TRIBE CONTINUES SEASON-OPENING ROAD TRIP

The William and Mary men's basketball team will continue its season-opening road trip at Mid-American Conference foe Ohio University on Sunday, Nov. 16. Tip-off is slated for 2 p.m. at the Convocation Center in Athens, Ohio.

W&M is coming off a 65-51 setback at Penn State of the Big Ten in its season-opener. Junior forward Danny Sumner led the Tribe with 15 points, while junior guard Sean McCurdy tallied team-highs in rebounds (6) and assists (7) in his first career game with W&M. Ohio went 2-0 in the exhibition slate against Wooster (79-65) and Mercyhurst (79-52) and will open the season against W&M.

The game will be broadcast live over the Tribe Radio Network with Jay Colley and Charlie Woollum on the call. The broadcast can also be heard live over the Internet by following the link on the men's basketball schedule page. The game can be followed via live stats over the Web as well with GameTracker. The link will be available on the Tribe Hoops schedule page or by visiting OhioBobcats.com.

STORY LINES

- The game with Ohio will be the first ever between the Tribe and the Bobcats. W&M will play its first Mid-American Conference foe since 2001-02 and its first road game at a MAC school since 1995-96.

- The Tribe's season-opening road trip marks the second straight year W&M has played its first two games on the road. The last time that happened in back-to-back seasons was 1953 and 1954.

SCOUTING OHIO UNIVERSITY

Ohio will play its season opener against the Tribe. The Bobcats went a perfect 2-0 during the exhibition slate, recording wins over Wooster (79-65) and Mercyhurst (79-52). Ohio will be under the direction of first-year head coach John Groce, who previously served as the associate head coach at Ohio State. Groce took over for Tim O'Shea, who departed Ohio after seven seasons to accept the head coaching position at Bryant University. The Bobcats finished last season at 20-13 overall and played in the inaugural College Basketball Invitational.

Ohio finished with four players in doubles digits in each of its two exhibition contests. Against Wooster, Jerome Tillman led the way with 18 points and eight rebounds. Tommy Freeman added 17 points, while Justin Orr and DeV Vaughn Washington tallied 12 and 11 points, respectively. In the win over Mercyhurst, Tillman once again led the attack with 16 points to go along with seven rebounds. Steven Coleman chipped in 15, while Tommy Freeman and Michael Allen contributed 11 and 10 points, respectively. Allen also had nine assists compared to zero turnovers in the victory. The Bobcats shot 5.1.1 percent from the floor and 86.7 percent from the free throw line against the Lakers.

Tillman is the Bobcats top returning player and one of the best returnees in the MAC. He was named to the preseason All-MAC squad by the league coaches and Blue Ribbon touted the 6-6 forward as the preseason MAC Player of the Year. Blue Ribbon also named the Bobcat frontcourt as the top unit in the MAC heading into the 2008-09 season. Tillman is the MAC's active career leader in points and rebounds with 1,069 and 602, respectively. He averaged 13.3 points and 7.6 rebounds per game a season ago. Orr is the Bobcats second-leading returning scorer at 6.8 points per game, while Allen averaged 4.4 assists per game, which is the top returning total in the MAC. Last season, Allen was second in the MAC in assists per game and third in assist-to-turnover ratio.

The Convocation Center has always been a tough place for opponents to play as evident by Ohio's 76.1 winning percent at the facility. Over the four seasons, the Bobcats are 49-6 at The Convo, which is an 89.1 winning percentage. The Bobcats enter the 2008-09 season having won 21-straight non-conference home games, a streak that dates back to Nov. 29, 2004. During that time, Ohio has registered victories over the likes of Butler, George Mason and New Mexico State. Ohio has also won its last 13 season-opening home games, a streak that started on Nov. 26, 1988.

