William and Mary Takes on Richmond For the First Time Since February of 2001

William and Mary's men's basketball team will travel to face Richmond in the first meeting between the two teams since February 3, 2001 ... The Tribe enters the game with a record of 5-5, coming off a 74-64 loss at Virginia Tech on Tuesday ... The Spiders are 5-6 this season and also lost on Tuesday, falling at Tulane, 64-41 ... This is the final non-conference game of the regular season for the Green and Gold.

Storylines

Saturday's game will be the 192nd meeting between William and Mary and Richmond ... Each school is the other's most often played opponent ... The Spiders lead the close series, 96-95 ... This will be the first time the two teams have faced each other since UR left the Colonial Athletic Association after the 2000-01 season ... The teams split their two meetings that year, with each winning on the other's home court ... The Green and Gold defeated the Spiders, 60-57, in Richmond on Jan. 20, before UR beat W&M, 57-49, in Williamsburg on Feb. 3 ... Beginning with a 32-26 W&M win in their first meeting in the 1913-14 season (Richmond's first season of basketball), the two schools had played each other in 89 consecutive seasons ... This will be the first time since the 1944-45 campaign that the two schools have met only once in a season ... Richmond is 61-35 at home against W&M, including a 20-10 mark against the Tribe in the Robins Center.

W&M is led in scoring by freshman point guard **Calvin Baker** with 14.8 points per game, sixth-best in the CAA and first among the league's freshmen ... Baker was named the CAA Rookie of the Week for the third time on Tuesday and is the only player in the league to earn the honor more than once this season ... Through Thursday, he is also ranked among the top 15 in the league in free throw percentage (.745) and assists (3.00), steals (1.70), three-point field goals (1.90) and minutes (31.50) per game ... Junior forward **Corey Cofield** is second on the team with 11.5 points per game and has a team-best 5.3 rebounds per game ... His .597 field goal percentage is fourth in the CAA ... Junior guard **Adam Payton** is averaging 10.5 ppg, coming off a career-high 20-point performance at Virginia Tech ... He is shooting 61.0 percent (36-59) from the field, four made field goals short of qualifying for a spot among the league's leaders.

Baker Named CAA Rookie of the Week for Third Time

Freshman guard **Calvin Baker** was named the CAA's Rookie of the Week for the third time this season on Tuesday, after also earning the award on Nov. 21 and Nov. 28) ... He earned the honor after scoring 19 points, including 16 in the second half, also adding four rebounds, three assists and three steals in W&M's win over UNC Greensboro (12/21) ... He leads the Tribe and is sixth in the league (and first among CAA freshmen) with 14.8 ppg ... Baker also leads W&M with 3.0 assists per game ... He has scored in double figures eight times this season, including five games of more than 15 points ... Baker was voted to the W&M Tip-Off Classic all-tournament team to start the season ... At Woodside (Newport News, VA) High School, he was named the Virginia Group AAA Player of the Year by the Virginia HS Coaches Association and was picked as the state's co-player of the year by the Associated Press ... A two-time *Daily Press* Player of the Year, he led Woodside to state championships in 2004 and 2005 and was the MVP of the state's East-West All-Star game in July of 2005.

Cofield Starting Strong Again

Junior forward **Corey Cofield** appears to be picking up where he left off last sea-

son as one of the top players in the CAA ... The Tribe's leading scorer (13.2 ppg) and rebounder (6.9 rpg) last season, Cofield is second on the team with 11.5 ppg and leads the team with 5.3 rpg ... For the second straight game, Cofield came off the bench for 14 points and six rebounds at Virginia Tech (12/27) ... He ranks fourth in the CAA with a .597 field goal percentage and ranks sixth all-time at W&M in that category with a .563 mark in his career ... The 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, Cofield just missed his 12th career double-double in the season opener vs. Maine (11/19), with 19 points and nine rebounds in just 23 minutes.

Alums Adam Hess and Jim Moran Nominated for FIBA Eurocup All-Star Game

Former Tribe basketball players **Adam Hess** (2004) and **Jim Moran** (2001) have each been nominated for selection to the FIBA EuroCup All-Star Game ... In EuroCup play, which involves the top professional teams throughout Europe, Hess is averaging 15.3 ppg and a team-best 8.4 rpg for Nymburk of the Czech Republic, while Moran is averaging a team-best 12.2 ppg for Gran Canaria of Spain ... In league play, Hess is fifth in the Czech Republic's NBL with 18.8 ppg and his team has a 12-0 record ... Individuals can vote online for the

Mann on Fire

Sophomore guard **Nathan Mann** has been heating up lately, scoring 19 points in back-to-back games against UMBC (12/17) and UNC Greensboro (12/21) ... He shot an impressive 13-20 (.650) from the field and a torrid 10-15 (.667) from behind the three-point line in those two games ... At UMBC, he was 7-11 from the field and 5-8 from beyond the arc ... That helped earn him his first start of the year in the win over UNCG, where he improved on those numbers, with 6-of-9 shooting overall, including a 5-of-7 mark from long-range ... This season, Mann is connecting on 42.5 percent of his three-point attempts (17-40).

