W&M OPENS CAA PLAY AT HOME VS. VCU

The William and Mary men's basketball team will open the Colonial Athletic Association portion of the schedule against VCU on Saturday, Dec. 6. Tip-off is slate for 7 p.m. at Kaplan Arena.

In its last contest, W&M dropped its second straight close road game, falling to Loyola (Chicago), 64-61, on Dec. 2. The College rallied from a 12-point deficit with four minutes remaining and had a chance to tie the game in the final seconds, but a pair of 3-point attempts were no good, sealing the Green and Gold's fate. Junior Danny Sumner once again led the Tribe with 18 points, all in the second half, while senior forward Peter Stein had a season-high 16 points to go along with five rebounds against the Ramblers. VCU is coming off a 79-62 victory over Western Michigan on Thursday night. Senior guard Eric Maynor once again led the Ram attack with 29 points to go along with eight assists. Joey Rodriguez and Kirill Pishchalnikov added 17 and 15 points, respectively, in the victory.

STORY LINES

- The contest will be a rematch of last season's CAA semifinal affair in which the Tribe tallied a last-second 56-54 win over the league regular season champion Rams in Richmond.

- As of Nov. 30, junior forward Danny Sumner ranked 30th nationally in scoring and is currently fourth in the CAA at 20.4 points per contest.

- W&M will open the CAA slate with VCU for the fourth time and for the second straight season.

SCOUTING VCU

The Rams enter the CAA opener at 4-3 following a convincing 79-62 home victory over Western Michigan on Thursday, Dec. 4. Earlier this season, VCU advanced to the finals of the Cancun Challenge, before falling to SEC foe Vanderbilt, 71-66, on Nov. 30. In the tournament, the Rams tallied victories over The Citadel, South Dakota State and New Mexico. The other two VCU setbacks on the year came at Rhode Island, 92-86, and at East Carolina in overtime, 93-90.

In its most recent victory over Western Michigan, VCU used a late first-half run to push its advantage to double digits at the half, before shooting 60 percent in the second half on its way to a 17-point win over the Broncos. Senior Eric Maynor topped the Rams with 29 points to go along with eight assists, while connecting on 4-of-5 from 3-point range and 9-of-10 from the charity stripe. Sophomore Joey Rodriguez added 17 points, while junior Kirill Pishchalnikov turned in a double-double with 15 points and 14 rebounds.

Maynor leads not only the Rams, but the CAA in scoring at 25.1 points per game. He also leads the conference in assists at six per contest, while ranking among the league leaders in field goal percentage (54.5 percent) and 3-point percentage (45.5 percent). Rodriguez is second on the team in scoring at 10.4 per affair, while leading the CAA in steals at 2.6 per game. Pishchalnikov lead the Rams in rebounding and ranks sixth in the CAA at 6.3 rebounds per game. Sophomore Larry Sanders tops the league and ranks among the national leaders in blocked shots at 3.4 per contest.

VCU leads the all-time series with the Tribe at 27-11, but W&M claimed the most recent contest, winning in the CAA semifinals, 56-54, on a last-second bucket by Laimis Kisielius. The Tribe overcame a six-point halftime deficit to knock off the regular season league champions. Danny Sumner had 19 points and seven rebounds in the victory, while Peter Stein added a game-high nine rebounds and drew three charges in the second half.

W&M IN CAA OPENERS

W&M is 8-16 all-time in CAA openers. The Tribe will open the CAA slate against VCU for the fourth time and for the second straight season. W&M and VCU opened the league portion of the schedule against one another in 1996, 1998 and 2007. VCU claimed a victory in 1996, while the College returned the favor in 1998. The Rams claimed last season's CAA opener, 71-57, in Richmond.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

The Tribe has proven to be a resilient group in the early part of the 2008-09 season. On three different occasions, the College has trailed by double-digits with five minutes remaining only to rally and force overtime or have a chance to tie in the waning seconds.

Against Navy, the College closed regulation on a 14-2 run to erase at 64-52 deficit with 5:13 remaining. Junior Danny Sumner capped the run with a trey from the left wing with 5.9 seconds remaining to tie the game at 66 and force OT. Freshman Quinn McDowell came up with a big shot as well for W&M. The Mason, Ohio native drilled a longball from the right side with just 2.2 seconds left on the clock to push the game to a third overtime session.

In the championship game of the Liberty Thanksgiving Classic, the Tribe trailed 56-45 with 3:57 left, but came back to send the game to extra sessions. W&M scored 15 of the final 19 points in the second half to force OT. Junior David Schneider sent the game to overtime with a 3-pointer from the left side with 22.4 seconds remaining.

During its most recent affair with Loyola (Chicago), W&M trailed 54-42 with 4:41 remaining. The College pulled within three points, 64-61, with 28.1 seconds remaining. The College had a pair of attempts in the final seconds to tie the contest and force overtime, but both chances were off the mark.

