

# **Spring Preview**

On the other side of the ball, Laycock has turned to veteran defensive coach Bob Shoop to take over the duties of defensive coordinator. Shoop comes to Williamsburg

NCAA I-AA title game last fall. Shoop inherits a youthful unit that returns five starters, but

With the W&M football program in the final stages of the spring season, the players and staff have made a commitment to hard work and are focused on improvement and progress moving towards the 2007 season. The fall campaign will be the 28th under head coach Jimmye Laycock. While the offense returns eight starters, the task at hand for Laycock's group involves adjusting to a new defensive coordinator, as well as replacing nine total starters, including three critical losses on the offensive side and six regulars on defense.

With the abundance of young and eager talent returning on both sides of the ball,

competition has been the key word of camp to this point. This fierce competition has provided the backdrop for what has been a very spirited spring session. As the team winds down towards completion and moves into summer workouts, there is a refreshing optimism building around the program and what promises to be an even more eventful fall.

### **OFFENSE**

On offense, the unit must deal with the departure of former all-conference players Elijah Brooks (running back), Cody Morris (center) and Matt Trinkle (tight end), who all

expended their eligibility in 2006. But, excitement surrounds the offensive side, as the unit welcomes back four starters on the front line, in senior tackles Brad Stewart and Brent Cochran, senior guard Justin Oliver and junior guard Luke Hiteshew, and allconference senior wide receiver Joe Nicholas.

Both Stewart and Cochran are two-year returning starters, while Oliver and Hiteshew each took over starting jobs in 2006. Senior center Tim Kelley and sophomore guard C.J. Muse are in the mix for a starting spot with Hiteshew also taking reps at center.

Nicholas earned Third-Team All-Atlantic 10 honors last season after ranking 10th in the conference in receiving vards per game (54.3) and leading the Tribe with eight touchdown receptions. He leads a receiving corps that also features tested veterans in juniors D.J. McAulay and Elliott Mack. McAulay is a deep threat and is coming off a campaign where caught 21 passes for 307 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Mack pulled in 20 balls for 225 yards and two touchdowns in 2006 and is also a rushing threat, gaining 61 yards on seven attempts last season.

Add in the return of senior tight end Drew Atchison and the Tribe has a very talented stable of pass catchers. Atchison recorded a pair of touchdown receptions in 2006, including a 57-yard scoring catch and run, finishing the year with 12 grabs for 183 yards. Atchison's 6-8 frame is also a key part of the running game and give the offensive line another reliable blocker.


The chores of getting the ball to the Tribe's receivers is an intriguing situation, as the unit returns a pair of signal callers with starting experience in senior Mike Potts and junior Jake Phillips. Versatile sophomore R.J. Archer has moved back to the position as well after a tremendous freshman season at wide receiver.

Potts started six games in 2006, including the final five, and led the team with 1,559 passing yards and 10 touchdowns in nine total games. He finished seventh in the A-10 in passing average (173.2) and also ranked eighth in the league in total offense (170.0). Phillips started the first four games of the season and five total, throwing for 763 yards and five scores in seven games. Phillips also finished as the team's third-leading rusher with 67 yards and a touchdown. Archer, who tallied 30 receptions for 489 yards in 2006, gives the offense another capable signal-caller with a solid understanding of the offense and another challenger for the starting job.

One of the spring's more interesting competitions has been at tailback, where the team is searching to identify a replacement for the all-around talents of Brooks. Junior DeBrian Holmes, who carried 44 times for 225 yards and a touchdown in 2006, has been the squad's primary back up the past two seasons. However, Holmes has missed the entire spring session rehabbing from off-season ankle surgery, leaving senior Tony Viola and redshirt freshman Courtland Marriner to handle the majority of carries in the spring. Viola brings a hard-running style to the position, while Marriner has game breaking speed and guickness.

