W&M OPENS HOME SLATE AGAINST HBU

The William and Mary men's basketball team will open the home portion of its schedule, welcoming Division I transitional Houston Baptist to Williamsburg for a post-Thanksgiving tilt. W&M and HBU will battle on Sunday, Nov. 25, at 2 p.m. It will be the first ever meeting between the two schools.

The Tribe is coming off its third straight road loss, falling at Wagner, 88-81, despite connecting on 14 3-point field goals against the Seahawks. Sophomores Danny Sumner and David Schneider led the way for the Tribe as each scored a career-high 18 points. Houston Baptist will play its third game in six days and are currently 0-2 over the stretch, following a 78-75 loss at Shenandoah on Friday. Kevin Amend led four Huskies in double figures with 13 points to go along with seven rebounds.

The W&M-HBU battle will be broadcast over the Tribe Radio Network with Jay Colley, Charlie Woollum and Bill McDonald on the call. The game can also be heard live over the Internet at TribeAthletics.com.

SCOUTING HOUSTON BAPTIST

The Huskies enter the Sunday affair with the Tribe at 1-8 on the year, following an 78-75 loss at Shenandoah. The only win this season for HBU was a 67-62 season-opening victory over Trinity in its only home contest so far this year. The W&M contest will be Houston Baptist's third in six days. HBU opened the trip with a 105-96 loss at Northwestern State prior to its defeat at Shenandoah. The Huskies have lost eight straight.

Houston Baptist is in its first season as a Division I transitional under the direction of Ron Cottrell, who is in his 18th season with the Huskies. Last season, the Huskies finished 22-7 overall and won their ninth straight conference title. HBU also finished the year ranked No. 10 in the NAIA rankings.

Baron Sauls, a transfer from the University of Texas-Arlington, leads the Huskies in scoring at 17.7 points per game. He is also the only player to have started all nine games for HBU and is averaging 5.2 assists per contest as well. Emanuel Willis ranks second on the team in scoring and is the Huskies low-post threat. The 6-8 Auburn transfer is averaging 10.8 points per game to go along with 6.2 rebounds and 2.8 blocked shots. Andrew Puzyk rounds out the trio of double-digit scorers for Houston Baptist at 10.1 points per game. He is also the top 3-point shooter for HBU, having knocked down 22 treys and shooting 37.3 percent from deep.

In the loss at Northwestern State, Sauls and Puzyk both scored over 20 points led by the 27 from Sauls. Puzyk drilled seven 3-pointers to finish with 23 points.

HOME OPENERS AT KAPLAN ARENA

Since William and Mary Hall was completed in 1970, the Tribe has amassed a 27-10 mark in home openers. W&M has won seven of its last eight home openers, and is a perfect 4-0 under head coach Tony Shaver. Those four opening victories at home have come by an average of over 24 points per game.

WAGNER RECAP

The Tribe dropped its third-straight road contest to open the season, falling at Wagner, 88-81, on Nov. 20. The College connected on 14 3-point field goals, the most since 2003, but could not overcome the Seahawk's sizzling second-half shooting.

Sophomores David Schneider and Danny Sumner led a quartet of Tribe players in double figures as each established a career-high with 18 points. Schneider was 5-of-9 from the field and 4-of-6 from 3-point range, while Sumner connected on 6-of-8 from the floor and 4-of-5 from deep. Senior co-captains Nathan Mann and Laimis Kisielius finished with 14 and 10 points, respectively. Kisielius also dished out a career-high seven assists in the contest.

The College opened up its largest lead of the first 20 minutes as Sumner connected on his second 3-pointer of the half. The trifecta gave the Tribe a 13-8 advantage with 12:51 remaining. Wagner answered with 11 straight points to take its biggest advantage of the first half. Durell Vinson and Lewchean Radford spear-headed the 11-point run with five and four points respectively.

W&M scored seven straight points of its own to regain the lead. It was again a Sumner 3-pointer from the left wing that put the College on top, 20-19, with 7:13 remaining. The two teams battled back and forth, before a Chris Darnell jump hook in the paint tied the contest at 29 with under two minutes remaining. It was the Seahawks that would take the lead, 31-29, to the locker room though as Vinson scored the final bucket of the first half with 46 seconds remaining.

Wagner's lead ballooned to eight points just over two minutes into the second half as the Seahawks scored eight of the opening 10 points of the stanza. The Tribe responded by scoring eight straight points to pull even at 39. Schneider scored five consecutive

points on a trey and two free throws, before Mann connected from the right corner at the 16:30 mark.

