#### TRIBE SET FOR ODU/STIHL SOCCER CLASSIC

For the 10th straight season, the William and Mary men's soccer team will take part in the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic at the ODU Soccer Stadium, Sept. 12-14. The College will look for its first event title since the 2006 season when it opens play against Central Florida on Friday, Sept. 12, at 4:30 p.m. The Tribe will face 2007 NCAA College Cup Semifinalist UMass in its final match of the event at noon on Sunday, Sept. 14.

#### WYM AT THE ODU/STIHL SOCCER CLASSIC

The College will compete in the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic for the 10th straight season and the 22nd time overall. W&M is 25-13-4 (.643) all-time at the event, winning the championship on four occasions (1987, 1992, 1998 and 2006). The Tribe has competed in the classic each of the last nine seasons and every season between 1985 and 1995, after first playing at the tournament in 1978. W&M has won both its games at the event on seven occasions (1985, 1986, 1988, 1993, 1994, 1998 and 2006).

#### TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- W&M is currently the highest ranked CAA team in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region poll at No. 5.
- The Tribe's game against Campbell that was originally slated for Sept. 6, has been rescheduled for Tuesday, Sept. 23, at Albert-Daly Field. Kickoff will be at 7 p.m.
- Senior Doug McBride and sophomore Andrew McAdams were named captains for the 2008 season.
- The Tribe is 17-9-9 all-time at Albert-Daly Field, including a 9-2-2 all-time ledger in non-conference games at the facility.
- W&M improved to 31-6-2 all-time and a perfect 5-0 under head coach Chris Norris in home openers, following its 2-1 victory over UNC Greensboro on Aug. 30.
- The Tribe has sent 30 players into the professional ranks and currently has a quartet of guys playing professionally in the U.S. and abroad. Wade Barrett has started 18 matches for the Houston Dynamo of the MLS. The Dynamo are currently leading the Western Division. Ralph Bean appeared in 11 matches and had an assist for the Bermuda Hogges of the USL Second Division. Adin Brown missed most of the season with Aalesunds FK in the Norwegian Eliteserien due to injury, while Carlos Garcia helped the Baltimore Blast to its second straight Major Indoor Soccer League Championship.

#### SCOUTING CENTRAL FLORIDA

Central Florida enters the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic at 1-2 on the season and is coming off its first victory of the campaign. The Knights opened the season at the 2008 Wolstein Classic hosted by Ohio State and dropped a pair of matches to Big Ten foes Penn State (2-0) and Ohio State (2-1). In the contest against the host Buckeyes, UCF jumped out to a 1-0 lead in the second half, before OSU equalized and then scored the game-winner in the second OT period. Most recently, the Knights tallied a 1-0 win over Stetson, who is ranked No. 10 in the NSCAA South Region poll.

In their opening three games, the Knights have been substantially outshot as UCF opponents hold a 66-25 advantage in the shot department, including a 26-6 cushion on goal. Goalkeeper Sean Johnson has been impressive in goal for Central Florida, despite being under constant pressure. Johnson owns a GAA of 1.26 and has an outstanding save percentage of .846. He has also made 22 saves, which equates to 7.3 per contest. He was recently named for C-USA Defensive Player of the Week for his shutout of Stetson. Chris Andaur and Joe Crowley have each scored for the Knights this season, while Matt Heffernan holds UCF's lone assist. In fact, Crowley's goal was the game-winner

on a breakaway against Stetson in the 85th minute. Ryan Roushandel is the Knights top returning player a season ago. He topped the squad with 17 points on eight goals and one assist. For his efforts, he earned Second-Team All-Conference USA honors.

The match will be the second meeting between UCF and the Tribe. The last time the two teams met, W&M tallied a 3-0 win over the Knights in 1987.

#### SCOUTING UMASS

For the first time, W&M and UMass will clash on Sunday, Sept. 14. The Minute Men are coming off a historic season in which they captured the 2007 Atlantic-10 Championship on their way to the NCAA College Cup Semifinals. UMass finished last season ranked No. 4 nationally. Currently, the Minute Men are 2-1 on the year, ranked ninth in the NSCAA Mid-Atlantic Region and receiving votes in the College Soccer News National Top 30.

The Minute Men dropped their season opener to Holy Cross, 1-0, but have rallied to win their last two matches. UMass defeated Boston University, 3-2, in double overtime, before disposing of Siena, 2-0.

