TRIBE SET TO FACE GEORGIA STATE, UNCW

The William and Mary men's soccer team will split the weekend between the road and the friendly confines of Albert-Daly Field. The College will trek to Atlanta to face Georgia State on Friday, Oct. 26, at 3 p.m., before returning home to host UNCW on Sunday, Oct. 28, at 2 p.m.

The College is currently 6-6-3 overall and 3-2-1 in the CAA. The Tribe's league mark currently puts them in fourth place halfway through the long 12-match CAA schedule. The home game against UNCW will have the Football Futbol Game promotion. Admission to the contest will be free with an Oct. 27th W&M vs. UMass football game ticket stub.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- W&M is currently receiving votes in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region poll.

- The Tribe was No. 64 in the Division I midseason RPI standings released by the NCAA on Oct. 15. W&M is listed third among CAA schools behind Old Dominion (No. 40) and Drexel (No. 52).

- W&M has started at least five freshmen in each of its last 12 contests, going 5-4-3 over the stretch. For the first time in school history, the Tribe started six freshmen in its CAA opening wins over Hofstra and Northeastern.

- Senior Ryan Overdevest and junior Doug McBride are the W&M captains for 2007.

- Sophomore Price Thomas had a seven-match point streak from Sept. 22-Oct. 14. Over the stretch, he scored six goals and dished out an assist.

- Redshirt freshman goalkeeper Andrew McAdams made his first collegiate start in the Tribe's 3-1 win over Temple, finishing with three saves. In games in which McAdams starts, W&M is 5-4-3 with a goals against average of 0.86.

- Seven W&M player have garnered their first collegiate points in 2007. Redshirt freshman Alan Koger scored his first collegiate goal in the Tribe's victory over Temple, while sophomore Jeremy Harris opened the season with his first marker against Elon and junior Doug McBride scored his first career goal at Stony Brook. Most recently, sophomore Roger Bothe tallied his first career goal on a PK against JMU. Reshirt freshman Andrew McAdams (assist vs. American) and freshmen Nathanial Baako (assist vs. Dartmouth) and Michael DiNuzzo (assist vs. Temple) tallied their first career points on assists this season.

- Two former W&M players are currently playing professionally in Major League Soccer (MLS) and with a club in the Norway. Wade Barrett (1994-97) is in his second season with the Houston Dynamo, after captaining the club to the 2006 MLS Cup. He has earned 29 starts this season, assisting on two goals. The Dynamo currently lead the MLS Western Division and having already secured a playoff spot. Former All-American Adin Brown (1996-99) is the first-team goalkeeper for Aalesunds FK in Norway. Brown has five shutouts in 20 games for Aalesunds FK and even scored the last-minute equalizing header against defending champion Rosenborg in July. In total, over 28 former Tribe players have played pro soccer at some level.



- The Tribe is 15-8-9 all-time at Albert-Daly Field, including a 5-1-1 mark this season.

- Senior Brennan Wergley began the season as the College's starting goalkeeper, but has appeared in each of the last four games as a reserve forward.

- W&M improved to 30-6-2 all-time in home openers with its win over Elon. The Tribe is a perfect 4-0 under head coach Chris Norris in home openers.

- Juniors Nathan Belcher and Doug McBride were named to the Penn State Classic All-Tournament Team. Redshirt freshman Alan Koger, freshman Nathaniel Baako and junior Brock Jones were named to the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic All-Tournament Team.

-W&M was greeted by a boisterous crowd of 667 when its hosted then-No. 15 Virginia Tech. It was the largest crowd for the Tribe since a crowd of 850 versus North Carolina in 2005.

SCOUTING GEORGIA STATE

The Panthers enter the contest with the Tribe on a four-match losing streak. Georgia State is 4-8-1 on the season and 1-5 in the CAA. The Panthers are coming off a 1-0 loss to first-place Drexel in overtime on Oct. 19 and a 2-0 defeat at the hands of Delaware on Oct. 21.

Floreal Pedrazo tops the Panthers in scoring with 20 points on eight goals and four assists. His points per game total ranks 12th nationally, while his goals per game mark is the 17th-best in the country. Joe Devito ranks second on the team with eight points on three goals and two assists, while Brian Forco and Tobias Nagy each of a pair of goals for GSU. Filipe Carvalho has started 12 matches in goal for the Panthers. He ranks sixth nationally in saves per game at 6.75 per contest. He has 81 saves, three shutouts and a goals against average of 1.83.

W&M is 2-1 all-time against Georgia State. Last season, the Tribe notched a 4-2 victory over GSU after falling behind the Panthers 2-0 in the opening 24 minutes of the game. The last time the Tribe played in Atlanta, W&M scored 30 seconds into the game, only to see GSU score on back-toback penalty kick before halftime. The College found the equalizer in the second half, but GSU scored with just over two minutes remaining in the second overtime for the victory.

