TRIBE TRAVELS TO ODU, HOSTS VCU

The William and Mary men's soccer team will wrap up a three-match road trip at Old Dominion on Wednesday, Oct. 8, before opening a four-match homestand on Saturday, Oct. 11, against VCU. TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- W&M is currently the highest ranked CAA team in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region poll at No. 3, trailing only nationally ranked Maryland and Virginia.
- W&M leads the CAA in assists on the year with 17 and 10 different Tribe player have registered a helper on the year.
- Sophomore Nat Baako ranks 78th nationally in points per game and 95th in goals per game.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Andrew McAdams ranks 94th nationally in goals against average.
- Senior Doug McBride and sophomore Andrew McAdams were named captains for the 2008 season.
- The Tribe is 18-10-9 all-time at Albert-Daly Field, including a 10-2-2 all-time ledger in non-conference games at the facility.
- W&M improved to 31-6-2 all-time and a perfect 5-0 under head coach Chris Norris in home openers, following its 2-1 victory over UNC Greensboro on Aug. 30.
- The Tribe has sent 30 players into the professional ranks and currently has a quartet of guys playing professionally in the U.S. and abroad. Wade Barrett has started 20 matches for the Houston Dynamo of the MLS. The Dynamo are currently leading the Western Division. Ralph Bean appeared in 11 matches and had an assist for the Bermuda Hogges of the USL Second Division. Adin Brown missed most of the season with Aalesunds FK in the Norwegian Eliteserien due to injury, while Carlos Garcia helped the Baltimore Blast to its second straight Major Indoor Soccer League Championship.

SCOUTING OLD DOMINION

The Monarchs enter the midweek tilt with the Tribe atop of the CAA standing at 2-0 and on a three-match winning streak. Old Dominion is 5-3-1 on the season, following a 1-0 win over UNCW on Oct. 4. ODU has won five of its last six contests and over the stretch owns wins over UNC Greensboro (2-1), UMass (1-0), Bryant (7-0) and Delaware (4-0). Old Dominion has not allowed a goal in each of its last three games and ranks 20th nationally in team GAA and 25th in shutout percentage. ODU is currently ranked No. 6 in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region poll.

T.J. Beaulieu and Steffen Rabben lead the Monarchs in goals with four apiece. Beaulieu leads ODU in points (12) and assists (4), while ranking among the CAA leaders in all three offensive categories. Preseason CAA Player of the Year Trevor Banks is third on the team with seven points on three goals and an assist. In goal, ODU has split time

between Brennan Kirkpatrick and Michael Roura following an injury to preseason All-CAA goalkeeper Evan Netwon prior to the 2008 campaign. The pair have filled in nicely, combining for five shutouts and a GAA of 0.65. Kirkpatrick has appeared in five matches with a GAA of 0.38 to go along with three shutouts, 11 saves and a save percentage of 84.6. Roura was named the CAA Rookie of the Week following the shutout win over UNCW. He has played in four matches and owns a GAA of 1.00 to go along with 12 saves and two shutouts.

W&M holds a slim lead in the all-time series with Old Dominion at 20-18-8. The Monarchs have the upper hand in Norfolk at 10-8-4 all-time. The Tribe will look for its first win over ODU since the 2002 season and its first win in Norfolk over Old Dominion since 1996. The Monarchs have won each of the last five meetings between the two schools.

SCOUTING VCU

VCU is 5-4 overall on the season and is 1-1 in the CAA entering its midweek affair with James Madison. The Rams will battle the Dukes on Wednesday at 7 p.m., before making the trek to Williamsburg on Saturday. VCU is ranked No. 5 in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region.

The Rams is coming off a 3-0 win over Hofstra. Forsan Asad-Radwan led the way for VCU, scoring two goals less than five minutes part in the opening half, including the game-winner against the Pride. For his efforts, Asad-Radwan was named to the National Team of the Week by Top Drawer Soccer.

Preseason CAA Player of the Year Gerson Dos Santos leads the Rams in scoring with 11 points on three goals and five assists. He is tied for the CAA lead in assist with teammate Owusu Sekyere, who also had five. Jorit Loehr and David Rosenbaum also have three goals each on the year for the Rams. Andrew Dykstra has started all nine games in goal for the Rams. He has a GAA of 1.13 to go along with 27 saves and three shutouts.

The Tribe leads the all-time series with the Rams at 15-8-2, including a 7-3-1 mark in Williamsburg. W&M has won the last two meetings between the two schools, including a 1-0 win last season. Price Thomas scored the game-winner for the College in the win over the Rams in Williamsburg.

RANKED REGIONALLY

For the fourth time in the last five weeks, the Tribe is ranked No. 3 in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America South Atlantic Region Poll. Following its victory over George Mason, who was No. 3 in last week's rankings, W&M jumped back over the Patriots after spending last week at No. 4. The Tribe is once again the highest ranked Colonial Athletic Association team in the regional rankings. The College has topped the conference representatives in five of the six regional polls this season. W&M has spent every week ranked among the top five in the region.

RETURNING TO THE LINEUP

After missing four of the Tribe's previous five matches due to injury, junior forward Andrew Hoxie returned to the W&M lineup in a big way against George Mason. He came on as a second-half sub against the Patriots and promptly assisted on the game-winning goal as the Tribe pulled out a 1-0 overtime win at Mason. This season, Hoxie ranks third on the team in points (7) and goals (2) and second in assists with three despite only playing in five matches. He got off to a great start to the 2008 campaign for the College, registering a goal and an assist in each of the Tribe's first two games of the season. The Tribe has been a more successful team with Hoxie in the lineup. The Tribe is 4-0-1 on the season when Hoxie plays, but 1-2-1 without him in the lineup.

