TRIBE CONTINUES EARLY-SEASON ROAD TRIP

The William and Mary men's basketball team continues its early season road slate when it travels to Staten Island, N.Y. to face Wagner on Tuesday, Nov. 20. Tip-off is scheduled for 7 p.m. It marks the second straight year the Tribe and Seahawks will meet.

The College will look for its first win of the season after dropping back-to-back games to top-25 teams in No. 5 Georgetown and No. 21 N.C. State. Most recently, the Tribe fell 66-47 to the Wolfpack. W&M pulled to within five points, 49-44, with under eight minutes remaining, but N.C. State scored 10 straight points to put the game out of reach. Wagner is coming off back-to-back losses as well, including a 72-69 setback at Saint Peter's on Nov. 17.

SCOUTING WAGNER

Wagner enters the game with a 1-2 mark on the year after dropping each of its last two games. The Seahawks dropped a 72-69 contest to Saint Peter's on Saturday. Wagner overcame a 14-point deficit to take a five-point second half lead, before a Saint Peter's 3-pointer with six seconds remaining gave the Peacocks the victory.

The Seahawks also lost at home against Manhattan after opening the season with a 74-70 win at Lafayette. Wagner was picked to finish third in the Northeast Conference by the league's coaches.

Joey Mundwiler led the Seahawks with 17 points against Saint Peter's knocking down a trio of 3-pointers. He is one of four players who average in double digits for Wagner. Mundwiler averages 11.7 point per game and is the Seahawks top threat from 3-point range. He has connected on 41.2 percent from long range.

Durell Vinson leads the Seahawks in scoring at 15 points per game. He opened the season with a double-double on 22 points and 14 rebounds in the victory over Lafayette. Vinson is the Seahawks leading rebounder as well at 9.3 per contest. For the year, Vinson is shooting 65.6 percent from the floor. Jamal Smith and Mark Porter round out the double-digit scorers for Wagner at 10 points per game. Porter is also the Seahawks leading assist guy at 3.3 per game.

Wagner averages 40 rebounds per game, including over 15 offensive boards per game. The Seahawks average 66.3 points per game, while shooting 40.3 percent from the floor and only 24.5 percent from 3-point range.

IN THE SERIES

The Tribe leads the all-time series with Wagner at 3-0. The trip on Tuesday will be the College first to Staten Island as the previous three meetings have come in Williamsburg, including a 77-53 win last season.

W&M is 4-1 on Nov. 20. It marks the second straight season that the College will meet Wagner on Nov. 20. Last season, the Tribe downed the Seahawks, 77-53. The first time W&M played on the date was in 1999 when it opened with a 92-39 win over Washington College. The following season, W&M beat Virginia Tech, 48-46, in Blacksburg. On Nov. 20, 2001, the Tribe fell at High Point, 63-57. W&M played on Nov. 20 was during the first W&M Tip-Off Classic in 2004. The College defeated Radford, 81-76, to claim the title. Nathan Mann had 14 points and five assists, while Laimis Kisielius chipped in 11 points.

N.C. STATE RECAP

W&M continued its tough early season schedule falling at No. 21/22 (AP/Coaches) N.C. State, 66-47. After struggling from the field for most of the contest, the Tribe closed the Wolfpack advantage to five with under eight minutes remaining, before NCSU used a 10-point run to put the game out of reach.

Senior Laimis Kisielius led the Tribe attack with 12 points, including a pair of 3-pointers. Sophomore guard David Schneider finished with nine points and a team-high six rebounds, while junior forward Chris Darnell equaled his career high with eight points to go along with five rebounds, two assists and a blocked shot.

The College stuck with the Wolfpack for the majority of the first half as the two teams traded buckets. The opening 11 minutes of the game featured seven ties, before the Tribe opened up its first lead of the opening half. Schneider and sophomore Danny Summer connected on back-to-back treys to keep the Tribe even, before Darnell knocked down a pair of free throws to give W&M a 21-20 advantage with 9:04 left

N.C. State answered with a 15-3 run over the next five minutes to open up its first double-digit lead of the game. The Wolfpack scored six straight points to open the run,

Both conference stats are from the 2006-07 season before capping the spurt with eight straight points. NCSU took a 13-point cushion to the locker room at 39-26.

The Wolfpack lead ballooned with 16 in the opening five minutes of the second half. State freshman J.J. Hickson, who led all scorers with 31 points, scored the opening eight tallies of the second-half to give the Wolfpack its largest lead to that point.

