New York July 8. 1790.

I wrote you on the 29th June informing you a bill
had passed the Senate for removing the government to
Philadelphia for ten years & then to George town. it
has not yet passed the lower house, but there re-
-mains not a doubt but that it will pass tomorrow
or the next day. The object of that & this letter
& others which I shall still send is to determine
the sending my furniture to Philadelphia instead
of New York if it be not too late. Besides the saving
of expence, it will save a great deal of embarras-
-ment at the custom houses. I had supposed the
packet would not sail till the 12th. I am now sud-
-denly informed she sails this afternoon. I have
therefore not a moment to add more than as-
-surances of the sincere attachment of D. S.