3-POINT SHOOTING

The 3-point shot has become a fixture of the Tribe offense, and W&M ranks among the national leaders in shooting from deep. As of Nov. 30, the College ranks No. 19 nationally in 3-pointers made per game. W&M is connecting on 8.9 treys per game, which also ranks second in the CAA. The Green and Gold are attempting 3-pointers at a high rate as well. According to Kenpom.com, W&M ranks 10th nationally in percentage of field goal attempts coming from beyond the 3-point arc. Of the Tribe's field goal attempts this season, 46.5 percent have come from 3-point range.

DISHING IT OUT

W&M not only tops the CAA in assists per game, but also ranks among the national leaders in the category. The College is averaging 16.5 assists per game and ranks No. 39 nationally as of Nov. 30 in the statistical category. The College has dished out 15 or more assists in all but one game this season and on two occasions, has eclipsed the 20-assist mark. W&M dished out 20 assists against Navy on Nov. 22, before handing out a season-best 23 helpers at Liberty on Nov. 29.

An even more impressive stats for the College is its percentage of field goals off assists. According to Kenpom.com, the College ranks 15th nationally in assist percentage at 67.7 percent. W&M also ranks second in the CAA in assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.1.

LONG RANGE BOMBERS

Juniors David Schneider and Danny Sumner have been lethal from 3-point range for the Tribe this season and currently ranked No.1 and No. 2 in the CAA in 3-pointers made per game. On the year, the pair has combined for 50 3-point field goals and is shooting a combined 37 percent from long range.

As of Nov. 30, Schneider ranked 10th nationally in 3-pointers per game, while Sumner was 87th in the category. The pair also currently rank among the top 15 in the CAA in 3-point field goal percentage. Sumner is sixth in the league at 41.1 percent followed by Schneider, who is No. 14 in the CAA.

SCHOOL AND LEAGUE RECORDS FALL

In the Tribe's 80-74 overtime loss at Liberty in the championship game of the Liberty Thanksgiving Classic, W&M set a pair of school and CAA records. The College attempted a program-high 46 3-point field goals, bettering the previous mark of 39 set last season in a victory over UNC Wilmington. The total also topped the CAA record of 45 attempted by VCU in 2003 and Navy in 1990. Junior guard David Schneider not only bettered the W&M school record for 3-pointers attempted in a game with 23, but also topped the Colonial Athletic Association mark. The previous school mark as well as the CAA record was 16 by W&M's Greg Burzell at Richmond in 1988.

AS TOUGH AS NAILS

Junior guard David Schneider is an all-out type of player, who gives it everything he has game after game. That statement was no more evident than in the Tribe's most recent double-overtime game at Liberty. With less than two minutes remaining in the opening half, Schneider dove out of bounds to save the ball that resulted in a fast-break lay-up for the Tribe. On the dive, Schneider hit a guard rail that surrounded the playing floor and separated the fans from the court. The Phoenix, Ariz., native lost a tooth and needed stitches on two facial cuts. The injury did not impact the junior guard's effectiveness as he came out in the second half and went on to finish with a game-high 23 points on seven 3-point field goals. One of those 3-point field goals came with 22.4 seconds remaining in regulation to tie the game at 60 and send it to overtime.

OVERTIME

In the championship game of the Liberty Thanksgiving Classic, the College played its second multiple overtime game of the season. In fact, the Tribe played a triple overtime game against Navy (Nov. 22) and a double overtime contest vs. Liberty (Nov. 29) in a week time frame. It marked the first time in school history that W&M played a triple OT and double OT game in the same season. The only other time W&M played two multiple overtime games in a season was during the 1978-79 season when it played two double overtime games against East Carolina and Davidson. Those two games came nine days apart on Jan. 30, 1979 and Feb. 8, 1979.

The Tribe's triple overtime setback to Navy on Nov. 22 marked the fifth time in W&M history that the program played three overtime periods. The Green and Gold also played three OTs in 1949 against George Washington in the Southern Conference Tournament, in 1958 against Richmond, in 1961 against Furman in the Southern Conference Tournament and against Virginia Tech in 1981.

STROKING IT FROM DEEP

The 3-point shot has been a vital part of W&M's success in recent years, and the College has continued to shoot it well this season. In four of the Tribe's last six games, W&M has drilled double-digit 3-pointers, while averaging 10.2 per game over the stretch. The College connected on 10 triples against both Norfolk State and South Carolina State, while knocking down 14 treys against Navy and another 13 at Liberty. The College has connected on double-digit treys 13 times over the last two seasons and 22 times overall under the direction of sixth-year head coach Tony Shaver. The Green and Gold is 14-8 under Shaver when connecting on 10 or more 3-point field goals in a game.

