W&M OPENS CAA PLAY AT HOME

After claiming the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic and evening its overall record at 4-4, the William and Mary men's soccer team opens the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) ledger with a pair of home affairs, Sept. 22-24. The Tribe will host Drexel on Friday, Sept. 22, at 7 p.m., before hosting Delaware at 2 p.m., on Sunday, Sept. 24.

Both Tribe home affairs will have promotions over the weekend. Friday night against Drexel will be 'Williamsburg Youth Soccer Night,' as all kids in uniform get into the match free. Sunday vs. Delaware will be 'Football/Futbol Game,' as anyone with a ticket stub from W&M's Saturday football game against VMI, receiving free admission to the soccer match.

W&M is 9-7-5 all-time in CAA openers, including a 4-2-4 ledger in Williamsburg. The College will look to snap a three-match conference opener losing streak. Last season, the Tribe lost it league opener, 3-2, at Georgia State in double overtime.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe claimed its first ODU Stihl Soccer Classic since 1998 and the fourth overall with its perfect 2-0 mark at the event.

- W&M opened the season against five straight teams that played in the NCAA Tournament a season ago. It marked the first time in school history that had occurred. Included in those five contests were four against teams ranked among the top 25 in the country (No. 1 North Carolina, No. 16 Wake Forest, No. 24 South Carolina and No. 8 Virginia Tech).

- The Tribe scored five goals in its victory over VMI. It marked the most goals the Tribe has scored in a game since the season opener in 2005. In that contest, W&M put eight goals on the board against Saint Joseph's.

- The Tribe scored five goals in its victories over VMI and UNCG, marking the first time since the 2003 campaign that the College had two games of five or more goals during a season.

- W&M notched back-to-back five-goal games against VMI and UNC Greensboro, marking the first time since the 2001 campaign that the College has accomplished the feat. In 2001, the Tribe defeated College of Charleston, 5-0, on Sept. 1, before notching a 6-1 win over Marist on Sept. 3.

- Senior Pat Scherder, junior Doug Ernst and sophomores Andrew Hoxie and Brock Jones were named to the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic All-Tournament team.

- Senior goalkeeper Kris Rake ranks 18th nationally in save percentage at .862.

- The Tribe is 8-5-7 all-time at Albert-Daly Field. The College is 2-1 during the 2006 season at home.

- The W&M-ODU game in Norfolk, Va., on Oct. 26 will be televised live on Fox Soccer Channel as part of the NSCAA/FSC College Soccer Game of the Week. It will be the 10th men's contest on television and is slated for 8 p.m. at ODU.

- Senior goalkeeper Kris Rake recorded his 12th career shutout against Stony Brook to move into a tie with Trevor Upton (1999-02) for fifth on W&M's career shutouts list.

- The schedule for the 2006 season will test the Tribe as half of its opponents made an appearance in the 2005 NCAA Tournament. Six of those teams were ranked in at least one of the major preseason top 25.

- Two former W&M players are currently playing in Major League Soccer (MLS) with another playing in the Norway. Steve Jolley (1993-96) is in his 10th season as an MLS vet, playing for Red Bull New York. He has appeared in 15 matches with 10 starts, while earning one assist. Wade Barrett (1994-97) is in his first season with the Houston Dynamo, earning 27 starts, while assisting on three goals. Former All-American Adin Brown (1996-99) is the first-team goalkeeper for Aalesunds FK in Norway. In total, over 27 former Tribe players have played pro soccer at some level.

SCOUTING DREXEL

Drexel had its four-match winning streak snapped by Soccer Seven rival Philadelphia University on Sept. 16, falling to 4-2. After dropping its season opener, 3-1, to Villanova, Drexel notched victories over St. Francis (Pa.), 1-0, Siena, 2-1 in OT, UMBC, 2-1, and Howard, 1-0. The final two victories came at the Drexel Invitational Tournament, as the Dragons defended their title from a season ago.

Freshman midfielder Fabio Assumpcao leads the Dragons in scoring with seven points on three goals and one assist. All three of his tallies on the season were game-winners for Drexel. Sophomore midfielder Mike Crosse ranked second on the team with five points and two goals, while sophomore forward Wade Gerhardt and freshman midfielder Anthony Bafile also have found the back of the net for the Dragons. Sophomore goalkeeper Cory Robertson has played every minute for the Dragons. He has posted a goals against average of 0.99 with 19 saves and two shutouts.

The Tribe is a perfect 6-0 all-time against the Dragons, including a 2-1 victory in Philadelphia, Pa., a season ago. W&M scored a pair of second-half goals to erase at 1-0 Drexel lead as Jarrett Thomas scored on a volley off a header from Andrew Hoxie for the game-winner. The Tribe has outscored Drexel, 15-4, in the team's six previous meetings.

