Directions to William and Mary

From the North/West: Take I-64 East to Lightfoot Exit 234A (Route 199 East). At top of exit ramp, take a right onto Route 199 East. Stay on 199 East until the Monticello Avenue exit. Exit at Monticello Avenue, and bear left on exit ramp. At bottom of ramp, turn left at light onto Monticello (pass under 199). Go straight through three stoplights, and continue straight for about half a mile and take the first right onto Compton Drive (before light at hospital and shopping centers). There may not be a street sign! The road is heavily wooded on both sides. Continue on Compton Drive and turn right at the first stop sign onto Brooks Road. William and Mary Hall will be on your left.

From the South/East: Take I-64 West to Exit 242A (Route 199 West). Follow 199 to fourth light. At the fourth light, take a right onto Jamestown Road. Follow Jamestown Road 1.1 miles (past Lake Matoaka on left), then take a left onto Ukrop Way. Take a left at the next stop sign and continue to follow Ukrop Way while bearing right until you reach William and Mary Hall up the hill on your left.

2008-09 MEN'S ROSTER





Former Tribe distance ace Alex Gibby returned to William and Mary in 2003 to assume the head coaching position for men's cross country and track and field and has continued the tradition of championship excellence at the College.

At W&M (2003-Present)
Coaching Highlights
2007-08

Cross Country: W&M won its eighth-straight CAA title with a conference-record 16 points ... The Tribe also sets a conference record by placing 10 athletes on the 12-man all-conference team ... Every runner finished 16th or higher ... Team finished third at the Southeast Regional, only five points out of first place ... Invited to NCAAs for the 11th year in a row ... Four athletes earned All-Region ... "B" team took third at IC4As, placing three on the All-East team ... At NCAAs, team finished 15th ... Christo Landry finished 13th at NCAAs for his third All-American honor ... Landry is one of only three W&M athletes to place 15th or better at NCAAs, and only the second to earn three All-America certificates in XC ... Landry also placed fourth at the region, and won the CAA crown ... In CAA post-season voting, Landry was tabbed Athlete of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Tom Burke was Rookie of the Year, and Gibby repeated as Coach of the Year ... Senior Ollie Ehlinger elected to Phi Beta Kappa. **Track:** Team finished second to UNC-Wilmington at the CAA Championships in closest finish ever, 194.5-190 ... Senior Ian Fitzgerald placed 18th at NCAA Championships in the 5,000m run ... Fitzgerald won the 1,500m run at the outdoor IC4A Championships ... Sophomore Ben Massam won the 10,000m run at the CAA Championships only 40 minutes after placing second in the 5,000m run ... Classmate Harry Miller ran the 3,000m steeplechase at the Penn Relays in 8:49.09, the fastest steeplechase at the College in 12 years ... Earned three All-East honors at the indoor IC4A Championships and two at the outdoor ... Garnered 11 All-CAA mentions at the conference championships ... Miller was also selected for the United States team at the NACAC U-23 Championships in the steeplechase ... Team had 3 members qualify for the USAT&F Junior National Championships.

2006-07

Cross Country: Team won its seventh consecutive Colonial Athletic Association title ... At the Southeast Regional, upset Louisville and Virginia to take second and earn its 10th-straight trip to the NCAA Championships, one of only five schools in the nation to accomplish the feat ... Won the IC4A Championships for the first time since 1982 and third time overall ... Placed eighth at the NCAA Championships, surpassed only by the fourth-place finish in 1973 as the best ever for the Tribe ... Christo Landry finished 34th to earn his second All-American citation ... Seven runners are All-CAA, six are All-East, five are All-Southeast ... Four named to the USTFCCCA All-Academic team, most in the nation ... Gibby named CAA Coach of the Year for fourth time ... Keith Bechtol earned his fourth Scholar-Athlete of the Year award from the CAA, and is selected to Phi Beta Kappa. **Track:** Bechtol placed 14th at the NCAA 10,000m championships, one second behind All-American cut-off ... He qualified for the NCAA meet by running 28:55.57, third-best time in school history, at Stanford ... Also qualified for 2008 Olympic Trials ... Tribe won two relay titles at the IC4A Championships, the indoor DMR and outdoor 4x800m ... Winning 4x800m time is 13th in the U.S. in 2007 ... Tribe won six titles at the CAA Championships en route to finishing second ... W&M swept the top three spots in the 5,000m, 10,000m, and 3,000m steeplechase ... Bechtol won the 5,000m and placed third in the 10,000m ... Matt Keally won the 10,000m ... Anthony Arena won the steeplechase ... David Groff won the 1,500m ... Matt Warco won the 800m ... Groff also won the 1,500m at the Colonial Relays, setting the meet record at that distance ... Ian Fitzgerald and Bechtol named All-Academic by USTFCCCA ... Bechtol named Athlete of the Year, Track Scholar-Athlete of the Year, and conference-wide Scholar-Athlete of the Year by the CAA ... Bechtol also named First-Team Academic All-American.

2005-06

Cross Country: Won five meets and rose to a ranking of 15th in the national polls ... Ian Fitzgerald won the CAA Championship and placed third at the Southeast Regional, leading the Tribe to victory in both races ... Southeast Region Championship was the first for the team since 2000 ... Team finished 22nd at the NCAA Championships ... Six runners named All-CAA, five named all-region, two are All-East ... Gibby named CAA and Southeast Region Coach of the Year ... Senior Mike Dominguez is Phi Beta Kappa. **Track:** Christo Landry qualified for NCAAs in the 5,000m, placing 26th ... Earlier in the season, Landry ran 13:53.62 at Stanford, and Ian Fitzgerald ran 13:57.67 unattached ... Seniors Jeff Hedley (1,500m), Matt Keally (5,000m), and Mike Dominguez (3,000m steeplechase) all won CAA titles ... Junior Keith Bechtol won the CAA 10,000m in meet-record time in his first race of the season ... Bechtol and Landry are both All-East outdoors, with Bechtol taking second in the 10,000m ... Bechtol named third-team Academic All-America, and becomes first athlete to ever win three Scholar-Athlete of the Year awards from the CAA.

2004-05

Cross Country: Tribe fell victim to food poisoning at the NCAA Championships and only four runners finish the race, led by freshman Christo Landry who finished 38th to earn All-America honors ... Landry is the first Tribe freshman since 1970 to do so ... Junior Matt Keally is the CAA Champion, leading W&M to the team title ... W&M also took second at the IC4A Championships, as four are named All-East ... In a sweep

of the conference awards, Gibby is named Coach of the Year, Jeff Hedley Athlete of the Year, Landry Rookie of the Year, and senior Pat Comstock is Scholar-Athlete of the Year ... Landry goes on to race at the World Junior Cross Country Championships, and classmate Dave Mock won the North American, Central American, and Caribbean Junior Cross Country Championship. **Track:** Ed Moran and Christo Landry qualified for the NCAA 5,000m, where Moran placed seventh for his fourth All-American honor ... Moran also won the 5,000m at both the CAA and IC4A Championships, the first conference championships of his career ... Raced at the USAT&F Championships, Moran ran 13:25.87, less than half a second off of the school record ... Landry set the W&M freshman record in the 5,000m, running 14:01.62 to qualify for the NCAA Regional ... Sean Anastasia-Murphy became the first Tribe athlete since 1996 to break nine minutes in the 3,000m steeplechase, running 8:59.26 at the IC4A Championships for All-East honors ... In total, 14 athletes are named All-East ... At the CAA Championships, senior Adam Otstot won the 3,000m steeplechase and led a sweep of the top five spots for the College ... Pat Comstock won the 10,000m in meet-record time, and the Tribe took six of the top eight positions ... Comstock was selected to Phi Beta Kappa.

