TRIBE HITS THE ROAD FOR FIRST TIME IN 2008

After winning the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic, the William and Mary men's soccer team will encounter its first two true road matches of the season. The College opens the swing with a tough matchup with No. 17 Loyola (Md.) in the Tribe's first midweek contest of the season on Wednesday, Sept. 17. Kickoff is slated for 5 p.m. at Diane Geppi-Aikens Field. The Tribe will continue its road trip against Elon on Saturday, Sept. 20, at 7 p.m.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- W&M is currently the highest ranked CAA team in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region poll at No. 3, trailing only nationally ranked Maryland (No. 4) and Boston College (No. 16). The Tribe is also receiving votes in the NSCAA/adidas National Top 25.
- The Tribe's game against Campbell that was originally slated for Sept. 6, has been rescheduled for Tuesday, Sept. 23, at Albert-Daly Field. Kickoff will be at 7 p.m.
- Nine different Tribe players registered an assist in the College's two games at the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic.
- W&M is off to its best start since the 1998 season at 2-0-1.
- The Tribe ranks No. 15 nationally in scoring offense at 2.33 goals per game.
- Senior Doug McBride and sophomore Andrew McAdams were named captains for the 2008 season.
- The Tribe is 17-9-9 all-time at Albert-Daly Field, including a 9-2-2 all-time ledger in non-conference games at the facility.
- W&M improved to 31-6-2 all-time and a perfect 5-0 under head coach Chris Norris in home openers, following its 2-1 victory over UNC Greensboro on Aug. 30.
- The Tribe has sent 30 players into the professional ranks and currently has a quartet of guys playing professionally in the U.S. and abroad. Wade Barrett has started 20 matches for the Houston Dynamo of the MLS. The Dynamo are currently leading the Western Division. Ralph Bean appeared in 11 matches and had an assist for the Bermuda Hogges of the USL Second Division. Adin Brown missed most of the season with Aalesunds FK in the Norwegian Eliteserien due to injury, while Carlos Garcia helped the Baltimore Blast to its second straight Major Indoor Soccer League Championship.

SCOUTING #17 LOYOLA (MD.)

Loyola (Md.) enters the midweek tilt with the Tribe as one of only six teams in the country that are both unbeaten and untied this season. The Greyhounds moved to 5-0 on the year with wins over Campbell (1-0) and George Washington (3-1) last week and jumped to No. 17 in the NSCAA/adidas National Top 25. Loyola (Md.) also owns wins over Fordham (2-0), Hartwick (2-0) and Towson (2-1) this season. Loyola is ranked No. 1 in the North Atlantic Region and is also ranked No. 18 nationally in the College Soccer News poll.

Dating back to last season, the Greyhounds are currently on a 13-match unbeaten streak. In 2007, Loyola (Md.) won the MAAC Championship and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Loyola tied Maryland in the second round, 0-0, and the Terrapins advanced on penalty kicks.

While the Greyhounds have put up an impressive record over the last two seasons, they have been even more tough at home. Loyola (Md.) has won each of its last 13 home matches, including 10 contests by shutout. Loyola currently ranks among the national leaders in team save percentage (10th, 0.92), team GAA (13th, 0.4) and shutout percentage (16th, 0.6).

Junior Milos Kocic has played all five games in goal for the Greyhounds and has put up impressive numbers. The two-time MAAC Defensive Player of the Week has a GAA of 0.40 to go along with 22 saves, a 91.7 save percentage and three shutouts. In Loyola's most recent game against George Washington, he registered a career-high 10 saves.

Junior forward Jamie Darvill leads the Greyhounds in every offensive category with nine points on three goals and three assists. Sophomore runningmate Phil Bannister also has three goals to go along with an assist for seven points. It total, five different players have scored a game-winning goal for Loyola (Md.) this season, including freshman midfielder Ben Hanson against George Washington. For his efforts, Hanson was named the MAAC Rookie of the Week.

W&M leads the all-time series with Loyola (Md.) at 12-9-3. The Tribe is 4-4-1 all-time on the road in the series. In the last meeting, W&M tallied a 2-1 win at the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic in 2006. The last time the College traveled to Loyola it registered a 2-1 win in 2004.

SCOUTING ELON

The Phoenix will host Wofford on Wednesday, Sept. 17, before welcoming the Tribe to Elon, N.C., on Saturday, Sept. 20. Elon is 1-3-1 on the season following a 1-0 setback to East Tennessee State. The Phoenix lone tie on the season was a 0-0 draw with Old Dominion, while its lone victory was a 1-0 over triumph over UNC Ashville. Elon's other losses on the year came to High Point (2-1) and Winthrop (2-1) in overtime.