UMass is led by returning All-American goalkeeper Zack Simmons. He was a preseason All-Atlantic 10 selection as well and currently has a goals against average of 0.96 to go along with 16 saves and a shutout. Senior Price Ofosu currently leads the Minute Men with two goals and four points. He tallied both markers in the win over Boston University. Sophomore Ben Arikian has a goal and an assist on the year for UMass, including the game-winner against Boston. Arikian was a second-team freshman All-American according to Soccer America last season. Chris Brown owns the only other UMass goal on the season, the game-winner against Siena.

#### RANKED REGIONALLY

For the second straight week, the Tribe is ranked among the top 5 in the NSCAA South Atlantic Region poll. W&M was No. 4 last week and despite having its game against Campbell postponed due to inclement weather, the College moved down one stop to No. 5 on Sept. 9. The College is the highest ranked CAA in the poll, followed closely by Drexel and George Mason at No. 6 and Hofstra at No. 9. Old Dominion, James Madison and VCU are all receiving votes in the regional poll.

#### RETURNING TO FORM

After redshirting last season, junior forward Andrew Hoxie wasted little time showing the form that made him an all-conference and all-region player in 2006. The Newport News, Va., native came off the bench as a first half sub for the Tribe in the season opener against UNC Greensboro and promptly tied the game on a penalty kick before assisting on the game-winner in the second half. It was Hoxie's fourth career game-winning assist. As a sophomore in 2006, Hoxie topped the Tribe in scoring with 24 points on 10 goals and four assists. He also tallied four game-winners.

#### VALUABLE FIRST

Sophomore Nick Orozco enjoyed a solid rookie season for the Tribe in 2007, starting all 21 games at center back and helping to anchor a defense that set a program record with six shutouts during the CAA portion of the schedule. While is defensive exploits are well documented, Orozco had yet

#### **CSN Players to Watch**

to register a shot, let alone a point in a collegiate game. That was until the Tribe's season opener against UNC Greensboro. The Moseley, Va., native made his first collegiate shot count, volleying in a rebound in the 88th minute to help the Tribe secure a 2-1 win over the Spartans.

#### COMEBACK WINS

The Tribe's 2-1 come-from-behind win over UNC Greensboro was the team's first since the 2006 season. Last season, W&M was 0-6 when its opponent scored first in a game. After UNCG took a 1-0 advantage with a penalty kick in the 14th minute, W&M responded to pull even with just over three minutes remaining in the opening half and then tacked on the gamewinner in the 88th minute. It was the first comeback win since W&M overcame a 2-0 deficit against Georgia State on Oct. 20, 2006 on its way to a 4-2 victory. During head coach Chris Norris' tenure, W&M has five comeback victories.

#### THOMAS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CAA

Junior forward Price Thomas was named to the Preseason All-CAA Team. Thomas is one of six players in the league who returns in 2008 after earning first-team all-conference laurels last season.

In 2007, Thomas enjoyed a breakout season and became the first Tribe player since 2004 to earn First-Team All-CAA honors. The Charlottesville, Va., native led the Tribe and ranked among the CAA leaders in shots (40), points (17), goals (7), assists (3) and game-winning goals (4). He topped the conference in game-winning goals, while also ranking seventh in goals and ninth in points. Earlier in the season, Thomas registered a point in seven straight games from Sept. 22-Oct. 14. Included over that stretch, he scored a goal in each of the first four CAA games of the season.

#### MCADAMS NAMED TO CSN'S PLAYERS TO WATCH IN 2008.

Sophomore goalkeeper Andrew McAdams was named as one of College Soccer News Players to Watch in 2008. McAdams was one of nine goalkeepers nationally to be named to the list, developed by CSN talent analyst Joe Mauceri as part of the Web sites College Soccer Coast to Coast preseason coverage.

In his analysis of the goalkeeper position, Mauceri said, "I look for players with good hands; who are decisive, fearless when needed, and who understand good positioning." The second-year Tribe backstop demonstrated his mettle as one of the top up-and-coming goalkeepers in the country last season. The Palm Harbor, Fla., native turned in one of the best statistical seasons for a Tribe goalkeeper on his way to earning CAA All-Rookie Team honors.

McAdams garnered his first collegiate start in the Tribe's fourth game of the regular season in 2007 and never relinquished the slot. He finished his rookie campaign among the Tribe's single-season leaders in save percentage (fourth at .850), shutouts (sixth with seven), saves (fifth with 96) and goals against average (seventh at 0.87). McAdams was instrumental in organizing a young Tribe defense, which started three freshmen and a sophomore in the defensive third. The W&M defense posted a school-record six shutouts during the CAA portion of the schedule. McAdams finished as the CAA leader in save percentage, while also finishing ranked 10th nationally in the category. He also ranked third in the CAA in both goals against average and saves, while ranking 23rd nationally in saves per game and 42nd in goals against average.


