The pre-Thanksgiving affair is slated for a 7 p.m. tip at Kaplan Arena in William and Mary Hall. The Tribe will return to the court for the first time in nine days after the earliest regular-season opener in school history on Nov. 11.

W&M suffered a tough 70-60 loss at Kansas State in the season opener. The Tribe led the Wildcats by 11 points midway through the first half, but could not hold on. Wagner opened the season with two losses, before tallying its first win at Maryland-Eastern Shore on Nov. 18.

The game can be heard live over the Tribe Radio Network with Jay Colley, Bill McDonald and Charlie Woollum on the call. The game also can be followed live over the Internet at Tribe Athletics.com.

STORY LINES

SCOUTING WAGNER

The Seahawks opened the season with back-to-back losses to Lafayette, 76-70, and Manhattan, 63-60, before tallying its first win of the year at Maryland-Eastern Shore or Nov. 18. Wagner shot 50 percent from the field in notching the victory over Maryland-Eastern Shore.

After trailing by as many as 19 in the first half, Wagner battled back to take a one-point lead, 53-52, lead over Lafayette midway through the second-half at home on Nov. 10. In its earliest season-opener in school history, the Seahawks saw the Leopards go on a 10-1 run to erase the slim margin. Lafayette put the contest away with a 12-2 run for a 76-70 victory.

Joey Mundweiler equaled the Wagner school record with seven 3-point field goals, leading all scorers with 22 points against Lafayette. Guard Mark Porter chipped in 16 points and six assists in the loss as well.

Against Manhattan, Wagner fell in a tight contest that included nine ties and nine lead changes. Manhattan used a 14-2 run in the later stages of the second half to tally a 63-60 victory. Forward Jamal Smith lead the Seahawks with 19 points, while Mundweiler and Porter each at 10 points in the defeat.

Porter led four double-digit Seahawk scorers in the win over UMES with 21 points. He narrowly missed a double-double chipping in nine rebounds and six assists. James Ulrich notched 18 points and 14 rebounds. Mundweiler and Smith each tallied 14 in the win, while Justin Drummond rounded out the double-digit scorers with 10. The Wagner lead reached as many as 14 in the second half on the way to a six-point, 82-76, victory.

Last season, Wagner finished the year at 13-14 overall and 6-12 in the Northeast Conference. Despite the losing mark, the Seahawks did take national runner-up UCLA to the brink during the non-conference slate, falling 74-72 in Westwood.

RECAPPING KANSAS STATE

The Tribe battled with the Kansas State Wildcats, but dropped its season-opener, 70-60, at Bramlage Coliseum on Nov. 11. The Tribe led by double-digits midway through the first half, but the Wildcats crashed the boards, pulling in 32 offensive rebounds and scoring 28 second-chance points to pull out the victory. W&M knocked down eight 3-point field goals, while holding KSU to 30 percent shooting from the field.

Freshman David Schneider led the Tribe with an impressive stat line during his debut. The Phoenix, Ariz., native scored 18 points and led the team with nine rebounds, seven assists and four steals. Junior Laimis Kisielius notched 16 points on 5-of-7 from the field, including a 3-of-3 mark from beyond the arc.

After Kansas State opened the game with a pair of offensive putbacks, the Tribe opened up its largest lead of the contest with an 18-3 run. Schneider connected on a trey from the right wing, before a driving 3-point play by senior guard Adam Payton gave the Tribe its first lead of the contest at 6-4 with 17:42 remaining. Junior guard Nathan Mann and Kisielius hit back-to-back 3-pointers to extend the cushion to 18-7 with nine minutes remaining in the opening half.

The Wildcats turned the tides with a steal and fast-break dunk from Lance Harris at the 10:10 mark. The bucket started a 14-point spurt as KSU regained a 21-18 lead. David Hoskins connected on a trey, before Akeem Wright tipped in a miss on the offensive end to cap the Wildcat run.

