All-Time Series: Virginia Tech leads, 39-18-4. Virginia Tech leads series in Blacksburg, 19-6-1

Last Meeting: Oct. 12, 1985; Virginia Tech won, 40-10, in Blacksburg.

#### First and 10

W&M travels west across the Commonwealth this weekend, renewing an old rivalry with Virginia Tech at Lane Stadium. The series between the Tribe and Hokies dates back to 1904, though the schools have not met since 1985. Saturday's contest will mark the 10th consecutive season the Tribe has faced a FBS (formerly Division I-A) opponent. W&M has won two consecutive games over in-state opponents, VMI and Liberty, to improve to 2-1. Virginia Tech, ranked 17th in this week's Associated Press Top 25 poll, is also 2-1 after posting a 28-7 victory at home over Ohio. W&M is one of the top offensive teams in the nation on the FCS level, leading the country in scoring (47.3) and passing yards per game (353.7), while ranking second in total offense (530.0). Junior quarterback Jake Phillips has the top passer rating in the FCS at 202.7 and also leads the subdivision in total passing yards (1,010) and passing yards per game (336.7). Virginia Tech has allowed a total of 17 points in two home games this season and an average of just 187.5 total yards in those contests. True freshman quarterback Tyrod Taylor is scheduled to make his second start for an offense averaging 300.0 yards per game. 

#### **Press Parking**

Parking for members of the working press is available just southeast of Zable Stadium in front of the University Center. Parking is limited and media members are encouraged to arrive early.

#### **Photographers**

Please observe the NCAA rules, which prohibit photographers between the 25 yard lines.

#### **Press Box Services**

Located atop the East grandstand of Zable Stadium at Cary field, the press box officially opens two hours prior to kickoff. Pregame notes, flip cards and programs will be available prior to the start. Complete halftime statistics, as well as final team and individual statistics, are available immediately following the game.

#### Radio

Visiting radio lines may be rented through the Sports Information Office at a cost of \$75 per line. The radio booth for the visiting team is located at the south end of the press box on the lower level. Radio stations should make arrangements with the Sports Information Office at least a month in advance. Requests for the line will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis.

#### **Visiting Film Crews**

Space will be allotted in the West Press Box for film and video crews of visiting teams' coaches' shows. We will provide two spots per team.

#### **Post-Game Procedures**

Head coach Jimmye Laycock and the visiting coach will be available about 10 minutes after the game in an interview area located directly below the press box. Individual W&M players' names should be given to Pete Clawson during the fourth quarter and they will be made available in the interview room.





#### **Virginia Tech Series Notes**

#### **Virginia Tech Connections**

William and Mary head coach Jimmye Laycock and Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer were both assistants under Bobby Ross at The Citadel from 1973-74. Laycock was the offensive backfield coach for his two seasons under Ross, before leaving to take a post as the quarterback's coach at Memphis State. Beamer was at The Citadel from 1973-78. serving as the defensive coordinator his final two seasons before moving on to Murray State.

Tech assistant coach Jim Cavanaugh, the Hokies' strong safety and outside linebackers coach, is a 1970 graduate of W&M. Cavanaugh and Laycock were teammates at W&M, playing from 1967-69.

Senior defensive tackle Ryan Jones, and junior safety David Houff are both Blacksburg natives and products of Blacksburg High School.

#### Looking Back

The W&M-Virginia Tech series dates back to 1904, when the schools first met in Blacksburg. Virginia Tech won the first meeting, 30-0. Though the Hokies hold a commanding edge, having won 39 of the 61 all-time meetings, the series was once dominated by W&M over a near two-decade stretch from 1937 to 1954. During that span, W&M went 13-1-2 against Virginia Tech, winning 12 consecutive games from from 1940 to 1953. From 1945 to 1985, W&M and Virginia Tech met every season, though after 1953, W&M has won only five times in 32 tries. The last Tribe victory in the series was on Oct. 2, 1976, when W&M defeated the Hokies, 27-15, in Blacksburg.