SCOUTING DELAWARE

The Blue Hens are coming off their first defeat of the season, 2-0, to Villanova after opening the season unbeaten in their first four contests for the first time since 1978. Delaware opening the season by claiming the Towson University Kickoff Tournament with a perfect 2-0 mark, defeating Adelphi, 2-0, and Loyola (Md.), 3-2. It marked the first time since 1995 that Delaware started a season 2-0. The Blue Hens have also tied George Washington, 0-0, and Navy, 1-1. Delaware sits at 2-1-2 and will play at No. 13 (College Soccer News) Old Dominion on Friday, Sept. 22, before traveling to Williamsburg.

Junior forward Sobhan Tadjalli leads the Blue Hens with six points and three goals on the young season. Sophomore forward Matt Laudeman ranks second on the team with five points on two goals and an assist. Junior midfielder Tal Blau has also found the back of the net, scoring against Adelphi for Delaware. Sophomore goalkeeper Taylor Thames has played every minute for the

Blue Hens with 22 saves, a goals against average of 1.15 and two shutouts.

The Tribe has never lost to the Blue Hens in the teams' previous eight meetings. W&M owns a 7-0-1 all-time mark against Delaware, including a 3-0 ledger in Williamsburg. In the eight all-time meetings, the Tribe has outscored the Blue Hens, 28-3. A season ago, Brock Jones followed up a saved shot from Doug Ernst to provide all the cushion the Tribe would need in a 1-0 victory at Delaware.

TRIBE CLAIMS ODU STIHL SOCCER CLASSIC

By virtue of its victories over then-No. 29 (College Soccer News) UNC Greensboro, 5-1, and Loyola (Md.), 2-1, W&M claimed the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic. The Tribe and host ODU both finished with perfect 2-0 record, but the Tribe took the title as a result of a better goal differential thanks in large part to its offensive outburst against UNC Greensboro.

In the opening match of the classic, the Tribe scored early and often in the victory over the Spartans. Senior forward Pat Scherder started the barrage with a goal in the fifth minute, before sophomore frontrunner Andrew Hoxie added the second, sending the College to a 2-0 halftime lead. Scherder added his second and junior Doug Ernst scored in the 70th minute before the Spartans got on the board three minutes later. Hoxie iced the game with his second tally of the contest in the closing minutes.

In the second game of the classic against Loyola (Md.), the Tribe again scored early on a goal from Ernst in the 17th minute, but the Greyhounds tied it up before the half. Sophomore Brock Jones added what proved to be the game-winner a minute into the second stanza as the Tribe dominated the second 45 minutes, outshooting Loyola (Md.), 14-4.

The College improved to 24-12-4 (.650) all-time at the event, winning the championship for the fourth time in its 20-year history at the classic. W&M won both its games at the event for the seventh time.

HOXIE TAKES HOME HONORS

After leading W&M to the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic crown, sophomore forward Andrew Hoxie was named the MVP of the tournament. Hoxie scored a pair of goals in the College's 5-1 win over then-No. 29 UNC Greensboro, before assisting on the College's first goal against Loyola (Md.).

The Newport News, Va., native received conference and national honors as a result of his performance at the classic. He became the first Tribe player since Kris Rake on Sept. 27, 2004, to earn CAA Brine Player of the Week honors. Hoxie also was named to the Top Drawer Soccer National Team of the Week.

For the season, Hoxie leads the Tribe in points (10) and goals (4). Those numbers also ranked second in the CAA.

ANSWERING THE CALL

Before the season, head coach Chris Norris said he had high expectations for junior midfielder Doug Ernst. The third-year head man of the Green and Gold felt it was time for the Alexandria, Va., native to step up his offensive production, given his success at the prep and club levels. This season, Ernst has answered the call and is enjoying a breakout season.

Ernst has found the back of the net in each of the Tribe's last three contests, adding assists in two of the affairs. At the ODU Soccer Classic, Ernst added a goal and an assist in both contests, capping the weekend by dishing out the game-winner to sophomore Brock Jones in the Tribe's 2-1 win over Loyola (Md.). He garnered All-Tournament honors for his efforts.

Ernst is tied with sophomore Andrew Hoxie for the team lead in points with 10. He also tops the team in assists with four. His 10 points and four assists also rank second in the CAA, while his three goals are tied for fourth in the conference.

