Musinski Versus the Minutemen

William and Mary is 1-1 against UMass in Musinski's career. The Minutemen have been one of his favorite teams to play against, as his career-highs in catches, yards and TDs came against UMass in 2001, while the longest catch of his career was against the Minutemen in 2000. The 86-yarder in 2000 was the first catch of his illustrious career. Musinski has averaged seven catches for 132.5 yards and two scores against UMass.

Each week during the season, W&M coach **Jimmye Laycock** participates in the Atlantic 10 teleconference and gives his thoughts on the Tribe's most recent performance, plus a look ahead at the squad's next game. Here's an excerpt of Laycock's comments from this week's teleconference:

1. What are your thoughts on the loss to Delaware?

A: I thought we played hard and I thought we competed. We played hard against Delaware. I thought we had a lot of energy out there, but we just didn't play as well as we needed to against a team of that caliber.

2. What did you think of Delaware?

A: They're very good on both sides of the ball. They played hard and executed well, and capitalized on our turnovers. When you lose the turnover battle against a good team, it's hard to offset that.

3. After the game Delaware Head Coach K.C. Keeler went out of his way to praise the performance of Lang Campbell, how did you rate Campbell's evening?

A: Honestly, he's not playing any differently than I expected. I'm not surprised he's playing well. He has practiced well, and he performed well in our scrimmages over the course of the off-season. He hasn't been in a lot of games for any extended period of time, but he has a very good understanding of our offense and uses good technique. He has a nice presence out there and he knows how to play. He's given us a lot with his ability to improvise and create things for us. He still can get better. He's good enough that he very seldom will make the same mistake twice. He knows what he did wrong before I even talk to him about. I'm very pleased with him.

4. How do you feel about finally playing a home game?

A: Hopefully we'll be able to take advantage of it. We're playing a very good team, so playing at home is a good thing. I think it's better for our fans around here, because the people in the community finally get to go to a game.

5. What was it like to have the offensive line reasonably intact against Delaware?

A: We played better, but we can still improve. Hopefully we'll get some continuity up front and that usually allows a better chance to improve.

6. What are your thoughts on UMass?

A: Well we didn't play them last year, so it's a little different in preparing to play them. But in looking at them on film, they look extremely athletic. They're playing with a great deal of confidence. They have a good balance offensively. Their quarterback is playing very well. Defensively, they do a good job controlling the line of scrimmage. Just look at their game against Kansas State - even though they lost, they played very well in that game.

7. Does it make you feel better about the defense's struggles when you see that you've played against the conference's highest-scoring teams?

A: We have to get better. We have to do a better job of understanding the schemes. We're working at it, but we just have to keep going. Again, I am pleased with the effort the unit puts forth and I know our coaches are working hard on preparing the unit to get things turned around.

Kudos for Campbell: In setting career-highs in completions (27), attempts (37) and yards (278) and tying his career-best for TDs (three) against Delaware, junior quarterback **Lang Campbell** earned the Atlantic 10 Football Conference's Offensive Player of the Week honors this past week.

With the effort, Campbell improved his already impressive quarterback efficiency rating to 142.25, which places him third in the A-10 and 15th-nationally. Campbell's quick ascension to one the elite signal-callers in the league comes after spending the last two seasons as the top backup to Tribe all-time great Dave Corley, Jr.. Much like his predecessor, Campbell has proven to be equally effective in the pocket or on the move. Through four games, he has amassed 163 yards on the ground, a number that would lead the College in rushing, were negative yardage for sacks not included in his season numbers (-77 yards).

Against Delaware, Campbell displayed an uncanny feel for the Tribe attack and cool in the pocket, as he was able to step around the intense blitzing pressure the Blue Hens sent at him for four quarters. Using a mixture of quick and medium routes, Campbell used eight different receivers to slice through the attacking Delaware unit.

With the three scoring passes, Campbell moved his season total to 11 through just four games. This figure marks the best start for any W&M quarterback, in terms of scoring passes, in Tribe history. For comparison sake, the following is the next three quickest starts through four games:

1. Campbell, 2002 - 11 TDs*
2. David Corley, 1999 - 10 TDs*
- T3. Ken Lambiotte, 1986 - 9 TDs **

- Lambiotte threw nine TDs in first three games, then missed start in fourth game of season.

Fresh Horses: Going hand-in-hand with the standout play of Campbell was the strong effort by the College's offensive front, which did a commendable job of recognizing and picking up all the different blitz packages by the Blue Hens. The return of steady veterans **Patrick Mulloy** at center and **Steve Stocki** at right guard gave the unit a major boost. Mulloy had missed all of the first three games with a knee injury, while Stocki has missed the majority of the past two contests with a bruised back. The Tribe offense turned the increased horsepower into a season-best 374 total yards (278 pass/96 rush) and 27 points.

High Water: While on the subject of the offense front, the efforts of starters **Michael Grenz**, **Ryan Lumm** and **Adam Bratton** can receive special notice when seen in light of their respective current living conditions. The trio, along with reserve quarterback **Ben Lawrence**, were forced out of their off campus home after severe flooding damage caused by Hurricane Isabel and have yet to return. In fact, at the height of the storm's fury, the crew was forced to swim out of their front yard (which was under an estimated four to five feet of water) to the safety of higher ground.

Making History: Senior All-American wide receiver **Rich Musinski** turned in a command per-

formance in front of four busloads of fans and family from his hometown of West Pittston, PA. With the over 240 faithful in attendance, Musinski pulled down a season best nine catches for 109 yards and a career-best tying three touchdowns.

