W&M TRAVELS TO LIBERTY THANKSGIVING CLASSIC

After playing the last three games at home, the William and Mary men's basketball team will return to the road by taking part in the Liberty Thanksgiving Classic, Nov. 28-29, in Lynchburg, Va. The College will open the event with South Carolina State on Friday, Nov. 28, at 8:15 p.m. The opening game of the tournament will pit host Liberty against Division II Coker at 6 p.m. on Friday. The consolation and championship games are slated for 6 p.m. and 8:15 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 29.

The Tribe improved to 2-3 on the season, using a dominating second-half performance to defeat Radford, 73-53, on Nov. 25. W&M erased a four-point half-time deficit with a 13-0 run to open the second stanza. The College outscored the Highlanders, 43-19, in the second half. Juniors Danny Sumner and David Schneider once again led the Tribe attack with 21 points and 16 points, respectively, while senior Chris Darnell chipped in a season-high 14 points and a game-best seven rebounds.

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA STATE

South Carolina State enters the Liberty Thanksgiving Classic at 3-1 and is coming off its first loss of the season. The Bulldogs opened the year with wins over Erskine College, 71-53, Allen University, 98-68, and Carver Bible College, 112-77, before suffering a 94-72 setback to its first Division I foe in College of Charleston. The meeting between the Tribe and Bulldogs will be the first.

The Bulldogs are averaging 88.2 points per game this season, while shooting 51.9 percent from the field. SCSU also owns a rebounding margin of 15.2 through the opening four games of the season and has blocked an averaged of seven shots per game.

Jason Johnson led four Bulldogs in double figures against College of Charleston, turning in a double-double performance with 19 points and 10 rebounds. Jason Flagler added 18 points on 9-of-15 shooting from the floor, while Brandon Smalls and Carrio Bennett each tallied 10 points. Kensha Johnson chipped in seven assists to go along with eight rebounds against the Cougars.

Flagler leads SCSU in scoring at 18.3 points per game, while shooting 64.7 percent from the field. Johnson is the lone other Bulldog player in double figures at 13 points per game. He tops SCSU in rebounding with seven per game, while also averaging two blocks per game and shooting a remarkable 74.1 percent from the field. Arsenio Williams, Bennett and Smalls each average nine points per game as seven players average seven or more points per game for the Bulldogs. Bennett also leads SCSU in assists with 4.5 per game.

SCOUTING LIBERTY

The Flames are coming off an impressive road victory at Virginia, 86-82, on Nov. 25. Liberty is 2-1 on the season with a victory over Montreat and a Big South opening loss at UNC Asheville, 84-56, on Nov. 18. Second-year head coach Richie McKay leads the Flame program.

In its victory over UVA, Liberty shot nearly 70 percent from the floor in the second half on its way to 56.6 percent for the game. The Flames connected on 13-of-26 from 3-point range in outdistancing the Cavaliers. Kyle Ohman, Seth Curry and Anthony Smith accounted for most of the Flames points, scoring a combined 73 of the team's 86 points. Ohman and Curry both scored 26 points in the win, while Smith registered 21. Ohman connected on six 3-point field goals, while Curry drilled four against UVA.

The Liberty starting lineup is a bit unorthodox featuring five guards, including a trio of freshmen, and no player taller than 6-6. Curry, a rookie, leads the way for Liberty at 22.3 points per game, which is the highest nationally for a true freshman. He is shooting 38.1 percent from 3-point range and averaging 4.7 rebounds per game. Smith, who is the preseason player of the year in the Big South, is second on the squad at 19.7 points per game and leads the Flames in rebounding at 5.7 per contest. Ohman rounds out the double-digit scorers for LU at 15.3 per game. He is connecting 58.8 percent from 3-point range in his opening three games of the year. As a team, Liberty is averaging 10.3 3-pointers per game and is shooting 38.8 percent from distance.

W&M and Liberty have met on two other occasions with each team winning on its home court. The Tribe won the most recent contest, 91-64, in Williamsburg during the 2004-05 campaign. The last meeting in Lynchburg went to the Flames, 62-61, in 2003.

SCOUTING COKER

Coker, a Division II program that plays in the Carolinas-Virginia Athletic Conference, is 3-2 entering the Liberty Thanksgiving Classic. The Cobras own victories over UNC-Pembroke, 80-71, Morris College, 86-77, and Division I foe Coastal Carolina, 80-59, on the road. Coker has dropped its last two contests to Francis Marion University, 68-59, and Limestone College, 81-74.

The Cobras average 75.8 points per game, while shooting 47.2 percent from the field and 71.1 percent from the charity stripe over the opening five games of the regular season. Mason Ambler leads a trio of double-digit scorers at 20.2 points per game for the Cobras. Ambler, a low post presence, shots 54.5 percent from the floor and 85.3 percent from the free throw line. He also tops the squad in rebounding at 9.6 per contest. Josh Poston ranks second on the team in scoring at 15.8 points per contest. He leads the Cobras in assists at 3.4 per contest and steals at 2.8 per affair. Lukas Varga rounds out the double-digit scorers for Coker at 11.8 per game.

