W&M OPENS HOME SLATE VS. DEFENDING CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS

After opening the season against a pair of top-20 teams at the Wake Forest adidas Classic, the road does not get any easier for the William and Mary men's soccer team. The Tribe will open the home portion of its ledger against a pair of defending conference champions. Defending America East Champ Stony Brook will travel to Williamsburg on Wednesday, Aug. 30 at 7 p.m., before Conference USA Champion and No. 24 South Carolina makes the trek on Saturday, Sept. 2, at 7 p.m.

W&M will begin its third season of competition at Albert-Daly Field with the contests against a pair of teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2005. Both games can also be heard live over the Internet by visiting TribeAthletics.com.

W&M HOME GAMES LIVE OVER THE INTERNET

HOME OPENER SUCCESS

The Tribe has enjoyed a successful start to the home season during its history. Since 1970, W&M is 28-6-2 (.806) in home openers, including a 2-0 record in head coach Chris Norris' first two seasons. A season ago, the Tribe opened the home ledger with an offensive explosion against Saint Joseph's, an 8-0 victory. In 2005, three Tribe players, Andrew Hox-

ie, Jarrett Thomas and Andreas Nydal notched two-goal performances in the victory over Saint Joseph's.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- W&M opens the season against five straight teams that played in the NCAA Tournament a season ago. It marks that first time in school history that has occurred.

- Seniors Pat Scherder, Brendan McCurdy and Jeff Marklin earned All-Tournament honors at the season-opening Wake Forest adidas Classic.

- W&M is 28-6-2 all-time in home openers. The Tribe is a perfect 2-0 at Albert-Daly Field and under the direction of head coach Chris Norris.

- The Tribe is 6-4-7 in the opening two season at Albert-Daly Field.

- Junior goalkeeper Brennan Wergley has recorded six more or saves in all seven games of his W&M career, including a seven-save performance against then-No. 16 Wake Forest.

SCOUTING STONY BROOK

Stony Brook won its first America East Championship in 2005 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Seawolves finished 2005 with a 13-5-4 record and an RPI of 45. Stony Brook was tabbed third in the preseason coaches poll for the America East, trailing Vermont and Boston University.

The Seawolves dropped their opening contest of the season, 3-0, at Fairleigh Dickinson. The Knights scored once before half-time prior to adding a pair in the 63rd and 78th minutes. Stony Brook was outshot, 14-8, in contest. E.J. Xikis started in net for the Seawolves and finished with five saves.

Junior midfielder Michael Palacio led the Seawolves in scoring during the 2005 season with 25 points on seven goals and 11 assists. Xikis started 13 games in goal for Stony Brook in 2005, compiling an 8-4-2 record with a GAA of 0.90 and three shut-outs.

The meeting between Stony Brook and W&M will be the first between the two schools.

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

South Carolina evened its record at 1-1 with a 2-0 victory over Wofford on Aug. 28. The Gamecocks dropped their season opener to Clemson on Aug. 25, 4-3. South Carolina is the defending Conference USA Champion after winning the league tournament and advancing to the NCAA Tournament a season ago.

South Carolina garnered a quartet of top-30 rankings during the preseason, topping out at No. 16 in the Top Drawer Soccer poll. The Gamecocks were also ranked No. 29 according to College Soccer News and No. 24 according to the NSCAA and Soccer Times. The next NSCAA poll will not be released until Sept. 5. Following its loss to Clemson, the Gamecocks fell out of the rankings in the College Soccer News, Soccer Times and Soccer America polls. The Gamecocks are still receiving votes in the Soccer Times and College Soccer News polls, while holding down the No. 17 spot according to Top Drawer Soccer.

Against Wofford, the Gamecocks received a first half goal

from Spencer Lewis, before Ayo Akinsete capped the contest with a goal at the 67-minute mark. The goal for Lewis was his first career tally, while Akinsete's marker was his first of the season. Mike Gustavson finished with two saves to earn his fifth career shutout.

South Carolina opened the season with a 4-3 loss at the hands of No. 5 Clemson on Aug. 25. The Gamecocks led the contest on three different occasions, but could not overcome Dane Richards pair of goals in the final 20 minutes of action. Sophomore midfielder David Smith notched two goals in the contest for South Carolina, the first two of his career. Rob Charest added the lone other Gamecock goal. Mike Gustavson played the entire contest in goal, finishing with two saves.