The Seahawks used a 19-2 run over the next seven minutes to take control of the contest. W&M battled to the end, but could only pull to within seven points on two occasions with under a minute remaining.

W&M knocked down 46.7 percent from 3-point range, hitting on 14-of-30 from deep. It was the most threes since the College hit 14 on Nov. 23, 2003 against Liberty. The last time a Tribe team hit for more than 14 treys in a game, the College connected on a school-record 16 against George Mason on Jan. 24, 1996. Wagner countered the Tribe's long-distance accuracy with some hot shooting from the field. The Seahawks ended the game shooting 56.1 percent from the field for the game and 69 percent in the second half.

CAREER NIGHT FOR SUMNER

Sophomore Danny Sumner turned in the best performance of his W&M career at Wagner on Nov. 20. The 6-7 wing scored a career and team-high 18 points on 6-of-8 from the floor and 4-of-5 from 3-point range. He also pulled down a team-high four rebounds, which equaled a career-high. He also established career marks for field goals made and attempted, 3-pointers made and attempted, free throws made, rebounds and minutes.

The night was part of a hot shooting start to the season for Sumner. He is shooting 80 percent from the floor and 83.3 percent from 3-point range over the opening three games. Sumner is averaging 7.7 points off the Tribe bench in 13.7 minutes per game.

BOMBS AWAY

The Tribe has been dangerous from deep this season and that has been no more evident than at Wagner. The College connected on 14-of-30 from long range against the Seahawks, including a 10-of-20 effort in the second half. The 14 treys tied for the third-most in school history, trailing only the school-record marks of 16 hit against George Mason on Jan. 24, 1996 and versus UNC Greensboro on Dec. 21, 1993. The 14 3-pointers were the most for the Tribe since the College connected on 14 vs. Liberty on Nov. 23, 2003.

Over the opening three games of the season, the Tribe has attempted 30 or more treys on two occasions. W&M is averaging 9.3 3-pointers per game, which leads the CAA. The College also leads the league in 3-pointers attempted.

TOUGH START

W&M will find the opening portion of its 2007-08 schedule a little difficult. Not only did the Tribe open with back-to-back top-25 teams, but six of its first seven games will come on the road.

The College opened the regular season on the road against a pair of top 25 teams in No. 5/5 Georgetown and No. 21/22 N.C. State on Nov. 15. W&M then made the trek to Staten Island, N.Y., to face Wagner on Nov. 20, before it opens the home portion of its slate on Sunday, Nov. 25, against Houston Baptist. The Tribe will then travel to Richmond on Nov. 28, VCU on Dec. 5 and North Florida on Dec. 7, before a two-week break for final exams at the College.

The six road games in the opening seven contests start is the toughest stretch since the 2001-02 season. During that campaign, the College played nine of its first 10 games away from Williamsburg. Of those nine games, seven were road games and another two were played at neutral sites as part of tournaments.

TOUGH START PART TWO

With the Tribe's back-to-back games to open the year against No. 5/5 Georgetown and No. 21/22 N.C. State, it marked the sixth time in school history that the Tribe played back-to-back games against nationally ranked opponents. It also was the first time in over 20 years as the College last played back-to-back top-25 teams during the 1983-84 season. During that campaign, the College traveled to No. 5 Maryland on Jan. 7 and No. 12 Wake Forest on Jan. 11. W&M also played back-to-back ranked foes during the 1971-72, 1956-57, 1954-55 and 1953-54 seasons.

CHASING 400

W&M head coach Tony Shaver is in his 22nd season patrolling the sidelines in college basketball. Prior to his stint at W&M, Shaver spent 17 seasons as the head man at Hampden-Sydney College in Virginia. Shaver currently has 396 career wins between W&M and Hampden-Sydney, needing only four wins to join the 400-win club.



1.000 WITHIN REACH

Both Tribe seniors Laimis Kisielius and Nathan Mann are within reach of the 1,000-point club. The duo could become the 29th and 30th members of the exclusive club in the 103-year history of Tribe basketball. Kisielius currently has 809 career points, needing only 191, while Mann has 746 career points and needs 254. Those numbers equate to Kisielius needing to average 7.3 points per game over the rest of the regular season to reach 1,000 points and Mann needing a 9.8 points per contest scoring average.