Hutt Doing the Dirty Work

Although scoring just 3.8 points per game, senior **Brian Hutt** has been a valuable force inside, averaging 4.3 rebounds and a team-high 0.9 blocks, despite playing 15.5 minutes per game ... In the Tribe's win over UNC Greensboro (12/21), the 6-9 center made his sixth start of the year, pulling down a game and career-high 11 rebounds, adding five points, two assists and a blocked shot ... In the game before that (at UMBC, 12/17) he had eight rebounds, six points, four assists and a block ... Connecting on 13 of his 25 field goal attempts (.520), he also has 11 assists against just four turnovers.

W&M's Basketball Gymnasium Named Kaplan Arena

On Nov. 17, W&M's basketball gymnasium was officially named Kaplan Arena, in honor of the longtime support of W&M graduates **Jim and Jane Kaplan** ... W&M Opens CAA Play Early

W&M's conference opener against UNC Wilmington (11/30) was the Tribe's earliest game against a CAA opponent in school history ... Solid Start

W&M's 4-1 start to the season was the best for the team since opening the 1992-93 campaign with a 6-1 record ... That season, however, two of the team's first four wins were against non-Division I teams Virginia Wesleyan and Shenandoah ... This is the first time in W&M history that the Tribe has opened a year with at least four wins in its first five games against current countable Division I opponents.

Front Runners

In its five wins this season, the Tribe has had to play from behind for a total of just nine minutes and 50 seconds ... W&M led or was tied for the entire 40 minutes vs. Maine and Campbell ... At Hampton, the Pirates took a 3-0 lead at 19:28, but the Tribe scored eight unanswered points, taking a 4-3 lead at 18:48 ... At Longwood, the Lancers went ahead, 3-0, at 19:29 and it took the Tribe nearly four minutes before taking the lead for good, 10-9, at 16:03 ... W&M trailed for all of 5:21 in the 83-73 win over UNC Greensboro.

Transferring Talent

W&M has two Division I transfers on its roster this season in senior forward **Hawley Smith** (Temple) and junior guard **Adam Payton** (Vanderbilt) ... Smith started nearly every game last season, but has seen limited action this year due to an ankle injury suffered a week before the season-opener ... Payton sat out last season, per NCAA transfer rules, but has started every game this year ... He scored a career-high 20 points 7-for-9 shooting at Virginia Tech (12/27) ... He also scored 19 points at Longwood (11/28) and had 18 points and seven rebounds in W&M's win at Hampton (11/22) ... The Tribe has had at least one transfer on its active roster every year but one since 1995-96 ... Each of the seven transfers since then were significant contributors with starting experience.

W&M Signs Four Early

W&M head coach Tony Shaver and his staff completed their recruiting for next season's class with the signing of four individuals on the first day of the early signing period (Nov. 9). The four future Tribe players are 6-10 forward **Steven Hess**, 6-2 guard **Matt McFadden**, 6-3 guard **David Schneider** and 6-7 forward **Danny Sumner**.

Steven Hess, 6-10, F, Gastonia, NC (Gaston Day School)

Hess averaged 16 points and nine rebounds for Gaston Day School last season, helping his team reach the semifinals of the state tournament in North Carolina's largest independent-school classification. He is a McDonald's All-American nominee and was an All-Southern Piedmont Athletic Association selection.

Matt McFadden, 6-2, G, Medford, NJ (Shawnee High School)

McFadden averaged 13 points, five assists, four rebounds and 2.5 steals per game last season at Shawnee High School. A three-time team captain, he was an All-Olympic Conference selection last year, helping his team to a 25-2 record, as Shawnee HS won the South Jersey Group 4 championship and advanced to the semifinals of the state tournament.

David Schneider, 6-3, G, Phoenix, AZ (Brophy Prep)

Schneider averaged 18.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 6.1 assists per game last season at Brophy Prep and was a first team all-region and honorable mention all-state selection. His father, Jeff, played basketball at Virginia Tech, ending his college career in 1982 with 276 assists, ninth-most in school history, before being selected in the fifth round of the 1982 NBA Draft by the Houston Rockets.