W&M AGAINST THE MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE

The Tribe is 2-6 all-time against current Mid-American Conference schools. The Tribe last played a MAC school during the 2001-02 season when it downed Akron, 74-62, at the Boilermaker Invitational in West Lafayette, Ind. The contest with Ohio will also be the first game on the road at a MAC program since a 76-72 setback to Toledo during the 1995-96 campaign. The Green and Gold will look for its first win on the road at a current MAC school since a victory over Akron during the 1949-50 season. Ohio will be the fifth current MAC program that the Tribe has faced. Here is a look at how W&M has fared against MAC programs:

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

For the second straight season, the Tribe opened the campaign with two straight road games. Last season, W&M traveled to then-No. 5 Georgetown, before making the trek to then-No. 21 N.C. State. In 2008-09, W&M opened at Big Ten foe Penn State on Friday and will meet Ohio University in Athens, Ohio, on Sunday. It marks the only two times since the 1969-70 season that W&M has opened a season with two straight true road games. With two consecutive seasons with two road games to open the year, it marks the first time that has occurred at

W&M since it pulled the feat in three straight season during the early 1950's. The Tribe played two road games to open the year in 1951-52, before starting the 1952-53 and 1953-54 campaigns with four straight road contests.

MAKING THEIR TRIBE DEBUTS

A quartet of players made their W&M debuts in the program's 2008-09 opener at Penn State Junior Sean McCurdy, who sat out last season at a transfer from Arkansas, sophomore Matt McFadden and freshmen Quinn McDowell and Kendrick Brown each saw the first action of their Green and Gold careers.

McCurdy started at the point guard slot and finished with team-high and career-best performances in assist (7) and rebounds (6), while also chipping in two points. McFadden was the first Tribe reserve off the bench, subbing in at the guard slot. In 10 minutes of action, he had a steal and also helped in handling the speed and pressure of the Nittany Lion guards. Brown and McDowell both came off the bench in their first collegiate contests. McDowell played the most minutes off the bench for a Tribe reserve with 12 and also added a reserve-best five points on 2-of-2 shooting from the field and 1-of-1 from the free throw line. The heady rookie from Mason, Ohio also provided two rebounds and an assist. Brown was a perfect 1-of-1 from the field, scoring the first two points of his Tribe career with a free throw line pull-up jumper. He also registered his first career steal in the second half against PSU.

MORE OF THE SAME FROM SUMNER

After coming on as the season went along for the Tribe last season, junior forward Danny Sumner provided more of the same in the Tribe regular season opener at Penn State. The Fairfax, Va., native finished with a team-high 15 points on 6-of-13 from the floor and 3-of-6 from 3-point range. He also pulled down five rebounds and had a steal in a team-high 34 minutes.

Sumner enjoyed a breakout season in 2007-08. He ranked third on the team at 10.5 points per game last season, but saved his best for the Green and Gold's late season run in the CAA Tournament. Over the four-day event, Sumner averaged 15.5 points and five rebounds per game, while shooting 50 percent from the floor and 47.1 percent from 3-point range. He capped the tournament by earning CAA All-Championship Team honors.

While Sumner has the ability to put up big numbers offensively, he was the College's most consistent scorer a season ago. He topped W&M with 21 double-digit scoring performances and over the final 28 games of the 2007-08 season, Sumner led W&M in scoring at an 11.4 points per game clip. The 6-7, 215-pounder can play both inside and outside for the Tribe. Last season, Sumner ranked among the CAA leaders, shooting 50.4 percent from the field, while also leading W&M in 3-point field goal percentage at 38.5 percent.

IMPACT TRANSFER

The College has a strong tradition of impact transfers under the direction of sixth-year head coach Tony Shaver. Hawley Smith served as a two-year captain for the Tribe during the 2005 and 2006 seasons after transferring from Temple, while Adam Payton earned All-CAA honors in 2007 after moving to Williamsburg from Vanderbilt. W&M has another impact transfer in the fold this season in junior guard Sean McCurdy, who sat out last season after transferring to the College from Arkansas prior to last season.

A dynamic point guard, who adds speed to the W&M backcourt, McCurdy started his first game in the Green and Gold and finished with team-best and career-high performances in assists (7) and rebounds (6). The 6-1, 184-pounder demonstrated the ability to find the open man as well as the ability to get by his defender on the drive and kick to open Tribe shooters in the season opener against Penn State. The Jersey City, N.J., native spent his redshirt year and the off season improving his strength and his jump shot. In two seasons at Arkansas, McCurdy appeared in 61 games, while making six starts, in helping the Razorbacks to the NCAA Tournament on a pair of occasions. He averaged 1.8 points and 1.3 assists

per game, while shooting 34.5 percent from 3-point range over his two seasons with Arkansas.