2003-04

Cross Country: Ed Moran won his second CAA Championship and led six teammates on the all-conference team as the Tribe wins its fourth consecutive title ... Leading the Southeast Regional, Moran breaks his foot but runs on it for the last half-mile to finish third and help the team secure an automatic berth to the NCAA Championships ... Gibby is named CAA Coach of the Year, Moran is Athlete of the Year, David Murphy is Rookie of the Year, and Adam Otstot is Scholar-Athlete of the Year. **Track:** The Tribe won its second-consecutive CAA crown ... Matt Wolak came from behind to win the 800m, freshman Keith Bechtol won the 10,000m, and sophomore Matt Keally won the 10,000m ... Jeff Hedley qualified for the NCAA 5,000m after finishing third at the NCAA East Regional ... Bechtol won the IC4A 10,000m and qualified for the USAT&F Junior National Championships, with the fastest-time run by any American junior competitor that year (29:58.13) ... Bechtol placed second at the Junior Nationals, and was the highest American finisher at Junior Worlds, finishing 19th ... Bechtol was named CAA Rookie of the Year.

At Stephen F. Austin (2000-03) - Coaching Highlights

Cross Country: Head men's and women's coach ... Men's team won the Southland Conference for the first time in 2001, and again in 2002 ... Women's team won the Southland in 2002 for the first time since 1990 ... Named Coach of the Year for both men and women in 2002 after also mentoring the individual champions in both races, the first time all four titles had gone to one school. **Track:** Assistant coach for men and women, working with the middle- and long-distance runners ... Athletes set 18 school records and won 18 individual conference championships ... Under Gibby's tutelage, Ana Rodriguez led the women's track team to the 2003 Southland Outdoor Championship, winning the 5,000m and 10,000m ... Rodriguez qualified for NCAAs in the 5,000m, finishing 21st and becoming the first distance runner in school history to run at NCAAs.

At At W&M (1997-2000)

Assistant men's coach ... Helped the Tribe cross country team win the 1997 CAA title and begin a streak of qualifying for the NCAA Championships that is still intact... 1997 team placed ninth at the NCAA meet, and the following two years' teams each placed 13th ... Helped mentor Matt Lane, an 11-time All-American who finished fourth at the U.S. Olympic Trials in the 5,000m in both 2000 and 2004 ... Also worked with three-time All-American and 1997 NCAA 800m runner-up Anders Christiansen.

At W&M (1992-1997) - Athletic Achievements

Four-time All-CAA between cross country and track ... 1997 CAA 5,000m champion ... All-East in the 10,000m ... NCAA provisional qualifier at 10,000m ... Bachelor of Arts in history.

Personal

Married to head women's track and cross country coach Kathy Newberry in 2005, and they reside in Williamsburg with their dogs, Oskar and Atlas ... Coaches several post-collegiate distance stars, including his wife ... Newberry is a three-time Olympic trials competitor, running in the 5K finals in 2000 and 2004, and in the finals of the 10K in 2000, 2004, and 2008 ... She was ranked 10th in the nation in 2004 at 10,000m ... Newberry has also run for the U.S.

at three World Cross Country Championships ... Ed Moran finished fourth in the 10,000m at the 2008 Olympic Trials ... Jacob Frey competed at the Olympic Trials in the marathon, running 2:18:19 for 22nd place ... In 2006, Frey finished seventh at the U.S. 25K National Championships ... Moran achieved the Olympic "A" standard at both 5,000m and 10,000m in 2007, and will compete for a spot on the Olympic team at the 2008 Olympic Trials ... Moran and Frey both competed for the United States at the 2007 Pan-American Games ... Frey placed fourth in the marathon with a personal-record performance of 2:16:44 ... Moran won the gold medal at 5,000m with a meet-record time of 13:25.60.

HEAD COACH ALEX GIBBY



In his 23rd year as Director of Track and Field at William and Mary, Dan Stimson oversees a program that has demonstrated success both in the classroom and on the track, and has served as an exemplary model for what collegiate athletics should be all about. In recognition of his years of service, the College honored Coach Stimson in 2007 by naming the new throwing facility in his honor, the Stimson Throwing Events Area. Made possible through a generous donation from Mr. and Mrs. Joe Showker, the facility includes an Olympic throwing cage with circles for both the hammer and discus, two shot put circles, and a javelin runway.

The men's and women's programs have combined for 18 Colonial Athletic Association titles out of 24 possible since the 2002-03 school year and have garnered numerous CAA Athlete and Rookie of the Year awards. The 2007-08 season was another banner year for the squads, as Stimson's program captured both CAA cross country titles: the eighth consecutive conference title for the men's team and fifth in a row for the women's squad. Punctuating the season was the 11th-straight NCAA team qualification for men's cross country, an achievement only four other schools can claim. In the spring, women's track and field won its seventh CAA title out of the past eight years and sent two women to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2003. To date, Stimson's programs have produced 56 All-Americans and one Olympian.

Stimson, who works primarily with the throwers, jumpers, and multi-eventers, has mentored many W&M athletes to national prominence in his tenure. Due to the absence of the javelin or the hammer throw at the high school level in Virginia and other nearby states, Stimson has earned a reputation for his ability to develop young talent.

His coaching credits include W&M hammer throw record-holder Mike Howell, who started with the hammer in his rookie season at W&M, and progressed through the ranks until his senior year, when he posted the eighth-best mark by an American collegian (206-1). Decathlon record-holder Todd Doughty (7,240 points) benefited from his time with Stimson as well, working his way from a walk-on to one of the top 20 decathletes in the country over the course of his career at W&M.

On the women's side, Stimson coached All-America high jumper Lisa Rayner to an 11th-place finish at the NCAA Championships and a school-record mark of 5-11.25 in 1994. Wendy Warren, the school record-holder in the javelin (153-6), was discovered in a physical education class and went on to earn All-East honors and place sixth at the ECAC Championships. Stimson coached pole vaulter Charlotte LaRoche to second place in the ECAC Championships and a school indoor record of 13'1" in her freshman season. He then guided steady improvement throughout her career, culminating in 2004 with her second conference title and double All-East honors. Stimson has had numerous All-East performers in all of the field events.

A recent example of Stimson's coaching ability can be seen in 2004 graduate Chris Parsons. As a freshman, Parsons made a powerful debut, winning CAA titles in both the shot put and the javelin, enabling him to be selected for the United States Junior National Team. He followed up his impressive freshman season with a sophomore campaign that featured top CAA finishes in the discus (fourth), javelin (third), hammer (second) and a second straight first-place showing in the shot put. Parsons went on to garner All-East honors in the hammer at the IC4A meet. In 2003, Parsons was named CAA Scholar-Athlete of the Year, after earning a pair of all-conference honors by finishing second in both the shot and the hammer at the CAA Championships. Parsons capped his career in style, winning the 2004 CAA title in the shot and hammer and breaking the NCAA Regional mark in both events.