After KSU took a 34-27 lead into the locker room, Kisielius opened the second half with a trey from the left wing off the dish from Schneider to bring the Tribe to within four. KSU scored six straight points, capped by a Harris steal and jumper to take its first double-digit lead of the contest, 40-30, with 14:48 remaining.

Five straight Tribe points drew W&M back within six points at 53-47 with 5:45 remaining in the second half. Schneider scored three points on the run with a free throw before hitting a jumper, but it was as close as the Tribe would get.

SCHNEIDER NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Freshman guard David Schneider garnered the Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week award, the conference office announced on Nov. 13. Schneider turned an impressive performance in his first game with the Tribe, topping the team in points, assists, rebounds, steals and minutes played in a 70-60 loss at Kansas State on Nov. 11.

In a game-high 38 minutes of action, Schneider scored 18 points, pulled down nine rebounds and dished out seven assists. He connected on a trio of 3-point field goals and had four steals in his collegiate debut against the Wildcats.





Schneider sparked an 18-3 run to give W&M an 11-point cushion with 11:13 remaining in the first half. The Phoenix, Ariz., native connected a 3-pointer to get the run started. He also had a steal and fast-break lay-up during the spurt, before finding juniors Nathan Mann and Laimis Kisielius for back-to-back treys to cap the run.

COFIELD SELECTED TO FANS' CHOICE PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM

Senior forward Corey Cofield was voted to the inaugural fan-selected preseason All-CAA men's basketball team on Nov. 9. Cofield was one of five men's players selected by the fans with nearly 3,000 ballots cast at CAASports.com. VCU senior guard B.A. Walker, Hofstra senior guard Loren Stokes, Georgia State sophomore forward Rashad Chase and VCU senior guard Jesse Pellot-Rosa joined Cofield on the fans selected team, released by the conference office.

Cofield, a two-time Third-Team All-CAA selection, is one of 14 W&M players with over 1,000 points and 500 rebounds during his Tribe career. The Newton, Mass., native is the Tribe's top returning scorer (10.3 ppg) and rebounder (4.7 rpg). During his W&M career, Cofield has averaged 12.1 points and 6.1 rebounds per game.

The 6-5, 245-pounder sits in sixth on the career field-goal percent list, hitting at a clip of .530 (357-of-674). Cofield ranks 25th on the Tribe's career scoring list with 1,039 points entering the 2006-07 campaign.

HOME OPENERS AT KAPLAN ARENA

Since William and Mary Hall was completed in 1970, the Tribe has amassed a 26-10 mark in home openers. W&M has won six of its last seven home openers, and is a perfect 3-0 under head coach Tony Shaver. Those three victories opening victories at home have come by an average of 24 points per game.

W&M is 3-1 on Nov. 20. The first time W&M played on the date was in 1999 when it opened with a 92-39 win over Washington College. The following season, W&M beat Virginia Tech, 48-46, in Blacksburg. On Nov. 20, 2001, the Tribe fell at High Point, 63-57.

The last time W&M played on Nov. 20 was during the first W&M Tip-Off Classic. The College defeated Radford, 81-76, to claim the title. Corey Cofield turned in a double-double with 24 points and 10 rebounds to garner the Classic MVP honors. Nathan Mann had 14 points and five assists, while Laimis Kisielius chipped in 11 points.

HIGH PERCENTAGE SHOOTING

Through the Tribe's exhibition and first regular season affair of the season, junior forward Laimis Kisielius has been shooting the ball exceptionally well from the floor. Against Barton, he hit on 6-of-8 from the field, including 1-of-2 from 3-point range, to finish with 17 points. He continued his torrid shooting in the regular-season opener, knocking down 5-of-7 from the field. The Vilnius, Lithuania native connected on all three of his attempts from beyond the arc, finishing with 16 points. Over the two game span, Kisielius is shooting 73.3 percent from the floor and 80 percent from downtown.

