TRIBE HOSTS ODU ON SENIOR NIGHT

The William and Mary men's soccer team will look to wrap up a berth in the CAA Tournament when it hosts Senior Night against Old Dominion on Thursday, Nov. 8. The game is slated for a 7 p.m. kickoff at Albert-Daly Field as the Tribe will honor seniors Doug Ernst, Brock Jones, Ryan Overdevest, Ryan Sells, Brennan Wergley and Michael Yakovac.

A victory or a tie would put the wraps on the College's first trip to the CAA Tournament since 2004. A win over Old Dominion would also give the College a first-round by into the semifinals. The top six teams in the CAA make the tournament field, with the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds receiving a first-round bye.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- W&M is currently receiving votes in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region poll.

- The Tribe was No. 79 in the Division I midseason RPI standings released by the NCAA on Oct. 30. W&M is listed third among CAA schools behind Old Dominion (No. 44) and VCU (No. 66).

- W&M has started at least five freshmen in each of its last 16 contests, going 8-5-3 over the stretch. For the first time in school history, the Tribe started six freshmen in its CAA opening wins over Hofstra and Northeastern.

- Redshirt freshman goalkeeper Andrew McAdams made his first collegiate start in the Tribe's 3-1 win over Temple, finishing with three saves. In games in which McAdams starts, W&M is 8-5-3 with a goals against average of 0.71.

- Seven W&M players have garnered their first collegiate points in 2007. Redshirt freshman Alan Koger scored his first collegiate goal in the Tribe's victory over Temple, while sophomore Jeremy Harris opened the season with his first marker against Elon and junior Doug McBride scored his first career goal at Stony Brook. Most recently, sophomore Roger Bothe tallied his first career goal on a PK against JMU. Reshirt freshman Andrew McAdams (assist vs. American) and freshmen Nathanial Baako (assist vs. Dartmouth) and Michael DiNuzzo (assist vs. Temple) tallied their first career points on assists this season.

- Underclassmen have scored 14 of W&M's 19 goals this season and registered 39 of its 58 points. Those numbers equate to 73.6 percent of the Tribe's goal scoring production and 67.2 percent of its points.

- The Tribe is 16-8-9 all-time at Albert-Daly Field, including a 6-1-1 mark this season.

- Senior Doug Ernst has three assists over his last two games. He assisted on both W&M goals in the 2-0 win over UNCW. It marked the fourth time in his W&M career in which he has recorded two assists in a game. He has 17 career helpers for W&M.

- Senior Brennan Wergley began the season as the College's starting goalkeeper, but has appeared six games as a reserve forward.

- Senior Ryan Overdevest and junior Doug McBride are the W&M captains for 2007.

- Sophomore Price Thomas had a seven-match point streak from Sept. 22-Oct. 14. Over the stretch, he scored six goals and dished out an assist.

- Two former W&M players are currently playing professionally in Major League Soccer (MLS) and with a club in the Norway. Wade Barrett (1994-97) is in his second season with the Houston Dynamo, after captaining the club to the 2006 MLS Cup. He has earned 29 starts this season, assisting on two goals. The Dynamo is currently playing in the MLS Playoffs. Former All-American Adin Brown (1996-99) is the first-team goalkeeper for Aalesunds FK in Norway. Brown has five shutouts in 20 games for Aalesunds FK and even scored the last-minute equalizing header against defending champion Rosenborg in July. In total, over 28 former Tribe players have played pro soccer at some level.

- W&M improved to 30-6-2 all-time in home openers with its win over Elon. The Tribe is a perfect 4-0 under head coach Chris Norris in home openers.

- Juniors Nathan Belcher and Doug McBride were named to the Penn State Classic All-Tournament Team. Redshirt freshman Alan Koger, freshman Nathaniel Baako and junior Brock Jones were named to the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic All-Tournament Team.

SCOUTING OLD DOMINION

The Monarchs enter the Thursday night affair with the Tribe in a firstplace tie with Drexel. ODU is 10-6-2 overall on the season and 7-2-1 in the CAA, having already clinched a berth in the conference tournament. Last weekend, Old Dominion suffered a 2-0 setback at Delaware, before ending the weekend with a 0-0 tie against Drexel.