SCHNEIDER NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CAA

Junior guard David Schneider was named to the 2008-09 Colonial Athletic Association Preseason All-Conference team. The Phoenix, Ariz., native was named an honorable mention all-league choice by vote of the conference coaches, media and sports information directors.

The CAA Preseason All-Conference selections were comprised of two five-man teams as well as three honorable mention honorees. The conference also released its 2008-09 CAA men's basketball predicted order of finish by the league coaches, media and SIDs at its media day, and the Tribe was picked to finish eighth. VCU was selected to defend its regular season league title, while Northeastern, Old Dominion, George Mason and Delaware rounded out the top five.

Schneider is a two-year returning starter for the Green and Gold at the guard position. He capped the 2007-08 season by earning CAA All-Championship honors in helping the Tribe to its first-ever CAA Championship Game. In W&M's CAA Opening Round win over Georgia State, Schneider knocked down a 25-footer with 1.5 seconds remaining as the Tribe overcame a six-point deficit with less than a 1:30 remaining. The 6-3 guard finished the contest with GSU, connecting on six 3-point field goals on his way to scoring 20 points.

For the season, Schneider ranked second on the team in points per game at 10.9, while also chipping his 4.5 rebounds and a team-best 3.8 assists per game. He knocked down 64 3-pointers and finished shooting 34.8 percent from long range. His assist total of 124 ranked fourth in school history, while his 3-pointers made was fifth and his 85.5 percent (106-of-124) free throw percentage was the seventh best in the program's annals. Along with his high assist numbers, Schneider was adept at taking care of the basketball, ranking second in the CAA and 38th nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio. Schneider also established a program-record for minutes played in a season with 1140.

FROM WAY DOWNTOWN...

The Tribe has demonstrated the importance of the 3-point shot in the program's offensive schemes over the last two seasons. In 2006-07, W&M change offensive systems, relying more on a perimeter-oriented system that spreads the floor and focuses on spacing, effective perimeter shooting and players reading and reacting to teammates' cuts and motion.

The change has been one for the better as W&M has not only posted back-to-back 15-win seasons for the first time in a quarter century, but it bettered the school record for 3-pointers made, attempted and made per game over the last two years. In 2006-07, W&M connected on 200-of- 624 from long range, establishing school records in both categories. One year later, W&M smashed those numbers and set Colonial Athletic Association record for 3's made and attempted. The College connected on 257 treys last season, while attempting 755. The Green and Gold also established a program mark for 3-pointers made per game at 7.8.

In 2007-08, W&M finished with nine games of double-digit 3-pointers, establishing a new school record. The College also knocked down double-digit 3's in five straight games. The Tribe has connected on 10 or more 3-point field goals in a game on 18 occasions under head coach Tony Shaver and is 12-6 in those contests.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

Six current Tribe players are following in their father's footsteps playing athletics collegiately. Juniors David Schneider and Sean McCurdy, sophomores Marcus Kitts, Matt McFadden and Vali Lazarescu as well as freshman Quinn McDowell are second-generation college athletes.

Four fathers played basketball collegiately, while two more were college football players. Schneider's father, Jeff, played basketball at Virginia Tech, before being drafted in the fifth round of the 1982 NBA Draft by the Houston Rockets. Mc-

Curdy's father, Bob, was an All-American at the University of Richmond after leading the nation in scoring during the 1975 season. McFadden's father, John, played basketball for four years at Rutgers, while Lazarescu's father, Marian, played basketball collegiately in Romania.

Kitts' father, Jon, played college football at Central Michigan from 1978-81, while McDowell's father, Dave, graduated from W&M in 1985 and played football for current Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock.

GOING INTERNATIONAL

Sophomore forward Marcus Kitts had a unique opportunity over the summer, traveling over to Taipei, Taiwan with Athletes in Action to participate in the 2008 William Jones Cup. Kitts helped AIA to the silver medal at the event. Representing the U.S. at the 30th annual event, Athletes in Action finished the round robin portion of the tournament in first with a 6-1 record and advanced to the finals, before falling to the defending champion Jordan National Team, 93-91, in the thrilling overtime championship game.