More Stimson-guided athletes litter the W&M and CAA record books. In 2005, Ayanna Jones claimed her second shot put title at the CAA Championships, the fifth-consecutive year a Tribe woman had won the event. She would go one to shatter the 23-year old school record

in the event, putting the shot 48-6 in the ECAC Championships. 2006 graduate Andy Smith became one of only two athletes in school history to claim four CAA crowns in one event (joining Tyler Steel, winner of the hammer throw from 1997-2000) after winning the javelin for the fourth time at the 2006 conference meet.

Perhaps no event in recent years shows the effect of Stimson's tutelage more than the women's heptathlon, where five athletes in the Green and Gold have won the last six CAA titles, and seven of the eight ever contested, along with two of the last three ECAC crowns. Alarice Cesareo earned a pair of titles in 2001 and 2003, and Phi Beta Kappa-graduate Sarah McHale won in 2004. In 2005, Bonnie Meekins won her first title with a then-record score of 4,763 points, before giving way to classmate Brenna Blevins in 2006, who scored 4,806 points

In 2007, Meekins came back again with another meet record, 5,192 points. Similarly, Blevins won the 2006 ECAC crown with a then-school record total of 5,229, the highest point total not invited to the NCAA Championships that year. Meekins provided the breakthrough in the spring of 2007, powering to a score of 5,457 to claim the Eastern title, and a trip to the NCAA meet, where she would place 16th. In 2008, freshman Katie Guevel won the CAA title with a Zable Stadium record 5,158 points. Guevel also set 15 school records and 15 freshman records during her stellar first year at the College.

The 2007 throwing corps provided another feather in Stimson's cap, providing a school record and numerous top-10 marks despite having a grand total of two upperclassmen. Alex Heacock captured his first CAA title in the javelin, throwing 25 feet farther than anyone else in the meet. Abby Lemon was only four inches shy of her own conference title in the hammer throw, but did claim the Colonial Relays title with a then-school record throw of 161-9, a mark she bettered at the ECAC Championships with a prodigious heave of 163-11. Jen Showker capped her career with lifetime-best marks in the shot put, discus (144-9), and hammer (142-0). Her put of 45-0.5 at the CAA Championships guaranteed her third and a berth at the ECAC meet, and makes her one of only four women to ever best 45 feet in the shot put.

In 2008, the throwers were just as spectacular. Abby Lemon had a great season, breaking the school record eight times and capturing the CAA crown in the hammer throw. For the men, Dan Klatzkin earned All-CAA honors in both the discus and the shot put for his performance at the conference championships. In the men's high jump, Cam Shriver was the IC4A Indoor Champion after clearing 6-10.75, the fifth best jump in the College's history.

Stimson began his career at perennial national powerhouse Tennessee, where he helped Volunteer athletes finish in the nation's top 10 on seven occasions and collect 12 Southeastern Conference titles. His coaching career started at Tennessee as a graduate assistant, helping the Vols win the 1972 NCAA cross country championship. From Knoxville, he moved to J.E.B. Stuart High School in Falls Church, Virginia for one year, then on to Miami University (Ohio) for nine years and back to Tennessee for four more years as the top assistant before coming to Williamsburg.

A native of Falconer, New York, Stimson graduated with honors from Ohio University in 1971 and holds a master's degree from Miami (Ohio). As an undergraduate, he was the All-Ohio and Central Collegiate shot put champion, as well as a two-time MAC shot put champion. He concluded his athletic career by competing in both the NCAA and AAU national championships in the shot put.

Dan and his wife Rosemary, also a Falconer native, have two children. Their son, Clare, is a local college student. Daughter Krista Crider graduated from W&M in 1996 with a B.S. in biology and earned her master's degree at the College in 1998. She earned a Ph.D. in the field of genetics and molecular biology at Emory University, and works for the Centers for Disease Control. Krista is a former W&M record holder in the hammer throw, and recently welcomed the newest addition to the Stimson family, when Samuel Daniel Crider was born in April of 2006.

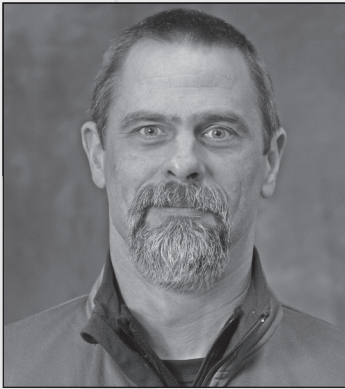

Emil Davis

B.S. Biology '85

Former Tribe multi-eventer and runner Emil Davis has spent the past eight seasons mentoring athletes at his alma mater. Davis is primarily responsible for the sprinters, jumpers, and multi-eventers for both the College's track teams.

Prior to joining W&M, Davis coached the Bruton High School (Williamsburg) girl's track and field team for 12 seasons. In his time with Bruton, where he continues to teach biology, his teams accumulated an impressive 82 victories, including two state championships (1996 and 1997), a state runner-up (1998), and numerous invitational victories.

Davis graduated in 1985 with a degree in biology, after earning All-East honors his senior year at W&M by placing second in the pentathlon at the indoor IC4A Championships. He still holds the Tribe record in that event (3,840). He is number two on the all-time lists in both the 200m (21.17) and the decathlon (6,819) and was a member of three record-setting relay teams. Davis holds the U.S. Masters age-group record for 40-44 year-old competitors in the double-decathlon (11,178 points).

Davis and his wife, Lynda, currently reside in Toano, Virginia and are the proud parents of three daughters: Elizabeth, a 2008 graduate of Virginia; Samantha, a senior at James Madison; and Hannah, a second-year swimmer at Virginia.



Ed Moran

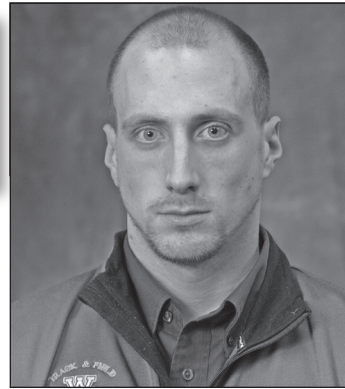

Ed Moran is in his fourth season on the William and Mary staff after a spectacular collegiate career that saw him earn four All-America honors in the 5,000m outdoors (2003, 2005) and in cross country (2000, 2002) for the College. In addition to assisting with both the men's and women's running programs,

the 2003 graduate has continued to race under the tutelage of head men's coach Alex Gibby, achieving the Olympic "A" qualifying standard at 5,000m and 10,000m in 2007 and winning the 5,000m gold medal at the Pan-American Games.

A professionally-sponsored runner with Nike, Moran raced unsponsored at the 2005 USAT&F Track and Field Championships shortly after earning his fourth All-America nod. He boasted an impressive debut, running well below his previous personal record in the 5,000m (13:39.70, second-best in school history, set a scant month-and-a-half earlier) to finish in 13:25.87. This time placed him only 49 hundredths of a second shy of the school record, running as the fastest amateur in the field of 24 runners. In 2007, he won the 5,000m gold medal at the Pan-American Games with a meet-record time of 13:25.60, and in 2008, finished fourth at the U.S. Olympic Trials in the 10,000m run.

