W&M HITS THE ROAD AGAIN TO FACE RICHMOND

After winning its home opener against Houston Baptist, the William and Mary men's basketball will once again take to the road for a threegame road trip, beginning with Richmond on Wednesday, Nov. 28. It will mark the 194th meeting in the storied rivalry, which is only separated by a single game in record books. Tip-off for the tilt is slated for 7 p.m. at the Robins Center in Richmond.

The Tribe tallied its first win of the season downing Houston Baptist, 79-70, on Nov. 25. Sophomore David Schneider and senior Laimis Kisielius led the way for the College with 19 points apiece. The Spiders are returning home after a two-game road trip in which they split games with a win over Rice, 61-55, and a loss to Marist, 64-62.

SCOUTING RICHMOND

Richmond enters the contest at 3-4 overall following a 64-62 loss at Marist on Nov. 24. In that contest, the Spiders led by as many as 17 in the second half, but the Red Foxes came charging back to claim the home victory. The Spiders, who are led by third-year head coach Chris Mooney, are 0-2 at home this season falling to Norfolk State, 72-69, on Nov. 10 and against UMBC, 70-68, on Nov. 17. UR owns victories over Maine (44-42), East Carolina (67-65 in OT) and Rice (61-55).

Sophomore Dan Geriot leads the Spiders in scoring at 15.1 points per game and is Richmond's top rebounder at 5.9 per contest. He has scored 20 or more points in three of the Spiders' last four games. Geriot posted back-to-back double-doubles against Norfolk State and UMBC.

Sophomore guard David Gonzalez ranks second on the team in scoring at 10.7 points per game, but has cooled a bit since a hot start. He averaged 18.3 points per game over the opening three contests of the year, including a game-high 25 against No. 3 Memphis. He is the Spiders top 3-point shooter at 42.3 percent on 11-of-26.

Oumar Sylla scored 12 points in the Spiders loss to Marist and averages 9.0 points per game in a starting roll. Fellow starter Ryan Butler is UR's top assist man at 2.6 per contest.

Last season, the Tribe tallied a 61-53 New Year's Eve victory over the Spiders. Alex Smith scored a then-career high 12 points in the win, while Laimis Kisielius added 11. The College held Richmond to just 13 points in the opening half in jumping out to a double-digit halftime advantage.

SERIES VS. RICHMOND

W&M and Richmond have played a combined 193 times with the Spiders holding the slimmest of advantages at 97-96. The two schools were long-time CAA nemesis prior to UR leaving the league to join the Atlantic-10 in 2001. The Tribe snapped a two-game losing streak last season with a win in Williamsburg. UR holds a 60-33 advantage in games at Richmond. The Tribe will look for its first win at the Robbins Center since Jan. 20, 2001.

HOUSTON BAPTIST RECAP

The Tribe won its home opener for the fifth-straight season under head coach Tony Shaver, downing Houston Baptist, 79-70, on Nov. 25. The Tribe knocked down 54.8 percent from the floor in the second half and connected on 10 3-point field goals on the way to the comeback victory.

Sophomore guard David Schneider and senior wing Laimis Kisielius led the Tribe charge with 19 points apiece, pacing four Tribe players in double figures. Junior forward Chris Darnell narrowly missed a double-double with 12 points and nine rebounds, while senior Chris Stratton came off the bench to post career-high marks with 10 points and four rebounds.

W&M fell behind early as Houston Baptist connected on four of its opening five shots, including a trio of 3-pointers. Joe Atang, making his first start of the season, connected on his second triple of the opening five minutes to give HBU at 14-8 lead with 15:05 remaining.

The Tribe made use of the free-throw line in the opening 20 minutes to work its way back into the ball game. W&M connected on all 12 of its chances from the charity stripe to close the gap. The College knocked down six straight from the charity stripe to take its first lead of the game at 31-29 with 2:06 remaining.