If the Tribe duo reaches the milestone this season, they would become only the third pair in history to score their 1,000th career points in the same season. Matt Courage and John Lowenhaupt both scored their 1,000th career points in 1997, while Matt Verkey and Carl Parker reached the mark in 1996. Kisielius and Mann would be the first to do it in the same season after spending their entire careers together at the College. Two other duos, Bev Vaughan and Jeff Cohen (1958-61) as well as Kevin Richardson and Keith Cieplicki (1982-85), played their entire careers together, but scored their 1,000th career points in separate seasons.

MANN ON THE MARK

Senior guard Nathan Mann moved up the Tribe's all-time career 3-pointers made list. He connected on a pair of trifectas against Georgetown before hitting on another against N.C. State. The treys pushed Mann's career total into fourth on the career list a head of former All-CAA player Adam Hess, who is currently playing professionally over in France. Mann needs two more 3-point field goals to tie Greg Burzell for third on the all-time list.

Mann also ranks among the top-10 in W&M history in career 3-pointers attempted, made per game and percentage. He currently sits fourth on the career 3-point field goals attempted list. He has connected on 148-of-433 from deep for a percentage of 34.2 over his career. That number ranks 10th on the Tribe career 3-point field goal percentage list. On average, Mann has knocked down 1.64 treys per game, which ranks sixth in the program's annals.

TRIBE SIGNS PAIR TO NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT

The Tribe added a pair of players during the early signing period in the form of Quinn McDowell (Mason, Ohio/Archbishop Moeller) and Kendrix Brown (Norfolk, Va./Norview). Both players signed National Letters of Intent and will be eligible to compete for the Tribe during the 2008-09 season.

Kendrix Brown (Norfolk, Va./Norview)

Last season, Brown was a First-Team All-Eastern District selection, while averaging 15 points, seven assists, five rebounds and two steals per game at Norview. The 6-3 guard was the District Newcomer of the Year in 2004-05 and earned honorable mention all-district honors. As a sophomore, he was a second-team all-district choice.

Each of the last four years, Brown has played on the highly regarded Boo Williams AAU Travel Team. He played alongside a number of Division I basketball recruits on the squad, including national top-20 recruit and North Carolina signee Ed Davis. Brown has also taken part in the Rbk Proving Ground Regional Combine.

Quinn McDowell (Mason, Ohio/Archbishop Moeller)

McDowell is a second-generation athlete at the College. His father, Dave, graduated from W&M in 1985 after competing on the football field for current Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock from 1982-84. Last season, McDowell led Moeller to the Division I Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) Boys State Championship in front of a crowd of over 14,000. He averaged a team-best 15.1 points per game, while chipping in 4.6 rebounds and 2.0 assists per contest. McDowell shot 52 percent from the floor, 36.6 percent from 3-point range and 79.7 percent from the free throw line.

In the state semifinal against Lake St. Edward High School, the 6-5, 195-pounder finished with 19 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the field to go along with a pair of assists and two steals, while being matched up with Michigan State signee and top-15 recruit Delvon Roe, who is 6-8, 220 pounds. For his performance in the Final Four, McDowell was a First-Team Final Four All-Tournament team choice. During his junior campaign, he led Moeller to a 25-2 record and garnered First-Team All-Greater Catholic League honors as well as Third-Team All-Southwest Ohio and Cincinnati Enquirer All-City accolades.

As a sophomore, McDowell averaged 10.5 points, 2.0 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game, while shooting 45 percent from 3-point range and 79.6 percent from the free throw line. He garnered Greater Catholic League Second Team honors in 2006, while also reg-

istering honorable mention All-Southwest district distinction. McDowell played AAU for Shining Star Sports. He helped to capture eight AAU State Championships and four top-10 AAU National finishes.

NO ANSWERS

The Tribe led 2007 Final Four participant and No. 5-ranked Georgetown for long stretches in the opening half and by as many as five. W&M's success in the opening half can be directly attributed to the play of senior Laimis Kisielius. The Hoyas had no answers for the Vilnius, Lithuania native as he tallied all 16 of his points in the opening 20 minutes of the game. He connected on 6-of-8 from the field, displaying a plethora of offensive moves. He also connected on 3-of-4 from the charity stripe in the opening 20 minutes.

GUARDS CRASHING THE BOARDS

W&M stayed close on the boards with a much taller Georgetown team, due in large part to the successful rebounding of the Tribe's guards. Sophomore guard David Schneider and senior Nathan Mann both led the Tribe with seven rebounds apiece. Schneider followed that performance up by leading the Tribe in rebounding for a second-straight game against N.C. State.