SCOUTING UNC WILMINGTON

UNCW enters the weekend with a 2-10-1 overall mark and a 1-5 ledger in the CAA. The Seahawks will host Old Dominion on Friday, Oct. 26, before traveling to face the Tribe in Williamsburg on Oct. 28. UNCW tallied its second victory of the season, 2-0, over Delaware on Oct. 19, before falling to double overtime to Drexel, 1-0. The Dragons currently sit atop the CAA standings with a perfect 6-0 mark.

UNCW and W&M have one common opponent aside from the CAA portion of the schedule in Elon. The Seahawks tied the Phoenix, 0-0, while the Tribe notched a 1-0 victory over Elon.

Daniel Roberts tops the Seahawks in scoring with 10 points on three goals and four assists. Allen Lomas is tied with Roberts to team-high honors in goals with three. He also has an assist for seven points. UNCW has struggled to score offensively, averaging only 0.74 goals per game. Brock Duckworth has started every game in goal for the Seahawks. He has 46 saves on the season to go along with three shutouts and a goals against average of 1.95.

W&M holds a 30-1-2 all-time record against UNCW, including a 14-0-1 mark in Williamsburg. The College has not lost to the Seahawks since the 1980 season, a streak of 27 matches (25-0-2). Last season, the Tribe tallied a 2-0 win over the Seahawks in Wilmington. Ryan Sells knocked home a rebound in the second half for the game-winner.

DOWN RIGHT DEFENSIVE

W&M head coach Chris Norris tinkered with his defensive lineup over the opening part of the regular season, and if recent results are any indication, Norris has pushed the right buttons. The first change came prior to the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic moving redshirt freshman goalkeeper Andrew McAdams into the starting XI. The changes continued a week later as the fourth-year Tribe headman moved junior Brock Jones to center back in an attempt to solidify the backline prior to the North Carolina match.

The moves have paid dividends as W&M has posted a 5-4-3 mark to go along with a 0.86 goals against average in the 12 games since the initial change. In fact, over the Tribe's last 10 matches, W&M has a GAA of 0.74, while registering five shutouts. The College shutout ACC foe North Carolina on the road on Sept. 19, before holding the nation's No. 7-ranked scoring offense, Virginia Tech, to only one goal in 110 minutes of play. W&M also has clean sheets against American, Hofstra, VCU and George Mason.

To make the Tribe's defensive strides more impressive is the influx of youth in the back third of the field. The W&M lineup not only sports a first-year goalkeeper in McAdams but also includes true freshmen Nick Orozco and Michael DiNuzzo in the back along with sophomore Roger Bothe. The trio of Orozco, DiNuzzo and Bothe has started every match this season for the Tribe.

In the Tribe's CAA opening wins over Hofstra and Northeastern, freshman back Derek Buckley stepped in for an injury Brock Jones in the back. The starts were the first of Buckley's W&M career.

LOOKING INTO HIS CRYSTAL BALL

W&M head coach Chris Norris has been spot on each of the last two seasons when noting Tribe players on the verge of a breakout season. Last season, Norris said he felt it was time for midfielder Doug Ernst to step to the forefront for the College, and the Alexandria, Va., native went on to lead the CAA in assists with nine. This season, Norris said he expected big things from sophomore Price Thomas, and the Charlottesville, Va., native has followed suit.

With W&M limited at the forward position this season, Thomas has stepped in to fill the void alongside blossoming redshirt freshmen striker Alan Koger. Thomas, who started 17 of 19 matches as a true freshman in the midfield, is starting to establish himself as one of the more dangerous players in the CAA with the ball at his feet. He leads W&M in scorining with 13 points on six goals and an assist. Thomas has tallied three game-winners for the Tribe's, scoring the decisive goal against American on Sept. 25, in the CAA opener versus Hofstra on Oct. 5 and vs. VCU on Oct. 14.

Thomas ranks among the CAA leaders on points, goals and game-winning goals. He leads the league in game-winning goals with three, while ranking fourth in goals (6) and ninth in points (13).

FAST CAA STARTS

The Tribe started the CAA porition of its schedule winning its opening two contest. The 2-0 start marked the College's best since the 2002 when W&M opened the conference season with a 5-0-1 record before dropping its first league match of the season. In fact, the Tribe's 3-1 ledger is its best through four matches in league play since the 2002 team was 3-0-1.