After the Huskies pulled even, freshman guard John Sexton hit the first 3-pointer of his career from the right wing to give W&M a 36-33 cushion with under a minute remaining. It would be Houston Baptist that would take the lead to the locker room though as

Andrew Puzyk's trey as time expired rattled around before dropping to give HBU a 38-36 advantage at the intermission.

The Husky lead ballooned to six in the opening minutes in the second half, before the College responded with a 13-2 run to take a five-point advantage. Schneider and Kisielius connected on back-to-back treys to draw the Tribe even, before a Darnell dunk ignited the Tribe faithful at the 15:12 mark.

Senior guard Nathan Mann canned his second three of the game, before a Stratton steal led to a Schneider lay-up, giving W&M a 51-46 lead with 13:10 remaining. The three by Mann was his second of the game and moved him into a tie with Greg Burzell for third on the W&M career 3-pointers made list with 150.

After HBU pulled to within four for the third time of the second half at 55-51 midway through the stanza, W&M used a 9-2 run to push its advantage over double-digits for the first time on the afternoon. Kisielius connected on a pair of threes, before Schneider made a steal and scored on a driving lay-up to bring the W&M crowd to its feet. He finished off the conventional 3-point play following the under eight-minute media timeout and gave the Tribe a 64-53 lead. The advantage would reach as much as 13 on a pair of occasions, before HBU pulled to within the final margin of nine.

The College finished with 18 assists on the game, including a team-high five from Kisielius. W&M also shot 48.2 percent (27-of-56) from the floor for the game, while knocking down double-digit treys for the second straight game with 10. As a team, the Tribe also shot 93.8 percent from the free throw line, hitting on 15 of its 16 chances.

BOMBS AWAY

W&M has proven that opposing defenses need to be well aware of the Tribe's ability to shot the basketball from 3-point range. In each of the Tribe's last two games, W&M has knocked double-digit treys. The College connected on 14 at Wagner, before hitting on 10 in the home opener against Houston Baptist. It marked the 10th and 11th times under head coach Tony Shaver that W&M has connected on 10 or more 3-point field goals in a game. W&M is 6-5 in those 11 games.

The back-to-back double-digit 3-pointers made performance marks the second time that has happened under Shaver. W&M also knocked down 10-plus threes in two straight games during his first season in 2003-04. The College connected on 14 treys against Liberty on Nov. 23, 2003, before hitting for 11 vs. Radford on Nov. 24, 2003.

Against Wagner, the College connected on 14-of-30 from long range, including a 10-of-20 effort in the second half. The 14 treys tied for the third-most in school history, trailing only the school-record marks of 16 hit against George Mason on Jan. 24, 1996 and versus UNC Greensboro on Dec. 21, 1993. The 10 second-half triples were also the third most in a single half for the College.

The Tribe leads the CAA and ranks among the national leaders in 3-pointers made per game. The College has connected on 9.5 treys per game and also leads the CAA in 3-point field goals attempted.

KNOCKING DOWN THE FREEBIES

The College used the free throw line to its advantage against Houston Baptist. W&M connected on 93.8 percent from the free throw line, knocking down 15 of its 16 chances. In fact, the Tribe was a perfect 12-of-12 in the first half against the Huskies.

It marked the fifth time under W&M head coach Tony Shaver that the Tribe has connected on 90 percent or better of its free throws in a game. The Green and Gold are 3-2 in those contests. The College currently ranks second in the CAA, hitting on 74.6 percent from the charity stripe.



DISHING IT OUT

Over the last two games, the Tribe has begun to share the basketball at a high rate. The College dished out 19 assists at Wagner, before following that performance up with 18 dimes in the home opener against Houston Baptist. Senior wing Laimis Kisielius has led the Tribe charge in assists this season at 3.3 per contest. Over the last two games, he has dished out 12 assists, including a career-high seven at Wagner.

W&M currently ranks fourth in the CAA at 14.3 assists per game. Coupled with its low number of turnovers, the Tribe ranks among the best in the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio. W&M ranks second in the league at a ratio of 1.12.