SUMNER 3-STRAIGHT 20-POINT NIGHTS

After not scoring 20 points in a game through his first two seasons with the College, junior forward Danny Sumner has tallied over 20 points in each of his last three games. He started the streak with 24 in a victory over Norfolk State, before notching a career-high with 30 points in the Green and Gold's triple overtime loss to Navy. In the Tribe's last outing, Sumner led the W&M attack with a game-high 21 points in the win vs. Radford.

Sumner becomes the first W&M player since Adam Hess in 2004 to score 20 or more points in three straight games. The last Tribe player to score 20 or more points in four straight games was Kurt Small during the 1992-93 season.

SCHNEIDER PROTECTING THE BASKETBALL

During his career, junior guard David Schneider has gained a reputation for taking care of the basketball and the 2008-09 season has not been any different. Over the last three games, Schneider has a assist-to-turnover ratio of 5.33, while averaging 5.3 assists per game over the stretch. In each of the Tribe's last two contests against Navy and Radford, Schneider has not turned the basketball over, while playing an astonishing 86 minutes. Over the two game stretch, Schneider has an assist-to-turnover ratio of 10-to-0.

After ranking among the national leaders in assist-to-turnover ratio last season, Schneider ranks second in the CAA this season at 2.6. He is also 12th in the league in assists at 3.4 per contest. Over his Tribe career, Schneider ranks second in W&M annals in assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.91. He has 210 career assists compared to just 110 turnovers.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

W&M head coach Tony Shaver challenged senior captains Peter Stein and Chris Darnell to provide better leadership both for the team and in their play. In the College's 73-53 win over Radford, the duo answered the call, while playing against a talented RU frontline. Stein, despite battling foul trouble, finished with eight points, two rebounds and three assists in 20 minutes of action, but his true impact once again came off the stat sheet. The 6-9 Texan provided solid defense and made a number of hustle plays that he has become known for over his Tribe career. Darnell played his best game of the season against the Highlanders, tallying 14 points and a game-high seven rebounds. He also added three assists compared to just one turnover, while connecting on 2-of-3 from 3-point range and 8-of-9 from the free throw line. The pair also did a number defensively on Preseason All-Big South player Joey Lynch-Flohr to just six points and two rebounds, when he entered the game averaging 12.7 points per game.

SECOND-HALF RUNS

In each of its victories this season, the Tribe has made a decisive run to start the second half. In the program's home-opening win over Norfolk State, the College busted open an 11-point halftime lead by starting the second half on a 19-2 run. The spurt extended a 31-20 W&M lead to 50-22 with 13:18 remaining in the contest. Junior Danny Sumner scored nine points on the run, while fellow classmate David Schneider added five. The Green and Gold also stepped up the defense, holding the Spartans to 1-of-9 in the opening seven minutes of the second half.

In its triumph over Radford, W&M erased a four-point halftime deficit with a 13-point run to open the second half. Schneider led the charge with six points, including a back-door cut lay-up that gave W&M the lead for good at 36-34. The Green and Gold defense was once again on display as the Tribe held the Highlanders to 0-of-11 from the floor in the opening 6:30 of the second half.

IMPROVEMENT FROM THE CHARITY STRIPE

A quartet of W&M players have progressively improved their free throw shooting over the last three seasons. Seniors Peter Stein and Chris Darnell as well as juniors David Schneider and Danny Sumner have upped their season percentages from the charity stripe during their collegiate careers. Here is a look at each player's improvement over the last three seasons:

STROKING IT FROM THE LINE

The Tribe has been connecting from the free throw line at an remarkable rate this season. W&M is shooting 74 percent from the charity stripe. It is the best percentage for the Tribe since it connected on a school-record 77.2 percent in 1983. At its current rate, W&M would attain the fourth-best free throw shooting mark in school history. The College currently ranks fourth in the CAA in free throw shooting this season.

30 AND 10

Junior Danny Sumner was sensational for the Tribe in its tripled overtime loss to Navy, finishing with the program's first double-double in three seasons with 30 points and 11 rebounds. The fact that makes those numbers more impressive is that its the first time a Tribe player has scored 30 or more points and pulled down 10 or more rebounds in a game since 1961. All-American Jeff Cohen pulled the trick with 49 points and 31 rebounds against Richmond during the 1961 campaign.

TEAMMATES IN THE 30S

Juniors David Schneider and Danny Sumner became only the second set of teammates in W&M history to score 30 or more points in a game during the Tribe's triple overtime loss to Navy. Schneider turned in a game and career high 31 points, while Sumner added a career best 30 points. The feat last happened during the 1967-68 season when Ron Panneton and Bob Sherwood tallied 32 and 30 points, respectively, in a 97-74 win over Loyola (Louisiana). It marked the 73rd and 74th times in W&M history that a Tribe player scored 30 or more points in a game and the first since 2004.

In W&M's home-opening win over Norfolk State one game prior, Schneider and Sumner both scored 20-plus points, becoming the first W&M teammates to pull the trick since 2005. Sumner led the way with 24 points followed by the 20 points of Schneider. The last teammates to accomplish the feat were Nick D'Antoni and Nathan Mann, who each scored 25 points, against George Mason in 2005.