W&M would not go quietly though as it responded with a 13-2 run of its own to close the deficit to five with under eight minutes to play. Darnell and junior forward Peter Stein scored the opening eight points on the run with four apiece to close the Tribe to within 10. Senior guard Nathan Mann connected from downtown, before a Kisielius bucket in the paint cut the deficit to 49-44.

The Tribe comeback would not come to fruition though as N.C. State scored 10 straight points to put the game out of reach. Brandon Costner, who finished with a double-double on 13 points and 12 rebounds, drilled a three from the left corner and Courtney Fells hit a trey from the right wing to push the NCSU lead back to double digits.

WAGNER LAST SEASON

W&M started its 2006-07 home opener against Wagner with an 8-0 run, and never looked back in a 77-53 win. The Tribe used its balance with 10 players logging 10 or more minutes and six finishing with seven or more points. W&M shot 50 percent from the field, while holding the Seahawks to a 32.7 clip from the floor and forcing 19 turnovers.

Laimis Kisielius led the Tribe with 18 points on 8-of-12 shooting, including a pair of 3-point field goals. Danny Sumner tallied 12 points, the first of his W&M career, in the victory to go along with three rebounds. David Schneider turned in an eight-point, six-assist night in 25 minutes of action.

Kisielius started the Tribe off with eight straight points in the opening two minutes. The Vilnius, Lithuania native busted back-to-back threes after scoring on a fast break lay-up off a dish from Schneider. The Seahawks broke the streak with a dunk from James Ulrich at the 17:58 mark.

The closest the Seahawks would make it over the remainder of the contest was two points at 13-11 with 11:06 to go in the first half. Llewchean Radford capped a six-point spurt for Wagner with a lay-up.

The Tribe responded by scoring 13 of the game's next 16 points to push its advantage to double-digits. The College showed its balance during the run, as six different players found the scoring column. Kyle Carrabine scored on a cutting move to the basket off a dish from Chris Darnell, who finished with a career-high three assists, before adding the free throw for the conventional 3-point play.

Darnell found a wide-open Adam Trumbower as the shot clock expired to push the advantage to 10. Darnell finished the run with a jumper, giving W&M a 26-14 lead with 2:16 remaining in the opening half. W&M led 31-20 at the break.

The Tribe lead reached 20 midway through the second half. After Wagner closed 38-26 on a 3-pointer from Mark Porter at the 17:17 mark of the second stanza, the Tribe went on a 14-3 run to put the Seahawks away, extending its lead to 52-29 with 12:56 left.

TOUGH START

W&M will find the opening portion of its 2007-08 schedule a little difficult. Not only did the Tribe open with back-to-back top-25 teams, but six of its first seven games will come on the road.

The College opened the regular season on the road against a pair of top 25 teams in No. 5/5 Georgetown and No. 21/22 N.C. State on Nov. 15. W&M will next face Wagner in Staten Island on Nov. 20, before it opens the home portion of its slate on Sunday, Nov. 25, against Houston Baptist. The Tribe will then travel to Richmond on Nov. 28, VCU on Dec. 5 and North Florida on Dec. 7, before a two-week break for final exams at the College.

The six road games in the opening seven contests start is the toughest stretch since the 2001-02 season. During that campaign, the College played nine of its first 10 games away from Williamsburg. Of those nine games, seven were road games and another two were played at neutral sites as part of tournaments.

TOUGH START PART TWO

With the Tribe's back-to-back games to open the year against No. 5/5 Georgetown and No. 21/22 N.C. State, it marked the sixth time in school history that the Tribe played back-to-back games against nationally ranked opponents. It also was the first time in over 20 years as the College last played back-to-back top-25 teams during the 1983-84 sea-



son. During that campaign, the College traveled to No. 5 Maryland on Jan. 7 and No. 12 Wake Forest on Jan. 11. W&M also played back-to-back ranked foes during the 1971-72, 1956-57, 1954-55 and 1953-54 seasons.

PROTECTING THE LEATHER

The Tribe has done an excellent job of taking care of the basketball against two of the most athletic teams the College will see all season. W&M only turned the ball over 11 times in the season-opener at No. 5 Georgetown, before limiting itself to 10 turnovers against N.C. State. Through the opening two games this season, the College has an assist-to-turnover ratio of 0.95, which ranks third in the CAA.

