- After not playing an overtime game in the first 11 matches of the season, four of the Tribe's last five contests have gone to extra time. W&M is 1-0-3 in overtime affairs.
- Junior midfielder Doug Ernst leads the CAA in assists with seven on the year.
- Junior goalkeeper Brennan Wergley recorded his first shutout of the season and fourth of his career against then-No. 22 George Mason on Oct. 15. He made four saves in preserving the 0-0 stalemate.
- Scoring goals for W&M in 2006 has led to results. The Tribe is 6-0-2 when it has scored at least one goal and 0-7-1 when it is shutout.
- W&M opened the CAA portion of the schedule with a 4-0 victory over Drexel on Sept. 22. It marked the first time the Tribe had won its CAA opener in four seasons.

- Despite 16 career goals, senior forward Pat Scherder entered the 2006 season having never tallied a multigoal game. His final campaign in the Green and Gold has been a different story as Scherder notched two-goal contests in a 5-1 win over then-No. 29 UNC Greensboro on Sept. 15 and in a 2-2 come-from-behind tie with No. 23 James Madison on Oct. 10.
- The Tribe claimed its first ODU Stihl Soccer Classic title since 1998 and the fourth overall with its perfect 2-0 mark at the event.
- -W&M opened the season against five straight teams that played in the NCAA Tournament a season ago. It marked the first time in school history that had occurred. Included in those five contests were four against teams ranked among the top 25 in the country (No. 1 North Carolina, No. 16 Wake Forest, No. 24 South Carolina and No. 8 Virginia Tech).
- The Tribe scored five goals in its victory over VMI. It marked the most goals the Tribe has scored in a game since the season opener in 2005. In that contest, W&M put eight goals on the board against Saint Joseph's.
- The Tribe scored five goals in its victories over VMI and UNCG, marking the first time since the 2003 campaign that the College had two games of five or more goals during a season.
- W&M notched back-to-back five-goal games against VMI and UNC Greensboro, marking the first time since the 2001 campaign that the College has accomplished the feat. In 2001, the Tribe defeated College of Charleston, 5-0, on Sept. 1, before notching a 6-1 win over Marist on Sept. 3.
- -The W&M-ODU game in Norfolk, Va., on Oct. 26 will be televised live on Fox Soccer Channel as part of the NSCAA/FSC College Soccer Game of the Week. It will be the 10th men's contest on television and is slated for 8 p.m. at ODU.
- Senior goalkeeper Kris Rake recorded his 13th career shutout against Drexel to move past Trevor Upton (1999-02) into fifth on W&M's career shutouts list.
- The schedule for the 2006 season will test the Tribe as half of its opponents made an appearance in the 2005 NCAA Tournament. Ten W&M opponents in 2006 have spent at least one week in the national top 25.
- -Two former W&M players are currently playing in Major League Soccer (MLS) with another playing in the Norway. Steve Jolley (1993-96) is in his 10th season as an MLS vet, playing for Red Bull New York. He has appeared in 16 matches with 10 starts, while earning one assist. Wade Barrett (1994-97) is in his first season with the Houston Dynamo, earning 31 starts, while assisting on three goals. Former All-American Adin Brown (1996-99) is the first-team goalkeeper for Aalesunds FK in Norway. Aalesunds is second in the Norwegian Second Division, while Brown, as of Oct. 9, was the second-highest rated goalkeeper and sixth-highest rated player ovearll in the league. In total, over 27 former Tribe players have played pro soccer at some level.

SCOUTING GEORGIA STATE

Georgia State enters the contest at 1-13, including losses in each of its last six contests. The Panthers lone victory over on the season came at VCU, 3-2 on Sept. 24.

Alberto Villarreal leads the Panthers in scoring with 12 points on six goals. Martin Zaluk ranks second on the team with six points on two goals and two assists. His two helpers are tops for GSU. Dathan Knott and Aaron Shepherd also have a pair of goals for Georgia State. Filipe Carvalho has started 13 matches in goal for the Panthers. He leads the nation in saves per game at 6.77 (88 total). Carvalho also has a goals against average of 2.70. As a team, the Panthers have allowed 2.73 goals per contest.