Danny Sumner, 6-7, F, Fairfax, VA (Paul VI)

Sumner averaged 14 points and 10 rebounds a game for Paul VI High School last season, as his team reached the Virginia Independent Schools Division I state final for the second straight year. Sumner was named to the 2005 Virginia Independent All-Tournament team and was an honorable mention Washington Post All-Metropolitan selection. He will be the Tribe's first men's basketball player from Paul VI since **David Cully**, who graduated from W&M in 1996 as the College's all-time blocked shots leader (248) and fifth-leading rebounder (783).

• Four of the eight Maine players that played against the Tribe in the season opener, including one starter, did not score a point in the game.

• W&M held Holy Cross scoreless for six minutes and two seconds of the second half (from 15:49 through 9:47) and didn't allow the Crusaders to make a field goal for eight minutes and 50 seconds in that period (15:49 through 6:59).

• The Tribe didn't allow Maine to score a point until the 16:35 mark of the first half.

• Four current players (seniors **Brian Hutt** and **Nate Loehrke**, junior **Corey Cofield** and freshman **Alex Smith**) have combined to take 909 shots from the field in their college careers, but none of them have attempted a single three-pointer.

• At Hampton, junior guard **Adam Payton** started and played 30 minutes, making three steals, without committing a single foul.

• At Towson (12/3), W&M had stretches of 9:04, 5:49 and 5:04 without a field goal.

New Schedule Format for CAA

With the addition of Georgia State and Northeastern to the CAA, the league will have an all-time high of 12 member institutions ... As a result, for the first time in conference history, the CAA will play an unbalanced schedule ... Each school has a set group of five opponents that it will play both at home and away each season ... The remaining six opponents are grouped into three pairs that rotate through the schedule every two years ... Each season a team will face two of those opponents both home and away, while playing the other four foes just once ... Using this rotation, each team in the CAA will host every league member at least four times in the six-year rotation ... W&M's annual home-and-home opponents are Drexel, James Madison, UNC Wilmington, Old Dominion and Virginia Commonwealth ... This season and next, the Tribe will also play two games against George Mason and Georgia State ... This year, W&M will host single games against Delaware and Hofstra, while playing Northeastern and Towson on the road.

Freshman forward **Chris Darnell** turned 19 years old when the Tribe played at Towson (12/3) ... Head coach **Tony Shaver** will be 52 years old on Jan. 28, when W&M hosts James Madison ... Senior forward **Hawley Smith** will be 23 years old on March 4, the second day of the CAA Tournament.

Best Things in Life are Free (Throws)

W&M led the CAA and was 53rd in the nation with a .725 free throw percentage last

season, the 10th best mark in school history ... Three players made more than 75 percent of their shots from the line, led by **Corey Cofield**, who was fourth in the CAA with a .804 FT%, leading the league in free throws made (144) and attempted (179) ... **Laimis Kisielius** (.767) and **Hawley Smith** (.752) each also made over 75 percent of their foul shots ... As a team, W&M was at least .750 from the line 11 times, including three games over 90 percent.

Facility Upgrades

During the summer, W&M Hall underwent a major renovation project with the installation of a new hardwood floor ... The \$750,000 project included a wall-to-wall, 16,900 square foot permanent wood floor, large enough for two full basketball courts when the arena's bleachers are retracted ... The floor was manufactured by Connor Sports Flooring Corporation and was installed by Recreation Plus of Hopewell, Virginia.

Back-to-Back Games

This is the third straight season and the fourth time in the last five years that the Tribe has opened the season with games on consecutive days ... Last season, W&M started the season by hosting the first Tip-Off Classic, winning both games ... Head Coach Tony Shaver

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his third season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program. Officially hired on May 2, 2003, Shaver is the 31st men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

The Green and Gold continued to make strides in Shaver's second season leading the Tribe. W&M immediately started the season on a high note, defeating Radford and Hartford to win the inaugural W&M Tip-Off Classic, the first regular season tournament title for the College since 1981. The Tribe defeated James Madison in the first round of the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament for W&M's first postseason win since 1997, and just the third in the last 20 years.

Shaver began his Tribe career with a 91-64 pounding of Liberty on Nov. 23, 2003. He also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime on Dec. 4, 2003. In his first contest against a nationally ranked opponent, W&M also performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There have been individual successes as well for the Green and Gold under Shaver's reign. 2004 graduate Adam Hess, currently playing professionally in Europe, became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a first team Academic All-America and all-conference selection as a senior. Current junior Corey Cofield was voted the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Cofield earned his second straight selection to the All-CAA third team in 2005, while current sophomore Laimis Kisielius earned a spot on the CAA All-Rookie team last season.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Ti-

gers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball

team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (24), a former standout pitcher on the Tribe's baseball team, who is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization, Austin (21) and Jackson (14).