DYNAMIC DUO

The Tribe possesses one of the best one-two scoring punches in the CAA in juniors Danny Sumner and David Schneider. The pair currently ranks No. 4 and No. 11, respectively, in the league. W&M is one of three schools in the league with two players among the top 12 in scoring. Sumner is averaging 20.4 points per game over the College's first eight games of the season, while Schneider is putting in 16 points per contest. The duo has accounted for 291 of the Tribe's 561 points this season, which equates to 51.9 percent. Combined, the pair is averaging over six 3-pointers per game, having knocked down 50 on the year. In every game this season, one of the two has led the Tribe in scoring with Sumner leading the way on six occasions and Schneider three times.

In four of the Tribe's last six games, both Sumner and Schneider have each scored 20 or more points. In W&M's home-opening win over Norfolk State, the duo both scored 20-plus points, becoming the first W&M teammates to pull the trick since 2005. In W&M's 3OT loss to Navy, Schneider and Sumner became only the second set of teammates in W&M history to score 30 or more points in the same game. Both players turned in career-best totals as Schneider scored a game-high 31 points and Sumner added 30 points. The feat last occurred during the 1967-68 season.

SUMNER FIVE STRAIGHT 20-POINT EFFORTS

Junior wing Danny Sumner became the first W&M player in nearly 40 years to score 20-plus points in five straight games from Nov. 19-29. He tallied his fifth straight game with 20 or more points, pouring in a game-high 23 points in the championship game of the Liberty Classic against the host Flames. During the streak, the Fairfax, Va., native added 20 points against South Carolina State (Nov. 28), 24 vs. Norfolk State (Nov. 19), a career-high 30 points against Navy (Nov. 22) and 21 points vs. Radford (Nov. 25). He became the first Tribe player since Bob Sherwood during the 1969-70 season to tally five straight games of 20 or more points. Sherwood had six consecutive games of 20-plus points against Richmond (21), at Duke (22), George Washington (20), Virginia Tech (23), VMI (22) and Virginia (20).

SCHNEIDER PROTECTING THE LEATHER

During his career, junior guard David Schneider has gained a reputation for taking care of the basketball and the 2008-09 season has not been any different. In back-to-back games against Navy and Radford, Schneider did not turn the basketball over, while playing an astonishing 86 minutes. This season, Schneider has a miniscule turnover rate of one turnover for every 25 minutes of game action, which is an improvement from his already solid rate of a turnover every 20:21 minutes last season.

After ranking among the national leaders in assist-to-turnover ratio last season, Schneider tops the CAA this season at 2.7. As of Nov. 30, the 6-3 guard ranks 25th nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio. He currently sits atop of the W&M annals in career assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.94. He has 223 career assists compared to just 115 turnovers. On the year, Schneider also ranks 11th in the CAA at 3.8 assists per game.

MCDOWELL'S IMPACT ON THE BENCH

Freshman forward Quinn McDowell has made quite an impact off the bench for the Tribe in his rookie campaign. The Mason, Ohio native ranks third on the team in scoring at 7.6 points per game, which is the highest for a Green and Gold reserve. He has led the Tribe bench in scoring on five occasions this season, including a trio of double-digit showing against Ohio (11 points), Navy (13 points) and Liberty (11 points). While the rookie has shown a high basketball IQ and the versatility to play various positions for the College, he has also demonstrated the ability to set up in pressure-packed situations. In the Tribe's triple OT loss to Navy, McDowell stepped up to drill a 3-pointer with 2.2 seconds remaining to extend the game to a third overtime. In the first extra session against Liberty on Nov. 29, he connected on another pressure filled 3-pointer, connecting from the right side with a minute remaining to tie the game at 68.

KITTS CONQUERING THE POST

After coming on late in his freshman season with the Tribe, sophomore forward Marcus Kitts has become a permanent fixture in the Tribe rotation and is developing into a low post threat for the College. This season, the Holy Springs, N.C., native is averaging five points and nearly four rebounds per contest in 14.6 minutes off the bench. At the Liberty Thanksgiving Classic, Kitts really showed his moxie in the paint, averaging 9.5 points and five rebounds over the two-game tournament. He scored a career-high 11 points on 4-of-5 shooting from the floor to go along with four rebounds and a career-best three assists in 16 minutes of action against South Carolina State, before finishing with eight points and six rebounds in a career-high 23 minutes against Liberty. In five of W&M's eight games this season, Kitts has pulled down at least four rebounds off the bench. With his numbers projected over 40 minutes, Kitts is the Tribe's leading rebounder at 10.5 per game.

IMPACT TRANSFER

The College has a strong tradition of impact transfers under the direction of sixth-year head coach Tony Shaver. Hawley Smith served as a two-year captain for the Tribe during the 2005 and 2006 seasons after transferring from Temple, while Adam Payton earned All-CAA honors in 2007 after moving to Williamsburg from Vanderbilt. Payton is currently playing professionally in France. W&M has another impact transfer in the fold this season in junior guard Sean McCurdy, who sat out last season after transferring to the College from Arkansas.

