Musinski Versus the Huskies

William and Mary is 2-0 against NU in Rich Musinski's career with the Tribe. Musinski caught four passes for 75 yards in a 26-15 win over Northeastern in 2000. The two squads didn't meet in Musinski's sophomore year of 2001, but last year, Musinski had an outstanding game. Before a Homecoming crowd at Zable Stadium, Musinski had six catches for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 30-13 win over nationally-ranked NU.

Each week during the season, W&M coach **Jimmye Laycock** participates in the Atlantic 10 teleconference and gives his thoughts on the Tribe's most recent performance, plus a look ahead at the squad's next game. Here's an excerpt of Laycock's comments from this week's teleconference:

1. What are your thoughts on the Tribe's 34-24 win over VMI last weekend?

A: VMI played well. They had a lot of experience on offense. They played very hard. They executed well and it took us awhile to get in a rhythm offensively. We were sporadic. We were good in spots and bad in spots. We came up with some big plays on defense that allowed us to hang in there and stay ahead of them. Fortunately we were able to hang in there and win it in the end. We have a lot of things that we have to work on.

2. Why did you think the offense was out of sync a little bit against VMI?

A: I think it's just a matter of getting some more experience out there. [Junior quarterback] Lang [Campbell] did fine. But we're really thin at the offensive line and real inexperienced. We had an injury early when [senior starting guard] Steve Stocki, one of our experienced players, went out after only about six or eight plays. We ended up playing a true freshman for most of the game. We were just kind of hanging on up front. We had a tough time moving and picking up the stunts, but I thought Lang did a good job and made some nice reads. They were doing a good job defensively doubling up on [senior WR and All-American candidate] Rich [Musinski]. They really tried to take him away.

3. What kind of shape, physically, is the offensive line in for the Northeastern game?

A: Only being Monday, it's a little tough to tell, but it doesn't look great right now. We knew coming into the season that we were thin and inexperienced up front. We don't know whether [starting sophomore center] Pat Mulloy or Stocki will be back. We're just going from day to day and trying to get better.

4. What did you like about your defensive play against the Keydets?

A: Well we came up with the big plays. Their quarterback was getting sacked and tried to throw the ball, but it was a lateral and it was a heads-up play by [sophomore linebacker Travis] McLaurin. He was alert enough to pick it up and run and score. And then [senior all-conference CB] Billy Parker had a nice interception to set up a score for us later in the game. McLaurin also blocked

field goal [in the first quarter] and that was big, as well. We did some good things there, but we didn't tackle very well at times. But coming up with the big plays were very important.

5. What are your thoughts on Northeastern?

A: Well they're obviously a very good football team. They have just about everybody back from last year's team, and playing at their place is tough. They're a very physical team and they run very well. They're just a very good, physical football team that knows how to win. We have to go on the road for the third-straight week and play hard and see how things go.

6. Do you have to worry just about Northeastern's schemes or do you also have to consider the group of running backs that they have?

A: Well you have to worry about them because they all bring something to the table. There's no drop-off, but just a different style. But when you have that big offensive line in front of you, as a defense, you're more worried about taking those blocks on and getting off blocks rather than what type of back you're facing. They have a good offensive line and good diversity in the backfield.

7. What are your thoughts on Northeastern linebacker Liam Ezekiel?

A: I thought he played very well against us last year. He can make plays from sideline to sideline. He just knows how to play the game. He has great instincts. He comes off blocks extremely well. It's hard to get a good, solid block on him. He does a great job for them at inside linebacker.

Doing It All: Sophomore tailback **Steven Hargrove** (pictured above) played another solid game against VMI, and in the process, retained his spot atop the Atlantic 10's all-purpose yardage chart. Hargrove has averaged 176.0 all-purpose yards per game to lead the conference. Against the Keydets, he had a 48-yard catch and run for a touchdown, his third receiving TD of the season.

Was That Lang or Earl Campbell?: Tribe junior quarterback **Lang Campbell** threw three touchdown passes for the second-straight game, but it was on his feet that Campbell made an equally big impact against the Keydets. Campbell led the squad in both attempts (17) and yards (52), while he had 86 positive yards before yardage lost on sacks was counted. Also, five of the Tribe's eight rushing first downs were from the legs of Campbell.