SPARK OFF THE BENCH

Playing in only this second game this season and 34th of his W&M, senior forward Chris Stratton made a major impact of the bench in the Tribe's 79-70 win over Houston Baptist. The Burke, Va., native finished with 10 points and four rebounds in 18 minutes of action, providing a much-needed spark that allowed the College to overcome an early deficit.

Stratton established career bests in points, rebounds, assists, field goals made and attempted, free throws made and attempted, steals and minutes played. He finished 3-of-4 from the floor to go along with a perfect 4-of-4 effort from the charity stripe. His 10 points were nearly half of his previous career total of 24 and more points that he scored during his entire junior campaign.

SENSATIONAL START FOR SCHNEIDER

After earning CAA All-Rookie team honors a season ago, much was expected of sophomore guard David Schneider and the Phoenix, Ariz., native has done little to disappoint. In each of the Tribe's last two games, he has led W&M in scoring with 18 points at Wagner and a career-high 19 in the victory over Houston Baptist. He currently leads the Tribe in points per game 15.0, which ranks 13th in the CAA.

Schneider has been hot from deep during the opening part of the second, connecting on 54.2 percent (13-of-24) of his 3-point attempts. He has knocked down four 3-pointers in three of the first four games this season. He ranks second in the CAA in 3-pointers made per game and fourth in 3-point field goal percentage. The 6-2 guard has also been nearly flawless from the free throw line. His percentage of 86.7 ranks sixth in the CAA.

MANN ON THE MARK

Senior guard Nathan Mann continues to establish himself as one of the top 3-point shooters in W&M history. With his pair of treys against Houston Baptist on Nov. 25, Mann moved into a tie for third on the Tribe career 3-point field goals made list with Greg Burzell. The Overland Park, Kan., native has knocked down 150 treys over his W&M career on 437 chances.

Mann also ranks among the top-10 in W&M history in career 3-pointers attempted, made per game and percentage. He currently sits fourth on the career 3-point field goals attempted list and 10th on the Tribe career 3-point field goal percentage list at 34.2. On average, Mann has knocked down 1.65 treys per game, which ranks sixth in the program's annals. Mann is 11 3-point attempts shy of passing former All-CAA performer Adam Hess on the career attempts list and only 22 treys short of passing Randy Bracey for second on the 3-pointers made ledger.

This season, Mann ranks among the CAA leaders in 3-point shooting. He is ninth in 3-pointers made per game at 2.0 and 13th in 3-point field goal percentage at 32.0.

IT COUNTS DOUBLE

In each of the first four games this season, senior Laimis Kisielius has registered double figures, while leading the Tribe in scoring on three occasions. He tallied a team-best 16 points against Georgetown, all in the first half, before scoring 12 at N.C. State. After scoring 10 points on the road at Wagner, Kisielius shared team-high scoring honors with sophomore David Schneider, registering 19 points in a win over Houston Baptist. Kisielius ranks 15th in the CAA scoring at 14.3 points per game.

Dating back to last season, Kisielius has scored in double figures in six straight games, which is the longest stretch of his W&M career. The Vilnius, Lithuania native has 42 career double-digit scoring performance for the Tribe.

CHASING 400

With the Tribe's home-opening victory over Houston Baptist, W&M head coach Tony Shaver took another step closer to the 400-win mark. The victory on Nov. 25 was the 397th of Shaver's collegiate coaching career. He is only three wins shy of joining the 400-win club. Shaver is in his 22nd season patrolling the sidelines in college basketball. Prior to his stint at W&M, he spent 17 seasons as the head man at Hampden-Sydney College in Virginia.

TAKING CHARGE

Junior forward Peter Stein has been a fixture in the Tribe lineup over the last two seasons. While he has shown the ability to score both inside and outside, the 6-9, 235-pounder is the most valuable on the defensive end for the Tribe. Stein is averaging over a charge taken per game this season and leads the team in that category with five on the year.