TONY SHAVER - A HALL OF FAMER

In each of his previous two stops before taking over the Tribe program, head coach Tony Shaver has enjoyed great success and been inducted into the Hall of Fame at each school. In 2004, Shaver was inducted into the Hampden-Sydney College Hall of Fame after coaching the Tiger program to eight ODAC Championships, 11 NCAA Tournament appearances and two Final Fours. He had 358 career victories and a .747 winning percentage at Hampden-Sydney. On Nov. 11, 2005, Shaver was inducted into the Episcopal High School (Alexandria, Va.) Hall of Fame. He coached at the school for 10 seasons (1977-86), winning 73 percent of his games and two IAC championships. After the 1986 season, he was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year and his team was ranked first in Northern Virginia by the Alexandria Gazette.

STARTING OFF EARLY

The Tribe's season-opener against Kansas State on Nov. 11 in Manhattan, Kan., was the earliest start to a season for W&M. The earliest start to a season prior to 2006-07 was Nov. 14, 1998 when the Tribe fell at Virginia Tech, 59-50.

EXPERIENCE ON BOARD

The Tribe returns perhaps head coach Tony Shaver's most experienced group during his time at the helm. In total, nine of the Tribe's 10 returning players have started at least one game during their W&M careers. Combine that with the fact that seven of the 10 returnees averaged nearly 10 minutes a game last season, and the Tribe will have depth and experience on its side in 2006-07.

TRIBE ON TELEVISION

The Tribe men's basketball program will have four home televised games as part of the largest broadcast schedule in Colonial Athletic Association history. Coming off the best season in the 22-year history of the CAA, the league will have a total of 75 games broadcasted on television, including 28 on the various ESPN platforms. As part of new multi-platform agreement with ESPN, the CAA will have three regular season contests as well as the CAA Championship on ESPN or ESPN2, six games on ESPNU and five games syndicated on ESPN Regional. The league will have its largest Comcast syndicated package featuring 30-plus games on Comcast SportsNets, SportsNet New York, CSS and CN8. The CAA entered last season listing a then record-high package of 39 men's games on television.

The Tribe will have home games against Towson (Dec. 5), Northeastern (Jan. 6), George Mason (Jan. 16) and UNC Wilmington (Feb. 3) televised. The Dec. 5 game against Towson was moved back an hour to 8 p.m. and can be see on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic and Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia. The Northeastern affair on Jan. 6 is now slated for a noon tip and will also be on the Comcast family of networks on CN8.

The College's home game with George Mason was originally scheduled for Jan. 17, but has been moved up to Tuesday, Jan. 16. The game will be part of the CAA's ESPN Platform agree and will be televised on ESPN Regional Television at 7 p.m.W&M will host its final television game of the season when UNC Wilmington heads to Williamsburg on Feb. 3. Tip-off is slated for 7 p.m. and the game will be televised on UNCW-TV.

CAA Success

The Colonial Athletic Association enjoyed a banner season in 2005-06. The following are a list of CAA accomplishments from the 2005-06 season:

- the only conference to have a team in the Final Four of the NCAA Tournament (George Mason), the post-season NIT (Old Dominion) and the pre-season NIT (Drexel).
- finished a conference-high eighth in the Final RPI rankings behind the SEC, Big Ten, Big East, ACC, Big 12, Missouri Valley and Pac-10.
- had six teams ranked among the top-88 in the Final RPI rankings.
- the only conference in America to produce four programs with 24 or more victories.
- had the second-best non-conference post-season winning percentage at .727 (8-3) behind the SEC's .750 (18-6).





- CAA teams combined to win nearly 60 percent (76-52) of their non-conference games, an impressive number considering that 60 percent of those contests came on the road or at neutral sites.