In the Clutch: While W&M was just five of 16 on third-down conversions, two of the Tribe's successful plays on that down were the key plays in eventual scoring drives. With the Tribe down 10-3 and facing a 3rd and 22 at its own 19-yard line, quarterback **Lang Campbell** found junior wideout **John Pitts** across the middle for a 27-yard gain to prolong a drive that ended in a 10-yard pass to **Danny Wade** to tie the game. Also, in the fourth quarter, with W&M up 31-24 and VMI desperately trying to get the ball back, the Tribe had a 3rd and 10 at its own 37-yard line. Senior fullback **Nick Rogers** got the handoff and ran up the middle for a 16-yard gain that put the squad in position for kicker **Greg Kuehn** to hit a 47-yard field goal that iced the game for W&M.

Running Backs Galore: With VMI keying on the Tribe's one-two punch of **Jon Smith** and **Steven Hargrove** whenever either got the ball

in the backfield, W&M had to look to other sources to gain yardage on the ground. While Smith and Hargrove were held to 36 yards on 14 carries, senior fullback **Nick Rogers**, redshirt freshman tailback **Delmus Coley** and junior quarterback **Lang Campbell** picked up the slack. Campbell led W&M with 52 yards, including 86 positive yards before losses from sacks were added in. Coley had the team's top average with 28 yards on just four carries. Rogers, meanwhile, had 26 yards on four carries, including a key third-down conversion in the fourth quarter. For his efforts, Rogers was named as the coaching staff's Offensive Player of the Week.

Special Teams Success Stories: In a close game, special teams can often make the difference as to whether a team gets the win or not. W&M's strong special teams play on Saturday against VMI certainly helped the team to victory. Sophomore placekicker **Greg Kuehn** and junior punter **Mike Mesi** were each very good on the wet surface at Alumni Memorial Field. Mesi avoided a big rush nearly every time he punted to average 43.2 yards on six punts. He also pinned the Keydets inside their own 20-yard line three times, including twice inside the VMI six-yard line. Kuehn made both of his field goals and all four of his PAT attempts to stay perfect on the year (3-3 FG, 7-7 PAT). Also, the Tribe got a big momentum change when VMI's attempt to break a scoreless tie in the first quarter was thwarted by sophomore **Travis McLaurin**, who blocked Matt Sharpe's 40-yard field goal attempt.

Making An Impact: While he did not match his previous week's total of 14 tackles, sophomore linebacker **Travis McLaurin** proved that he is a big-play performer on at least two separate oc-

casions against VMI. With the game scoreless in the first quarter, McLaurin blocked a field goal, the first of his career. Then, on just the third play of the second half, McLaurin broke up a 10-10 tie with a 28-yard fumble recovery in which he alertly realized that an errant pass by VMI's Jonathan Wilson had been a backwards lateral. McLaurin picked the ball up and ran untouched into the end zone, giving the Tribe a 24-17 advantage.

Making An Impact (Part II): Despite having just one catch, redshirt freshman **Matt Trinkle** made one of the biggest plays of the game, as he hauled in a two-yard pass from quarterback **Lang Campbell** with just over nine minutes left in the fourth quarter to put W&M up for good at 31-24.

Billy's Getting the Ball: Senior cornerback **Billy Parker** came to William and Mary as a true freshman and wanted to play offense. While the move to the defensive side of the ball has worked out very well for the All-America candidate, the Mechanicsville native has proven an ability to get his hands on the ball from his spot in the secondary, as well. Against Western Michigan, Parker had a 27-yard return of a fumble recovery. He followed that up with a clutch interception against VMI that he ran back for 33 yards to put the Tribe in position for Greg Kuehn's 47-yard field goal that clinched the win.

At a Loss: William and Mary's defense did an excellent job of getting past the VMI offensive line to stop plays, as the Tribe was credited with three sacks and 10 tackles for loss in the victory. Leading the way was senior defensive end **Donté Lewis**, who had three TFLs among his six tack-

les. Redshirt freshman linebacker **Ryan Nickell** recorded his first career sack in the contest.

