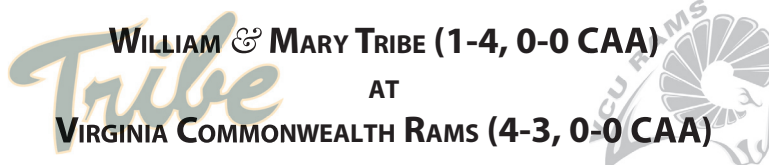

TRIBE OPENS CAA LEDGER AT VCU

The William and Mary men's basketball team will open the CAA schedule on the road at Virginia Commonwealth on Wednesday, Dec. 5. Tip-off is slated for 7:30 p.m. at the Alltel Pavilion at the Stuart C. Siegel Center. W&M and VCU will be the final two CAA teams to get the league portion of the schedule underway.

W&M is coming off its fourth road defeat of the season at Richmond, 58-55, on Nov. 28. Senior guard Nathan Mann led the way for the Tribe with 13 points on 4-of-6 from 3-point range, while juniors Alex Smith and Chris Darnell each add 10 points in the loss. The Rams are coming off an impressive 85-76 victory over ACC-foe Maryland on Dec. 2. Jamal Schuler and Eric Mayor led VCU with 30 and 25 points, respectively.

The VCU-W&M contest will be streamed over the Web via the VCU Ram Cam. The streaming is available for a monthly charge of \$8.95 at VCUAthletics.com.

The contest will be broadcast over the Tribe Radio Network with Jay Colley, Bill McDonald and Charlie Woollum on the call. The broadcast can also be heard live over the Internet at TribeAthletics.com.

STORY LINES

- W&M will look for its first victory over VCU since 2003 and its first win in Richmond over the Rams since 2000.

- The Tribe leads the CAA in 3-pointers made per game at 9.2 triples per contest. The number ranks 28th nationally.

- The contest will be the first of two road contest over a three-day stretch for W&M. The College also travels to North Florida on Dec. 7 at 7 p.m.

2007-08 W&M MEN'S BASKETBALL GAMES NOTES

AT VCU | DEC. 5, 2007 | RICHMONG, VA. | 7:30 PM

SCOUTING VCU

W&M and VCU will be the last CAA teams to begin the conference portion of the schedule when the two teams battle on Wednesday, Dec. 5, at 7:30 p.m. in Richmond. The Rams enter the contest at 4-3 overall following its biggest victory of the season, downing ACC foe Maryland, 85-76, as part of the BB&T Classic in Washington, D.C. VCU also owns victories over Maryland-Eastern Shore, Houston and Elon. The Rams defeats came to Miami (Fla.) and Arkansas at the Puerto Rico Tip-off as well as Hampton on Nov. 29.

In the victory over Maryland, the VCU pair of senior Jamal Schuler and junior Eric Maynor led the way with 55 combined points in the victory. Schuler scored a game-high 30 points, including six 3-pointers, while Maynor tallied 25 points to go along with team-highs in rebounds (8) and assists (5). The duo has been the leading force behind the Rams this season as both players rank among the top 10 in scoring in the CAA. Schuler ranks fifth in the league at 16.6 points per game, while Maynor is seventh at a 16.3 clip.

Maynor is the Rams top assist man at 5.4 per contest, which also ranks second in the CAA. The preseason CAA Player of the Year competed for Team USA over the summer at the Pan American Games. Schuler is one of the top 3-point shooters in the CAA. He leads a Ram squad that tops the CAA in 3-point field goal percentage at .429, while holding opponents to just .265 from deep. Schuler ranks second in the league in 3-point field goals per game at 3.14 to go along with a 3-point percentage of .489, which ranks third in the league.

Senior forward Michael Anderson tops the Rams in rebounding at 5.1 per contest. He also chips in 9.1 points per game and has started all seven games for VCU. Senior center Wil Fameni is averaging 7.3 points and four rebounds per game, but did not see action in the Ram's victory over Maryland.