Kitts finished the nine-game tournament averaging 5.9 points and 3.6 rebounds per game, while playing 14 minutes per contest. He shot 56.8 percent (25-of-44) from the field over the event and finished with five steals and six blocked shots. During the preliminary round robin portion of the Jones Cup, AIA tallied wins over Qatar (81-67), the Australian Under-19 National Team (98-71), the Korean University Selection Team (103-65), the Kazakhstan National Team (86-69), the Egyptian National Team (93-76) and the Taiwan National Team (102-84). The lone AIA loss in the prelims came in its opening game to Jordan, 67-63, in overtime.

Kitts turned in a trio of double-digit performances during the preliminary rounds for AIA. The Holly Springs, N.C., native tallied 12 points and seven rebounds in a the win over the Australian Under-19 National Team on July 12, and scored 10 points on July 15 in a victory over Egypt. Against the Egyptians, Kitts, who was the tallest player on the AIA roster at 6-foot, 9-inches, had to face a starting front line of 7-1 and 6-10. Kitts best game of the tournament came against the Korean University Selection team in which the Tribe sophomore scored 17 points and chipped in a team-high eight rebounds in just over 20 minutes of action, leading AIA to an easy 103-65 victory.

Kitts was one of 11 players from NCAA Division I programs across the country to compete for the U.S. It marked the 15th time since the event's inception in 1977 that Athletes in Action took part in the Jones Cup. Along with the basketball slate, the team performed numerous outreach activities in Taiwan, including basketball clinics and visits to a local orphanage.

Athletes In Action is the sports division of Campus Crusade for Christ International. Dave Hannah, who desired to capitalize on society's great love of sports and utilize the platform given to athletes to reach the world for Jesus Christ, founded AIA in 1966. AIA's outreach range includes ministry to college and professional athletes and coaches globally across a great number of sports. International competing teams partner with in-country staff and other mission organizations to resource Christian ministry around the world.

SENIOR CAPTAINS

Seniors Peter Stein and Chris Darnell return for their final seasons in the Green and Gold. Both players have been mainstays in the Tribe rotation as either starters or reserves over the last two seasons. The duo, along with juniors David Schneider and Sean McCurdy, were named captains for the 2008-09 season.

Stein is a hardworking, do-it-all type of player. The 6-9 Texan is the College's top defender and last season led the College in rebounding as well. He averaged 7.9 points and 4.8 rebounds per game, while topping the College shooting 53 percent from the floor. Stein also has the ability to step out and shoot the ball from deep after connecting on 34.4 percent from long range in 2007-08. He spent the off season working on his low post game and will be a force in the paint on both ends for W&M as a senior.

As a junior, Darnell spent time as both a reserve and starter. He appeared in all

33 games, while starting 13 contests. The Stafford, Va., native averaged 4.4 points and 3.7 rebounds per game last season. He possesses a diverse game that allows him to shoot it from the perimeter and slash to the goal. Darnell is also a strong passer from the forward position, and will likely draw a starting nod with his experience.

COACH OF THE YEAR

Each of the last two seasons, W&M head coach Tony Shaver has been honored with Coach of the Year accolades in turning out success not seen in Williamsburg in over a decade. After W&M posted a 15-15 ledger in 2006-07, CollegenInsider.com named Shaver the CAA Coach of the Year. A season later, Shaver reeled in numerous accolades in leading W&M to its first winning season in a decade and the program's first CAA Championship game appearance. In 2007-08, Shaver was voted the CAA Coach of the Year by the league's coaches, SIDs and media, and once again received the league honor from CollegenInsider.com. He was also named one of 10 finalists for the Hugh Durham National Mid-Major Coach of the Year presented by CollegenInsider.com. Shaver rounded out the awards, being named the W&M Alumni Association's Coach of the Year.