TRIPLE OT

The Tribe's triple overtime setback to Navy marked the fifth time in W&M history that the program played three overtime periods. The Green and Gold also played three OTs in 1949 against George Washington in the Southern Conference Tournament, in 1958 against Richmond, in 1961 against Furman in the Southern Conference Tournament and against Virginia Tech in 1981.

SCHNEIDER FROM DEEP

Junior David Schneider turned in an impressive performance in the Tribe's loss to Navy, scoring a career-high 31 points, and he did so by using the longball. The Phoenix, Ariz., native connected on 7-of-15 from 3-point range against the Midshipmen. While both were career highs for Schneider, the stats also ranked among the all-time best in Tribe history. The seven 3-pointers were the fourth-most in school history. The 15 3-pointers attempted rank as the second most in W&M annals and were also a Kaplan Arena record. The pervious mark of 13 held by the Tribe's Matt Verkey against George Mason in 1995 and VCU's Emanuel Mathis in 2003.

After connecting on just 2-of-10 from 3-point range in the Tribe's opening loss to Penn State, Schneider has found his stroke over the last four contests. Over that stretch, the 6-3 guard has connected on 40.6 percent from 3-point range (13-of-32). Schneider ranks second in the CAA in 3-pointers made per game at three per contest.

SUMNER NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior Danny Sumner was named Colonial Athletic Association co-Player of the Week on Nov. 24. The 6-7 wing averaged 27 points and eight rebounds per game in the Tribe's first two home games of the season last week and shared the honor with Northeastern's Matt Janning.

In the home-opener against Norfolk State, Sumner scored a then-career high 24 points on 9-of-13 shooting from the floor in leading the College to a 74-58 win. The Fairfax, Va., native followed that performance by eclipsing his career mark for the second straight night, scoring 30 points and pulling down 11 rebounds. It was the first W&M double-double in three seasons. Sumner was 11-of-22 from the floor and 4-of-9 from 3-point range against the Midshipmen. With just five seconds remaining in regulation, the Tribe junior knocked down a trey from the left side to cap a 12-point W&M rally and send the game to OT. For the week, Sumner shot 60.6 percent (20-of-35) from the floor and 50 percent (7-of-14) from 3-point range.

For the season, Sumner tops the Tribe in points (20.3), rebounds (6.5) and minutes per game (38.8), while also leading the way in 3-point field goal percentage at 44 percent. He is currently one of three players that ranks in the top 10 in the CAA in both points and rebounds. Sumner is sixth in scoring, 10th in rebounding, ninth in field goal percentage (50.8 percent), ninth in 3-point field goal percentage, fourth in 3-point field goals made (2.8) and second in minutes in the league.

STRONG ONE-TWO PUNCH

The Tribe possesses one of the best one-two scoring punches in the CAA. Juniors Danny Sumner and David Schneider currently rank No. 5 and No. 11, respectively, in the league in scoring. W&M is one of only three schools in the league with two players among the top 12 in scoring.

Sumner is averaging 20.4 points per game over the College's first five games of the season, while Schneider is putting in 16.2 points per contest. The duo has accounted for 183 of the Tribe's 352 points this season, which equates to 52 percent. Combined, the pair is averaging 5.6 3-pointers per game, having knocked down 28 on the year.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

Against Navy, the Tribe trailed by as many as 12 points in the second half, but rallied to force overtime. The Midshipmen led 64-52 with five minutes remaining, before the College reeled off a 14-2 run over the remainder of regulation to force extra time. Junior Danny Sumner capped the run with a 3-pointer from the left wing with 5.9 seconds remaining to tie the game at 66 and force OT. Freshman forward Quinn McDowell came up with a big shot as well for the Green and Gold. The Mason, Ohio native drilled a longball from the right side with just 2.2 seconds left on the clock to push the game to a third overtime session.

CONNECTING ON DOUBLE-DIGITS FROM DEEP

W&M connected on double-digit 3-pointers in back-to-back games vs. Norfolk State and Navy. W&M knocked down 10 3-point field goals in the home-opening win over Norfolk State on Nov. 19, before drilling 14 in the 3OT loss to Navy on Nov. 22. It marked the 19th and 20th times under head coach Tony Shaver that W&M has hit double-digit treys in a game. Last season, the Tribe established a school record with nine games of double-digit 3-pointers as well as a program mark with double-digit 3's in five straight games. The Green and Gold is 13-7 under Shaver when hitting 10 or more 3-pointers in a game.

The Tribe's 14 3-pointers made vs. Navy equaled the third-best total in program history. W&M connected on 14 treys last season at Drexel and at Wagner. The Green and Gold school mark is 16 set against UNC Greensboro in 1993 and at George Mason in 1996. The College ranks second in the CAA in 3-pointer made per game at 8.2.

FRESHMEN EARNING THEIR STRIPES

Tribe head coach Tony Shaver felt in the preseason that freshmen Kendrix Brown and Quinn McDowell could both have an impact on the Green and Gold lineup as rookies in 2008-09. The duo has displayed maturity beyond its years early in the season as key members of the W&M rotation.