After missing five games due to injury, McCurdy returned to the Tribe lineup against Loyola (Chicago). Playing 23 minutes as a reserve, the dynamic point guard finished with three points, three rebounds, a team-high three assists and two steals. He made a big steal for the College at the end of the contest, forcing a jump ball with 24.2 seconds remaining to give W&M possession as it trailed by three points, 64-61.

McCurdy started his first game in the Green and Gold and finished with team-best and career-high performances in assists (7) and rebounds (6) at Penn State. The 6-1, 184-pounder demonstrated the ability to find the open man as well as the ability to get by his defender on the drive and kick to open Tribe shooters in the season opener against Penn State. He followed that performance with a career-high tying 10 points on 4-of-6 shooting against Ohio. McCurdy added a pair of driving 3-point plays against the Bobcats.

The Jersey City, N.J., native spent his redshirt year and the off season improving his strength and his jump shot. In two seasons at Arkansas, McCurdy appeared in 61 games, while making six starts, in helping the Razorbacks to the NCAA Tournament twice.

SCHNEIDER FROM DEEP

Junior David Schneider is a threat from 3-point range for the Tribe. The 6-3 guard leads the CAA in 3-pointers made per game, connecting on an average over 3.4 per contest. In three of the last five games, Schneider has drilled five or more trifectas, including a pair of seven trey games. He knocked down a career-best seven longballs against Navy, before equalling the feat against Liberty on Nov. 29. He also connected on five triples in the win over South Carolina State. Schneider's seven 3-pointers made against the Midshipmen and the Flames were the fourth-best total in school history. He attempted 15 treys against Navy, which was a Kaplan Arena record. Schneider's 23 longballs attempted against Liberty set a program and CAA record.

SECOND-HALF RUNS

In each of the Tribe's first two victories of the year, W&M made a decisive run to start the second half. In the program's home-opening win over Norfolk State, the College busted open an 11-point halftime lead by starting the second half on a 19-2 run. The spurt extended a 31-20 W&M lead to 50-22 with 13:18 remaining in the contest. Junior Danny Sumner scored nine points on the run, while fellow classmate David Schneider added five. The Green and Gold also stepped up the defense, holding the Spartans to 1-of-9 in the opening seven minutes of the second half.

In its triumph over Radford, W&M erased a four-point halftime deficit with a 13-point run to open the second half. Schneider led the charge with six points, including a back-door cut lay-up that gave W&M the lead for good at 36-34. The Green and Gold defense was once again on display as the Tribe held the Highlanders to 0-of-11 from the floor in the opening 6:30 of the second half.

30 AND 10

Junior Danny Sumner was sensational for the Tribe in its tripled overtime loss to Navy, finishing with the program's first double-double in three seasons with 30 points and 11 rebounds. The fact that makes those numbers more impressive is that its the first time a Tribe player has scored 30 or more points and pulled down 10 or more rebounds in a game since 1961. All-American Jeff Cohen pulled the trick with 49 points and 31 rebounds against Richmond during the 1961 campaign.

SUMNER NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior Danny Sumner was named Colonial Athletic Association co-Player of the Week on Nov. 24. The 6-7 wing averaged 27 points and eight rebounds per game in the Tribe's first two home games of the season and shared the honor with Northeastern's Matt Janning.

In the home-opener against Norfolk State, Sumner scored a then-career high 24 points on 9-of-13 shooting from the floor in leading the College to a 74-58 win. The Fairfax, Va., native followed that performance by eclipsing his career mark for the second straight night, scoring 30 points and pulling down 11 rebounds. It was the first W&M double-double in three seasons. Sumner was 11-of-22 from the floor and 4-of-9 from 3-point range against the Midshipmen. With just five seconds remaining in regulation, the Tribe junior knocked down a trey from the left side to cap a 12-point W&M rally and send the game to OT. For the week, Sumner shot 60.6 percent (20-of-35) from the floor and 50 percent (7-of-14) from 3-point range.

For the season, Sumner tops the Tribe in points (20.3), rebounds (6.5) and minutes per game (38.8), while also leading the way in 3-point field goal percentage at 44 percent. He is currently one of three players that ranks in the top 10 in the CAA in both points and rebounds. Sumner is sixth in scoring, 10th in rebounding, ninth in field goal percentage (50.8 percent), ninth in 3-point field goal percentage, fourth in 3-point field goals made (2.8) and second in minutes in the league.

FREE THROWS VALUABLE TO SUCCESS

Free throw shooting has proven to be another key ingredient in the Tribe's winning recipe over the last few seasons. Getting to the foul line has been a valuable commodity for the Green and Gold. Last season, W&M was 12-1 when connecting on more free throws than its opponent, and so far in 2008-09, the Tribe is 3-0.