#### A Win Against Virginia Tech Would ...

- Stand as the Tribe's first win over an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent since 1986, a 41-37 win at Virginia.
- Be the Tribe's first win over a FBS opponent since defeating Temple in 1998 (45-38).
- Mark the College's first win over a nationally ranked (FBS) opponent since a Mary Levy coached Tribe squad traveled to Annapolis and upset Navy (27-16) in 1967.
- Stand as the first victory over Virginia Tech since 1976, when the College defeated the Hokies in Blacksburg, 27-15.
- Equal the College's best start to a season (3-1) since 2004, when the team started 5-1.
- Be the Tribe's first three game winning streak since the 2005 season.

#### W&M vs. The Atlantic Coast Conference

Since the league was formed in 1953, W&M has gone 10-32 (.238) against opponents from the ACC, including a 27-14 loss at Maryland in the 2006 season-opener. If games against current ACC members Virginia Tech, Florida State and Miami, before they joined the league are taken into account, the Tribe's all-time record against current ACC teams is 17-61-1 (.215). Prior to the loss in College Park, the last ACC team W&M faced was North Carolina in 2004 (49-38 loss). The last ACC team the College defeated was state-rival Virginia, 41-37, in Charlottesville in 1986.

#### Did You Know?

The last time the College hosted an ACC opponent in Williamsburg was in 1980, when the Demon Deacons of Wake Forest made a visit to Zable Stadium and defeated the Tribe, 27-7.


## Game Note

#### **Team Notes**

#### **Top-Notch Competition**

The game with Virginia Tech will mark the 10th-consecutive year the College has faced an opponent from the FBS (formerly Division I-A), which is the longest current streak in the CAA. In the last 21 years, the Tribe has faced over 25 I-A opponents, including 22 from the current BCS conferences. The last W&M win over an FBS opponent was in 1998, when the Tribe downed Temple, 45-38. Here is a quick look at W&M's last 10 games against a I-A opponent:

#### Take A Closer Look

In the Tribe's five previous games at FBS opponents, the offense averaged a respectable 23.4 points per contest. The defense has had its hands full, though, allowing an average of 38.6 points over the five games.

In three of the previous five games vs. I-A opponents, the Tribe has either been in the lead, or tied, in the third quarter with the only exceptions being against Western Michigan in 2003 and at Maryland in 2006. In the first game of 2005 at Marshall, the Tribe led the Herd, 24-23, late in the third quarter and were threatening to extend the lead before a 70-yard fumble return for touchdown by Marshall. The Herd tacked on another scored on in its next possession and pulled out the 36-24 win.

In 2004, behind Payton Award winning guarterback Lang Campbell, W&M led North Carolina, 31-28, entering the fourth quarter of the season-opener, before the Tar Heels used a deep bench and powerful offensive line to outscore the Tribe, 21-7, in the fourth quarter and post a 49-38 victory.

#### Did You Know? II

With New Hampshire's 48-35 win at Marshall last Saturday, the Colonial Athletic Association Football Conference has now won 14 games vs. FBS foes over the last 10 years. The league membership has now defeated at least one FBS school in four of the last five years. For the record, the conference is 14-54 overall vs. the FBS since 1997.

The CAA has produced three national championship teams in the last 10 seasons and has had a representative in the national championship game in three out of the last four years, winning two titles.

#### **Extra Effort**

The Tribe's 48-41, double overtime win vs. Liberty was the College's eighth all-time overtime game. W&M is 5-2 in overtime contests, including a perfect 5-0 at home. The Tribe's last OT game before Saturday was a double-overtime win at Northeastern in 2005.

#### Seeing Yellow

W&M consistently is one of the least penalized teams in the CAA, so the 13 penalties for 87 yards on Saturday against Liberty were very uncharacteristic. The 13 flags tie the team's record for most penalties in a single game in the 28 years Laycock as been at the helm. The only other time occurred in the 1995 season finale vs. Richmond. One has to go back to the 2004 season to find the last time a Tribe team was penalized for more yards (90, also against Liberty).

In a stark contrast, the Tribe was not penalized in the previous week's contest at VMI.

#### Fresh Start

Due to depth issues along the Tribe's defensive front, true freshman Mike Stover saw his first game action against VMI. With the playing time, he joined Terrell Wells (cornerback) as members of the 2007 recruiting class to see the field.

Stover, who became the first Tribe true freshman defensive lineman to see game action since Brian Williamson in 2003, contributed three assisted tackles on the afternoon. In the season opener against Delaware, Wells became the first true freshman to score a touchdown for the Tribe since 1992. The last true freshman to reach the end zone was former all-conference tailback Troy Keen. Keen, who was a key reserve on the '92 squad, found pay dirt six times that season and went onto having one of the finest playing careers in school history.