The success of W&M guards on the boards is nothing new to the program. Last season, the Tribe's backcourt was a significant reason for the Tribe's success in the rebounding department. The College outrebounded 16 opponents in 2006-07. On 25 occasions and in 20 of the Tribe's 30 games last season, a guard led the Tribe in rebounding. In fact, all three of the College's starting guards averaged over 3.4 rebounds per contest. In total, the Tribe received over 15 rebounds a game from the guard position.

RETURNING EXPERIENCE

W&M head coach Tony Shaver has boasted about the experience and depth the Tribe returns from a season ago. The College returns four starters and 11 letterwinners from last year's milestone campaign.

Senior co-captains Laimis Kieslius and Nathan Mann are three-year returning starters, while nine different players on the W&M roster have earned starting nods at some point in their College career. It total, the Tribe's returning roster has 493 career games played and 192 career starts. Six returning players have played in nearly 50 games for the College over their careers, while seven return after averaging 10-plus minutes per game last season.

PLAYING FINAL FOUR COMPETITION

For the second straight season and the 19th time overall, the W&M men's basketball team faced a NCAA Final Four opponent from the previous season in No. 5/5 Georgetown. The Hoyas advanced to their fifth Final Four last season, before falling in the semifinals to Ohio State.

Last season, the Tribe defeated 2006 Final Four participant George Mason, 67-63, on Jan.3, marking the fifth time in school history that the College defeated a Final Four participant from the previous season. The Tribe also accomplished the feat with wins over N.C. State during the 1950-51 season, West Virginia during the 1959-60 season, North Carolina during the 1977-78 season and Virginia during the 1984-85 campaign.

The victory for the 2006-07 version of the Tribe was the first to pull the trick on the road. The previous four wins all came in contests considered home games, while W&M downed the Patriots in Fairfax, Va. The win over George Mason was also the first over a Final Four participant since the NCAA Tournament field expanded to 64. The 1984 NCAA Tournament was the final event with a 48-team field. The Tribe's victories over N.C. State in 1951 and West Virginia in 1960 were both played in Norfolk, Va., but both were considered home games.

The College played Duke on four occasions (1986-87, 1988-89, 1989-90, 1991-92 and 1999-2000) and North Carolina on three occasions (1957-58, 1977-78 and 1981-82) following Final Four trips for the schools. W&M also played West Virginia on three occasions during the 1959-60 season after the Mountaineers went to the 1959 Final Four. The Tribe has battled Jacksonville in 1970-71, Providence in 1973-74 and Maryland in 2001-02 following Final Four trips for those programs.



SMITH GOES INTERNATIONAL WITH PANAMA

Junior forward Alex Smith spent the summer competing with the Panamanian Senior National Team. He played with the squad at the FIBA Americas Championship in Las Vegas, Nev., Aug. 22-Sept. 2 as well as at the Pan-American Games, June 29-July 1.

At the FIBA Americas Championship, Smith averaged 2.5 points and 1.3 rebounds per game, coming off the Panamanian bench. In a loss to Puerto Rico, Smith notched his best statistical game with five points and three rebounds in 20 minutes of action. He also added three points, two rebounds and a steal in Panama's lone victory of the championship against Mexico on Aug. 24.

At the Pan-American Games, Smith played in four games, including one start, and averaged 4.3 points and 1.2 rebounds per game, while shooting 75 percent from the floor. He turned in his best game of the tournament against the U.S. in the fifth-place game, scoring seven points and pulling down two rebounds. Georgetown's Roy Hibbertt was a member of that U.S. Team at the Pan-American Games. Smith also competed in a third tournament with Panama over the summer in Chile. He averaged 7.3 points and 3.0 rebounds in 26.3 minutes of action over the three-game Chile Top 4 Tournament.

TRIBE ON TV

W&M will once again have a number of games televised as part of the Colonial Athletic Association's (CAA) television package for the 2007-08 season. W&M will have four games broadcast as part of the league's most comprehensive TV package in the 23-year history of the conference.

The Tribe will have a trio of games broadcast on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic and a game televised on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. Three of the Tribe's four TV games will be on the road and one will come in the friendly confines of Kaplan Arena in Williamsburg. The Tribe's contest at Old Dominion on Jan. 5, slated for an 8 p.m. tipoff, will be televised on CSN-MA. The network will also broadcast both W&M games against Towson on Jan. 19 and Feb. 16. The Jan. 19 contest is slated for a 4 p.m. tip in Williamsburg, while the Feb. 16 match up in Towson, Md., will start at 2 p.m. The Tribe's final regular season road contest at George Mason on Feb. 27 will also be a part of the television package. MASN will show the game, which is set to begin at 9 p.m.