SERIES VS. VCU

VCU holds a 25-10 advantage in the all-time series, including a 13-3 mark in Richmond. The Tribe will look to snap a 10-game losing streak to VCU, dating back to the 2002-03 season. The last W&M victory in the series came on Jan. 18, 2003 when the Tribe tallied an 88-83, double-overtime win over the Rams in Williamsburg. The College will also look for its first win in Richmond over the Rams since 2000.

W&M IN CAA OPENERS

W&M is 8-15 all-time in CAA openers. The Tribe will open the CAA slate against VCU for the third time after opening the league ledger at home against Towson last season. W&M and VCU opened the league portion of the schedule against one another in 1996 and 1998. VCU claimed a victory in 1996, while the College returned the favor in 1998. The opener on the road is the first for the College since the 2004-05 campaign. The College will look for its first victory in a CAA opener on the road since a 73-70 win over George Mason in 1991.

RICHMOND RECAP

The Tribe dropped a close, 58-55, road contest at Richmond on Nov. 28. The College rallied from a halftime deficit to take an eight-point lead midway through the second half, but could not overcome the 14 3-pointers from the Spiders.

Senior guard Nathan Mann led the Tribe in scoring with 13 points on 4-of-6 from 3-point range. Juniors Chris Darnell and Alex Smith each finished with 10 points apiece in the loss. Sophomore guard David Schneider turned in a solid all-around game for the College finishing with eight points, six rebounds and seven assists compared to only one turnover. For the second straight game, senior forward Chris Stratton provided an important spark off the bench with six points and a team-high and career-high seven rebounds, including five on the offensive end.

After trailing by five at the break, W&M opened up a five-point lead by scoring 13 of the opening 16 points of the second half. The Tribe pulled even at 34, before Darnell knocked down a trey from the left corner to give W&M the lead. Smith upped the cushion to five with a putback on his own offensive miss to give the Tribe a 39-34 advantage just 6:30 into the second half.

Darnell's second 3-pointer of the second half pushed the W&M lead to eight, 44-36, at the 10:24 mark. The Tribe maintained the advantage and led 49-41 with 7:39 remaining in the second. Richmond came roaring back by way of the longball as the Spiders connected on four straight over a two-minute stretch to retake the lead.

After Kevin Smith knocked down a triple from the left wing out of the media timeout,

it was David Gonzalvez who took over for the Spiders. Over a 1:14, the sophomore guard knocked down three straight 3-pointers from deep to turn a six-point W&M lead, 50-44, into a three-point UR advantage, 53-50, with 4:45 remaining in the contest.

The Tribe pulled to within two at 55-53 on a lay-up from Smith, but it was again Gonzalvez who hit his seventh 3-pointer of the game to push the UR lead to 58-53 with 1:46 remaining.

W&M was able to cut the deficit to a single possession with 51 seconds remaining as senior Laimis Kisielius found Darnell for a lay up. After W&M held UR on the defensive end, Kisielius tried to a driving lay-up but had it blocked out a bounds. Following a Tribe timeout with 9.8 seconds remaining, Kisielius took a 3-pointer from the right wing, but it hit off the front iron and UR got the rebound to clinch the victory

The Tribe dominated Richmond on the boards, outrebounding the Spiders, 38-26. W&M knocked down eight 3-point field goals and dished out 14 assists.

Each team started the game on runs as the Spiders hit back-to-back treys to open the game, before W&M responded with seven straight points. A Nathan Mann 3-pointer five minutes into the game put the Tribe on top 7-6. Richmond came right back with eight consecutive points capped by treys from Justin Harper and Gonzalvez to take a 14-7 lead.

Following the trey from Gonzalvez, the Tribe defense tighten and held the Spiders without a field goal for the next five minutes as the College mounted an 11-2 run to retake the lead. Schneider followed four straight Chris Stratton points with a 3-pointer from the right corner to give W&M an 18-16 lead with 6:06 remaining in the opening half.