McDowell has topped the W&M reserves in scoring during three of the five games this season, including a pair of double-digit performances. The 6-5 forward tallied his first career double-digit performance at Ohio with 11 points and four rebounds. In the College's most recent contest against Navy, McDowell scored 13 points on 6-of-9 shooting from the field to go along with five rebounds. He connected on a big 3-pointer from the right wing with just 2.2 seconds remaining to help extend the game to a third overtime. For the year, he is averaging 19 minutes per game and shooting 61.9 percent from the floor, while ranking fourth on the team and tops among reserves at 6.8 points per game.

Brown has been equally as impressive, showing a diverse skill set to go along with a tireless work rate. He has subbed in for injured starting point guard Sean McCurdy and started each of the last three games. He turned in an impressive all-around stat line with eight points, four rebounds, three assists and two steals the Spartans. In the road game at Ohio, Brown dished out a team-best five assists compared to zero turnovers. He also added five assists and six rebounds against Navy. Brown is averaging 21.6 minutes per game and ranks second on the team at 2.8 assists per game.

TRIBE-LOYOLA GAME ADDED TO TV PACKAGE

The Tribe's game at Loyola University Chicago on Tuesday, Dec. 2, has been added to the ESPN Full Court package. The Tribe-Rambler contest will also be available on ESPN360.com and will be streamed on the Horizon League Network at www.horizonleaguenetwork.tv as well. All games scheduled for broadcast are tentative and subject to change. Game time for the contest is scheduled for 8 p.m. at the Gentile Center in Chicago.

The ESPN Full Court airing as well as the streamed online broadcast at ESPN360.com will use the Lakeshore Public Television feed, which broadcasts Loyola games in the Chicago and Northern Indiana areas. ESPN Full Court is a subscription package available through cable and satellite providers that allows fans to watch up to 30 college basketball games per week. Pricing and other information can be found by contacting your cable or satellite provider.

ESPN360.com is the network's signature broadband sports TV network. The contest

scheduled to stream live on ESPN360.com will be available free to any W&M student on campus, the approximately 18 million students on college campuses in the country and nearly 24 million households nationwide that get high-speed internet from one of the 20 internet service providers associated with ESPN360.com.

The meeting between W&M and Loyola will be a replace of last season's BracketBuster contest played in Williamsburg. The Ramblers pulled out a 71-66 victory behind 12 3-point field goals.

HOME OPENERS AT KAPLAN ARENA

With its victory over Norfolk State on Nov. 19, the Tribe improve to a perfect 6-0 in home openers under head coach Tony Shaver. In fact, W&M has won nine of its last 10 home openers and is 29-10 (.744) in home opener since the completion of W&M Hall in 1970.

Free throw shooting has proven to be another key ingredient in the Tribe's winning recipe over the last few seasons. Getting to the foul line has been a valuable commodity for the Green and Gold. Last season, W&M was 12-1 when connecting on more free throws than its opponent, and so far in 2008-09, the Tribe is 2-0.

Over the last four seasons, W&M is 26-12 when shooting 20 or more free throws in a game. Last season, the College was 9-2 when attempting 20 or more freebies in a contest and the Green and Gold is 2-1 this year when pulling the trick. It is just as important for the Tribe

to connect on its free throw opportunities. W&M was 9-1 last season when making more than 15 free throws in a game. Over the last three seasons, the College has posted a 16-6 mark when connecting on 15 or more free throws. The Tribe's record jumps to 12-2 over the last four seasons when hitting on 20-plus free throws.

W&M connected on a season-best 28-of-32 from the charity stripe in the victory over Radford. It marked the most free throws made for W&M since Feb. 16, 2005 when it connected on 29 against James Madison.

50 PERCENT EQUALS VICTORIES

The Tribe has been flawless under head coach Tony Shaver when it hits on 50 percent or better from the floor, going a combined 20-0 over his six seasons. ON THE ROAD AGAIN

For the second straight season, the Tribe opened the campaign with two straight road games. Last season, W&M traveled to then-No. 5 Georgetown, before making the trek to then-No. 21 N.C. State. In 2008-09, W&M opened at Big Ten foe Penn State, before meeting Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. It marks the only two times since the 1969-70 season that W&M has opened a season with two straight true road games. With two consecutive seasons with two road games to open the year, it marks the first time that has occurred at W&M since it pulled the feat in three straight seasons during the early 1950's. The Tribe played two road games to open the year in 1951-52, before starting the 1952-53 and 1953-54 campaigns with four straight road contests.

WHERE'S THE FIRE?

The start of the Tribe's road game at Ohio on Nov. 16 was delayed nearly 30 minutes due to an impromptu fire drill during pregame warm-ups. Midway through pregame warm-ups, the fire alarm system in the Convocation Center in Athens, Ohio began to light up and sound. The Tribe as well as numerous fans already in their seats was forced to exit the facility, while firefighters inspect the arena. In the end, a smoke alarm in a neighboring dorm triggered the system and resulted in the game starting nearly 30 minutes after its scheduled time.

IMPACT TRANSFER

The College has a strong tradition of impact transfers under the direction of sixth-year head coach Tony Shaver. Hawley Smith served as a two-year captain for the Tribe during the 2005 and 2006 seasons after transferring from Temple, while Adam Payton earned All-CAA honors in 2007 after moving to Williamsburg from Vanderbilt. Payton is currently playing professionally in France. W&M has another impact transfer in the fold this season in junior guard Sean McCurdy, who sat out last season after transferring to the College from Arkansas.