TRIBE IN 2007 ESPN BRACKETBUSTERS

All 12 CAA teams, including the Tribe, will take part in the 2007 ESPN BracketBusters, Feb. 16-17. A total of 102 teams from 16 conferences will take part in the fifth-year event. The two-day, 51-game BracketBusters will have five games televised on the ESPN networks.

The Tribe will be on the road for the event, having already been designated as an away squad. The actual pairings will not take place until three weeks prior to the event (Monday, Jan. 29) and are based on regular-season performance. As part of the agreement, all home squads will play a "return" game at their opponent's facility next season.

Eight CAA teams participated in BracketBusters last year and the league posted a sparkling 6-2 record. The conference gained national attention by winning all three of its nationally-televised contests as VCU edged Albany, 70-67, Old Dominion rolled past Marist, 84-71 and Ge

orge Mason shocked Wichita State, 70-67, in one of the premier match-ups in the event. The CAA is a perfect 4-0 in televised BracketBusters games with Drexel having posted a 74-70 win at Ball State in 2005.

GETTING OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

The Tribe will look to repeat its season-opening performance from a season ago. In 2005-06, W&M opened the season with its first 4-1 start since the 1992-93 campaign. It also marked the first time in school history that W&M opened a year with four wins in its first five games against Division I opponents. After splitting the first two games at the W&M Tip-Off Classic, the Tribe won three straight over NCAA Tournament participant Hampton, Campbell and Longwood.

COFIELD NOTCHES CAREER MILESTONES

Senior forward Corey Cofield set a pair of career milestones during the 2005-06 season, scoring his 1,000th career point on Feb. 23, 2006 at Drexel just eight days after pulling down his 500th career rebound against Delaware (Feb. 15, 2006). He is the 28th 1,000-point scorer in W&M history and just the 14th to do it in less than three full seasons. Cofield is just the 14th W&M player to have 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in his career. He is the Tribe's top returning scorer and rebounder at 10.3 points and 4.7 rebounds per game. He has finished in the top two on the team in both categories during each of his three years at William and Mary. Cofield sits in 25th place on the William and Mary career points list with 1,039 tallies.

MANN ON THE MARK

Junior guard Nathan Mann has connected on 35.9 percent (88-of-245) from 3-point range during his William and Mary career, a percentage that ranks eighth on the school's career list. The 88 made 3-point field goals is tied for 11th on the career list. During the 2005-06 season, Mann knocked down 3-pointers at a 41.1 percent (51-of-124) clip. The percentage ranked third in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) and sixth on the W&M single-season list. Mann also tied for 11th in the CAA, knocking down 1.81 3-point field goals per game.

PAYTON STEALING THE SHOW

Senior guard Adam Payton made an immediate impact at William and Mary following his transfer from Vanderbilt in 2005-06. Payton started 26 of 28 contests at the guard position in 2005-06 and ranked among the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) leaders in steals. The Burlington, N.J., native finished the year tied for eighth in the conference at 1.61 swipes per contest. His 45 steals during the campaign tied for fourth on the College's single-season list. Payton will be the lone transfer on the roster in 2006-07, after he averaged 7.0 points per game during his first season with the Tribe.

TEAM OF THIEVES

In 2005-06, the Tribe proved to be one of the most successful teams in school history when it came to steals. Led by guard Adam Payton, the Tribe posted 196 steals on the year, a total that ranks eighth in school history. It was the most steals for a Tribe team since the 1997-98 team had 215. The average of seven per contest ranked 10th in the program's annals. Four W&M players had over 20 swipes on the season, while a pair, including Payton, had over 40.

HITTING THE BOARDS

For the fifth straight season, including all three under head coach Tony Shaver, the Tribe outrebounded its opponents in 2005-06. The College held an advantage of 947 (33.8 average) to 929 (33.2 average). The rebounding defensive stat is the best for the College in nearly 20 years. The last time W&M held its opponents to a lower average and fewer total rebounds was during the 1986-87 season. The Tribe held its opponents to 869 total and a 32.2 average during that season.

