TRIBE SET FOR ODU STIHL SOCCER CLASSIC

The William and Mary men's soccer team will travel to Norfolk, Va., to take part in the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic for the 20th time. The Tribe will face #29 (College Soccer News) UNC Greensboro on Friday, Sept. 15, at 4:30 p.m., before squaring off with Loyola (Md.) on Sunday, Sept. 17, at 12 p.m.

The College is 22-12-4 (.632) all-time at the event, winning the championship on three times (1987, 1992 and 1998). The Tribe competed in the classic each of the last seven seasons and every season between 1985 and 1995, after first playing at the tournament in 1978. W&M has won both its games at the event on six occasions (1985, 1986, 1988, 1993, 1994 and 1998). Last season, W&M fell, 3-2, in both games against Rhode Island and in double overtime against then-No. 13 and eventual College Cup semifinalist Clemson.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- W&M opened the season against five straight teams that played in the NCAA Tournament a season ago. It marked the first time in school history that had occurred. Included in those five contests were four games against teams ranked among the top 25 in the country (No. 1 North Carolina, No. 16 Wake Forest, No. 24 South Carolina and No. 8 Virginia Tech).

- The Tribe scored five goals in its victory over VMI. It marked the most goals the Tribe has scored in a game since the season opener in 2005. In that contest, W&M put eight goals on the board against Saint Joseph's.

- Seniors Pat Scherder, Brendan McCurdy and Jeff Marklin earned All-Tournament honors at the season-opening Wake Forest adidas Classic.

- Senior goalkeeper Kris Rake ranks 18th nationally in save percentage at 87.5 percent.

- The Tribe is 8-5-7 all-time at Albert-Daly Field. The College is 2-1 during the 2006 season at home.

- The W&M-ODU game in Norfolk, Va., on Oct. 26 will be televised live on Fox Soccer Channel as part of the NSCAA/FSC College Soccer Game of the Week. It will be the 10th men's contest on television and is slated for 8 p.m. at ODU.

- The schedule for the 2006 season will test the Tribe as half of its opponents made an appearance in the 2005 NCAA Tournament. Six of those teams were ranked in at least one of the major preseason top 25.

- Two former W&M players are currently playing in Major League Soccer with another playing in the Norway. Steve Jolley (1993-96) is in his 10th season as an MLS vet, playing for Red Bull New York. He has appeared in 15 matches with 10 starts, while earning one assist. Wade Barrett (1994-97) is in his first season with the Houston Dynamo, earning 26 starts, while assisting on three goals. Former All-American Adin Brown (1996-99) is the first-team goalkeeper for Aalesunds FK in Norway. In total, over 27 former Tribe players have played professional soccer at some level.

SCOUTING UNC GREENBORO

The Spartans are coming off a 1-1 split at the UNC Greenboro Classic, Sept. 8-10. UNCG dropped the opener, 3-2, to UAB, before rolling past Belmont, 5-2, to close the tournament. The Spartans are 4-2 on the year with victories over Jacksonville, Stetson, Campbell and Belmont, while they suffered losses at the hands of VCU and UAB. UNC Greenboro is one of the top scoring teams in the country, averaging nearly three goals per game to ranked sixth nationally.

UNCG is led by a pair of Missouri Athletic Club Hermann Trophy candidates in the form of forward Randi Patterson and midfielder Scott Jones. After missing the previous two games due to a conference suspension, Patterson erupted for a hat trick in the 5-2 win over Belmont. For the season, he leads UNCG with five goals and 10 points in just three games. Jones is tied for second on the team with eight points on two goals and four assists. Michael FitzGerald also has eight points for the Spartans with four goals.

Chad Janda and Nate Berry have both seen time in goal for the Spartans. Janda is 2-0 with two starts. He started the last game against Belmont and has a goals against average of 2.00 with five saves. Berry has started the other four games for UNCG. He has a goals against average of 2.08 with 11 saves and a shutout.

The meeting will be the eighth in the Tribe-Spartan series history. W&M holds a 4-2-1 advantage, and it will be the first meeting between the two at a neutral site. The Spartans claimed a wild, 4-3, victory in Greenboro a season ago. UNCG scored off a free kick with less than a minute remaining to claim the victory. The Tribe overcame a pair of two-goal deficits to draw even at three in the 81st minute. Andrew Hoxie, Brendan McCurdy and Jarrett Thomas all added goals in the contest, while Thomas also provided the assist on McCurdy's equalizer.