## Game Notes

#### **Offensive Notes**

#### **Big Numbers**

Coming off a 48-point, 524-yard performance vs. Liberty, the Tribe offense is currently leading the FCS in scoring (47.3) and passing offense (353.7) and is second in total offense (530.0). Georgia Southern leads the nation with an average of 585.0 yards per game.

W&M is currently averaging an impressive 7.2 yards per play on the season and over 16 yards per completion.

#### **Huge Improvement**

One year removed from a 2006 season that saw it produce uncharacteristic offensive numbers (19 points per game and 339.4 yards per game), the W&M attack is off to a record start. No team in the College's 113-year football history has recorded more total yards (1,590) or points (142) through three games to start the season.

When comparing the numbers to last season, the Tribe has already accumulated nearly 70 percent of the total points it scored all of last season (209) and nearly 43 percent of its 11-game game cumulative total offensive yardage (3,733).

#### Did You Know?

The last time a W&M team accumulated more points or total yards in any three-game stretch was during the 1993 season, when the College put together an eye-popping 153 points and 1,679 total yards between the fifth through seventh games, all wins (49-6, VMI; 53-6, Northeastern; and 51-17, Villanova).

#### **High Water Mark**

The Tribe's offense was nearly flawless in putting together a 63-point performance at VMI two weeks back. After yielding the team's only offensive turnover of the season on the second snap of the game, the Tribe's attack was nearly unstoppable. The College amassed 524 yards of total offense and scored touchdowns on nine of its ensuing 11 possessions. After the initial miscue, the College ran a total of 34 offensive plays over its next seven possessions for the remainder of the first half and faced a third down situation just three times, converting two.

The 63 points stand as the most for any Laycock coached team and is the school's highest single-game performance since the 1932 season, which saw the Tribe hang a 77-0 defeat on Bridgewater College. The 46-point margin of victory is the most since the Tribe defeated fellow Big South Conference member, Liberty, 56-0 in 2005.

#### Did You Know?

The Tribe offense has had 34 total possessions in the first three games and, excluding drives where the squad has intentionally taken a knee, has produced points on 21 of them with 18 touchdowns and three field goals. W&M has punted only five times and has been forced three-and-out just twice, once each vs. Delaware and Liberty.

#### Phillips on Fire

One of the driving reasons behind the Tribe's hot offensive start has been the stellar play of junior quarterback Jake Phillips. After going through a nearly eight month battle through the spring and fall drills to earn the starting nod, the Warm Springs, Va. native has taken his game to another level in the early season.

By completing 20 of his 28 attempts for 335 yards and three touchdowns vs. Liberty, Phillips has raised his quarterback efficiency rating to a national best 202.33. In his first game against Delaware, Phillips set the school's single-game passing record with 433 yards. Last week, he completed 13 of his 15 attempts for 242 yards and three scores in just a half of work at VMI.

He has completed 70.2 percent of his attempts on the season (59-84) for 1,010 yards and eight touchdowns, with no interceptions.

In addition to leading the league in passing efficiency, he is also first in the CAA in passing yards per game (336.7) and his eight touchdown passes tie him with Liam Coen of UMass for the league lead. His average of 351.3 yards a game of total offense trails only UNH's Ricky Santos' average of 362.0.

#### 1,000 and Counting

The College has had a long and storied history of developing quality quarterbacks in the 28 seasons Laycock has been at the helm. But, no signal caller has surpassed the 1,000-yard passing barrier quicker than Phillips. Many quarterbacks share the previous record of four games, most recently accomplished by 2004 Walter Payton Award winner, Lang Campbell.

#### **Chart Climbing**

Phillips' 335-yard effort pushed his career total to 3,337 passing yards, which moved him into the College's all-time top 10. Phillips moved past Dave Murphy (1980-83, 3,087 yards) into the 10th position. Phillips needs just 25 passing yards to vault into the ninth position held by Dan Darragh (1965-67, 3,361 yards).

Phillips is also poised to enter the all-time top-10 listing in total offense, as his total of 3,631 yards rests just 119 away from moving him past former tailback Derek Fitzgerald (1992-95, 3,749 yards. **Phillips progress in the records books can be found on page 9**.