NEW FACES ON STAFF

While every year bring new faces to collegiate programs in form of players, W&M also added two new assistant coaches and a new director of basketball operations during the offseason. Former assistant coaches Dee Vick and Antwon Jackson left W&M for opportunities as the head coach at Hampden-Sydney College and an assistant coach at UMass, respectively. Those two vacancies paved the way for the hiring of Jamion Christian and Jonathan Holmes as assistant coaches. Both young coaches bring experience as both collegiate players and coaches. Coupled with third-year assistant Ben Wilkins, the Tribe's assistant coaching staff is one of the youngest in the country.

Christian spent the last two seasons on staff at Bucknell University. In Christian's first season with the Bison during the 2006-07 campaign, Bucknell finished with a 22-9 mark and advanced to the Patriot League Championship game before falling to Holy Cross. As a player, Christian was the VHSL Group A State Player of the Year at New Kent, before playing at Mount St. Mary's where he was a three-year captain.

Holmes has enjoyed coaching stops at Montreat College and Francis Marion University. He furthers the Tribe's North Carolina connection, having played four years for the Tar Heels. Holmes was runner-up for Indiana's "Mr. Basketball" as a high school senior, before helping North Carolina to the 2000 Final Four.

The Tribe also added David Kontaxis to the program as the director of basketball operations during the offseason. Kontaxis spent seven seasons as a basketball coach at Central High School in Capitol Heights, Md. Each of the last two years, he was the head coach of the Falcon program after spending five season as an assistant.

TRIBE ON TV

The Colonial Athletic Association released the most extensive men's and women's basketball television package in conference history with 110 televised contests, and the Tribe will have five games televised this season.

The Green and Gold's season opener at Penn State was televised on the Big Ten Network. The Tribe will have a quartet of games during the league schedule shown on TV, including a pair of home contests. The first two TV games of the conference slate for the College will both come on the road on Wednesday, Jan. 7 at UNC Wilmington and on Saturday, Jan. 17, at Delaware. The W&M-UNCW contest will be televised on ESPN Regional at 7 p.m., while the Tribe-Blue Hens affair is slated for a noon tip on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Philadelphia and the

Charter Sports Network. The game at UNCW will also be broadcast regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN).

On Saturday, Jan. 31, the Tribe will host Georgia State in a televised contest at 5 p.m. The game will be aired on the Comcast/Charter Sports Network and will also be shown locally on WSKY Channel 4. Four days later, the Green and Gold's home game against Northeastern will be televised on Comcast SportsNet New England as well as locally on WSKY Channel 4. The Wednesday, Feb. 4, tilt is slated for a 7 p.m. tip-off.

In total, the CAA TV package includes 92-game men's basketball games to be broadcast. The composite schedule features 33 appearances on the various ESPN platforms, including four regular-season games and the CAA Championship on ESPN/ESPN2, eight games on ESPNU and five syndicated games on ESPN Regional Television. That number could rise as all 12 CAA teams are once again participating in the ESPNU BracketBusters on February 20-21, 2009.

The largest-ever Comcast syndicated package features 28 games on the Comcast SportsNets (CSN Mid-Atlantic, CSN Philadelphia, CSN New England and CSS) and 20 games on CN8, the Comcast Network, providing tremendous exposure in many of the nation's largest media markets. CN8 will once again televise the quarterfinals and semifinals of the CAA Men's Basketball Championship.

O'REILLY ESPNU BRACKETBUSTERS

For the third straight season, the William and Mary men's basketball team, along with the rest of the Colonial Athletic Association, will take part in the ESPNU BracketBusters. The seventh annual event will be Feb. 20-21, 2009 and will feature 13 nationally televised contests on ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN360.com. W&M will host a BracketBusters Game for the second consecutive year.

During its first two seasons of BracketBusters, the Tribe has faced Fairfield of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference and Loyola (Chicago) of the Horizon League. In 2007, the College fell at Fairfield, 61-45, before dropping last season's contest to Loyola, 71-66, in Williamsburg.

The CAA has had tremendous success in BracketBusters, with the league posting an 8-3 record in televised contests over the past four years. CAA teams have registered several impressive victories in the event, including George Mason's triumph at Wichita State in 2006, Drexel beating Creighton on the road in 2007 and VCU winning at Akron in 2008.

A pool of 102 teams from 17 different conferences will participate in the 2009 BracketBusters. The field includes teams with 77 appearances in the last five NCAA Tournaments, including a team in the Final Four, one in Elite Eight and six Sweet Sixteen squads.

