Washington July 20. 08.

I have put off writing to you to the last moment, and must therefore be short as I am just setting out for Monticello. yours of the 15th is received. we fix your departure by the next vessel we send which will be in about 6 weeks. it will not be necessary for you to visit this place as Mr Madison leaves it on Saturday. we highly approve the idea of calling your friend our messenger & your taking your passage as a private man. but we can recommend no one to you, not knowing any one. Lewis is worthy of it, but he cannot be spared & he is a Virginian. The salary is the same as formerly. Mr Madison will lay down rules for your charges. The mission is, in the first instance considered as special, to remain till peace, ^{if the Senate approves.} whether it may be permanent afterwards is not decided. in great haste I must place here my salutations & assurances of constant affection.