There's a First Time for Everything: Three Tribe players started for the first time in their careers against VMI. Sophomore defensive end **Adam O'Connor** came through with two tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in his first start. O'Connor earned the coaching staff's Defensive Player of the Week honor for his efforts. Redshirt freshman **Alan Wheeling** started at one cornerback position, and junior wideout **Josh Lustig** got the nod at one of the wide receiver spots.

Hitting the Road: W&M opens the season with three consecutive road games, starting with the September 6 game at Western Michigan, then last week's contest at VMI and finishing up with this Saturday's game at Northeastern. In the 14 years it which it started with three straight road games, W&M's record is 4-8-2 in the third game. Under current head coach Jimmye Laycock, W&M's record is 0-2 in that situation.

High School Teammates: William and Mary junior defensive tackle **Mike McCarthy** attended Mechanicsburg, PA's Cumberland Valley High School with Northeastern junior tight end Kevin Lawlor. W&M linebacker **Chris Ndubueze** was a teammate of NU linebacker Rold Louis and running back Anthony Riley at DeMatha High School in Maryland. Gaithersburg High School in Gaithersburg, MD is the alma mater of NU's Richard Orah and W&M's **Richard Riley** and **John Jacobs**.

A-10 Accolades: William and Mary was well-represented on the Atlantic 10's preseason all-conference squads, led by the senior trio of wideout **Rich Musinski** and defensive backs **Marques Bobo** and **Billy Parker**. The three players all earned first-team citations, and were among five W&M players selected.

Joining those three on the all-conference squad were second team picks **Jon Smith** at tailback and **Paul Carpenter** at linebacker.

In addition to the individual selections, the league also announced its preseason standings picks, and W&M was picked seventh in the 11-team league. The Tribe can take solace in the fact that since the Atlantic 10 adopted a one-division format in 1999, a team predicted seventh or lower has claimed at least a share of the league title in each of the past four years. Last year, Northeastern won the league after being tabbed as the 10th best team in the league in the preseason.

Good Company: Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, who is in his 24th year as the W&M leader, ranks third among all current Division I-A and Division I-AA head coaches in terms of

most years at their current school. The two coaches ahead of him are Penn State's Joe Paterno (37 years) and Florida State's Bobby Bowden (26 years).

Rich's Rewards: Senior wideout **Rich Musinski** has earned a number of citations this spring, including preseason All-America honors from The Sports Network, Don Hansen's Football Gazette and I-AA.org. Also, Musinski was named as one of the 16 players to watch for the Walter Payton Award, which goes to the top player in Division I-AA football. In addition, he was a first-team all-conference selection at wide receiver.

Musinski is the Tribe's all-time leader in receiving yards (3,434). He now needs 18 catches to break Dave Conklin's school record for receptions. Coming into his final fall with the Tribe, Musinski has several conference and national marks within reach. Musinski is seventh in NCAA I-AA history with an average of 95.4 receiving yards per game in his career. In 36 career games, Musinski has reached the 100-yard receiving mark 17 times, just seven shy of Jerry Rice's I-AA record of 24 100-yard games. With 511 more receiving yards this season, Musinski will become the Atlantic 10's all-time leader in receiving yards.

Musinski's selection to the Payton Watch List marks the second-consecutive year that a Tribe player has been on the list, as graduated quarterback Dave Corley, Jr. made the list last season.

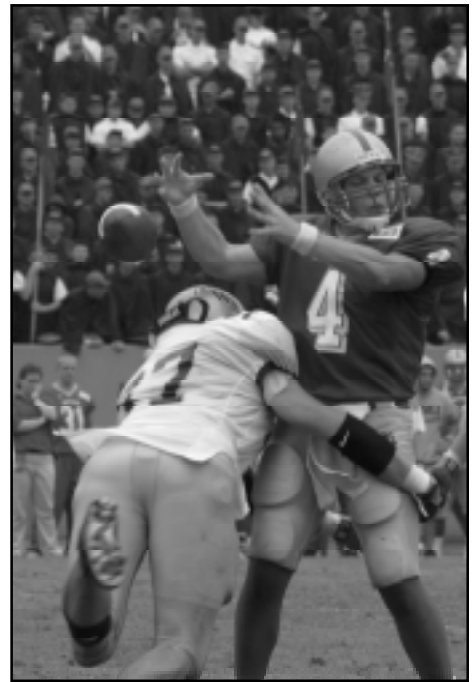
