Dear Sir,

Accept my most sincere thanks for your attention to my letter of the 10th Inst, and believe that I am grateful for your goodness, in allowing me to forward the bridle to you.

You will find the the workmanship very badly executed; the nose band ought to have a hinge in the middle; by which it should be regulated so as to fit any horse, but the mouth was so awkward that I would not have it; and the nose band itself is not well made; so that this bridle will only serve to shew you the effect.

If after trying it, the bridle should be found to answer the end designed, and you think it worth notice, I beg of you to dispose of it as you please; and if it should be condemned as unfit for use, I pray you to have it destroyed and pardon me for having been troublesome to you.