The fullback position will also feature a rotation this spring, as returning senior starter Matt Otey will be limited by an injury. Otey is expected to be at full strength in the fall, while senior Graham Falbo and redshirt freshman Jimmy Hobson will take most of the reps in the spring.

linebacker Michael Pigram, though the strength of the unit potentially lies on the front line, where sophomore starters C.J. Herbert and Adrian Tracy return. Herbert started all 11 games at tackle as a redshirt freshman in 2006 and recorded 30 total tackles and two blocked placement kicks. Tracy, an all-conference caliber defensive end, was second on the team and second among league freshmen in 2006 with 70 total tackles and finished the year sixth in the A-10 in tackles for loss (15.5) and seventh in sacks (6.0).

> Sophomore tackle Sean Lissemore is another young promising lineman battling for a starting job, while senior Ryan Jones and redshirt freshman Bryan Jean-Pierre

are in the mix at the other defensive end position. Lissemore came on strong during his freshman season finishing with 33 total tackles, including 2.5 behind the line of scrimmage. Jones is one of the unit's three seniors and is game tested, while Jean-Pierre is another big, strong athlete developing into an all-around player.

Cox leads the secondary in an area where the team may be its youngest, but a group of young defensive backs is moving to the forefront this spring, ready to contribute. Cox led the squad with 41 unassisted tackles in 2006 and finished with 59 total stops, to go along with a team-high nine pass break-ups and an interception.

Sophomore David Caldwell appeared in all 11 games as a true freshman in 2006 and started the season finale. Caldwell recorded 37 total tackles on the year and his firstcareer interception and is transitioning to the safety position during spring drills. He was also a key special teams player, ranking fourth in the A-10 in kickoff return average (22.8).

Robert Livingston, a transfer from Western Michigan, and redshirt freshman Michael Alvarado are also all in the fold at the safety positions this spring. Livingston is a good-sized, athletic sophomore adjusting to the new scheme in his first spring with the program. Alvarado is another very athletic back who will challenge for playing time.

Versatile sophomore **David Houff**, started three games at safety in 2006, recording 20 unassisted tackles and an interception, and has seen significant time this spring at the cornerback position. Fellow sophomores Max Harris and Fred Johnson will also compete for the other starting corner spot alongside Cox. Harris was a key special teams player last season forcing a fumble and recovering a fumble in kick coverage, while finishing with eight tackles in 10 games.

Pigram moves to the front of a linebacker corps that must replace two departed all-conference players in Chris Ndubueze and Travis McLaurin and hopes for the healthy return of sophomore Josh Rutter. Senior T.J. O'Neill is the defense's most experienced returner and is using the spring drills to transition back to linebacker.

Pigram was third among all Tribe defenders last season with 69 total tackles and started all 11 games at the weak-side position. He collected 4.5 tackles for loss and forced three fumbles as well.

Rutter, who turned in one of the finest rookie seasons by a Tribe defender in 2005, was off to another solid start in 2006 before suffering season-ending knee injury in the third game against VMI. Rutter, who will be limited to non-contact drills in the spring, led the team as a freshman in '05 with 109 tackles.

Another senior, Ryan Horvath, and junior Todd Reyher are also in the mix for starting roles at linebacker.

### SPECIAL TEAMS

Another area of concern for the staff entering the spring is the special team's department, as the roster is now void of anyone with place-kicking or punting game experience after the departure of Blair Pritchard.

Redshirt freshman David Miller was a member of the travel squad last season and backed up Pritchard at both kicking and punting. Walk-on Brian Pate will also compete for a roster spot in the spring at both kicking positions.



# Jimmye Laycock

Head Coach

**28th Season** 178-127-2 Career Record

The 2007 campaign for Tribe Football will mark the 28th season in the illustrious career of head coach Jimmye Laycock. A 1970 graduate of William and Mary, Laycock is the program's winningest coach, boasting a career 178-127-2 (.583) record. Since Laycock's first season in 1980, the College has had 18 winning ledgers and played in postseason games in nine seasons.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in William and Mary's 113-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success and has steadily built his program into a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

Evidence of this is provided in the fact the Tribe averaged over 10,000 fans per game in five home dates in 2006. W&M drew a total of 53,225 spectators to Zable Stadium in 2006, an average of 10,645 per game, the program's best figure since the 1995 season.