For the fourth straight year, ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, will televise five BracketBusters games while ESPN360.com, ESPN's customized broadband service, will offer two. ESPN2 will televise six contests. ESPN360.com will also simulcast ESPN2's six telecasts. The 13 BracketBusters matchups will be announced February 2, while game time and network assignments will be announced February 9.

2007-08 REWIND

The 2007-08 season will not only go down as one of the most memorable in William and Mary basketball lore, but it also set forth a belief that Tribe hoops may not be too far from the program's elusive conference title. W&M capped its memorable season with the program's first trip to the CAA Championship game and its first appearance on national TV via ESPN. While in the end the College came up just shy of its first CAA crown, the road and list of accomplishments signified a change in attitude and thinking about the Tribe program.

The Green and Gold notched its first winning season in a decade, finishing the year at 17-16. The 17 wins marked only the sixth time in W&M history that a squad tallied 17 or more wins in a season. The Tribe also won 15 games in 2006-07, marking back-to-back 15-plus win campaigns for the first time in 25 years.

W&M led its fans on a breathe-taking, dramatic run through the CAA Tournament. W&M recorded last-second victories in each of its first three games, becoming the first No. 5 seed in the history of the league championship to earn a spot in the conference title game. In the opening-round game, the Tribe trailed Georgia State by six points with 1:25 remaining, but a David Schneider 25-footer with 1.5 seconds remaining gave the College a redeeming 58-57 win over the same Panther squad that had sent W&M home on a last second shot the season before.

In the quarterfinals, the Green and Gold rebounded from a slow start and Nathan Mann's 3-pointer from the left wing with 7.5 seconds remaining sent the College to the semifinals with 63-60 win over Old Dominion. It was Laimis Kisielius' turn in the semifinals, banking in a leaning six-footer with three seconds remaining as the Tribe pulled off a 56-54 upset of regular season champion VCU. Despite falling in the title game to George Mason, the Tribe showed it belong among the CAA elite and that the program will be one to watch in the coming seasons.

KYLE GAILLARD, MATT RUM SIGN WITH TRIBE

William and Mary head men's basketball coach Tony Shaver announced the signing of Kyle Gaillard (Huntersville, N.C./North Mecklenburg) and Matt Rum (Chapel Hill, N.C./Loyola Blakefield) to National Letters of Intent. Both players will be eligible to compete for the Tribe during the 2009-10 season.

Kyle Gaillard (Huntersville, N.C./North Mecklenburg)

Gaillard is a three-year letterwinner for Duane Lewis at North Mecklenburg, where he helped propel the Vikings to the MECA-7 regular season championship and a North Carolina 4A Sectional Championship as a junior in 2008. The 6-7 lefty averaged 17 points per game for one of the top teams in the state of North Carolina last season, while shooting 43 percent from 3-point range. He was named to the MECA-7 All-Conference team and received all-region honors.

Gaillard grew four inches between his sophomore and junior years of high school and is listed as a two-star recruit by Scout.com. As one of the top underclassmen in the state of North Carolina, Gaillard was invited to participate in the second annual Carolina Challenge in 2008 by national recruiting analyst Dave Telep. Prior to signing with the Tribe, Gaillard gained recruiting interest from Penn State, Michigan, Davidson and Winthrop. He was recently named a McDonald's All-American nominee.

During his high school career, Gaillard was named North Mecklenburg's Most Improved player in 2007. This coming season, he will serve as the Viking's team captain. Also during his high school career, Gaillard was a two-year letterwinner as a pitcher on the North Mecklenburg varsity baseball team.

During his AAU career, Gaillard was a part of six different teams that won North Carolina State Championships. He played for the Carolina Flight 11U-16U and the Charlotte Royals 17U. He participated in the 2008 Hoops Group Elite Camp and was named to two of their Super Seven lists, while playing in the summer event that included over 3,400 athletes. Hoops Group Elite ranked Gaillard the No. 6 in Best Player from Outside the Northeast list and also ranked him No. 3 in Best Players from North Carolina list.