A dynamic point guard, who adds speed to the W&M backcourt, McCurdy started his first game in the Green and Gold and finished with team-best and career-high performances

in assists (7) and rebounds (6) at Penn State. The 6-1, 184-pounder demonstrated the ability to find the open man as well as the ability to get by his defender on the drive and kick to open Tribe shooters in the season opener against Penn State. He followed that performance with a career-high tying 10 points on 4-of-6 shooting against Ohio. McCurdy added a pair of driving 3-point plays against the Bobcats.

The Jersey City, N.J., native spent his redshirt year and the off season improving his strength and his jump shot. In two seasons at Arkansas, McCurdy appeared in 61 games, while making six starts, in helping the Razorbacks to the NCAA Tournament twice.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

Six current Tribe players are following in their father's footsteps playing athletics collegiately. Senior Peter Stein, juniors David Schneider and Sean McCurdy, sophomores Marcus Kitts and Matt McFadden as well as freshman Quinn McDowell are second-generation college athletes.

Three fathers played basketball collegiately, while three more were college football players. Schneider's father, Jeff, played basketball at Virginia Tech, before being drafted in the fifth round of the 1982 NBA Draft by the Houston Rockets. McCurdy's father, Bob, was an All-American at the University of Richmond after leading the nation in scoring during the 1975 season. McFadden's father, John, played basketball for four years at Rutgers.

Kitts' father, Jon, played college football at Central Michigan from 1978-81, while McDowell's father, Dave, graduated from W&M in 1985 and played football for current Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock. Stein's father, Mike, played football at Princeton from 1973-76.

SCHNEIDER NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CAA

Junior guard David Schneider was named to the 2008-09 Colonial Athletic Association Preseason All-Conference team. The Phoenix, Ariz., native was named an honorable mention all-league choice by vote of the conference coaches, media and SIDs

The CAA Preseason All-Conference selections were comprised of two five-man teams as well as three honorable mention honorees. The conference also released its 2008-09 CAA men's basketball predicted order of finish by the league coaches, media and SIDs at its media day, and the Tribe was picked to finish eighth. VCU was selected to defend its regular season league title, while Northeastern, Old Dominion, George Mason and Delaware rounded out the top five.

FROM WAY DOWNTOWN...

The Tribe has demonstrated the importance of the 3-point shot in the program's offensive schemes over the last two seasons. In 2006-07, W&M change offensive systems, relying more on a perimeter-oriented system that spreads the floor and focuses on spacing, effective perimeter shooting and players reading and reacting to teammates' cuts and motion.

The change has been one for the better as W&M has not only posted back-to-back 15-win seasons for the first time in a quarter century, but it bettered the school record for 3-pointers made, attempted and made per game over the last two years. In 2006-07, W&M connected on 200-of-624 from long range, establishing school records in both categories. One year later, W&M smashed those numbers and set Colonial Athletic Association record for 3's made and attempted. The College connected on 257 treys last season, while attempting 755. The Green and Gold also established a program mark for 3-pointers made per game at 7.8.

GOING INTERNATIONAL

Sophomore forward Marcus Kitts had a unique opportunity over the summer, traveling over to Taipei, Taiwan with Athletes in Action to participate in the 2008 William Jones Cup. Kitts helped AIA to the silver medal at the event. Representing the U.S. at the 30th annual event, Athletes in Action finished the round robin portion of the tournament in first with a 6-1 record and advanced to the finals, before falling to the defending champion Jordan National Team, 93-91, in the thrilling overtime championship game.

Kitts finished the nine-game tournament averaging 5.9 points and 3.6 rebounds per game, while playing 14 minutes per contest. He shot 56.8 percent (25-of-44) from the field over the event and finished with five steals and six blocked shots.

Kitts turned in a trio of double-digit performances during the preliminary rounds for AIA. The Holly Springs, N.C., native tallied 12 points and seven rebounds in a the win over the Australian Under-19 National Team on July 12, and scored 10 points on July 15 in a victory over Egypt. Against the Egyptians, Kitts, who was the tallest player on the AIA roster at 6-foot, 9-inches, had to face a starting front line of 7-1 and 6-10. Kitts best game of the tournament came against the Korean University Selection team in which the Tribe sophomore scored 17 points and chipped in a team-high eight rebounds in just over 20 minutes of action, leading AIA to an easy 103-65 victory.

Kitts was one of 11 players from NCAA Division I programs across the country to compete for the U.S. It marked the 15th time since the event's inception in 1977 that Athletes in Action took part in the Jones Cup. Along with the basketball slate, the team performed numerous outreach activities in Taiwan, including basketball clinics and visits to a local orphanage. Athletes In Action is the sports division of Campus Crusade for Christ International. Dave Hannah, who desired to capitalize on society's great love of sports and utilize the platform given to athletes to reach the world for Jesus Christ, founded AIA in 1966. AIA's outreach range includes ministry to college and professional athletes and coaches globally across a great number of sports. International competing teams partner with in-country staff and other mission organizations to resource Christian ministry around the world.