WINNING THE HOME OPENER

With its 79-70 win over Houston Baptist on Nov. 25, the Tribe improved to 28-10 overall in home openers at Kaplan Arena. The College also bumped its winning streak in home openers to five. The College has not lost a home opener under head coach Tony Shaver. In fact, the Tribe has won eight of its last nine home openers.

NEARLY A DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Junior forward Chris Darnell narrowly missed garnering the Tribe's first double-double in two seasons. In the Tribe's home opening win over Houston Baptist, the Stafford, Va., native posted career highs with 12 points and nine rebounds, coming just one board shy of a double-double.

After averaging just 10 minutes per game through his freshman and sophomore campaigns, Darnell has started the opening four games of the year for the Tribe and ranks second on the team in minutes per game at 31.8. He is the College's leading rebounder at 5.8 per contest to go along with 7.5 points per game. His rebounding total ranks 15th in the CAA.

1,000 WITHIN REACH

Both Tribe seniors Laimis Kisielius and Nathan Mann are within reach of the 1,000-point club. The duo could become the 29th and 30th members of the exclusive club in the 103-year history of Tribe basketball. Kisielius currently has 828 career points, needing only 172, while Mann has 754 career points and needs 246. Those numbers equate to Kisielius needing to average 6.9 points per game over the rest of the regular season to reach 1,000 points and Mann needing a 9.8 points per contest scoring average.

If the Tribe duo reaches the milestone this season, they would become only the third pair in history to score their 1,000th career points in the same season. Matt Courage and John Lowenhaupt both scored their 1,000th career points in 1997, while Matt Verkey and Carl Parker reached the mark in 1996. Kisielius and Mann would be the first to do it in the same season after spending their entire careers together at the College. Two other duos, Bev Vaughan and Jeff Cohen (1958-61) as well as Kevin Richardson and Keith Cieplicki (1982-85), played their entire careers together, but scored their 1,000th career points in separate seasons.

TOUGH START

W&M will continue to find the opening portion of its 2007-08 schedule a little difficult. Not only did the Tribe open with back-to-back top-25 teams, but six of its first seven games will come on the road. Following its home-opening win over Houston Baptist on Nov. 25, the Tribe will play three more games on the road before returning home on Dec. 20 against VMI.

The College opened the regular season on the road against a pair of top 25 teams in No. 5/5 Georgetown and No. 21/22 N.C. State on Nov. 15. W&M then made the trek to Staten Island, N.Y., to face Wagner on Nov. 20, before winning its home opener against Houston Baptist. The Tribe will travel to Richmond on Nov. 28, VCU on Dec. 5 and North Florida on Dec. 7, before a two-week break for final exams at the College.

The six road games in the opening seven contests start is the toughest stretch since the 2001-02 season. During that campaign, the College played nine of its first 10 games away from Williamsburg. Of those nine games, seven were road games and another two were played at neutral sites as part of tournaments.



TOUGH START PART TWO

With the Tribe's back-to-back games to open the year against No. 5/5 Georgetown and No. 21/22 N.C. State, it marked the sixth time in school history that the Tribe played back-to-back games against nationally ranked opponents. It also was the first time in over 20 years as the College last played back-to-back top-25 teams during the 1983-84 season. During that campaign, the College traveled to No. 5 Maryland on Jan. 7 and No. 12 Wake Forest on Jan. 11. W&M also played back-to-back ranked foes during the 1971-72, 1956-57, 1954-55 and 1953-54 seasons.

CAREER NIGHT FOR SUMNER

Sophomore Danny Sumner turned in the best performance of his W&M career at Wagner on Nov. 20. The 6-7 wing scored a career and team-high 18 points on 6-of-8 from the floor and 4-of-5 from 3-point range. He also pulled down a team-high four rebounds, which equaled a career-high. He also established career marks for field goals made and attempted, 3-pointers made and attempted, free throws made, rebounds and minutes.