BOMBS AWAY

Last season, the College set school records for 3-point field goals made and attempted. Those records might not stand long if the Tribe's opening game is any indication. W&M finished with nine 3-point field goals made on 33 attempts from deep against the No. 5-ranked Hoyas. Last season, W&M connected on eight or more field goals on 12 occasions and nine or more five times. The 33 3-point field goals attempted were the most for a Tribe team since hoisting up 34 against Radford on Nov. 24, 2003.

CHASING 400

W&M head coach Tony Shaver is in his 22nd season patrolling the sidelines in college basketball. Prior to his stint at W&M, Shaver spent 17 seasons as the head man at Hampden-Sydney College in Virginia. Shaver currently has 396 career wins between W&M and Hampden-Sydney, needing only four wins to join the 400-win club.

1,000 WITHIN REACH

Both Tribe seniors Laimis Kisielius and Nathan Mann are within reach of the 1,000-point club. The duo could become the 29th and 30th members of the exclusive club in the 103-year history of Tribe basketball. Kisielius currently has 799 career points, needing only 201, while Mann has 732 career points and needs 268. Those numbers equate to Kisielius needing to average 7.4 points per game over the rest of the regular season to reach 1,000 points and Mann needing a 9.9 points per contest scoring average.

If the Tribe duo reaches the milestone this season, they would become only the third pair in history to score their 1,000th career points in the same season. Matt Courage and John Lowenhaupt both scored their 1,000th career points in 1997, while Matt Verkey and Carl Parker reached the mark in 1996. Kisielius and Mann would be the first to do it in the same season after spending their entire careers together at the College. Two other duos, Bev Vaughan and Jeff Cohen (1958-61) as well as Kevin Richardson and Keith Cieplicki (1982-85), played their entire careers together, but scored their 1,000th career points in separate seasons.

MANN ON THE MARK

Senior guard Nathan Mann moved up the Tribe's all-time career 3-pointers made list with a trio of treys this season. He connected on a pair of trifectas against Georgetown before hitting on another against N.C. State. The treys pushed Mann's career total to 145, moving him in to fourth on the career list a head of former All-CAA player Adam Hess, who is currently playing professionally over in France. Mann needs five more 3-point field goals to tie Greg Burzell for third on the all-time list.

Mann also ranks among the top-10 in W&M history in career 3-pointers attempted, made per game and percentage. He currently sits fourth on the career 3-point field goals attempted list. He has connected on 145-of-426 from deep for a percentage of 34.0 over his career. That number ranks 10th on the Tribe career 3-point field goal percentage list. On average, Mann has knocked down 1.63 treys per game, which ranks seventh in the program's annals.

BIG TIME OPPONENT, BIG TIME PLAYER

After earning CAA All-Rookie Team honors last season, sophomore David Schneider needs little reason to get up for a game, but a quick look at the stats would show that that a major conference opponent brings out the best in him. In the season opener at Kansas State last season, Schneider flirted with a triple-double on his way to team-high honors in points (18), rebounds (9), assists (7) and steals (4) in 38 minutes of action. The Phoenix, Ariz., native put up similar numbers in his 2007-08 season debut against No. 5 George-

town. In 38 minutes of action, Schneider scored 14 points, while finishing with team-best honors in rebounds (7), assists (4), steals (2) and 3-point field goals made (4). Over the opening two games this season, Schneider is averaging 11.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.0 steals per game, while connecting on a team-high 45.5 percent from 3-point range.

NO ANSWERS

The Tribe led 2007 Final Four participant and No. 5-ranked Georgetown for long stretches in the opening half and by as many as five. W&M's success in the opening half can be directly attributed to the play of senior Laimis Kisielius. The Hoyas had no answers for the Vilnius, Lithuania native as he tallied all 16 of his points in the opening 20 minutes of the game. He connected on 6-of-8 from the field, displaying a plethora of offensive moves. He also connected on 3-of-4 from the charity stripe in the opening 20 minutes.

GUARDS CRASHING THE BOARDS

W&M stayed close on the boards with a much taller Georgetown team, due in large part to the successful rebounding of the Tribe's guards. Sophomore guard David Schneider and senior Nathan Mann both led the Tribe with seven rebounds apiece. Schneider followed that performance up by leading the Tribe in rebounding for a second-straight game against N.C. State.

The success of W&M guards on the boards is nothing new to the program. Last season, the Tribe's backcourt was a significant reason for the Tribe's success in the rebounding department. The College outrebounded 16 opponents in 2006-07. On 25 occasions and in 20 of the Tribe's 30 games last season, a guard led the Tribe in rebounding. In fact, all three of the College's starting guards averaged over 3.4 rebounds per contest. In total, the Tribe received over 15 rebounds a game from the guard position.