Georgia State and W&M have split the only two meetings between the schools. Last season, the Panthers knocked off W&M, 3-2, in double overtime. Brendan McCurdy scored 29 seconds into the match for the Tribe, before GSU got a pair of penalty kicks from Villarreal to take a 2-1 lead into halftime. The Tribe drew even with a Brock Jones goal in the 81st minute, but Knott scored the game-winner for the Panthers in the 108th minute.

SCOUTING UNC WILMINGTON

Since experiencing a four-match losing streak to open CAA, the Seahawks have won four straight to even its conference ledger at 4-4. UNCW is 9-5-1 overall. Included in those nine victories is a 1-0 win at then-No. 5 Duke on Sept. 19. Along with the CAA schedule, the Seahawks and Tribe have a common opponent in Stony Brook. W&M defeated SBU, 2-0, while UNCW also notched a victory, 2-1, over the Seawolves.

Chris Murray and Tim Masters share team high scoring honors with 10 points on four goals and two assists apiece. Pedro Pereira and Rick Henderson also share the team lead is assists with two. Pereira ranks third on the team with three goals and eight points. Brad Knighton has seen the majority of the minutes in net for the Seahawks. He has a GAA of 0.86 with 48 saves and five shutouts

The Tribe is 29-1-2 all-time against UNC Wilmington. W&M is 13-1-1 all-time in Wilmington, N.C. Last season, the two teams played to a 2-2 draw in Williamsburg. Andrew Hoxie and Jarrett Thomas scored in the opening four minutes of the second half to give the Tribe a 2-0 lead, before UNCW scored twice over the final 20 minutes of regulation to force overtime.

SENIOR CAPSULES

Scott Kelsey

Kelsey earned the first playing time of his career in the Tribe's 5-0 win over VMI earlier this season. He played the final 16:54 of the contest and preserved the Tribe's shutout of the Keydets. The Virginia Beach, Va., native has provided a wealth of knowledge and experience to the Tribe defense.

Jeff Marklin

Marklin has been in mainstay in the Tribe defense during his four-year career. He has appeared in 66 career games with 64 starts at back. In 2005-06, Marklin was honored with the Coaches Award and was a W&M Provost Academic Award recipient. The Richmond, Va., native earned all-tournament honors at the Wake Forest adidas Classic to open the 2006 season. During his four-year career, the W&M defense has registered 19 shutouts with a goals against average of 1.23.

Brendan McCurdy

After making the move from forward to back, McCurdy has been a constant in the Tribe's defensive backfield. He has started 15 matches in 2006, anchoring a W&M defense that has four shutouts. Over his career, McCurdy has played in 66 matches with 26 starts. He has scored eight career goals, including three gamewinners. This season, the Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla., native garnered all-tournament honors at the season-opening Wake Forest adidas Classic.

Kris Rake

Rake has etched his named in the Tribe's record book with his play at the goalkeeper position. In W&M history, the Flower Mound, Texas native ranks eighth in save percentage (.739), sixth in goals against average (1.30), fifth in shutouts (13) and fourth in saves (226). He also has 26 wins in goal over his Tribe career. This season, Rake has two shutouts, four victories and 40 saves for the Tribe.

Pat Scherder

After missing most of last season with an injury, Scherder has returned to form, ranking second on the team with six goals and 14 points. Over his W&M career, Scherder has 51 points on 22 goals and seven assists, appearing in 72 matches with 53 starts.



A two-time All-CAA selection, the Vienna, Va., native garnered NSCAA Second-Team All-South Atlantic Region honors in 2004. This season, he recorded his first two career multi-goal games against UNC Greensboro and James Madison.

Jarrett Thomas

Over his W&M career, Thomas has a valuable addition at the forward position. This season, he has three assists, playing in 13 matches with two starts. Last season, the McLean, Va., native earned the Tribe's Golden Boot, leading the team in scoring with 16 points and seven goals. Thomas has appeared in 42 games over his W&M career with 14 starts, while racking up 28 points on 11 goals and six assists.

CAA RACE TIGHTENING UP

With three matches left to play in the CAA, the Tribe is on the outside looking in for one of the six berths in the conference tournament. W&M sits in an eighth-place tie with Delaware, trailing James Madison, who sits in the final playoff slot, by two points. In fact, positions 5-9 in the CAA standings are only separated by three points.