Trevor Banks leads the Monarchs in scoring with 15 points on six goals and three assists. A.J. Kulp tops the squad in assists with six, while ranking second on the team in goals (3) and points (12). Ambane Emmanuel and T.J. Beaulieu each of three goals on the season as well with all three of Beaulieu's markers coming as game-winners. Evan Newton has played nearly ever minute in goal for the Monarchs, amassing a GAA of 0.69 to go along with 51 saves and eight shutouts.

W&M holds a 20-17-8 all-time advantage over ODU, including an 8-7-3 ledger in Williamsburg. Despite the cushion in the all-time series, W&M has dropped the last four matches with the Monarchs, including a 2-1 decision in Norfolk last season.

SENIOR NIGHT

The Tribe men's soccer program will honor six seniors playing in their final regular-season home contests for the College against Old Dominion. Seniors Dour Ernst, Brock Jones, Ryan Overdevest, Ryan Sells, Brennan Wergley and Michael Yakovac have posted 30 victories during their fours season with the College and are poised to make their second trip to the CAA Tournament.

Senior Midfielder Doug Ernst.

Ernst has been a catalyst for the Tribe offense during his career at the College, racking up 25 career points on four goals and 17 assists. He has appeared in 70 matches over his career, including 41 starts. Ernst currently leads the Tribe and ranks among the top-10 in the CAA in assists with five. Last season, he led the league in assists with nine on the year. Ernst also scored the gamewinner earlier this season in W&M's 2-1 overtime victory over Northeastern. He ranks third on the team with seven points this season.

Senior Back Brock Jones

Jones has displayed incredible versatility during his career with the Tribe. While currently trolling the middle of the Tribe backline, he has started matches in the midfield and at forward during his career. For his career, Jones has 21 points on eight goals and five assists. Earlier this season, he was named to the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic All-Tournament for the second straight year. Jones has started 51 of his 53 career games with W&M.

Senior midfielder Ryan Overdevest

Overdevest has been known as a smart and tireless worker over his Tribe career, and as a co-captain this season, has provided balance in the W&M midfield. Earlier this month, he earned ESPN The Magazine First-Team Academic All-District III honors for the second consecutive year. In 2006, he was a Second-Team Academic All-America choice. Last weekend, Overdevest tallied his first goal of the season, scoring the game-winner at Delaware. He also assisted on the Tribe's game-winning goal in a 1-0 victory over VCU in October.

Senior back Ryan Sells

During his W&M career, Sells has started and played at both in the midfield and the back. He has appeared in 59 matches over his career, while earning 30 starts. As a redshirt freshman in 2004, Sells earned W&M Co-Rookie of the Year honors. In 2006, he tallied his only career goal, scoring the game-winner in a 2-0 win over UNCW. This season, he has appeared in nine matches, while making one start.

Senior forward/goalkeeper Brennan Wergley

Wergley has provided the Tribe with quality play at both the goalkeeper and forward positions during his senior season. After beginning the year as the Tribe's starting goalkeeper, he has emerged as a reserve forward, appearing in six games in that capacity. He started the opening three games of the season in goal for the College and has started 20 matches over his career, posting a goals against average of 1.31 to go along with 95 saves and six shutouts.

Senior back Michael Yakovac

Yakovac has been a solid contributor for the Tribe over his four seasons. He has appeared in 31 matches, making 17 starts. As a redshirt freshman in 2004, Yakovac garnered CAA All-Rookie Team honors and W&M co-Rookie of the Year accolades. He also registered his only career point during the 2004 campaign, assisting on the game-winning goal in the Tribe's 1-0 upset of No. 1-ranked Maryland.