TRIBE SIGNS PAIR TO NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT

The Tribe added a pair of players during the early signing period in the form of Quinn McDowell (Mason, Ohio/Archbishop Moeller) and Kendrix Brown (Norfolk, Va./Norview). Both players signed National Letters of Intent and will be eligible to compete for the Tribe during the 2008-09 season.

Kendrix Brown (Norfolk, Va./Norview)

Last season, Brown was a First-Team All-Eastern District selection, while averaging 15 points, seven assists, five rebounds and two steals per game at Norview. The 6-3 guard was the District Newcomer of the Year in 2004-05 and earned honorable mention all-district honors. As a sophomore, he was a second-team all-district choice.

Each of the last four years, Brown has played on the highly regarded Boo Williams AAU Travel Team. He played alongside a number of Division I basketball recruits on the squad, including national top-20 recruit and North Carolina signee Ed Davis. Brown has also taken part in the Rbk Proving Ground Regional Combine.

Quinn McDowell (Mason, Ohio/Archbishop Moeller)

McDowell is a second-generation athlete at the College. His father, Dave, graduated from W&M in 1985 after competing on the football field for current Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock from 1982-84. Last season, McDowell led Moeller to the Division I Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) Boys State Championship in front of a crowd of over 14,000. He averaged a team-best 15.1 points per game, while chipping in 4.6 rebounds and 2.0 assists per contest. McDowell shot 52 percent from the floor, 36.6 percent from 3-point range and 79.7 percent from the free throw line.

In the state semifinal against Lake St. Edward High School, the 6-5, 195-pounder finished with 19 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the field to go along with a pair of assists and two steals, while being matched up with Michigan State signee and top-15 recruit Delvon Roe, who is 6-8, 220 pounds. For his performance in the Final Four, McDowell was a First-Team Final Four All-Tournament team choice. During his junior campaign, he led Moeller to a 25-2 record and garnered First-Team All-Greater Catholic League honors as well as Third-Team All-Southwest Ohio and Cincinnati Enguirer All-City accolades.

As a sophomore, McDowell averaged 10.5 points, 2.0 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game, while shooting 45 percent from 3-point range and 79.6 percent from the free throw line. He garnered Greater Catholic League Second Team honors in 2006, while also registering honorable mention All-Southwest district distinction. McDowell played AAU for Shining Star Sports. He helped to capture eight AAU State Championships and four top-10 AAU National finishes.

PLAYING FINAL FOUR COMPETITION

For the second straight season and the 19th time overall, the W&M men's basketball team faced a NCAA Final Four opponent from the previous season in No. 5/5 Georgetown. The Hoyas advanced to their fifth Final Four last season, before falling in the semi-finals to Ohio State.

Last season, the Tribe defeated 2006 Final Four participant George Mason, 67-63, on Jan.3, marking the fifth time in school history that the College defeated a Final Four participant from the previous season. The Tribe also accomplished the feat with wins over N.C. State during the 1950-51 season, West Virginia during the 1959-60 season, North Carolina during the 1977-78 season and Virginia during the 1984-85 campaign.

The victory for the 2006-07 version of the Tribe was the first to pull the trick on the road. The previous four wins all came in contests considered home games, while W&M downed the Patriots in Fairfax, Va. The win over George Mason was also the first over a Final Four participant since the NCAA Tournament field expanded to 64. The 1984 NCAA Tournament was the final event with a 48-team field. The Tribe's victories over N.C. State in 1951 and West Virginia in 1960 were both played in Norfolk, Va., but both were considered home games.

The College played Duke on four occasions (1986-87, 1988-89, 1989-90, 1991-92 and 1999-2000) and North Carolina on three occasions (1957-58, 1977-78 and 1981-82) following Final Four trips for the schools. W&M also played West Virginia on three occasions during the 1959-60 season after the Mountaineers went to the 1959 Final Four. The Tribe has battled Jacksonville in 1970-71, Providence in 1973-74 and Maryland in 2001-02 following Final Four trips for those programs.

