SEASON REVIEW

'08-09 TRIBE BASKETBALL

The 2007-08 season will not only go down as one of the most memorable in William and Mary basketball lore, but it also set forth a belief that Tribe hoops may not be too far from the program's elusive conference title. W&M capped its memorable season with the program's first trip to the CAA Championship game and its first appearance on national TV via ESPN. While in the end the College came up just shy of its first CAA crown, the road and list of accomplishments signified a change in attitude and thinking about the Tribe program.

The Green and Gold notched its first winning season in a decade, finishing the year at 17-16. The 17 wins marked only the sixth time in W&M history that a squad tallied 17 or more wins in a season. The Tribe also won 15 games in 2006-07, marking back-to-back 15-plus win campaigns for the first time in 25 years.

W&M lead its fans on a breathe-taking, dramatic run through the CAA Tournament. W&M recorded last-second victories in each of its first three games, becoming the first No. 5 seed in the history of the league championship to earn a spot in the conference title game. In the opening-round game, the Tribe trailed Georgia State by six points with 1:25 remaining, but a David Schneider 25-footer with 1.5 seconds remaining gave the College a redeeming 58-57 win over the same Panther squad that had sent W&M home on a last second shot the season before.

In the quarterfinals, the Green and Gold rebounded from a slow start and Nathan Mann's 3-pointer from the left wing with 7.5 seconds remaining sent the College to the semifinals with 63-60 win over Old Dominion. It was Laimis Kisielius' turn in the semifinals, banking in a leaning six-footer with three seconds remaining as the Tribe pulled off a 56-54 upset of regular season champion VCU. Despite falling in the title game to George Mason, the Tribe showed it belong among the CAA elite and that the program will be one to watch in the coming seasons.

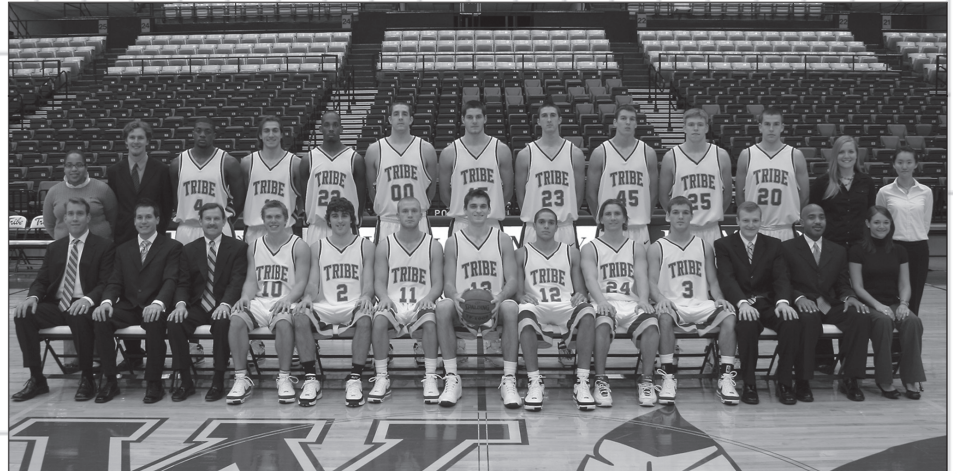
Here is a look at notes from the Tribe's memorable 2007-08 season.

SHAVER NAMED FINALIST FOR NATIONAL MID-MAJOR COACH OF THE YEAR

After guiding the Tribe to its first winning season in a decade and to the CAA Championship game for the first time ever, head coach Tony Shaver was named one of 10 finalists for the 2008 CollegeInsider.com Hugh Durham Mid-Major Coach of the Year Award. Shaver joined a list of finalists that included Ronnie Arrow of South Alabama, Randy Bennett of St. Mary's, Keno Davis of Drake, Steve Donahue of Cornell, Danny Kaspar of Stephen F. Austin, Bob McKillop of Davidson, Randy Monroe of UMBC, Mike Rice of Robert Morris and Brad Stevens of Butler. The Hugh Durham Award is given annually to the nation's top mid-major coach, as voted on by the 20-member panel. The winner will be presented with the award at the Final Four in San Antonio. CollegeInsider.com also named Shaver the CAA Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

TRIBE SETS CAA RECORDS

The Tribe not only set school records for 3-pointers made and attempted in 2007-08, but the College also topped the CAA records in both categories. W&M knocked down 257 treys on the year, bettering the old CAA record held by the 2006-07 Hofstra squad. The Green and Gold shattered the old school record, set just a season prior, by 57 3-

point field goals. The College also destroyed the CAA record for 3-pointers attempted in a season, hoisting 755 long balls on the year. The number was 74 more than the old mark set by Northeastern in 2005-06. Along with those school records, W&M established a new program mark for 3-pointers made per game at 7.8 per contest.

