# LANG CAMPBELL

## THE CAMPBELL FILE

**Senior, QB, 6-3, 205**

**Note of the Week:** Campbell has thrown at least one TD pass in each of his 11 career starts and has now thrown for over 200 yards in eight consecutive games dating back to last season.

### CAMPBELL'S CLIPS

- Thrown for over 200 yards in eight consecutive games dating back to 2003.
- Thrown at least one TD pass in every career start (11).
- Needs just 143 passing yards to reach 3,000 for his career.
- Has been intercepted only once in last 152 pass attempts, including 81-straight w/o one.
- At UNC, became first W&M QB to pass and run for two TDs since David Corley did it vs. Maine in 2001.
- Led the A-10 in passing yards per game (229.6) and pass efficiency (152.1) in 2003.
- Threw for over 200 yards in each of the Tribe's final seven games last year.
- Finished '03 as the Tribe's second-leading rusher with 300 yards.
- Twenty-two TD passes in '03 matched fifth-best single-season total in W&M history.

The senior from Winchester, VA emerged with a breakout season last fall and picked up right where he left off.

At UNC, Campbell threw for a career-high 322 yards, surpassing the 300-yard mark for the first time in his career. He completed 23 of 41 attempts and threw a pair of TD passes against the Tar Heels. Campbell has now thrown for 200 yards or better in eight consecutive games and has thrown at least one TD pass in each of his 11 career starts. In addition, Campbell ran for a pair of scores and was the Tribe's second-leading rusher at UNC with 35 yards. He became the first Tribe quarterback to run and pass for two TDs in a game, since David Corley, Jr. did it in 2001.

In 2003, Campbell completed 182 of 285 passes, with 22 touchdowns and just seven interceptions. He averaged over 243 passing yards per game in conference play, with a pass efficiency rating of 156.7. Campbell finished the season as the league's leader in passing yards per game (229.6) and pass efficiency (152.1), while finishing second in total offense (259.6). Campbell's passer rating was seventh in the country, while he ranked 18th nationally in total offense.

**Personal:** Son of Shep and Nancy Campbell... Brings a cumulative GPA of better than 3.3 into senior campaign... Enjoys playing sports, listening to music and reading in his free time... Born September 25, 1981.

### Campbell's Career vs. UNH

W&M is 1-0 in Campbell's career against UNH, winning 38-28 last season. Campbell threw for 276 yards against the Wildcats with three TD passes and was picked off once. He also ran seven times for a career-high 65 yards.

**Silver Linings: Jimmye Laycock** is in his 25th season as the Tribe's head coach. The school's all-time winningest coach, Laycock has compiled a 159-111-2 career record at W&M. He ranks fifth on the A-10 career victories lists (59), only three behind former Richmond and Massachusetts coach Jim Reid. W&M has made seven postseason appearances under Laycock and posted winning ledgers in 17 of the past 21 seasons.

**Good Company:** Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, in his 25th season on the W&M sidelines, ranks third among all current Division I-A and Division I-AA head coaches in terms of most years at their current school. The two coaches ahead of Laycock are Penn State's Joe Paterno (37 years) and Florida State's Bobby Bowden (26 years).

**Quotes from Monday's A-10 Coaches Conference Call...**

**1. Is it a little strange having a bye week only one game into the season?**

Yeah it is. I don't know when the last time was we had a bye right after our opener. We had to rethink what we were going to do this week and look at approaching it a little bit differently. I think we got something out of it. Our practice schedule was hurt last week with the rain, so we didn't get as much done as I would have liked, but we'll see how it turns out.

**2. How did you approach the off week differently?**

We kind of went back and started again with some preseason work. It wasn't as much of a chance to give the players a break as it was to clean up a few things that we may not have had time to get done in our preseason practices.

**3. What sort of things did you have to clean up?**

Well, if you ask any football coach they'll tell you that there's no shortage of those sort of things. We reviewed and looked closely at our first game and our personnel to try and make sure we're putting people in the right situations. We made some changes, personnel wise, with some people on special teams and went on from there.

**4. Can you talk about what you've seen from New Hampshire considering they seem to be one of the surprise teams in the conference right now?**

Obviously we're very, very impressed with what they've accomplished. I think it says a lot for the league in the fact they went in there and beat Rutgers at Rutgers. I think it emphasizes to everyone how strong our league is, and we congratulate them. They played us really tough last year. We were fortunate to get a really tough win, and they have most of those people back. With the new quarterback in there that's a whole different story. They've done an outstanding job of bringing him along, making him successful and doing things offensively to move the ball. Obviously, if you look at the numbers and what they've accomplished they've done a great job.

