TRIBE RETURNS HOME TO FACE CAMPBELL, TOWSON

Off to its best start since 1994, the William and Mary men's soccer team will host a pair of matches, welcoming Campbell and Towson to Albert-Daly Field. The Sept. 23rd match against Campbell is a make up date from Sept. 6 when the teams' tilt was postponed due to inclement weather from Tropical Storm Hanna. The Tuesday night affair is slated to kick off at 7 p.m.

W&M will open the CAA portion of its schedule with Towson on Saturday, Sept. 27. Kickoff for that match is slated for 7 p.m. as well. The Tribe will look to avenge a pair of losses to the Tigers last season. W&M is 2-2 in CAA openers under head coach Chris Norris and 10-8-5 all-time.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- W&M is currently the highest ranked CAA team in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region poll at No. 3, trailing only nationally ranked Maryland and Boston College.

- W&M ranks 19th nationally in team winning percentage.

- Nine different Tribe players registered an assist in the College's two games at the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic. In total, 10 W&M players have tallied assists this season.

- W&M is off to its best start since the 1994 season at 3-0-2.

- Sophomore Nat Baako ranks 67th nationally in points per game and 50th in goals per game.

- Sophomore goalkeeper Andrew McAdams ranks 64th nationally in goals against average, while also ranking 89th in save percentage.

- McAdams tallied his third career assist in the Tribe's 2-1 win over Elon. W&M is a perfect 3-0 when McAdams registers an assist in a game.

- Senior Doug McBride and sophomore Andrew McAdams were named captains for the 2008 season.

- The Tribe is 17-9-9 all-time at Albert-Daly Field, including a 9-2-2 all-time ledger in non-conference games at the facility.

- W&M improved to 31-6-2 all-time and a perfect 5-0 under head coach Chris Norris in home openers, following its 2-1 victory over UNC Greensboro on Aug. 30.

- The Tribe has sent 30 players into the professional ranks and currently has a quartet of guys playing professionally in the U.S. and abroad. Wade Barrett has started 20 matches for the Houston Dynamo of the MLS. The Dynamo are currently leading the Western Division. Ralph Bean appeared in 11 matches and had an assist for the Bermuda Hogs of the USL Second Division. Adin Brown missed most of the season with Aalesunds FK in the Norwegian Eliteserien due to injury, while Carlos Garcia helped the Baltimore Blast to its second straight Major Indoor Soccer League Championship.

SCOUTING CAMPBELL

Campbell enters the contest with the Tribe at 2-4 on the year following losses to UNC Greensboro (2-1) and Appalachian State (1-0) over the weekend. The Fighting Camels suffered those setbacks despite outshooting its Southern Conference opponents by a combined 28-14. Campbell has struggled a bit on the road, going 0-4 away from Buies Creek, N.C. Those four losses have all come by one-goal margins. Last season, the Campbell went 13-6-3 on their way to winning the Atlantic Sun Championship.

The Fighting Camels return their top six scorers from last season and their starting goalkeeper. Senior midfielder Richard Jata tops the list of returnees after finishing with 22 points on nine goals and four assists last season. He is a two-time All-Atlantic Sun and the preseason conference player of the year. He has started three games this season and registered an assist.

Midfielder Josue Soto, who was a freshman All-American last season after finishing with 22 points on eight goals and six assists, is tied for the team-lead in goals with Khalil Johnson as both players have a pair of tallies. Jason Keever owns the other goal for the Fighting Camels this season. Aaron Johnson has played every minute in goal for Campbell and leads the Atlantic Sun in goals against average. He has a GAA of 0.83 to go along with 13 saves and two shutouts.

The match between the College and Campbell will only be the second. The last time the two teams met, W&M tallied a 3-2 win at Campbell during the 1973 campaign.