#### **Phillips Going Down Field**

What makes Phillips' early season surge even more impressive is the fact that while he is completing over 70 percent of his passes, he still is averaging more than 17 yards per completion. On the year, 23 of his 59 completions have gone for 20 yards, or more.

#### Beginning of the End

When senior tight end Drew Atchison first walked into the Tribe's football program before spring practice in 2005, he was a 220-pound sophomore walk-on who had spent his freshman year as a member of the Tribe baseball squad. The College's staff recognized his athleticism, and figured he would have the ability to fill out his 6-7 frame. Some 35 pounds of muscle later, Atchison has done just that — and more.

With six catches for 103 yards vs. Liberty, Atchison moved his season total to a team-high 13 receptions for 244 yard and three scores. He contributed several big plays on the evening, but none bigger than his 15-yard touchdown catch in the first overtime period. In fact, five of his six catches vs. the Flames were for 15-yards, or more. Atchison is averaging an impressive 18.8 yards per reception on the year.

The game with Liberty was his second 100-yard receiving effort already this season, a sum that equaled the team's entire 11-game total of 100-yard receiving games from 2006. He brought down six passes for 139 receiving yards, including a 50-yard touchdown catch and run, in the opener against Delaware. His 139-yard effort stands as the best single-game performance for a Tribe tight end since Glenn Bodnar set the school's position record with a 183-yard performance vs. Colgate in 1983. Atchison's six-receptions against the Blue Hens are the most for a Tribe tight since 1999, when current Denver Bronco, Mike Leach, had seven receptions for 64 yards in a 30-20 loss to James Madison.

Despite seeing only limited playing time in the team's 63-16 win at VMI, Atchison currently ranks fourth in the CAA in receiving yards per game (81.3) and his three touchdown catches are the highest total among the league's top 10 leaders in either receiving yards or receptions.

While his size and speed create match-up issues in opposing defensive backfields, he has also worked extremely hard to increase his effectiveness along the line of scrimmage as well. His consistent improvement and considerable natural ability has attracted the attention of several NFL scouts as eight were in attendance for the Tribe's season opener against Delaware.

#### **Receiving Corps Continues Solid Play**

As has been the case all season, the Tribe received another solid all-around outing from its receiving corps against Liberty. Junior Elliott Mack put together one of the best performances of his career by bringing down five passes for 71 yards, including a nifty 7-yard, fourth quarter touchdown reception. Mack is currently second on the team with 13 catches for 197 yards and two touchdowns.

#### **Archer on Target**

Another constant for the Tribe's receiving corps has been the play of sophomore, R.J. Archer. With three catches for 56 yards against Liberty, Archer extended his streak of consecutive games with at least one catch to 14 with one in every career appearance. He has caught at least two passes in his last 10-straight appearances and currently has 10 catches for 160 yards.

After seeing action in all 11 games of the 2006 season as a wide receiver, Archer concentrated his entire spring, summer and the great majority of his fall camp work competing for the starting quarterback job. While he was the dark horse in a race that featured two other talented and game-tested players, Archer's athletic ability and strong arm kept him very much in the starting quarterback conversation till literally game week preparations began, and Jake Phillips was named the No. 1 QB.

In what is a great testament to his athletic ability and willingness to compete and contribute, Archer made the switch back to wide receiver just days before the opening kickoff with Delaware. With a late camp injury preventing projected senior starter Joe Nicholas from suiting up vs. the Blue Hens, Archer stepped right back into the starting line-up and made his eighth-straight start at wide out. Despite throwing far more passes than he caught over the last eight months, Archer didn't miss a beat as he contributed five receptions for 58 yards vs. the Blue Hens.

#### **Back In Action**

As mentioned above, senior wide out Joe Nicholas missed the first two games of the 2007 season with a knee injury, but he retuned to the starting lineup last week vs. Liberty and contributed one catch for 17 yards.

Nicholas has now appeared in 36 career games, with 35 starts, and is currently tied for fifth on the school's all-time touchdown receptions list (19) and is seventh in both career receiving yards (2,142) and receptions (160). Nicholas' progress on the school's career receiving charts can be found on page 8.