CAA TOURNAMENT POSSIBILITIES

The Tribe can clinch a berth in the CAA Tournament and a first-round by with a victory over Old Dominion on Thursday night. W&M has the possibility of finishing as high as No. 2 in CAA standings or as low as No. 7, depending on results from Nov. 8's CAA regular-season finales. The College can clinch a berth in the CAA Tournament for the first time since the 2004 season with any of the following results:

- 1) A win or tie versus Old Dominion
- 2) A Northeastern loss to Hofstra
- 3) A James Madison win over VCU
- 4) A VCU win over James Madison
- 5) A Towson win or loss to George Mason



OVERDEVEST NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

For the second straight season, senior midfielder Ryan Overdevest was named to the ESPN The Magazine First-Team Academic All-District III squad. Last season, the Bridgeton, N.J., native garnered first-team academic all-district honors on his way to ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America distinction. Overdevest was one of four midfielders and 12 overall players selected to the academic all-district squad.

This season, Overdevest has helped the Tribe to an 9-7-3 overall mark and a 6-3-1 ledger in the CAA. He has started 15 matches, including each of the last 12 contests, while playing in all 19 for the College. He has three points on the year with a goal and an assist. He headed in the game-winner against Delaware on Nov. 4, while providing the game-winning helper in the Tribe's 1-0 win over VCU. For his career, Overdevest has played in 59 matches, earning 23 starts.

The senior co-captain has been a standout in the classroom as well as the pitch. He carries a perfect grade point average along with his Academic All-America honors from a season ago. During the last three seasons, Overdevest has won the W&M Alumni Award for the highest GPA on the Tribe men's soccer team. Last spring, he was named the W&M Robert M. Usry Award winner. The award is given annually to a varsity athlete who has earned at least one varsity letter, has the highest GPA of any athlete at the end of his/her junior year and has completed 75 percent of his/her degree requirements for graduation.

IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

The Tribe defense has proven to be one most stout in the CAA this season, and those numbers have translated nationally as well. The College has shutout nine of its 19 opponents this season, which ranks 31st nationally for shutout percentage. The Tribe is also 28th nationally in save percentage as a team at .828.

Redshirt freshman goalkeeper Andrew McAdams ranks among the national leaders in goals against average, saves per game and save percentage. His CAA-leading .861 save percentage ranks eighth nationally, while he is 21st in saves per game. His goals against average of 0.81 ranks 42nd nationally.

STOUT DEFENSE

The College has made it difficult for opponents to find the back of the net this season, especially over the last few weeks. W&M head coach Chris Norris said his team set a goal of 10 shutouts prior to the 2007 campaign and the squad is well on its way to achieving that goal. W&M has registered nine shutouts so far this season, including six in CAA play.

The Tribe's six CAA shutouts are the most ever for a W&M team, bettering the mark set by the 1987, 1998 and 2005 squads. The College leads the league in shutouts overall and in conference play, while ranking third in the CAA in goals against average during league play at 0.58.

As the season has worn on, the Tribe defense has gotten stronger. Over W&M's last 14 matches, the Tribe has shutout eight opponents and registered a goals against average of 0.61. Over that stretch, W&M is 7-4-3. The College has been even stingier over the last seven games, registering five shutouts with a goals against average of 0.27.

KILLER COMBO

Heading into the 2007 campaign, W&M head coach Chris Norris was unsure of who would play the forward position for the College and where the goal-scoring production would come from. Consider both those questions answered in the form of the striker duo of sophomore Price Thomas and redshirt freshman Alan Koger.

Neither player started the season opener for the College, and Thomas actually started the season at his normal attacking midfield position. But with W&M struggling to score goals, Norris switched Thomas to forward and started Koger along side him beginning with the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic. The pair have provided W&M with the scoring punch it has needed ever since.

Over the Tribe's last 16 matches, Thomas and Koger have combined for 30 points on 12 goals and six assists. The pair comprises 63.2 percent of W&M's goal scoring and 51.7 percent of its point production. They have scored six of the College's nine game-winning goals this season and ranks first and second in points, goals and shots.

UNDER RATED, BUT NOT UNDER APPRECIATED

Junior Doug McBride has been one of the Tribe most consistent players throughout his career. One thing that can always be expected from the 5-9 dynamo is his all out effort in the middle of the pitch. That effort is starting to translate over to the stat sheet as well.