SCOUTING LOYOLA (Md.)

The Greyhounds enter the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic with a 0-4-1 record on the year. Loyola has dropped contests to Delaware, Syracuse, Princeton and American, while forging a tie with Towson.

Omar Alfonso and Rade Kokovic top Loyola in points with five apiece on the year. Both players have a goal and three assists. Jamie Darvill is the top scorer for the Greyhound, having scored two goals on the season. Goalkeeper Justin Chelland has played every minute in net for the Greyhounds. He has a goals against average of 2.29 with 22 saves. Kokovic and Gabriel Ortega were named to the preseason All-MAAC team. The Greyhounds were picked second in the preseason MACC coaches poll.

In its last contest against American, the Greyhounds could not overcome an early second-half two-goal deficit, falling 2-1. American scored 49 seconds out of the halftime break to take a 2-0 lead. Loyola cut it to 2-1 on a goal from Darvill, but could not find the equalizer. Chelland finished with three saves in net for the Greyhounds, while American held a 13-11 shot advantage.

The meeting between the Tribe and the Greyhounds will be the 24th in the series history. W&M owns an 11-9-3 cushion in the all-time series, but Loyola holds a 2-0-1 advantage at neutral sites. The Tribe won the last meeting between the two schools, 2-1, at Loyola on Sept. 18, 2004.

INTO THE RECORD BOOKS

The Tribe broke open a 1-0 halftime lead with goals 20 seconds apart in the 60th minute against VMI. Sophomore forward Andrew Hoxie chipped the goalkeeper from 35 yards after a failed clearance at 60:23, before freshman midfielder Price Thomas hammered home a volley from six-yards out on a cross from senior forward Pat Scherder at 60:43.

The W&M goals 20 seconds apart established a school record for the fastest two consecutive goals. The 20-second mark also ranks as the 21st-fastest consecutive goals by a team in NCAA history. According to the 2005 NCAA Men's and Women's Soccer Record Book, it is also the fastest set of goals for a single team in nearly four years. The last time one team scored 20 seconds apart came on Sept. 27, 2002 when Mike Rosenthal and M.J. Serota of UMKC scored 20 seconds apart against Denver.

GAME OF FIRST

Four different W&M players scored their first career goals in the 5-0 victory over VMI. Junior midfielder Doug Ernst scored his first career goal, the game-winner, in the 26th minute of play to lead the Tribe firsts. Freshman midfielder Price Thomas, junior back Chris Wayne and sophomore forward Nathan Belcher each scored the first tallies of their career in the second half to push the Tribe to victory. Sophomore forward Andrew Hoxie led W&M with three points on a goal and an assist. It marked the first time in his career that Hoxie recorded both a tally and a helper in a single game.

Price Thomas scored on a volley in the six-yard box in the 60th minute. Wayne notched the Tribe's fourth tally of the contest at the 63:28 mark off a free kick, bending it inside the near post to the upper left corner of the goal. In his first career appearance for W&M, Belcher scored less than five minutes after entering the contest to give the College a 5-0 lead. Senior forward Jarrett Thomas hit an outside-footed shot from a serve angle on goal. The VMI goalkeeper made the diving save to deny the chance, but Belcher was there to clean up the mess, pushing the ball in from six yards out.

Along with Belcher, redshirt freshman midfielder Preston Whitlock and senior goalkeeper Scott Kelsey made the first appearances of their W&M careers against the Keydets. Kelsey played the final 16:54 in net, but was not tested.

HOXIE ENJOYING THE HOME PITCH

Sophomore forward Andrew Hoxie definitely enjoys the home pitch of Albert-Daly Field. During the opening 11 games of his career at home, the Newport News, Va., native has scored six of his seven career goals at home. Both Hoxie's two career game-winners have come at home through the early stages of his sophomore campaign. In fact, Hoxie notched the game-winner

in the home opener each of the last two seasons. He recorded a pair of goals against Saint Joseph's a season ago, before tallying the game-winner against Stony Brook on Aug. 30. In the Tribe's last home game against VMI, Hoxie notched his first career game with a goal and an assist. He assisted on what proved to be the game-winner.