#### **Tough Break For Holmes**

Junior tailback DeBrian Holmes had already turned in a career-best performance vs. Liberty when he took a helmet to the leg and broke his left ankle at the end of a fourth-quarter run. Holmes' evening ended with him setting career highs in both carries (23) and rushing yards (96), and he also had contributed scoring runs of five and eight yards. He currently leads the team in carries (49), rushing yards (191) and rushing touchdowns (5).

## Game Notes

Losing Holmes is particularly difficult because W&M lost speedy redshirt-freshman Courtland Marriner to a thumb injury at VMI, and the pair figured to see the majority of the work in the Tribe offensive backfield this season. Marriner was also injured in the late stages of a standout performance, as he had established career highs in rushes (13) and rushing yards (107) vs. the Keydets.

It has been an eerie trend for the Tribe offense this season, as junior wide out D.J. McAulay suffered the same fate in the season opener with Delaware, as he turned in career highs in both receptions (7) and receiving yards (162) vs. the Blue Hens, before sustaining a serious knee injury late in the fourth quarter.

Marriner's return has not yet been determined, but Holmes and McAulay will miss the remainder of the season.

#### Senior Tailback Tony Viola Stepping Up

As always, injuries create opportunities, and senior tailback Tony Viola is more than primed to make the most of his. He will likely make his first career start this Saturday vs. Va. Tech and few have worked harder or longer to earn it. Coming into this season, due to the depth and talent the College has had at his position, Viola has rarely cracked the two-deep and his playing opportunities have been limited. But, against Liberty, he was placed squarely in the spotlight of the fourth-quarter of a tight game and responded with a deliberate 15 carry, 57-yard effort.

In fact, 35 of his 57 yards on the evening came in the pair of overtime sessions. He converted a crucial fourth and one on the team's first overtime possession, then carried the ball five-straight times on the team's second, and decisive, overtime possession, gaining 24 yards and setting up a one-yard Jake Phillips touchdown plunge.

The 6-1, 215-pound native of Broadway, Va. is currently third on the team with 113 yards rushing on 27 attempts.

#### **Foundation of Success**

Despite the rash of injuries to key skill personnel, the Tribe offense continues to cruise along and much of this success can be contributed to the work of the front five. The senior tackle combination of Brad Stewart and Brent Cochran each are three-year starters for the College and will challenge for post-season honors.

The Tribe returned four of the five starters from last season's offensive line and the experience, and a great deal of hard work in the off season, has paid early dividends. The College racked up an impressive 281 yards on the ground vs. VMI, averaging 5.3 yards per carry. The last time the Tribe rushed for more yards was the 56-0 win over Liberty in 2005 (335 yards, 64 attempts, 5.2 avg.).

Through three games, W&M has rushed a total of 128 times for 529 yards and 10 touchdowns, averaging 4.2 yards per attempt and 176.3 yards per game. Last season, W&M scored a total of just 11 rushing touchdowns.

#### Did You Know?

Since joining the league in 1993, the College has rushed for 200, or more, yards 46 times in 164 total games. The Tribe's record in those contests is a gaudy 45-1 with its only loss coming during the 2001 season, when it fell 34-31 at URI.

#### **Sure Footing**

Sophomore place kicker Brian Pate was named the CAA Football Special Team's Player of the Week for his performance in the Tribe's double-overtime victory over Liberty.

Pate, who was appearing in just his third career game, connected on two field goal attempts, including a career-long 43-yarder, and was perfect on six extra point attempts, including two in overtime. Pate drilled the 43-yard field goal as time expired in the first half, giving W&M a 17-13 lead at the break. He also connected on his only other field goal attempt, a 19-yarder in the fourth quarter.

With the performance, Pate scored a career-high 12 total points. A week earlier, Pate set a school record with nine extra-points in the Tribe's 63-16 win at VMI. On the season, Pate is 19-for-19 on PATs and 3-for-4 on field goals.

Pate's average of 9.3 points a game is fourth overall in the CAA and the top figure amongst kickers.

#### **Defensive Notes**

#### Tribe Defense Gets Two Turnovers Against Liberty

W&M recorded its first two interceptions of the season on Saturday, picking off a pair of Liberty passes. Junior corner Derek Cox stepped in front of a pass in the end zone in the third quarter, ending a Flames' scoring threat and preserving a 17-13 Tribe lead. Sophomore safety David Caldwell followed with a fourth-quarter interception. Cox brought his career interception total to three, while Caldwell recorded his second career pick.

