

Tribe Head Coach JIMMYE LAYCOCK

Each week during the season, W&M coach **Jimmye Laycock** participates in the Atlantic 10 teleconference and gives his thoughts on the Tribe's most recent performance, plus a look ahead at the squad's next game.

1. Can you talk about the win over UNH?

A: I saw a lot of things I liked. Offensively, I thought we were very balanced and did a pretty good job of moving the ball. Defensively, we looked good. We need to be a little more consistent in certain areas, but coming off of the open date, playing against a very good and physical New Hampshire team, I was pleased with the way we played.

2. Do you think you'd have more wins this year if the team would have been performing at its current level early in the season, or was that more of a case of the teams you were playing at that time?

A: I think we're playing better, and I think it's a mark of a younger team that we're improving as the season goes on and players are gaining more experience. I think our guys have really done a good job working at it and continuing to improve.

3. Can you comment on the improvements that Lang Campbell has been making at QB?

A: Well, Lang's been playing pretty well all year. When he makes a mistake, he learns from it and usually doesn't repeat it. He's been pretty good every game. He really is very comfortable with our offense and does a very good job out there. The key is to get the people around him playing well, too. He's been helped by the improved play on the offensive line.

4. What is the injury status of [redshirt freshman tailback] Delmus Coley?

A: He had knee surgery yesterday and he is out for this weekend's game.

5. What is [senior All-American WR] Rich Musinski's health situation?

A: He hurt himself [left hamstring] early in the second quarter and basically only played the first quarter. He had 117 yards and a touchdown in the first quarter and he's day-to-day. We'll see how he progresses later in the week.

6. What does the absence of Coley do for your tailback rotation?

A: We'll see how Jon Smith is this week. He probably could have played Saturday, but hopefully he's getting better [from a high ankle sprain suffered four weeks ago at URI]. [Sophomore tailback] Steven Hargrove will be back in the rotation, and I thought Trevor McLaurin did a pretty good job last week.

7. Can you talk about Trevor McLaurin's three-touchdown performance vs. URI?

A: We pressed him into duty last week [with all the injuries] and when he got in at tailback, he looked good so we kept giving him the ball. He did a pretty nice job in there.

8. What are your thoughts on the game with Richmond?

A: It's always a big game for us. It's a rivalry. It's a lot of excitement for our alumni. It's always a very physical game. We're just going to work hard and try to get better this week.

W&M and Richmond have met on the football field every year since the 1944 season, and this year will mark the 60th-consecutive season that the game has been played.

For Old Times' Sake: Saturday's game is the 113th meeting between William and Mary and Richmond in the latest installment of the Oldest Rivalry in the South. William and Mary leads the all-time series, 57-50-5. The first meeting between the in-state rivals was in 1898, when Richmond shut out W&M, 15-0. The Spiders defeated the Tribe, 35-13, in last year's game.

Storied Rivalry: Only three other Division I-AA series have a longer history than that of William and Mary vs. Richmond. In fact, the Spiders and the Tribe have met just as many times as the longest I-A series, Minnesota vs, Wisconsin. Saturday's game will be the 113th between the two squads. Here is a look at the longest series in Division I:

What's at Stake?: A few interesting scenarios could be in store for the Tribe faithful on Saturday. The following is a quick look at what is on the horizon:

With a Win ... The College will not only secure its 17th non-losing season in the 24 years that Head Coach Jimmye Laycock has been on the sidelines, but it will also perpetuate Laycock's remarkable achievement of never having a sub-.500 mark in his 11 years in the very difficult Atlantic 10 Football conference. The next closest team in the conference, over the same span, is Delaware, with two losing records (which have each come over the last two seasons prior to 2003).

With 430 Total Yards ... the College will have averaged better than 384 yds per game for the season, marking the 14th-straight year Laycock's squad has accomplished the feat. To average an even 400 for the year, the Tribe will have to record an improbable 584 total yards. Last season, W&M managed just 239 total yards vs. Richmond.

With Three TD Passes ... W&M QB Lang Campbell will push his season total to 23 and move into third place on the College's all-time single season record books. One more would put him into a tie for seventh second place (with Dave Corley, Jr., 2001-02), while two more would.