DOUBLE-DIGIT LEAGUE WINS

The Tribe tallied 10 victories during the CAA regular season, marking only the second time in the Tribe's 23-year history in the league that it reached double-digit wins in conference play. The 10 wins are the second-most CAA victories for a W&M team behind only the program-best 13 league wins in 1997-98.

The 2007-08 version of Tribe basketball joined some elite company with its 10th league win against Drexel on Feb. 20. In the program's 71-year affiliation with a conference, it marked only the eighth time a W&M team won 10 or more league games. It occurred six times as a member of the Southern Conference (1948-49 [10], 1949-50 [12], 1950-51 [13], 1951-52 [10], 1959-60 [10] and 1962-63 [10]) and only once as a member of the CAA (1997-98 [13]). W&M was a member of the Southern Conference from 1936-77, before joining the ECAC South from 1977-85. The Tribe was a charter member of the CAA and has been with the league since 1985.

ANOTHER SEASON OF FIRSTS

The Tribe once again enjoyed a historic and memorable season achieving numerous milestones that had not been seen in Williamsburg in some time. While the 2007-08 version of W&M hoops got off to a slow start, it did not derailed the number of benchmarks that came to fruition for the Green and Gold. Here is a look at some of the firsts in recent Tribe history:

- W&M advanced to its first-ever CAA Championship game, while winning three games at the conference tournament for the first time.

- The 2008 Tribe became only the sixth team in school history to win 17 games in a season.

- W&M defeated VCU, 56-54, for the first time since 2003. It was W&M head coach Tony Shaver and the Tribe senior class' first victory over the Rams.

- The Tribe won its first-ever game in the Ted Constant Center against Old Dominion on Jan. 5. The 70-61 triumph was the first for W&M in Norfolk since the 1997-98 season.

- With its overtime victory over Drexel, the Tribe not only picked up its first win over the Dragons in Philadelphia, but the program's first-ever win as a whole in the City of Brotherly Love. It was also the first W&M win in the state of Pennsylvania since the 1985-86 season.

- W&M had a six-game CAA winning streak from Jan. 5 through Jan. 23. It marked only the third such winning streak in Tribe history and the first since the 1997-98 campaign.

- The Tribe's victory at Drexel in overtime was the first W&M victory on the road in overtime since downing George Mason in Fairfax, Va., on Feb. 16, 1998.

- W&M had its first conference winning streak of six games since the 1997-98 season. It was the third longest streak in league play since the Tribe joined the CAA.

- The College has won four straight road games for the first time since the 1994-95 campaign. All four road wins came in CAA play, which marks only the second time since the Tribe joined the CAA that the feat has occurred.

- W&M tallied its first victory over Hofstra under head coach Tony Shaver with its 74-62 win on Feb. 6.

- For only the second time since joining the CAA and the eighth time in the College's 71-year history of being affiliated with a conference, the Tribe registered double-digit victories with its 10th CAA win over Drexel, 57-50, on Feb. 20.

TRIBE CAA AWARDS

After one of its best Colonial Athletic Association seasons in school history, the William and Mary men's basketball team reaped the rewards at the league's annual awards banquet highlighted by Tribe head coach Tony Shaver garnering CAA Coach of the Year honors. Senior Laimis Kisielius headlined the player awards for the Green and Gold, receiving Third-Team All-CAA accolades. The College also led the way on the league's All-Academic teams with a trio of honorees. Sophomore David Schneider received First-Team CAA All-Academic team honors, while Kisielius and fellow senior captain Chris Stratton received second team distinction.

Shaver became the third Tribe coach to garner the league's coach of the year honor, joining Charlie Woollum (1998) and Bruce Parkhill (1983). Along with leading the program to the CAA title game and 17 wins, the fifth-year Tribe head man won his 400th collegiate coaching game in 2007-08 when W&M defeated Fairfield, 71-50, on Dec. 31.

Kisielius was a key component to the Tribe's success throughout the 2007-08 season, leading the team in scoring at 11.3 points per game, while also adding 3.4 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game. He garnered CAA Player of the Week honors earlier in the year after scoring a career-best 26 points against Old Dominion. Kisielius' honor marked the 19th occasion that a W&M player has earned All-CAA honors and the fifth occurrence under Shaver. Kisielius

became the 13th Tribe player to earn the honor.