NEW FACES ON STAFF

While every year bring new faces to collegiate programs in form of players, W&M also added two new assistant coaches and a new director of basketball operations during the off-season. Former assistant coaches Dee Vick and Antwon Jackson left W&M for opportunities as the head coach at Hampden-Sydney College and an assistant coach at UMass, respectively. Those two vacancies paved the way for the hiring of Jamion Christian and Jonathan Holmes as assistant coaches. Both young coaches bring experience as both collegiate players and coaches. Coupled with third-year assistant Ben Wilkins, the Tribe's assistant coaching staff is one of the youngest in the country.

Christian spent the last two seasons on staff at Bucknell University. In Christian's first season with the Bison during the 2006-07 campaign, Bucknell finished with a 22-9 mark and advanced to the Patriot League Championship game before falling to Holy Cross. As a player, Christian was the VHSL Group A State Player of the Year at New Kent, before playing at Mount St. Mary's where he was a three-year captain.

Holmes has enjoyed coaching stops at Montreat College and Francis Marion University. He furthers the Tribe's North Carolina connection, having played four years for the Tar Heels. Holmes was runner-up for Indiana's "Mr. Basketball" as a high school senior, before helping North Carolina to the 2000 Final Four.

The Tribe also added David Kontaxis to the program as the director of basketball operations during the offseason. Kontaxis spent seven seasons as a basketball coach at Central High School in Capitol Heights, Md. Each of the last two years, he was the head coach of the Falcon program after spending five season as an assistant.

TRIBE ON TV

The Colonial Athletic Association released the most extensive men's and women's basketball television package in conference history with 110 televised contests, and the Tribe will have five games televised this season.

The Green and Gold's season opener at Penn State was televised on the Big Ten Network. The Tribe will have a quartet of games during the league schedule shown on TV, including a pair of home contests. The first two TV games of the conference slate for the College will both come on the road on Wednesday, Jan. 7 at UNC Wilmington and on Saturday, Jan. 17, at Delaware. The W&M-UNCW contest will be televised on ESPN Regional at 7 p.m., while the Tribe-Blue Hens affair is slated for a noon tip on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Philadelphia and the Charter Sports Network. The game at UNCW will also be broadcast regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN).

On Saturday, Jan. 31, the Tribe will host Georgia State in a televised contest at 5 p.m. The game will be aired on the Comcast/Charter Sports Network and will also be shown locally on WSKY Channel 4. Four days later, the Green and Gold's home game against Northeastern will be televised on Comcast SportsNet New England as well as locally on WSKY Channel 4. The Wednesday, Feb. 4, tilt is slated for a 7 p.m. tip-off.

In total, the CAATV package includes 92-game men's basketball games to be broadcast. The composite schedule features 33 appearances on the various ESPN platforms, including four regular-season games and the CAA Championship on ESPN/ESPN2, eight games on ESPNU and five syndicated games on ESPN Regional Television. That number could rise as all 12 CAA teams are once again participating in the ESPNU BracketBusters on February 20-21, 2009.

The largest-ever Comcast syndicated package features 28 games on the Comcast SportsNets (CSN Mid-Atlantic, CSN Philadelphia, CSN New England and CSS) and 20 games on CN8, the Comcast Network, providing tremendous exposure in many of the nation's largest media markets. CN8 will once again televise the quarterfinals and semifinals of the CAA Men's Basketball Championship.

O'REILLY ESPNU BRACKETBUSTERS

For the third straight season, the William and Mary men's basketball team, along with the rest of the Colonial Athletic Association, will take part in the ESPNU BracketBusters. The seventh annual event will be Feb. 20-21, 2009 and will feature 13 nationally televised contests on ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN360.com. W&M will host a BracketBusters Game for the second consecutive year.

During its first two seasons of BracketBusters, the Tribe has faced Fairfield of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference and Loyola (Chicago) of the Horizon League. In 2007, the College fell at Fairfield, 61-45, before dropping last season's contest to Loyola, 71-66, in Williamsburg.

The CAA has had tremendous success in BracketBusters, with the league posting an 8-3 record in televised contests over the past four years. CAA teams have registered several impressive victories in the event, including George Mason's triumph at Wichita State in 2006, Drexel beating Creighton on the road in 2007 and VCU winning at Akron in 2008.

A pool of 102 teams from 17 different conferences will participate in the 2009 BracketBusters. The field includes teams with 77 appearances in the last five NCAA Tournaments, including a team in the Final Four, one in Elite Eight and six Sweet Sixteen squads.

For the fourth straight year, ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, will televise five BracketBusters games while ESPN360.com, ESPN's customized broadband service, will offer two. ESPN2 will televise six contests. ESPN360.com will also simulcast ESPN2's six telecasts. The 13 BracketBusters matchups will be announced February 2, while game time and network assignments will be announced February 9.

KYLE GAILLARD, MATT RUM SIGN WITH TRIBE

William and Mary head men's basketball coach Tony Shaver announced the signing of Kyle Gaillard (Huntersville, N.C./North Mecklenburg) and Matt Rum (Chapel Hill, N.C./Loyola Blakefield) to National Letters of Intent. Both players will be eligible to compete for the Tribe during the 2009-10 season.