Over the last four seasons, W&M is 27-12 when shooting 20 or more free throws in a game. Last season, the College was 9-2 when attempting 20 or more freebies in a contest and the Green and Gold is 3-1 this year when pulling the trick. It is just as important for the Tribe to connect on its free throw opportunities. W&M was 9-1 last season when making more than

15 free throws in a game. Over the last three seasons, the College has posted a 16-6 mark when connecting on 15 or more free throws. The Tribe's record jumps to 12-2 over the last four seasons when hitting on 20-plus free throws.

W&M connected on a season-best 28-of-32 from the charity stripe in the victory over Radford. It marked the most free throws made for W&M since Feb. 16, 2005 when it connected on 29 against James Madison.

HOME OPENERS AT KAPLAN ARENA

With its victory over Norfolk State on Nov. 19, the Tribe improve to a perfect 6-0 in home openers under head coach Tony Shaver. In fact, W&M has won nine of its last 10 home openers and is 29-10 (.744) in home opener since the completion of W&M Hall in 1970.

with two road games to open the year, it marks the first time that has occurred at W&M since it pulled the feat in three straight seasons during the early 1950's. The Tribe played two road games to open the year in 1951-52, before starting the 1952-53 and 1953-54 campaigns with four straight road contests.

WHERE'S THE FIRE?

The start of the Tribe's road game at Ohio on Nov. 16 was delayed nearly 30 minutes due to an impromptu fire drill during pregame warm-ups. Midway through pregame warm-ups, the fire alarm system in the Convocation Center in Athens, Ohio began to light up and sound. The Tribe as well as numerous fans already in their seats was forced to exit the facility, while firefighters inspect the arena. In the end, a smoke alarm in a neighboring dorm triggered the system and resulted in the game starting nearly 30 minutes after its scheduled time.

SCHNEIDER NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CAA

Junior guard David Schneider was named to the 2008-09 Colonial Athletic Association Preseason All-Conference team. The Phoenix, Ariz., native was named an honorable mention all-league choice by vote of the conference coaches, media and SIDs

The CAA Preseason All-Conference selections were comprised of two five-man teams as well as three honorable mention honorees. The conference also released its 2008-09 CAA men's basketball predicted order of finish by the league coaches, media and SIDs at its media day, and the Tribe was picked to finish eighth. VCU was selected to defend its regular season league title, while Northeastern, Old Dominion, George Mason and Delaware rounded out the top five.

GOING INTERNATIONAL

Sophomore forward Marcus Kitts had a unique opportunity over the summer, traveling over to Taipei, Taiwan with Athletes in Action to participate in the 2008 William Jones Cup. Kitts helped AIA to the silver medal at the event. Representing the U.S. at the 30th annual event, Athletes in Action finished the round robin portion of the tournament in first with a 6-1 record and advanced to the finals, before falling to the defending champion Jordan National Team, 93-91, in the thrilling overtime championship game.

Kitts finished the nine-game tournament averaging 5.9 points and 3.6 rebounds per game, while playing 14 minutes per contest. He shot 56.8 percent (25-of-44) from the field over the event and finished with five steals and six blocked shots.

Kitts turned in a trio of double-digit performances during the preliminary rounds for AIA. The Holly Springs, N.C., native tallied 12 points and seven rebounds in a the win over the Australian Under-19 National Team on July 12, and scored 10 points on July 15 in a victory over Egypt. Against the Egyptians, Kitts, who was the tallest player on the AIA roster at 6-foot, 9-inches, had to face a starting front line of 7-1 and 6-10. Kitts best game of the tournament came against the Korean University Selection team in which the Tribe sophomore scored 17 points and chipped in a team-high eight rebounds in just over 20 minutes of action, leading AIA to an easy 103-65 victory.

Kitts was one of 11 players from NCAA Division I programs across the country to compete for the U.S. It marked the 15th time since the event's inception in 1977 that Athletes in Action took part in the Jones Cup. Along with the basketball slate, the team performed numerous outreach activities in Taiwan, including basketball clinics and visits to a local orphanage. Athletes In Action is the sports division of Campus Crusade for Christ International. Dave Hannah, who desired to capitalize on society's great love of sports and utilize the platform given to athletes to reach the world for Jesus Christ, founded AIA in 1966. AIA's outreach range includes ministry to college and professional athletes and coaches globally across a great number of sports. International competing teams partner with in-country staff and other mission organizations to resource Christian ministry around the world.

NEW FACES ON STAFF

While every year bring new faces to collegiate programs in form of players, W&M also added two new assistant coaches and a new director of basketball operations during the off-season. Former assistant coaches Dee Vick and Antwon Jackson left W&M for opportunities as the head coach at Hampden-Sydney College and an assistant coach at UMass, respectively. Those two vacancies paved the way for the hiring of Jamion Christian and Jonathan Holmes as assistant coaches. Both young coaches bring experience as both collegiate players and coaches. Coupled with third-year assistant Ben Wilkins, the Tribe's assistant coaching staff is one of the youngest in the country.