The Tribe's 2-0 start marked the seventh time in the Tribe's 23-year history in the CAA that W&M has opened the CAA 2-0. The Tribe has started 2-0 in the CAA during the 2002, 1996, 1994, 1989, 1987 and 1986 seasons. On four of those occasions, the College went on to win the CAA regular season championship.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

A glance at the Tribe roster will bring about one common theme, youth. The W&M roster features 17 of 25 players, who are underclassmen (freshmen, redshirt freshmen and sophomores). Head coach Chris Norris has wasted little time not only putting the Tribe's youth movement on display, but relying on it to win matches for the College.

In its CAA opening wins over Hofstra and Northeastern, the W&M lineup featured six freshmen. It marked the first time in school history that six freshmen have started together in a match. In fact, in each of the Tribe's last 12 matches, five or more freshmen have started. The Tribe is 5-4-3 over that stretch.

Against Hofstra on Oct. 5, the Tribe starting XI featured redshirt freshmen Andrew McAdams and Alan Koger along with true freshmen Nick Orozco, Michael DiNuzzo, Derek Buckley and Nathaniel Baako. The youth movement didn't stop there as nine of the 11 starters were underclassmen with sophomores Roger Bothe, Price Thomas and Jeremy Harris joining the fold.

In the College's season-opening win over Elon, the starting XI featured four true freshmen (Nick Orozco, Michael DiNuzzo, Nathaniel Baako and Ian Stowe). It marked the first time in 15 years that four true freshmen started the same game. The last time a W&M starting lineup included four true freshmen was Nov. 14, 1992 when Chris Scrofani, Tim Pricso, Bill Owens and Greg Richards started the Tribe's First Round NCAA Tournament victory over West Virginia. The 1992 campaign was also the last time five freshmen started at least one game during the season as Andrew Petty started eight games as well as the four players who started the NCAA Tournament affair.

KOGER MAKING AN IMPACT UP TOP

Redshirt freshman forward Alan Koger has made his presence felt in the attacking half for the Tribe in 2007. After coming on as a reserve in the Tribe's opening three matches of the season, Koger moved into the starting lineup prior to the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic and has been there ever since. Over the Tribe's last 12 games, Koger has nine points on three goals and three assists. In his first career start against Temple, Koger tallied two goals to lead the Tribe to a 3-1 victory.

Koger has not only made his impact in the scoring department for the Tribe, but also with his ability in the air as well. The 6-2 striker gives the College a big target in the attacking half, and has demonstrated the ability to dominate a game by winning balls in the air. On two different occasions this season against Virginia Tech and Hofstra, Koger has flicked a header off a long ball to set up W&M goals.

MCADAMS GARNERS CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONOR

After helping the Tribe register a pair of ties against Atlantic Coast Conference foes North Carolina, 0-0, and current No. 9 Virginia Tech, 1-1, redshirt freshman goalkeeper Andrew McAdams was named CAA Rookie of the Week on Sept. 24. McAdams became the first Tribe rookie to earn the CAA weekly honor since Brennan Wergley garnered the accolade in 2005.

In the Tribe's 0-0 stalemate at North Carolina, McAdams tallied his first career shutout making 10 saves in just his third career start. The Palm Harbor, Fla., native came up with the biggest save of the game in the second overtime period. After W&M was whistled for a foul in the box, McAdams denied Scott Campbell's penalty kick with a kick save in the 105th minute of play to preserve the shutout. His 10-save performance was the best by a W&M goalkeeper since Kris Rake had 10 stops against then-No. 1 Maryland on Sept. 22, 2004.

McAdams followed that performance with a seven-save effort allowing only one goal to the nation's No. 7-ranked scoring offense in Virginia Tech. The Hokies came into the match averaging three goals a game over their five-match win streak, but could only muster a single score in a 110 minutes against the Tribe. For the week, McAdams finished with a goals against average of 0.41 against a pair of teams who have been in the national top-25 or receiving votes throughout the 2007 season.

KOGER NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Redshirt freshman men's soccer player Alan Koger was named the Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Week on Sept. 17. Koger scored three goals for the Tribe at the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic on his way to earning All-Tournament team honors. Koger became the first Tribe men's soccer player this season and the 26th overall to win the CAA weekly honor.

In the College's 3-1 win over Temple, Koger earned his first career start and responded by providing a vital scoring punch for the Tribe. The Spencer, Va., native tallied goals just 2:16 apart in the opening 20 minutes of the play to stake the Tribe to a 2-0 advantage. W&M's first marker came in the 17th minute of play as Koger jumped on a rebound, heading the ball into the back of the net for the goal. At the 18:46, Koger struck again to give the Tribe a little breathing room at 2-0 as he beat the Owl goalkeeper to the ball on a service from junior midfielder Brock Jones.

Koger notched his third goal of the weekend in the Tribe's 2-1 loss to Dartmouth. The 6-2 striker scored on a breakaway following a through ball from fellow rookie Nathaniel Baako in the 30th minute of play. On the weekend, Koger registered eight shots, including six on goal.