In his six-year collegiate career, Moran racked up three all-conference and All-Southeast honors (never finishing worse than third), and was twice conference champion and Athlete of the Year in cross country. On the track, he earned multiple all-conference nods, was named the 2003 CAA Male Athlete of the Year and was the 2005 IC4A and CAA champion in the 5,000m.



Dave Fritz

Virginia Tech

Dave Fritz enters his second season coaching the pole vaulters at William and Mary after helping some of the sports' biggest names achieve national and international success.

In 2008, Fritz saw his vaulters reach new heights. Sophomore Nicole Kazuba captured the outdoor ECAC title with a school record vault of 13-1.5, and went on to place fourth at the NCAA East Regional and qualify for the NCAA Championships. Kazuba also won the CAA and Colonial Relay championships. Freshman Emily Jeremiah, who set the freshman record with a vault of 12-3.5, also earned All-East honors for her performance at the ECAC Championships. Finally, senior Erin Gnass was named All-CAA after finishing tied for third at the conference championships.

Prior to joining the Tribe, Fritz has worked as the assistant jumps coach at Suhr Sports in New York, helping both professional and amateur pole vaulters to unprecedented heights. Most notably, he coached Jennifer Stuczynski from an absolute novice to become the reigning U.S. record holder in the women's pole vault (16-0), and the 2008 Olympic silver medalist. Along the way, Stuczynski also captured four national titles, indoors in 2005 and 2007, and outdoors in 2006 and 2007.

Among amateur athletes, his success has been equally compelling, producing the top-two high school girl's pole vaulters. Mary Saxer was the first high school girl to clear 14 feet, and set the national high school girl's record indoors of 14-3.25. Tiffany Maskulinski also cleared 14-0 under Fritz' tutelage, only the second girl to do so. At the collegiate level, he coached at the Rochester Institute of Technology in 2006, producing a pair of school records and the school's first NCAA qualifier in the pole vault.

A three-time All-BIG EAST vaulter at Virginia Tech, Fritz graduated in 2004 with a bachelors degree in computer science. In the summer of 2006, he was the head clinician for pole vault at the Region II Junior Olympics clinic. Fritz holds a USATF Level II coaching certification, and is also certified by the Pole Vault Safety Board.



The 2007 season was another brilliant one for the men's cross country team. The Tribe won their eighth straight CAA title with the most dominant performance in conference history and appeared at its 11th straight NCAA Championships. But this year, head coach **Alex Gibby** must replace six of his 10 runners that were named to the All-CAA squad last fall, including three-time All-American and CAA Athlete of the Year Christo Landry.

Leading the way for the much younger Tribe this year will be sophomore **Patterson Wilhelm**. Wilhelm's season was highlighted by being the second Tribe finisher at the NCAA Championships and finishing 23rd at the Southeast Regional. Wilhelm is also the top returning performer from the CAA Championships, where he finished in third place.

Behind Wilhelm in the top tier of runners is a deep group of junior harriers. Leading the juniors will be **Ben Massam** and **Charlie Swartz**. Massam had a fantastic second year for the College. He was the fourth Tribe finisher at the NCAA Championships and earned all-region honors with his 15th-place showing at the Southeast Regional. Swartz was the top Tribe finisher at the IC4A Championships, coming in 11th place and earning All-East honors. Swartz also earned All-CAA recognition for his sixth-place finish at the conference championships and once again led the Tribe with his fourth-place finish at the Tribe Open.

Right behind those two juniors are two of their fellow classmates, **Colin Leak** and **Harry Miller**. Leak finished third at the Cavalier Open and also ran at the NCAA Championships for the Tribe for the second year in a row. Miller looks to build off of his breakout season on the track that saw him run the fastest 3,000m steeplechase at the College since 1996. Rounding out the top tier of runners for the Tribe will be junior transfer **Jonathan Grey**. Grey earned All-Region honors for Oklahoma University last season and also finished 13th at the 2007 USA Junior Cross Country Championships.

Leading the second tier of runners this season and pushing for spots on the travel squad will be sophomores **Tom Burke** and **Brian Sklodowski**, along with junior **Drew Midland**. Burke was named CAA Rookie of the Year last fall and was the best true freshman finisher in eighth-place at the CAA Championships. Sklodowski looks to build off of his 800m All-CAA performance in the spring and have another solid season this fall. His 2007 season was highlighted by an eighth-place finish at the Cavalier Open and running for the Tribe at the IC4A Championships. Midland hopes to duplicate his great fall last year that included finishing 17th at the IC4A Championships to earn

All-East honors and a seventh-place finish at the CAA Championships that earned him an all-conference nod.

Looking to push these runners will be a group of harriers that includes sophomores **Skeeter Morris** and **Jay Bilsborrow**, and red-shirt freshman **Max Werner**. Morris' ran for the Tribe at the IC4A Championships and a fifth-place finish unattached at the Cavalier Open. Bilsborrow looks to build on a strong season in the spring that saw him run in the 800m at the CAA Championships. Werner, who redshirted after walking on last fall, finished 17th unattached at the Cavalier Open and qualified for the USAT&F Junior Championships in the 10,000m last spring.

Adding to the depth of the squad this season will be a trio of senior harriers. **David Groff** placed 16th last year at the CAA Championships, while **Dan MacKay** will be rested after redshirting both cross country and track in 2007-08. Classmate **Bryce Wilk** will look to improve on a season that saw him place 11th at the Cavalier Open and run for the Tribe in the IC4A Championships.

Three sophomores will look to build off of solid first-year campaigns and progress in their second years. **Robert Sagar** finished fifth at the IC4A Coaches' race and 14th at the Tribe Open. **Sean Sewell** redshirted last year for the College, but did place 37th unattached at the Lou Onesty Invitational. **Sean Mahoney** did not compete in the fall last year, but looks to build on setting his personal best in the 800m run at the CAA Championships last spring.

Adding depth for the Tribe this year will be junior **Cabell Rosanelli** along with freshmen **Lewis Woodard**, **Glen Wright Colopy**, **Paul Norland**, and **Chris Tyson**.

Pacing the freshman runners this year will be **Peter Dorrell** and **Alex McGrath**. Dorrell comes to the College as a two-time Gatorade Track Athlete of the Year in Virginia, while McGrath arrives touting Gatorade Runner of the Year and New Hampshire Runner of the Year honors in 2007.

Four more freshmen come to W&M boasting some impressive prep credentials. **John Pence** was a three-time all-conference prep former, while **Liam Anastasia-Murphy** comes to Williamsburg as the Massachusetts State Division champion in cross-country in 2007. Rounding out the freshmen class are **David Adley** and **Zach Gates**. Adley was named to the All-Pennsylvania First Team, while Gates finished fourth at the Indiana State Cross Country Championships.