RETURNING EXPERIENCE

W&M head coach Tony Shaver has boasted about the experience and depth the Tribe returns from a season ago. The College returns four starters and 11 letterwinners from last year's milestone campaign.

Senior co-captains Laimis Kieslius and Nathan Mann are three-year returning starters, while nine different players on the W&M roster have earned starting nods at some point in their College career. It total, the Tribe's returning roster has 493 career games played and 192 career starts. Six returning players have played in nearly 50 games for the College over their careers, while seven return after averaging 10-plus minutes per game last season.

PLAYING FINAL FOUR COMPETITION

For the second straight season and the 19th time overall, the W&M men's basketball team faced a NCAA Final Four opponent from the previous season in No. 5/5 Georgetown. The Hoyas advanced to their fifth Final Four last season, before falling in the semi-finals to Ohio State.

Last season, the Tribe defeated 2006 Final Four participant George Mason, 67-63, on Jan.3, marking the fifth time in school history that the College defeated a Final Four participant from the previous season. The Tribe also accomplished the feat with wins over N.C. State during the 1950-51 season, West Virginia during the 1959-60 season, North Carolina during the 1977-78 season and Virginia during the 1984-85 campaign.

The victory for the 2006-07 version of the Tribe was the first to pull the trick on the road. The previous four wins all came in contests considered home games, while W&M downed the Patriots in Fairfax, Va. The win over George Mason was also the first over a Final Four participant since the NCAA Tournament field expanded to 64. The 1984 NCAA Tournament was the final event with a 48-team field. The Tribe's victories over N.C. State in 1951 and West Virginia in 1960 were both played in Norfolk, Va., but both were considered home games.

The College played Duke on four occasions (1986-87, 1988-89, 1989-90, 1991-92 and 1999-2000) and North Carolina on three occasions (1957-58, 1977-78 and 1981-82) following Final Four trips for the schools. W&M also played West Virginia on three occasions during the 1959-60 season after the Mountaineers went to the 1959 Final Four. The Tribe has battled Jacksonville in 1970-71, Providence in 1973-74 and Maryland in 2001-02 following Final Four trips for those programs.



SMITH GOES INTERNATIONAL WITH PANAMA

Junior forward Alex Smith spent the summer competing with the Panamanian Senior National Team. He played with the squad at the FIBA Americas Championship in Las Vegas, Nev., Aug. 22-Sept. 2 as well as at the Pan-American Games, June 29-July 1.

At the FIBA Americas Championship, Smith averaged 2.5 points and 1.3 rebounds per game, coming off the Panamanian bench. In a loss to Puerto Rico, Smith notched his best statistical game with five points and three rebounds in 20 minutes of action. He also added three points, two rebounds and a steal in Panama's lone victory of the championship against Mexico on Aug. 24.

At the Pan-American Games, Smith played in four games, including one start, and averaged 4.3 points and 1.2 rebounds per game, while shooting 75 percent from the floor. He turned in his best game of the tournament against the U.S. in the fifth-place game, scoring seven points and pulling down two rebounds. Georgetown's Roy Hibbertt was a member of that U.S. Team at the Pan-American Games. Smith also competed in a third tournament with Panama over the summer in Chile. He averaged 7.3 points and 3.0 rebounds in 26.3 minutes of action over the three-game Chile Top 4 Tournament.

TRIBE ON TV

W&M will once again have a number of games televised as part of the Colonial Athletic Association's (CAA) television package for the 2007-08 season. W&M will have four games broadcast as part of the league's most comprehensive TV package in the 23-year history of the conference.

The Tribe will have a trio of games broadcast on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic and a game televised on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. Three of the Tribe's four TV games will be on the road and one will come in the friendly confines of Kaplan Arena in Williamsburg. The Tribe's contest at Old Dominion on Jan. 5, slated for an 8 p.m. tipoff, will be televised on CSN-MA. The network will also broadcast both W&M games against Towson on Jan. 19 and Feb. 16. The Jan. 19 contest is slated for a 4 p.m. tip in Williamsburg, while the Feb. 16 match up in Towson, Md., will start at 2 p.m. The Tribe's final regular season road contest at George Mason on Feb. 27 will also be a part of the television package. MASN will show the game, which is set to begin at 9 p.m.