Kyle is the son of Jill and Ted Gaillard and was born on April 15, 1991 in Naperville, Ill. His father, Ted, played baseball at the University of Delaware from 1977-79. At North Mecklenburg, Kyle was a Junior Marshall for the 2008 Graduating Class and was chosen based on his top 50 academic standing in the junior class of 525 students. As a senior in high school, Kyle was voted homecoming king at North Mecklenburg.

Matt Rum (Chapel Hill, N.C./Loyola Blakefield)

Rum signs with the Tribe as one of the top players in the Baltimore area. As a junior, the 6-3 guard was named to the All MIAA 'A' Conference, All-Baltimore Catholic League and All-Baltimore County. Rum led Loyola Blakefield to the semifinals of the BCL playoffs for the first time since 1998 as he averaged 15.7 points per game, 5.7 rebounds and knocked down 44 3-point field goals. The Baltimore Catholic League is nationally known for its level of play, including producing numerous Division I and NBA players. Rum also was named the MVP of Gilman High School Holiday Tournament as a junior.

During his sophomore year at Loyola, Rum averaged 14.8 points per game, while shooting 40 percent from 3-point range. He highlighted the campaign by knocking down eight 3-pointers on his way to a career-high 30 points in a victory over Archbishop Curley. Over his career at Loyola Blakefield, Rum has scored 720 points and knocked down 91 3-point field goals.

Rum also received recruiting interest from Towson, Radford and Boston University. He played AAU basketball for Severna Park/Maryland 3D and is listed as a two-star recruit by Scout.com. Rum grew up in Chapel Hill, N.C., prior to moving to Baltimore for high school. He played AAU for the North Carolina Gators out of Greensboro and helped the program to 13U and 14U state champions.

As a youth, Rum was a ball boy at Duke University in 2000 when the Blue Devils had the likes of current and former NBA players Mike Dunleavy, Jr., Carlos Boozer, Shane Battier and Jason Williams. He is one of the first former Duke ball boys to earn a Division I scholarship to play basketball. Rum also had the opportunity to play HORSE against ESPN college basketball guru and Hall of Famer Dick Vitale during his time as a Blue Devil ball boy.

Matt is the son of Steve and Carol Rum and was born Nov. 9, 1989 in Alexandria, Va. TONY SHAVER

HEAD COACH • SIXTH SEASON AT W&M

When Tony Shaver accepted the head coaching position at William and Mary in May of 2003, he set his sights on making the Tribe a winning program. Fast-forward five years and the two-time CAA Coach of the Year and National Mid-Major Coach of the Year finalist has led a revival of the Green and Gold program, and last season, took it to the brink of its first-ever CAA title and NCAA Tournament appearance. Despite all the recent success, Shaver's vision and intensity to win has not wavered.

"I do not want anyone to limit the vision of our program," Shaver said. "We expect our teams to win and the last two seasons have been exceptional steps toward where we know our program can be."

In 2007-08, William and Mary posted its first winning season in a decade finishing with a 17-16 ledger. In fact it was only the sixth time in school history that a Tribe team had won 17 or more contests. W&M also finished fifth in the league on the strength of a 10-8 CAA ledger. It marked only the second time in the Tribe's 23-year history in the CAA that it has won double-digit games. Over the last two seasons, W&M ranks fifth in the league in conference wins with 18. The stat demonstrates the rising success of the Tribe program, given W&M won only 10 CAA games in Shaver's first three seasons at the helm.

In five seasons at the helm of the William and Mary men's basketball program, Tony Shaver has turned the William and Mary men's basketball program into a winner. Over the last two seasons, the program posted back-to-back 15-plus win seasons for the first time in a quarter of a century. The Tribe also put together consecutive seasons with a .500 or better record for the first time in 23 years.

Shaver was voted the 2008 CAA Coach of the Year by the league's media, coaches and sports information directors. The Shaver-led Tribe punctuated the honor by reeling off three-straight last-second wins on its way to the CAA Championship Game. Included in the run was a 56-54 win over regular season champion and No. 1 seed VCU in the semifinals. W&M won three contests to get to the championship game, matching the program's victory total in the tournament from the previous 22 years. As a result of the title game appearance, W&M had its first-ever national televised game and made its first appearance on ESPN.