Through three games, the defense has now gained a total of five turnovers after forcing two in each of the last two games. The Tribe forced one in the season opener against Delaware, a fumble recovery returned 38 yards for a touchdown by freshman Terrell Wells, and two against VMI, both Josh Rutter fumble recoveries.

#### **Tribe Thwarts Two Red Zone Opportunities**

Against Liberty, the Tribe defense denied two red zone scoring chances for the Flames, none bigger than the stop in double-overtime. Caldwell made a key tackle for loss on second down to set up third-and-five, before combining with linebacker Michael Pigram to stop Liberty's Rashad Jennings and set up fourth-and-one. Liberty called Jennings'

number one more time, but redshirt freshman linebacker Nick Dewispelaere and a host of Tribe tacklers came up with biggest defensive play of the night, stopping Jennings short of the first down.

The other red zone stop turned out to be extremely important as well, as Cox recorded an interception in the end zone to end a potential Liberty scoring drive. The two stops were the Tribe's first in the red zone this season.

#### Pass Defense Tops in CAA

In this week's conference statistical report, the Tribe leads the league in pass defense. W&M is allowing a league-low 142.3 yards per game through the air. While W&M allowed 203 yards passing to Liberty, the Flames' longest passing play spanned 19 yards.

#### Rutter Ranks in Top 20 Nationally in Tackles Per Game

Junior linebacker Josh Rutter was 19th in tackles per game (11.3) in this week's NCAA statistics report. The figure is seventh in the CAA. Rutter recorded 15 stops in the win over Liberty, one shy of his career-mark set in 2005 against Marshall, to earn the coaching staff's defensive player of the week award.

Rutter leads the Tribe with 34 total tackles through three games, an impressive start to the 2007 campaign after missing the final eight games last season with a knee injury. Rutter also has a league-best two fumble recoveries, both of which came in the Tribe's win at VMI (Sept. 8).

#### **Caldwell Continues Strong Play**

Sophomore strong safety David Caldwell continued his solid start to the 2007 season, recording eight total tackles, an interception and a big tackle for loss in overtime against Liberty. In his first season as a starter, Caldwell is second on the squad with 28 tackles, ranking 10th in the CAA in tackles per game (9.3). He recorded a careerhigh 15 total tackles, including 1.5 for loss, in the win at VMI, surpassing his previous career mark of 10 set last year against Richmond. Caldwell's 15 stops were the highest single-game tackle total since former safety James Miller ('06) recorded 16 at Villanova in 2005. Caldwell also forced a fumble against the Keydets and broke up a pass.

#### Solid Performance at VMI For Young Defensive

After a tough start to the season against Delaware, the Tribe defensive showed a number of positives in the victory over VMI. Facing the Keydets' option-heavy ground attack, the Tribe forced a pair of turnovers, limited VMI to just two third-down conversions and recorded a pair of sacks and seven total tackles for loss. Additionally, the Tribe defense created two more turnovers on downs and allowed VMI to enter the red zone only twice.

#### Youth Movement on Defense

A look at the Tribe's roster reveals only three seniors on the defensive side of the ball, while a glance at the two deep shows nine redshirt or true freshman and an additional eight redshirt or true sophomores. This season, four defensive players have made their first career start, while an additional 10 have seen the playing field for the first time. Six sophomores have started both games, and the 10 players to see their first collegiate snaps this season are redshirt freshmen Evan Francks (LB), Michael Alvarado (DB), Bryan Jean-Pierre (DL), Derek Toon (DL), Carl Watts (DL), Nick Dewispelaere (LB), Wes Steinman (LB) and Ben Cottingham (DB) and true freshmen Terrell Wells (DB) and Michael Stover (DL).

And, a number of the youngsters have made key contributions. Dewispeleare collected eight total tackles in his first appearance, which came at VMI, and was credited with the game-ending tackle in Saturday's win over Liberty. Francks, who has seen action in all three games, recorded five total tackles at VMI, including his first-career sack. Stover made his debut at VMI and collected three tackles, while Wells had one of the defensive highlights of the opener against Delaware, scoring on a 28-yard fumble recovery in the fourth quarter.