SCOUTING TOWSON

Towson enters the CAA opener with W&M on a three-match winning streak. Last week, the Tigers tallied wins over UMBC (2-1) and Stony Brook (1-0). Towson also owns wins over Longwood (3-0) and Rutgers (2-1). The Tigers are currently a perfect 3-0 on the road this season with their only setbacks coming to Fairfield (1-0) and Loyola (Md.) (2-1) at home. Towson is currently ranked eighth in the South Atlantic Region

Freshman Liam Maloney led the Tigers over the weekend scoring the game-winners against both UMBC and Stony Brook. He also tallied an assist against UMBC and garnered CAA Rookie of the Week honors in the process. He currently leads Towson in scoring with eight points on three goals and two assists. Three other Tiger players have five points on the season with two goals and an assist. That list includes Kevin Ruck, Scott Horta and Tommy Appel-Schumacher. Matt Beckman leads the CAA in assists with four on the season through six matches.

In goal, rookie John Steele has done well in replacing All-American goalkeeper Billy Chiles, who graduated last season. Steel has played every minute in net for the Tigers and ranks second in the CAA in goals against average at 0.83. He has 30 saves on the season to go along with an 85.7 save percentage and two shutouts.

Towson tallied a pair of one-goal victories over the Tribe last season, including a 2-1 win in the CAA quarterfinals. The Tigers also tallied a 1-0 overtime win during the regular season. Both those losses came at Towson. The Tribe holds a 5-4-2 advantage in the all-time series with the Tigers, including a 3-1 ledger in Williamsburg.

IMPRESSIVE START

W&M is off to its best start since the 1994 at 3-0-2. The Tribe started that season on a school-record 12-match winning streak. The five-game unbeaten streak to start the season marks the seventh time in school history a W&M team has accomplished the feat. W&M also opened the 1970 (11 games), 1982 (5 games), 1985 (10), 1987 (6) and 1991 (6) seasons with unbeaten streaks of five or more matches.

PAYING DIVIDENDS

Senior forward Nathan Belcher earned the first two starts of his W&M career last week against No. 17 Loyola (Md.) and Elon. His insertion into the lineup paid dividends for the College as the 6-6 striker tallied his first career game-winner in the College 2-1 road victory over Elon. It was his third career goal for the College. Belcher has three points on the year via a goal and an assist. He enjoyed a breakout summer playing for the Virginia Legacy of the PDL. Belcher ranked among the national leaders scoring 10 goals in 14 games for the Legacy.

LENDING A HELPING HAND

Through the opening five games of the 2008 season, the Tribe has dished out 12 assists. W&M not only leads the CAA in assists per game (2.40), but despite playing two fewer games than most conference teams, the College leads the league in total assists. Everyone has gotten in on the action as well with 10 different Green and Gold players tallying assists on the young season. Most recently, sophomore goalkeeper Andrew McAdams registered his third career assist against Elon.

At the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic, W&M finished the two-game event with nine helpers. The more impressive number is the fact those nine assists came from nine different Tribe players. Senior Doug McBride and junior Andrew Hoxie lead W&M in assists with two each, which ranks seventh in the CAA. Senior Nathan Belcher, juniors Price Thomas, Roger Bothe and Jeremy Harris and sophomores Nat Baako, Ian Stowe and Alan Koger, along with Hoxie and McBride, each had an assist at the ODU Classic.

RANKED REGIONALLY

For the second straight week, the Tribe is ranked No. 3 in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region Rankings. The College trails only nationally ranked Maryland (No. 4) and Boston College (No. 16) from the ACC.

W&M opened the season at No. 4 in the NSCAA South Atlantic poll. The Tribe fell one spot to No. 5 in the standings after not playing due to inclement weather before moving up to No. 3 last week. W&M remains the highest ranked CAA program in the region ahead of No. 4 VCU, No. 6 George Mason, No. 8 Towson, No. 9 James Madison and No. 10 Old Dominion.

A LONG TIME COMING

Sophomore Nat Baako has long been a key fixture in the Tribe offense, starting every match for W&M since stepping on the Williamsburg campus from Accra, Ghana in 2007. While a heady sparkplug in the center of the park for the Tribe, Baako showed the ability to be a dangerous attacking player, but still lacked a collegiate goal on his resume. That was until the ODU/Stihl Classic, where Baako had a breakout weekend. The 5-5 dynamo scored his first collegiate goal in the Tribe's win over UCF and then exploded for both Green and Gold tallies in the program's 2-2 tie with 2007 NCAA College Cup Semifinalist UMass. The second of Baako's tallies against the Minutemen came in the 87th minute on a beautiful strike from the top of the 18-yard box to equalize after UMass had taken the lead just four minutes prior.