Richmond answered again as Ryan Butler drilled a three from the left wing, before five more UR points pushed the cushion to 24-18 with 3:03 remaining. W&M drew to within three at 29-26 following a 3-pointer and a free throw from Mann, but UR took a five-point cushion, 31-26, to the locker room on a Harper jumper with six seconds remaining.

TURNING THE CALENDAR

W&M will leave the month of November behind it, and turn its attention to December. While the Tribe is off to a difficult 1-4 start, the 2007-08 season appears to be taking a similar track as the 2006-07 campaign. Last season, the Tribe started the year 1-3, before rebounding with a hot month of December in which the College went 6-1, including the start of a seven-game winning streak with four straight to end the month. The seven-game winning streak propelled the Tribe to 15 wins last season, the most in nearly a decade.

FAMILY TIES

W&M head coach Tony Shaver will see a familiar face across the way on the VCU sidelines Wednesday night. One of Shaver's three sons, Austin, serves as a graduate assistant for the Ram program. Austin is working toward a graduate degree in sports leadership at VCU.

SMITH RETURNS

After missing the better part of three games due to an injury, junior forward Alex Smith returned to action for the Tribe at Richmond. Smith suffered an injury prior to the Tribe's game with N.C. State and sat out. He tried to battle through the injury, but was limited to five minutes and aggravated the injury at Wagner. He also missed the Tribe's home opening victory over Houston Baptist on Nov. 25. Against Richmond, Smith finished with 10 points, four rebounds and a blocked shot in 16 minutes of action

SPARK OFF THE BENCH

After playing sparingly in his first three seasons with the College, senior forward Chris Stratton has made his presence felt as a spark off the W&M bench in the early going this season. Over the Tribe's last two games, Stratton is averaging 8.0 points 5.5 rebounds in 20 minutes of action.

In the Tribe's 79-70 win over Houston Baptist, the Burke, Va., native finished with 10 points and four rebounds in 18 minutes of action, providing a much-needed spark that allowed the College to overcome an early deficit. The 10 points were a career-best for Stratton and nearly half his previous career total of 24 entering the game.

The 6-6, 225-pounder followed that performance with a game-high seven rebounds, including five on the offensive glass, at Richmond. Stratton also finished with six points in a career-high 22 minutes against the Spiders.

2007-08 W&M MEN'S BASKETBALL GAMES NOTES

SENSATIONAL START FOR SCHNEIDER

After earning CAA All-Rookie team honors a season ago, much was expected of sophomore guard David Schneider and the Phoenix, Ariz., native has done little to disappoint. Prior to the Tribe's contest against Richmond, he led W&M in scoring with 18 points at Wagner and a career-high 19 in the victory over Houston Baptist. He currently leads the Tribe in points per game 13.6, which ranks 15th in the CAA.

Despite struggling from the field and only finishing with eight points against Richmond, Schneider equaled his career high with seven assists. Even more impressive than his seven dimes was the fact that he only turned the ball over one time in 36 minutes. Schneider currently ranks third in the CAA in assist-to-turnover ratio and eighth in assists per game.

Schneider has been hot from deep during the opening part of the season, connecting on 48.4 percent (15-of-31) of his 3-point attempts. He has knocked down four 3-pointers in three of the first five games this season. He ranks third in the CAA in 3-pointers made per game and fourth in 3-point field goal percentage. His 3-pointers made per game ranks 49th in the country, while his 3-point percentage ranks 33rd. The 6-2 guard has also been nearly flawless from the free throw line. His percentage of 88.2 ranks third in the CAA.

MANN ON THE MARK

Senior guard Nathan Mann continues to establish himself as one of the top 3-point shooters in W&M history. With his quartet of treys at Richmond on Nov. 28, Mann moved past Greg Burzell into third on the Tribe career 3-point field goals made list. The Overland Park, Kan., native has knocked down 154 treys over his W&M career on 443 chances.