A pair of goalkeepers have seen time for the Phoenix this season. Kyle Berner has started three contests and owns a GAA of 1.60 to go along with eight saves. Clint Irwin has started a pair of contests for Elon and has yet to be scored upon, making 12 saves and earning a shutout. Three players own goals this season for the Phoenix with Stephen Dilger leading the team in scoring with three points on a goal and an assist. Efran Imeni and Justin Wyatt have also scored this season for Elon with Wyatt's being the team's lone game-winner. Brad Franks, Aaron Parker and Daniel Street each own assists for the Phoenix.

Elon and W&M met for the first time last season with the Tribe pulling out a 1-0 victory in Williamsburg. Jeremy Harris scored the game-winner for the Tribe in the 55th minute of play.

RANKED REGIONALLY

The Tribe moved up two spots in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region Rankings and also received votes for the NSCAA/adidas National Top 25 released on Sept. 16. The College is ranked No. 3 in the region, trailing only nationally ranked Maryland (No. 4) and Boston College (No. 16) from the ACC. The Tribe is also listed eighth among the also receiving votes category for the national top 25.

W&M opened the season at No. 4 in the NSCAA South Atlantic poll. Last week, the Tribe fell one spot to No. 5 in the standings after not playing due to inclement weather. W&M remains the highest ranked CAA program in the region ahead of No. 5 VCU, No. 7 George Mason and No. 8 Drexel. Old Dominion and James Madison are listed among the also receiving votes category. In the national rankings, the Tribe received five votes and was one of 18 teams outside the top 25 to receive votes in the poll.

IMPRESSIVE START

W&M is off to its best start since the 1998 at 2-0-1. The Tribe started that season 4-0, before suffering a setback. The last time, a W&M team started the year unbeaten through more than four games was during the 1994 season when the College won a school-record 12-straight matches to open the year. The three-game unbeaten streak to start the season marks the 12th time in school history a W&M team has accomplished the feat.

A LONG TIME COMING

Sophomore Nat Baako has long been a key fixture in the Tribe offense, starting every match for W&M since stepping on the Williamsburg campus from Accra, Ghana in 2007. While a heady sparkplug in the center of the park for the Tribe, Baako showed the ability to be a dangerous attacking player, but still lacked a collegiate goal on his resume. That was until the ODU/Stihl Classic, where Baako had a breakout weekend. The 5-5 dynamo scored his first collegiate goal in the Tribe's win over UCF and then exploded for both Green and Gold tallies in the program's 2-2 tie with 2007 NCAA College Cup Semifinalist UMass. The second of Baako's tallies against the Minutemen came in the 87th minute on a beautiful strike from the top of the 18-yard box to equalize after UMass had taken the lead just four mintues prior.

HONORS COME ROLLING IN

For his efforts at the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic, sophomore Nat Baako was named the event's Most Valuable Player. In the two-game classic, Baako finished with seven points on three goals and an assist. He went on to be named the CAA co-Player of the Week along with VCU goalkeeper Andrew Dykstra for his efforts. Baako was joined on the Classic's All-Tournament team by senior Doug McBride and juniors Price Thomas and Roger Bothe.

TOP OF THE HEAP

Sophomore Nat Baako leads the CAA in four offensive categories. He tops the league in points (7), goals (3), points per game (2.33) and goals per game (1.0). Baako also ranks fourth in the CAA in shots per game at 3.0. Baako's goals and points per game averages rank among the national leaders as well. He is in the top-10 in both categories at No. 9 in points and No. 7 in goals.

ODY/STIHL SOCCER CLASSIC CHAMPIONSHIP

For the second time in the last three seasons and the fifth time overall, the College won the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic as a result of its 1-0-1 record at the event. The Tribe opened with a 3-1 win over Central Florida on Sept. 12, before forging a 2-2 tie with 2007 NCAA College Cup Semifinalist UMass on Sept. 14. The College improved to 26-13-5 (.648) all-time at the Stihl Soccer Classic, having competed in the event on 22 occasions. W&M also claimed the event title in 1987, 1992, 1998 and 2006.

LENDING A HELPING HAND

Through the opening three games of the 2008 season, the Tribe has dished out 10 assists. W&M not only leads the CAA in assists per game (3.33), but despite playing two fewer games than most conference teams, the College leads the league in total assists. At the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic, W&M finished the two-game event with nine helpers. The more impressive number is the fact those nine assists came from nine different Tribe players. Junior Andrew Hoxie leads W&M with a pair of assists on the season. He ranks third in the CAA in assists and assists per game (0.67). His assists per game number also ranks 18th nationally. Seniors Doug McBride and Nathan Belcher, juniors Price Thomas, Roger Bothe and Jeremy Harris and sophomores Nat Baako, Ian Stowe and Alan Koger, along with Hoxie, each had an assist at the Classic.