#### **Herbert Records Third Career Blocked Kick**

Sophomore defensive end C.J. Herbert has already demonstrated an impressive proficiency in blocking placement kicks during his young career, picking up his third career blocked kick in the win over VMI. Herbert blocked an extra point try in the second half. Last year, Herbert blocked two placement kicks, including a key extra point attempt in the one-point win at Liberty.

#### Horvath, Jones Continue With Starting Roles

After challenging for a starting role during fall camp, senior linebacker Ryan Horvath entered the season opener against Delaware as a the back-up at strong side linebacker. Horvath has started each of the Tribe's last two games however, as classmate T.J. O'Neill has been out with an illness. A former walk-on, Horvath has taken full advantage of the opportunity, recording 11 total tackles over the last two games. He tallied six total tackles, including three unassisted stops against VMI and followed with five stops, including three solos, in the win over Liberty Saturday.

Jones took a similar path to his starting role at defensive tackle, working his way into the line-up after entering the program as a walk-on. He has started each of the first three games and tallied three tackles and a forced fumble.

Comments From Monday's CAA Football Coaches Conference Call:

Can you give some general comments about the double-overtime win over Liberty?

A: Liberty was a very talented and physical team, a good team, and we had our hands full. I think we played well, especially offensively. Defensively, we were a little inconsistent, but offensively I thought Jake Phillips had another fine game. I have to give

Liberty credit, they took the ball from us [at the end of the fourth quarter] and ran it down [for a touchdown] and got a two-point conversion to put it in overtime [with just 16 seconds remaining].

How is DeBrian Holmes, he looked to be injured in the fourth quarter.

A: DeBrian has a broken ankle, and he is done for the season.

Do you have any update on when [redshirt freshman tailback] Courtland Marriner will play [after sustaining a thumb injury two weeks ago at VMI and missing the Liberty game]?

A: Courtland is getting better, but he will not play this week.

Can you give me a comment on [senior tailback] Tony Viola's [15-carry, 57-yard] performance? In the second overtime, he ran it five times for 24 of the 25 yards.

A: Tony stepped it up, and he did what he had to do. We needed to control the ball and the offensive line came alive a little bit more to help him out some. Tony did a fine job.

Does having a first year kicker (sophomore Brian Pate) get this sort of pressure experience early on in the season help him with confidence?

A: You don't take anything for granted, whether it's a kick or a hold or a snap. I think it's a matter of him being able to block [the pressure of the moment] out and everyone else doing a good job and handling their own responsibilities. One fact about the game that may have gotten lost with the wild finish was the [43-yard] field goal Brian Pate made before the end of the half. He's developing into a good, solid kicker.

One of the big themes coming into the season was how hard you guys worked over the spring and summer, and it looked like you were the more fit team during the overtime. Do you think that helped?

A: I said that I thought Liberty looked tired, but I know our quys were fine. They were ready to go. I didn't see anyone hanging their heads or bending over or acting like they were tired. We didn't address it or give them an opportunity to be tired. I didn't want to hear anything about that.

# In the Spotlight

#### T.J. O'Neill, Senior, Linebacker

#### Where are you from?

A: Duxbury, Massachusetts. It's a little beach town about 30 minutes south of Boston.

#### Is it known for anything in particular?

A: Oysters, great oysters. Duxbury Boy Bailey's are sold all over the world.

#### Have you ever had a job on the water?

A: I've done a lot of different jobs while working there. I did get offered a job making lobster pots one summer for \$10 an hour, but I didn't take it.

#### What is the hardest summer job you've ever had?

A: I worked on a friend of my father's estate. He has seven acres of land. He has lots of big gardens on it and grows all sorts of different vegetables and fruits — pumpkins, watermelons, etc... My job was basically everything. I'd come into work everyday and there'd be a list waiting for me. It'd be anything from mowing or mulching to washing his car or fixing a three-wheeled motorcycle that we used. I was a grounds keeper for the estate. It was a lot of hard work and long hours. But looking back on it, I had a great time doing it and learned a lot of different things. What was your job last summer?

A: The previous two summers I've been working for a company called Midway Pacific. It's basically a lumber company that sells processed lumber. It's pretty interesting. [The company] gets its wood from Russia and its really high quality wood. What it's doing is combining Russian high quality wood with United States technology. It produces really high density wood.