Mann also ranks among the top-10 in W&M history in career 3-pointers attempted, made per game and percentage. He currently sits fourth on the career 3-point field goals attempted list and eighth on the Tribe career 3-point field goal percentage list at 34.8. On average, Mann has knocked down 1.69 treys per game, which ranks sixth in the program's annals. Mann is five 3-point attempts shy of passing former All-CAA performer Adam Hess on the career attempts list and only 18 treys short of passing Randy Bracey for second on the 3-pointers made ledger.

This season, Mann ranks among the CAA leaders in 3-point shooting. He is seventh in 3-pointers made per game at 2.4 and 10th in 3-point field goal percentage at 38.7.

CHASING 400

With the Tribe's home-opening victory over Houston Baptist, W&M head coach Tony Shaver took another step closer to the 400-win mark. The victory on Nov. 25 was the 397th of Shaver's collegiate coaching career. He is only three wins shy of joining the 400-win club. Shaver is in his 22nd season patrolling the sidelines in college basketball. Prior to his stint at W&M, he spent 17 seasons as the head man at Hampden-Sydney College in Virginia.

TAKING CHARGE

Junior forward Peter Stein has been a fixture in the Tribe lineup over the last two seasons. While he has shown the ability to score both inside and outside, the 6-9, 235-pounder is the most valuable on the defensive end for the Tribe. Stein is averaging over a charge taken per game this season and leads the team in that category with six on the year.

DISHING IT OUT

The Tribe has made it a habit of sharing the basketball and making the extra pass. The College currently ranks third in the CAA in assists per game at 14.2 per contest. The Tribe dished out a season-high 19 assists at Wagner, before following that performance up with 18 dimes in the home opener against Houston Baptist.

Sophomore guard David Schneider and senior wing Laimis Kisielius lead the Tribe charge in assists at 3.6 and 3.4 per contest, respectively. Schneider ranks eighth in the CAA, while Kisielius is 12th. Both players have tallied career-high totals in assists as Kisielius dropped seven dimes against Wagner and Schneider dished out seven helpers at Richmond.

The Tribe has also done a good job of protecting the basketball this season. Coupled with its low number of turnovers, the Tribe ranks among the best in the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio. W&M ranks second in the league at a ratio of 1.11. Schneider (third at 1.8) and Kisielius (seventh at 1.42) rank among the top 10 in the league in assist-to-turnover ratio. The pair makes the College one of two teams in the league to have two players ranked among the top-10 in the category. W&M also ranks among the national leaders in fewest turnovers per game. The College is 35th nationally averaging only 12.8 turnovers per game.

BOMBS AWAY

W&M has proven that opposing defenses need to be well aware of the Tribe's ability to shot the basketball from 3-point range. In two games this season, W&M has knocked double-digit treys. The College connected on 14 at Wagner, before hitting on 10 in the home opener against Houston Baptist. It marked the 10th and 11th times under head coach Tony Shaver that W&M has connected on 10 or more 3-point field goals in a game. W&M is 6-5 in those 11 games.

The back-to-back double-digit 3-pointers made performance marks the second time that has happened under Shaver. W&M also knocked down 10-plus threes in two straight games during his first season in 2003-04. The College connected on 14 treys against Liberty on Nov. 23, 2003, before hitting for 11 vs. Radford on Nov. 24, 2003.

Against Wagner, the College connected on 14-of-30 from long range, including a 10-of-20 effort in the second half. The 14 treys tied for the third-most in school history, trailing only the school-record marks of 16 hit against George Mason on Jan. 24, 1996 and versus UNC Greensboro on Dec. 21, 1993. The 10 second-half triples were also the third most in a single half for the College.

The Tribe leads the CAA and ranks among the national leaders in 3-pointers made per game. The College has connected on 9.2 treys per game and also leads the CAA in 3-point field goals attempted. The Tribe's 9.2 3-pointers made per game ranks 28th nationally.