2008 CROSS COUNTRY PREVIEW



Sprints/Hurdles

Leading the way for the sprinters and hurdlers this year will be sophomore **Chris McIntosh**. McIntosh set a personal record in the 400m hurdles at the CAA Championships last year with his time of 54.28 which ranked him as the eighth-fastest hurdler in the history of the College.

Senior **Matt Heidman** looks to close out his career at the College on a high note, improving on a solid junior campaign.

Also looking to contribute this year will be freshman **Matt Clark**, who placed first at the Virginia Independent Schools state meet in the 55m hurdles, and sophomore **Chad Cochran**, who looks to improve his hurdling and provide depth at the sprint events.

Pacing the sprinters this season will sophomores **David Blitzler** and **Florian Cords**. Blitzler moved into the top 10 at the College in the 60m dash at the Patriot Games. Cords looks to have a breakthrough season and once again compete at the CAA Championships.

Middle Distance

Middle distance will once again be a strength of the team this season. Senior **David Groff**, the 2007 CAA champion in the 1,500m, leads this group of runners and looks to finish his career at W&M on a high note. Groff won the 1,000m run last year at the George Mason Invitational and ran the 1,000m and 4x800 relay at the IC4A Indoor Championships in March. This year Groff will also look to better his career marks of 1:49.43 in the 800m and 3:46.98 in the 1,500m run that he set in 2007.

Junior **Cabell Rosanelli** will try to duplicate his sophomore season that saw him earn All-East honors after placing eighth with a time of 2:27.71 in the 1,000m IC4A Indoor Championships.

Five sophomores should also contribute heavily to the success of the middle distance runners this year. The sophomores will be led by **Brian Sklodowski** who was named All-CAA for his third-place performance in the 800m at the conference championships. Sklodowski also qualified for the IC4A and the USAT&F Junior Championships. **Lewis Woodard** looks to keep the momentum going from last year when he set his career mark in the 1,500m run at the IC4A Championships, while **Jay Bilsborrow** looks to improve after running in the 800m run at the CAA Championships.

Both **Sean Mahoney** and **Sean Sewell** had great performances at the CAA Championships. Both set personal bests in the 800m, with Sewell running in the finals of both the 800m and 3,000m steeplechase at the championships.

Freshman **Liam Anastasia-Murphy** will look to contribute right away for the middle distance corps. Anastasia-Murphy was a four-

time all-conference honoree in both indoor and outdoor track in high school.

Junior **Harry Miller** will lead a strong group of steeplechasers for the Tribe this season. Miller became the fourth-fastest steeplechaser in the College's history, and the quickest since 1996, at the Penn Relays when he finished in 8:49.09 for fourth. Miller and senior **Bryce Wilk** were both named All-CAA for their performances at the CAA Championships that saw Wilk place second and Miller place third.

Sophomore **Robert Sagar** will look to score for the Tribe this season at the CAA Championships, something he just missed out on last year when he placed ninth in the 3,000m steeplechase.

Redshirt freshman **Paul Norland** and true freshman **Chris Tyson** will provide depth and look to gain some experience behind the two highly regarded steeplechasers during the season.

Distance

Leading the distance runners, and the Tribe as a whole, will be senior **Ian Fitzgerald** and senior **Christo Landry**. Fitzgerald had a stellar junior campaign that saw him place 18th at the NCAA Championships in the 5,000m run. Fitzgerald was the IC4A and Colonial Relay champion in the 1,500m run and earned all-conference honors for his runner-up finish at the CAA Championship in the 1,500m. Fitzgerald also set a personal-best time of 13:55.19 in the 5,000m run at the UNC Last Chance. Landry redshirted the track season, but had an unbelievable cross country season. Landry was named an All-American for the third time after placing 13th at the NCAA Championships and was named CAA Athlete of the Year. Landry will look to better his career mark of 13:53.62 in the 5,000m that he set at Stanford in 2006.

Junior **Patterson Wilhelm** had a great 2008 campaign for the Tribe. Patterson placed 15th in the 5,000m run at the NCAA East Regional and also captured the CAA 5,000m championship. He also set a personal-best time of 14:16.80 in the 5,000m run at the Payton Jordan Invitational. Junior **Ben Massam** won the CAA Championship in the 10,000m run and placed second in the 5,000m run with only 40 minutes in between the events. Massam also placed eighth and earned All-East honors at the IC4A Indoor Championships in the 5,000m and placed fifth in the 10,000m run at the IC4A Outdoor Championships for his second All-East nod of the year. Massam set his career-best mark in the 5,000m run at the Colonial Relays this year, running 14:21.81.

Junior **Charlie Swartz** and sophomore **Tom Burke** both look to build on solid seasons last year. Swartz ran in both the indoor and outdoor IC4A Championships and placed fourth at the CAA Championships in the 5,000m run. Swartz also set his personal-best in the 5,000m run of 14:21.49 at the Penn Relays. Burke looks to improve

upon a rookie campaign that saw him earn Rookie of the Year honors in cross country and just miss scoring at the CAA Championships with his ninth place finish in the 10,000m run.

Both senior **Dan MacKay** and junior **Colin Leak** are expected to run well this season for the Tribe after redshirting last season. Also expected to contribute for the team will be junior **Drew Midland**, who set a personal best in the 3,000m run at the IC4A Indoor Championships last season.

Two sophomores will add great depth for the distance corps this coming season. Transfer **Jonathan Grey** comes to the College after running last year at the University of Oklahoma. Grey ran well for the Sooners, placing fifth in the 10,000m run at the USAT&F Junior Nationals in 2007. Classmate **Skeeter Morris** will look to improve on a great showing at the CAA Championships that saw him set a new personal record in the 10,000m run.

Two sophomores will look to build on good rookie campaigns that saw them each set new career-bests in the 10,000m run. **Glen Wright Colopy** set his mark at the Colonial Relays, while **Max Werner** had his best performance at the CAA Championships, qualifying for the USA T&F Junior Nationals in 31:47.67.

Five incoming freshman come in boasting great prep credentials and look to provide depth immediately for the Tribe. **Peter Dorrell** comes to the College as a two-time Gatorade Track Athlete of the Year in Virginia and a nine-time Virginia AA state champion. He has impressive personal-bests in both the 1,600 and 3,200, timing 4:11.62 and 8:58.30 respectively. **Alex McGrath** was named the Gatorade Runner of the Year in New Hampshire and was also named New Hampshire Runner of the Year in 2007.

John Pence was named all-conference three-times in track, while **David Adley** arrives in Williamsburg as a three-time district champion in outdoor track. Rounding out the freshman distance runners will be **Zach Gates**, who placed fourth in the 3,200m run at the Indiana state meet.

Throws

Junior **Brandon Oliver** and sophomore **Dan Klatzkin** will both try to capture CAA titles this year after coming close last year. Oliver earned All-CAA honors in the hammer throw with his third-place finish, while Klatzkin finished second in the discus and third in the shot put to earn all-conference honors in both.

Senior **Alex Heacock** looks to recapture the CAA championship in the javelin after placing a close second last year at the conference championships. Heacock also looks to move up the list of all-time javelin throwers at the College, where he currently ranks fifth after throwing a personal-best 196-6 at the Lou Onesty Invitational.