RETURNING TO FORM

After redshirting last season, junior forward Andrew Hoxie wasted little time showing the form that made him an all-conference and all-region player in 2006. The Newport News, Va., native tallied a goal and an assist in each of the Tribe's first two wins of the season against UNC Greensboro and Central Florida. Hoxie tallied the game-winning assist against UNCG, before scoring the game-winning goal on a deflected volley in the 62nd minute against Central Florida. Hoxie has been a dangerous component of a Tribe attack that leads the CAA and ranks among the national leading in offensive scoring. Hoxie ranks second in the CAA, behind teammate Nat Baako, in both points per game (2.0) and goals per game (0.67). He is third in the conference in assists (2) and fourth in points (6). The 6-4 striker has also been dangerous at creating scoring chances as he also leads the CAA in shots per game at 4.0 a contest. Hoxie's goals per game number ranks 48th nationally, while his points per game average is 22nd in the country.

VALUABLE FIRST

Sophomore Nick Orozco enjoyed a solid rookie season for the Tribe in 2007, starting all 21 games at center back and helping to anchor a defense that set a program record with six shutouts during the CAA portion of the schedule. While is defensive exploits are well documented, Orozco had yet to register a shot, let alone a point in a collegiate game. That was until the Tribe's season opener against UNC Greensboro. The Moseley, Va., native made his first collegiate shot count, volleying in a rebound in the 88th minute to help the Tribe secure a 2-1 win over the Spartans.

COMEBACK WINS

The Tribe's 2-1 come-from-behind win over UNC Greensboro was the team's first since the 2006 season. Last season, W&M was 0-6 when its opponent scored first in a game. After UNCG took a 1-0 advantage with a penalty kick in the 14th minute, W&M responded to pull even with just over three minutes remaining in the opening half and then tacked on the game-winner in the 88th minute. It was the first comeback win since W&M overcame a 2-0 deficit against Georgia State on Oct. 20, 2006 on its way to a 4-2 victory. During head coach Chris Norris' tenure, W&M has five comeback victories.

THOMAS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CAA

Junior forward Price Thomas was named to the Preseason All-CAA Team. Thomas is one of six players in the league who returns in 2008 after earning first-team all-conference laurels last season.

In 2007, Thomas enjoyed a breakout season and became the first Tribe player since 2004 to earn First-Team All-CAA honors. The Charlottesville, Va., native led the Tribe and ranked among the CAA leaders in shots (40), points (17), goals (7), assists (3) and game-winning goals (4). He topped the conference in game-winning goals, while also ranking seventh in goals and ninth in points. Earlier in the season, Thomas registered a point in seven straight games from Sept. 22-Oct. 14. Included over that stretch, he scored a goal in each of the first four CAA games of the season.

MCADAMS NAMED TO CSN'S PLAYERS TO WATCH IN 2008.


Sophomore goalkeeper Andrew McAdams was named as one of College Soccer News Players to Watch in 2008. McAdams was one of nine goalkeepers nationally to be named to the list, developed by CSN talent analyst Joe Mauceri as part of the Web sites College Soccer Coast to Coast preseason coverage.

In his analysis of the goalkeeper position, Mauceri said, "I look for players with good hands; who are decisive, fearless when needed, and who understand good positioning." The second-year Tribe backstop demonstrated his mettle as one of the top up-and-coming goalkeepers in the country last season. The Palm Harbor, Fla., native turned in one of the best statistical seasons for a Tribe goalkeeper on his way to earning CAA All-Rookie Team hon-

McAdams garnered his first collegiate start in the Tribe's fourth game of the regular season in 2007 and never relinquished the slot. He finished his rookie campaign among the Tribe's single-season leaders in save percentage (fourth at .850), shutouts (sixth with seven), saves (fifth with 96) and goals against average (seventh at 0.87). McAdams was instrumental in organizing a young Tribe defense, which started three freshmen and a sophomore in the defensive third. The W&M defense posted a school-record six shutouts during the CAA portion of the schedule. McAdams finished as the CAA leader in save percentage, while also finishing ranked 10th nationally in the category. He also ranked third in the CAA in both goals against average and saves, while ranking 23rd nationally in saves per game and 42nd in goals against average.