NEARLY A DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Junior forward Chris Darnell narrowly missed garnering the Tribe's first double-double in two seasons. In the Tribe's home opening win over Houston Baptist, the Stafford, Va., native posted career highs with 12 points and nine rebounds, coming just one board shy of a double-double. He followed that performance up with his second straight double-digit scoring performance with 10 against Richmond. He was 4-of-5 from the floor and 2-of-3 from 3-point range against the Spiders.

After averaging just 10 minutes per game through his freshman and sophomore campaigns, Darnell has started the opening four games of the year for the Tribe and ranks second on the team in minutes per game at 31.2. He is the College's leading rebounder at 5.2 per contest to go along with 8.0 points per game. His rebounding total ranks 16th in the CAA.

WINNING THE HOME OPENER

With its 79-70 win over Houston Baptist on Nov. 25, the Tribe improved to 28-10 overall in home openers at Kaplan Arena. The College also bumped its winning streak in home openers to five. The College has not lost a home opener under head coach Tony Shaver. In fact, the Tribe has won eight of its last nine home openers.

1,000 WITHIN REACH

Both Tribe seniors Laimis Kisielius and Nathan Mann are within reach of the 1,000-point club. The duo could become the 29th and 30th members of the exclusive club in the 103-year history of Tribe basketball. Kisielius currently has 832 career points, needing only 168, while Mann has 767 career points and needs 233. Those numbers equate to Kisielius needing to average seven points per game over the rest of the regular season to reach 1,000 points and Mann needing a 9.7 points per contest scoring average.

If the Tribe duo reaches the milestone this season, they would become only the third pair in history to score their 1,000th career points in the same season. Matt Courage and John Lowenhaupt both scored their 1,000th career points in 1997, while Matt Verkey and

Carl Parker reached the mark in 1996. Kisielius and Mann would be the first to do it in the same season after spending their entire careers together at the College. Two other duos, Bev Vaughan and Jeff Cohen (1958-61) as well as Kevin Richardson and Keith Cieplicki (1982-85), played their entire careers together, but scored their 1,000th career points in separate seasons.

KNOCKING DOWN THE FREEBIES

The College used the free throw line to its advantage against Houston Baptist. W&M connected on 93.8 percent from the free throw line, knocking down 15 of its 16 chances. In fact, the Tribe was a perfect 12-of-12 in the first half against the Huskies.

It marked the fifth time under W&M head coach Tony Shaver that the Tribe has connected on 90 percent or better of its free throws in a game. The Green and Gold are 3-2 in those contests. The College currently ranks second in the CAA, hitting on 74.6 percent from the charity stripe.

TOUGH START

W&M will continue to find the opening portion of its 2007-08 schedule a little difficult. Not only did the Tribe open with back-to-back top-25 teams, but six of its first seven games will come on the road.

The College opened the regular season on the road against a pair of top 25 teams in No. 5/5 Georgetown and No. 21/22 N.C. State on Nov. 15. W&M then made the trek to Staten Island, N.Y., to face Wagner on Nov. 20, before winning its home opener against Houston Baptist. W&M will return to Richmond for the second straight week to play VCU on Dec. 5, after dropping a tight road affair at Richmond on Nov. 28. The Tribe will wrap up the road swing at North Florida on Dec. 7, before a two-week break for final exams at the College.

The six road games in the opening seven contests start is the toughest stretch since the 2001-02 season. During that campaign, the College played nine of its first 10 games away from Williamsburg. Of those nine games, seven were road games and another two were played at neutral sites as part of tournaments.

TOUGH START PART TWO

With the Tribe's back-to-back games to open the year against No. 5/5 Georgetown and No. 21/22 N.C. State, it marked the sixth time in school history that the Tribe played back-to-back games against nationally ranked opponents. It also was the first time in over 20 years as the College last played back-to-back top-25 teams during the 1983-84 season. During that campaign, the College traveled to No. 5 Maryland on Jan. 7 and No. 12 Wake Forest on Jan. 11. W&M also played back-to-back ranked foes during the 1971-72, 1956-57, 1954-55 and 1953-54 seasons.

