W&M Men's Soccer to Compete at Old Dominion Tournament

William and Mary's men's soccer team will face No. 13 Clemson and Rhode Island this weekend at Old Dominion's Stihl Soccer Classic ... The Tribe will face the Tigers Friday at 4:30 PM and will take on the Rams Sunday at noon ... The matches begin a stretch of six straight games away from home for the Green and Gold ... W&M finished second at the ODU Tournament last season with a 1-0 win over Navy and a 1-1 tie with Rutgers.

About William and Mary

The Tribe enters this weekend with a 1-0-0 record, after crushing Saint Joseph's, 8-0, in the season opener at home last Saturday ... W&M received eight votes in the most recent SoccerTimes.com Division I coaches poll ... Senior forward **Andreas Nydal** leads the team in scoring with five points on two goals and one assist ... Junior forward **Jarrett Thomas** (2g, 0a), freshman forward **Andrew Hoxie** (2g, 0a) and redshirt freshman midfielder **Brock Jones** (1g, 2a) are tied for second on the team with four points each ... W&M posted a record of 9-7-4 last season and finished tied for fifth in the Colonial Athletic Association with a 4-4-1 record ... The Tribe's defense led the way in 2004, shutting out the opposition in six of 20 matches and allowing only one goal in eight more contests ... W&M allowed just 21 goals all season, the fewest since giving up just 20 in 1999 and tied for the third-fewest in a season since 1990 ... Current senior forward **Pat Scherder** was named a first team All-CAA and all-state selection and was also picked to the NSCAA All-South Atlantic Region second team in 2004.

Scoring at Home

W&M scored an impressive eight goals last Saturday in the Tribe's season-opening win over Saint Joseph's ... Three different players, senior forward Andreas Nydal, junior forward Jarrett Thomas and freshman forward Andrew Hoxie, each scored two goals for W&M, with Nydal adding an assist ... W&M scored three goals in the first 10 minutes of the match, including the first two by Hoxie, more than the Tribe scored in any one game last season ... The College's eight goals was more than the total number of W&M goals scored (seven) in the final 10 games of 2004 ... The eight goals were the most for the Tribe since defeating UNC Wilmington 8-0 on Nov. 9, 2000 in the guarterfinals of the CAA Tournament.

Hot Start for Tribe Rookies

The three players that had their college debut against Saint Joseph's all had promising starts to their careers ... Most impressive was the play of rookie forward Andrew Hoxie, who started and scored the Tribe's first two goals of the season, including the game-winner, in the first seven minutes of the match ... Redshirt freshman midfielder Brock Jones made the most of his 28 minutes of action, scoring a goal and two assists in the final 15 minutes ... Redshirt freshman Doug McBride played all 90 minutes of the game on defense, helping to shut out the Hawks, while taking three shots, including two on goal.

W&M Plays in 19th ODU Classic

This will be the 19th time that the Tribe has competed at Old Dominion's annual men's soccer tournament ... W&M has a record of 22-10-4 (.667) all-time at the event, winning the championship three times (1987, 1992 and 1998) ... Last season the Tribe went 1-0-1 at the tournament, tying Rutgers, 1-1, in double overtime and defeating Navy, 1-0 ... The Tribe competed at the event the last six seasons and every season between 1985 and 1995, after first playing at the tournament in 1978 ... W&M has won both its games at the ODU Classic six times (1985, 1986, 1988, 1993, 1994 and 1998).

Select W&M Soccer Games to be Broadcast Live on the Internet

A select number of Tribe men's and women's soccer games will be broadcast live via the Internet this season ... The first was the men's season opener on Saturday, Sept. 3 against St. Joseph's ... At least one more men's game and two more women's games are also planned to be broadcast on the web this season ... Providing the commentary for the games are former W&M men's head coach **Al Albert**, a 1969 W&M graduate, and long-time Tribe supporter **Mario Kokolis** ... The pair were joined at halftime by current Tribe women's coach

About Clemson

Clemson will enter Friday's match with a record of 2-0-0 after a 2-1 overtime win over South Carolina and a 3-1 victory over Longwood on Tuesday ... The Tigers are ranked 13th in the nation in the most recent NSCAA Division I coaches poll ... Dane Richards leads the team with five points on two goals and one assist, all coming against Longwood ... Goalkeeper Phil Marfuggi has played every minute in goal for Clemson and has a 0.94 goals against average with six saves ... The Tigers have attempted 51 shots in their first two matches of the season ... Last season Clemson finished with a record of 8-9-1, ending the Tigers' streak of 34 consecutive winning seasons.

The Clemson Series

W&M will be looking for its first win against Clemson, as the Tigers have won both of the two matches between the two teams ... Both of those games were played at Clemson ... The last time the two teams faced each other was Nov. 29, 1998 in the second round of the NCAA Tournament as the then No. 1 ranked Tigers defeated the Tribe 1-0 ... The series began with a 3-1 Clemson win on Oct. 13, 1991.

