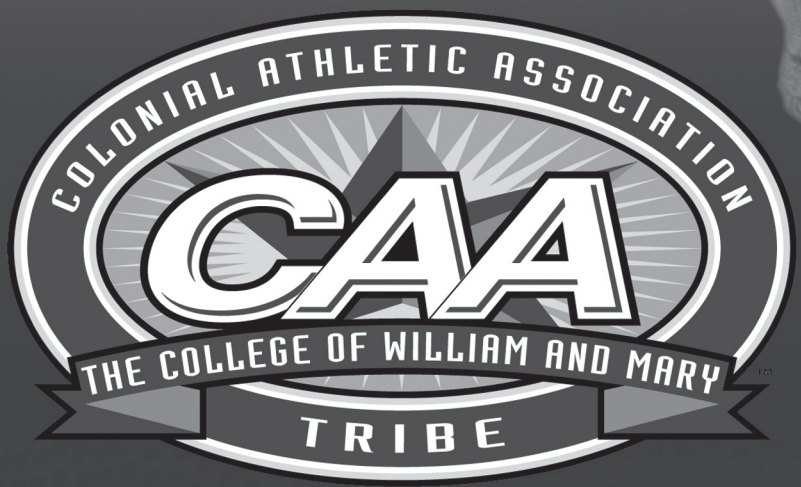

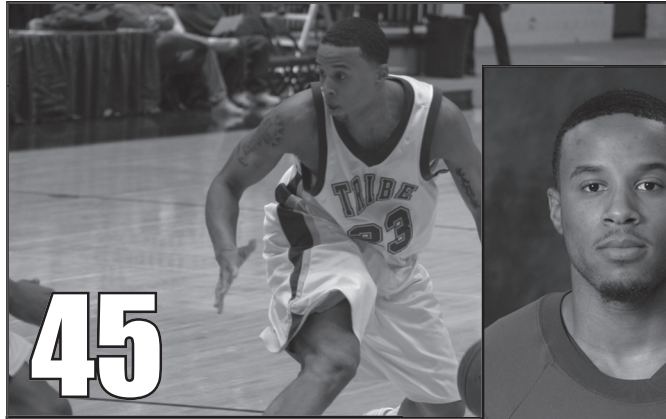

Junior Year (2005-06)

Appeared in all 28 game with 15 starts ... Topped W&M in rebounding and field-goal percentage for the second straight season with 4.7 per contest and .554 (112-of-202), respectively ... His .554 field-goal percentage ranked sixth in school history, behind his .563 percentage of 2004-05 ... Ranked second on the team in scoring at a 10.3 clip ... Led the team in rebounding on a team-high 11 occasions, while topping the squad in points on six occasions ... Recorded 16 double-digit scoring games, including a season-high 21 points against Longwood (11/28) ... Finished the contest against Longwood (11/28), 7-of-11 from the field and 7-of-8 from the charity stripe ... Notched his 12th career double-double with 19 points and 11 rebounds at Northeastern (2/2) ... Equaled a career-high with three steals against VCU (2/25) ... Opened the season with a 19-point, nine-rebound effort against Maine (11/18) ... Connected on a season-high nine field goals against the Black Bears ... Registered 17 points in 22 minutes on 8-of-13 from the field vs. JMU (1/28) ... Capped the season with a 17-point effort against VCU (3/3) in the CAA Tournament.

Sophomore Year (2004-05)

Voted to the All-CAA third team for the second straight season ... Named the Most Valuable Player of the W&M Tip-Off Classic and named the CAA Player of the Week for his performance in the tournament ... Dramatically improved his free throw accuracy, shooting .804 from the line after making just 63.4 percent as a freshman ... Made 144 free throws, 10th-most in a season at W&M ... His .804 free throw percentage is 17th-best in a single season at W&M ... Scored 382 points and had 200 rebounds, the 14th-most in a season at W&M since 1973 ... Ended the season in the top 15 in the CAA in scoring (13.2 ppg, 13th), rebounding (6.9 rpg, fifth), field goal percentage (.480, sixth) and free throw percentage (.804, fourth) ... Had five double-doubles on the season ... Scored 24 points and had 10 rebounds the next day against Radford ... Had 10 rebounds against Hampton (12/30) ... Scored 22 points with 12 rebounds at VCU (1/22) ... Scored 21 points and had 12 rebounds at UNC Wilmington (2/9) ... Scored 24 points on 7-9 shooting from the field and 10-of-11 from the free throw line against JMU (2/16) ... Scored career high 27 points, including making 13-of-16 free throws, in just 27 minutes at VCU (2/23) ... Set a career high with 13 rebounds and scored 11 points at Towson (2/26) ... Scored 15 points and pulled down 10 rebounds in CAA Tournament win over JMU (3/4).