Towson and George Mason are the only two teams to clinch spots in the CAA Tournament, but Hofstra and Old Dominion are only one victory each away from garnering spots. W&M, Delaware, James Madison, UNC Wilmington and Northeastern appeared to be competing for the final two spots.

FIT TO BE TIED

Over the last five matches, the Tribe has played to a tie on three occasions. In road contests at Northeastern and James Madison, W&M trailed before rallying to forge ties. Northeastern led 1-0 in the opening half, before the Tribe found the equalizer seven minutes later. Against then-No. 23 James Madison, the College trailed 2-0, before senior forward Pat Scherder scored twice to even the score. W&M's latest tie was a 0-0 stalemate against then-No. 22 George Mason in Williamsburg on Oct. 15.

REELING IN THE AWARDS, HOXIE BECOMES FIRST

Sophomore forward Andrew Hoxie became the first Tribe player in W&M's 22-year history in the CAA to win two league player of the week honors in a season. The Newport News, Va., native scored both W&M goals in a 2-1 overtime victory at VCU on Oct. 8 to win his second honor of the season.

Against VCU, Hoxie hammered home a penalty kick in the 89th minute to draw the Tribe even after junior midfielder Doug Ernst was taken down in the box. Just over six minutes into the overtime period, the 6-4 striker pressured the Ram defense before volleying a shot from 15 yards for the game-winner.

Hoxie also earned Brine CAA Player of the Week honors on Sept. 18 after earning MVP honors at the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic. During that event, he scored two-goals, including the eventual game-winner against then-No. 29 UNC Greensboro. He also assisted on the Tribe's first goal against Loyola (Md.).

coming the first player since 2001 to register three multigoal affairs in a single season. Hoxie has pulled the trick against then-No. 29 UNC Greensboro, Drexel and VCU.

Scherder picked up his second multigoal game of the season, leading the Tribe back from a two-goal deficit to forge a tie with then-No. 23 James Madison. He also notched two scored in the Tribe's 5-1 romp of then-No. 29 UNC Greensboro on Sept. 15. Remarkably, despite entering the year as the Tribe's active goal scoring leader with 16, the two-goal games were the first of his career.

COMEBACK KIDS

After allowing a pair of goals to No. 23 James Madison in the first 30 minutes of the contest, the Tribe rallied to forge a tie with the Dukes on Oct. 10. Senior striker Pat Scherder scored off an assist from junior Doug Ernst three minutes before halftime, and then found the equalizer in the 54th minute off a feed from junior Ryan Overdevest.

It marked the first time since Oct. 4, 2003 that W&M overcame of two-goal deficit to forge at least a tie. On that date, W&M received goals four minutes apart in the second half from Scherder and Graham Albert to tie College of Charleston, 2-2.

Last season, the Tribe overcame a two-goal deficit, but went on to lose the contest. At then-No. 19 UNC Greensboro, W&M trailed 2-0 and 3-1, before tying the contest up in the 82nd minute. The comeback was short-lived though as the Spartans scored with less than a minute remaining on a free kick to claim a 4-3 victory.

Answering the Call

Before the season, head coach Chris Norris said he had high expectations for junior midfielder Doug Ernst. The thirdyear head man of the Green and Gold felt it was time for the Alexandria, Va., native to step up his offensive production, given



his success at the prep and club levels. This season, Ernst has answered the call and is enjoying a breakout season.

Ernst has found the back of the net on three occasions, but more impressively is first in the CAA in assists with seven.

In the CAA opening victory over Drexel, Ernst notched a pair of assists his second, two-assist game of the season. He became the first W&M player to notched a pair of multiple assist games in a season since Phil Hucles had two, two-assist games in 2003. Ernst's seven assists this season are already the most in a campaign for a W&M player since Hucles had seven and Bryan Hinkle had nine in 2003.

TRIBE CLAIMS ODU STIHL SOCCER CLASSIC

By virtue of its victories over then-No. 29 (College Soccer News) UNC Greensboro, 5-1, and Loyola (Md.), 2-1, W&M claimed the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic. The Tribe and host ODU both finished with perfect 2-0 record, but the Tribe took the title as a result of a better goal differential thanks in large part to its offensive outburst against UNC Greensboro.