THOMAS FINDS HIS GROOVE

Junior forward Price Thomas earned First-Team All-CAA honors last season, while leading the Tribe in scoring with 17 points on seven goals and three assists. After a slow start to the season, the Charlottesville, Va., native has increased his production over the last five games. Over the stretch, Thomas has seven points on three goals and an assist. Two of this three markers have been game-winners, including the strike against George Mason just 29 seconds into overtime on Oct. 4.

BAAKO TURNING INTO AN OFFENSIVE FORCE

Sophomore Nat Baako has long been a key fixture in the Tribe offense, starting every match for W&M since stepping on the Williamsburg campus from Accra, Ghana in 2007. During his sophomore season, the heady sparkplug has been an offensive force for the Green and Gold. Baako currently leads the Tribe and ranks among the CAA leads in points (11), goals (4) and assists (3).

The 5-5 dynamo enjoyed a breakout start to the 2008 season at the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic, earning MVP honors after finishing with three goals and an assist. Baako was also named CAA co-Player of the Week following his performance at the event. He scored his first collegiate goal in the Tribe's win over UCF and then exploded for both Green and Gold tallies in the program's 2-2 tie with 2007 NCAA College Cup Semifinalist UMass.

OFFENSIVELY SPEAKING

The Tribe ranks among the CAA leaders in every offensive category. The Green and Gold is second in the league in shots and corners, third in points and fourth in goals. W&M is the conference leader in both assists on assists per game on the year. The Tribe has dished out 17 assists on the year, an average of just under two per game. Everyone has gotten in on the act as 10 different Green and Gold players have tallied assists on the year. Sophomore Nat Baako and junior Andrew Hoxie lead the Tribe and rank fifth in the CAA with three assists each.

ODY/STIHL SOCCER CLASSIC CHAMPIONSHIP

For the second time in the last three seasons and the fifth time overall, the College won the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic as a result of its 1-0-1 record at the event. The Tribe opened with a 3-1 win over Central Florida on Sept. 12, before forging a 2-2 tie with 2007 NCAA College Cup Semifinalist UMass on Sept. 14. The College improved to 26-13-5 (.648) all-time at the Stihl Soccer Classic, having competed in the event on 22 occasions. W&M also claimed the event title in 1987, 1992, 1998 and 2006.

VALUABLE FIRST

Sophomore Nick Orozco enjoyed a solid rookie season for the Tribe in 2007, starting all 21 games at center back and helping to anchor a defense that set a program record with six shutouts during the CAA portion of the schedule. While is defensive exploits are well documented, Orozco had yet to register a shot, let alone a point in a collegiate game. That was until the Tribe's season opener against UNC Greensboro. The Moseley, Va., native made his first collegiate shot count, volleying in a rebound in the 88th minute to help the Tribe secure a 2-1 win over the Spartans.

COMEBACK WINS

The Tribe's 2-1 come-from-behind win over UNC Greensboro was the team's first since the 2006 season. Last season, W&M was 0-6 when its opponent scored first in a game. After UNCG took a 1-0 advantage with a penalty kick in the 14th minute, W&M responded to pull even with just over three minutes remaining in the opening half and then tacked on the game-winner in the 88th minute. It was the first comeback win since W&M overcame a 2-0 deficit against Georgia State on Oct. 20, 2006 on its way to a 4-2 victory. During head coach Chris Norris' tenure, W&M has five comeback victories.

THOMAS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CAA

Junior forward Price Thomas was named to the Preseason All-CAA Team. Thomas is one of six players in the league who returns in 2008 after earning first-team all-conference laurels last season.

In 2007, Thomas enjoyed a breakout season and became the first Tribe player since 2004 to earn First-Team All-CAA honors. The Charlottesville, Va., native led the Tribe and ranked among the CAA leaders in shots (40), points (17), goals (7), assists (3) and game-winning goals (4). He topped the conference in game-winning goals, while also ranking seventh in goals and ninth in points. Earlier in the season, Thomas registered a point in seven straight games from Sept. 22-Oct. 14. Included over that stretch, he scored a goal in each of the first four CAA games of the season.

MCADAMS NAMED TO CSN'S PLAYERS TO WATCH IN 2008.


Sophomore goalkeeper Andrew McAdams was named as one of College Soccer News Players to Watch in 2008. McAdams was one of nine goalkeepers nationally to be named to the list, developed by CSN talent analyst Joe Mauceri as part of the Web sites College Soccer Coast to Coast preseason coverage.

In his analysis of the goalkeeper position, Mauceri said, "I look for players with good hands; who are decisive, fearless when needed, and who understand good positioning." The second-year Tribe backstop demonstrated his mettle as one of the top up-and-coming goal-keepers in the country last season. The Palm Harbor, Fla., native turned in one of the best statistical seasons for a Tribe goalkeeper on his way to earning CAA All-Rookie Team honors.

McAdams garnered his first collegiate start in the Tribe's fourth game of the regular season in 2007 and never relinquished the slot. He finished his rookie campaign among the Tribe's single-season leaders in save percentage (fourth at .850), shutouts (sixth with seven), saves (fifth with 96) and goals against average (seventh at 0.87). McAdams was instrumental in organizing a young Tribe defense, which started three freshmen and a sophomore in the defensive third. The W&M defense posted a school-record six shutouts during the CAA portion of the schedule. McAdams finished as the CAA leader in save percentage, while also finishing ranked 10th nationally in the category. He also ranked third in the CAA in both goals against average and saves, while ranking 23rd nationally in saves per game and 42nd in goals against average.