W&M head coach Chris Norris has called his co-captain holding midfielder the most under rated

player in the CAA. McBride has an engine that never quits, and he is the calming influence that anchors the Tribe's defense and is integral in starting the transition from defense to attack.

After registering just one assist in his first two seasons with the Tribe, McBride has four points on a goal and two assists this season. In the College's back-to-back wins over Georgia State and UNCW, McBride has registered an assist, including the game-winning helper with 1:47 left in the College's 1-0 win over the Panthers.

KOGER NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Redshirt freshman forward Alan Koger was named the Colonial Athletic Association co-Rookie of the Week on Oct. 29 following his pair of goals in Tribe victories over Georgia State and UNC Wilmington. It marks the second time this season that Koger has been honored by the CAA, but the first rookie of the week accolade for the Spencer, Va., native. He was named the CAA Player of the Week on Sept. 17 after earning All-Tournament honors at the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic.

In the Tribe's 1-0 win over Georgia State, Koger broke a scoreless tie sending a header to the far post with just 1:47 remaining. It was his second game-winning goal of the season. Against UNC Wilmington, Koger added an insurance goal for the College in the 79th minute. The rookie striker ranks second on the team in points (13), goals (5) and assists (3).

DEFENSE CHANGES

W&M head coach Chris Norris tinkered with his defensive lineup over the opening part of the regular season, and if recent results are any indication, Norris has pushed the right buttons. The first change came prior to the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic moving redshirt freshman goalkeeper Andrew McAdams into the starting XI. The changes continued a week later as Norris moved Brock Jones to center back in an attempt to solidify the backline prior to the North Carolina match.

The moves have paid dividends as W&M has posted a 8-5-3 mark to go along with a 0.71 goals against average in the 16 games since the initial change. The College shutout ACC foe North Carolina on the road on Sept. 19, before holding the nation's No. 7-ranked scoring offense, Virginia Tech, to only one goal in 110 minutes of play. W&M also has clean sheets against American, Hofstra, VCU, George Mason, Georgia State and UNCW.

To make the Tribe's defensive strides more impressive is the influx of youth in the back third of the field. The W&M lineup not only sports a first-year goalkeeper in McAdams but also includes true freshmen Nick Orozco and Michael DiNuzzo in the back along with sophomore Roger Bothe. The trio of Orozco, DiNuzzo and Bothe has started nearly every match this season for the Tribe.

In the Tribe's CAA opening wins over Hofstra and Northeastern, freshman back Derek Buckley stepped in for an injured Brock Jones in the back. The starts were the first of Buckley's W&M career.

LOOKING INTO HIS CRYSTAL BALL

W&M head coach Chris Norris has been spot on each of the last two seasons when noting Tribe players on the verge of a breakout season. Last season, Norris said he felt it was time for midfielder Doug Ernst to step to the forefront for the College, and the Alexandria, Va., native went on to lead the CAA in assists with nine. This season, Norris said he expected big things from sophomore Price Thomas, and the Charlottesville, Va., native has followed suit.

With W&M limited at the forward position this season, Thomas has stepped in to fill the void alongside blossoming redshirt freshmen striker Alan Koger. Thomas, who started 17 of 19 matches as a true freshman in the midfield, is starting to establish himself as one of the more dangerous players in the CAA with the ball at his feet. He leads W&M in scoring with 17 points on seven goals and three assists. He has factored into the game-winning goal for the College in six of its nine wins, including four game-winning goals. He had a seven-match point streak from Sept. 22 through Oct. 14. He also scored goals in four straight matches to open the CAA portion of the schedule.

Thomas ranks among the CAA leaders on points, goals and game-winning goals. He leads the league in game-winning goals with four, while ranking seventh in goals (7) and eighth in points (17).

Fast CAA Starts

The Tribe started the CAA porition of its schedule winning its opening two contest. The 2-0 start marked the College's best since the 2002 when W&M opened the conference season with a 5-0-1 record before dropping its first league match of the season.

The Tribe's 2-0 start marked the seventh time in the Tribe's 23-year history in the CAA that W&M has opened the CAA 2-0. The Tribe has started 2-0 in the CAA during the 2002, 1996, 1994, 1989, 1987 and 1986 seasons. On four of those occasions, the College went on to win the CAA regular season championship.