TRIBE SIGNS PAIR TO NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT

The Tribe added a pair of players during the early signing period in the form of Quinn McDowell (Mason, Ohio/Archbishop Moeller) and Kendrix Brown (Norfolk, Va./Norview). Both players signed National Letters of Intent and will be eligible to compete for the Tribe during the 2008-09 season.

Kendrix Brown (Norfolk, Va./Norview)

Last season, Brown was a First-Team All-Eastern District selection, while averaging 15 points, seven assists, five rebounds and two steals per game at Norview. The 6-3 guard was the District Newcomer of the Year in 2004-05 and earned honorable mention all-district honors. As a sophomore, he was a second-team all-district choice.

Each of the last four years, Brown has played on the highly regarded Boo Williams AAU Travel Team. He played alongside a number of Division I basketball recruits on the squad, including national top-20 recruit and North Carolina signee Ed Davis. Brown has also taken part in the Rbk Proving Ground Regional Combine.

Quinn McDowell (Mason, Ohio/Archbishop Moeller)

McDowell is a second-generation athlete at the College. His father, Dave, graduated from W&M in 1985 after competing on the football field for current Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock from 1982-84. Last season, McDowell led Moeller to the Division I Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) Boys State Championship in front of a crowd of over 14,000. He averaged a team-best 15.1 points per game, while chipping in 4.6 rebounds and 2.0 assists per contest. McDowell shot 52 percent from the floor, 36.6 percent from 3-point range and 79.7 percent from the free throw line.

In the state semifinal against Lake St. Edward High School, the 6-5, 195-pounder finished with 19 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the field to go along with a pair of assists and two steals, while being matched up with Michigan State signee and top-15 recruit Delvon Roe, who is 6-8, 220 pounds. For his performance in the Final Four, McDowell was a First-Team Final Four All-Tournament team choice. During his junior campaign, he led Moeller to a 25-2 record and garnered First-Team All-Greater Catholic League honors as well as Third-Team All-Southwest Ohio and Cincinnati Enquirer All-City accolades.

As a sophomore, McDowell averaged 10.5 points, 2.0 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game, while shooting 45 percent from 3-point range and 79.6 percent from the free throw line. He garnered Greater Catholic League Second Team honors in 2006, while also registering honorable mention All-Southwest district distinction. McDowell played AAU for Shining Star Sports. He helped to capture eight AAU State Championships and four top-10 AAU National finishes.

PLAYING FINAL FOUR COMPETITION

For the second straight season and the 19th time overall, the W&M men's basketball team faced a NCAA Final Four opponent from the previous season in No. 5/5 Georgetown. The Hoyas advanced to their fifth Final Four last season, before falling in the semifinals to Ohio State.

Last season, the Tribe defeated 2006 Final Four participant George Mason, 67-63, on Jan. 3, marking the fifth time in school history that the College defeated a Final Four participant from the previous season. The Tribe also accomplished the feat with wins over N.C. State during the 1950-51 season, West Virginia during the 1959-60 season, North Carolina during the 1977-78 season and Virginia during the 1984-85 campaign.

The victory for the 2006-07 version of the Tribe was the first to pull the trick on the road. The previous four wins all came in contests considered home games, while W&M downed the Patriots in Fairfax, Va. The win over George Mason was also the first over a Final Four participant since the NCAA Tournament field expanded to 64. The 1984 NCAA Tournament was the final event with a 48-team field. The Tribe's victories over N.C. State in 1951 and West Virginia in 1960 were both played in Norfolk, Va., but both were considered home games.

The College played Duke on four occasions (1986-87, 1988-89, 1989-90, 1991-92 and 1999-2000) and North Carolina on three occasions (1957-58, 1977-78 and 1981-82) following Final Four trips for the schools. W&M also played West Virginia on three occasions during the 1959-60 season after the Mountaineers went to the 1959 Final Four. The Tribe has battled Jacksonville in 1970-71, Providence in 1973-74 and Maryland in 2001-02 following Final Four trips for those programs.