The Gamecocks own a 3-1 advantage in the series with the Tribe. The last time the two teams squared off, South Carolina notched a 2-1 victory in Columbia, S.C., to open the 2004 season. Pat Scherder scored the Tribe's lone goal of the contest to even it at one in the 43rd minute, while the Gamecocks scored the game-winner in the 51st minute. The meeting between South Carolina and W&M will be the first in Williamsburg.

IMPRESSIVE PERFORMANCES IN NET

The Tribe received a pair of impressive efforts in goal from senior Kris Rake against No. 1 UNC and from junior Brennan Wergley against No. 16 Wake Forest. Rake finished the game versus UNC with nine saves. The nine saves were the second-highest total in his career. He recorded a career-high 10 stops against then-No. 1 Maryland on Sept. 22, 2004 and Sept. 27, 2003 versus then-No. 5 St. John's.

Wergley started against the Demon Deacons and recorded seven saves, including denying a penalty kick in the first half. Wergley has recorded six or more saves in all seven of his career starts.

WAKE FOREST ADIDAS CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

The senior trio of forward Pat Scherder and backs Jeff Marklin and Brendan McCurdy earned All-Tournament honors for their efforts at the Wake Forest adidas Classic. The three Tribe players were joined on the squad by Central Florida's Akin Akinrinade and Jake Howard, North Carolina's Justin Hughes, Andre Sherard and Ted Odgers as well as Austin da Luz, Julian Valentin,

Ryan Solle and Sam Cronin of Wake Forest. Marklin and McCurdy started both games in central defense as the Tribe dropped a pair of tough contests to top-20 foes. Scherder came on as a sub at the forward position for the College and provided a spark with his speedy and hustle in the offensive third.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS

True freshmen Roger Bothe and Price Thomas earned the first starts of their W&M careers at the Wake Forest adidas Classic. Thomas started both games against No. 1 UNC and No. 16 Wake Forest in the attacking midfield position, while Bothe came off the bench against North Carolina before starting as a back against the Demon Deacons. After redshirting in 2005 with injuries, midfielder Jeremy Harris saw the first playing time of his career against both UNC and Wake Forest. True freshman Rob Godwin also saw the pitch for the first time in his young Tribe career against UNC.

DIFFICULT WAY TO START

The opening of the 2006 season will not be an easy one for the Tribe as each of its first five opponents appeared in the NCAA Tournament a season ago. North Carolina advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament, while Wake Forest made it to the Round of 16. Both Stony Brook and Virginia Tech made it to the second round of the tournament, while South Carolina made the field before falling in the opening round. It marks the first time in school history W&M will not only open the season, but play five-straight regular-season foes that advanced to the NCAA Tournament the previous season.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

The schedule for the 2006 season will test the Tribe as half of opponents made an appearance in the 2005 NCAA Tournament. Six of those teams were ranked in the preseason top 25 of either the Soccer America (SA), NSCAA, College Soccer News (CSN) or the Soccer Times (ST) polls, with two others receiving votes in the CSN poll. The ledger will be highlighted by matches against No. 1 (SA) North Carolina, No. 12 UNC Greensboro (SA), No. 16 (NSCAA) Wake Forest, No. 19 (SA) Virginia Tech, No. 20 (CSN) Old Dominion and No. 24 (NSCAA) South Carolina. Along with the six, James Madison, Hofstra and Stony Brook are Tribe foes that made appearances in the 2005 NCAA Tournament.

WELCOME BACK

W&M got a welcomed return for the 2006 season in the form of fifth-year senior forward Pat Scherder. The Vienna, Va., native missed the final 15 games of the 2005 season with an injury after earning first-team all-conference and second-team all-region accolades as a junior in 2004. The speedy forward leads all current Tribe players in career goals with 17.

After enjoying a successful return to the pitch over the summer with the Williamsburg Legacy of the PDL, Scherder wasted little time finding his scoring touch. In the Tribe's lone exhibition of the season, Scherder found the back of the net in the 37th minute against Navy, giving the Tribe a 1-0 cushion.

RETURNING THE SPRING PUNCH

The Tribe returns 72.4 percent (21-of-29) of its goals from a season ago. Included in the number are four of the top-five goal scorers and players with the top-three point totals on the team from a season ago. Senior Jarrett Thomas topped the squad in both goals (7) and points (16) a season ago, while sophomores Brock Jones and Andrew Hoxie finished tied for second on the team with five goals apiece. The pair rounded out the top-three point scorers for the Tribe with 12 and 11 points, respectively. Senior Brendan McCurdy ranked fifth on the team a season ago with three goals.