KISIELIUS, LITHUANIA CLAIM SILVER AT GLOBAL GAMES

Forward Laimis Kisielius helped lead the Lithuania to the silver medal at the Global Games in Dallas, Texas, June 19-24. Kisielius started every game for the Lithuania side that won its group with a perfect 3-0 mark before falling in the Championship Game against Russia on June 24. Kisielius turned in his top performance in an 80-77 victory over Argentina on June 22 with 17 points, including four, 3-point field goals in the win. He also added six rebounds and three assists while playing a team-high 38 minutes.

The Global Games is the pre-eminent international basketball event played in the United States. The Global Games exist to highlight the rising stars in the world of international basketball and to promote the growth of international basketball in the United States. This goal is validated and reinforced every year by the large number of NBA scouts, basketball fans, and coaches attending the Global Games. A total of 11 players from the 2005 event were drafted into the NBA in 2005. Some of the event alums currently playing in the NBA include Yao Ming, Carlos Boozer, Darko Milicic and Chris Bosh.

In his first two seasons with William and Mary, Kisielius averaged 7.9 points and 3.3 rebounds per game. He has played in 56 games during his career and started 45 of those contests. He scored in double figures during 21 combined games during his freshman and sophomore seasons at the College. As a freshman in 2005, Kisielius earned Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) All-Rookie Team honors as he averaged 8.7 points and 3.1 rebounds per game.

SCORING FOR SHAVER

Under head coach Tony Shaver's fast-paced style of play, the Tribe has scored 80 or more points in 19 of his 84 games including six times in 2005-06.

TRIBE ADDS PAIR OF SIGNEES FOR 2007-08

The William and Mary men's basketball program and head coach Tony Shaver announced the signing of two players, 6-9, 240-pound power forward Marcus Kitts (Holly Springs, N.C.) and 6-4, 190-pound guard Valeriu 'Vali' Lazarescu (Brossard, Quebec, Canada), to National Letters of Intent on Nov. 9. The duo will begin competition for the Tribe during the 2007-08 season.

"It is a great day for the College of William and Mary basketball program," Shaver said. "We are adding two quality young men in Marcus Kitts and Valeriu Lazarescu to our basketball family. Our main objective with our fourth recruiting class was to be highly selective and sign difference makers. We are confident we accomplished both those goals by signing Marcus and Vali. Both players are home runs for our program. They come from great family backgrounds and have what it takes to be impact players for our ball club."

MARCUS KITTS - F - 6-9 - 240 - HOLLY SPRINGS, N.C. (MIDDLE CREEK)

Kitts averaged 19 points and 12 rebounds as a junior. He scored 419 points in 2005-06, including a season-high 36 against Lee County on Jan. 3. Each of the last two seasons, Kitts earned All-Tri-Seven Conference honors. As a sophomore in 2004-05, he averaged 13.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and 2.2 blocks per game.

"Marcus was the easiest evaluation I have made in my 30 years of coaching," Shaver said. "The first time I saw Marcus, he scored more than 30 points and grabbed over 20 rebounds in a 4A basketball game in the Raleigh, N.C., area. I knew he was our guy, and we just had to find a way to sign him. Marcus is a very talented athlete who has yet to realize his potential. He has exceptional hands and a rare knack for rebounding the ball above the rim. The bigger the game and the better the competition, the better Marcus plays. He is fearless, and he welcomes challenges from opposing teams and players."

The power forward was a 2006 McDonald's All-American Nominee. He earned MVP honors at the 2006 North Carolina State Games Tournament. After receiving interest from UNC Wilmington, Iowa, West Virginia, Davidson and Tennessee, Kitts chose to play collegiate basketball for the Tribe. He spent the summer of 2006 adding muscle to his game, bulking up nearly 20 pounds. Kitts is known as an all-out player who will bang in the paint. He gets off the floor quickly and rebounds on the interior with a purpose.