The 80-game CAA men's basketball composite broadcast slate features 38 appearances on the various ESPN platforms, including four regular-season games and the CAA Championship on ESPN/ESPN2, 14 games on ESPNU and six syndicated games on ESPN Regional Television. The largest-ever Comcast syndicated package features more than 30 games syndicated on the Comcast family of Networks (Comcast SportsNets, SportsNet New York, CSS, CN8), allowing consistent exposure in many of the nation's largest media markets.

O'REILLY ESPNU BRACKETBUSTERS

For the second straight season, the Tribe will take part in O'Reilly ESPNU BracketBusters. All 12 CAA teams will compete in the sixth-annual event. After serving as a road team in 2007, the Tribe will host a game during the 2008 two-day event, Feb. 22-23. BracketBusters will feature 14 nationally televised contests on ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN Classic and ESPN360.com.

A pool of 100 teams from 16 different conferences will participate in the 2008 Brack-etBusters. The field includes teams with 74 appearances in the last five NCAA Tournaments, including a team in the Final Four and seven Sweet Sixteen squads. This year's coverage will feature the addition of a game on ESPN Classic. For the third straight year, ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, will televise five BracketBusters games while ESPN360.com, ESPN's customized broadband service, will offer two. ESPN2 will televise six contests. ESPN360.com will also simulcast ESPN2's six telecasts. The BracketBusters matchups will be announced Feb. 4, while game time and network assignments will be announced Feb. 11.

The 100-team field will feature 12 teams from the CAA and the Mid-American Conference; 11 from the Ohio Valley Conference; 10 from the Missouri Valley, Horizon League and Metro Atlantic Athletic; nine from the Western Athletic Conference and Big West; four from the America East and Southern; two from the Patriot, Big Sky and Big South; one from the West Coast, Summit League and Atlantic Sun.

EXPERIENCE BEYOND HIS YEARS

Sophomore David Schneider faced a gauntlet of experienced point guards during his rookie season with the Tribe in 2006-07. The Phoenix, Ariz., native demonstrated maturity beyond his years during his first season in the Green and Gold, helping the College to its best season in nearly a decade. Schneider had the fewest turnovers of any primary point guard in the CAA. He only turned the ball over 48 times while averaging over 30 minutes per game. Schneider averaged only one turnover per 16:22 minutes played.

Schneider ranked 11th in the CAA in assists to turnover ratio. That number ranked second among the league's rookies. On 12 occasions, Schneider has turned the ball over one or few times, while dishing out five or more assists on five occasions. He led the Tribe in assists per game at 2.7.

REACHING NEW HEIGHTS

The 2006-07 version of William and Mary basketball joined some elite company in the school's annals. With its 60-47 win over Drexel on Feb. 14, the Tribe became only the fifth team in W&M men's basketball history to win 15 games against Division I opponents. The 2006-07 squad joined the 1950-51, 1982-83, 1984-85 and 1997-98 teams in winning 15 Division I games. Only the 1997-98 team (20) and the 1982-83 team (16) have posted more than 15 wins over Division I opponents in a season.

The 15 wins also marked only the second time in the last 20 years that the College collected 15 victories in a season. The Tribe is one of only 21 teams in school history to win 15 games in a season (both Division I and other opponents).

The victory over Drexel was monumental in another way as well. The Dragons entered the game ranked No. 53 in the RPI according to CollegeRPI.com. It marked the highest rated opponent the Tribe had defeated since downing Richmond in 2001 when the Spiders were No. 43 in the RPI.

MAKING SOME HISTORY

The 2006-07 season provided some memorable moments for the W&M men's basketball program. Here is a look at some of the winning accomplishments from last season:

- The College tallied its most victories in a season since the 1997-98 campaign when it won its 15th game of the year vs. Drexel on Feb. 14.
- W&M's 60-47 victory over Drexel on Feb. 14 marked the first time that the Tribe has defeated the Dragons since Drexel joined the CAA in 2001-02.
- On Feb. 10, W&M recorded its first win in Trask Coliseum since the 1993-94 season, defeating UNCW, 61-55.
- The Tribe was one of only 21 teams in school history to win 15 or more games (Division I or other) in a season and one of only five teams to win 15 or more Division I games.
- W&M jumped out to a 10-4 start to the season, the best start for the College since going 11-3 during the 1997-98 season.
- It marked the 12th occasion in W&M basketball history that the Tribe started the season 10-4 or better. The 2006-07 team was only the fifth team since 1950 to start the season 10-4 or better.
- The College won seven straight contests from Dec. 8-Jan. 8. It marked only the 17th winning streak of seven or more games in W&M history. The streak also was only the sixth of seven or more games since the 1950-51 campaign.