DOWN RIGHT DEFENSIVE

Despite playing one of the toughest early season schedules in the country, the Tribe defense has held strong. Through the first eight games of the season, the W&M defense has only allowed seven goals, including only one tally in the second half. The back four of seniors Brendan McCurdy and Jeff Marklin along with junior Chris Wayne and freshman Roger Bothe have anchored a defense with a 0.88 goals against average, playing three top-10 and five ranked teams along the way.

W&M owns shutout victories over Stony Brook and VMI. Senior Kris Rake and junior Brennan Wergley have proven to be an impressive combo. As a team, W&M ranks among the national leaders in save percentage at 28th with a percentage of .848. Individually, Rake is 18th nationally with a save percentage of .862.

SCORING WITH A QUICKNESS INTO THE RECORD BOOKS

The Tribe broke open a 1-0 halftime lead with goals 20 seconds apart in the 60th minute and a trio of tallies just over three minutes apart against VMI. Sophomore forward Andrew Hoxie chipped the goalkeeper from 35 yards after a failed clearance at 60:23, before freshman midfielder Price Thomas hammered home a volley from six-yards out on a cross from senior forward Pat Scherder at 60:43. Junior Chris Wayne added a bending free kick from 25 yards out at 63:28, giving W&M three straight scores in 3:05.

The 3:05 time span between the trio of Tribe goals was the 11th fastest between three goals by one team in NCAA history. The 3:05 was also the fastest in the NCAA since three UMBC players (Drew Perkins, John Clark and Larry Scheller) scored 1:46 apart in a victory over Valparaiso on Oct. 12, 2001.

The W&M goals 20 seconds apart established a school record for the fastest two consecutive goals. The 20-second mark

also ranks as the 21st-fastest consecutive goals by a team in NCAA history. According to the 2006 NCAA Men's and Women's Soccer Record Book, it is also the fastest set of goals for a single team in nearly four years. The last time one team scored 20 seconds apart came on Sept. 27, 2002 when Mike Rosenthal and M.J. Serota of UMKC scored 20 seconds apart against Denver.

RETURN TO HEALTH

After missing the majority of the 2005 season with an injury, senior forward Pat Scherder has shown he is back to full strength in 2006. Scherder ranks third on the team with eight points on three goals and two assists. He ranks fourth in the CAA in goals and fifth in both points and assists.

Scherder notched his first career two-goal performance in the Tribe's 5-1 win over then-No. 29 UNC Greensboro at the ODU Soccer Classic. He went on to earn All-Tournament honors as the event, marking the second time he earned an All-Tournament honor this season. He also garnered the accolade at the Wake Forest adidas Classic to open the year.

Against Stony Brook, Scherder not only iced the game with his second-half goal, but started for the first time in nearly a year. Scherder last started a match on Sept. 9, 2005 against Clemson. The Vienna, Va., native earned first-team all-conference and second-team all-region accolades as a junior in 2004, but missed the final 15 games of last season. The speedy forward leads all current Tribe players in career goals with 19.

GAME OF FIRST

Four different W&M players scored their first career goals in the 5-0 victory over VMI. Junior midfielder Doug Ernst scored his first career goal, the game-winner, in the 26th minute of play to lead the Tribe firsts. Freshman midfielder Price Thomas, junior back Chris Wayne and sophomore forward Nathan Belcher each scored the first tallies of their career in the second half to push

the Tribe to victory. Sophomore forward Andrew Hoxie led W&M with three points on a goal and an assist. It marked the first time in his career that Hoxie recorded both a tally and a helper in a single game.

Price Thomas scored on a volley in the six-yard box in the 60th minute. Wayne notched the Tribe's fourth tally of the contest at the 63:28 mark off a free kick, bending it inside the near post to the upper left corner of the goal. In his first career appearance for W&M, Belcher scored less than five minutes after entering the contest to give the College a 5-0 lead. Senior forward Jarrett Thomas hit an outside-footed shot from a severe angle on goal. The VMI goalkeeper made the diving save to deny the chance, but Belcher was there to clean up the mess, pushing the ball in from six yards out.

Along with Belcher, redshirt freshman midfielder Preston Whitlock and senior goalkeeper Scott Kelsey made the first appearances of their W&M careers against the Keydets. Kelsey played the final 16:54 in net, but was not tested.

FRESHMAN STARTERS

Freshmen Price Thomas and Roger Bothe have wasted little time making a significant impact on the W&M program. Thomas has started every game at the attacking midfielder position and tallied his first career goal against VMI. He has added a flare and creativity to the Tribe attack. Bothe, the 2005-06 Gatorade Virginia State Player of the Year, has appeared in all eight Tribe games, including starts in the last seven at back. The Chester, Va., native has shown solid skills defending as well as the ability to make runs up the flanks and get into the offensive attack.