Kyle Gaillard (Huntersville, N.C./North Mecklenburg)

Gaillard is a three-year letterwinner for Duane Lewis at North Mecklenburg, where he helped propel the Vikings to the MECA-7 regular season championship and a North Carolina 4A Sectional Championship as a junior in 2008. The 6-7 lefty averaged 17 points per game for one of the top teams in the state of North Carolina last season, while shooting 43 percent from 3-point range. He was named to the MECA-7 All-Conference team and received all-region honors.

Gaillard grew four inches between his sophomore and junior years of high school and is listed as a two-star recruit by Scout.com. He was ranked the 47th best small forward prospect in the class of 2009 by ESPN.com. As one of the top underclassmen in the state of North Carolina, Gaillard was invited to participate in the second annual Carolina Challenge in 2008 by national recruiting analyst Dave Telep. Prior to signing with the Tribe, Gaillard gained recruiting interest from Penn State, Michigan, Davidson and Winthrop. He was recently named a McDonald's All-American nominee.

During his high school career, Gaillard was named North Mecklenburg's Most Improved player in 2007. This coming season, he will serve as the Viking's team captain. Also during his high school career, Gaillard was a two-year letterwinner as a pitcher on the North Mecklenburg varsity baseball team.

During his AAU career, Gaillard was a part of six different teams that won North Carolina State Championships. He played for the Carolina Flight 11U-16U and the Charlotte Royals 17U. He participated in the 2008 Hoops Group Elite Camp and was named to two of their Super Seven lists, while playing in the summer event that included over 3,400 athletes. Hoops Group Elite ranked Gaillard the No. 6 in Best Player from Outside the Northeast list and also ranked him No. 3 in Best Players from North Carolina list.

Kyle is the son of Jill and Ted Gaillard and was born on April 15, 1991 in Naperville, Ill. His father, Ted, played baseball at the University of Delaware from 1977-79. At North Mecklenburg, Kyle was a Junior Marshall for the 2008 Graduating Class and was chosen based on his top 50 academic standing in the junior class of 525 students. As a senior in high school, Kyle was voted homecoming king at North Mecklenburg.

Matt Rum (Chapel Hill, N.C./Loyola Blakefield)

Rum signs with the Tribe as one of the top players in the Baltimore area. As a junior, the 6-3 guard was named to the All MIAA 'A' Conference, All-Baltimore Catholic League and All-Baltimore County. Rum led Loyola Blakefield to the semifinals of the BCL playoffs for the first time since 1998 as he averaged 15.7 points per game, 5.7 rebounds and knocked down 44 3-point field goals. The Baltimore Catholic League is nationally known for its level of play, including producing numerous Division I and NBA players. Rum also was named the MVP of Gilman High School Holiday Tournament as a junior.

During his sophomore year at Loyola, Rum averaged 14.8 points per game, while shooting 40 percent from 3-point range. He highlighted the campaign by knocking down eight 3-pointers on his way to a career-high 30 points in a victory over Archbishop Curley. Over his career at Loyola Blakefield, Rum has scored 720 points and knocked down 91 3-point field goals.

Rum also received recruiting interest from Towson, Radford and Boston University. He played AAU basketball for Severna Park/Maryland 3D and is listed as a two-star recruit by Scout.com. Rum grew up in Chapel Hill, N.C., prior to moving to Baltimore for high school. He played AAU for the North Carolina Gators out of Greensboro and helped the program to 13U and 14U state champions.

As a youth, Rum was a ball boy at Duke University in 2000 when the Blue Devils had the likes of current and former NBA players Mike Dunleavy, Jr., Carlos Boozer, Shane Battier and Jason Williams. He is one of the first former Duke ball boys to earn a Division I scholarship to play basketball. Rum also had the opportunity to play HORSE against ESPN college basketball guru and Hall of Famer Dick Vitale during his time as a Blue Devil ball boy.

Matt is the son of Steve and Carol Rum and was born Nov. 9, 1989 in Alexandria, Va. His father, Steve, played professional baseball in Italy and Japan and is currently the senior associate vice president for development and alumni relations at Johns Hopkins Medicine. Along with his athletic exploits, Matt has also been involved with numerous community service projects, including Special Olympics and day camps for Eagle Scouts.

TONY SHAVER

HEAD COACH · SIXTH SEASON AT W&M

When Tony Shaver accepted the head coaching position at William and Mary in May of 2003, he set his sights on making the Tribe a winning program. Fast-forward five years and the two-time CAA Coach of the Year and National Mid-Major Coach of the Year finalist has led a revival of the Green and Gold program, and last season, took it to the brink of its first-ever CAA title and NCAA Tournament appearance. Despite all the recent success, Shaver's vision and intensity to win has not wavered.

"I do not want anyone to limit the vision of our program," Shaver said. "We expect our teams to win and the last two seasons have been exceptional steps toward where we know our program can be."

In 2007-08, William and Mary posted its first winning season in a decade finishing with a 17-16 ledger. In fact it was only the sixth time in school history that a Tribe team had won 17 or more contests. W&M also finished fifth in the league on the strength of a 10-8 CAA ledger. It marked only the second time in the Tribe's 23-year history in the CAA that it has won double-digit games. Over the last two seasons, W&M ranks fifth in the league in conference wins with 18. The stat demonstrates the rising success of the Tribe program, given W&M won only 10 CAA games in Shaver's first three seasons at the helm.