- The 2006-07 team became only the fourth team to win seven or more in a row as the 1982-83 and 1997-98 team both did it twice.
- On Jan. 3, the Tribe tallied its first win in Fairfax, Va., over George Mason, 67-63, since the 1997-98 season. The Tribe also snapped George Mason's 14-game home conference winning streak that span nearly two years.
- W&M jumped out to only its fourth 3-1 start in the school's 22 years in the CAA. Only the 1994-95 (4-1) and 1997-98 (4-1) teams jumped out to better records in CAA play.
- The College finished with eight CAA victories making it one of only three teams in W&M's 22-years as part of the CAA to win eight or more games.

50 PERCENT EQUALS VICTORIES

The Tribe has been flawless under head coach Tony Shaver when it hits on 50 percent or better from the floor. The Tribe tallied five contests of 50-percent or better from the field in 2006-07. Here is a look at the Tribe's 50-percent or better shooting from the field under Shaver:

2007-08 W&M MEN'S BASKETBALL GAMES NOTES

TONYSHAVER

In four seasons at W&M, head coach Tony Shaver has led a turnaround of Tribe basketball. During 2006-07 season, W&M enjoyed a breakout season, winning 15 Division I games for only the fifth time in school history. Shaver, though, believes 15 wins is only a rung on the ladder to becoming a perennial Colonial Athletic Association contender. Shaver has spent 21 seasons of coaching at the collegiate level and enters his 32nd season as a head coach.

"I do not want anyone to limit the vision of our program," Shaver said. "I am used to winning as a coach, and last season was a great step towards where I know this program can end up. As a staff, we expect big things not only from our players, but from our program as a whole."

Shaver earned CollegeInsider.com Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Tribe to a 15-15 record. It marked just the second time in the last 20 years W&M had won 15 games. Shaver also led his troops to eight wins during the tough CAA portion; only the third time in the 22-year history of the league the Tribe has accomplished that feat. Another telling stat of the progression of the program was the four CAA road victories, highlighted by a 67-63 win over 2006 Final Four participant George Mason. In Shaver's first four seasons, W&M had won only three road affairs.

The 2006-07 season brought about a change in styles for the 31st W&M head coach. After spending much of his career coaching an up-tempo offense, featuring a trapping defense, Shaver switched over to a more perimeter-oriented attack last season. The Tribe offensive scheme now spreads the floor and relies on spacing, effective perimeter shooting and players reading and reacting to teammates' cuts and motion. Defensively, W&M employs a plethora of defensive systems to throw off opposing offenses.

The new style led to the Tribe ranking among the top 50 in the country in 3-point field goal defense as well as holding its opponents to 64.2 points per game, the best mark since the 1997-98 season. The College also established school records for 3-point field goals made and 3-point field goals attempted. The success of the new approach was never more evident than in the Tribe's Feb. 14 victory over eventual National Invitational Tournament participant Drexel, 60-47, in Williamsburg. It was the lowest point production for Drexel in four seasons, and marked the highest ranked team, in terms of RPI, that W&M had defeated since 2001.

During the 2005-06 season, W&M started 4-1, marking the best start for the Tribe team since opening the 1992-93 campaign with a 6-1 record. The 4-1 start for the 2005-06 squad though was the first time in school history that the Tribe has opened a year with at least four wins in its first five games against current Division I opponents. Included in those four victories was a 70-60 win at Hampton, which went on to make the NCAA Tournament.

In November 2005, Shaver was inducted into the Episcopal High School Hall of Fame. He led EHS for 10 seasons from 1976-86. Shaver has been inducted into the Hall of Fame at both of his head coaching stops prior to taking over the reigns at W&M.

There have been individual successes as well for the Green and Gold under Shaver's reign. On four occasions, a W&M player has been named All-CAA under Shaver, while another four have been named to the CAA All-Rookie Team. 2004 graduate Adam Hess, currently playing professionally in France, became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a First-Team Academic All-American and all-conference selection as a senior. W&M players have also enjoyed success in the classroom under Shaver, as on seven occasions a Tribe player has been named to the CAA All-Academic team over the last four seasons, including a program-

high three in 2007.

Shaver was named the head coach of the Tribe on May 2, 2003. He came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Tigers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith.