A glance at the Tribe roster will bring about one common theme, youth. The W&M roster features 17 of 25 players, who are underclassmen (freshmen, redshirt freshmen and sophomores). Head coach Chris Norris has wasted little time not only putting the Tribe's youth movement on display, but relying on it to win matches for the College.

In its CAA opening wins over Hofstra and Northeastern, the W&M lineup featured six freshmen. It marked the first time in school history that six freshmen have started together in a match. In fact, in each of the Tribe's last 16 matches, five or more freshmen have started. The Tribe is 8-5-3 over that stretch.

Against Hofstra on Oct. 5, the Tribe starting XI featured redshirt freshmen Andrew McAdams and Alan Koger along with true freshmen Nick Orozco, Michael DiNuzzo, Derek Buckley and Nathaniel Baako. The youth movement didn't stop there as nine of the 11 starters were underclassmen with sophomores Roger Bothe, Price Thomas and Jeremy Harris joining the fold.

In the College's season-opening win over Elon, the starting XI featured four true freshmen (Nick Orozco, Michael DiNuzzo, Nathaniel Baako and Ian Stowe). It marked the first time in 15 years that four true freshmen started the same game. The last time a W&M starting lineup included four true freshmen was Nov. 14, 1992 when Chris Scrofani, Tim Pricso, Bill Owens and Greg Richards started the Tribe's First Round NCAA Tournament victory over West Virginia. The 1992 campaign was also the last time five freshmen started at least one game during the season as Andrew Petty started eight games as well as the four players who started the NCAA Tournament affair.

MCADAMS GARNERS CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONOR

After helping the Tribe register a pair of ties against Atlantic Coast Conference foes North Carolina, 0-0, and current No. 9 Virginia Tech, 1-1, redshirt freshman goalkeeper Andrew McAdams was named CAA Rookie of the Week on Sept. 24. McAdams became the first Tribe rookie to earn the CAA weekly honor since Brennan Wergley garnered the accolade in 2005.

In the Tribe's 0-0 stalemate at North Carolina, McAdams tallied his first career shutout making 10 saves in just his third career start. The Palm Harbor, Fla., native came up with the biggest save of the game in the second overtime period. After W&M was whistled for a foul in the box, McAdams denied Scott Campbell's penalty kick with a kick save in the 105th minute of play to preserve the shutout. His 10-save performance was the best by a W&M goalkeeper since Kris Rake had 10 stops against then-No. 1 Maryland on Sept. 22, 2004.

McAdams followed that performance with a seven-save effort allowing only one goal to the nation's No. 7-ranked scoring offense in Virginia Tech. The Hokies came into the match averaging three goals a game over their five-match win streak, but could only muster a single score in a 110 minutes against the Tribe. For the week, McAdams finished with a goals against average of 0.41 against a pair of teams who have been in the national top-25 or receiving votes throughout the 2007 season.

KOGER NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Redshirt freshman men's soccer player Alan Koger was named the Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Week on Sept. 17. Koger scored three goals for the Tribe at the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic on his way to earning All-Tournament team honors. Koger became the first Tribe men's soccer player this season and the 26th overall to win the CAA weekly honor.

In the College's 3-1 win over Temple, Koger earned his first career start and responded by providing a vital scoring punch for the Tribe. The Spencer, Va., native tallied goals just 2:16 apart in the opening 20 minutes of the play to stake the Tribe to a 2-0 advantage. W&M's first marker came in the 17th minute of play as Koger jumped on a rebound, heading the ball into the back of the net for the goal. At the 18:46, Koger struck again to give the Tribe a little breathing room at 2-0 as he beat the Owl goalkeeper to the ball on a service from junior midfielder Brock Jones.

Koger notched his third goal of the weekend in the Tribe's 2-1 loss to Dartmouth. The 6-2 striker scored on a breakaway following a through ball from fellow rookie Nathaniel Baako in the 30th minute of play. On the weekend, Koger registered eight shots, including six on goal.