DOWN RIGHT DEFENSIVE

Despite playing one of the toughest early season schedules in the country, the Tribe defense has held strong and given itself a chance in games against top-25 programs. Through the first six games of the season, the W&M defense has only allowed five goals, including zero in the second half. The back four of seniors Brendan McCurdy and Jeff Marklin along with junior Chris Wayne and freshman Roger Bothe have anchored a defense with a 0.83 goals against average, playing three top-10 teams along the way.

W&M owns shutout victories over Stony Brook and VMI. Senior Kris Rake and junior Brennan Wergley have proven to be an impressive combo. As a team, W&M ranks among the national leaders in save percentage at 16th with a percentage .872. Individually, Rake is 18th nationally with a save percentage of .875.

MARCHING UP THE CLEAN SHEET LIST

Senior goalkeeper Kris Rake recorded his first shutout of the season and the 12th of his career with three saves in the Tribe's home-opening win over Stony Brook. The shutout moved Rake into a tie for fifth on the W&M career shutouts list. His 12th clean sheet equaled the total of Trevor Upton (1999-02).

W&M-ODU TELEVISED ON FSC

The Tribe's Oct. 26 road contest with Old Dominion gained a little more importance, as it was announced as part of the NSCAA and Fox Soccer Channel (FSC) College Soccer Game of the Week television package for the 2006 season. The W&M-ODU rivalry at the 4,000-seat ODU soccer Stadium will be televised live on FSC as part of the 12-game Thursday/Friday night package.

In June of 2006, FSC and the NSCAA announced that they extended their agreement through 2008. FSC will televise at least eight men's and eight women's games each year. The W&M-ODU match up will be the 10th College Soccer Game of the Week telecast on Oct. 26 at 8 p.m. The College owns a 20-16-8 (.545) all-time mark against ODU, but the Monarchs have won the last three affairs between the two schools.

Sean Wheelock, a veteran of Major League Soccer broadcasts and other MLS programming, including the MLS Super-Draft, will serve as the primary announcer for each game.

Santa Barbara, California-based Cultural Videos Communications is returning for a second season to coordinate the production of all the men's and women's NSCAA matches on Fox Soccer Channel. Cultural Videos Founder David Bolton, who also produces USL and MLS coverage on Fox Soccer Channel, will again serve as director/producer of the FSC college package.

The 2006 version will feature 16 teams ranked in the 2006 NSCAA/adidas preseason rankings, including No. 1 Maryland, No. 2 Connecticut, No. 4 Virginia, No. 5 North Carolina, No. 5 Clemson, No. 10 UCLA, No. 12 Indiana, No. 13 Penn State, No. 14 Duke, No. 16 Wake Forest, No. 17 St. John's, No. 18 South Florida,

No. 21 UNC Greensboro, No. 22 UC Santa Barbara, No. 23 Old Dominion and No. 25 Washington.

RETURN TO HEALTH

After missing the majority of the 2005 season with an injury, senior forward Pat Scherder has shown he is back to full strength in 2006. Against Stony Brook, Scherder not only iced the game with his second-half goal, but started for the first time in nearly a year. Scherder last started a match on Sept. 9, 2005 against Clemson. The Vienna, Va., native earned first-team all-conference and second-team all-region accolades as a junior in 2004, but missed the final 15 games of last season. The speedy forward leads all current Tribe players in career goals with 17. For the season, Scherder has three points on a goal and an assist.

After enjoying a successful return to the pitch over the summer with the Williamsburg Legacy of the PDL, Scherder wasted little time finding his scoring touch. In the Tribe's lone exhibition

of the season, Scherder found the back of the net in the 37th minute against Navy, giving the Tribe a 1-0 cushion

During the PDL season, Scherder finished second on the Legacy in points (11) and goals (5). He notched a pair of two-goal games for Williamsburg, including the final one against Raleigh Elite on July 21. In the game against Raleigh Elite, the Legacy overcame a three-goal first-half deficit to forge a tie. Scherder scored the final two Legacy goals in the 51st and 54th minutes. In total, Scherder started all 15 games in which he appeared, racking up 1074 minutes.

FRESHMAN STARTERS

Freshmen Price Thomas and Roger Bothe have wasted little time making a significant impact on the W&M program. Thomas has started every game at the attacking midfielder position and tallied his first career goal against VMI. He has added a flare and creativity to the Tribe attack. Bothe, the 2005-06 Gatorade Virginia State Player of the Year, has appeared in all six Tribe games, including starts in the last five at back. The Chester, Va., native has shown solid skills defending as well as the ability to