During Laycock's tenure, the fans at Zable have consistently been treated to a winner on the field, as the program's mentor ranks in the top 10 of all active I-AA head coaches in terms of career wins. Laycock is also second among active conference head coaches in career league wins with 69. The Tribe has posted a stellar 164-77-2 (.679) record against I-AA competition under Laycock.

Laycock has made the home turf in Zable Stadium into unfriendly territory for opponents as the Tribe has won 75.6 percent of its games (91-29-1) there in the last 23 years. W&M has turned in seven undefeated regular season home campaigns.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has also tutored 30 players to 76 All-America honors from the William and Mary ranks and has coached seven Academic All-Americans. Quarterback Lang Campbell is the most decorated of all, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the I-AA ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Academic Player of the Year. The Tribe has produced an astounding 132 all-conference selections since 1993.

While no one season can define a career that spans more than two and a half decades, Laycock's 25th year at the top of the Tribe program produced levels of success never before reached at the College.

W&M set a school record for wins (11), won the Atlantic 10 Football Conference's automatic NCAA bid, hosted a NCAA semifinal game before a standing room only crowd at Zable Stadium in front of a national television audience and finished the year with a school record No. 3 final national ranking. Along the way, a bevy of school single-season records fell; total points (486), total yards (6,044) and home wins (seven), to name just a few.

But, none of these achievements spoke more succinctly to Laycock's approach than the program's 100 percent official NCAA graduation-rate report for all student-athletes receiving athletics aid. This showed W&M graduated all of its football players who entered the program as freshmen during the 1997-98 school year. The Tribe not only carried the highest graduation rate in the conference, but also was far and away the top figure of any team ranked in the final national top 25. In fact, W&M is one of only four teams in the entire I-AA top 25 to have a graduation rate of 70 percent, or better.

Laycock is married to Deidre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at the College. They have three children: Michael (16), Mary Louise (15) and James (13).

Laycock's 26-year-old daughter, Melanie, is a graduate of the University of Virginia and is a teacher in Atlanta, Ga.

### The Laycock Center

In the fall of 2007, the program will open the brand new, state-of-the-art 30,000-square foot football complex that will bear head coach Jimmye Laycock's name.

The Jimmye Laycock Football Center will be located at the northwest corner of the stadium on what is the Tribe's football practice field at a cost of \$11 million. In what could be the most exciting aspect of all, the entire funding of the project will be provided by private gifts.

The center will provide a new home for team and coaches lockers, an athletic training room, an equipment storage area, coaches offices, conference rooms, and administrative support areas – as well as an entrance that will include a Tribe Football Hall of Fame space.

LYNCHBURG, Va. (10/14/06) -- Elijah Brooks rushed for 101 yards and two touchdowns, and the Tribe hung on for a 14-13 victory over state-rival Liberty at Williams Stadium.

Brooks eclipsed the 2000-yard career rushing mark in the second quarter en route to his seventh-career 100-yard game, as W&M snapped a two-game losing streak. Archer on a 46-yard completion that set up Brooks' game-winning, 5-yard run in the third. Phillips completed two passes on the afternoon and contributed to a solid Tribe rushing attack with 42 yards on seven attempts, including a key first down run that enable W&M to run out the clock in the closing minutes.

The Flames also had an opportunity to retake the lead in the third, but senior Travis McLaurin blocked a 35-yard field goal attempt by Beasley with 1:32 on the clock.

Derek Cox paced the defense with a career-high 14 tackles, including nine unassisted, and Chris Ndubueze had a season-high 11 stops, including a key unassisted sack in the fourth quarter for a 7-yard loss on third down. Alan Wheeling finished with 11 tackles as well and had a 33-yard interception return that set up Brooks' first score, and sophomore Michael Pigram finished with 10 stops.

Phillips, who entered the game in the third quarter, threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to Joe Nicholas, and after the Tribe recovered an onside kick, Phillips scored on a 1-yard run.

Phillips finished with 107 yards on 9-of-12 passing and was the Tribe's leading rusher with 24 vards on seven attempts. Nicholas had four catches for 61 vards and tied Chris Rosier on the school's career touchdown receptions list with his 18th.