Freshman Year (2003-04)

2004 CAA Rookie of the Year ... Third Team All-CAA ... CAA Rookie of the Week on three occasions (1/12, 1/26 and 2/9) ... Second on the team in scoring (13.2) and rebounding (6.6) ... Shot .563 (126-224) from the field, a W&M rookie record and the fifth-best field goal percentage in school history ... Led all CAA rookies in scoring, rebounding and field goal percentage ... Ranked 11th in the league in scoring, sixth in rebounding, and fourth in field goal percentage ... Led team with six double-doubles ... Scored in double figures 18 times and had 10 or more rebounds seven times ... Played in all 28 games and started the last 21 ... Scored a 25 points and tied for the third-best shooting game in school history with 9-of-9 performance against JMU (2/4) ... Led all scorers with 24 points on 10-of-13 shooting at Hofstra (1/24) ... Scored 18 points and set a career high with 13 rebounds at Drexel (2/7) ... Sixth double-double overall and fourth in five games with 18 points and 11 rebounds vs. Towson (2/18).

Played for coach Brad Rerheim ... Three-time ISL All-American ... Had 1,181 points and 784 rebounds in his career, both school records ... Averaged a double-double each of his last three years, including 19 points and 16 rebounds as a senior and 18 points and 13 rebounds as a junior ... 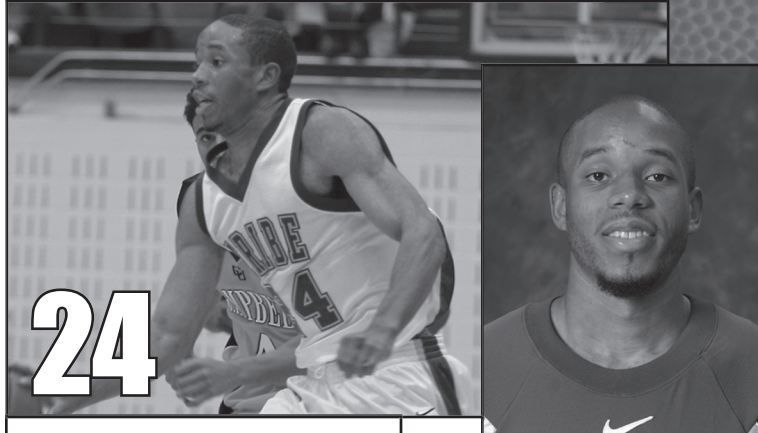

Junior Year (2005-06)

Started 25 of 28 games ... 25 starts ranked second on the team ... Averaged 7.0 points, 2.5 rebounds, 1.8 assists and 1.6 steals per game ... His steals total topped the Tribe and ranked eighth in the CAA (all games) ... Ranked third on the team in assists with 50 ... Led W&M with a career-high 20 points at Virginia Tech (12/27) ... Hit on 7-of-9 (.778) from the field, including a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line against Virginia Tech (12/27) ... Racked in a career-high seven rebounds in back-to-back games against Hampton (11/22) and Campbell (11/26) ... Had an impressive game against Campbell and closed in on a triple-double with 13 points, eight assists and seven rebounds ... The eight assists were a W&M season-high as well as a career-high ... Registered a career-high four steals on a pair of occasions at James Madison (2/11) and at Longwood (11/28) ... Turned in a 19-point performance on 7-of-8 (.875) from the field, including a perfect 2-of-2 from three-point range and an unblemished 3-of-3 from the free-throw line ... Knocked down 3-of-4 (.750) from three-point range to go along with a team-high six rebounds at Drexel (2/23).

Redshirt Junior Year (2004-05)

Sat out season per NCAA regulations after transferring from Vanderbilt in the summer of 2004.

Sophomore Year (2003-04 at Vanderbilt)

Played in 29 games with 64 points, 21 rebounds and 22 assists ... Career high eight points on 3-4 shooting to go with four rebounds against Belmont (11/21) ... Scored four points in 12 minutes against eventual national champion Connecticut in the third round of the NCAA Tournament (3/25) ... Seven points on 3-of-3 shooting against Georgia (2/11) ... Two points and career high five rebounds against Appalachian State (12/22).

Freshman Year (2003-04)

Played in 23 games with 29 points, five rebounds and 12 assists ... Season high seven points in just eight minutes against Connecticut (12/1) ... Six points in 16 minutes at Mississippi State (2/5).