VALERIU LAZARESCU - G - 6-4 - 190 - BROSSARD, QUEBEC (CHAMPLAIN ST. LAMBERT)

Lazarescu is an athletic player and a flat-out scorer. He plays for head coach John Dangelas, regarded as one of the top coaches in Canada, at the College of Champlain St. Lambert in Montreal, Quebec, which is known for producing Division I talent. Lazarescu chose the Tribe over American, Princeton, Evansville, Toledo and Boston University.

"I am so thankful Coach John Dangelas allowed us to get involved with Vali at such a late date in the recruiting process," Shaver said. "Vali is a big guard with tremendous athleticism. He is the winner of multiple Canadian dunk contests. He can finish in transition above the rim, shoot from the perimeter and rebound from the guard position."

This season, Lazarescu led Champlain to the Hagen title with a perfect 5-0 mark. He earned tournament MVP honors and led Cavaliers to a 97-39 win over Algonquin in title game with a team-high 22 points. He has enjoyed an exceptional final season at Champlain, also averaging 20 points per game at the Prep Canada Challenge against top teams from Toronto and Ottawa. At the 2005-06 Canadian Colleges Athletic Association (CCAA) Nationals, Lazarescu helped his Champlain team to a bronze medal.

TONYSHAVER

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his fourth season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program and his 31st overall in coaching. Shaver has coached at the collegiate level for the last 19 years and was officially hired as the 31st head men's basketball coach in the history of the College on May 2, 2003

The Green and Gold continue to make strides under the direction of Shaver. W&M started the 2005-06 season 4-1, marking the best start for a Tribe since opening the 1992-93 campaign with a 6-1 record. During that season, however, two of the team's first four wins were against non-Division I teams Virginia Wesleyan and Shenandoah, which means the 4-1 start for the 2005-06 squad was the first time in school history that the Tribe has opened a year with at least four wins in its first five games against current Division I opponents. Included in those four victories was a 70-60 win at Hampton, who went on to make the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to the start of the 2005-06 season, Shaver was inducted into the Episcopal High School Hall of Fame in a ceremony at the school on Nov. 11. He led EHS for 10 seasons from 1977-86. With his inception into the Episcopal Hall of Fame, Shaver has been inducted into the Hall of Fame at both of his head coaching stops prior to taking over the reigns at William and Mary. He was inducted into the Hampden-Sydney Hall of Fame in 2004.

In his second season at the helm, W&M immediately started the season on a high note, defeating Radford and Hartford to win the inaugural W&M Tip-Off Classic, the first regular season tournament title for the College since 1981. The Tribe defeated James Madison in the first round of the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament for W&M's first postseason win since 1997, and just the third in the last 20 years.

Shaver began his Tribe career with a 91-64 pounding of Liberty on Nov. 23, 2003. He also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime on Dec. 4, 2003. In the Tribe's first contest against a nationally ranked opponent under Shaver's direction, W&M performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There have been individual successes as well for the Green and Gold under Shaver's reign. 2004 graduate Adam Hess, currently playing professionally in Germany, became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a First-Team Academic All-American and all-conference selection as a senior. Current senior Corey Cofield was voted the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Cofield earned his second straight selection to the All-CAA third team in 2005, while current junior Laimis Kisielius earned a spot on the CAA All-Rookie team in 2005.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hamp-den-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in



1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious Butch Bennett Award, presented to the freshman who exemplifies determination, sportsmanship and sacrifice for the team. Shaver was voted the honoree by his teammates. During his four years in Chapel Hill, UNC went 95-26, including a pair of trips to the NCAA Tournament in 1975 and 1976. During the 1975 season, the Tarheels won the ACC Tournament and advanced to the Sweet 16. During the 1973 and 1974 season, North Carolina made the National Invitational Tournament.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (25), a former standout pitcher on the Tribe's baseball team, who is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization, Austin (22) and Jackson (15).
