Tribe Head Coach JIMMYE LAYCOCK

Each week during the season, W&M coach **Jimmye Laycock** participates in the Atlantic 10 teleconference to discuss the team's most recent performance and its upcoming game. Here's an excerpt of Laycock's comments from this week's teleconference:

1. What were you able to accomplish on the unexpected bye week?

A: I don't know if we were able to accomplish anything. Hopefully the players got their minds straight and rested a little bit. I gave them the weekend off and gave them a chance to go home. Football-wise, I don't know if we took a step forward or a step back. I'll see how that goes this week

2. Was the mental aspect your biggest concern of the time off?

A: I thought we were doing pretty well. In fact, last Tuesday's practice was one of our better ones of the year. We had a real good practice and then we found out that the game wasn't going to be played, so we had to regroup. Obviously our players were disappointed in not playing their home opener. I really don't know how all of that will play out. We'll see this week.

3. How much were you affected by the storm, in relation to football operations?

A: It was okay. It was different. It was not a normal game week preparation, but I don't know what is anymore. You improvise, you do what you have to do and just go from there.

4. Were your staff and players surprised at the news of the cancellation?

A: I would say yes and no. Yes, we were surprised, but the way things had been going, every time you turned around, things were changing. I told them that I couldn't tell them what would happen next. Normally I like to be pretty organized and on top of things, but circumstances dictated the fact that things were going to change. We had to move on.

5. What is your reaction to the resolution of the cancellation by the league?

A: Personally, everything considered, it was probably a fair resolution. I wasn't involved in the call, but from what I gather, it was probably a fair resolution.

6. What logistical problems would have prevented the game from being played in Richmond?

A: I wasn't involved in that decision-making at all. I was busy getting the football team ready. I trust in our administration and that was the decision that was made. I went on and did my job.

7. What do you need to do defensively to get better?

A: We need to do a lot of things. Stop the run. Stop the pass. Create turnovers. There are a lot of things we need to do, and we need to do them in a hurry after looking at the tape on Delaware. We're not consistent at all right now. We're playing some young people, and that's part of it. We have to be fundamentally better. We have to react to the throwing game better. We have to play more consistently. We aren't playing like a championship team needs to play. We need to make some improvements. I don't know how far we can go. Time will tell. For us to compete in this league like we need to, we have to improve a great deal.

8. What are your thoughts on the play of sophomore linebacker Travis McLaurin?

A: I've been pretty pleased with him, as have his coaches. We went into the season not sure about the other linebacker spot opposite [senior all-conference performer] Paul Carpenter, but Travis caught everyone's eye with his consistent and aggressive play. He still has a lot to learn at the position, but he plays hard and with a great deal of intensity. He knows how to compete and he's going to get better. I'm really pleased with him.

9. What are your thoughts on Delaware's play this year?

A: They're off to a great start. They're playing very well. They're doing a great job offensively. They have the ability to throw it all over the place, but they have good toughness with their running game, too. Defensively, they're really playing hard. They're playing with a lot of aggressiveness and they're playing consistently on defense. That's causing them to get off to a great start and play very well.

Coming Out Party: Speedy redshirt freshman tailback Delmus Coley (pictured above) was the Tribe's leading rusher at Northeastern, slashing out 70 yards on just nine attempts (7.8 yards per attempt). Through three games, he is the team's leading ball carrier, with 117 yards on 20 attempts. Current backfield mate, junior Jon Smith, was the last Tribe frosh to lead the squad in rushing, when he turned the trick in the 2000 season by running for 712 yards.

Able Stable: Three different players have led the team in rushing through the season's first three games – tailback Steven Hargrove (58 yards vs. Western Michigan), quarterback Lang Campbell (52 yards vs. VMI) and tailback Delmus Coley (70 yards vs. Northeastern). Starting tailback Jon Smith and Hargrove were the only two players to lead the team in rushing last season, with Smith leading the way seven of the 11 games. The last time W&M had three different players lead the team on consecutive weeks was over the final three weeks of the 2001 season when quarterback Dave Corley, tailback Komlan Lonergan and Smith traded the honors.

Mesi's Magic: Junior punter Mike Mesi's left foot has been nothing short of magical over the first three games of 2003. He is currently second in the conference with an average of nearly 43 yards an attempt (42.4 over 17 attempts). But it hasn't been just the distance that has been impressive — it is also his pinpoint accuracy, which has been witnessed by his six punts downed inside opponent's 20-yard lines. Of his six inside the 20, three of those have been inside the 10.

Mesi has earned the coaching staff's Special Teams Player of the Week honor for the past two weeks, including sharing the honor with placekicker **Greg Kuehn** for the VMI game.

Pressure People: In the preseason, one of the stated goals of the Tribe's defensive scheme for 2003 was to improve its pass rush, and through three games, the unit has made strides towards making that a reality by recording 10 quarterback takedowns and 13 hurries. In comparison, the 2002 unit recorded 16 sacks in 11 games. Towering sophomore **Adam O'Connor**, who stands six-foot-six, currently leads the team with a pair of sacks for –15 yards and five QB hurries. After O'Connor, eight different Tribe players have recorded at least one sack on the year.