Christian spent the last two seasons on staff at Bucknell University. In Christian's first season with the Bison during the 2006-07 campaign, Bucknell finished with a 22-9 mark and advanced to the Patriot League Championship game before falling to Holy Cross. As a

player, Christian was the VHSL Group A State Player of the Year at New Kent, before playing at Mount St. Mary's where he was a three-year captain.

Holmes has enjoyed coaching stops at Montreat College and Francis Marion University. He furthers the Tribe's North Carolina connection, having played four years for the Tar Heels. Holmes was runner-up for Indiana's "Mr. Basketball" as a high school senior, before helping North Carolina to the 2000 Final Four.

The Tribe also added David Kontaxis to the program as the director of basketball operations during the offseason. Kontaxis spent seven seasons as a basketball coach at Central High School in Capitol Heights, Md. Each of the last two years, he was the head coach of the Falcon program after spending five season as an assistant.

TRIBE ON TV

The Colonial Athletic Association released the most extensive men's and women's basketball television package in conference history with 110 televised contests, and the Tribe will have five games televised this season.

The Green and Gold's season opener at Penn State was televised on the Big Ten Network. The Tribe will have a quartet of games during the league schedule shown on TV, including a pair of home contests. The first two TV games of the conference slate for the College will both come on the road on Wednesday, Jan. 7 at UNC Wilmington and on Saturday, Jan. 17, at Delaware. The W&M-UNCW contest will be televised on ESPN Regional at 7 p.m., while the Tribe-Blue Hens affair is slated for a noon tip on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Philadelphia and the Charter Sports Network. The game at UNCW will also be broadcast regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN).

On Saturday, Jan. 31, the Tribe will host Georgia State in a televised contest at 5 p.m. The game will be aired on the Comcast/Charter Sports Network and will also be shown locally on WSKY Channel 4. Four days later, the Green and Gold's home game against Northeastern will be televised on Comcast SportsNet New England as well as locally on WSKY Channel 4. The Wednesday, Feb. 4, tilt is slated for a 7 p.m. tip-off.

In total, the CAA TV package includes 92-game men's basketball games to be broadcast. The composite schedule features 33 appearances on the various ESPN platforms, including four regular-season games and the CAA Championship on ESPN/ESPN2, eight games on ESPNU and five syndicated games on ESPN Regional Television. That number could rise as all 12 CAA teams are once again participating in the ESPNU BracketBusters on February 20-21, 2009.

The largest-ever Comcast syndicated package features 28 games on the Comcast SportsNets (CSN Mid-Atlantic, CSN Philadelphia, CSN New England and CSS) and 20 games on CN8, the Comcast Network, providing tremendous exposure in many of the nation's largest media markets. CN8 will once again televise the quarterfinals and semifinals of the CAA Men's Basketball Championship.

O'REILLY ESPNU BRACKETBUSTERS

For the third straight season, the William and Mary men's basketball team, along with the rest of the Colonial Athletic Association, will take part in the ESPNU BracketBusters. The seventh annual event will be Feb. 20-21, 2009 and will feature 13 nationally televised contests on ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN360.com. W&M will host a BracketBusters Game for the second consecutive year.

During its first two seasons of BracketBusters, the Tribe has faced Fairfield of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference and Loyola (Chicago) of the Horizon League. In 2007, the College fell at Fairfield, 61-45, before dropping last season's contest to Loyola, 71-66, in Williamsburg.

The CAA has had tremendous success in BracketBusters, with the league posting an 8-3 record in televised contests over the past four years. CAA teams have registered several impressive victories in the event, including George Mason's triumph at Wichita State in 2006, Drexel beating Creighton on the road in 2007 and VCU winning at Akron in 2008.

A pool of 102 teams from 17 different conferences will participate in the 2009 BracketBusters. The field includes teams with 77 appearances in the last five NCAA Tournaments, including a team in the Final Four, one in Elite Eight and six Sweet Sixteen squads.

For the fourth straight year, ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, will televise five BracketBusters games while ESPN360.com, ESPN's customized broadband service, will offer two. ESPN2 will televise six contests. ESPN360.com will also simulcast ESPN2's six telecasts. The 13 BracketBusters matchups will be announced February 2, while game time and network assignments will be announced February 9.

KYLE GAILLARD, MATT RUM SIGN WITH TRIBE

William and Mary head men's basketball coach Tony Shaver announced the signing of Kyle Gaillard (Huntersville, N.C./North Mecklenburg) and Matt Rum (Chapel Hill, N.C./Loyola Blakefield) to National Letters of Intent. Both players will be eligible to compete for the Tribe during the 2009-10 season.

