I make no doubt Sir you recollect the Sacrifice my Father made of his Property to Raise Money to carry on the Proceedings of the War at that time. The Widow and Heirs of General Thomas Nelson are in want, and mean to apply to the Virginia Legislature for remuneration. Be pleased Sir to give me information in such a Form, as would be received by the Legislature, and directed to Thomas Nelson Page in Richmond. Blessings attend you and your Family, Prays your Friend