**5. As a person who works with quarterbacks, how impressive is what New Hampshire has done with a player who came into the summer fourth on the depth chart?**

I'm extremely impressed. Not to mention losing a solid returning quarterback for the season, they've just done a great job keeping their players up and playing hard. It would be very easy to fold after losing a senior quarterback. To jump in there and get another quarterback ready and to put up numbers against the people they have been playing is very impressive.

**6. What have you seen from New Hampshire's defense?**

They played very hard against us last year. They are very physical, and they're playing a little different scheme. They really fly around and get people to the football. Right now, they look to be a year better, a year more experienced and they play extremely hard. When you look at them, there's not going to be one guy on the ball there's going to be a swarm of them. They run well too. This team is extremely fast on defense.

**7. How is your injury situation coming out of the off week?**

I think we're healthy, and we should be okay. I think we should be pretty much where we were before the Carolina game. Maybe one or two players will have to be determined mid-week, but I think we're in good shape.

## W&M GAME NOTES

VS. NEW HAMPSHIRE SEPT. 18

**Seriously Offensive:** Over the last three meetings with the Wildcats, the Tribe offense has been extremely effective, averaging better than 37 points (110 total) and 462 yards of total offense.

Perhaps the best indicator of that effectiveness has been the balance the College's attack has managed to maintain, as it has averaged 272.6 yards rushing and 258.3 passing over the three games.

The following are some offensive notes for the Tribe in the series:

#### Individually W&M has had ...

- A receiver go over 100-yards three times (Rich Musinski).
- A quarterback throw for more than 200 yards three times (including Lang Campbell's 268-yard performance last year, which including a career-best three touchdowns).

- A tailback run for 100-yards in the last two meetings (Delmous Coley, 22 attempts for 122 yards in '03; Jon Smith 32 carries for 198 yards in '02).

- Jon Smith set his career high for TD runs in '01, as he bulled in for three scores during the Tribe's 38-28 win at Durham (which stood as the first three scores of his career).

- Sophomore tailback Trevor McLaurin establish a career high for TDs, as he rushed for two scores and caught a TD pass during the Tribe's 38-28 win in Williamsburg last season (which also stood as the first three scores of his career).

- Senior WR Jon Pitts set his career high for catches (five) and yards (79) in '03.

#### As a Team, W&M has ...

- averaged 5.9 yds/attempt rushing (818 yards on 138 carries, including a season-best 268 yards on 45 attempts in '03).

- Completed better than 64% of its passing attempts (53 of 82)

- Thrown only two interceptions, as compared to seven TDs

- Averaged nearly 10 yards a passing attempt (9.5 yds/attempt)

- Rushed no less than 45 times (138 total)

**Continuing On Campbell:** All-American candidate Lang Campbell lived up to all the preseason expectations in his first start of 2004, earning the league's Offen-

sive Player of the Week honors (for the second time in his career) by throwing for 322 yards and a pair of scores, while rushing for another two TDs.

The following is a brief point-by-point look at his afternoon, what he has accomplished in his 11 games as the starting QB, and what could be just on the horizon.

#### The game vs. UNC saw Campbell ...

- Set his career high in passing yards (with 322)

- Set his career high in rushing touchdowns (two, which also equaled his career total).

- Complete passes to a career best nine different receivers (see note to follow)

- Set a career high in attempts (41, previous high was 37 vs. JMU).

- Extend his streak of games with at least one TD pass to 11 (every career start)

- Turn in his eighth 200-plus yard passing afternoon (in his 11 career starts)

- Turn in his eighth multiple TD passing afternoon of his career.

- Extend his streak of games with better than .500 completion percentage (11).

#### For his career, Campbell is ..

- Just 172 yards from 3,000 for his career (in just 18 total games).

- Just 143 yards from breaking into the College's all-time top 10 career passing yardage list (closing in on John Brosnahan's two-year total of 2,970 set between 1987-88).

- Now in ninth place on the College's all-time TD pass listing (26), just two scoring connections behind eighth place and five from seventh (see listing on page 10).

- Currently second on the College's all-time completion percentage listing (.630, 220 of 349 attempts).

- Just 515 yards of total offense from moving into the College's all-time top 10 in that category. He has amassed 3,192 (2,828 passing, 364 rushing) for his career (see chart on page 10).

- Carrying a career TD/INT ratio of nearly four to one (26TD/7 INT).