The Tribe led the way with a trio of 14 total CAA All-Academic team selections. It marked the second straight season in which the Tribe had three honorees. In fact, W&M has the most All-Academic team selections since 2000 with 14. On 10 occasions under Shaver, a Tribe player has been named to the league's All-Academic team. Schneider, a business marketing major at the College, was one of five players named to the First-Team CAA All-Academic team. Kisielius garnered second team all-academic team honors for the second straight season and was joined on the squad by Stratton, who was also the W&M nominee for the Dean Ehlers Leadership Award.

1,000-POINT DUO

The senior duo of Nathan Mann and Laimis Kisielius became only the third set of teammates and the first that spent all four years of the Tribe careers together to reach the 1,000-point mark in the same season. After Kisielius joined the group on Jan. 30 with his 1,000th career point at JMU, Mann accomplished the feat in the Tribe's game at George Mason. They became the 29th and 30th members of the W&M 1,000-point club. Kisielius finished his W&M career ranked 22nd on the career scoring list, while Mann was No. 28.

The duo became only the third pair in history to score their 1,000th career points in the same season. Matt Courage and John Lowenhaupt both scored their 1,000th career points in 1977, while Matt Verkey and Carl Parker reached the mark in 1996. Kisielius and Mann are the first to do it in the same season after spending their entire careers together. Two other duos, Bev Vaughan and Jeff Cohen (1958-61) as well as Kevin Richardson and Keith Cieplicki (1982-85), played their entire careers together, but scored their 1,000th career points in separate seasons.

EQUALING A SCHOOL RECORD

Senior guard Nathan Mann tied the W&M school record for games played in a career. The CAA Championship game was his 120th career appearance for the Green and Gold, equaling the school record held by Ed McMillan, who played for the College from 1948-51.

SEEING MAJOR MINUTES

Sophomore guard David Schneider shattered the W&M school record for minutes played in a season. He played 1,140 minutes in 2007-08 and averaged 34.5 minutes per contest. The Phoenix, Ariz., native bettered the W&M record of 1,033 minutes set by Scott Coval in 1986.

Senior guard Nathan Mann finished the year third on the Tribe's single-season minutes played list with 1,011 and his career total of 3,151 ranked fourth in the program's annals. Fellow classmate Laimis Kisielius joined Mann in the Tribe's 3,000 career minute club against Georgia State in the CAA tournament. Only six players in W&M history have played more than 3,000 minutes, including Mann and Kisielius. Kisielius played 3,121 minutes during his career. The duo also finished their career ranking first and third in career games played for the Tribe at 120 and 117, respectively.

CARDIAC KIDS

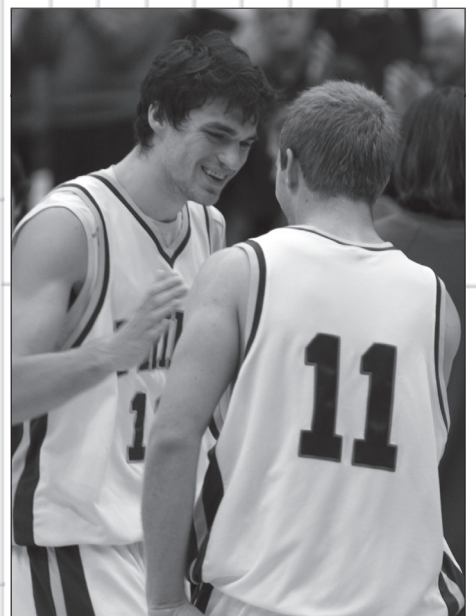
In each of the Tribe's CAA victories over James Madison, at Georgia State, against Northeastern and UNC Wilmington, the College rallied from double-digit deficits on its way to victory. W&M displayed its never-say-die attitude at home, overcoming an 11-point deficit with 8:55 remaining in tallying a 69-66 win over James Madison on Jan. 9. The Tribe followed that up with a 16-point rally to notch a 60-58 victory at Georgia State. The Green and Gold completed the trilogy versus the Huskies as W&M trailed by 12 at halftime, only to notch a 55-53 triumph. Most recently, UNCW led the Tribe by 10 in the second half, before coming back for the 70-66 victory.

The comeback victories marked the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth times under head coach Tony Shaver that the Tribe has overcome a double-digit deficit in recording a victory. The three straight double-digit second-half comebacks for the College are the most consecutive double-digit rallies in the College in more than 25 years. Dating back to the 1980-81 season, the Tribe had never overcome back-to-back double-digit deficits to record wins, let alone three straight.

The 16-point comeback against Georgia State was the largest by a W&M team since the Tribe trailed James Madison by 18 in a 64-61 win in Kaplan Arena on Jan. 4, 1997. The last time a W&M team overcame a deficit of at least 16 points on the road in the second half to tally a victory came at UNC Greensboro during the 1992-93 season.