Kyle Gaillard (Huntersville, N.C./North Mecklenburg)

Gaillard is a three-year letterwinner for Duane Lewis at North Mecklenburg, where he helped propel the Vikings to the MECA-7 regular season championship and a North Carolina 4A Sectional Championship as a junior in 2008. The 6-7 lefty averaged 17 points per game for one of the top teams in the state of North Carolina last season, while shooting 43 percent from 3-point range. He was named to the MECA-7 All-Conference team and received all-region honors.

Gaillard grew four inches between his sophomore and junior years of high school and is listed as a two-star recruit by Scout.com. He was ranked the 47th best small forward prospect in the class of 2009 by ESPN.com. As one of the top underclassmen in the state of North Carolina, Gaillard was invited to participate in the second annual Carolina Challenge in 2008 by national recruiting analyst Dave Telep. Prior to signing with the Tribe, Gaillard gained recruiting interest from Penn State, Michigan, Davidson and Winthrop. He was recently named a McDonald's All-American nominee.

During his high school career, Gaillard was named North Mecklenburg's Most Improved player in 2007. This coming season, he will serve as the Viking's team captain. Also during his high school career, Gaillard was a two-year letterwinner as a pitcher on the North Mecklenburg varsity baseball team.

During his AAU career, Gaillard was a part of six different teams that won North Carolina State Championships. He played for the Carolina Flight 11U-16U and the Charlotte Royals 17U. He participated in the 2008 Hoops Group Elite Camp and was named to two of their Super Seven lists, while playing in the summer event that included over 3,400 athletes. Hoops Group Elite ranked Gaillard the No. 6 in Best Player from Outside the Northeast list and also ranked him No. 3 in Best Players from North Carolina list.

Kyle is the son of Jill and Ted Gaillard and was born on April 15, 1991 in Naperville, Ill. His father, Ted, played baseball at the University of Delaware from 1977-79. At North Mecklenburg, Kyle was a Junior Marshall for the 2008 Graduating Class and was chosen based on his top 50 academic standing in the junior class of 525 students. As a senior in high school, Kyle was voted homecoming king at North Mecklenburg.

Matt Rum (Chapel Hill, N.C./Loyola Blakefield)

Rum signs with the Tribe as one of the top players in the Baltimore area. As a junior, the 6-3 guard was named to the All MIAA 'A' Conference, All-Baltimore Catholic League and All-Baltimore County. Rum led Loyola Blakefield to the semifinals of the BCL playoffs for the first time since 1998 as he averaged 15.7 points per game, 5.7 rebounds and knocked down 44 3-point field goals. The Baltimore Catholic League is nationally known for its level of play, including producing numerous Division I and NBA players. Rum also was named the MVP of Gilman High School Holiday Tournament as a junior.

During his sophomore year at Loyola, Rum averaged 14.8 points per game, while shooting 40 percent from 3-point range. He highlighted the campaign by knocking down eight 3-pointers on his way to a career-high 30 points in a victory over Archbishop Curley. Over his career at Loyola Blakefield, Rum has scored 720 points and knocked down 91 3-point field goals.

Rum also received recruiting interest from Towson, Radford and Boston University. He played AAU basketball for Severna Park/Maryland 3D and is listed as a two-star recruit by Scout.com. Rum grew up in Chapel Hill, N.C., prior to moving to Baltimore for high school. He played AAU for the North Carolina Gators out of Greensboro and helped the program to 13U and 14U state champions.

As a youth, Rum was a ball boy at Duke University in 2000 when the Blue Devils had the likes of current and former NBA players Mike Dunleavy, Jr., Carlos Boozer, Shane Battier and Jason Williams. He is one of the first former Duke ball boys to earn a Division I scholarship to play basketball. Rum also had the opportunity to play HORSE against ESPN college basketball guru and Hall of Famer Dick Vitale during his time as a Blue Devil ball boy.

Matt is the son of Steve and Carol Rum and was born Nov. 9, 1989 in Alexandria, Va. His father, Steve, played professional baseball in Italy and Japan and is currently the senior associate vice president for development and alumni relations at Johns Hopkins Medicine. Along with his athletic exploits, Matt has also been involved with numerous community service projects, including Special Olympics and day camps for Eagle Scouts.

TONY SHAVER

HEAD COACH · SIXTH SEASON AT W&M

When Tony Shaver accepted the head coaching position at William and Mary in May of 2003, he set his sights on making the Tribe a winning program. Fast-forward five years and the two-time CAA Coach of the Year and National Mid-Major Coach of the Year finalist has led a revival of the Green and Gold program, and last season, took it to the brink of its first-ever CAA title and NCAA Tournament appearance. Despite all the recent success, Shaver's vision and intensity to win has not wavered.

"I do not want anyone to limit the vision of our program," Shaver said. "We expect our teams to win and the last two seasons have been exceptional steps toward where we know our program can be."