**Wide Variety:** One of the strengths that QB Lang Campbell brings into the 2004 season is his experience within the Tribe's complex offensive system. What makes him even more dangerous is his ability to

see the entire field.

Standing up in the face of, and often running around, a stout pass rush by North Carolina, Campbell calmly checked through his reads and completed passes to a career-high nine different receivers. In the course of his 11 career starts, Campbell has never connected to less than six different teammates. He averages completing passes to 7.5 different receivers/start.

**Fun with Numbers:** Campbell's start vs. UNC was the 11th of his career. If you were to look at it like one full season, his numbers would read as follows

His numbers would place him in the school's single-season top 10 in every significant passing category, as well as in total offense (2,952).

**Running Strong:** Senior tailback Jon Smith gained 24 yards on just nine carries vs. UNC, but the effort still inched him closer to several career milestones. With just 232 yards, Smith will move his career total to 2,000 yards (currently at 1,786) and become the 11th Tribe running back to reach the lofty barrier. With 348 yards rushing, Smith can move into possession

of 10th-place all-time on the College's career rushing listing (see listing on page 10).

**Not in a Giving Mood:** The Tribe's offense has not yielded a turnover, or sack, over the last eight quarters, dating back to last season. In fact, the Tribe has yielded only one fumble (vs. Hofstra) and one INT (vs. UNH) over the last six games.

**Getting Started:** With a win over New Hampshire, the Tribe will open its conference schedule with a win for the first time since the 2001 season (a 31-10 win at UMass). In fact, the Tribe has lost four of the last five league openers, including last year's 48-14 loss at Northeastern.

W&M opened its league schedule vs. UNH on two other occasions, including its first game as a league member (a 27-14 win in Williamsburg in '93). The other contest was significant as the Tribe carried a school all-time high No. 2 national ranking into Durham for its first conference game of the 1997 season and was upset 24-22 by the Wildcats.

All-time, the Tribe is 5-6 in league openers under Jimmie Laycock.

**Hard to Believe:** The College has opened its conference schedule on the road for NINE-straight years. One has to go back

**W&M 38, UNH 28**

**WILLIAMSBURG, VA(11/15/03)** - Behind a balanced offensive attack and an opportunistic defense, William and Mary won its third-straight game with a 38-28 victory over New Hampshire before a crowd of 4,887 at Zable Stadium.

The first half was highlighted by an amazing performance by wide receiver **Rich Musinski**. Musinski had four catches for 117 yards in the first quarter alone before leaving with an injury. Even without Musinski, the passing game kept rolling. **Lang Campbell** hit junior **John Pitts** from 26 yards out to put W&M up 17-10 early in the second quarter.

With the game tied at the half, it was the play of redshirt freshman running back **Trevor McLaurin** that broke the game open in the second half. **McLaurin** tallied the first score of his career on a 22-yard run (pictured below) in the third quarter. He followed that up just over seven minutes later by catching an 11-yard score. And finally, late in the game McLaurin hit paydirt again, this time from two yards out to set the final margin.

to the 1995 season for the last time W&M opened the league schedule in the friendly confines of Zable Stadium (a 24-17 loss to James Madison).

**Zoned Out:** After finishing last season with 30 conversions of its 36 red zone opportunities (21 TDs/nine FGs), the Tribe seems to have come into 2004 with an even better 'nose' for the end zone. The College came away with points on all five of its red zone opportunities vs. UNC, including four TDs (and one FG) (see chart on page 20).

**Got You Covered:** The College's coaching staff modified Greg Kuehn's kick offs for the North Carolina game, with the idea of improving its coverage and the results were impressive. With Kuehn rocketing low line drives (squib kicks) deep into Carolina territory, the Tribe's coverage unit limited the Tar Heels returners to less than 11 yards on four of five kick attempts (one aberration being a 32 yard return). Three of the five UNC returns yielded less than five yards and the Heels average starting field position was its own 24-yard line.

**When it Counts:** Looking into the numbers of Lang Campbell's impressive afternoon at UNC, which featured 322 yards and two touchdowns, perhaps the most striking breakdown comes when you look at his efficiency on third down. In 11 third down passing attempts, Campbell completed eight of his passes for 81 yards (and four conversions).

Of the four third downs that Campbell failed to convert with his right arm, two were converted with his feet, as he was two for two on fourth down rushing attempts, including a 10-yard run and a one-yard TD run.