HONORS COME ROLLING IN

For his efforts at the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic, sophomore Nat Baako was named the event's Most Valuable Player. In the two-game classic, Baako finished with seven points on three goals and an assist. He went on to be named the CAA co-Player of the Week along with VCU goalkeeper Andrew Dykstra for his efforts. Baako was joined on the Classic's All-Tournament team by senior Doug McBride and juniors Price Thomas and Roger Bothe.

ODU/STIHL SOCCER CLASSIC CHAMPIONSHIP

For the second time in the last three seasons and the fifth time overall, the College won the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic as a result of its 1-0-1 record at the event. The Tribe opened with a 3-1 win over Central Florida on Sept. 12, before forging a 2-2 tie with 2007 NCAA College Cup Semifinalist UMass on Sept. 14. The College improved to 26-13-5 (.648) all-time at the Stihl Soccer Classic, having competed in the event on 22 occasions. W&M also claimed the event title in 1987, 1992, 1998 and 2006.

VALUABLE FIRST

Sophomore Nick Orozco enjoyed a solid rookie season for the Tribe in 2007, starting all 21 games at center back and helping to anchor a defense that set a program record with six shutouts during the CAA portion of the schedule. While defensive exploits are well documented, Orozco had yet to register a shot, let alone a point in a collegiate game. That was until the Tribe's season opener against UNC Greensboro. The Moseley, Va., native made his first collegiate shot count, volleying in a rebound in the 88th minute to help the Tribe secure a 2-1 win over the Spartans.

COMEBACK WINS

The Tribe's 2-1 come-from-behind win over UNC Greensboro was the team's first since the 2006 season. Last season, W&M was 0-6 when its opponent scored first in a game. After UNCG took a 1-0 advantage with a penalty kick in the 14th minute, W&M responded to pull even with just over three minutes remaining in the opening half and then tacked on the game-winner in the 88th minute. It was the first comeback win since W&M overcame a 2-0 deficit against Georgia State on Oct. 20, 2006 on its way to a 4-2 victory. During head coach Chris Norris' tenure, W&M has five comeback victories.

THOMAS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CAA

Junior forward Price Thomas was named to the Preseason All-CAA Team. Thomas is one of six players in the league who returns in 2008 after earning first-team all-conference laurels last season.

In 2007, Thomas enjoyed a breakout season and became the first Tribe player since 2004 to earn First-Team All-CAA honors. The Charlottesville, Va., native led the Tribe and ranked among the CAA leaders in shots (40), points (17), goals (7), assists (3) and game-winning goals (4). He topped the conference in game-winning goals, while also ranking seventh in goals and ninth in points. Earlier in the season, Thomas registered a point in seven straight games from Sept. 22-Oct. 14. Included over that stretch, he scored a goal in each of the first four CAA games of the season.

MCADAMS NAMED TO CSN'S PLAYERS TO WATCH IN 2008.

Sophomore goalkeeper Andrew McAdams was named as one of College Soccer News Players to Watch in 2008. McAdams was one of nine goalkeepers nationally to be named to the list, developed by CSN talent analyst Joe Mauceri as part of the Web sites College Soccer Coast to Coast preseason coverage.

In his analysis of the goalkeeper position, Mauceri said, "I look for players with good hands; who are decisive, fearless when needed, and who understand good positioning." The second-year Tribe backstop demonstrated his mettle as one of the top up-and-coming goalkeepers in the country last season. The Palm Harbor, Fla., native turned in one of the best statistical seasons for a Tribe goalkeeper on his way to earning CAA All-Rookie Team honors.

McAdams garnered his first collegiate start in the Tribe's fourth game of the regular season in 2007 and never relinquished the slot. He finished his rookie campaign among the Tribe's single-season leaders in save percentage (fourth at .850), shutouts (sixth with seven), saves (fifth with 96) and goals against average (seventh at 0.87). McAdams was instrumental in organizing a young Tribe defense, which started three freshmen and a sophomore in the defensive third. The W&M defense posted a school-record six shutouts during the CAA portion of the schedule. McAdams finished as the CAA leader in save percentage, while also finishing ranked 10th nationally in the category. He also ranked third in the CAA in both goals against average and saves, while ranking 23rd nationally in saves per game and 42nd in goals against average.