Juniors **Alex Ball** and **Adam Gawne** are both coming off top ten performances at the CAA Championships. Ball started the year by setting personal bests in the weight throw in the first three meets he threw in and capped his season by placing seventh in the hammer throw at the conference meet. Gawne had a very solid year that was punctuated with a sixth-place and personal-best throw of 153-5 in the hammer throw at the CAA Championships.

Sophomore **Zach Jordan** also had a great showing at the CAA Championships. Jordan placed fifth and set a career-best of 153-7 in the hammer throw at the meet. Classmate **Tim Latham** is expected to contribute this year for the Tribe after he was limited to only one performance last year due to health reasons. Senior **Cam Shriver** will look to move up the College's top 10 list in the javelin this year after competing in the CAA Championships last year.

Freshman **Brandon Héroux**, like many of his freshman brethren, comes in with an impressive prep resume. Héroux is the reigning Penn Relays champion in the javelin throw, and owns a career best mark of 202-4.

Jumps

Coming off a fantastic year, Shriver will once again lead the jumping athletes. Shriver was the IC4A indoor champion in the high jump and ranks fifth all-time at the College with his winning height of 6-10.75. Shriver also earned All-CAA honors after finishing as the runner-up in the high jump.

In the pole vault, the Tribe will be represented by junior **Kiernan Lofland** and sophomore **Keith Constance**. Constance will look to improve after acclimating himself to college competition last season, while Lofland looks to improve on his 13th-place finish in the pole vault at the IC4A Championships and his fifth-place finish at the CAA Championships. He will also look to eclipse his personal-best height of 16-0.75 that he set at the IC4A Outdoor Championships in 2007.

Junior **Doug Zimmer** had a breakout year last year for the Tribe. After redshirting indoors, Zimmer set a career best in the decathlon at the IC4A Championships with a score of 6,261. His performance at the championships puts him sixth all-time at the College. Zimmer also performed well at the CAA Championships, winning the pole vault component of the decathlon and placing third in the 1,500m component. This season Zimmer will transition to becoming exclusively a pole-vaulter after vaulting an impressive height of 14-7.25 at the Outdoor IC4A Championships, which made him the second-best pole-vaulter on the team.

Multi-Events

Freshman **Roman Dent** comes to W&M with an impressive prep credentials and looks to contribute immediately. Dent is a two-time Tennessee state champion in the triple jump and also owns state championships in the long jump, pole vault, and the 110m hurdles and boasts a personal-best of 47-11.75 in the triple jump.

A SUCCESSFUL BALANCE

ATHLETIC SUCCESS

• The 2007-08 season was another strong year for the College, as Tribe teams added four more CAA titles to bring the school's all-time league-leading total to 92. W&M also had eight different programs represented at the NCAA Championship level in some capacity.

• The men's cross country squad won its eighth consecutive CAA crown in the fall, while the women's cross country team won its fifth straight. The women's track and field team won its seventh CAA Championship in the last eight years, while the women's tennis team added its 20th all-time CAA crown in the 23-year history of the league during the spring.

• In total, W&M had five conference players of the year, five conference scholar-athletes of the year, 18 All-Americans and 100 athletes earned all-conference honors in their respective sports during the 2007-08 season.

• Individually, the women's tennis doubles team of Megan Moulton-Levy and Katarina Zoricic garnered All-America honors by advancing to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. Moulton-Levy also became the first Tribe athlete and only the fourth in CAA history to win conference player of the year honors for a fourth time. Katie Radloff, who garnered CAA Swimmer of the Year and Swimmer of the Championships honors for the second straight season, earned a spot in the NCAA Swimming Championships for the second time in as many years. Christo Laundry earned All-America honors for the third time in cross country and also won the CAA Individual Championship. Women's soccer player Claire Zimmeck garnered CAA Player of the Year honors for the second straight season and was a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy. Additionally, Emily Anderson earned All-America honors with a fifth-place finish in the 1,500m, marking the best Tribe finish in 14 years.