**Lustig Plays Big:** In a direct contrast to his 5-9, 175-pound frame, senior wideout Josh Lustig's play vs. UNC was large. His six-catch, 112-yard afternoon not only stands as personal single-game bests, but also eclipsed Lustig's entire season total from 2004 (four catches for 44 yards). His previous best game was five grabs for 87 yards (and two TDs) vs. VMI in 2001.

He also made an impact on special teams, by returning six kickoffs for 135 yards, which gave him 247 all-purpose yards on the afternoon. He currently leads

the conference in all-purpose yardage and is fourth in receiving.

**Been Awhile:** Former All-American WR Rich Musinski recorded 21 career 100-yard plus receiving afternoons over the last four seasons for the College. But, before Lustig's 112-yard outing vs. UNC, it had been 22 games since a WR other than Musinski had recorded the feat.

The last player, other than Musinski, to break the century mark was Bryce Lee, who turned in a 117-yard effort on five catches in the team's conference title clinching win over Villanova in the 2001 regular season finale.

**Talented Mr. Thompson:** While on the subject of receivers, one focus of the College's spring and fall camps was to develop a replacement for the large shoes left vacated by the graduation of Musinski. The staff is going to rely on a trio of senior receivers (Lustig, Dominique Thompson and Jon Pitts) to fill the void. While all three are capable of making plays, Thompson's sheer athleticism casts him as the team's most dangerous big-play threat. He didn't disappoint in his debut appearance in the role, as he brought down six catches for 83 yards and also contributed a rush for 13 yards (and had another rush of more than 15 yards called back on clipping penalty).

Like Lustig, he equaled his entire 2003 total of catches (six) on the afternoon, while his 83 receiving yards stands as his career, single-game, best.

**A Fresh Start:** Redshirt freshman wideout Joe Nicholas made the most of his first collegiate experience by contributing four catches for 48 yards in his role as the Tribe's slot receiver.

He showed the ability to go up in a crowd and bring down the difficult catches, as he primarily was working over the middle. After overseeing his conversion from defensive back to WR this off-season, the staff is counting on his continued improvement and will be looking for him to display some of the same playmaking ability he turned in during a standout spring practice session.

**He's a Kick:** Junior two-time all-conference kicker Greg Keuhn finished his afternoon's work vs. North Carolina with eight points (five for five on extra points and a

21-yard field goal).

Kuehn has scored at least one point in 21 of his 22 career games (only game he failed to score was at Northeastern last season). He has converted at least one field goal in 18 of his 22 career games and has now converted his last 50-straight PAT attempts (last miss came on a blocked kick vs. Northeastern in 2002).

**More on the McLaurin's:** The McLaurin twins each made significant contributions last season, and the 2004 campaign should be no different. **Travis** earned third-team all-conference honors last season after recording 120 tackles in his first season as a starter, while **Trevor** emerged as one of the Tribe's top rushing threats late last

season.

Travis earned A-10 Defensive Player of the Week honors in October after a 13-tackle effort against Massachusetts, and Trevor was the A-10 Rookie of the Week after scoring three TDs in a win over New Hampshire in November.

In the season-opener on Sept. 4, Travis made seven tackles and recovered two fumbles, one of which he returned 33 yards to set up a Tribe TD.

**Cason Back in Action:** Prior to the start of fall camp, junior corner **Stephen Cason** was cleared to return to the playing field for the 2004 season, after missing all of last year with a severe neck injury suffered in a car accident prior to the start of the 2003 campaign.

In his first game back (at UNC), Cason made an immediate impact, showing flashes of his big-play ability that made him a standout performer as a redshirt freshman in 2002.

Against the Tar Heels, Cason registered six tackles, five solo, forced a fumble and broke up a pass. The fumble (pictured above) came on a cornerback blitz midway through the second quarter and was recovered by Travis McLaurin and returned to the Tribe 4-yard line, leading to a Tribe TD. Cason also saved a long TD run in the fourth quarter, hunting down UNC tailback Ronnie McGill from behind after he had broken free for 49 yards.

As a redshirt freshman in 2002, Cason started 10 of the 11 games he played in, making 47 tackles, 34 solo, and recording three interceptions and eight pass break-ups. In addition to his defensive duties, Cason returned seven kickoffs for the Tribe and led the squad with an averaged of 28.1 yards per kickoff return.

In perhaps his best individual performance with the Tribe, Cason earned A-10 Rookie of the Week Honors after making eight tackles, intercepting a pass and blocking a field goal against JMU in 2002.

**Take It Away:** One of the major reasons the Tribe was able to compete so successfully at UNC was four caused turnovers,

all in the first half, by the defense, which included three fumble recoveries and an interception. Even more important was the timing of a couple of the turnovers.