Late Openers: With the cancellation of the scheduled home opener against Maine last weekend, W&M's first home game will come on Oct. 11 against Massachusetts. That marks the third-latest home opener in history for W&M, and the latest since 1975, when the Tribe also began on Oct. 11. The latest home opener in school history was in 1954, when the College's first game on Cary Field was Nov. 13 against West Virginia. The last time that W&M didn't have a home game until October was in 1987, when the Tribe christened its home slate with a 28-27 win over Lehigh on Oct. 3.

Like Old Times: In its long and storied football history, W&M has played a 10-game schedule on 26 different occasions. The Tribe hasn't had a 10-game regular season slate since 1969, but that will change this year, as the cancellation of the game against Maine means that W&M will play just 10 regular season games this year.

Starting Early: When true freshman offensive lineman Cody Morris made the start at right guard vs. Northeastern on Sept. 20, he became the first freshman lineman to start a game since at least 1980 and the start of head coach Jimmye Laycock's tenure at W&M. Earlier in the season, when Morris stepped onto the field in the team's season opener at Western Michigan, he became the first true freshman to see any game action whatsoever on the offensive line for W&M since the 1982 season. Ironically, the last W&M player to step into the trenches as a freshman on the offensive line was Morris' current position coach, Bob Solderitch (1982 vs. Miami (OH)).

Starting Early II: While on the note of players starting careers on the playing field, as the team prepares to take the field against Delaware this Saturday a total of 28 of the team's 44 available positions on the two-deep are manned by freshman and sophomores.



When the Tribe leads by 10 or more points in a contest, head coach Jimmye Laycock's troops win nearly 93 percent of the time.

On Point: If William and Mary goes up by 10 points during a game, the Tribe wins almost 93 percent of the time. When holding a 10-point lead, W&M's record under head coach Jimmye Laycock is an incredible 132-10-1 (.927). For comparison, Pittsburgh Steelers coach Bill Cowher's team has gone 78-2-1 (.969) in games in which they led by 10 or more points, one of the top marks in the National Football League.

On the Road Again: William and Mary's trip to Delaware this weekend marks the fourth consecutive road game for the Tribe. The last time that W&M had four-straight road games was in 1986, when the Tribe went 3-1 on a stretch that included a 41-37 win over Virginia. W&M has started a season with at least four straight road games seven other times, the most recent being in 1975, when the Tribe lost all four games. Overall, in the seven years that W&M has started with four road games, its record in those contests is a combined 11-15-2.

In the Zone: Despite an attack that features so many new faces, the Tribe offense has managed to turn its scoring opportunities into points. Through the first three games, the College has ventured inside the opponent's 20-yard line a total of six times and has turned all six into scores (four touchdowns and two field goals).

Quick Start for Campbell: Junior quarterback Lang Campbell has experienced immediate success as a starter for the Tribe, tossing eight touchdown passes in his first three games. In comparison, here are Tribe great Dave Corley, Jr.'s number in his first three starts of each of his four seasons with the Tribe.

2002 -59 of 105 for 797 yards, 6 TD 2001 - 50 of 82 for 643 yards, 6 TD 2000 - 43 of 73 for 671 yards, 4 TD 1999 - 46 of 71 for 763 yards, 9 TD

Campbell - 43 of 78 for 523 yards, 8 TD

Don't Count Rich Out: Senior wideout Rich Musinski has 14 catches for 204 yards and a touchdown this season. While those are solid numbers, some may have expected more out of the All-America candidate. But when looking at Musinski's numbers from last year at this time, it shows that he is on a similar pace thus far, and last year, he finished with 58 catches for 1,140 yards and nine scores.

Against the Blue Hens: The Tribe is looking for its third-straight win against Delaware, which would mark only the second time in the series history that W&M has won three consecutive against UD. W&M also won three in a row from 1984-86. The longest streak in the series is a five

consecutive wins by Delaware, spanning from 1976-83. Several Tribe players have had strong games against UD in the past, highlighted by senior wide receiver **Rich Musinski**, who has racked up 17 receptions for 365 yards and four TDs in three meetings against the Blue Hens. Also, senior wideout **Danny Wade** caught a scoring pass in the 2000 contest. In last year's W&M win, placekicker **Greg Kuehn** had a 13-point day, with three field goals and four PATs. And senior corner **Billy Parker** clinched the win for the Tribe with a 41-yard interception return for a touchdown.

Special Success: A highlight in the Tribe's 1-2 start has been the play of specialists **Greg Kuehn** and **Mike Mesi** at kicker and punter, respectively. The pair of all-conference candidates are among the league and national leaders in their kicking categories. Kuehn is tied for the conference lead and ranked 18th in the nation with one field goal per game, and has made 75 percent of his field goals and all of his PAT kicks on the season. Mesi has been nothing short of spectacular at punter, ranking second in the league with an average of 42.4 yards per punt. That mark is good enough for 16th in the nation.

Getting on the Board: Under current head coach Jimmye Laycock, William and Mary has been very successful when being the first team to score. W&M's record under Laycock is 111-31-1 (.780) when putting points on the scoreboard before the opposition.

High School Connections: The Tribe's lone player from California, guard Ryan Lumm, attended Santa Margarita High School in Mission Viejo with UD freshman Brandt "Bubba" Jespersen. Tribe twins Travis and Trevor McLaurin hail from Wilmington, DE's McKean High School, as does Delaware redshirt freshman quarterback Terry Kelly. W&M freshman quarterback Mike Potts was an all-state signalcaller at Middletown High School in Middletown, DE, the alma mater of Brett Wharton, a UD linebacker.