With 100 yards Receiving ... Tribe All-American receiver Rich Musinski will end his career with a remarkable 22 career 100-yard games in 44 career starts. If he were able to bring in 188 yards, he would break the 1,000-yard mark for the season and be the only player in school history with three 1,000-yard seasons to his credit.

Magnificent Musinski: With one game remaining in his storied collegiate career, Tribe All-American WR **Rich Musinski** owns every major receiving record in the College's books. The following are some cliff notes of what he has accomplished to this point, and what records are just on the horizon.

• Leads the A-10 in receptions game (6.33) and is 15^{th} nationally

• Second in A-10 in reception yards per game (90.22) and is 20th nationally

• Fourth in league in TD receptions (seven)

More on the 2003 season: No Tribe receiver has ever led the league in receptions per game ... Would need to bring in 10 receptions vs. Richmond to set the school's single-season mark in category (record is 6.7 set by Chuck Albertson in 1966) ... Averaging better than six catches (6.43), 94.0 yards and one TD per game in league play this season ... Has been over 100-yards in receiving five of nine games, including three of the last four ... Has had eight or more receptions in four of nine games.

Counting on Campbell: Junior Tribe QB **Lang Campbell** continued his bid for all-conference honors by posting his sixth-straight 200-yard plus passing afternoon vs. UNH, throwing for 276 yards on 18 completions in 29 attempts in the College's 38-28 win over the Wildcats.

Over that same six-game span, Campbell is averaging 258 yards per game in the air and over 290 yards of total offense per contest.

Certainly, Campbell's all-conference case is made much stronger when you look at the numbers he's put up against A-10 competition. Campbell is averaging 274.1 total yards a game, 246.6 passing yards and has a 154.2 QB efficiency rating in seven league games, figures which all lead the league.

Perhaps the most impressive portion of his game has been his uncanny accuracy. Campbell has completed 166 of his 262 attempts on the year (63.4 %). Since throwing his second of two interceptions vs. Northeastern in the final drive of the third quarter in the season's third game, Campbell has completed a remarkable 67 percent of his passes over the next 21 quarters (105of 157) since, with only two interceptions balanced against 11 TD passes.

His 274-yard outing vs. URI marked the end of four straight weeks in which he threw for better than 250 yards, a feat not accomplished by a Tribe quarterback since the 1990 season when 2004 W&M Hall of Fame Inductee Chris Hakel surpassed the 250-yard barrier five straight time between the season's sixth and 10th games

His command of the Tribe's attack is quantified by the fact that he averages completing passes to seven different receivers per game. This is in spite of the fact that he has one of the premier go-to players in the conference in All-American wideout Rich Musinski.

Not just a one-dimensional player, Campbell also is the squad's second-leading rusher from scrimmage on the season, gaining 369 yards on 55 attempts. His net rushing total on the season is reduced to 259 when yards lost on sacks are factored in (-110 yards on 17 sacks).

Overall, Campbell comes into Saturday's contest with Richmond, leading the A-10 in QB efficiency rating (149.7) and ranked second in passing yards per game (230.4), total offense (259.2 yards per game) and TD to INT ratio 2.9 to 1 (20 to 7), while his 20 touchdown passes ranks third. Campbell's QB efficiency ranking ranks seventh nationally and his 259.2 yards per game in total offense ranks 17th.

Campbell in a Nut Shell: The following is a brief look at what could be ahead for Campbell as far as W&M single-season records are concerned:



10th-place on completions list (10th-place currently held by Chris Garrity, 186 in 1981).

• Three more TD passes will move him into a third place tie (with two others, most recently Kenny Lambiotte in 1986).

• Currently ranks sixth all-time with a .634 completion percentage

• Vying to become the sixth W&M QB to win the league's efficiency title since W&M joined the conference 11 years ago.

More on Campbell: A W&M QB has earned allconference recognition of some kind in each of the past five seasons, and nine of the 11 years the College has been in the A-10 conference ... The Tribe's record for TD passes by a first-year starter is currently held by Kenny Lambiotte, who threw 23 in 11 games during the 1986 season.