WINNING IT CLOSE

In 2007-08, W&M won nine games by four or fewer points. W&M won two games by a single point, three by two points, three by three points and one by four points. Included in those wins by four or fewer points were all three CAA Tournament victories. It is another impressive sign of the steps the program has taken under head coach Tony Shaver. In the College opening four seasons under Shaver, W&M won only six games by four or fewer points.

WILLIAM & MARY 58 GEORGIA STATE 57 CAA OPENING ROUND

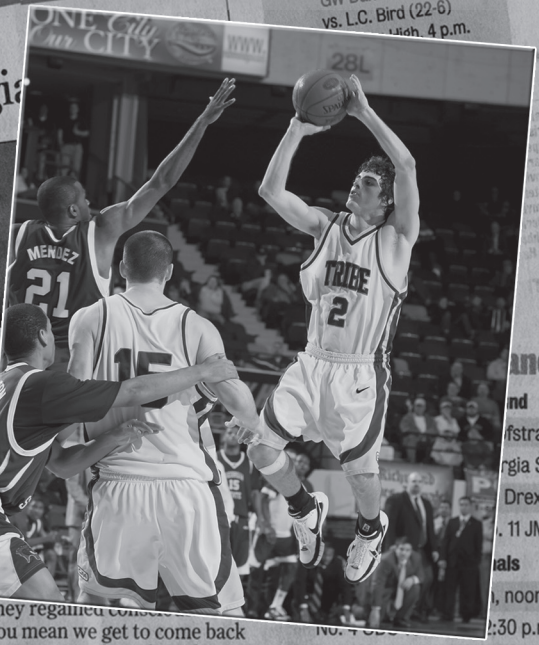
Call it deja vu, but this time the shoe was on the other foot as William and Mary sophomore guard David Schneider came off a Peter Stein screen to drill a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 1.5 seconds left, capping a Tribe come-from-behind victory over Georgia State in the opening round of the CAA Championship. After falling on a Panther buzzer beater last season in the very same round of the league tourney, it was the College's chance to return the favor as it rallied from a six-point deficit with 1:25 remaining.

Schneider scored a valuable eight points over the final 46 seconds of the game and finished with a game-high 20 points, including 14 in the second half. The Phoenix, Ariz., native was 6-of-8 shooting from 3-point range and was flanked by fellow classmate Danny Sumner, who finished with 17 points on 5-of-10 shooting from the floor.

A Nathan Mann 3-pointer with 7.5 seconds remaining provided an encore to W&M's last-second victory in the opening round as the Tribe upended No. 4 seeded Old Dominion in the quarterfinals. For the first in the 23-year history of the CAA, W&M won two games in the league tournament and advanced to the semifinals for the third time in the program's history.

Senior Laimis Kisielius and sophomore Dany Sumner paced the Tribe in scoring with 16 points each in the victory. Mann finished with 10 points on a pair of 3-pointers to go along with a career-high six assists.

After a slow start, W&M scored a 14-0 run in the first-half to seize control and take a lead into the locker room. The Tribe led the entire way in the second half until an offensive put back from Gerald Lee gave the Monarchs a 58-57 lead with 1:41 remaining. A David Schneider 3-pointer gave W&M a momentary lead, before an ODU tip-in tied things at 60 with less than a minute remaining.

For the third time in as many days, W&M needed late-game heroics, this time in the form of a six-foot bank shot with three seconds left from senior Laimis Kisielius. The shot sent the College into the CAA title game for the first time ever and capped a 56-54 upset win over regular season champion VCU.

Kisielius led all scorers with 23 points and six assists. Sophomore Danny Sumner once again starred for the College scoring a career-high 19 points, including a trio of 3-pointers, while also adding seven rebounds.

The Tribe trailed by six points at the half, but used a 12-0 run sparked by Kisielius and Sumner midway through the second half to take an eight-point lead. VCU rallied to pull even at 51 and then again at 54, before Kisielius' dramatics.

In front of a national television audience on ESPN (another first for the program), the Tribe had its magical run in the CAA Championship come to a close at the hands of George Mason. W&M trailed by only one at the half, but the Patriots used a 9-0 out of the locker room to seize control of the game.

Senior Laimis Kisielius was sensational in his final collegiate game, leading all scorers with 22 points. He along with the sophomore pair of David Schneider and Danny Sumner headlined a three-member W&M contingent on the six-person All-Championship Team. Schneider and Sumner finished with 12 and 10 points, respectively. In the title game, W&M connected on nine 3-point field goal to bring its season total to 25-7, which set a new CAA record.