His third and final TD of the evening moved him into sole possession of the College's all-time career record for scoring receptions with 28, moving him past Dave Conklin's former record of 27, amassed between the 1996-1999 seasons.

For good measure, the performance not only kept his chances of passing Jerry Rice's career record (23) for 100-yard games alive, but also moved him closer to passing Conklin's school-record for catches in a career (190). The Wyoming Area High grad currently has 183 career grabs and needs just seven more to move past Conklin for the top spot.

Musinski entered the year as the team's all-time leader in receiving yards, a mark that he has pushed to 3,593 yards, a total that ranks him fourth all-time in the Atlantic 10 Football Conference. With just 352 more yards over the final six games, the accounting major will pass URI's Brian Forster's career conference record for receiving yardage (3,944 yards).

When taken as a whole, perhaps two of the more impressive of all his many accomplishments are the facts that he has never missed a start in his 38 career games and has made at least two catches in each one of them. Also impressive is the fact that of his 120 of his last 154 receptions (better than 77%) have resulted in first downs for the Tribe.

Helping Hands: Along with the continued great play of Musinski, two of his fellow wide outs, **Danny Wade** and **John Pitts** had breakout evenings vs. the Blue Hens. Wade, who stands 6-foot-3, 210-pounds, and Pitts, a 6-foot-3, 215-pound target, each registered career-best performances, as Wade brought down seven passes for 78 yards, while Pitts contributed four receptions for 38 yards.

Both players eclipsed their previous-best totals, which had each occurred in the loss to Northeastern on Sept. 20. In that game, Wade had five catches for 66 yards, while Pitts brought down a pair of receptions for 35 yards.

Rockin' Rogers: There was nothing subtle about Nick Rogers' career-best nine-carry, 48-yard performance against the University of Delaware on Saturday evening. The 5-11, 220-pound senior fullback powered out his entire yardage total between the tackles and became the fourth player in as many games to lead the squad in rushing on the season. Not just a boon in the running game, Rogers also delivered a few clutch blocks on pass protection that enabled W&M to get into rhythm in the air attack.

Through four games, the kinesiology major from Garrettsville, OH is averaging nearly five yards per carry on 20 attempts (97 yards - 4.8 yards per attempt).

Twin Billing: Junior safeties **Corey** and **Craig Patterson** were both in the starting lineup against Delaware, marking the first game that they have both started. Also, the Tribe's other set of twins, **Travis** and **Trevor McLaurin**, combined on a tackle on a kickoff return, a fitting effort in a return to their home state from the Wilmington, DE natives.

Mesi's Magic: Junior punter **Mike Mesi** continued his outstanding season in the game against Delaware. Despite punting just twice in the game, he still managed to boot a 48-yarder on one attempt and land his other kick inside the Delaware 20-yard line. Mesi now leads the conference and ranks 13th nationally with an average of 42.1 yards per punt. But it hasn't been just the distance that has been impressive — it is also his pinpoint accuracy, which has been witnessed by his seven punts downed inside opponent's 20-yard lines. Of his seven inside the 20, three of those have been inside the 10. Mesi has earned the coaching staff's Special Teams Player of the Week honor twice this season.

Late Openers: With the cancellation of the scheduled home opener against Maine on Sept. 27, this week's game against Massachusetts is the first of the season for the Tribe at Zable Stadium. That marks the third-latest home opener in history for W&M, and the latest since 1975, when the Tribe also began on Oct. 11. The latest home opener in school history was in 1954, when the College's first game on Cary Field was Nov. 13 against West Virginia. The last time that W&M didn't have a home game until October was in 1987, when the Tribe christened its home slate with a 28-27 win over Lehigh on Oct. 3.

Like Old Times: In its long and storied football history, W&M has played a 10-game schedule on 26 different occasions. The Tribe hasn't had a 10-game regular season slate since 1969, but that

will change this year, as the cancellation of the game against Maine means that W&M will play just 10 regular season games this year.

On Point: If William and Mary goes up by 10 points during a game, the Tribe wins almost 93 percent of the time. When holding a 10-point lead, W&M's record under head coach Jimmye Laycock is an incredible 132-10-1 (.927). For comparison, Pittsburgh Steelers coach Bill Cowher's team has gone 78-2-1 (.969) in games in which they led by 10 or more points, one of the top marks in the National Football League.

Special Success: A highlight in the early part of the season has been the play of specialists **Greg Kuehn** and **Mike Mesi** at kicker and punter, respectively. The pair of all-conference candidates are among the league and national leaders in their kicking categories. Kuehn has the conference lead and is ranked 14th in the nation with 1.25 field goals per game. Mesi has been nothing short of spectacular at punter, ranking tops in the league with an average of 42.1 yards per punt. That mark is good enough for 13th in the nation.

Getting on the Board: Under current head coach Jimmye Laycock, William and Mary has been very successful when being the first team to score. W&M's record under Laycock is 111-31-1 (.780) when putting points on the scoreboard before the opposition.

Defensively, the Tribe was led by linebackers **Paul Carpenter** and **Travis McLaurin**, who each had 14 tackles on the evening. Senior corner **Billy Parker** had a 27-yard fumble return and linebacker **Chris Outlaw** contributed a 68-yard interception return for the Tribe defense.

Fullback **Nick Rogers** had a one-yard TD catch for the Tribe, while sophomore kicker **Greg Kuehn** nailed a 33-yard field goal and converted all three of his PAT attempts.