Disappointment for Delmus: The Tribe's 38-28 win over New Hampshire was tempered by an injury to standout redshirt freshman Delmus Coley. Coley most likely ended his season after injuring his knee on what was the game's most decisive play. With the Tribe clinging to a 31-28 lead late in the fourth quarter, the College was faced with a fourth and inches at the New Hampshire 45-yard line and called Coley's number on a toss sweep. Coley rose to the challenge and shrugged off a would-be tackler behind the line of scrimmage and exploded down the left sideline for a game-breaking 43-yard run to the UNH one-yard line. Coley was injured when he was hit on his planted knee while carrying another defender towards the goal line.

The play moved Coley over the 100-yard rushing mark on the game, his third straight, as he ended with a game-high 122 yards on 22 carries.

Coley had stepped up into the featured role after an injury to junior starting tailback Jon Smith (high ankle sprain) three games ago vs. URI. The diminutive Virginia Beach native has hitched the Tribe's rushing attack to his 5-9, 195-pound frame over that span and has run for 359 yards on 68 carries (5.3 yards per carry).

With Smith in street clothes, and Hargrove hobbled, Coley was the featured back vs. Hofstra on an afternoon which saw the Tribe determined to establish a ground game. Sixty minutes and a career-high 25 carries later, Coley proved to be more than equal to the heavy load, as he ended the day with 133 yards and a pair of scores.

This performance came on the heels of a 24-carry, 104-yard effort vs. URI. His 24 carries vs. the Rams was more than twice the number of carries that any W&M back this season had carried the ball in any one game (Jon Smith 11, two times, last coming vs. JMU). Prior to the game with the Rams, Smith had been the last Tribe running back to go over the 100-yard mark, when he rushed for 192 yards vs. JMU in the 10th game of the 2002 season (seven games prior to the URI contest).

Despite the injury, Coley will likely still

end the season as the College's leader in rushing yards (488) and attempts (101). If he does finish the season as the College's leading rusher, he will become just the fourth freshman to lead the team in rushing in Laycock's 24 seasons as the head coach (joining Robert Green, 1988, Derek Fitzgerald, 1993 and Jon Smith, 2001).

Standing In: The Tribe's offense established a season best 544 total yards vs. UNH, including a season best 268 rushing yards. While this output is impressive on its own merit, the production is made even more impressive in light of the fact that the team's offense was without the services of Musinski for the final three quarters, and two other starters and a key reserve (WR Danny Wade, TB Jon Smith and TB Steven Hargrove). The quartet combined for 1,439 yards of total offense on the season (better than 42 percent of the team's total output).

The Tribe didn't miss a beat, due to the standout play of **Lang Campbell** and **Delmus Coley**. Also making major contributions were

TB **Trevor McLaurin** (three TDs, 36 rushing yards and 11 yards receiving) and WR **John Pitts**, who set a career-highs in catches (five) and yards (79), and TE Matt Trinkle (three catches for 36 yards).

Matching McLaurin's: W&M's pair of identical twins, Travis and Trevor McLaurin, have been making significant contributions to the Tribe's cause this seaoson. Travis, a linebacker, has been one of the league's leading tacklers (ranking fifth with an average of 11.6 tackles per game), while Trevor earned the league's Rookie of the Week honors with his three-TD performance vs. UNH. Travis earned the league's Defensive Player of the Week honors after his 13-tackle afternoon vs. UMass.

Rushing On: After averaging only slightly better than 110.0 yards per game through the first six contests, the Tribe's offensive attack has slashed out 667 yards on the ground over the past three games (268 vs. UNH, 203 vs. URI and 196 vs. Hofstra). This effort, powered by Coley's emergence, has improved the team's rushing average from a season-worst 110.0 (coming into the URI game), to a seasonbest 148.0 yards per game.

Since coming into the league in 1993, the Tribe's worst single season rushing average was 135.3, set last season (1,487 yards over 11 games).

On the Rise: Going hand-in-hand with the increased run-production, the Tribe's total offense figures have also improved dramatically over the past three games. Coming off the loss to James Madison (10/25), the team was averaging just 332.5 yards a game in total offense, a figure which was about 70 yards off the average Laycock's team's have posted in the same span (403.4 yards over 114 games since joining the conference in 1993).

In the three games since JMU, the College has improved its total offense average to 379.6 yards per game, an amazing 47-yard improvement. For the record, the Tribe's worst output of total yards since joining the conference is 357.5 (set in 1995).