SMITH GOES INTERNATIONAL WITH PANAMA

Junior forward Alex Smith spent the summer competing with the Panamanian Senior National Team. He played with the squad at the FIBA Americas Championship in Las Vegas, Nev., Aug. 22-Sept. 2 as well as at the Pan-American Games, June 29-July 1.

At the FIBA Americas Championship, Smith averaged 2.5 points and 1.3 rebounds per game, coming off the Panamanian bench. In a loss to Puerto Rico, Smith notched his best statistical game with five points and three rebounds in 20 minutes of action. He also added three points, two rebounds and a steal in Panama's lone victory of the championship against Mexico on Aug. 24.

At the Pan-American Games, Smith played in four games, including one start, and averaged 4.3 points and 1.2 rebounds per game, while shooting 75 percent from the floor. He turned in his best game of the tournament against the U.S. in the fifth-place game, scoring seven points and pulling down two rebounds. Georgetown's Roy Hibbertt was a member of that U.S. Team at the Pan-American Games. Smith also competed in a third tournament with Panama over the summer in Chile. He averaged 7.3 points and 3.0 rebounds in 26.3 minutes of action over the three-game Chile Top 4 Tournament.

TRIBE ON TV

W&M will once again have a number of games televised as part of the Colonial Athletic Association's (CAA) television package for the 2007-08 season. W&M will have four games broadcast as part of the league's most comprehensive TV package in the 23-year history of the conference.

The Tribe will have a trio of games broadcast on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic and a game televised on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. Three of the Tribe's four TV games will be on the road and one will come in the friendly confines of Kaplan Arena in Williamsburg. The Tribe's contest at Old Dominion on Jan. 5, slated for an 8 p.m. tipoff, will be televised on CSN-MA. The network will also broadcast both W&M games against Towson on Jan. 19 and Feb. 16. The Jan. 19 contest is slated for a 4 p.m. tip in Williamsburg, while the Feb. 16 match up in Towson, Md., will start at 2 p.m. The Tribe's final regular season road contest at George Mason on Feb. 27 will also be a part of the television package. MASN will show the game, which is set to begin at 9 p.m.

The 80-game CAA men's basketball composite broadcast slate features 38 appearances on the various ESPN platforms, including four regular-season games and the CAA Championship on ESPN/ESPN2, 14 games on ESPNU and six syndicated games on ESPN Regional Television. The largest-ever Comcast syndicated package features more than 30 games syndicated on the Comcast family of Networks (Comcast SportsNets, SportsNet New York, CSS, CN8), allowing consistent exposure in many of the nation's largest media markets.

O'REILLY ESPNU BRACKETBUSTERS

For the second straight season, the Tribe will take part in O'Reilly ESPNU Brack-etBusters. All 12 CAA teams will compete in the sixth-annual event. After serving as a road team in 2007, the Tribe will host a game during the 2008 two-day event, Feb. 22-23. BracketBusters will feature 14 nationally televised contests on ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN Classic and ESPN360.com.

A pool of 100 teams from 16 different conferences will participate in the 2008 BracketBusters. The field includes teams with 74 appearances in the last five NCAA Tournaments, including a team in the Final Four and seven Sweet Sixteen squads. This year's coverage will feature the addition of a game on ESPN Classic. For the third straight year, ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, will televise five BracketBusters games while



ESPN360.com, ESPN's customized broadband service, will offer two. ESPN2 will televise six contests. ESPN360.com will also simulcast ESPN2's six telecasts. The BracketBusters matchups will be announced Feb. 4, while game time and network assignments will be announced Feb. 11.

The 100-team field will feature 12 teams from the CAA and the Mid-American Conference; 11 from the Ohio Valley Conference; 10 from the Missouri Valley, Horizon League and Metro Atlantic Athletic; nine from the Western Athletic Conference and Big West; four from the America East and Southern; two from the Patriot, Big Sky and Big South; one from the West Coast, Summit League and Atlantic Sun.