The Tribe accomplished numerous other milestones during the historic 2007-08 season. W&M established not only school records, but CAA marks for 3-pointers made (257) and attempted (755) in a season. The Tribe also bettered the school standard for 3-pointers per game (7.79), double-digit 3-point efforts in a season (9) and consecutive double-digit 3-point shooting performances (5). Shaver engineered a quartet of double-digit comebacks for the Tribe in 2008, including three straight in wins over James Madison (1/9), at Georgia State (1/12) and against Northeastern (1/16). It marked the first time in school history W&M overcame two-straight double-digit second-half deficits, let alone three. The Tribe's 16-point second-half comeback at Georgia State was the largest deficit that W&M overcame on the road in 15 years. Shaver also reached a coaching milestone of his own on December 31, 2007, winning his 400th collegiate coaching game as the Tribe defeated Fairfield, 71-50, at Kaplan Arena.

W&M demonstrated its mettle as a winning team with not only its ability to overcome deficits, but also with being able to win close games. The Tribe won more than half its games (nine) when trailing at the half. W&M also won nine games by four or fewer points this season, bettering the total (six) from Shaver's first four seasons at the helm of the program. The Tribe put together a six-game CAA winning streak from Jan. 5 through Jan. 23, which marked only the third such league winning streak in Tribe history. Shaver also guided the Tribe to four straight CAA road wins in 2008. It equaled the program's longest CAA mark and was the second-longest single-season road winning streak in school history.

In 2006-07, Shaver earned CollegelInsider.com Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Tribe to a 15-15 record. It marked just the second time in the last 20 years W&M had won 15 games.



Shaver also led his troops to eight wins during the tough CAA portion; only the third time the Tribe has accomplished that feat. Another telling stat of the progression of the program was the four CAA road victories, highlighted by a 67-63 win over 2006 Final Four participant George Mason. In Shaver's first four seasons, W&M had won only three road affairs.

The 2006-07 season brought about a change in styles for the 31st W&M head coach. After spending much of his career coaching an up-tempo offense, featuring a trapping defense, Shaver switched over to a more perimeter-oriented attack last season. The Tribe offensive scheme now spreads the floor and relies on spacing, effective perimeter shooting and players reading and reacting to teammates' cuts and motion. Defensively, W&M employs a plethora of defensive systems to throw off opposing offenses.

The new style led to the Tribe ranking among the top 50 in the country in 3-point field goal defense as well as holding its opponents to 64.2 points per game, the best mark since the 1997-98 season. The College also established school records for 3-point field goals made and 3-point field goals attempted. The success of the new approach was never more evident than in the Tribe's Feb. 14 victory over eventual National Invitational Tournament participant Drexel, 60-47, in Williamsburg. It was the lowest point production in four seasons, and marked the highest ranked team, in terms of RPI, that W&M had defeated since 2001.

There have been individual successes as well for the Green and Gold under Shaver's reign. On five occasions, a W&M player has been named All-CAA under Shaver, while another four have been named to the CAA All-Rookie Team. 2004 graduate Adam Hess, currently playing professionally in France, became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a First-Team Academic All-American and all-conference selection as a senior. Corey Cofield was voted the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. W&M players have also enjoyed success in the classroom under Shaver, as on 10 occasions a Tribe player has been named to the CAA All-Academic team over the last five seasons, including a program-high three in 2007 and 2008. This past season, junior David Schneider garnered the third CAA Men's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year award under Shaver.

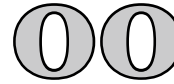
In total, four former W&M athletes who played under Shaver have gone on to or will shortly begin professional careers overseas. Hess is currently playing his second season for Artland in the German Bundesliga. He spent last season in France after earning Second-Team All-Bundesliga honors with Artland in 2007. Fellow 2004 graduate Zeb Cope is in his sixth professional season overseas and third in France. He is playing in the French Pro A League with JDA Dijon Bourgogne. Adam Payton, a 2007 graduate of W&M, completed his first season in 2008 with BC Boncourt in Switzerland and signed with Lille Metropole in the French N1 League. Laimis Kisielius, who graduated last season, will begin his professional career in Europe in the fall.