If Campbell and the Tribe's passing attack can maintain its current average of 231.6 yards per game, it will mark the eighth-straight year that the College has averaged better then 210 yards per game in the air. The last time the College didn't average better than 210 yards passing over a season was in 1995 (160.5 yards per game).

Wave That Flag: Discipline is certainly one trademark of Laycock's program, and this season is no different as the College currently is tops in the league with the fewest penalties (46) and penalty yards (42.1 yards per game – 379 penalty yards).

In fact, the Tribe has 16 fewer penalties and 79 less yards than the next closest league opponent (Richmond, 62 for 458 yards.

Two the Point: William and Mary has converted four two-point conversions in five attempts on the season, the top mark in the league. The team's only miss on the year came vs. Northeastern, when a misfired extra-point snap resulted in a failed scramble by Lang Campbell.

Conversion Conversation: Despite suffering a very uncharacteristic pair of turnovers in the redzone vs. UNH, the College still converted three of its five chances inside the Wildcat's 20-yards line into decisive scores (two TDs, FG). The afternoon moved the College's red zone conversion percentage to a very respectable .800 on the season (24 of its 30 red zone chances; 15 TDs, nine FGs).

On the Mark: Going hand-in-hand with the College's success in the red zone has been the

accuracy and strength of Tribe kicker **Greg Kuehn** right leg. Kuehn has made 12 of 17 field goals and all 22 of his PAT attempts. He leads the league, and is 10th nationally, in field goals per game (1.33). Kuehn leads the Tribe, and is seventh in the league in scoring by averaging 6.44 points per game (58 total).

When looking at the place kicking position for the College, there is certainly a legacy of success under Jimmye Laycock. In the previous 10 seasons the College has spent in the A10, a Tribe kicker has earned all-conference honors of some variety in six of those years. Steve Christie (1989) and Brett Sterba (1999) have earned All-America recognition at the position in recent years.

Just 20 games into his collegiate career, Kuehn's accomplishments already rank him amongst the College's best at his position, as he has converted 26 of his 38 career attempts (.684). With one games still remaining in his sophomore season, Kuehn's 26 FGs trails only Brett Sterba's 28 (between 1998-99) for the most by a Tribe kicker in his first two seasons as the starting kicker. Percentage wise, his 68.4 percent success rate would be third, behind Brian Morris (21 of 27, 77.7 percent, 1982-83) and Sterba (29 of 38, 76.3 percent).

A current NFL kicker with San Diego, Christie holds the Tribe's school record for career field goals with 57, acccumulated between the 1986 and 1989 seasons. Only two other players have kicked for all four seasons in a Tribe uniform; Brian Shallcross (1995-97) and Brian Morris (1982-85).

Senior Citizen: After spending the better part of the last three seasons as a reserve, senior fullback Nick Rogers has started every game at fullback, making major contributions as a standout lead blocker and steady performer when his own number is called. Perhaps the team's most improved player, Rogers has proven to be one of the squad's most consistent ball carriers. He is currently third on the team in rushing yardage (236) and leads the team in yards per carry (5.0).

Putting his season accomplishments into perspective, coming into the year Rogers had a career rushing total of just 377 yards over 23 career games. He has already eclipsed his 11-game rushing total from a season ago (161 yards on 23 attempts) with one game remaining.

Wade Out: Much like Rogers, wideout Danny Wade had saved his best performance for last, as he was having a career year through the first eight games in his senior season. Unfortunately for the College, Wade's career is over, more-thanlikely, after he re-injured his shoulder on a diving reception in the team's Homecoming win over Hofstra. Fittingly, the catch went for 22 yards and a first down.

Currently, Wade is second on the team in

both receptions (29) and receiving yards (322). Both figures stand as career-highs for the Martinsville, VA native.

Wade hads been especially effective over the past four weeks, as he has brought down 20 receptions for 220 yards. One week after establishing a career-high both in catches and yards at fourth-ranked Delaware (seven receptions for 78 yards), Wade broke both marks against the seventh-ranked Minutemen by turning in an eight catch, 80-yard afternoon.

Coming into this year, Wade's career-best for receptions and yards in a season was 24 for 279 yards (set last year).

Talented Mr. Thompson: One player who the Tribe's coaching staff will look to step up into the void left by the injury to Wade will be athletic junior receiver Dominique Thompson. Thompson displayed his big-play ability on the team's first scoring play vs. Hofstra, as he reeled in a career long 51-yard TD spiral from Campbell, easily out striding the Pride's defensive back to the ball and end zone.