In the opening match of the classic, the Tribe scored early and often in the victory over the Spartans. Senior forward Pat Scherder started the barrage with a goal in the fifth minute, before sophomore frontrunner Andrew Hoxie added the second, sending the College to a 2-0 halftime lead. Scherder added his second and junior Doug Ernst scored in the 70th minute before the Spartans got on the board three minutes later. Hoxie iced the game with his second tally of the contest in the closing minutes.

In the second game of the classic against Loyola (Md.), the Tribe again scored early on a goal from Ernst in the 17th minute, but the Greyhounds tied it up before the half. Sophomore Brock Jones added what proved to be the game-winner a minute into the second stanza as the Tribe dominated the second 45 minutes, outshooting Loyola (Md.), 14-4.

The College improved to 24-12-4 (.650) all-time at the event, winning the championship for the fourth time in its 20-year history at the classic. W&M won both its games at the event for the seventh time.

SCORING WITH A QUICKNESS INTO THE RECORD BOOKS

The Tribe broke open a 1-0 halftime lead with goals 20 seconds apart in the 60th minute and a trio of tallies just over three minutes apart against VMI. Sophomore forward Andrew Hoxie chipped the goalkeeper from 35 yards after a failed clearance at 60:23, before freshman midfielder Price Thomas hammered home a volley from six-yards out on a cross from senior forward Pat Scherder at 60:43. Junior Chris Wayne added a bending free kick from 25 yards out at 63:28, giving W&M three straight scores in 3:05.

The 3:05 time span between the trio of Tribe goals was the 11th fastest between three goals by one team in NCAA history. The 3:05 was also the fastest in the NCAA since three UMBC players (Drew Perkins, John Clark and Larry Scheller) scored 1:46 apart in a victory over Valparaiso on Oct. 12, 2001.

The W&M goals 20 seconds apart established a school record for the fastest two consecutive goals. The 20-second mark also ranks as the 21st-fastest consecutive goals by a team in NCAA history. According to the 2006 NCAA Men's and Women's Soccer Record Book, it is also the fastest set of goals for a single team in nearly four years. The last time one team scored 20 seconds apart came on Sept. 27, 2002 when Mike Rosenthal and M.J. Serota of UMKC scored 20 seconds apart against Denver.

GAME OF FIRST

Four different W&M players scored their first career goals in the 5-0 victory over VMI. Junior midfielder Doug Ernst scored his first career goal, the game-winner, in the 26th minute of play to lead the Tribe firsts. Freshman midfielder Price Thomas, junior back Chris Wayne and sophomore forward Nathan Belcher each scored the first tallies of their career in the second half to push the Tribe to victory. Sophomore forward Andrew Hoxie led W&M with three points on a goal and an assist. It marked the first time in his career that Hoxie recorded both a tally and a helper in a single game.

Price Thomas scored on a volley in the six-yard box in the 60th minute. Wayne notched the Tribe's fourth tally of the contest at the 63:28 mark off a free kick, bending it inside the near post to the upper left corner of the goal. In his first career appearance for W&M. Belcher scored less than five minutes after entering the contest to give the College a 5-0 lead. Senior forward Jarrett Thomas hit an outside-footed shot from a severe angle on goal. The VMI goalkeeper made the diving save to deny the chance, but Belcher was there to clean up the mess, pushing the ball in from six yards out.

Along with Belcher, redshirt freshman midfielder Preston Whitlock and senior goalkeeper Scott Kelsey made the first appearances of their W&M careers against the Keydets. Kelsey played the final 16:54 in net, but was not tested.

FRESHMAN STARTERS

Freshmen Price Thomas and Roger Bothe have wasted little time making a significant impact on the W&M program. Thomas has started every game at the attacking midfielder position and tallied his first career goal against VMI. He has added a flare and creativity to the Tribe attack. Bothe, the 2005-06 Gatorade Virginia State Player of the Year, has appeared in all 14 Tribe games, including starts in the last 13 at back. The Chester, Va., native has shown solid skills defending as well as the ability to make runs up the flanks and get into the offensive attack.