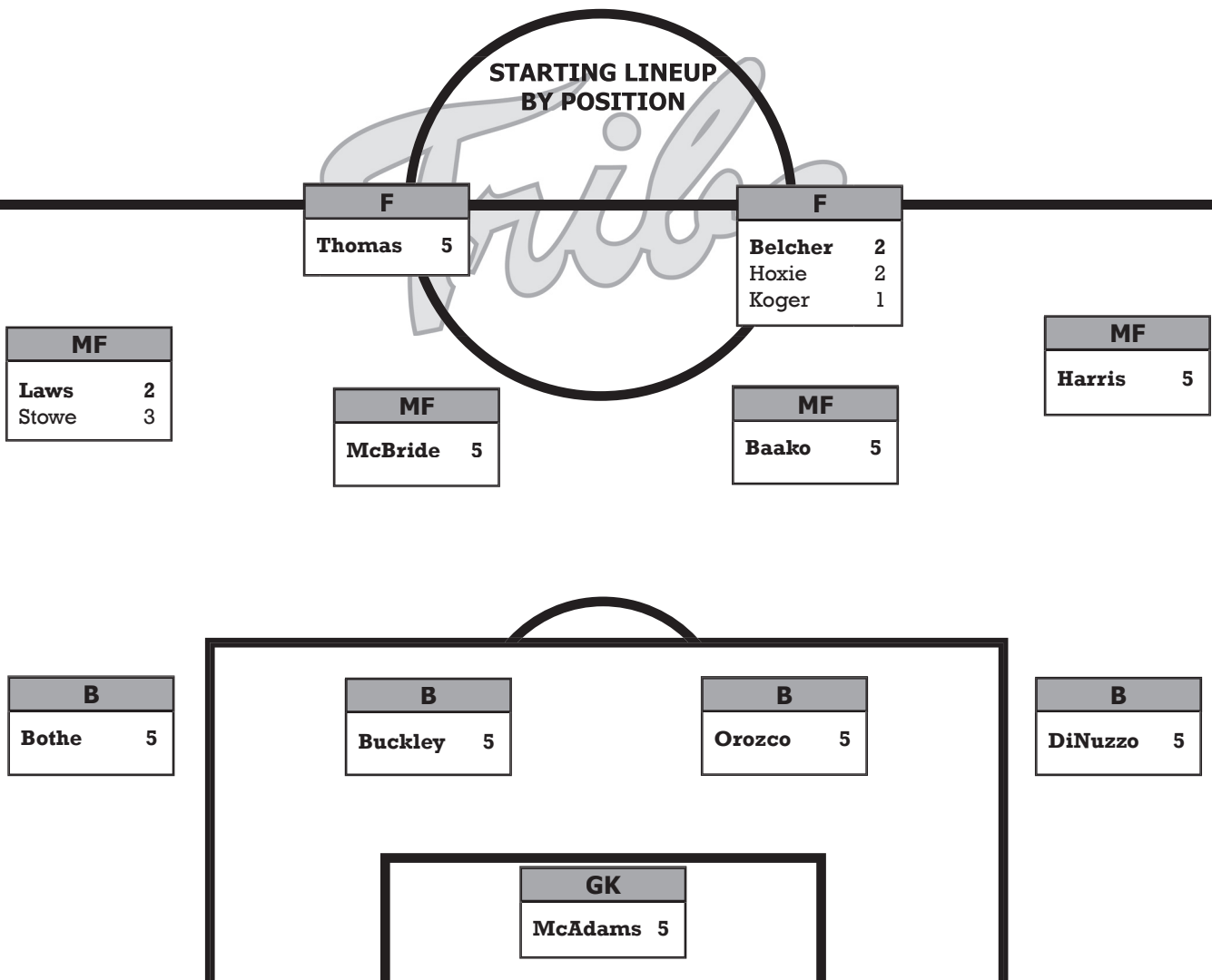