The 80-game CAA men's basketball composite broadcast slate features 38 appearances on the various ESPN platforms, including four regular-season games and the CAA Championship on ESPN/ESPN2, 14 games on ESPNU and six syndicated games on ESPN Regional Television. The largest-ever Comcast syndicated package features more than 30 games syndicated on the Comcast family of Networks (Comcast SportsNets, SportsNet New York, CSS, CN8), allowing consistent exposure in many of the nation's largest media markets.

O'REILLY ESPNU BRACKETBUSTERS

For the second straight season, the Tribe will take part in O'Reilly ESPNU BracketBusters. All 12 CAA teams will compete in the sixth-annual event. After serving as a road team in 2007, the Tribe will host a game during the 2008 two-day event, Feb. 22-23. BracketBusters will feature 14 nationally televised contests on ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN Classic and ESPN360.com.

A pool of 100 teams from 16 different conferences will participate in the 2008 BracketBusters. The field includes teams with 74 appearances in the last five NCAA Tournaments, including a team in the Final Four and seven Sweet Sixteen squads. This year's coverage will feature the addition of a game on ESPN Classic. For the third straight year, ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, will televise five BracketBusters games while ESPN360.com, ESPN's customized broadband service, will offer two. ESPN2 will televise six contests. ESPN360.com will also simulcast ESPN2's six telecasts. The BracketBusters matchups will be announced Feb. 4, while game time and network assignments will be announced Feb. 11.

The 100-team field will feature 12 teams from the CAA and the Mid-American Conference; 11 from the Ohio Valley Conference; 10 from the Missouri Valley, Horizon League and Metro Atlantic Athletic; nine from the Western Athletic Conference and Big West; four from the America East and Southern; two from the Patriot, Big Sky and Big South; one from the West Coast, Summit League and Atlantic Sun.

EXPERIENCE BEYOND HIS YEARS

Sophomore David Schneider faced a gauntlet of experienced point guards during his rookie season with the Tribe in 2006-07. The Phoenix, Ariz., native demonstrated maturity beyond his years during his first season in the Green and Gold, helping the College to its best season in nearly a decade. Schneider had the fewest turnovers of any primary point guard in the CAA. He only turned the ball over 48 times while averaging over 30 minutes per game. Schneider averaged only one turnover per 16:22 minutes played.

Schneider ranked 11th in the CAA in assists to turnover ratio. That number ranked second among the league's rookies. On 12 occasions, Schneider has turned the ball over one or few times, while dishing out five or more assists on five occasions. He led the Tribe in assists per game at 2.7.

REACHING NEW HEIGHTS

The 2006-07 version of William and Mary basketball joined some elite company in the school's annals. With its 60-47 win over Drexel on Feb. 14, the Tribe became only the fifth team in W&M men's basketball history to win 15 games against Division I opponents. The 2006-07 squad joined the 1950-51, 1982-83, 1984-85 and 1997-98 teams in winning 15 Division I games. Only the 1997-98 team (20) and the 1982-83 team (16) have posted more than 15 wins over Division I opponents in a season.

The 15 wins also marked only the second time in the last 20 years that the College collected 15 victories in a season. The Tribe is one of only 21 teams in school history to win 15 games in a season (both Division I and other opponents).

The victory over Drexel was monumental in another way as well. The Dragons entered the game ranked No. 53 in the RPI according to CollegeRPI.com. It marked the highest rated opponent the Tribe had defeated since downing Richmond in 2001 when the Spiders were No. 43 in the RPI.

MAKING SOME HISTORY

The 2006-07 season provided some memorable moments for the W&M men's basketball program. Here is a look at some of the winning accomplishments from last season:

- The College tallied its most victories in a season since the 1997-98 campaign when it won its 15th game of the year vs. Drexel on Feb. 14.
- W&M's 60-47 victory over Drexel on Feb. 14 marked the first time that the Tribe has defeated the Dragons since Drexel joined the CAA in 2001-02.
- On Feb. 10, W&M recorded its first win in Trask Coliseum since the 1993-94 season, defeating UNCW, 61-55.
- The Tribe was one of only 21 teams in school history to win 15 or more games (Division I or other) in a season and one of only five teams to win 15 or more Division I games.
- W&M jumped out to a 10-4 start to the season, the best start for the College since going 11-3 during the 1997-98 season.
- It marked the 12th occasion in W&M basketball history that the Tribe started the season 10-4 or better. The 2006-07 team was only the fifth team since 1950 to start the season 10-4 or better.
- The College won seven straight contests from Dec. 8-Jan. 8. It marked only the 17th winning streak of seven or more games in W&M history. The streak also was only the sixth of seven or more games since the 1950-51 campaign.