50 PERCENT EQUALS VICTORIES

The Tribe has been flawless under head coach Tony Shaver when it hits on 50 percent or better from the floor. The Tribe tallied five contests of 50-percent or better from the field in 2006-07. Here is a look at the Tribe's 50-percent or better shooting from the field under Shaver:

TONYSHAVER

In four seasons at W&M, head coach Tony Shaver has led a turnaround of Tribe basketball. During 2006-07 season, W&M enjoyed a breakout season, winning 15 Division I games for only the fifth time in school history. Shaver, though, believes 15 wins is only a rung on the ladder to becoming a perennial Colonial Athletic Association contender. Shaver has spent 21 seasons of coaching at the collegiate level and enters his 32nd season as a head coach.

"I do not want anyone to limit the vision of our program," Shaver said. "I am used to winning as a coach, and last season was a great step towards where I know this program can end up. As a staff, we expect big things not only from our players, but from our program as a whole."

Shaver earned CollegeInsider.com Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Tribe to a 15-15 record. It marked just the second time in the last 20 years W&M had won 15 games. Shaver also led his troops to eight wins during the tough CAA portion; only the third time in the 22-year history of the league the Tribe has accomplished that feat. Another telling stat of the progression of the program was the four CAA road victories, highlighted by a 67-63 win over 2006 Final Four participant George Mason. In Shaver's first four seasons, W&M had won only three road affairs.

The 2006-07 season brought about a change in styles for the 31st W&M head coach. After spending much of his career coaching an up-tempo offense, featuring a trapping defense, Shaver switched over to a more perimeter-oriented attack last season. The Tribe offensive scheme now spreads the floor and relies on spacing, effective perimeter shooting and players reading and reacting to teammates' cuts and motion. Defensively, W&M employs a plethora of defensive systems to throw off opposing offenses.

The new style led to the Tribe ranking among the top 50 in the country in 3-point field goal defense as well as holding its opponents to 64.2 points per game, the best mark since the 1997-98 season. The College also established school records for 3-point field goals made and 3-point field goals attempted. The success of the new approach was never more evident than in the Tribe's Feb. 14 victory over eventual National Invitational Tournament participant Drexel, 60-47, in Williamsburg. It was the lowest point production for Drexel in four seasons, and marked the highest ranked team, in terms of RPI, that W&M had defeated since 2001.

During the 2005-06 season, W&M started 4-1, marking the best start for the Tribe team since opening the 1992-93 campaign with a 6-1 record. The 4-1 start for the 2005-06 squad though was the first time in school history that the Tribe has opened a year with at least four wins in its first five games against current Division I opponents. Included in those four victories was a 70-60 win at Hampton, which went on to make the NCAA Tournament.

In November 2005, Shaver was inducted into the Episcopal High School Hall of Fame. He led EHS for 10 seasons from 1976-86. Shaver has been inducted into the Hall of Fame at both of his head coaching stops prior to taking over the reigns at W&M.

There have been individual successes as well for the Green and Gold under Shaver's reign. On four occasions, a W&M player has been named All-CAA under Shaver, while another four have been named to the CAA All-Rookie Team. 2004 graduate Adam Hess, currently playing professionally in France, became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a First-Team Academic All-American and all-conference selection as a senior. W&M players have also enjoyed success in the classroom under Shaver, as on seven occasions a Tribe player has been named to the CAA All-Academic team over the last four seasons, including a program-

high three in 2007.


Shaver was named the head coach of the Tribe on May 2, 2003. He came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious Butch Bennett Award, presented to the freshman who exemplifies determination, sportsmanship and sacrifice for the team. Shaver was voted the honoree by his teammates.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (26), Austin (23) and Jackson (16). Christopher is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization after a former standout career with the Tribe's baseball team. Austin is working toward a graduate degree in sports leadership at VCU, while working as a graduate assistant with the Ram basketball program. Jackson is a junior at Jamestown High School, and plays both basketball and baseball for the Eagles.