SMITH GOES INTERNATIONAL WITH PANAMA

Junior forward Alex Smith spent the summer competing with the Panamanian Senior National Team. He played with the squad at the FIBA Americas Championship in Las Vegas, Nev., Aug. 22-Sept. 2 as well as at the Pan-American Games, June 29-July 1.

At the FIBA Americas Championship, Smith averaged 2.5 points and 1.3 rebounds per game, coming off the Panamanian bench. In a loss to Puerto Rico, Smith notched his best statistical game with five points and three rebounds in 20 minutes of action. He also added three points, two rebounds and a steal in Panama's lone victory of the championship against Mexico on Aug. 24.

At the Pan-American Games, Smith played in four games, including one start, and averaged 4.3 points and 1.2 rebounds per game, while shooting 75 percent from the floor. He turned in his best game of the tournament against the U.S. in the fifth-place game, scoring seven points and pulling down two rebounds. Georgetown's Roy Hibbert was a member of that U.S. Team at the Pan-American Games. Smith also competed in a third tournament with Panama over the summer in Chile. He averaged 7.3 points and 3.0 rebounds in 26.3 minutes of action over the three-game Chile Top 4 Tournament.

TRIBE ON TV

W&M will once again have a number of games televised as part of the Colonial Athletic Association's (CAA) television package for the 2007-08 season. W&M will have four games broadcast as part of the league's most comprehensive TV package in the 23-year history of the conference.

The Tribe will have a trio of games broadcast on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic and a game televised on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. Three of the Tribe's four TV games will be on the road and one will come in the friendly confines of Kaplan Arena in Williamsburg. The Tribe's contest at Old Dominion on Jan. 5, slated for an 8 p.m. tipoff, will be

televised on CSN-MA. The network will also broadcast both W&M games against Towson on Jan. 19 and Feb. 16. The Jan. 19 contest is slated for a 4 p.m. tip in Williamsburg, while the Feb. 16 match up in Towson, Md., will start at 2 p.m. The Tribe's final regular season road contest at George Mason on Feb. 27 will also be a part of the television package. MASN will show the game, which is set to begin at 9 p.m.

The 80-game CAA men's basketball composite broadcast slate features 38 appearances on the various ESPN platforms, including four regular-season games and the CAA Championship on ESPN/ESPN2, 14 games on ESPNU and six syndicated games on ESPN Regional Television. The largest-ever Comcast syndicated package features more than 30 games syndicated on the Comcast family of Networks (Comcast SportsNets, SportsNet New York, CSS, CN8), allowing consistent exposure in many of the nation's largest media markets.

O'REILLY ESPNU BRACKETBUSTERS

For the second straight season, the Tribe will take part in O'Reilly ESPNU BracketBusters. All 12 CAA teams will compete in the sixth-annual event. After serving as a road team in 2007, the Tribe will host a game during the 2008 two-day event, Feb. 22-23. BracketBusters will feature 14 nationally televised contests on ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN Classic and ESPN360.com.

A pool of 100 teams from 16 different conferences will participate in the 2008 BracketBusters. The field includes teams with 74 appearances in the last five NCAA Tournaments, including a team in the Final Four and seven Sweet Sixteen squads. This year's coverage will feature the addition of a game on ESPN Classic. For the third straight year, ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, will televise five BracketBusters games while ESPN360.com, ESPN's customized broadband service, will offer two. ESPN2 will televise six contests. ESPN360.com will also simulcast ESPN2's six telecasts. The BracketBusters matchups will be announced Feb. 4, while game time and network assignments will be announced Feb. 11.