Travis McLaurin recovered a fumble on the Tar Heels' opening possession after a 25-yard pass completion, while corner **Alan Wheeling** forced a fumble at the W&M 1-yard line, saving what appeared to be a 48-yard UNC TD run.

The other two turnovers came on Cason's forced fumble and defensive lineman **Wade Harrell's** third career interception. Harrell tipped an attempted screen pass, corralled it and rumbled 37 yards to the UNC 2-yard line, which set up a 21-yard FG and 24-14 halftime lead.

The last time the W&M defense forced four turnovers in a game was at Indiana in the 2002 season-opener.

**The Last Line:** Junior safety **James Miller** had a career day at UNC, making 15 tackles on the afternoon, including eight unassisted stops out of the secondary. He was "James on the Spot" early in the first quarter, recovering a UNC fumble on the W&M 1-yard line and later adding a pass break-up.

Going back to the second half of the 2003 season, Miller has begun to emerge as one of the Tribe's top defensive contributors. Dating back to the Oct. 18 contest against JMU, Miller has recorded at least seven tackles in six consecutive games, including three double-digit games (JMU, 11, 10/18/03; URI, 10, 10/25/03; UNC, 15, 9/4/04).

Here is a quick look at Miller's last six games:

- vs. JMU 10/18/03 - 11 total tackles, fumble recovery, one tackle for loss.
- at URI 10/25/03 - 10 total tackles, two for loss.
- vs. Hofstra 11/1/03 - nine total tackles.
- vs. UNH 11/15/03 - nine total tackles, two for loss.
- at Richmond 11/22/03 - seven total tackles, two interceptions, including a 77-yard INT return for a TD.
- at UNC 9/4/04 - 15 total tackles, fumble recovery, pass break-up.

**A Tall Order:** Going up against the Tar Heels' Division I-A offensive line created some size mismatches for the Tribe in areas, with the exception being 6-7 defensive end **Adam O'Connor**. The Tribe defense received an outstanding effort against the



Tar Heels from O'Connor, who along with Jonas Watson, recorded the only sack of the game. The 6-7 O'Connor applied a consistent pass rush on the afternoon, resulting in the sack and an additional two quarterback hurries. He added another tackle for loss and was credited with three total stops in the game.

**More on Kuehn's Kicking:** Kuehn made 13 of 18 field-goal attempts in 2003 and converted all 30 of his PAT attempts. He led the league and ranked eighth nationally with 1.3 field goals per game and ranked sixth in the A-10 in overall scoring with 6.9 points per game.

When looking at the place kicking position for the College, there is certainly a legacy of success under Jimmie Laycock. In the previous 12 seasons W&M has been in the A-10, a Tribe kicker has earned all-conference honors of some variety in seven of those years. Steve Christie (1989) and Brett Sterba (1999) have garnered All-America recognition at the position in recent years.

Two seasons into his collegiate career, Kuehn's accomplishments already rank him amongst the College's best at his position, as he has converted 28 of his 41 career attempts (.683). With 27 field goals in his first two seasons, Kuehn trailed only Brett Sterba's 28 between 1998-99 for the most by a Tribe kicker in his first two seasons as a starter.

An NFL veteran, Christie holds the school record for career field goals with 57, accumulated between the 1986 and 1989 seasons. Only two other players have kicked all four seasons in a Tribe uniform: Brian Shallcross (1993-97) and Brian Morris (1982-85).

**A Tradition of QBs:** With **Lang Campbell** earning third-team all-conference honors in 2003, it marked the sixth consecutive season that a W&M quarterback earned all-conference recognition of some kind. In fact, a Tribe signal caller has garnered all-conference accolades in 10 of the 12 seasons that W&M has been in the Atlantic 10.

**Preseason All-Conference Awards:** All-American candidate **Lang Campbell**, linebacker **Travis McLaurin** and tight end **Adam Bratton** all earned preseason first team All-Atlantic 10 honors, while specialists **Greg Kuehn** and **Mike Mesi**

each garnered second-team honors.

Campbell, a co-captain, led the league in passing yards per game (229.6) and pass efficiency (152.1) in 2003, en route to third team all-conference accolades. McLaurin was also a third-team A-10 selection last year, after making 120 tackles and recording three sacks, an interception and a fumble recovery. Bratton saw action in all 10 games last season, making six starts, and caught seven passes for 77 yards.

