead into the break, behind a sizzling 51.7% field goal shooting performance in the opening frame.

Loehrke continued to shine in the second half, hitting three of his first four attempts from the floor, including a putback of his first miss that made it 49-33 with 17:18 to go. ODU kept the pressure on though, as Hunter and Valdas Vasylius combined to score 16 of the Monarchs' first 18 points of the period and give ODU its biggest lead of the game, 63-40, at the 11:21 mark. W&M, however, began to heat up and responded with an 8-0 run to get back in it.

Laimis Kisielius, who chipped in with 16 points on the night, buried his first three-pointer to start the run, before **Corey Cofield** countered with a three-point play on the Tribe's next trip down the floor. After a Cofield steal, **Nick D'Antoni**'s layup cut the deficit to 63-48 with 9:41 remaining. Playing in his final game at William and Mary Hall, D'Antoni joined Loehrke and Kisielius in double-figures with 10 points.

ODU's Alex Loughton, who registered a double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds, stopped the Tribe spurt with a three-point play on the Monarchs' next series, putting ODU back in front by 18, 66-48. W&M's **Hawley Smith** drilled his lone three-point attempt on the Tribe's next touch to cut it back to 15, and after one free throw from Kisielius and a pair from Cofield, the ODU lead was down to 12, 66-54, with 6:08 left on the clock.

Hunter, who shot 4 of 7 from long-range, knocked down another trey to put ODU back up by 15, but a Kisielius jumper and free throw had the Tribe within 12 again, 69-57, at the 5:15 mark. That was as close as the College would get the rest of the way, however, as Drew Williamson, Kiah Thomas and Vasylius each hit key buckets down the stretch for the Monarchs to fend off W&M. Williamson and Thomas finished with 12 and 10 points, respectively.

The contest also marked the final home game in the career of senior **Reid Markham**, who finished with three points, three rebounds and a steal.

Loehrke finished the night 9-13 from the field and 3-5 at the line to surpass his previous career-high of 16 points, set earlier this season on January 2 at North Carolina. Smith hauled in a team-high nine rebounds, while Cofield narrowly missed a double-double with nine points and eight boards.