The 100-team field will feature 12 teams from the CAA and the Mid-American Conference; 11 from the Ohio Valley Conference; 10 from the Missouri Valley, Horizon League and Metro Atlantic Athletic; nine from the Western Athletic Conference and Big West; four from the America East and Southern; two from the Patriot, Big Sky and Big South; one from the West Coast, Summit League and Atlantic Sun.

TONY SHAVER

Head Coach • Fifth Season at W&M

In four seasons at W&M, head coach Tony Shaver has led a turnaround of Tribe basketball. During 2006-07 season, W&M enjoyed a breakout season, winning 15 Division I games for only the fifth time in school history. Shaver, though, believes 15 wins is only a rung on the ladder to becoming a perennial Colonial Athletic Association contender. Shaver has spent 21 seasons of coaching at the collegiate level and enters his 32nd season as a head coach.

"I do not want anyone to limit the vision of our program," Shaver said. "I am used to winning as a coach, and last season was a great step towards where I know this program can end up. As a staff, we expect big things not only from our players, but from our program as a whole."

Shaver earned CollegelInsider.com Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Tribe to a 15-15 record. It marked just the second time in the last 20 years W&M had won 15 games. Shaver also led his troops to eight wins during the tough CAA portion; only the third time in the 22-year history of the league the Tribe has accomplished that feat. Another telling stat of the progression of the program was the four CAA road victories, highlighted by a 67-63 win over 2006 Final Four participant George Mason. In Shaver's first four seasons, W&M had won only three road affairs.

The 2006-07 season brought about a change in styles for the 31st W&M head coach. After spending much of his career coaching an up-tempo offense, featuring a trapping defense, Shaver switched over to a more perimeter-oriented attack last season. The Tribe offensive scheme now spreads the floor and relies on spacing, effective perimeter shooting and players reading and reacting to teammates' cuts and motion. Defensively, W&M employs a plethora of defensive systems to throw off opposing offenses.

The new style led to the Tribe ranking among the top 50 in the country in 3-point field goal defense as well as holding its opponents to 64.2 points per game, the best mark since the 1997-98 season. The College also established school records for 3-point field goals made and 3-point field goals attempted. The success of the new approach was never more evident than in the Tribe's Feb. 14 victory over eventual National Invitational Tournament participant Drexel, 60-47, in Williamsburg. It was the lowest point production for Drexel in four seasons, and marked the highest ranked team, in terms of RPI, that W&M had defeated since 2001.

During the 2005-06 season, W&M started 4-1, marking the best start for the Tribe team since opening the 1992-93 campaign with a 6-1 record. The 4-1 start for the 2005-06 squad though was the first time in school history that the Tribe has opened a year with at least four wins in its first five games against current Division I opponents. Included in those four victories was a 70-60 win at Hampton, which went on to make the NCAA Tournament.

In November 2005, Shaver was inducted into the Episcopal High School Hall of Fame. He led EHS for 10 seasons from 1976-86. Shaver has been inducted into the Hall of Fame at both of his head coaching stops prior to taking over the reigns at W&M.

There have been individual successes as well for the Green and Gold under Shaver's reign. On four occasions, a W&M player has been named All-CAA under Shaver, while another four have been named to the CAA All-Rookie Team. 2004 graduate Adam Hess, currently playing professionally in France, became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a First-Team Academic All-American and all-conference selection as a senior. W&M players have also enjoyed success in the classroom under Shaver, as on seven occasions a Tribe player has been named to the CAA All-Academic team over the last four seasons, including a program-

high three in 2007.

Shaver was named the head coach of the Tribe on May 2, 2003. He came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious Butch Bennett Award, presented to the freshman who exemplifies determination, sportsmanship and sacrifice for the team. Shaver was voted the honoree by his teammates.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (26), Austin (23) and Jackson (16). Christopher is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization after a former standout career with the Tribe's baseball team. Austin is working toward a graduate degree in sports leadership at VCU, while working as a graduate assistant with the Ram basketball program. Jackson is a junior at Jamestown High School, and plays both basketball and baseball for the Eagles.