FRESHMAN TO WATCH

College Soccer News named freshman Roger Bothe as one of its top 100 freshmen to keep an eye on in 2006. The College

was one of 59 institutions to have at least one player named to the watch list and one of only three in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA).

Bothe was one of four CAA players to be recognized by College Soccer News. Evan Newton of Old Dominion as well as Richard Edger and Sean Kelley of George Mason were also named to the list. Bothe was one of 24 defenders on the top 100 freshmen to watch list.

The 6-2, 170-pound back enjoyed a stellar prep career prior to joining the Tribe. He led his Thomas Dale High School team to back-to-back 24-0 records with a pair of Group AAA State Championships in 2004 and 2005. Bothe garnered the 2005-06 Gatorade Virginia High School Player of the Year award, along with garnering the Virginia High School Coaches Association (VHSL) Group AAA Male Athlete of the Year honor. He also received Central Region Player of the Year honors and studentsportssoccer.com Second-Team All-America distinction in 2005.

ANOTHER ROOKIE TO KEEP AN EYE ON

Rookie Price Thomas earned the start in each of his first two games with the Tribe against No. 1 North Carolina and No. 16 Wake Forest. The Charlottesville, Va., native scored 25 goals and dished out 20 assists during his prep career at Albemarle. Thomas garnered First-Team Commonwealth District honors in 2005 and 2006, as well as All-Northwest Region and All-Central Virginia nods during his junior and senior years of high school. Head coach Chris Norris described Thomas as a player with "flare, creativity and athleticism that has the ability to break down an opponent's defense with and without the ball."

MAKING THE MOVE

After playing 51 games and scoring eight goals for W&M as a forward, senior Brendan McCurdy moved to center back during the 2006 spring and summer seasons. McCurdy enjoyed success as one of the defensive backbones for the Williamsburg Legacy of the PDL, helping the squad to five shutouts during the regular season. He continued to demonstrate leadership on the backline for the Tribe in the Wake Forest adidas Classic against a pair of top-20 teams in North Carolina and Wake Forest.

PDL SUCCESS

Seven Tribe players played in the United Soccer League's (USL) Premier Development League (PDL) over the summer. Six of those players saw their teams earn a spot in a Eastern Conference playoffs with the Williamsburg Legacy and the Virginia Beach Submariners.

Seniors Jeff Marklin, Brendan McCurdy, Kris Rake and Patrick Scherder along with sophomore Andrew Hoxie played for the Legacy over the summer. Junior back Chris Wayne saw time with the Submariners, while freshman Roger Bothe played for the Richmond Future Kickers.

The Legacy claimed the lone wild-card spot in the Eastern Conference with 28 points and an 8-4-4 regular season record. The Virginia Beach Submariners earned a playoff bid by winning the Mid-Atlantic Division with 31 points and a 10-5-1 record.

Scherder finished the season second on the Legacy in points (11) and goals (5). He notched a pair of two-goal games for Williamsburg, including the final one against Raleigh Elite on July 21. In the game against Raleigh Elite, the Legacy overcame a three-goal first-half deficit to forge a tie. Scherder scored the final two Legacy goals in the 51st and 54th minutes with Hoxie assisting on the final goal. McCurdy also notched an assist in the comeback helping on the Legacy's first goal in the 36th minute. In total, Scherder started all 15 games in which he appeared, racking up 1074 minutes.

Hoxie played 12 games for the Legacy with eight starts. The 2005 CAA All-Rookie Team selection ranked third on the team with seven points and second with three assists. He earned PDL Team of the Week honors with five points on two goals and an assists against the Richmond Kickers on July 23, including the eventual game-winner as the Legacy clinched a playoff berth.

Marklin, McCurdy and Rake were key contributors to the Legacy's defense. Overall, Williamsburg finished the regular season with a goals against average of 1.25 and five shutouts. During the 16-game slate, the Legacy only allowed 20 goals, which ranked 14th in the 59-team PDL and third in the Eastern Conference.

Marklin played in 11 matches with seven starts, totaling 701 minutes in the Legacy defense. McCurdy was a constant for the Williamsburg squad in the back as he started 16 matches and played the maximum 1440 minutes during those contests.

Rake started the first seven games of the season for the Legacy in goal. He amassed a 3-1-3 record with an impressive goals against average of 0.86. He notched 36 saves with three shutouts. Rake blanked three of the Legacy's first four opponents.

Wayne appeared in 10 matches with five starts for Virginia Beach. He totaled 387 minutes of action and notched a goal from his back position. His goal capped a 4-0 victory over the West