#### What was your role in this company?

A: I was doing a lot computer work, helping the owner with spreadsheets, setting up power point presentations for him, and editing documents for him that he would present to a potential client. I was also going to used car auctions, because one of the things my boss was doing was coordinating the sale of high-end cars bought in the United States and then shipping them over in the huge transport containers to Russia. The idea was they would make money on getting the empties over to Russia by selling these luxury cars at a nice profit, then use the same containers to return the wood back to the states.

#### As far as this experience in the business world, what do you think you took from it?

A: One of the most important things I learned is that when you are in the business world, you might just have one job title, but you can have an incredibly diverse set of responsibilities.

#### What are some of the other things you do for enjoyment outside of football?

A: One of my favorite places in the world is the beach. I love being at the beach. I love being on the ocean and doing anything with the ocean — fishing, going out on boats with my buddies, surfing.

#### What's your major?

A: Sociology.

#### What are your future plans, as far as your career is concerned?

A: One thing I was really thinking about last summer was applying to some of the agencies that are in the [Williamsburg] area — the DEA or ATF. Law enforcement is definitely an interest to me. When I came here, I didn't know what I wanted to major in. I took a great class in criminology and I loved it. They obviously don't have a criminology or criminal justice major here. But they have side classes in sociology such as Deviance and Social Problems — things that have always really interested me. Being so close to Quantico, I figure with my qualifications I could get an interview. It pulls in all those different agencies — CIA, FBI.

#### What was the reason you choose to play football at W&M?

A: When I was trying to decide where I wanted to go, I was a little sick of the northeast winters. And also, I wanted to experience something different. Everyone in my family had always been from Massachusetts and no one had ever left. My sisters, my parents all grew up in Boston, went to college in Boston, and all live in Boston. It was some place pretty different, pretty far outside my comfort zone. It was far enough away from home that my dad wouldn't be at my doorstep every morning. Close enough to home so that my parents could come down for the games. Once I got here, I appreciated everything that Williamsburg is and appreciate everything about Virginia. It also made me appreciate home that much more.

#### What is your best non-athletic skill?

A: I love cooking. I really got into it within the past few summers. Everything I cook is on the grill - vegetables, any type of meat.

#### What's one thing about you that somebody wouldn't know right away?

A: Music plays a huge role in my life, and it has for a very long time. My favorite type of music is reggae and it has been for a pretty substantial amount time. I just love everything about it. I love going to reggae shows. I love listening to music. And I'm even involved in some reggae music myself.

#### You make some reggae music?

A: My best friend from back home is a reggae artist. I've helped him in the past. With his first album release, I helped him write a couple of lyrics and even sang on a couple of tracks for him

#### If anyone is interested in trying to hear it, is there anyway they can do it?

A: Yeah, www.stickfiguremusic.com.

#### What tracks are you featured in?

A: "Feeling in the Mood" and "Sweet Reggae Music."

#### What non-athletic activities were you involved in during high school?

A: My boarding school had its own radio station. It went out to the local towns. It was WWTA and I had my own radio show every Tuesday night. It was mostly jokes and game shows and a lot of reggae music. I think that's the best way to sum it up.

#### Did you ever make public appearances as part of the show?

A: During boarding school, kids used to love to have me come in and freestyle, you know like freestyle rap, not like hip hop, really, but it would be like kids playing jam band music and then I kind of freestyle over it. I was actually involved with this kid on his senior project and he asked me to freestyle on one of his tracks.

#### So would it be fair to say that past football, music is your thing?

A: Well, I don't know how good I am at music, but I love it and I love being involved in it. But I would never consider myself a great musician.

#### What's your favorite part about playing football?

A: Probably the release it gives you. William and Mary is a pretty intense academic school. But on the football field, you can just put it all behind you. It doesn't matter what's going wrong, if you're in a fight with your girlfriend or whatever, at that moment football is all that matters.

#### What's the biggest thing you'll take away from your William and Mary experience?

A: Being able to manage my time is the biggest thing. With that extra time maybe you have between class and practice, but then after practice you have to hurry up and get to Swem because you've got the research paper to work on. I was definitely challenged here, both in the classroom and football field. There's no way to escape being a student. But, as an athlete, the athletics department gives you endless amounts of resources to help you make the most of your study time.
