Sir

The turn which the late trials for
Treason de has taken would deter me from
troubling you on that subject. but that I
consider is a duty I owe to you & my Country
to prevent in as much as I can the renewal
of the like projects.

I have reason to believe ~~the~~ many
of those persons implicated with Burr. are
about to rendezvous at New Orleans again

My ship Orleans - Captain Tolz
is to sail in a few days for Orleans. and
Mr. Nathan Doctor Bollman. with two others
whose names he did not mention. applied
for a Passage on board her - but certainly
room could not be found in my ship for
men who I believe to have plotted & will
again plot treason against our country -
There are other vessels going for that City
in a few days - one tomorrow - in which these
men will no doubt be admitted -

As trifling as this circumstance may
appear I consider it my duty to communicate
it