About Rhode Island

The Rams enter this weekend's tournament with a 0-1-1 record ... URI lost to UAB, 3-1, in its season opener last Friday, before tying Providence, 1-1, on Sunday ... Jeffrey Gonsalves leads the team in scoring with three points on a goal and an assist ... Lukasz Tomicz (1g, 0a) and Callum Bissett (0g, 1a) have also scored for the Rams ... Goalkeeper Dean Ruddy has played all 200 minutes this season, with a 1.80 GAA and 10 saves, allowing four goals ... Last season URI had a 12-8-1 record.

The Rhode Island Series

This will be just the second meeting between W&M and URI ... The Rams won the first game in the series, defeating the Tribe, 2-1, in Kingston, RI on Oct. 18, 1983.

Road Warriors

Last Saturday was the only chance to see the men's soccer team play at home in Williamsburg in the month of September ... Including this weekend's neutral-site games in Norfolk, W&M is on the road for six straight games and won't return to Albert-Daly Field for almost a month (Oct. 2 against UNC Wilmington) ... After the next home game against UNCW, the Tribe will hit the road for two more matches the following weekend, then return for five home matches in just 10 days.

W&M at Albert-Daly Field

W&M is 6-1-3 (.750) all-time at its home facility, Albert-Daly Field ... In 2004 the Tribe men's and women's soccer teams began play at the new grass facility named after former men's head coach Al Albert and current women's mentor John Dalv ... The Green and Gold posted a 5-1-3 record at the facility last season, including a 1-0 win over Maryland, then ranked No. 1 in the nation ... Constructed partly to aid in bringing higher quality opponents to Williamsburg, the facility paid immediate dividends, as the Tribe hosted both Maryland and Virginia Tech, the first two Atlantic Coast Conference opponents to play W&M in Williamsburg since 1996 ... Prior to last season, the Tribe's last 20 games against ACC opponents had been on the road or at neutral sites ... W&M defeated VMI, 2-1, in the first match at Albert-Dalv Field, with current junior Brendan Mc-**Curdy** scoring the first goal at the facility in the 33rd minute.

W&M Looking for 31st Straight Winning Season

The Tribe finished with a record of 9-7-4 last season, extending its streak of consecutive winning seasons to 30 ... W&M is tied with Southern Methodist for the third-longest active streak among all NCAA Divison I teams, and is tied for the fifth-longest streak in NCAA Divison I history ... Only UCLA (38) and Indiana (32) enter 2005 with longer active streaks ... The Tribe's run of winning campaigns began in 1975, when W&M went 9-4-1 on the year ... The College has had just four losing seasons since men's soccer became a varsity sport at W&M in 1967.

Tribe Picked Sixth in CAA

W&M was picked to finish sixth in the CAA in the preseason coaches poll released by the conference in early August ... The Tribe received 74 points in the poll, just five behind UNC Wilmington ... W&M finished tied for fifth in the league last season, with a 4-4-1 regular-season record against CAA opponents ... With the addition of Georgia State and Northeastern to the CAA this season, the league will expand to 12 teams, battling for just six conference tournament berths ... Georgia State and Northeastern tied for 10th place in the preseason poll.

Head Coach Chris Norris

Chris Norris enters his second season as the head coach of the William and Mary men's soccer team. He was named to the position on January 23, 2004, after nine years as a Tribe assistant and four years as a standout defender for the Green and Gold.

In Norris' first season leading the Tribe, the team extended its streak of consecutive winning seasons to 30, tied for the fifth-longest streak in NCAA Division I history. W&M went 5-1-3 in its first year at Albert-Daly Field, including a 1-0 win over top-ranked Maryland in just the second home game at the College's new facility. The Green and Gold allowed opponents to score just 21 goals all season, the fewest since 1999 and resulting in a 0.99 goals against average for the team. Five W&M players earned All-Colonial Athletic Association honors, including first team selection Pat Scherder, who also earned allstate and second team all-region accolades.

Norris joined the Tribe soccer staff in 1995 after a solid playing career at the College. He made the transition from the field to the sideline and played a major role in helping former head coach Al Albert develop one of the premier soccer programs in America.

A captain his senior year, Norris was the team's defensive leader, starting all four seasons (1991-94). During his career, W&M compiled an impressive 1.04 goals against average, including two seasons (1992 and 1994) with a team GAA of less than 1.00. He was a two-time All-CAA performer and was also selected to the VaSID All-State squad and the All-South Atlantic second team in 1994. The team's Most Valuable Player as a junior, Norris received the Coaches' Award in 1992 and earned W&M Rookie of the Year honors in 1991. Norris also earned the team's Freshman Academic Achievement Award in 1991 and graduated from the College with a degree in kinesiology.

Prior to his return to William and Mary, Norris served as junior varsity boys' soccer coach at Lafayette High School in Williamsburg. Along with his coaching duties for the Tribe, Norris is involved in coaching with the Williamsburg Soccer Club and serves as the co-director of the Tidewater Soccer Camp. He holds a National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) advanced national diploma and serves as an associate staff member for the NSCAA.