In 2007-08, William and Mary posted its first winning season in a decade finishing with a 17-16 ledger. In fact it was only the sixth time in school history that a Tribe team had won 17 or more contests. W&M also finished fifth in the league on the strength of a 10-8 CAA ledger. It marked only the second time in the Tribe's 23-year history in the CAA that it has won double-digit games. Over the last two seasons, W&M ranks fifth in the league in conference wins with 18. The stat demonstrates the rising success of the Tribe program, given W&M won only 10 CAA games in Shaver's first three seasons at the helm.

In five seasons at the helm of the William and Mary men's basketball program, Tony Shaver has turned the William and Mary men's basketball program into a winner. Over the last two seasons, the program posted back-to-back 15-plus win seasons for the first time in a quarter of a century. The Tribe also put together consecutive seasons with a .500 or better record for the first time in 23 years.

Shaver was voted the 2008 CAA Coach of the Year by the league's media, coaches and sports information directors. The Shaver-led Tribe punctuated the honor by reeling off three-straight last-second wins on its way to the CAA Championship Game. Included in the run was a 56-54 win over regular season champion and No. 1 seed VCU in the semifinals. W&M won three contests to get to the championship game, matching the program's victory total in the tournament from the previous 22 years. As a result of the title game appearance, W&M had its first-ever national televised game and made its first appearance on ESPN.

The Tribe accomplished numerous other milestones during the historic 2007-08 season. W&M established not only school records, but CAA marks for 3-pointers made (257) and attempted (755) in a season. The Tribe also bettered the school standard for 3-pointers per game (7.79), double-digit 3-point efforts in a season (9) and consecutive double-digit 3-point shooting performances (5). Shaver engineered a quartet of double-digit comebacks for the Tribe in 2008, including three straight in wins over James Madison (1/9), at Georgia State (1/12) and against Northeastern (1/16). It marked the first time in school history W&M overcame two-straight double-digit second-half deficits, let alone three. The Tribe's 16-point second-half comeback at Georgia State was the largest deficit that W&M overcame on the road in 15 years. Shaver also reached a coaching milestone of his own on December 31, 2007, winning his 400th collegiate coaching game as the Tribe defeated Fairfield, 71-50, at Kaplan Arena.

W&M demonstrated its mettle as a winning team with not only its ability to overcome deficits, but also with being able to win close games. The Tribe won more than half its games (nine) when trailing at the half. W&M also won nine games by four or fewer points this season, bettering the total (six) from Shaver's first four seasons at the helm of the program. The Tribe put together a six-game CAA winning streak from Jan. 5 through Jan. 23, which marked only the third such league winning streak in Tribe history. Shaver also guided the Tribe to four straight CAA road wins in 2008. It equaled the program's longest CAA mark and was the second-longest single-season road winning streak in school history.

In 2006-07, Shaver earned CollegelInsider.com Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Tribe to a 15-15 record. It marked just the second time in the last 20 years W&M had won 15 games.



Shaver also led his troops to eight wins during the tough CAA portion; only the third time the Tribe has accomplished that feat. Another telling stat of the progression of the program was the four CAA road victories, highlighted by a 67-63 win over 2006 Final Four participant George Mason. In Shaver's first four seasons, W&M had won only three road affairs.

The 2006-07 season brought about a change in styles for the 31st W&M head coach. After spending much of his career coaching an up-tempo offense, featuring a trapping defense, Shaver switched over to a more perimeter-oriented attack last season. The Tribe offensive scheme now spreads the floor and relies on spacing, effective perimeter shooting and players reading and reacting to teammates' cuts and motion. Defensively, W&M employs a plethora of defensive systems to throw off opposing offenses.

The new style led to the Tribe ranking among the top 50 in the country in 3-point field goal defense as well as holding its opponents to 64.2 points per game, the best mark since the 1997-98 season. The College also established school records for 3-point field goals made and 3-point field goals attempted. The success of the new approach was never more evident than in the Tribe's Feb. 14 victory over eventual National Invitational Tournament participant Drexel, 60-47, in Williamsburg. It was the lowest point production for Drexel in four seasons, and marked the highest ranked team, in terms of RPI, that W&M had defeated since 2001.

There have been individual successes as well for the Green and Gold under Shaver's reign. On five occasions, a W&M player has been named All-CAA under Shaver, while another four have been named to the CAA All-Rookie Team. 2004 graduate Adam Hess, currently playing professionally in France, became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a First-Team Academic All-American and all-conference selection as a senior. Corey Cofield was voted the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. W&M players have also enjoyed success in the classroom under Shaver, as on 10 occasions a Tribe player has been named to the CAA All-Academic team over the last five seasons, including a program-high three in 2007 and 2008. This past season, junior David Schneider garnered the third CAA Men's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year award under Shaver.

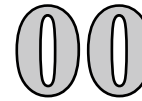
In total, four former W&M athletes who played under Shaver have gone on to or will shortly begin professional careers overseas. Hess is currently playing his second season for Artland in the German Bundesliga. He spent last season in France after earning Second-Team All-Bundesliga honors with Artland in 2007.