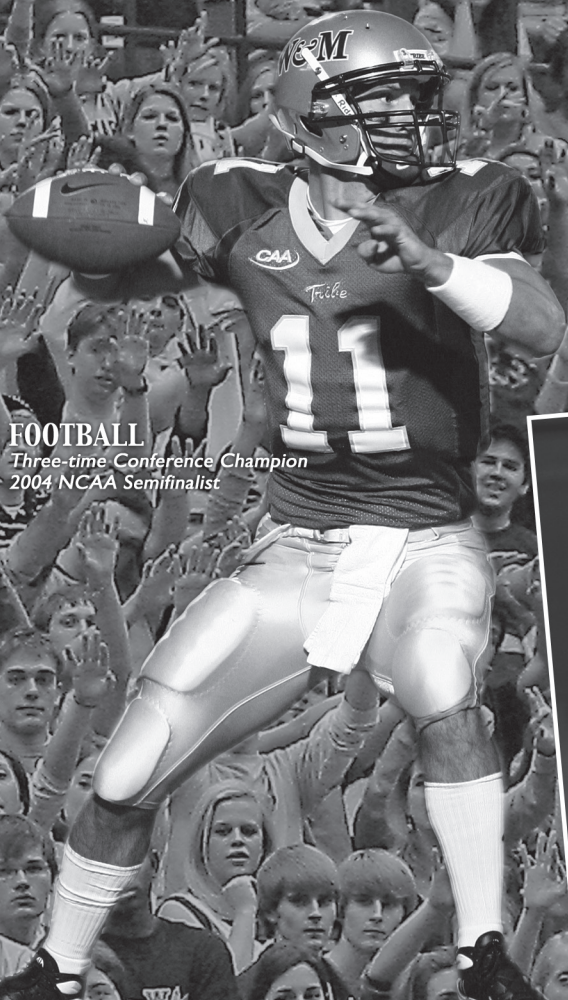

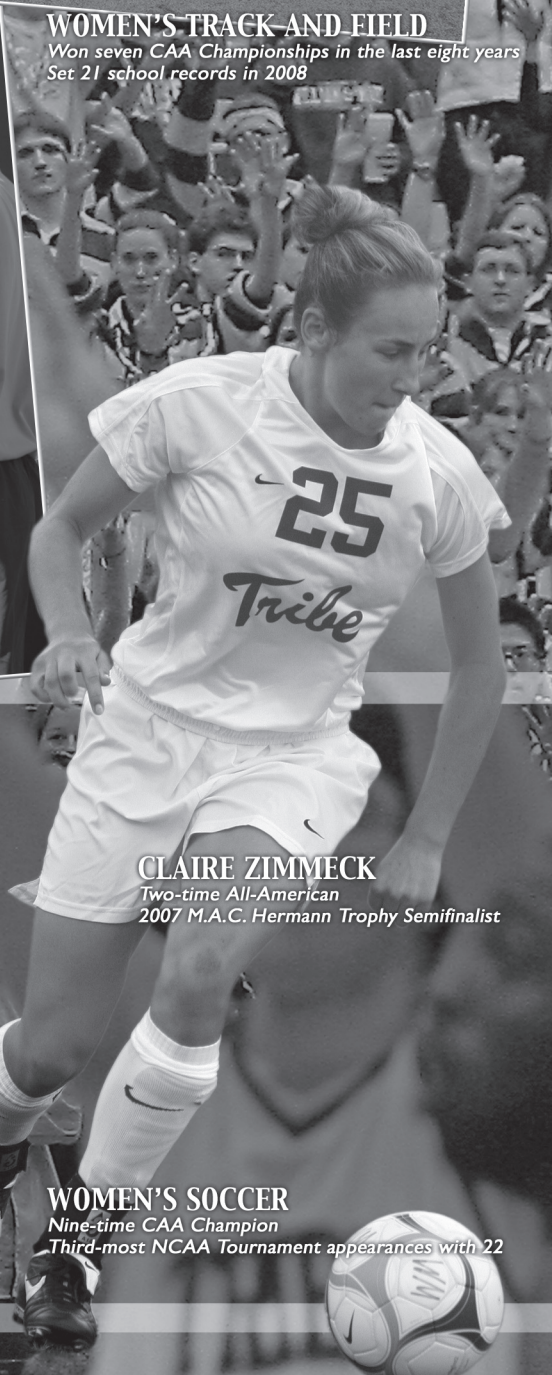

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

- The Tribe's athletic accomplishments do not come at the expense of its student-athlete's academic responsibilities, as W&M ranked fourth, the highest of any athletic scholarship-granting school and of any public school, among the Division I teams when the NCAA released its inaugural Academic Progress Rate scores in 2005.
- In a recent NCAA survey on graduation rates, William and Mary athletic teams set the standard for academic excellence – 13 teams graduated 100 percent of their players. The overall graduation rate for our athletes is 96 percent (higher than 86 percent for the entire student body).
- There have been 45 student athletes elected to Phi Beta Kappa in the past ten years. Four Rhodes Scholars were W&M student-athletes
- The College's Athletics Department showed a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 86 percent among its student-athletes who entered school on athletics scholarships in the 2000-01 athletics year in data released by the NCAA in 2007.
- The national average among all Division I schools was 63 percent. W&M is tops in both the CAA and among all Division I Virginia schools.
- In 2002-03, the CAA created a Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award in each of its sports, and not surprisingly, W&M has set the pace with 25 winners in the six-year history of the award.

The College



THE COLLEGE OF WILLIAM AND MARY

The College of William and Mary is a public university located in Williamsburg, Va. Founded in 1693 by Royal Charter issued by King William III and Queen Mary II of England, William and Mary is the second oldest college in the country after Harvard. William and Mary has a long history of liberal arts education and a growing research and science curriculum that demonstrates a strong commitment to undergraduate research. The College, which became a state university in 1906, has been designated a "Public Ivy," and for nine straight years has been ranked by U.S. News & World Report as sixth-best public university in the country – and the nation's top small public university.

Also referred to as "the alma mater of a nation," the College has educated four U.S. Presidents – George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler, which is the third most of any college in the country. William and Mary also claims several firsts, including the 1776 creation of Phi Beta Kappa – the country's first academic honor society – the first honor code of conduct for college students, and the first collegiate law school, established in 1779. William and Mary is also home to the Sir Christopher Wren Building – the country's oldest academic building still in use – and the President's House, the oldest home of a university president still in use.

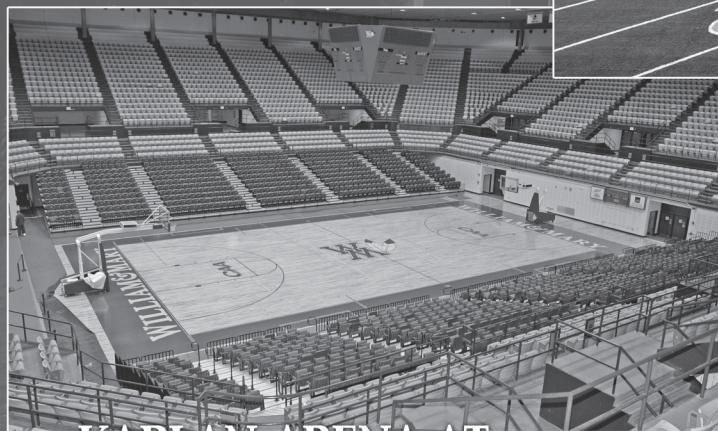
- In addition to four U.S. Presidents, William and Mary has educated a number of this country's key historical figures, including U.S. Supreme Court Chief Justice John Marshall and 16 signers of the Declaration of Independence.
- More recent famous alumni from William and Mary include U.S. Secretary of Defense Robert Gates ('65), the late David Brown ('78) (astronaut on the Columbia Shuttle), actress Glenn Close ('74), comedian John Stewart ('84), fashion designer Perry Ellis ('61), actor Patton Oswalt ('91), the late Mark McCormack ('51) (founder of sports and celebrity agency IMG), actress Linda Lavin ('59), NASCAR and Gibbs Racing's J.D. Gibbs ('91), Minnesota Vikings star Darren Sharper ('97), and Pittsburgh Steelers Head Coach Mike Tomlin ('95).
- In 2008, William and Mary recognized as 5th-highest producer of Peace Corps volunteers among mid-sized schools (5,000-15,000 students). As of January 2008, 51 W&M alumni are serving. Since the Peace Corps' inception, 499 W&M alumni have volunteered with the Corps, making the university the 82nd-highest producer of volunteers of all time.
- For 2007-2008, the College had more Fulbright Scholars than any other college of university in Virginia, and it had the highest application-to-award rate among nation's top research institutions. In 2006-2007, 12 William and Mary students were named Fulbright Scholars. Eleven received the honor in 2007-08 and scholars are studying in countries such as Argentina, Hungary, Uganda, Sweden, Senegal, and Ecuador.
- In 2008, U.S. News ranked William and Mary sixth among all public colleges and universities and 33rd out of all universities – both public and private. The William & Mary Law School ranked tied for 30th in 2008 by U.S. News. The Mason School Business ranked 40th in nation (2008) by Financial Times and 71st in the world. William and Mary ranked 4th-best bargain in higher education by Kiplinger's in 2008. Newsweek magazine named W&M "hottest small state university" in 2006.
- In 2008, W&M received a record number of applications for undergraduate admission for the 3rd year in a row. More than 11,500 undergraduate applications were received.
- According to a recent survey, William and Mary students contribute 323,000 hours of community service per year. Seventy-five percent of undergraduates and 50 percent of graduate students report they volunteered during their time at the College. Ninety percent of undergraduates report they will volunteer in the community they reside in following graduation.

TRIBE FACILITIES

William and Mary is committed to building and maintaining outstanding facilities for all 21 of its varsity athletic teams. The College has demonstrated this commitment by investing approximately \$16 million toward the construction and upgrade of its athletics facilities during just the last five years. Among W&M's recent projects was the construction of the \$11 million, 30,000-square foot Jimmie Laycock Football Center, which was dedicated this past June. In recent years, the College has hosted NCAA tournament events for football and women's tennis, while a number of other W&M programs have hosted conference championships at Tribe venues.