In five seasons at the helm of the William and Mary men's basketball program, Tony Shaver has turned the William and Mary men's basketball program into a winner. Over the last two seasons, the program posted back-to-back 15-plus win seasons for the first time in a quarter of a century. The Tribe also put together consecutive seasons with a .500 or better record for the first time in 23 years.

Shaver was voted the 2008 CAA Coach of the Year by the league's media, coaches and sports information directors. The Shaver-led Tribe punctuated the honor by reeling off three-straight last-second wins on its way to the CAA Championship Game. Included in the run was a 56-54 win over regular season champion and No. 1 seed VCU in the semifinals. W&M won three contests to get to the championship game, matching the program's victory total in the tournament from the previous 22 years. As a result of the title game appearance, W&M had its first-ever national televised game and made its first appearance on ESPN.

The Tribe accomplished numerous other milestones during the historic 2007-08 season. W&M established not only school records, but CAA marks for 3-pointers made (257) and attempted (755) in a season. The Tribe also bettered the school standard for 3-pointers per game (7.79), double-digit 3-point efforts in a season (9) and consecutive double-digit 3-point shooting performances (5). Shaver engineered a quartet of double-digit comebacks for the Tribe in 2008, including three straight in wins over James Madison (1/9), at Georgia State (1/12) and against Northeastern (1/16). It marked the first time in school history W&M overcame two-straight double-digit second-half deficits, let alone three. The Tribe's 16-point second-half comeback at Georgia State was the largest deficit that W&M overcame on the road in 15 years. Shaver also reached a coaching milestone of his own on December 31, 2007, winning his 400th collegiate coaching game as the Tribe defeated Fairfield, 71-50, at Kaplan Arena.

W&M demonstrated its mettle as a winning team with not only its ability to overcome deficits, but also with being able to win close games. The Tribe won more than half its games (nine) when trailing at the half. W&M also won nine games by four or fewer points this season, bettering the total (six) from Shaver's first four seasons at the helm of the program. The Tribe put together a six-game CAA winning streak from Jan. 5 through Jan. 23, which marked only the third such league winning streak in Tribe history. Shaver also guided the Tribe to four straight CAA road wins in 2008. It equaled the program's longest CAA mark and was the second-longest single-season road winning streak in school history.

In 2006-07, Shaver earned CollegelInsider.com Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Tribe to a 15-15 record. It marked just the second time in the last 20 years W&M had won 15 games.



Shaver also led his troops to eight wins during the tough CAA portion; only the third time the Tribe has accomplished that feat. Another telling stat of the progression of the program was the four CAA road victories, highlighted by a 67-63 win over 2006 Final Four participant George Mason. In Shaver's first four seasons, W&M had won only three road affairs.

The 2006-07 season brought about a change in styles for the 31st W&M head coach. After spending much of his career coaching an up-tempo offense, featuring a trapping defense, Shaver switched over to a more perimeter-oriented attack last season. The Tribe offensive scheme now spreads the floor and relies on spacing, effective perimeter shooting and players reading and reacting to teammates' cuts and motion. Defensively, W&M employs a plethora of defensive systems to throw off opposing offenses.

The new style led to the Tribe ranking among the top 50 in the country in 3-point field goal defense as well as holding its opponents to 64.2 points per game, the best mark since the 1997-98 season. The College also established school records for 3-point field goals made and 3-point field goals attempted. The success of the new approach was never more evident than in the Tribe's Feb. 14 victory over eventual National Invitational Tournament participant Drexel, 60-47, in Williamsburg. It was the lowest point production in four seasons, and marked the highest ranked team, in terms of RPI, that W&M had defeated since 2001.

There have been individual successes as well for the Green and Gold under Shaver's reign. On five occasions, a W&M player has been named All-CAA under Shaver, while another four have been named to the CAA All-Rookie Team. 2004 graduate Adam Hess, currently playing professionally in France, became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a First-Team Academic All-American and all-conference selection as a senior. Corey Cofield was voted the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. W&M players have also enjoyed success in the classroom under Shaver, as on 10 occasions a Tribe player has been named to the CAA All-Academic team over the last five seasons, including a program-high three in 2007 and 2008. This past season, junior David Schneider garnered the third CAA Men's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year award under Shaver.

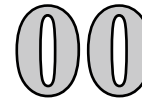
In total, four former W&M athletes who played under Shaver have gone on to or will shortly begin professional careers overseas. Hess is currently playing his second season for Artland in the German Bundesliga. He spent last season in France after earning Second-Team All-Bundesliga honors with Artland in 2007. Fellow 2004 graduate Zeb Cope is in his sixth professional season overseas and third in France. He is playing in the French Pro A League with JDA Dijon Bourgogne. Adam Payton, a 2007 graduate of W&M, completed his first season in 2008 with BC Boncourt in Switzerland and signed with Lille Metropole in the French N1 League. Laimis Kisielius, who graduated last season, will begin his professional career in Europe in the fall.