Kuehn, a two-time all-conference performer, has led the Tribe in scoring each of the last two seasons, while Mesi averaged 41.2 yards per punt last season and had 14 kicks downed inside the opposition's 20-yard line, which earned him second team all-conference status.

**No Flags on the Play:** Discipline is certainly one trademark of Laycock's program, and 203 was no different as W&M was the least penalized team in the A-10 (50) and yielded the fewest penalty yards among conference schools (40.6 yards per game, 406 total penalty yards).

In fact, the Tribe had 17 fewer penalties and 87 less penalty yards than the next closest league opponent (Richmond, 67 for 493 yards).

Although they have played only one game, the Tribe ranks fourth in penalty yards per game (45.0) and has been penalized a league-low five times.

**Double Vision:** The W&M football roster features two sets of identical twins in **Trevor and Travis McLaurin** and **Corey and Craig Patterson**. Trevor McLaurin wears No. 52 and plays middle linebacker, while brother Travis sports jersey number 23 and plays tailback. Craig (No. 5) and Corey Patterson (No. 6) are both defensive backs.

**A-10 vs. Division I-A:** In addition to W&M's Sept. 4 battle in Chapel Hill, there are a conference-record tying eight games in 2004 featuring A-10 teams against I-A opponents. Atlantic 10 teams entered the 2004 campaign looking to knock off a I-A team for the third consecutive season, a feat that was accomplished for the first time since the 1998-2000 seasons, with New Hampshire's 35-24 win at Rutgers last week. Last year, two A-10 teams knocked off I-A opponents, as Delaware

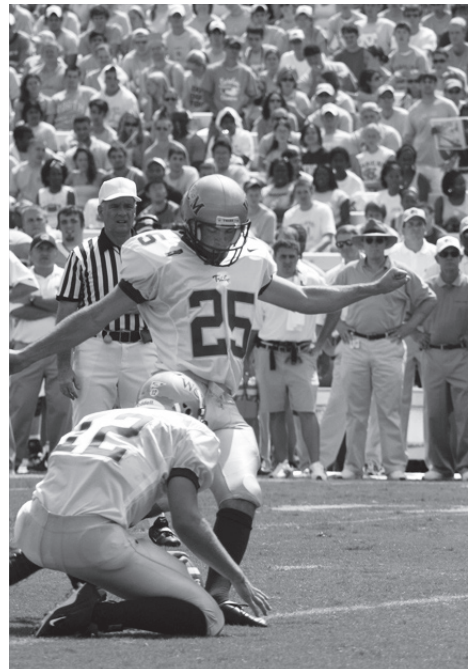

Campbell had the Divison I-A North Carolina defense on its "heels" most of the afternoon, throwing for a career-high 322 yards and two TDs, including a 46-yard strike to Lustig to open the scoring. Lustig hauled in a career-best 112 yards on six catches. Campbell added a pair of rushing TDs in the first half and **Greg Kuehn** booted a 21-yard FG as time expired, as the Tribe built a 10-point halftime lead.

**Stephen Cason** and **Alan Wheeling** each forced a fumble in the first half, **Travis McLaurin** recovered two fumbles in the first half, including one he returned 33 yards and **Wade Harrell** returned his third-career interception 37 yards to set up Kuehn's FG, as W&M forced four turnovers in a game for the first time since 2002 (IU). **James Miller**, who also recovered a fumble, led the Tribe with 15 tackles.

**Dominique Thompson**, a NC native, caught six passes for 83 yards and a TD, while **Jon Smith** added a 2-yard TD run.

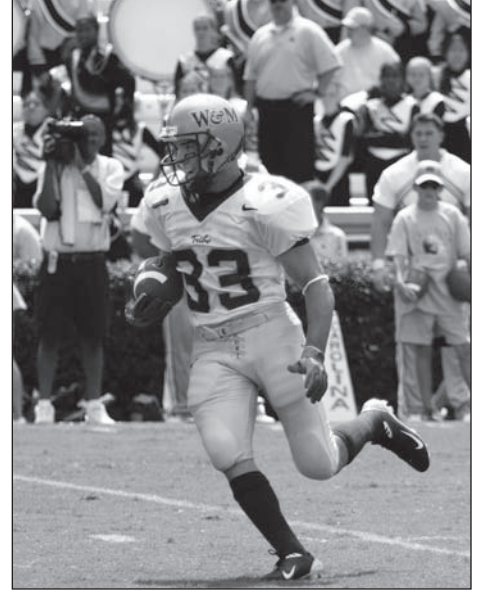