- On Jan. 3, the Tribe tallied its first win in Fairfax, Va., over George Mason, 67-63, since the 1997-98 season. The Tribe also snapped George Mason's 14-game home conference winning streak that span nearly two years.
- W&M jumped out to only its fourth 3-1 start in the school's 22 years in the CAA. Only the 1994-95 (4-1) and 1997-98 (4-1) teams jumped out to better records in CAA play.
- The College finished with eight CAA victories making it one of only three teams in W&M's 22-years as part of the CAA to win eight or more games.

TONYSHAVER

In four seasons at W&M, head coach Tony Shaver has led a turnaround of Tribe basketball. During 2006-07 season, W&M enjoyed a breakout season, winning 15 Division I games for only the fifth time in school history. Shaver, though, believes 15 wins is only a rung on the ladder to becoming a perennial Colonial Athletic Association contender. Shaver has spent 21 seasons of coaching at the collegiate level and enters his 32nd season as a head coach.

"I do not want anyone to limit the vision of our program," Shaver said. "I am used to winning as a coach, and last season was a great step towards where I know this program can end up. As a staff, we expect big things not only from our players, but from our program as a whole."

Shaver earned CollegeInsider.com Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Tribe to a 15-15 record. It marked just the second time in the last 20 years W&M had won 15 games. Shaver also led his troops to eight wins during the tough CAA portion; only the third time in the 22-year history of the league the Tribe has accomplished that feat. Another telling stat of the progression of the program was the four CAA road victories, highlighted by a 67-63 win over 2006 Final Four participant George Mason. In Shaver's first four seasons, W&M had won only three road affairs.

The 2006-07 season brought about a change in styles for the 31st W&M head coach. After spending much of his career coaching an up-tempo offense, featuring a trapping defense, Shaver switched over to a more perimeter-oriented attack last season. The Tribe offensive scheme now spreads the floor and relies on spacing, effective perimeter shooting and players reading and reacting to teammates' cuts and motion. Defensively, W&M employs a plethora of defensive systems to throw off opposing offenses.

The new style led to the Tribe ranking among the top 50 in the country in 3-point field goal defense as well as holding its opponents to 64.2 points per game, the best mark since the 1997-98 season. The College also established school records for 3-point field goals made and 3-point field goals attempted. The success of the new approach was never more evident than in the Tribe's Feb. 14 victory over eventual National Invitational Tournament participant Drexel, 60-47, in Williamsburg. It was the lowest point production for Drexel in four seasons, and marked the highest ranked team, in terms of RPI, that W&M had defeated since 2001.

During the 2005-06 season, W&M started 4-1, marking the best start for the Tribe team since opening the 1992-93 campaign with a 6-1 record. The 4-1 start for the 2005-06 squad though was the first time in school history that the Tribe has opened a year with at least four wins in its first five games against current Division I opponents. Included in those four victories was a 70-60 win at Hampton, which went on to make the NCAA Tournament.

In November 2005, Shaver was inducted into the Episcopal High School Hall of Fame. He led EHS for 10 seasons from 1976-86. Shaver has been inducted into the Hall of Fame at both of his head coaching stops prior to taking over the reigns at W&M.

There have been individual successes as well for the Green and Gold under Shaver's reign. On four occasions, a W&M player has been named All-CAA under Shaver, while another four have been named to the CAA All-Rookie Team. 2004 graduate Adam Hess, currently playing professionally in France, became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a First-Team Academic All-American and all-conference selection as a senior. W&M players have also enjoyed success in the classroom under Shaver, as on seven occasions a Tribe player has been named to the CAA All-Academic team over the last four seasons, including a program-

high three in 2007.


Shaver was named the head coach of the Tribe on May 2, 2003. He came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious Butch Bennett Award, presented to the freshman who exemplifies determination, sportsmanship and sacrifice for the team. Shaver was voted the honoree by his teammates.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (26), Austin (23) and Jackson (16). Christopher is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization after a former standout career with the Tribe's baseball team. Austin is working toward a graduate degree in sports leadership at VCU, while working as a graduate assistant with the Ram basketball program. Jackson is a junior at Jamestown High School, and plays both basketball and baseball for the Eagles.