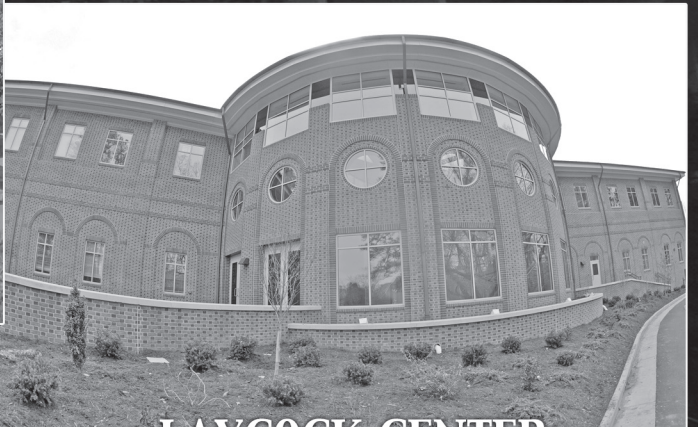

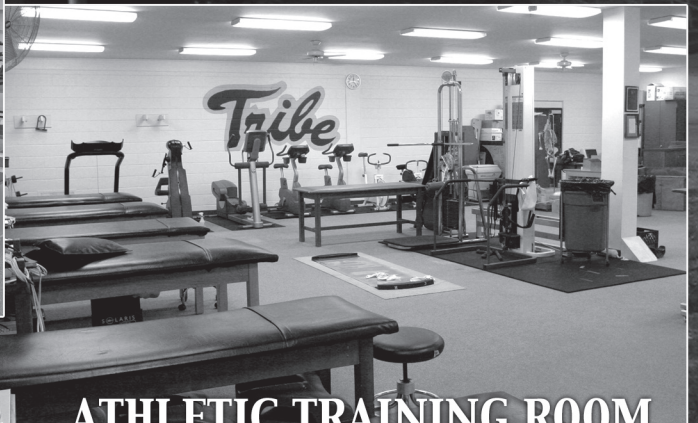

 ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

Under the steady guidance and watchful eye of Terry Driscoll, the William and Mary Athletics Department has solidified its standing as one of the nation's preeminent broad-based programs. As Driscoll enters his 13th year as athletics director, he has overseen an unprecedented era of improvement in terms of funding and facilities while also maintaining the College's rich history of producing well-rounded student-athletes.

Driscoll oversees a program that is committed to balancing academic demands with athletic success. One of the department's stated goals each year is to finish among the top 100 in the annual Director's Cup rankings, which has happened in all but one of the years that Driscoll has been the director.

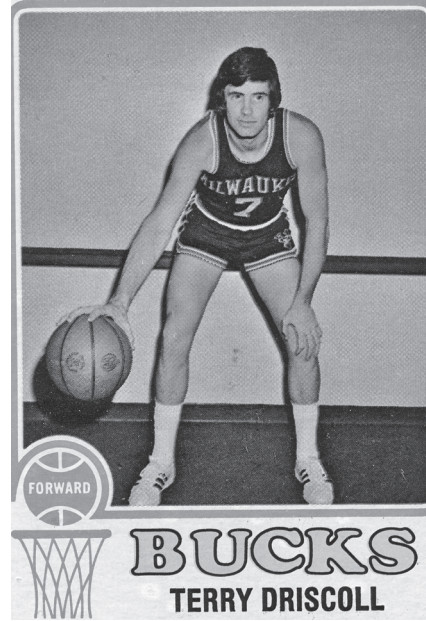
In the last five years alone, the Tribe's program has combined for a total of 23 Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles. This past season, W&M claimed four CAA titles (Men's and Women's Cross Country, Women's Track & Field, and Women's Tennis). As recently as 2002-03, W&M had a school-record 10 teams compete in the NCAA Tournament, with four teams winning conference titles and six that finished in the top 25 at the end of their respective seasons. Overall, no institution in the CAA can claim more all-time league championships than the 92 William and Mary has earned.

As impressive as the athletic accomplishments have been during Driscoll's tenure, the program's academic successes have been even greater. In the NCAA's inaugural (2004) APR rankings, a measurement of academic progress based on academic eligibility, retention, and graduation of student-athletes, W&M was fourth in the nation overall and first among institutions offering athletic performance-based scholarships. Additionally, the Tribe football team has posted a 100 percent graduation rate three times, while the majority of the program's squads have consistently ranked among the nation's finest in terms of graduation. In 2002, the CAA started recognizing Scholar-Athletes of the Year for each of the 22 sports it sponsors, and the College has had a conference-high 26 individuals receive the honor.

In addition to the many academic and athletic successes, Driscoll's impact on the program has been equally impressive in terms of physical and financial improvements. Since taking over as athletics director, Driscoll has overseen the construction of more than \$20 million in new facilities, including Plumeri Park (baseball), Albert-Daly Field (soccer, lacrosse), and the Busch Courts (tennis). Most recently, the College dedicated a new \$11 million, 30,000 square-foot Jimmie Laycock Football Center at Zable Stadium in the summer of 2008. During the last three years, the venerable stadium has been enhanced with an \$800,000-plus video scoreboard (2007), the installation of a \$650,000 permanent lighting system (2006), and an \$840,000 state-of-the-art Field Turf Pro artificial playing surface (2006).

In addition to the physical structures, Driscoll has also worked with the Associate Athletics Director for Development, Bobby Dwyer, to increase the annual fund-raising totals for non-capital projects from \$1.36 million in 1995 to the current annual total of approximately \$2.7 million.

A true student-athlete himself, Driscoll's leadership skills were developed during his collegiate years. As a student-athlete at Boston College, Driscoll captained the basketball team to the National Invitation Tournament Finals as a senior and was named the tournament MVP. In addition to being named an All-American, his success in the classroom as a biology major garnered him an Academic All-America honor.



After graduating from BC, he was the fourth overall pick of the 1969 NBA Draft, selected by the Detroit Pistons, just three spots after the Milwaukee Bucks chose UCLA's Lew Alcindor, later to be known as Kareem Abdul-Jabbar. Driscoll chose to play a year in Italy first, but then returned to the U.S. to play for the Pistons, Washington Bullets, and Milwaukee Bucks before going back to Italy as a player and then coach until 1980.

Driscoll then entered the corporate world in 1980, working for Kazmaier Associates, Inc., an international sporting goods sales and sports marketing firm. After Kazmaier purchased Bike Athletic in 1986, KSG Inc. was formed with the objective of becoming the first, and only, national sales agency in the sporting goods industry. By 1987, Driscoll was president of the company and had expanded the agency to all 50 states just two years later. In early 1990, Driscoll's contribution to a marketing research project for the NCAA was the initial step moving him from product marketing and sales to sports marketing and management. The result of the project was a joint venture between Kazmaier Associates and Host Communications - with Driscoll being named managing director and chief operating officer of NCAA International.

In 1993, Driscoll diversified his experience in the athletic world by working as the venue executive director of the 1994 World Cup site in Boston. In September of that year, Driscoll was again enlisted to launch a new business, Eagle International Group, an event management and services company. As vice president, Driscoll worked with Hawaii Pacific Sports to organize the Women's World Volleyball Grand Prix competition in Honolulu.

Driscoll resides in Williamsburg with his wife, Susan. The couple has two children - Keith, a 1997 graduate of Holy Cross, and Leslie, a 2001 graduate of William and Mary.