While the Durham, NC native has only four catches on the year, to this point, two have gone for scores (as he also pulled down an acrobatic eight-yard scoring catch in the College's home loss to James Madison.

An explosive athlete, with an outstanding burst off the line of scrimmage, Thompson is also one of the team's best special team's players. In addition to his TD catch, vs. the Pride, Thompson also contributed four special team's tackles. This came one week removed from his sparkling hustle play on punt coverage vs. URI, when he ran down a 61-yard rocket off the foot of Tribe punter Mike Mesi and downed it on the Rams one-yard line, pinning URI against its own goal line with less than five minutes to play and the College clinging to a six-point lead.

Putting the Pressure On: The W&M defense recorded four five sacks and four other tackles for loss against Hofstra, continuing the team's trend of pressuring opponent signal callers. Leading the way, once again, was sophomore defensive end **Adam O'Connor**. The Greensboro, NC native made six tackles against the Dukes, including two-and-a-half sacks.

For the season, O'Connor ranks third the league with six sacks, and his 12.0 TFLs is fourthbest in the conference. He has also contributed an amazing 23 quarterback hurries, by far the top mark on the squad. His six sacks, through just eight games, is already the highest single-season total for a Tribe player since former standout Luke Cullinane recorded also recorded six in his senior season of 1997. Cullinane is also the last player to turn in more than six sacks on a year, as he established the school-record for sacks in a single season with 12 in 1996.

Specializing: Tribe junior punter **Mike Mesi** is proving to be one of the team's most consistent performers on the season. The junior punter currently is second in the conference and 16th in the nation with a 41.33 yards per attempt average.

An outstanding all-around athlete, Mesi, who came to the College as a quarterback, combines a strong leg with uncanny accuracy, as he has pinched the ball inside the opponent's 20yard line 13 times this season.

KALAMAZOO, MI (9/6/03) -- Chad Munson threw for 450 yards and six touchdowns as the Broncos spoiled **Lang Campbell**'s debut as W&M's starting quarterback in a 56-24 win.

Campbell played well for W&M, completing 18 of 31 passes for 181 yards and three scores, including two to **Steven Hargrove**. **Rich Musinski** had eight catches for 101 yards, leaving him six short of tying Jerry Rice's I-AA record for 100-yard games in a career.

Defensively, the Tribe was led by linebackers **Paul Carpenter** and **Travis McLaurin**, who each had 14 tackles on the evening. Senior corner **Billy Parker** had a 27-yard fumble return and linebacker **Chris Outlaw** contributed a 68-yard interception return for the Tribe defense.

Fullback **Nick Rogers** had a one-yard TD catch for the Tribe, while sophomore kicker **Greg Kuehn** nailed a 33-yard field goal and converted all three of his PAT attempts.

W&M 23, Hofstra 9

WILLIAMSBURG, VA(11/1/03) - Redshirt freshman tailback **Delmus Coley** rushed for a career-high 133 yards on 25 carries and scored twice in the second half as William and Mary rallied to defeat Hofstra, 23-9, before a Homecoming crowd of 9,051 at Zable Stadium.

In addition to it being W&M's secondstraight victory, the win also saw senior wideout **Rich Musinski** break the Atlantic 10's all-time receiving yardage record, as he made five receptions for 44 yards, including a 13-yard catch in the second quarter that broke Brian Forster's mark of 3,944 career receiving yards.

W&M (3-5, 2-5) trailed 9-0 with just under nine minutes remaining in the third quarter when junior quarterback **Lang Campbell** hit junior wideout **Dominique Thompson** on a 51-yard play-action pass to cut into the deficit.

On the Tribe's next possession, Coley broke free for a 49-yard run that brought the ball all the way down to the Hofstra five-yard line. Three plays later, Coley carried the ball in from the oneyard line to give the Tribe a 13-9 advantage. Campbell then carried the ball in for the two-point conversion to put the College up by six points.

Clinging to the six-point lead, Coley set the final margin when he went off left-tackle from 19 yards out to cap a five-play, 74-yard drive with just over 12 minutes remaining in the game. Musinski then caught a conversion pass from Campbell to make the final margin 23-9.
